

BY THE NUMBERS

- 6-0 Coupled with its 8-0 start last season, U of L has begun the season 6-0 in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1954-55 and 1955-56 (6-0 and 8-0, respectively). U of L has never had consecutive 7-0 starts in its program history.
- 13 Combining his 596 points in two years at Manhattan, Chris Smith needs 13 points to reach 1.000 for his collegiate career. He scored 18 points against Long Beach State -one below his UofL career high -while making a career-best 4-of-6 three pointers. He leads the BIG EAST in assist/turnover ratio (4.75; 19 assists, 4 turnovers) and has not had a turnover in his last 101 minutes of floor action.
- 14 Consecutive home victories for the Cardinals. UofL has a 24-2 record in its second year in the KFC Yum! Center.
 - Steals for Peyton Siva vs. Long Beach State, two below his career best and the fourth time in his career with as many thefts. He has 31 career games with multiple steals.
- 3.0 Blocked shots average for Gorgui Dieng, which leads the BIG EAST (10th nationally). He has blocked a shot in 30 of 35 career games, 17 with multiple blocks.
- 251 Coaching victories by Rick Pitino at Louisville, reaching the 250 milestone vs. Ohio. He has averaged over 24 wins a season with the Cardinals. He gained his 600th career collegiate victory in this year's opening game.

■ About Vanderbilt -- Louisville plays its fourth straight in the KFC Yum! Center as the Cardinals face the Vanderbilt Commodores in the BIG EAST/SEC Challenge on Friday. Vanderbilt (5-2), ranked No. 19 in the ESPN/USA Today poll and No. 20 by AP, fell 70-82 in overtime to No. 11/11 Xavier in its last game on Monday in Nashville. Senior guard John Jenkins led the Commodores with 20 points and seven rebounds in that game, while Jeffrey Taylor and Lance Goulbourne added 18 points each. Vanderbilt was outrebounded 54-33 in the game, including allowing 25 offensive boards.

Vanderbilt's only other loss was to Cleveland State 58-71 on Nov. 13. Jenkins leads the SEC in scoring at 20.2 points per game, and has scored in double figures in 39 straight games, dating back to the 2010 SEC Tournament. The Commodores are picked to finish second in the SEC behind Kentucky. Vanderbit is averaging 75.9 points a game and has connected on 57-of-166 three-point goals this season (.343). The Commodores were 29th nationally in scoring last season (75.9 ppg).

Louisville leads the series 8-7 and has won five of the last seven meetings, including a 78-62 victory in Freedom Hall in the last meeting on Feb. 6, 1994 when DeJuan Wheat scored 21 points to lead the Cardinals.

■ BIG EAST/SEC Challenge -- Louisville's matchup with Vanderbilt on Friday is part of the BIG EAST/SEC Challenge, an event staged Dec. 1-3 that pits men's basketball teams from the SEC against 12 of the 16 BIG EAST teams. This is the first year of the event with this format, but the two leagues met in the SEC/BIG EAST Invitational from 2007-10, when four schools from each conference played in doubleheaders at primarily off-campus sites. Each university from the two conferences participated in at least one game over that four-year period, with the outcome of the games tied 8-8. Louisville participated in the SEC/BIG EAST Invitational once, beating Mississippi 77-68 in Cincinnati, Ohio on Dec. 18, 2008.

■ Pitino Wins No. 250 With Cards — U of L Coach Rick Pitino won his 250th coaching victory at Louisville with a 59-54 win over Ohio University on Nov. 25. Pitino's

250th win with the Cards made him the eighth NCAA Division I coach to amass 250 or more wins with one school and 200+ at another (Pitino went 219-50 at Kentucky from 1989-97). Active coaches currently on that list are Connecticut's Jim Calhoun and North Carolina's Roy Williams. Pitino, who has averaged over 24 wins in his 11th season with the

Cardinals, gained his 600th career collegiate victory in the Cards' opener this year. ■ Defensive Gems — U of L has opened the season with many good defensive performances, limiting its opponents to 54 or fewer points in five of its six outings. The Cardinals are allowing just 49.3 points per game, third best in the nation.

Louisville has allowed 60 points or fewer in nine of its last 11 home games dating back to last season. Louisville held its first five opponents of the season to fewer than 55 points for the first time since a 12-game stretch from Dec. 18, 1946 to Feb. 2, 1946.

Louisville held Arkansas State to just 27 points, the lowest for a UofL foe in 64 years - since beating Georgetown College 20-12 on Feb. 4, 1947. The 12 first-half points by Arkansas State were the fewest in the first half by a UofL opponent since 1972-73 (complete box scores are unavailable prior to that date). The Red Wolves

■ Pitino Reaches 600 Victories — U of L Coach Rick Pitino gained his 600th collegiate coaching win with an 83-48 victory over UT Martin in the Cardinals' opening game on Nov. 11. His 605-224 record in his 26+ seasons of collegiate coaching ranks him 12th among active coaches in winning percentage (.730).

A total of 39 Division I coaches have reached 600 wins in a career, including 11 active coaches. Pitino is only the sixth active coach with 600 career victories and a winning percentage of .725 or better. Ben Braun of Rice (584 wins entering the season), and Bobby Cremins of the College of Charleston (567) also have a chance to add their names to the list of 600-win coaches in 2011-12. Louisville is just the third NCAA school to have two coaches reach the plateau while at the institution (other UofL coach is Denny Crum), joining North Carolina (Dean Smith, Roy Williams) and Oklahoma State (Henry Iba, Eddie Sutton) in that distinction.

In a recent discussion before the season, it was discovered that Pitino had a few additions to his career record. As an assistant coach in his second year at Hawaii during the 1975-76 season, Pitino coached the Rainbows for the final six games of the season after the head coach was relieved of his duties. Hawaii won two of those contests. The 2-4 record had not been previously included on his career coaching record and is not reflected in the Cardinals' current media guide.

Series vs. Vanderbilt

- Louisville has an 8-7 advantadge over the Commodores of Vanderbilt in a series that dates back to 1929. U of L has won five of the last seven meetings.
- In the last meeting between the two teams, Louisville defeated Vanderbilt 78-62 at Freedom Hall on Feb. 6, 1994 as DeJuan Wheat led the Cadinals with 21 points on 9-of-14 shooting from the floor. Greg Minor and Clifford Rozier also scored in double figures with 17 and 16 points, respectively, as the Cardinals shot 50.9 percent from the field. McCaffrey (21 points) and McMahan (20) paced the Commodores. Louisville went on to reach the NCAA Sweet Sixteen that season.
- Louisville has a collective 78-60 record against current members of the Southeastern Conference, having faced all of its members (Alabama 6-3, Arkansas 4-3, Auburn 1-1, Florida 7-1, Georgia 1-1, Kentucky 14-28, LSU 8-1, Mississippi 1-2,

Mississippi State 3-1, South Carolina 13-5, Tennessee 12-7 and Vanderbilt 8-7). Louisville fell 78-63 to Kentucky on Dec. 31, 2010 in the last game the Cards played against an SEC opponent. U of L faces the Wildcats in Lexington on Dec. 31.

- Louisville has a collective 93-53 all-time record against Tennessee colleges, with the bulk of that figure coming in the Cardinals' 51-34 series mark against Memphis.
- UofL Coach Rick Pitino has a 14-3 record against Vanderbilt teams, with all of the games coming while coaching Kentucky.

- Kuric's Defense -- Against Ohio, Kyle Kuric produced a career-best three blocked shots and a career-high matching four steals -- including a huge one that led to the go-ahead basket with 1:49 to play. Kuric has three games with 3+ steals this season. It was the first time a U of L player had totaled at least three blocks and four steals in a game in nearly 12 years -- since Dion Edward swatted three shots and recorded five steals in a 78-58 win over the UCF on Dec. 15, 1999. Only nine different Cardinals have ever put together such a performance.
- Siva on Prestigious Lists -- U of L guard Peyton Siva was named to the 2011-12 John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 List, which is comprised of student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for the honor. He was also on the preseason watch list for the Naismith Award, presented to the nation's player of the year.
- Tough Schedule Nineteen of the Cardinals' 31 games will be played against teams that participated in post-season competition last season, including 16 in the NCAA Tournament. U of L will play 16 games this season against teams ranked or receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today preseason poll, including eight games vs. teams ranked among the top 11 teams.

■ Cards on the Sidelines — The Cardinals have had some unfortunate health and eligibility issues in the early stages of this season. Junior forward Rakeem Buckles, who is recovering from a torn ACL in right knee on Feb. 27, participated in his first individual instruction session on Nov. 9, started practice on Nov. 24 and the Cards are hopeful for a return in early December. Elisha Justice suffered a broken nose on Nov. 27 and missed UofL's game vs. Long Beach State. Peyton Siva suffered a concussion in the Cards' first exhibition game vs. Pikeville and was out from Oct. 27 - Nov. 8. Siva returned to game action vs. UT Martin, but sprained his left ankle in practice on Nov. 14. He missed the Cards' games vs. Butler and Arkansas State, but returned to play vs. Ohio.

Stephan Van Treese, who had missed all of practice with a left patellar tendon strain, had his first individual workout on Nov. 14 and saw his first action of the year at Butler. He reinjured the knee on Nov. 26 and is out indefinitely. Mike Marra suffered a torn ACL in his left knee against Lamar on Nov. 13 and will miss the remainder of the season. He had surgery Nov. 29 and normal recovery time is 9-12 months. Marra had made it back on the court after being out from Oct. 25 through Nov. 9 with back problems. Injuries have kept other Cardinals out for short periods as well.

Freshman Wayne Blackshear had been awaiting clearance on his freshman eligibility requirements and was not able to practice with the Cardinals until Oct. 24, then suffered a shoulder injury on Oct 28 and is out indefinitely. He had surgery on Nov. 1 to repair the shoulder damage and may have an opportunity to return this season. Signee Kevin Ware did not meet freshmen eligibility requirements, but continued to work on his standing while not enrolled at U of L and became eligible for the 2012 spring semester. He will join the Cardinals on Dec. 14, the day after U of L final exams.

- Success vs. Top 25 Foes -- With its victory over No. 4 Notre Dame on March 11, the Cardinals have won four of its last five against ranked opponents. The Cards have been victorious the last five times they have faced an AP top-five opponent. Louisville has a 22-14 record against Top 25 teams over the last four years, including an 18-11 record during the regular season (7-5 vs. ranked teams last year). U of L has also won 12 of its last 21 games when facing Top 10 teams, spanning the last five years.
- Cards Faced Three of the 2011 NCAA Final Four teams -- Louisville faced three of the four teams in the 2011 NCAA Final Four, producing a 3-2 record during the season against those teams. The Cardinals beat national champion Connecticut twice in three meetings, defeated national runner-up Butler in their opener, and fell to Kentucky. U of L plays all three again in 2011-12. U of L played 18 of its 34 games prior to the NCAA Tournament against teams that participated in the NCAA Tournament, compiling an 11-7 mark against those foes. UofL posted a 5-2 record last season against teams seeded 1-3.
- Don't Count the Cards Out -- Louisville battled back from at least a seven-point deficit to win on nine occasions during the 2010-11 season. Its latest comeback was recovering from a 14-point halftime deficit to defeat Notre Dame 83-77 in overtime in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Conference Championship in New York on March 11. The Cardinals used a key 13-0 run over 8:20 in the second half against West Virginia to erase a 12-point deficit to win 55-54 on Jan. 26. One of the most improbable recoveries was when the Cardinals beat Marquette 71-70 on Jan. 15 after U of L had trailed by 18 with 5:44 to play. UofL was down nine at UConn with 7:45 remaining on Jan. 29 before winning in double overtime.
- Cards Started in the Bahamas Louisville began its trek for the 2011-12 season on July 16 with the first of 10 practices prior to its foreign trip to the Bahamas on Aug. 8-14. In addition to an intrasquad scrimmage on the island, U of L defeated the Commonwealth Giants -- which won the professional championship in the Bahamas the last two seasons -- 115-54 as Chane Behanan scored 16 points to lead eight Cardinals in double figures. Russ Smith scored 22 points to lead the Cards to a 113-58 victory over the Real Deal Shockers -- last season's pro league runner up -- in another game for UofL in Nassau, Bahamas.
- Champion Cardinals Three Cardinals won state championships at the high school level. Peyton Siva led Franklin High School to the 2009 Washington 3A State Championship as a senior and Franklin also won the 4A state title his freshman year in 2006. Rakeem Buckles won a pair of Florida 4A State Championships as a sophomore and junior at Monsignor Pace High School (2007, 2008). Elisha Justice was the Most Valuable Player for the 2010 Kentucky State Championship, which his Shelby Valley High School team won.
- Trends U of L is 110-7 over the last 11 seasons under Coach Rick Pitino when scoring 80 or more points (1-0 this season, 12-0 in 2010-11) ... Over the past 11 years under Pitino, Louisville is 89-6 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (2-0 this season, 6-0 in 2010-11) ... U of L is 194-33 when holding its opponent below 70 points over the past 11 years under Pitino (6-0 this season, 17-5 in 2010-11).

- Cards Feature A Pair of Kings U of L's basketball team has a pair of "kings" on its roster. Junior guard Peyton Siva was crowned U of L's 2011 Homecoming King on Oct. 29, 2011 at halftime of the Cardinals' homecoming football game against Syracuse. Senior forward Kyle Kuric received the similar honor last year and presented Siva with the recognition this year. Kuric serves as a student body representative on the U of L Athletic Association Board of Directors, the governing body for the Cardinals' athletic department.
- Exceeding Expectations Last Season Tied for third in arguably the toughest conference in the nation in 2010-11, the Cardinals were picked eighth in the league and did not receive a single vote in the AP preseason poll. Despite having 10 players who missed games with injuries last year, the Cardinals earned their ninth straight season with 20 wins. Louisville opened the season with no regular starters from the previous season and returning Cardinals started just 14 collective BIG EAST games in 2009-10, the lowest total in the league. Louisville defeated seven Top 25 teams and rose to as high as 11th in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today poll. Louisville was the only school in the nation to defeat three top-five squads in 2010-11 and has an active winning streak of five games over AP top five schools.

■ Cards Chosen Third in BIG EAST Preseason Poll — U of L was chosen to finish third in the 2011-12 BIG EAST Conference in a preseason poll of league coaches. Defending NCAA Champion UConn and Syracuse were tied as the choice to win the league. UofL guard Peyton Siva was selected to the preseason all-conference second team. In league play, each school plays 18 games, playing three teams twice. The Cards' three mirror games are against Syracuse, Pittsburgh and DePaul.

- High Production Returns -- While the Cardinals will miss departed starters Preston Knowles (14.6 ppg, 3.9 rpg, 1,023 career points) and F/C Terrence Jennings (9.6 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 65 blocked shots), a large percentage of their total production will return. UofL returns 66 percent of its scoring from the 2010-11 squad (1722 of 2623 points), 73 pct. of its rebounding (924 of 1272), 78 percent of its assists (476 of 608) and 71 percent of the total minutes played (5092 of 7125).
- Cards Earn BIG EAST Team Academic Honor -- UofL's men's basketball team earned the 2010-11 BIG EAST Conference Team Academic Excellence Award, which recognizes the highest collective grade-point averages in each of the conference's 26 sports. The men's basketball team has hovered around a collective 3.0 GPA for six straight semesters, including a 2.96 GPA for the most recent spring 2011 semester when seven Cardinals surpassed a 3.0.
- La Poderosa Will Broadcast Six Six U of L home men's basketball games will be broadcast this season in Spanish on La Poderosa (WTUV, 620AM/105.7 FM). The three remaining games are Dec. 7 vs. IUPUI, Dec. 20 vs. College of Charleston and Feb. 4 vs. Rutgers. Carlos Lucio and Elvis Martinez call the action for the broadcasts in U of L's effort to reach out to the Hispanic community for the seventh straight year. All of U of L's home football games over the last eight years have also been broadcast in Spanish.
- Louisville Unique Accomplishment Louisville is the only university in the nation which over the last six years has reached each of the men's and women's Final Four, a BCS bowl game, the College World Series and the Men's Soccer College Cup. Louisville was national runner up in the 2009 Women's Final Four and 2010 Men's Soccer College Cup, won the 2007 Orange Bowl, and participated in the 2005 Men's Final Four and 2007 College World Series.

First — Louisville played five home games during the month of November for the first time ever. Last year's four home games in November was the previous high. The Cards' move to the KFC Yum! Center has provided more flexibility in scheduling. During its 54 years in Freedom Hall, some longstanding trade shows which invade the massive Kentucky Exposition Center limited opportunities for the Cardinals to play home games in November and February.

■ Rozier Signs With Cards --Terry Rozier, a 6-1, 170-pound guard from Shaker Heights (Ohio) High School, has signed a national letter-of-intent to continue his basketball playing career at the University of Louisville. Rozier averaged 18.2 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists as a junior last season as Shaker Heights won nine of their last 13 games en route to a 14-8 record. An All Lake Erie League selection as a sophomore and junior, Rozier is rated 88th overall in the 2012 ESPNU Top 100 players, is listed No. 112 by Rivals in the class of 2012, and is the 20th rated point quard in the nation by Scout.com.

He had 10 points and three steals for his USA Midwest team in a 99-93 victory over Canada in the championship game of the 2011 Nike Global Challenge, which featured the top high school and under 19 players from top international teams. He is the cousin of current U of L freshman center Zach Price. Rozier had also considered attending Cincinnati, Illinois, West Virginia and Cleveland St. before signing with UofL.

■ Injuries Hit Cards' Blackshear, Marra -- U of L freshman Wayne Blackshear suffered a shoulder injury in practice on Oct 28 and will be sidelined for an extended period. Blackshear suffered a torn labrum in his right shoulder and had surgery to repair it on Nov. 1. It will be 6-8 weeks before he can begin rehabilitation on the shoulder and could be back on the court within three months. A 6-5 McDonald's High School All-American from Chicago, Blackshear had just been cleared by the NCAA initial eligibility center to participate as a freshman on Oct. 24. He had suffered an injury to his left shoulder as he closed out his high school career, had surgery to repair it, and had spent the summer rehabilitating that shoulder. He averaged 32.6 points, 14.6 rebounds, 5.6 assists and 3.7 steals as a senior for Morgan Park High School last season.

Mike Marra suffered a torn ACL in his left knee against Lamar on Nov. 13 and will miss the remainder of the season. He will have surgery soon to repair the damage and normal recovery time is 9-12 months. Marra had recently made it back on the court after being out from Oct. 25 through Nov. 9 with back problems. One of the Cards' more savvy and dependable players, Marra scored six points in each of Louisville's first two games. He averaged 6.2 points and two assists as a sophomore last season, starting 11 games. He scored in double figures on 11 occasions as a sophomore, including scoring 22 points and burying six three-pointers against Marquette in the BIG EAST Tournament quarterfinals.

■ Cards Have Been Tough on the Road — Louisville has the most road victories in BIG EAST Conference play over the last five years (27; three last year, four in '09-10, eight of nine in 2008-09, and six in each of the previous two years; Pittsburgh has 26, including six this year). Overall, the Cardinals have a 31-17 record over the last six years on their opponent's home court. Louisville has won 21 of its last 35 on the road, including six against Top 25 ranked opponents.

HEAD COACH RICK PITINO

In his 26th season as a collegiate head coach and 11th at Louisville, U of L Coach **Rick Pitino** has compiled a 605-224 overall record (251-96 at U of L). The only coach to take three different



schools to the NCAA Final Four including his 2005 Cardinal team, his .729 winning percentage entering the season ranks him 12th among active coaches and No. 36 alltime. Among active coaches, Pitino (Massachusetts '74) has the seventhhighest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.717 winning percentage, 38-15 record in 16 NCAA tournament appearances). He guided Kentucky to three NCAA Final Four appearances in eight seasons (1989-97), winning the 1996 NCAA Championship and reaching the national title game in 1997. He has also served as head coach at Providence College (1985-87, 1987 Final Four). Boston University (1978-83). Hawaii (last six games in 1975-76) as well as the NBA New York Knicks (1987-89) and Boston Celtics (1997-2001). Pitino has a 14-3 career record vs. Vanderbilt.

■ Cards 18th in All-Time Victories

— Louisville has an all-time 1637-854 record in 98 seasons of intercollegiate basketball. The Cardinals are 18th among all NCAA schools in victories. U of L started playing intercollegiate basketball in 1911-12, but did not field teams in 1916-17, 1922-23 or 1942-43. The Cardinals have produced winning seasons in 64 of the last 67 years, including winning 20 or more games in the last nine straight seasons.

■ Second Season in KFC Yum! Center -- Louisville is in its second season in the spectacular KFC Yum! Center, located on the banks of the Ohio River in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals had previously played basketball for 54 years in Freedom Hall (1956-2010). The 22,000-seat multi-purpose arena was built at a cost of \$238 million, includes 71 luxury suites, 62 four- or six-seat premium boxes, over 2,000 side-court club seats and four party suites with a seating capacity of 32 each.

U of L's men's and women's teams have permanent locker rooms. There are five additional team locker rooms, two officials locker rooms, five star dressing rooms, a full-function media work room and a full-sized basketball practice court on the event level. The seven levels of the arena (including the upper catwalk) include a collective 721,762 square feet, or roughly the area of 13 football fields.

After passing through the one and a half acre landscaped entry plaza that features a basketball-themed fountain, entering fans can visit the 2,500-square foot U of L adidas store, the 3,000-square foot U of L Hall of Honor, or head to their seats using one of the eight escalators or seven elevators within the building.

Lounge space is abundant within the arena. Four spacious donor rooms are available for Cardinal fans, including three that overlook the Ohio River. The 7.000-



square foot main concourse restaurant overlooks the river and a main concourse sports bar has views directly into the arena bowl. Two 4,000-square foot club lounges on the event level, as well as the terrace club and premium box lounges, provide amenities for their respective patrons.

The KFC Yum! Center will serve as the site for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds in March 2012 and the NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship in December 2012.

Cardinals in the NCAA Tournament

- Louisville made its 37th NCAA Tournament appearance last year. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Tournament 28 of the last 35 years (five straight, eight of the last ten, 10 of the last 13 years, 16 of last 20). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 17 occasions, including advancing to the Elite Eight two of the last four seasons. Louisville is tied for sixth in tournament wins (60) and is fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (37). U of L has a 60-39 overall NCAA Tournament record, reaching the Final Four eight times.
- Only four teams -- Kentucky (51), UCLA (42), North Carolina (42), and Kansas (40) -- have more NCAA Tournament appearances than Louisville's 37.
- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has a 38-15 record in NCAA Tournament play (.717), ranking him seventh among active coaches in winning percentage and 14th all time. Only six coaches have coached more Final Four teams than Pitino's five, a feat matched by four others. Pitino is the only coach to lead three different teams to the Final Four; is one of eight coaches to lead four different schools to the NCAA

Tournament; and one of 11 active collegiate coaches who have won an NCAA Championship.

- Only four teams have been to more Sweet 16 appearances than Louisville's 17 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 24, Kentucky 23, Duke 22 and Kansas 18).
- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has guided 16 teams to NCAA tournament appearances, including eight of his last nine years at Louisville. His last six straight Kentucky teams reached the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats won the 1996 NCAA title and were national runner-up in 1997 under his guidance.
- Louisville advanced to its 17th NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2009. Only four teams have been to more Sweet

16 appearances than Louisville's 17 since the NCAA began Sweet 16 records in 1975 (North Carolina 23, Duke 21, Kentucky 21; and Kansas 18). Louisville has been to at least the Sweet 16 in three of the last seven years.

U of L has reached the NCAA Elite Eight on 11 occasions, including two of the last four years (1959, 1972, 1975, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1997, 2005, 2008, 2009).

U of L in the NCAA Tournament

■ Louisville Host for NCAA

Tournament -- Louisville will serve as the host institution for the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament second and third rounds on Thursday, March 15 and Saturday, March 17, 2012 at the KFC Yum! Center. It is the first NCAA men's basketball tournament event the Cardinals have hosted since the 1991 NCAA Southeast Regional in Freedom Hall.

Nearly 20,000 tickets have already been sold for the event. Tickets may be purchased through NCAA.com.

■ 24 Former Pitino Assistants/ Players Became Head Coaches -- U of L Coach Rick Pitino has had 24 of his former assistants or players rise to a collegiate head coaching position, two of which the Cardinals will face this season (Jan. 28 at Seton Hall, Feb. 23 at Cincinnati). There are eight former assistants as current head coaches, including Mick Cronin at Cincinnati; Scott Davenport at Bellarmine; Billy Donovan at Florida; Steve Masiello at Manhattan, Marvin Menzies at New Mexico State: Herb Sendek at Arizona St.; Kevin Willard at Seton Hall; and Tubby Smith at Minnesota. Pitino has a collective 24-7 record in games against his former assistants (3-0 vs. Ralph Willard; 7-5 vs. Tubby Smith; 6-0 vs. Billy Donovan, 4-2 vs. Mick Cronin, 1-0 vs. Scott Davenport, 1-0 vs. Marvin Menzies, 2-0 vs. Kevin Willard). John Kuester, who was a Pitino assistant at Boston University, is the head coach of the NBA Detroit Pistons. Indiana Pacers head coach Frank Vogel was a student manager for Pitino at Kentucky and his video coordinator with the Celtics.

Five former Pitino players also became collegiate head coaches, four of which are currently active, including Travis Ford of Oklahoma State; John Pelphrey of Arkansas (before his dismissal March 13); Sean Woods of Mississippi Valley State; and Donovan. Including games against both his 24 former assistants and former players who went on to become collegiate head coaches, Pitino is 26-7 (record vs. former players as head coaches: 3-1 vs. Travis Ford, 2-0 vs. John Pelphrey and Donovan).

■ Kuric Slams Top Dunk — Kyle Kuric's monster slam in the closing seconds of the first half at Notre Dame last was recognized as the 2011 Papa John's Dunk of the Year. After narrowing the list to eight finalists on the season, Kuric's dunk received 45 percent of the votes in an online fan poll to earn the national title. His first basket of this season was a dunk against UT Martin among his 14 points and he added five rebounds and a game-high three steals.

■ IUPUI Awaits Next -- Louisville plays its fifth straight in the KFC Yum! Center as the Cardinals face the IUPUI Jaguars on Dec. 7 at 7 p.m. (WHAS/ESPN3/Wazoo). IUPUI (2-5) fell 58-81 at Georgetown in its last outing on Nov. 28. The Jaguars will play home games against South Dakota State (Dec. 1) and North Dakota State (Dec. 3) prior to facing the Cardinals.

First year head coach Todd Howard, associate coach at IUPUI the previous 10 seasons, was a walk-on guard at Louisville and served as a program assistant in 1993-94 following his playing career. Also on the IUPUI bench as an assistant coach is David Padgett, an All-BIG EAST center for the Cardinals from 2005-08. Padgett was an assistant strength coach for UofL last season. Three Louisville high school products are on the IUPUI roster: sophomore guard Ian Chiles (Ballard), freshman forward Lionell Gaines (Eastern), and sophomore forward Donovan Gibbs (Iroquois),

Alex Young, The Summit League preseason player of the year, leads the Jaguars averaging 17.1 points, 6.6 rebounds and has made 14 three-pointers this season. IUPUI is picked to finish fourth in The Summit League. Louisville won the only previous meeting between the two schools 80-60 in Freedom Hall on Dec. 21, 2004 as Juan Palacios totaled 25 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Cardinals.

■ Success at Home -- Louisville has won its last 14 consecutive games in the KFC Yum! Center and have a 24-2 record in their second year in the massive facility. The Cardinals were unbeaten in BIG EAST Conference games at home last season. The current 14-game win streak is UofL's longest since ripping off 15 consecutive home victories from Jan. 10-Dec. 27, 2008 in Freedom Hall.

■ Ware on the Way -- Kevin Ware, a 6-4 guard from Conyers, Ga., has met NCAA intial eligibility requirements and will join the team in mid-December. Ware, who signed a financial aid agreement with the Cardinals in June, was denied a waiver and subsequent appeal for admittance in early September. He continued to work on improving his standing and will enroll for the 2012 spring semester. He will join the Cardinals on Dec. 14, the day after U of L's fall semester final examinations.

A first-team all-state selection as a senior last season, Ware averaged 13.2 points, 4.1 assists, 3.9 rebounds and 2.2 steals in helping Rockdale County High School post a 26-6 record and finish as the Georgia 4-A state runner-up.

- Swopshire Returns Jared Swopshire is averaging 7.2 points and 5.8 rebounds as the Cardinals' top player off the bench since returning from injury. In his first official game after missing all of last season, Swopshire came off the bench to produce eight points and five rebounds against UT Martin. He backed that outing up with a game-high 13 points and eight rebounds vs. Lamar; and eight points and six rebounds at Butler. Swopshire has gathered five or more rebounds in 14 of his last 15 games dating back to his sophomore season in 2009-10, grabbing three vs. Ohio to break a 13-game streak. Swopshire sustained a groin injury in the summer of 2010, had surgery on Jan. 10 and began practicing with the team in October.
- 10 Consecutive at Home a High Louisville began a school-record tying 10 consecutive home games when the Cardinals faced Arkansas State on Nov. 22 (also 10 straight in 2006 from Dec. 8-30; and 2010 from Nov. 16 Dec. 18). The Cardinals played five home games during the month of November for the first time ever. U of L's move to the KFC Yum! Center has provided more flexibility in scheduling.
- Cards Second in BIG EAST Wins -- Since the 2005-06 season when the Cardinals joined the BIG EAST, Louisville is second in league victories with a 71-33 mark during the regular season, behind Pittsburgh (75-29).
- Blockbird -- Sophomore center Gorgui Dieng leads the BIG EAST and is 10th nationally in blocked shots, averaging 3.0 per game. He has swatted two or more shots in five of six games this season. Dieng is one of three Cardinals all-time to start the year with at least a pair of blocks in each of the first five games, joining recent teammate Terrence Jennings (six straight to open last season) and Louisville career blocks leader Pervis Ellison (seven straight to start the '85-'86 title campaign). Dieng has blocked a shot in 30 of 35 career games, including 17 with multiple blocks.
- Buckles Nearing A Return Forward Rakeem Buckles began practicing with the Cardinals on Nov. 24.Buckles has been recovering a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) suffered in his right knee on Feb. 27. He had surgery to repair the knee on March 16, participated in his first individual instruction session on Nov. 9 and has been progressing well. He could return to game action as soon as a couple of weeks. The knee injury was one setback during a tough sophomore season in which he suffered three separate injuries that kept him off the court, also enduring a concussion and broken index finger. He averaged 6.8 points and 6.1 rebounds in 16 games, including 10 starting assignments. He had ranked among the top ten in rebounding in the BIG EAST before he broke his finger.
- Van Treese Out Again Forward Stephan Van Treese has been sidelined indefinitely after reinjuring his left knee in practice on Nov. 26. Van Treese had missed all of practice with a left patellar tendon strain before participating in his first individual workout on Nov. 14. He returned to see his first action of the year at Butler and played in each of the last three games, producing a combined four points and six rebounds in 20 minutes. Van Treese averaged 2.9 points, 3.5 rebounds and collected 21 steals as a sophomore when he started 12 games. He averaged 4.2 points and 4.6 rebounds in BIG EAST games.
- Limited Output -- Arkansas State managed just 12 points in that first half against Louisville, the fewest for a Cardinal opponent in a first half since the 1972-73 season (complete box scores unavailable prior). Only twice since that time has a Louisville foe had fewer tallies in a half, with those coming last year (11 in second half by San Francisco on Dec. 8) and in the 1981 Metro Tournament (11 by Cincinnati in second half on March 7).

■ Freshmen Debut — Freshman forward Chane Behanan blasted onto the collegiate scene with double-doubles in his first two games (14 pts., 12 reb. vs. UT Martin, 10 pts., 13 reb. vs. Lamar). He is the first known UofL freshman to produce double-doubles in his first two career games. Behanan's 14 points vs. UT Martin is tied for the sixth most ever at U of L in a freshman career debut and his 12 rebounds were the most in a freshman debut in 36 years (since Larry Williams grabbed 14 boards in the '75-76 opener). He averaged 15.5 points and eight rebounds in a pair of exhibition wins on the Cardinals' foreign trip to the Bahamas in August. Along with Behanan, three other Louisville freshmen made their career debuts against UT Martin and each scored -- Mark Jackson, Jr. (five points), Zach Price (two) and Angel Nunez (one).

■ Early Opener — Louisville's opening game against Tennessee-Martin on Nov. 11 marked the earliest date in school history that the Cardinals have opened their season. The earliest previous U of L opener was last season's Nov. 16 victory over Butler in the opening game of the KFC Yum! Center.

- Rebounding a Key UofL Coach Rick Pitino has stressed rebounding with his team this season and the Cardinals have delivered with a rebound advantage in five of six games. In its six games, UofL has an average +6.5 rebounding margin, including a 17-rebound advantage over UT Martin in its opening game (46-29). The Cards had just three games with a double-digit rebounding edge during its successful 2010-11 season, with a high of +19 against Gardner-Webb (45-26).
- Cards Clutch at the Line -- Whilte the Cardinals are connecting on 68.1 percent from the free throw line this season, they have certainly made them when it has counted. Louisville has had four games this year (Lamar, Butler, Ohio, and Long Beach State) in which its opponent either led or was within eight at some point in the second half. In all four, UofL has literally been perfect down the stretch to ice the game, burying a collective 33-of-33 free throws:

■ Card Clips -- Chane Behanan has grabbed six or more rebounds in every game ... Chris Smith has made his last 12 consecutive free throws, making all four of his free throws in an 18-point performance against Long Beach State in his last outing ... Smith has 11 assists without a turnover over his last 101 minutes of floor action dating back to the second half of the Butler game ... Over the last three games, Gorgui Dieng is averaging 9.7 points and 10.3 rebounds ... Peyton Siva has made 17 consecutive free throws. His lone miss this season came in his first try against UT Martin in the opener ... Russ Smith has at least one steal in every game this season. He has 23 steals in 201 minutes for his career, translating to 4.6 per 40 minutes of playing time. Smith has a steal in 17 of 23 career games despite averaging just 8.7 minutes ... Smith set career highs of 11 points and three assists against Long Beach State ... Kyle Kuric had 16 points, five rebounds, four steals and three blocked shots vs. Ohio. He is averaging 14.1 points and 5.5 rebounds per outing since Feb. 9 of last season after putting up 4.8 and 2.1 in 68 career games prior to that ... With its 54-27 victory over Arkansas State, Louisville became the first team to hold a Division I opponent to 27 points or less since Ohio State beat Samford 59-22 on Nov. 29, 2008. It is only the 20th time in the last 15 seasons a Division I team has scored 27 points or fewer in a game ... Louisville's 21 offensive rebounds against Ohio were its second-highest total over the past two seasons, bested only by the Cards' 23 offensive boards in the overtime win against Notre Dame in last year's BIG EAST semifinals ... Gorqui Dieng totaled 10 points and a career-high 16 rebounds vs. Ohio, his second career double-double and third career double-digit rebound outing. His other double-double came against UConn on Feb. 18 last season (13 points, 12 rebounds) ... UofL handed Butler its worst home defeat in 19 years ... Butler lost for just the sixth time at Hinkle Fieldhouse (57-6) in five seasons.






