## THE OLE MISS SERIES

Vanderbilt has won three out of the last five games played between the teams.

The 'Dores have won the last three meetings against the Rebels played in September, outscoring them by an average of 9.3 points-per-game during the span.

Vanderbilt has played only one team, Tennessee, more than Ole Miss. This marks the 85th meeting between the teams.

## KEY RECENT GAMES IN SERIES

- ★ **2008** The Commodore defense forces six turnovers, helping Vanderbilt edge the Rebels 23-17 in Oxford. Safety Ryan Hamilton earns national player of the week honors after tying a school record with three INTs. The victory is saved when LB Chris Marve forces a Rebel fumble into the endzone as Ole Miss appears ready to take a lead in the closing minutes.
- ★ **2007** Vanderbilt used 119 rushing yards and three TDs by Cassen Jackson-Garrison to record a 31-17 victory on campus. It was the Commodores' second straight home win.
- ★ **2005** Vanderbilt used touchdowns by Jeff Jennings and Cassen Jackson-Garrison to take a 24-3 third quarter lead before Ole Miss came back with 20 straight points to narrow the margin to 24-23. In the fourth quarter, Jay Cutler guided a game-clinching touchdown drive. With :01 left, Moses Osemwegie sealed the Commodore win with a quarterback sack and forced fumble.
- ★ **2003** The Commodores received career performances by a pair of sophomores – Cutler and WR Erik Davis – during a narrow loss in Nashville. Cutler posted highs in completions (20) and passing yards (248) while Davis set a best with 138 receiving yards.
- ★ **2002** Freshman RB/KR Kwane Doster posted one of the most productive offensive games in Vanderbilt and SEC history, compiling 344 all-purpose yards, including 101 yards rushing and a league-record 243 yards in kickoff returns.
- ★ **1997** Vanderbilt came out on top in overtime 37-34, giving the Commodores its first SEC road win in five years. Greg Zolman threw for 344 yards, including a last-minute tying touchdown to WR Todd Yoder and a game-clinching pass to Elliott Carson in overtime.

## THE 2009 VANDERBILT-OLE MISS GAME

### #21 Ole Miss (23) at Vanderbilt (7) Vanderbilt Stadium, Nashville (39,625) • Oct. 3, 2009 • ESPN

**NASHVILLE** – One week after producing 36 points in a win at Rice, the Commodore offense offered little competition against Ole Miss as Vanderbilt fell to 2-3 with a 23-7 loss to the No. 21 Rebels.

Ole Miss quarterback Jevan Snead passed for three touchdowns to overcome three interceptions as the Rebels bounced back from a loss to South Carolina to go 3-1 overall.

Snead matched his season high with three TDs against Vanderbilt in helping the Rebels to their best start since 2002 when they opened 5-1. One year earlier, the Commodores picked off four Snead passes in route to a win in Oxford.

The Commodores fell to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in SEC play.

Commodore defenders Jamie Graham, Casey Hayward and Myron Lewis each intercepted a Snead pass, but the Vanderbilt offense totalled just 240 yards, and mustered just a lone score midway in the third quarter.

A late Commodore threat ended when Ole Miss' Marcus Temple intercepted Larry Smith in the end zone to help preserve a 23-7 lead.

The Commodore attack was topped by Warren Norman's 86 rushing yards.

## VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

One week into the season the Commodore depth chart features an array of sophomores (28), redshirt freshmen (14) and true freshmen (20).

Nearly 30 sophomores and freshmen are featured on the Vanderbilt two-team depth chart.

Only eight seniors have contributed vs. Northwestern and LSU.

## ELEVEN NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Eleven Commodore players – five on offense, five on defense and a specialist – enjoyed their first career starts through the team's first two games.

Three offensive linemen and three defensive backs were among the first time starters.

Two Commodores – **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR) and **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB) – earned their first starts against LSU.

In the opener, the following offensive players made their first career starts: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., left guard), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., left tackle), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., right tackle) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., wide receiver). **Eddie Foster** (So., defensive back), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., defensive tackle) and **Trey Wilson** (So., defensive back) were first-time starters on defense in the opener.

**Richard Kent** (R-So.) also started at punter in the opener.

## TEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Ten Commodore true freshmen have played this action.

One first-year player, **Jonathan Krause**, started against LSU at wide receiver. He had one catch for 22 yards against the Tigers, and had five receptions on the season.

Other true freshmen seeing action besides Krause were **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **Kenny Ladler** (safety), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Andre Simmons** (safety), **Carey Spear** (kicker).

## NINETEEN SEE INITIAL COLLEGE ACTION

Twenty-one Commodores have played their first collegiate snaps this season.

Two Commodores – **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE) and **Taylor Loftley** (R-So., DT) – earned their first action against LSU.

First-time contributors in the season opener were **Mylon Brown** (R-Fr., OG), **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (Fr., RB/DB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Chase Garnham** (Fr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Fr., DB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., OT), **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE), **Richard Kent** (R-So., P), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Fitz Lassing** (Fr., TE), **Reece Lovell** (R-Fr., RB), **Jordan Matthews** (Fr., WR), **Marc Panu** (R-Fr., DT), **Andre Simmons** (Fr., safety), **Carey Spear** (Fr., PK) and **Wesley Tate** (R-Fr., RB).

## TAYLOR FROM MISSISSIPPI

**Vince Taylor** (Fr., DT) prepped at Oak Grove H.S. in Hattiesburg, Miss. He is the only active Commodore roster from the state.

A promising lineman for the Commodores, Taylor has been slowed by a broken hand.

## CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

**Robbie Caldwell**, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, will be one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace Bobby Johnson at Vanderbilt on July 14th following Johnson's unexpected retirement.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year. A third, Derek Dooley of Tennessee, is in his initial year after having served as Louisiana Tech's head coach.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

Vanderbilt is one of 23 NCAA FBS schools to feature a new head coach roaming the sidelines in 2010.

## HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

**Herb Hand**, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and is the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 Hurricane offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points, both tops in the NCAA.

Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

## DUTIES CHANGE FOR SIX ASSISTANTS

Six assistant coaches have new responsibilities this season.

★ Longtime defensive coordinator **Bruce Fowler** will assist Caldwell as assistant head coach. He will also mentor linebackers.

★ **Jamie Bryant** becomes the sole defensive coordinator and continues as the secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** has added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ Running backs coach **Des Kitchings** has added running game coordinator duties.

★ **Mike Pelton**, hired last spring, will coach defensive ends.

★ **Ted Cain**, former offensive coordinator, will serve as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.





# COMMODORE NOTES

## NOTES FROM LSU GAME

★ Vanderbilt has now dropped its last seven game to the Tigers, marking its longest losing streak in the series.

★ **Brandon Barden** (R-Jr., TE) topped the Commodores with five receptions, good for 38 yards. He leads the team with nine catches through two games.

★ The Vanderbilt offense produced just eight first downs and 135 yards (65 rushing and 70 passing) against the talented LSU defense.

★ The Commodore defense played well for most of the game. The unit limited LSU to 10 points and 227 total yards through three quarters before giving up two late scores.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-So., punter) put together a solid performance. He averaged 32.1 yards on 10 punts and allowed standout LSU returner Patrick Patterson just eight yards on two returns.

★ A 17-0 advantage by LSU in the fourth quarter continues a late-game trend that hurt the Commodores much of last year.

Last year, Vanderbilt was outscored 89-46 in the fourth quarter and overtime, a key stat to their eventual 2-10 record.

★ **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) was stellar on defense, tying a career high with eight tackles, including five solo stops. He also knocked down a pair of LSU pass attempts.

★ **Warren Norman** (So., RB) paced the Commodore offensive attack with 68 rushing yards on eight carries.

Norman's 51-yard rush early in the third quarter was the second longest carry of his career.

★ The Vanderbilt offensive front struggled to contain their LSU defensive counterparts. The Tigers notched six quarterback sacks, resulting in a loss of 47 yards for the Commodores.

It was the most QB sacks allowed by Vanderbilt since Tennessee had the same total on Nov. 22, 2008.

★ **Sean Richardson** (Jr., safety) topped the Vanderbilt defense with 10 total tackles, including nine solo stops. Richardson and Chris Marve (R-Jr., LB) share the team lead through two games with 18 tackles each.

★ **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) nabbed the Commodores' first interception of the season. It was the third of his career, the most among active players.

★ **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB) had a pair of tackles and a forced fumble in his first career start.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (WR) earned his first Commodore start. After having four catches for 55 yards in the opener, Krause posted a lone catch for 22 yards against LSU.

★ In his first collegiate action, **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE) posted three tackles, including one for a loss.

★ The Commodore offense converted on just two of 13 third-down attempts. The LSU offense was successful on half of their 16 third-down attempts.

★ Vanderbilt was flagged for more penalties and penalty yards than their opponent for the second straight game. The Commodores had seven infractions for 52 yards. LSU was flagged for just three penalties, resulting in 15 penalty yards.

★ **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OL) saw action at two offensive line positions, starting at right tackle, then moving to left guard.

## VANDERBILT RESULTS IN SEC OPENERS

Vanderbilt dropped their second consecutive SEC opener when they lost to LSU 27-3 last Saturday.

The Commodores are just 4-21 in their last 25 conference openers, and 2-4 since 2005.

## COMMODORE WINS VS. RANKED FOES

In the last four seasons, the Commodores have notched five wins over nationally ranked opponents.

Despite those victories, the 'Dores have lost six straight to teams ranked by the Associated Press Top 25 after dropping a 27-3 decision to LSU last Saturday.

In 2008, Vanderbilt registered three victories over ranked foes, accomplishing the feat for the first time in team history. The 'Dores beat No. 24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, No. 13 Auburn before an ESPN *College GameDay* crowd and No. 24 South Carolina before an Thursday night sellout.

## LOOKING TO CONTINUE SOLID SEPTEMBER PLAY

The Commodores look to return their solid early-season play when they travel to Ole Miss Saturday.

Since the 2005 opener, the Commodores are 15-8 in games played before October 1. Despite the success, they have lost both of their September games this year.

In 2005 and 2008, the Commodores went 4-0 in September.

From 2000-04, Vanderbilt struggled in September, going 4-16.

## SMOTHERMAN START STREAK ENDS

**Adam Smotherman's** consecutive start streak of 23 games ended against Northwestern when he did not dress due to an injury. It was the team's second longest active streak, trailing only LB **Chris Marve** (27).

Smotherman, a redshirt senior defensive tackle, is not expected to play until early October from an ACL injury suffered last spring.

## TWO COMMODORES IN POSTGRAD STUDIES

Two members of the Commodore football team, quarterback **Jared Funk** and receiver **Turner Wimberly**, are enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt's Peabody College.

Both Funk and Wimberly are working toward postgraduate degrees in Leadership and Public Policy.

A third Commodore player, linebacker **John Stokes**, has received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School, but will not start those classes before September 2011. Stokes is a two-time District IV Academic All-America recipient.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It will be displayed on the front of Stewart's No. 90 jersey.

## VANDERBILT'S TOUGH SLATE

College football insiders say the Commodores' 2010 schedule ranks among the nation's most difficult.

Ten of Vanderbilt's 12 opponents this season made postseason appearances during the 2009-10 season. Six of the 10 played in bowls on or after January 1. An 11th foe, Wake Forest, went 5-7 last year after making three straight bowl appearances.

Vanderbilt's 12 opponents won at a 58.4 percent clip in 2009, going a combined 90-66. Remove Eastern Michigan's winless campaign, and the remaining 11 teams went 90-54 one year ago.

Through two weeks this year, Commodore opponents are a combined 17-6.

*Phil Steele's College Football Preview* listed the Vanderbilt schedule No.12 toughest among 120 NCAA FBS teams.

The Commodores will play four teams ranked in AP preseason Top 25 (Florida, 4th; Arkansas, 17th; LSU, 21st; and Georgia, 23rd).

The Commodores are also the only SEC school this year that will face at least three opponents from BCS-member conferences: Northwestern, Big Ten; UConn, Big East; and Wake Forest, ACC.

## THREE RUNNING BACK ROTATION

After using a four-back rotation at tailback against Northwestern due to preseason injuries, the Commodores played three backs against LSU.

Sophomores **Zac Stacy** and **Warren Norman**, and redshirt freshman **Wesley Tate** were used against the Tigers.

They combined for 91 yards on 20 carries.

## TIGER PRESSURE HINDERS PASS ATTACK

Heavy pressure from the LSU defensive front caused problems for the Commodore passing game.

QB **Larry Smith** completed just eight of 15 passes for 70 yards. It was the fewest passing yards for Smith since a 69-yard total against Ole Miss last year.

Smith was under constant pressure. The Tiger defense posted six sacks, the a highest single-game total of Smith's starting career.



## MARVE, NORMAN PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Standouts **Chris Marve** and **Warren Norman** were named to the Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team all-conference.

Both earned All-SEC recognition from league coaches last year after putting together excellent seasons: Marve ranking as the SEC's No. 2 tackler; Norman walking away with SEC Freshman of the Year honors as the conference's all-purpose yardage leader.

Marve, one of four captains, has been named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award. He enters his third season as a starter trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn accomplished the feat in 1998-2000.

Marve, who posted 121 tackles in 2009, opened with a 12-tackle performance against Northwestern. He is tied for the team high with 18 total tackles through two games.

Norman played well against Northwestern despite undergoing an arthroscopic knee procedure 10 days earlier. The sophomore leads Vanderbilt with 114 rushing yards and 288 all-purpose yards.

In 2009, Norman produced one of the most productive freshman campaigns in SEC history one year ago. He topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process, and matched another league mark with three kickoff returns for touchdowns. Norman also ranked seventh in the SEC with 783 rushing yards.

**BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE)** Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 57 receptions and 565 receiving yards.

**RYAN FOWLER (R-So., PK)** Untested entering '09, Fowler connected on 11 of his last 12 attempts, including final eight. Fowler's 16 FGs tied a school record, earning Freshman All-America and SEC honors.

**T.J. GREENSTONE (R-Jr., DT)** Extremely productive on the field, 2010 co-captain posted 38 total tackles and two QB sacks last year.

**CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)** Displayed excellent cover skills, picking off two passes and defending seven others. He also added 58 total tackles, including 8.5 for loss.

## REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

*"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.*

*"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.*

*"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."*

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

The son of Narjaketha Bennett and the late Charles Bennett, Rajaan is survived by a younger brother and sister.
