Head Coach Melanie Balcomb



The 2007-08 season marks the sixth year for Melanie Balcomb in the Music City. The New Jersey native brought her uptempo style to the Southeastern Conference prior to the 2002-03 season, and success followed close on her heels.

Last season, the Commodores made their eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament after winning the school's fifth SEC Tournament championship. It was Balcomb's second time to cut down the nets as a Commodore, and promises not be her last. She won her 100th game as Vanderbilt's head coach on Nov. 30, 2006, a 85-63 victory at UAB.

Now in her 15th season as a collegiate head coach, Balcomb is nearing 300 career victories and has won more than 65 percent of her games all-time. Before coming to Nashville, Balcomb led her Xavier team to the NCAA Tournament three times, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001.

Balcomb has coached 15 players who have received all-conference accolades, and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft. Last year, Carla Thomas was a first-round selection while Dee Davis was chosen with the first pick in the second round.

DEFENDING CHAMPS

The Vanderbilt women's basketball team opens their Southeastern Conference title defense on Friday, March 7, at 9 p.m. inside Nashville's Sommet Center. Vanderbilt won the 2007 SEC Tournament title in Duluth, Ga., but that is not the only history on the Commodores' side. In two previous trips to Nashville's downtown arena for the SEC Tournament, the Commodores are an undefeated 7-0 with championships under their belt (2002 & 2004).

TOURNAMENT STATS

This year's possible second-round opponents for Vanderbilt are No. 6 Auburn and No. 11 Arkansas. Since the tournament began to include 12 teams in 1992, the No. 6 seed holds an 11-5 advantage over the No. 11. South Carolina (1998), Ole Miss (2001), Auburn (2002), Arkansas (2005) and Florida (2007) have all won first-round games from the No. 11 seed. In those same 16 years, the No. 3 seed is 11-5 in second-round games -- going 5-0 against No. 11 seeds and 6-5 against No. 6 seeds..

FIVE EARN POSTSEASON HONORS

Vanderbilt junior Christina Wirth earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors Tuesday, highlighting a group of five Commodores that earned postseason recognition from conference coaches.

Along with Wirth's first-team recognition, classmate Jennifer Risper was a second-team All-SEC recipient. Risper also was honored on the league's All-Defensive team. Sophomore Jessica Mooney shared the title of SEC Sixth Woman of the Year with LSU's Alison Hightower, while both Jence Rhoads and Hannah Tuomi were named to the SEC All-Freshmen team.

Wirth, a native of Mesa, Ariz., leads the SEC in three-point shooting accuracy and ranks in the league's Top 10 in scoring. She averaged 13.6 points per league game while playing the full 40 minutes of four contests.

A product of Moreno Valley, Calif., Risper leads the SEC in steals and ranks among league leaders in rebounding, assists, free throw percentage and minutes played. The 5-9 guard has three double-doubles on the season and tallied three or more steals on 16 occasions.

Mooney has come off the bench in all 16 league games and scored in double-figures eight times. VU Head Coach Melanie Balcomb has continually praised the Nashville native for providing the Commodores with a spark as part of the team's "starting seven." Sixth Woman of the Year, now in its third year, has been awarded to a Commodore each season.

The Commodores' freshmen class has made a big contribution this season, with two first-year players cracking Balcomb's starting lineup for the first time in four years. Both Rhoads and Tuomi were lauded for their efforts this season.

A point guard from Slippery Rock, Pa., Rhoads has dished out 100 assists this year and boasts an impressive 1.7:1 assist-to-turnover ratio. Tuomi, a post who hails from Thornton, Colo., has averaged six points and five rebounds per game, including her first career double-double at then-No. 2 Tennessee.

MARSH NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore guard Merideth Marsh was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week after a pair of impressive performances against Auburn and Alabama.

Marsh averaged 17.5 points per game during the week, nearly double her 9.0 points per game average. The Louisville, Ky., native tied a career high with 19 points on Thursday in a win at Auburn, which included 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range. It marked the second time this season that Marsh hit five three-pointers.

In Sunday's victory over Alabama, Marsh sank four more three-pointers to score a game-high 16 points. For the week, the Christian Academy product hit 60 percent of her three-pointers and 12-of-18 shots from the field overall. Marsh closed the regular season averaging 10.0 points per game and ranking second in three-point accuracy in conference games.

The last Vanderbilt student-athlete to earn SEC Player of the Week honors was another Commodore marksman, current graduate assistant coach Caroline Williams (February, 2007). Forward Hannah Tuomi was honored as the league's Freshman of the Week earlier this season after posting a double-double at Tennessee.

VU'S 20/20 VISION

Vanderbilt notched its 20th victory of the season on Thursday, Feb. 21, at Arkansas. The Does have won 20-or-more games in all six seasons under Coach Balcomb, and have a total of twenty-two (22) 20-plus-win seasons overall (including nine in a row and 16 of the last 17). A complete list is below:

Commodore Notes

BEST SEC START

With a win over Kentucky last Thursday, the Commodores moved to 8-2 in the SEC -- stretching their best start since the league moved to a 14-game schedule (prior to the 1998 season).

Vanderbilt made it to the halfway point at 5-2 in 2002 only to drop its next game. In 1998, the Commodores made it to 6-2 before losing their third conference game.

In the previous 11-game schedule, Vanderbilt posted a mark of 9-2 on two occasions -- 1993 and 1994. Both years, the Commodores won eight of their first 10 games.

BEST SEC FINISH

The win over Alabama on Sunday gave Vanderbilt a school-record 11 conference wins. The Commodores had never claimed more than 10 SEC victories in a season prior to this year. VU's 78.6 league winning percentage (11-3) marks the team's second-best record. The Commodores won 81.8 percent of their games (9-2) in both the 1993 and 1994 seasons.

The Feb. 28 win at Auburn gave the Commodores double-digit conference wins for the fourth time in seven years. Vanderbilt first achieved the 10-SEC-win mark in 2002, and Melanie Balcomb's squads have since repeated the feat three times (2005, 2007 and 2008).

OVERALL ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Of the 11 teams currently competing in winter and spring competition for Vanderbilt, seven squads are ranked in the Top 25 of their respective sports. In the most recent Associated Press poll, the women's basketball team moved up two spots to rank 21st in the nation. Four other women's programs are also among the best in the country, including bowling (No. 3), lacrosse (No. 11), tennis (No. 20) and golf (No. 23). On the men's side, the baseball (No. 7) and basketball (No. 16) teams also are nationally ranked.

NIGHT OWLS IN CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

The 2008 Southeastern Conference Tournament will mark the fifth consecutive year that the Commodores will play in the event's latest time slot. Since 2004, the 6-11 game has been played last on Thursday, with the three seed playing the winner in Friday's final game.

Vanderbilt was the No. 6 seed in 2004 and 2006, and the No. 3 seed in 2005 and 2007. Four of the Commodores' five SEC Tournament championships have featured late-night contests -- including 1993 (3rd seed), 2002 (3rd seed), 2004 (sixth seed) and 2007 (third seed). In 1995, Vanderbilt earned the two seed and played in Friday's second of four games.

FRESHMEN POINT GUARDS

Over the past 11 years, the Commodores have primarily utilized the services of a freshman point guard in four seasons, including this year. Jence Rhoads (Slippery Rock, Pa.) is the latest in a line of point guards to be thrown directly into the collegiate spotlight, and she's handling the task quite well.

In conference games, Rhoads boasts an assist-to-turnover ratio of nearly 2-to-1 -- ranking fourth in the SEC behind a trio of LSU seniors. Her 4.5 assists per league game rank second in the conference.

Rhoads is following in some big footsteps. The last two Commodores who started at point as freshmen went on to break records at Vanderbilt. Ashley McElhiney ran point from 2000 to 2003, handing out 673 assists in her illustrious career. Dee Davis took over the following season, running the floor between 2004 and 2007. Davis' 730 career assists broke McElhiney's record and rank sixth all-time in the SEC.

Balcomb becomes the fifth active coach in the Southeastern Conference to boast 300-or-more career victories, joining UT's Pat Summitt, Georgia's Andy Landers, LSU's Van Chancellor and Mississippi State's Sharon Fanning.

MEDIA PRESEASON PICKS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth overall in the Southeastern Conference, according to media voting that preceded 2007 Media Day.

Melanie Balcomb's sixth squad at Vanderbilt was predicted to finish behind Tennessee, LSU and Georgia.

Commodore junior forward Christina Wirth was chosen as an All-SEC Second Team honoree by the media.

PRESEASON COACHES' PICKS

Vanderbilt was also chosen fourth overall by a vote of Southeastern Conference coaches.

In the coaches' All-SEC selections, Christina Wirth earned first-team honors, while Liz Sherwood was chosen to the second team.

NOTES ON THE SEC TOURNAMENT...

In 28 years at the SEC Tournament, Vanderbilt holds an all-time record of 36-23, including five tournament titles (1993, 1995, 2002, 2004 and 2007). The Commodores holds the league's second-best winning percentage in SEC Tournament games (.610), behind only 12-time champ Tennessee.

Vanderbilt has advanced to the tournament finals on seven occasions, losing only twice (1994, 2001). The Commodores have made it at least to the semifinals on 14 occasions (where they are 7-7), and hold a 14-9 record in second-round play.

Since SEC women's basketball dropped East-

West seeding in 1986, the Commodores have played from the No. 3 seed on five prior occasions. They hold a 10-2 overall record as the three, including tournament championship runs in 1993, 2002 and 2007.

Vanderbilt accounts for three of the four SEC Tournament titles by a No. 3 seed, with Georgia claiming the other crown in 2001 over fourth-seeded Vanderbilt.

Vanderbilt's SEC Tournament MVP's are Mara Cunningham (1993), Sheri Sam (1995), Chantelle Anderson (2001), Zuzi Klimesova (2002) and Carla Thomas (2004 & 2007).

Christina Wirth and Vanderbilt's hot shooters were on target most of the time in their 105-77 win over Florida, finishing just shy of the SEC tournament record. Georgia shot 67.3 percent from the field against Mississippi in the 1986 tournament.

Wirth led the Commodores (25-5) with 19 points while making all five of her 3-pointers. Caroline Williams and Carla Thomas scored 16 points apiece. Dee Davis added 15 and Jessica Mooney had 11.

The Commodores shot 70.4 percent from the field in the half, including 7-for-8 on 3-point attempts. Vanderbilt's final 3 of the night, by Meredith Marsh with 1:7 left to play, pushed the Commodores past the 100-point mark for the third time this season and the first time in a conference game.

DULUTH, Ga. (AP) -- After riding its 3-point shooters to the SEC tournament final, Vanderbilt had to find another way to complete its championship run. Dee Davis provided the answer.

Davis scored 19 points, including a crucial breakaway basket with 23 seconds left, to lead No. 13 Vanderbilt to a 51-45 victory over LSU in the SEC tournament championship game Sunday night.

Davis, better known for her passes than her points, was a surprise scoring leader on a team that has leaned on the outside shooting of Christina Wirth and Caroline Williams and the inside power game of Carla Thomas. It was only the second time this season Davis led the Commodores in scoring.

LSU lost to Tennessee in the 2005 and 2006 finals. It has lost the three championship games by a combined margin of nine points.

Thomas added 13 points and was named tournament MVP for Vanderbilt, which has six tournament titles overall, most recently in 2002 and 2004. Wirth scored with 2:04 left to give Vanderbilt a 46-43 lead. Following a missed 3-pointer by LSU's Erica White, Davis missed a 3 but Williams grabbed the rebound for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt, still holding the ball and the three-point lead, called a timeout with 44 seconds left. Davis caught the inbound pass but White forced her to turn the ball over.

Rashonta LeBlanc missed a 3-pointer for LSU, and Vanderbilt's Jennifer Risper pushed the lead to 50-45 with two free throws. LeBlanc led LSU (26-7) with 19 points. Fowles had 13 points and nine rebounds to just miss her 20th consecutive double-double.

Vanderbilt advanced to the final with two wins in high-scoring games -- 105-77 over Florida and 81-56 over Georgia. The slower pace in the final seemed to favor LSU, which allowed an average of 50 points in its first two tournament wins over Mississippi and Tennessee.

Vanderbilt's 51 points is the lowest scoring total for any winning team in SEC tournament history. The combined 96 points set another SEC tournament record low.

Risper also put the Commodores ahead 44-43 with 12:42 left, taking the lead for the first time since the opening minutes. Both teams were in the free-throw bonus the final 10 minutes that kept the game tight.

Duke got off to another slow start. The Blue Devils had five turnovers in their first five possessions against the Commodores, and fell behind 7-4 in the opening minutes. Duke has trailed in the first 10 minutes in five of its first seven games.

The Commodores equaled a 2003 home win over South Carolina with the 45-point margin. Junior Christina Wirth scored a team-high 20 points -- including 15 points in the first half as Vanderbilt opened a 47-19 lead at the break.

Sherwood, who transferred to Vanderbilt from Connecticut, finished with seven points and grabbed four rebounds in her final game at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores led Alabama (8-21, 1-13) 54-21 at the half after shooting 67 percent from the field. They finished hitting 53 percent for the game.

Bridge's 16 points were a career high and Jessica Mooney added 11 for Vanderbilt.

Alabama was led by Tierney Jenkins' 15 points as the Crimson Tide lost their 13th game in a row.

The 11 SEC wins is a new Vanderbilt record. It was also the Commodores' sixth win in a row against Alabama.
