VANDERBILT LOOKS TO NINTH STRAIGHT NOVEMBER WIN UNDER FRANKLIN

Vanderbilt enters the regular season finale game seeking its ninth consecutive win in the month of November.

Vanderbilt's current eight-game win streak in November is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished during the 1923-24 seasons.

The 'Dores under James Franklin are 9-2 in November games. In the decade before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

COMMODORES ARE 14-4 IN LAST 18 GAMES

The Commodores also own a 14-4 record over their last 18 games.

The 18-game stretch includes a seven-game streak to conclude the 2012 season and a victory in the Music City Bowl.

The 'Dores also are tied with Texas A&M for the SEC's second best record over that span. Only Alabama owns better records over their last 18 games than the Commodores.

In the 14 wins, Vanderbilt's margin of victory is 19.3 points. Eleven of the victories have come against BCS teams: Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee, Georgia and Florida from the SEC and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the ACC.

Three of Vanderbilt's four losses have come to teams ranked in the AP Top 25.

The 'Dores are also 15-6 dating back to early in the 2012 season.

OFF. LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON SETS NEW VANDERBILT CAREER STARTS RECORD

Wesley Johnson (R-Sr., OL) broke a team record in the Tennessee game by making his 49th career start.

Johnson's total ranks second in consecutive starts among SEC players, trailing only UGA QB **Aaron Murray** (51 starts).

Johnson has started at four different line positions: left and right tackle, left guard and center. This year, he has all 11 starts at left tackle.

In the UT game, Johnson eclipsed the record for career starts he shared with **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07).

'DORES ENJOYING IMPROVED TURNOVER MARGIN

The 'Dores have moved from midpack in the SEC to second in the league in turnover margin by forcing a rash of fumbles and interceptions in the last month.

The defense has forced 19 takeaways in the last five games – 12 picks and seven fumble recoveries. Vanderbilt has a turnover margin of plus-8 entering the Wake Forest game.

FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in team history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer **Dan McGugin**, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 22-15 overall. His .595 winning percentage is the best since **Red Sanders** (1940-42, 1946-48) directed the Vanderbilt sidelines.

SAFETY LADLER PLAYING AT ALL-SEC LEVEL; TOPS LEAGUE IN TWO DEFENSIVE CATEGORIES

Senior **Kenny Ladler** is putting together a superb final season.

Ladler, a third-year starting safety, tops the SEC in forced fumbles, shares the league lead in interceptions and ranks among the leaders in tackles.

Ladler's five forced fumbles ties a modern-day Vanderbilt record. Two former Commodores, LB **Jamie Duncan** in 1996 and LB **Shelton Quarles** in 1991, also registered five forced fumbles.

Ladler contributed a forced fumble, an interception and three tackles in the team's 14-10 win at Tennessee last week.

The senior also is on an impressive streak. In his last six games, Ladler has five forced fumbles, four interceptions and 49 total tackles.

He has 58 solo stops, six behind Georgia LB **Ramik Wilson**.

Ladler is the team's active career leader with 284 total tackles, 195 solo tackles, 10 interceptions and eight forced fumbles.

VANDERBILT OFFENSE HAVING RED-ZONE SUCCESS

The Commodore offense ranks among the most improved in the SEC and NCAA in its success on third downs and inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

This season, Vanderbilt leads the SEC in red-zone success. The 'Dores have scored on 41 of 47 red-zone possessions, a league-high 87% success rate. Through 11 games in 2012, the 'Dores were successful at a 73% clip (30 of 41).

More importantly, Vanderbilt is scoring TDs on red-zone drives at a much higher percentage than last year. The 'Dores have scored TDs on 33 of the 47 possessions, a 70% rate of success. Through 11 games last year, the offense was only half as successful, tallying TDs on just 18 of 41 possessions (44%).

SEEKING CONSECUTIVE 8-WIN REGULAR SEASONS

With a win this Saturday against Wake Forest, the Commodores will register back-to-back eight-win regular seasons for the first time since America was in the midst of the Great Depression.

Vanderbilt last achieved consecutive seasons of at least eight wins under Hall of Fame coach Dan McGugin in 1927-28.

The Commodores are 9-6 all-time against Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also is riding a two-game win streak over the Demon Deacons, both coming on the road in Winston-Salem. It marks the final game in the series that was renewed in the last decade.

CHASE GARNHAM, PARIS HEAD RECEIVE SEC WEEKLY HONORS FOLLOWING WIN OVER TENNESSEE

Chase Garnham (Sr., LB) and **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB) received recognition from the Southeastern Conference on Monday for their contributions to Vanderbilt's 14-10 victory at Tennessee.

Garnham, a defensive co-captain from Fairhope, Ala., was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week. Head, from Lawrenceville, Ga., shared SEC Freshman of the Week honors with LSU CB **Reshard Robinson**.

Garnham set a season high with seven solo tackles and 10 total stops to pace the Commodore defensive effort that limited Tennessee to its lowest point total in the series since 1968.

Head was superb after being inserted into the secondary when both starting cornerbacks went to the sidelines. Head intercepted two Tennessee passes, including one coming on a Volunteer fake field goal in the fourth quarter.

LAST TIME VS. WAKE FOREST

COMMODORES CLAIM SIXTH STRAIGHT WIN IMPRESSIVELY ON THE ROAD AT WAKE FOREST

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — The Vanderbilt Commodores continue to rewrite the school record books. And the season isn't even over yet.

After a 2-4 start the Commodores have strung together six straight wins, the school's longest such streak since 1955.

The latest victory came Saturday in a blowout fashion as Jordan

Rodgers threw for 229 yards and two TDs, and Zac Stacy ran for 180 yards and two scores in a dominating 55-21 win over Wake Forest.

Vanderbilt also scored twice on special teams, blocking a punt and recovering it in the end zone for a TD and also returning a punt 83 yards for a

score.

Stacy eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing for the second straight season and added to his career school record of 3,036 yards rushing, receiver Jordan Matthews set a single-season record with 1,262 yards receiving, and kicker Carey Spear hit a pair of field goals from beyond 50 yards and added seven extra points to finish with a school record 81 points.

SIGNIFICANCE OF WIN AT TENNESSEE

★ Following a 41-18 triumph in Nashville last year, the 14-10 win in Knoxville marked Vanderbilt's first back-to-back victories over the Vols since the 1925-26 seasons.

★ It was Vanderbilt's first victory in Neyland Stadium since **Jay Cutler** engineered a game-winning, fourth quarter drive in 2005.

★ It marked Vanderbilt's fifth road win in SEC play in the last two years.

★ Vanderbilt has won nine conference games over the last two seasons, the most in a two-year period since 1934-35.

ADDITIONAL NOTES AND STATS FROM ROAD WIN OVER VOLUNTEERS

★ The victory marked Vanderbilt's 16th win in the last two years, the most by the Commodores in a two-year period since the 1927-28 seasons.

★ Vanderbilt's clutch 92-yard game-winning drive capped by a 5-yard rush by **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) with 00:16 left is the team's longest TD possession in more than two years. It is the team's longest drive since a 93-yard possession against Kentucky on Nov. 12, 2011.

★ **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) was superb during the game-clinching drive, completing 6-of-7 passes for 77 yards. **Jordan Matthews** (Sr. WR) had three catches for 42 yards and **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) posted two receptions for 35 yards in the possession.

Carta-Samuels finished the game 21-of-27 for 181 yards. Combined, Carta-Samuels and Robinette were 24-of-31 for 195 yards.

★ The defense limited Tennessee to 10 points, the fewest points scored by a Volunteer offense during the series since 1968.

★ Despite injuries and penalties that depleted the entire starting secondary, the Commodore defense held Tennessee to 53 passing yards, the lowest total by an SEC opponent in the James Franklin Era.

★ It was Vanderbilt's third consecutive win in SEC play. The Commodores now have notched at least three straight league wins in 2012 and 2013.

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) extended a remarkable stretch on defense, contributing an interception for the fourth consecutive game and his fifth forced fumble of the season. He tops or shares the SEC lead in both stats.

★ Playing in place of sidelined starters, **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB) picked off two passes, the last coming at the Vanderbilt 10-yard line on a UT fake FG try.

It represents the second straight year that a Commodore CB recorded two interceptions against the Vols. In 2012, **Andre Hal** accomplished the feat.

★ **Darius Sims** (Fr., CB/RS) averaged 35.0 yards on kickoff returns. His 71-yard return in the third quarter was the longest by a Commodore since Hal went 96 yards for a score against Georgia on Oct. 15, 2011.

★ **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB) had his finest game of the year, setting season bests with seven solo tackles and 10 total stops to lead the defense.

★ The Commodore defense picked off three UT passes – and now have 10 total interceptions in the last three games. Both Head and Ladler have three picks during the three-game span.

★ **Wesley Tate** (R-Sr., RB) enjoyed his most productive game in more than a month, rushing for 35 yards on eight carries and catching five passes.

★ **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) continues to become more of a playmaker on the defensive front. Butler had two tackles for loss among five tackles and blocked a 33-yard UT FG attempt. It was the team's first FG block since **Walker May's** deflection of a South Carolina kick in 2010.

★ **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., DE) contributed one sack of the UT quarterback and assisted **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) on another.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) scored his 13th rushing TD on a 4-yard carry in the first quarter. Seymour is just one TD shy of matching the team record shared by RB **Zac Stacy** (2011) and TE **Allama Matthews** (1982).

MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

MORE ON MATTHEWS CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS, PAGE 10

Jordan Matthews (Sr., WR) established another important Southeastern Conference career receiving record at Tennessee and is approaching yet another as the Commodore face Wake Forest.

In the UT performance, Matthews set a new SEC record for career receptions, eclipsing the former mark of 236 catches set by former Commodore **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews, named as a semifinalist Nov. 18 for the Biletnikoff Award, posted a career-high 13 catches for 133 yards in Vanderbilt's 14-10 win at Kentucky. He now has 246 all-time receptions.

In a Oct. 26 game at Texas A&M, Matthews broke the SEC all-time receiving yardage. Matthews has 3,491 receiving yards for his career entering the Wake Forest game.

This season, Matthews has 96 receptions for 1,209 yards and five TDs. He is the first player in SEC history to post back-to-back seasons of at least 90 catches, and could become the league's first player to surpass 100 receptions in a single season.

Matthews holds five team receiving marks for the Commodores. In addition to the career receiving yardage record, he is the team leader with 22 all-time touchdown catches, 1,323 receiving yards in a season, and 17 games of 100+ receiving yards.

His 109.9-yard receiving average ranks second in the SEC behind Texas A&M's **Mike Evans**.

Matthews also surpassed 100 receiving yards in seven games this year. He has amassed at least five catches in every game as a senior.

Matthews' performance in the season opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his Vanderbilt career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels.

The conference's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb stats against SEC opponents. He has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 13 of his last 19 games against SEC teams, averaging 119.2 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 18 of his last 23 games.

2013 OFFENSE ON PACE TO REGISTER ONE OF TOP SEASONS IN MODERN TEAM HISTORY

The Vanderbilt offense is on pace to produce one of the finest campaigns in modern team history.

Through 11 games, the unit is averaging 29.7 points, which would rank among the team's highest single-season average since Dan McGugin's potent Commodore teams in the World War I era. The unit established a modern day scoring standard in 2012 with a 30.0-point average.

The attached chart shows a Commodore unit that compares with the 2012 offense

that ranked among the team's best ever, and is improved from James Franklin's initial offense in 2011. The current offense is vastly improved over the 2010 unit, the last prior to Franklin's arrival.

Through 11 games, the current offense is averaging 2.7 points more than the 2012 unit that featured a 2,500-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver.

Impressive performances from various special team units played a key role in Vanderbilt's 14-10 victory at Tennessee.

Darrius Sims (Fr., KOR) consistently gave the Commodores excellent field possession averaging 35.0 yards on three UT kicks, including one return for 71 yards.

For the second straight game, **Adam Butler** (R-Fr.) produced a huge play on conversion block units. One week after knocking down a Kentucky extra point attempt leading to a Commodore 2-point conversion, Butler broke through the Tennessee line to get his right hand on a 33-yard field goal. The attempt was unsuccessful, landing shy of the goal posts.

Punting in cold and windy conditions, first-year starter **Taylor Hudson** (R-So.) limited Tennessee to five return yards on five punts.

Carey Spear (Sr., PK) limited UT's dangerous kick returners to just 45 total return yards.

LADLER, HAL, AZUBIKE, WOESTMANN LEADING DEFENSIVE UNIT

Kenny Ladler (Sr., safety) and **Darreon Herring** (So., LB) are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 60 solo tackles and 84 total stops. He had three tackles, an INT and forced fumble at Tennessee. Herring is second with 75 total stops and third behind **Jovan Marshall** (Sr., safety) in solo stops.

DE **Caleb Azubike** has the most tackles for loss (9.5) while DE **Kyle Woestmann** has the team lead in QB sacks (5.5).

Andre Hal (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with 14 passes defended.

NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since QB **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection broke a team record with a his 49th consecutive career start in the win at Tennessee.

JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 45 solo stops and 73 total tackles.

JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Award semifinalist has topped 100 receiving yards in seven of 11 games, leads the SEC with 96 catches and ranks 2nd with 1,209 receiving yards.

WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

May has 35 total tackles, 3.0 QB sacks & 7.5 tackles for loss in nine starts,

CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior is 10-of-14 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more. He also scored on a TD on a fake FG attempt vs. Georgia. Spear has also been one of the SEC's top kickoff specialists as a senior.

TE DILLON VAN DER WAL NEWEST COMMODORE TO EARN FIRST START

Dillon van der Wal (R-So., TE) became the latest Commodore to earn his initial start when Vanderbilt defeated Florida Nov. 9.

The Commodores also had three first-time starters, **Patton Robinette** (QB), **Paris Head** (CB) and **Torren McGaster** (CB), in the previous game at Texas A&M. Robinette was 15-of-28 for 216 yards and a TD vs. the Aggies. Head and McGaster contributed three and two tackles, respectively.

Van der Wal, Robinette, Head and McGaster joins 12 other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts this year.

Adam Butler (R-Fr., DT), **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Taylor Hudson Jr.**, punter), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) made their first collegiate starts in the opener against Ole Miss.

Jake Sealand (So., LB) earned his first start against Austin Peay, with **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) and **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR) enjoying their first start at South Carolina. **Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) also received his first start at UMass, and **Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL) started vs. Georgia.

Several of the other first-time starters posted superb stats in their first start. Sealand had two tackles against Austin Peay. Seymour had 39 rushing yards, including a 1-yard TD rush, vs. South Carolina.

Jelks and Gouger lined up at tackle eligible in their initial starts.

Torrey Smith, now starting with the Ravens, also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record... Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps Wildcats to 7-6 record in 2006, topped by a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. K-State plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason game in three years... Under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense in 2007 becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 1st-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets many school records, including 3,353 passing yards... MORE ON 'DORE OFFENSIVE LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) has played four offensive line positions along with tight end while setting a new school record with 49 consecutive starts.

But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

★ Johnson has been flagged for just three holding penalties during his 49-game career.

★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 7.5 sacks on 1,244 career pass attempts, or one sack every 166 pass plays.

★ Johnson did not allow a single QB sack in 2012. He has allowed two sacks this year.

★ Johnson has produced 216 knockdown blocks, 73 intimidation blocks and 135 blocks that led to a Commodore TD or first down.

★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two offensive TDs for the last 3+ seasons.

★ Johnson has played 3,088 career snaps: 2,195 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 76 at tight end. He has played 98.6 percent of the team's snaps over the last 3+ years.

SEC WEEKLY HONORS

WESLEY JOHNSON (R-Sr., OT) GEORGIA, Oct. 19

Johnson was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after contributing four blocks that led directly to Commodore TDs in Vanderbilt's 31-27 victory over ranked Georgia.

Johnson has been recognized on four occasions by the SEC, more than any current or former Vanderbilt player.

CALEB AZUBIKE (So., DE) FLORIDA, Nov. 9

Azubike earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors after registering two QB sacks, four tackles and a pair of hurries in Vandy's 34-17 won over Florida. It was Azubike's first SEC weekly recognition.

JORDAN MATTHEWS (Sr., WR) KENTUCKY, Nov. 16

Matthews' effort vs. Kentucky – 12 catches for 141 yards – earned the standout SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Remarkably, it marked Matthews' first recognition from the SEC.

COMMODORE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

Vanderbilt's offensive point production through 11 games ranks among the highest season averages in team history.

The Commodores rank ninth in the SEC with a 29.7-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 0.3 points lower than in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points. The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the program's highest single-season total since the 1915 Commodore squad averaged 51.4 points.

The increased scoring continues a trend the Commodores started at midseason one year ago. In its last 17 games, the Vanderbilt offense is averaging 34.3 points.

Vanderbilt seniors **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause** rank as the SEC's second most productive receiving tandem.

Collectively, Matthews and Krause are averaging 182.2 receiving yards each game.

The Matthews-Krause duo trails only the LSU receiving tandem of **Odell Beckham** and **Jarvis Landry** (196.4 yards). **Mike Evans** and **Malcome Kennedy** of Texas A&M are third with a 178.1-yard average.

While Matthews ranks No. 1 in the SEC with 96 receptions and second with 1,209 receiving yards, Krause also is enjoying a break-through season. The three-year starter has established new season highs with 35 catches, 651 receiving yards and three TD catches.

with 1,209 receiving yards. Matthews' 109.9-yard average trails only **Mike Evans** of Texas A&M (119.5 yards).

He is just two catches shy of breaking the team and SEC single-season record of 97 receptions held by **Keith Edwards** (1983).

Last Saturday, he totalled 133 receiving yards in the 'Dore win.

During the Oct. 26 effort at A&M, Matthews broke the SEC career receiving yardage record previously held by former Georgia WR **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002). He has 3,491 receiving yards.

Matthews also set the Vanderbilt team record Oct. 5 against Missouri

with his 22nd career touchdown catch.

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., has been voted one of 10 semifinalists for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, which is given to the nation's leading receiver.

Through 11 games, Matthews also is on target to become the first receiver in SEC history to catch 100 passes in a season.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in seven games this year, extending his school and SEC career record to 17 games of at least 100 receiving yards.

He also opened the year with a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole Miss, and added 106 yards at South Carolina. Later, he produced 123 receiving yards against Missouri, 111 yards vs. Austin Peay and 141 yards vs. Kentucky besides the 133-yard effort at Tennessee.

Matthews has been sensational against SEC competition this year. He has 74 catches for 907 receiving yards in conference play.

Matthews posted staggering numbers during a superb junior campaign when he earned First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America recognition. Matthews' 94-reception total in 2012 is tied for the third most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks fifth on the SEC single-season charts.

RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

SPEAR SETS THIRD TEAM FIELD GOAL RECORD; CONVERTED 10-OF-14 FIELD GOALS THIS YEAR

Coming off the best season ever by a Vandy placekicker, senior **Carey Spear** has continued his excellent form in 2013.

The early-season Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yards during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

Spear is 10-of-14 this year on field goal attempts. Two of his conversions have come from 50 yards or longer. He has also registered a rushing TD on a fake FG.

A second-team AP All-SEC recipient in 2012, Spear set a team records with 20 field goals and 87 points.

Spear's career total of 170 points ranks fourth all-time among Vanderbilt kickers. He passed **Johnny Clark** (1966-69) during the Kentucky game.

Spear is a two-year starting placekicker and four-year starter at kickoff specialist. He is also the first Commodore player to be voted captain for three consecutive seasons since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected in 2003-05.

HUDSON SOLID AS COMMODORE PUNTER

Taylor Hudson (R-So.) has earned the respect of teammates and SEC observers as a first-year starting punter. Hudson has been superb as the replacement of 2012 All-SEC recipient **Richard Kent**.

The former prep QB is averaging 43.0 yards on 46 punts. He also has a solid net punt average of 38.3 yards. Hudson averaged 37.8 yards in tough conditions at Tennessee, one week after averaging 46.4 yards vs. Kentucky.

Hudson has punts of 50 yards or more in eight of 11 games.

LASSING, HUDSON NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE DISTRICT III ALL-ACADEMIC SQUAD

Two of Vanderbilt top scholar athletes, **Fitz Lassing** (Sr., FB) and **Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) have been named to the Capital One/CoSIDA Academic District III football team.

Lassing, a senior from Montgomery Bell Academy in Nashville, and Hudson, a redshirt sophomore from Olentangy Liberty H.S. in Powell, Ohio, are under consideration for the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team.

Lassing and Hudson are the first Commodore football players to earn Academic All-District recognition since linebacker John Stokes and receiver John Cole were recognized in 2010.

The last Vanderbilt scholar athlete to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team honors was linebacker Hunter Hillenmeyer in 2002. That year, Hillenmeyer also earned National Scholar Athlete status.

Lassing returned to the Commodore starting lineup at Florida, providing several key lead blocks from his fullback position in the Vanderbilt victory. On the season, he has three pass receptions for 18 yards and one touchdown.

Lassing is expected to earn an undergraduate degree in Economics in May. He holds a 3.9 GPA and is a multiple SEC Academic Honor Roll and Dean's List recipient.

Hudson has been superb as a first-year starting punter. He ranks among the nation's top 25 punters with a 43.0-yard average, and owns one of the top net averages in the SEC. He also is a candidate for the Ray Guy Award.

Hudson holds a 3.78 GPA as he works toward a Bachelor's degree in Neuroscience from the College of Arts and Science.

FRANKLIN'S COMMODORES ARE 10-1 IN NON-SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE PLAY

Vanderbilt captured its sixth straight regular season win against a non-SEC member when it defeated UAB 52-24 on Sept. 28.

Besides UAB, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay and UMass, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 10-1 (.909) in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 11-2 overall (.846) against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt is 22-14 (.611) against regular season non-SEC teams.

SIGNIFICANT VANDERBILT WIN IN THE SWAMP

The 34-17 victory over Florida Nov. 9 ended decades of Vanderbilt struggles facing the Gators in the Swamp.

★ It marked Vanderbilt's first victory on the Florida campus since a 7-0 shutout in 1945. That game, held just months after World War II ended, was Vanderbilt's trip visit to Gainesville. Until Saturday, the Commodores were 0-19-1 in the Swamp since the 1945 win.

★ The victory also ended 22 years of Commodore frustration in the series. The win was Vanderbilt's first over the Gators since 1988,

★ The 17-point winning margin was the Commodores widest margin of victory in the series since a 20-0 shutout in 1946.

COMMODORES ON RECORD POINTS STREAK

Vanderbilt's consecutive streak of scoring at least 21 points ended at 15 games in the 14-10 victory at Tennessee.

The 15-game scoring streak ranks as a new standard for the Commodore program. Never in the 124-year history of Vanderbilt football, including the early 1900s when Dan McGugin's teams routinely averaged 40+ points, have the Commodores duplicated the current scoring streak.

FORMER STANDOUT JIMMY WILLIAMS RECOGNIZED AS PROGRAM'S 2013 SEC LEGEND

Jimmy Williams, a standout RB/DB from 1997-2000, will be saluted as Vanderbilt's Legend as part of SEC Championship activities this December in Atlanta. Williams was an All-SEC performer who started for the Commodores as a running back, cornerback and return specialist.

CAREY SPEAR: WUERFFEL AWARD FINALIST AND ALLSTATE-AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM RECIPIENT

In recent weeks, **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) has received two impressive recognitions, earning inclusion as a Wuerffel Trophy finalist and a member of the Allstate/American Football Coaches Assn. national Good Works Team.

Spear, a native of Mayfield Village, Ohio near Cleveland, is the first Commodore student-athlete ever to receive either recognition. He was named among 12 finalists for the Wuerffel Trophy on Nov. 12. The Wuerffel honors the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with outstanding academic and athletic achievement.

Spear was recognized by Allstate officials during a special ceremony Oct. 23 at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital on the Vanderbilt campus.

He is considered among the nation's leading placekickers. An All-SEC recipient in 2012, Spear is 10-of-14 on field goals this year.

Spear was nominated for the Senior CLASS Award, and was a finalist for the Vanderbilt Outstanding Senior Award in mid-October.

Home games with Ole Miss, South Carolina, Florida and Tennessee will highlight Vanderbilt's 2014 football schedule.

The 2014 Vanderbilt schedule features eight home games, including the first four contests of the season. The 'Dores will conclude the regular season against Tennessee, reviving a season-ending rivalry that existed for 67 years until being interrupted in 2007.

The 2014 season opens against Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28 and is followed by Ole Miss, which will be visiting for the second straight year, on Sept. 6. UMass and South Carolina follow to cap the month-long home stand.

The Commodores then hit the road for back-to-back games against Kentucky and Georgia before returning Oct. 11 to host Charleston Southern.

DEFENSE IMPRESSES IN VANDERBILT'S LAST FOUR SEC VICTORIES

The 'Dore defense has registered four of its best efforts in recent wins over Georgia, Florida, Kentucky and Tennessee.

The unit held Tennessee to its fewest points in the series since 1968. The Volunteers managed just 53 passing yards and 257 total yards against the Commodore defense.

One week earlier, the defense held Kentucky scoreless after an opening-drive touchdown. After that possession, Kentucky managed just 187 total yards on 56 plays.

The defense also produced seven picks vs. Tennessee and Kentucky, including a season-high four against the 'Cats.

On Nov. 9, the unit helped Vanderbilt to its first win in Gainesville since 1945 by limiting Florida to 39 rushing yards and forcing four critical turnovers in a 34-17 victory.

In mid-October, facing one of the SEC's most potent attacks, the unit held Georgia to season lows in every virtual offensive category, including rushing yards (107), first downs (16), total yards (221) and points scored (27). UGA QB **Aaron Murray**, the league's all-time leader in passing yardage, threw for only 114 yards, his third lowest total in a 49-game career, and failed to complete a TD pass for just the third time in his last 31 appearances.

Trailing by 10 points at intermission, the 'Dore defense frustrated Murray to just five first downs and 80 total yards after halftime.

The 221 yards of total offense by Georgia was the fewest Vanderbilt has allowed to an SEC opponent since Auburn managed just 212 yards in a 17-13 'Dore victory on Oct. 20, 2012.

QB CARTA-SAMUELS IMPRESSIVE; POSTED CONSECUTIVE 300+YARDS

Austyn Carta-Samuels (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB in 2009-10 at Wyoming, is averaging 226.3 passing yards and 236.0 yards of total offense in nine starts. He has also completed 10 TD passes and ran for five more scores. He has has been extremely accurate, hitting on 68.1% of his passes.

Carta-Samuels has returned to the starting lineup in the last two games, completing 40 of 51 passes for 386 yards.

He threw for 338 yards and two TDs against Missouri on Oct. 5, one week after throwing for 334 yards and two TDs in a win over UAB on Sept. 28.

TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

VANDERBILT ANNOUNCES FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Lincecum Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.

OLE MISS EDGES VANDERBILT IN WILD SEASON OPENER

NASHVILLE – Mississippi coach Hugh Freeze may have a highly-rated crop of freshmen to coach. Senior Jeff Scott made sure his new teammates left their first college game as winners.

Jeff Scott ran 75 yards for a touchdown with 1:07 left, and Mississippi rallied twice Thursday night to beat Vanderbilt 39-35 in a wild season opener for both teams.

Game 1 Aug. 29, 2013 Nashville

Vanderbilt went up 35-32 on a 34-yard TD pass from Austyn Carta-Samuels to Steven Scheu with 1:30 left. But Scott beat the Commodores for a TD and the fourth lead change.

Vanderbilt had a final chance to extend the Southeastern Conference's longest winning streak, but Cody Prewitt intercepted a pass off Jordan Matthews' hands with 26 seconds left. That allowed the Rebels to snap a three-game skid to Vanderbilt, the last a painful 27-26 loss in Oxford last year.

COMMODORES TOP AUSTIN PEAY; SCORE 35 POINTS IN 2ND QUARTER

NASHVILLE – Like last week, Vanderbilt got off to a slow start, but this result was much different.

Austyn Carta-Samuels ran for two touchdowns and threw for another as Vanderbilt beat Austin Peay 38-3 Saturday night.

Leading 3-0 at the end of the first quarter, the Commodores opened the game up in the second, scoring touchdowns on four straight possessions.

Game 2 Sept. 7, 2013 Nashville

"It is something that I have noticed this week and last week," Carta-Samuels said. "Our second quarters have been phenomenal but our first quarters have been slow. It is definitely going to be a focal point moving forward, starting really well at the beginning of practice because that is where everything happens first, and then carrying it over into Saturdays."

Carta-Samuels, making his third career start for Vanderbilt, had a 1-yard touchdown run with 9:23 remaining in the second. Later on in the quarter he connected with receiver Jordan Matthews on a 39-yard touchdown play.

DORES' RALLY LATE FAILS; TAKE 35-25 LOSS AT CAROLINA

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Steve Spurrier won't hang his head after No. 13 South Carolina's 35-25 win over Vanderbilt (1-2, 0-2), no matter how close the Gamecocks came to blowing a four-touchdown lead.

The Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) scored on their first-four possessions as Connor Shaw threw for three touchdowns and Jadeveon Clowney forced a third-quarter fumble Saturday night despite pain in his right foot because of troublesome bone spurs he's had since high school.

Game 3 Sept. 14, 2013 Columbia, S.C.

South Carolina appeared to have this one finished early, scoring on its first four possessions to lead 28-0. It still led 35-10 when it opened the second half with Shaw's final TD pass, a 33-yarder to Brandon Wilds.

That's when the Commodores (1-2, 0-2) threw a scare into the Gamecocks, aided by a fumbled kickoff and punt by South Carolina. Vanderbilt scored twice in a 13-second span of the fourth quarter to pull within 10 points.

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. – Austyn Carta-Samuels threw for two touchdowns and Vanderbilt used a pair of TDs in the fourth quarter to pull away in a 24-7 victory over Massachusetts on Saturday.

Carta-Samuels completed 18 of 27 passes for 219 yards and rushed for 38 more. He also caught a pass for a 21-yard gain that set up his 11-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Matthews to put the Commodores (2-2) up 17-7 with 13:44 left to play.

Seymour started the game's scoring with a 7-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter. With just over nine minutes remaining in the second Seymour took a direct snap and ran for a 58-yard score on the only play of that drive.

It was the first career two-touchdown game for the sophomore, who set a career high with 107 yards rushing.

Vanderbilt quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, completing 23-29 passes for a career high 334 yards.

TIGERS REMAIN UNBEATEN; IMPRESSIVE IN ROAD VICTORY

NASHVILLE – James Franklin threw for four touchdowns and Missouri squashed any doubts about its early season schedule with a 51-28 victory at Vanderbilt.

The Tigers moved to 5-0 and opened conference play without missing a beat in the program's first trip to Nashville as a member of the SEC. Vanderbilt, which won the last match up 19-15 in Columbia, Mo., last year, slipped to 0-3 in conference play and 3-3 overall.

Game 6 Oct. 5, 2013 Nashville

Missouri coach Gary Pinkel, who opened a season 5-0 for the fifth time in 13 seasons, credited his veteran quarterback for guiding the aggressive Tiger offense yet again.

Franklin guided Missouri on scoring drives on the first six Tiger possessions, which resulted in three touchdowns and three field goals. Missouri out-gained the Commodores 285-97 in the first half in taking a 30-7 lead.

Franklin finished 19-for-28 for 278 yards passing and added another 63 yards on the ground.

Vanderbilt rallied from a 13-point deficit by scoring 17 unanswered points in the fourth quarter Saturday for a 31-27 victory.

The Commodores (4-3, 1-3) hadn't beaten a Top 25 team since Oct. 4, 2008, when they edged then-No. 13 Auburn in Nashville. They also got

their first victory over Georgia in Nashville since 1991, snapping a six-game skid to the Bulldogs.

"When you take over a program like we did ... every win has been unbelievably significant to us and every win should be significant to our fan base and to our community and to our alumni because it's an opportunity," Franklin said when asked about the meaning of the biggest win since he took over in December 2010.

COMMODORES DEFEAT TENNESSEE; SCORE WINNING TD ON LATE DRIVE

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) – In his wildest dreams, Vanderbilt quarterback Patton Robinette couldn't have imagined a happier homecoming.

In its worst nightmares, Tennessee couldn't have pictured a more heartbreaking home finale.

Robinette, who grew up about 20 miles from Tennessee's campus in Maryville, Tenn., ran for a 5-yard touchdown with 16 seconds remaining Saturday as Vanderbilt rallied for a 14-10 victory over the Volunteers. Vanderbilt's winning drive was kept alive after Tennessee's fourth-and-inches stop of quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels in the final minute was overturned on replay, giving Vanderbilt a first down at the

Tennessee 33.

Vanderbilt (7-4, 4-4 SEC) overcame four turnovers to beat Tennessee for the second straight year, giving the Commodores consecutive victories over their in-state rivals for the first time since winning six straight over the Volunteers from 1920-26. The Commodores' 16 wins over the last two years are their most over a two-season stretch since 1927-28.
