## DEREK MASON ERA BEGINS IN NASHVILLE

As a key member of the Stanford University staff from 2010-13, Derek Mason helped guide the Cardinal to a 45-8 overall record and four straight BCS postseason games, including appearances in the last two Rose Bowls.

Named as the 28th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Jan. 17, the former Cardinal Associate Head Coach and Willie Shaw Director of Defense will direct his first game on the sidelines in Nashville when the Commodores host Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28.

One of 20 new head coaches in NCAA FBS college football this season, the 44-year-old Mason, is one of just five FBS coaches enjoying their first year as a head coach.

Mason replaces James Franklin, who went 24-15 over three years on the Vanderbilt campus, leading the Commodores to three straight bowls.

Regarded as one of the nation's leading defensive minds while at Stanford, Mason quickly went to work in Nashville. Within three weeks of getting the position, Mason secured signatures from 22 prep standouts on National Signing Day from across the nation. Since then, Mason has attracted a stellar coaching staff, and installed new schemes during a busy Spring Practice. He's also worked diligently to build strong relationships in the Vanderbilt and Nashville communities.

**SERIES NOTES:** This marks just the third meeting between Temple and Vanderbilt, though the series dates to the 1930s when both programs were among the nation's best. The first meeting (1935) between the schools resulted in a narrow 6-3 Temple win in Philadelphia. That Temple team was coached by legendary Glenn "Pop" Warner. Vanderbilt's Ray Morrison was just three games into replacing Commodore legend Dan McGugin on the sidelines. Five years later, Morrison was Temple's head coach.

## VANDERBILT IN SEASON OPENERS

Vanderbilt starts its 125th football season on August 28 against Temple looking to improve on a 78-42-4 all-time mark in openers.

This marks the first time since 2011 that Vanderbilt has not opened the regular season with a Southeastern Conference opponent, having hosted Ole Miss in 2013 and South Carolina in 2012. In the last 25 years, Vanderbilt has an 8-8 record against non-SEC opponents in the season opener.

Some other notes on Vanderbilt in season-openers:

- ★ Vanderbilt is opening at home for the sixth straight season. It also marks the Commodores' third straight Thursday night opener.
- ★ Vanderbilt has won four of its last seven season openers. The three losses have come by a total of 10 points.

## PLAYING ON THURSDAY NIGHTS

Vanderbilt will open the season playing in front of a national television audience at home on Thursday night for the third straight year.

In 2013, the Commodores fell to Ole Miss 39-35 in what ESPN eventually ranked as one of the season's most exciting games.

In 2012, the 'Dores nearly defeated No. 9 South Carolina.

It also marks the fourth time since 2008 that Vanderbilt has opened the season on a Thursday night. That year, the Commodores opened with a win at Miami (Ohio).

The Temple game will mark Vanderbilt's ninth Thursday night appearance, dating back to a 1996 home stint against nationally ranked Notre Dame.

## 'DORES ARE 16-4 IN LAST 20 GAMES; TIED FOR SEC'S SECOND BEST RECORD

Vanderbilt sports one of the SEC's best records since October 2012.

Vanderbilt owns a 16-4 overall record in its last 20 games dating back to a victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

Vanderbilt's successful stretch includes a season-ending five-game win streak in 2013 and seven-game win streak in 2012.

Among SEC teams, the Commodores' record during its last 20 games is tied for second with South Carolina. The only conference member with a better record over the span is 2012 BCS national champion Alabama (18-2).

More impressively, the 'Dores' margin of victory in the 16 wins has been 18.1 points.

Twelve of the 20 victories have come against power conference affiliates: Auburn, Kentucky (twice), Ole Miss, Tennessee (twice), Georgia and Florida from the SEC, Wake Forest (twice) and N.C. State from the ACC, and Houston from the American Athletic Conference.

Vanderbilt is also 17-5 in its last 22 games.

## TEAMMATES SELECT THREE CAPTAINS: EAST, TOWNSEND, WOESTMANN ELECTED

Returning starters **Joe Townsend** (Sr., center), **Kyle Woestmann** (Sr., outside linebacker) and **Andrew East** (Sr., snapper) have been elected co-captains for the upcoming season.

Coach Derek Mason announced the team's new captains on Aug. 18.

The staff will announce a fourth Commodore to join East, Townsend and Woestmann prior to each game of the 2014 season.

East, a native of Indianapolis, will serve as special teams' captain for the second consecutive season. This marks the first year that either Townsend, from Hendersonville, Tenn., or Woestmann, of Marietta, Ga., have served as a Commodore captain.

Mason said East, Townsend and Woestmann were elected in a recent ballot by Vanderbilt teammates. "I'm pleased for all three of these players. These men stepped forward as team leaders during the summer workouts and in (preseason) camp," the head coach said.

East is a three-year starter for the Commodores, and regarded as one of the nation's most versatile snappers. He has handled virtually every snap on conversion and punt units since arriving on campus.

East also stands out off the field. He graduated with a civil engineering degree last May and is currently enrolled in postgraduate studies at Vanderbilt's Owen School of Management. He is one of the team's most active participants in community service efforts around Nashville.

Townsend has 22 total starts, most among active Commodores, entering his final season. All of his starts have come at the center position.

This summer, Townsend was named as a preseason candidate for the Rimington Trophy, given each year to the nation's top center.

Woestmann, who started every game last year at end, is expected to start at outside linebacker in Mason's new 3-4 defensive scheme.

Woestmann ranks as the team's active leader with 12 QB sacks and 15 tackles for loss. He also ranks second on the team in career tackles.

## PRESEASON POLLS OFFER FEW VOTES FOR VANDERBILT

Despite finishing the last two years ranked in the final Top 25 polls, Vanderbilt again is getting little national respect from either sports-writers or coaches entering the 2014 season.

The Commodores received just two votes in the recent Associated Press Poll. The USA Today-Coaches ballot did not include a single vote for the Commodores, a program coming off back-to-back 9-4 campaigns.

The 'Dores were not ranked in either 2012 or 2013 preseason poll. They also were not ranked in either preseason ballot this year.

Vanderbilt is one of four teams that ended 2013 ranked among the Top 25 not included in the 2014 preseason polls. Others are Oklahoma State, Duke and Louisville.

## SEVERAL COMMODORE COACHES OWN NFL EXPERIENCE

Five coaches with National Football League experience are among the impressive 10-person staff assembled by first-year Vanderbilt head coach **Derek Mason**.

Mason also brings NFL experiences to the Commodore staff. Prior to joining Jim Harbaugh's Stanford staff in 2010, Mason worked three years as a defensive backs assistant coach in Minnesota, helping the Vikings to NFC North titles in 2008 and 2009.

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** has the most pro experience. Maxie joined Mason's staff after a two-year run as defensive backs coach with the cross-town Tennessee Titans. Prior to the Titans' role, Maxie coached 14 years in the NFL, with stops in Dallas, Miami, Atlanta, San Francisco and Carolina.

Offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Karl Dorrell** has spent nine total years in the NFL, as well as serving as head coach at UCLA from 2003-07. In 2012-13, Dorrell coached quarterbacks in Houston. From 2008-11, he worked as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach in Miami. Dorrell's first NFL experience came as a receivers coach in Denver from 2000-02.

**Marc Lubick** coached with Dorrell as an offensive assistant for the last two years in Houston. Lubick also spent the 2003-04 seasons in St. Louis' scouting department.

**Charles Bankins** developed much of his knowledge on special teams during his time as an assistant with the St. Louis Rams in 2005.

**Bill Hughan** has worked on the sport performance staffs of three NFL clubs: New York Jets, Atlanta Falcons and Oakland Raiders.

## MASON TIES TO COORDINATORS DATE TO PLAYING DAYS, EARLY COACHING ROLES

Coordinators **Karl Dorrell** and **David Kotulski** played influential roles in the early coaching development of **Derek Mason**.

The relationship between Mason and Dorrell dates to the early 1990s when both were at Northern Arizona University – Mason as a cornerback practicing daily against NAU receivers coached by Dorrell.

Much of Mason's expertise on the 3-4 defensive scheme came in 1999-2000 when Kotulski hired him to coach defensive backs at Bucknell University. More than a decade later, Mason repaid Kotulski by bringing him to Palo Alto to mentor Stanford inside linebackers.

Mason also has long ties with new offensive assistants **Gerry Gdowski** and **Keven Lightner**. Ten years ago, Mason, Gdowski and Lightner were members of the offensive staff at New Mexico State, then joined Frank Solich's Ohio University staff for the 2005-06 seasons.

## MAXIE GOES FROM TITANS TO COMMODORES

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** joined Mason's staff without leaving Nashville. Maxie, who played 13 years as a safety in the NFL, spent the last two years mentoring Tennessee Titans' defensive backs. After spending 16 years in the NFL coaching ranks, this marks Maxie's first season as a collegiate coach.

## ANCHOR DASH FOR FRESHMEN CLASS AMONG ACTIVITIES FOR OPENER

The **Anchor Dash** – an annual rite of passage for first-year Vanderbilt students – is one of the pregame highlights scheduled before the Temple season opener.

Vanderbilt's entire freshman class of nearly 1,650 students participates in the Anchor Dash, which features students running the length of Dudley Field from the south end zone tunnel to the north end zone in order to get to the student section in Vanderbilt Stadium.

Led by Vanderbilt Chancellor Nicholas Zeppos, the Anchor Dash activity starts about 15 minutes before kickoff.

### OTHER PREGAME TRADITIONS

In addition to being in the stands to watch the Anchor Dash, several other traditions are on tap for early-arriving Commodore fans to the Temple game.

Here's an upclose look at two activities that request fan participation:

#### • GREET THE TEAM AT 'DORE ALLEY

The entire Vanderbilt team walks the entire Vandyville tailgate area nearly three hours before kickoff, starting at Children's Way and Natchez Trace.

#### • STAR WALK

An hour before kickoff fans gather between Vanderbilt Stadium and McGugin Athletics Center to cheer the team's arrival to the stadium.

## LEADERSHIP, PRODUCTION EXPECTED FROM VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE CORPS

An offensive line unit that features four returning starters and a fifth player with previous starting experience should be a Commodore strength during the upcoming season.

The corps features four returning starters: senior center **Joe Townsend**, junior guards **Jake Bernstein** and **Spencer Pulley**, and sophomore tackle **Andrew Jelks**. Also back is senior **Andrew Bridges**, who has 17 career starts at right tackle.

Collectively, the five returnees have combined for 82 career starts, third highest total in the SEC behind only South Carolina (90) and Texas A&M (87).

During spring drills, new position coach **Keven Lightner** identified Jelks as the replacement for departed left tackle **Wesley Johnson**, the All-SEC performer who finished his career by setting team records with 51 career and consecutive starts.

While Jelks moves to left tackle, Bridges and sophomore **Will Holden** have competed for the starting spot at right tackle.

With Townsend, Bernstein and Pulley, the Commodores are veteran interior blockers who have experienced plenty of success. The trio has combined for 56 career starts at center and guard.

The corps also feature quality depth, with sophomores **Barrett Gouger** (OG), and **Kevin McCoy** (OG/OT), redshirt freshmen **Delando Crooks** (OG) and **Sean Dowling** (OT), available.

## SEC NETWORK "SEC STORIED" SET TO AIR EPISODE ON GAINES, MULLINS SEPT. 4

The SEC Network plans to debut the "SEC Storied" series episode "It's Time" in early September. The 70-minute documentary chronicles the incredible relationship that developed between former Vanderbilt fullback Brad Gaines and former Ole Miss defensive back Chucky Mullins.

The emotional episode is scheduled to air Sept. 4 on the new SEC Network. Two days later, the Commodores and Rebels square off in Nashville's LP Field at 3:30 p.m., on ESPN.

"It's Time" depicts the aftermath of a bruising hit by Mullins on Gaines during the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game on Oct. 28, 1989.

During the play near the Ole Miss goal line, Mullins suffered a broken neck, leaving him a quadriplegic. But in that heartbreaking moment, a friendship was born that lasted another two years, until Mullins died of a blood clot in a Memphis hospital room, with Gaines at his side.

The tragedy took a tremendous toll on Gaines, who befriended Mullins and his family, and Mullins' coaches and teammates at Ole Miss. Each year, Gaines attends a spring banquet on the Oxford campus when one Ole Miss player is honored to wear Mullins' No. 38 jersey the following year. Gaines also continues to care for Mullins' gravesite in Russellville, Ala.

Brad Gaines, several members of the Gaines family, and former Commodore quarterback John Gromos, the current color analyst for Vanderbilt football games who threw the pass intended for Gaines, are interviewed in the film. Interviews with Mullins' guardians, former *Tennessean* sportswriter Larry Woody, former Ole Miss head coach Billy Brewer and several Ole Miss teammates are included in the production.



## BUTLER, DIXON, TAYLOR TOP DEFENSIVE LINE

Vanderbilt's defensive front will build around three linemen who return with starting experience from a year ago: **Vince Taylor** (Sr.), **Barron Dixon** (Sr.) and **Adam Butler** (So.).

Taylor, who enjoyed 10 starts at tackle last year, is expected to play the nose in Vanderbilt's 3-4 alignment. One of the strongest Commodores, Taylor contributed 18 tackles in 2013. Butler became a positive force as a redshirt freshman, earning six starts at tackle. He contributed

25 tackles last year, including six tackles for loss. Dixon only earned one start, but finished the year with 26 tackles and 2.5 QB sacks as part of a four-player rotation. They have plenty of support this year, including athletic **Jay Woods** (R-Fr.), who has been impressive in preseason camp.

## ROBINETTE NAMED STARTING QB; EARNS JOB AFTER STIFF COMPETITION

The Commodores' starting quarterback for the Temple game will be sophomore **Patton Robinette**, who helped guide Vanderbilt to four key late-season victories last year.

Robinette, a third-year player from Maryville, Tenn., was named as the team's starter for the opener on Aug. 21 by Head Coach **Derek Mason**.

Robinette competed with two others – **Stephen Rivers** (Grad.) and **Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr.) – through preseason camp under the watchful eyes of Mason and offensive coordinator-quarterbacks coach **Karl Dorrell**.

Robinette and McCrary shared snaps during spring drills with a third prospect, junior **Josh Grady**, who moved to wide receiver early in the team's camp. During the summer, Rivers joined the team after graduating from LSU where he played behind Zach Mettenberger for two years.

Robinette has the most collegiate experience, having started three games and playing a key role in a fourth contest late in the 2013 season. After guiding the 'Dores to 17 second half points in an upset over Georgia, Robinette also started in Vanderbilt's November win at Florida and the BBVA Compass Bowl victory over Houston. He completed 52.3 percent of his passes and accounted for 11 touchdowns.

Though McCrary redshirted in 2013, he has displayed a strong arm and dual-threat abilities during spring drills and preseason camp.

Rivers, the brother of San Diego Chargers QB Philip Rivers, owns skills suited to the team's current Pro-set offense.

## SEC NETWORK'S 'SEC NATION' SHOW COMING TO LP FIELD SEPT. 6

The SEC Network's two-hour Saturday morning college football show, *SEC Nation*, will air from the grounds of LP Field in Nashville prior to the Ole Miss-Vanderbilt game Saturday, Sept. 6.

Vanderbilt Athletics officials hope Commodore students and fans converge on the *SEC Nation* set in large numbers. The show invites all college football fans to participate in its audience.

"We could not be happier than hearing news that the SEC Nation show is broadcasting next to Vandyville prior to the game Sept. 6. This is more evidence to what an important early-season matchup the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game is in the SEC," VU associate athletics director Steve Walsh said.

*SEC Nation* is designed similar to ESPN's highly popular *College GameDay* production that also airs on Saturday mornings.

The show will broadcast from 9-11 a.m. CT from a LP Field parking lot next to the Shelby Street Pedestrian Bridge, which connects the 67,000-seat stadium with downtown Nashville. The *SEC Nation* set also will be next to Vandyville, Vanderbilt's official tailgate location for the Ole Miss game, just outside the south gates of LP Field.

After the show, the Commodores and Rebels will kickoff at 3:30 p.m. CT at LP Field. The VU-Ole Miss game is the only pairing of SEC schools on Sept. 6, and will be televised nationally on ESPN.

*SEC Nation* will feature ESPN play-by-play announcer Joe Tessitore hosting the stage with several prominent SEC Network and Southeastern Conference football personalities, including 2007 Heisman Trophy winner Tim Tebow, former LSU and Dallas Cowboys defensive lineman Marcus Spears, sports talk provocateur Paul Finebaum.

SEC Network will premiere *SEC Nation* on Thursday, August 28 from Columbia, S.C., where the Gamecocks and Texas A&M square off to open the season at 5 p.m. CT. Later that night, Vanderbilt opens its campaign by hosting Temple on the network.

## MORRISON, CODY COACHED AT TEMPLE

Two former Vanderbilt gridiron legends, **Ray Morrison** and **Josh Cody**, also served as head coaches at Temple.

Morrison, a Commodore All-America QB in 1911 and the man picked to replace legendary Dan McGugin as Vanderbilt head coach in 1930, left Vanderbilt to become Temple's head coach in 1940. He was 31-38-9 overall in nine years at Temple.

Cody, a three-time Vanderbilt All-America (1915-16, 1919) served as Temple's head coach in 1955.

## MAKING TEAM HISTORY: THREE STRAIGHT BOWLS; CONSECUTIVE NINE-WIN SEASONS

Vanderbilt looks to continue the success it has enjoyed in recent years, such as making three straight bowl appearances and notching consecutive 9-win seasons.

Neither of those feats had been accomplished in the team's history until last year.

Remarkably, before consecutive 9-4 campaigns in 2012-13, Vanderbilt had only two nine-win seasons in the first 123 years of the program. Both of those

came a century ago in the Dan McGugin Era (9-0, 1904; 9-1, 1915).

Vanderbilt enters this season as one of six SEC teams seeking a 4th straight postseason appearance.

## TEAM'S TOP 2014 SACK SPECIALISTS WILL ATTACK QBS FROM NEW POSITION

Defensive scheme changes are expected to result in Vanderbilt's top three sack specialists from a year ago attacking opposing quarterbacks from a new position this year.

Derek Mason's highly regarded defense at Stanford offered opposing offenses multiple looks out of a 3-4 base formation.

The team's three top sack specialists from a year ago – senior **Kyle Woestmann**, junior **Caleb Azubike** and sophomore **Stephen Weatherly** – have shifted from defensive end to outside linebackers in the new scheme.

Mason's outside linebackers at Stanford were known as aggressive playmakers, frequently causing havoc for Cardinal opponents.

Other former ends such as **Jimmy Stewart** (Jr.), **Landon Stokes** (R-Fr.) and **Jonathan Wynn** (R-Fr.) could see repetitions at the OLB position.

## YOUNG HALFBACKS EXPECT TO SEE ACTION

Two young Vanderbilt halfbacks – **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr.) and **Dallas Rivers** (Fr.) – have impressed through preseason camp and are expected to see action early this year.

Webb and Rivers have competed with **Brian Kimbrow** (Jr.) and **Derek King** (Jr.) for the most snaps in August. Webb was a standout last spring, rushing for more than 100 yards in the Black & Gold Spring Game. Rivers brings plenty of physicality to the halfback.

**Jerron Seymour** (Jr.) and Kimbrow are the team's most experienced running backs. Seymour rushed for 716 yards and 14 TDs last year, while Kimbrow ended the year with 341 rushing yards and three TDs.

Dudchock and Rivers are both first-year contributors. Dudchock is working toward a master's in higher education administration from the Peabody College after graduating from Stanford last spring. Rivers graduated from LSU in May, and is taking postgraduate courses at Vanderbilt's Divinity School.

The 2013 Vanderbilt roster did not include a single graduate student.

## VANDERBILT'S ACTIVE WIN STREAK RANKS 2ND AMONG SEC SCHOOLS

For the second straight year, Vanderbilt enters the season owning one of the SEC's longest active win streaks.

In 2013, Vanderbilt opened the season with a seven-game streak. It ranked as the SEC's longest active streak.

This year, the Commodores ride a five-game win streak entering the Temple opener.

The longest win streak in Vanderbilt history came before World War I. From late in the 1903 campaign to early in the 1905 season, the Commodores captured 13 straight games. That stretch includes the first 11 games legendary Dan McGugin coached at Vanderbilt.
