Head Coach Tim Corbin, the staff, current student-athletes, and several members of the 2014 team now playing baseball at the pro level are expected back on campus for the halftime ceremonies.

FACING RANKED OPPONENTS

Vanderbilt is seeking its second win against a ranked opponent in the last year when the 'Dores host No. 14 South Carolina this Saturday.

The Commodores' 31-27 victory over Georgia last October broke a 13-game losing streak to teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25.

In a game earlier this year, Vanderbilt fell to No. 15 Ole Miss.

DEREK MASON ERA BEGINS ON VANDERBILT CAMPUS

As a key member of the Stanford University staff from 2010-13, Derek Mason helped guide the Cardinal to a 45-8 overall record and four straight BCS postseason games, including appearances in the last two Rose Bowls.

Named as the 28th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Jan. 17, the former Cardinal Associate Head Coach and Willie Shaw Director of Defense directed his first game on the sidelines in Nashville when the Commodores hosted Temple on Aug. 28.

One of 20 new head coaches in NCAA FBS college football this season, the 44-year-old Mason, is one of just five FBS coaches enjoying their first year as a head coach.

Regarded as one of the nation's leading defensive minds while at Stanford, Mason quickly went to work in Nashville. Within three weeks of getting the position, Mason secured signatures from 22 prep standouts on National Signing Day from across the nation. Since then, Mason has attracted a stellar coaching staff, and installed new schemes during a busy Spring Practice. He's also worked diligently to build strong relationships in the Vanderbilt and Nashville communities.

Mason replaces James Franklin, who went 24-15 over three years on the Vanderbilt campus, leading the Commodores to three straight bowls.

VANDERBILT TOPS NATION WITH 31 PARTICIPATING FRESHMEN

Head Coach Derek Mason kept true to his word that several freshmen would play this season. The coach hasn't wasted any time either, putting 31 freshmen, including 12 true freshmen, onto the field in the first three games of the season.

Vanderbilt's total of participating freshmen leads the nation. Other teams across the nation playing an abundance of freshmen are LSU (27), Tennessee (25), Oregon (22), Florida (22), Memphis (21), Baylor (20), California (20), NC State (20), Ole Miss (20), Southern California (19), Oklahoma State (19) and TCU (19).

Last Saturday against UMass, three additional 'Dore freshmen played their initial snaps: Trey Ellis (PR, Fr.), Wade Freebeck (QB, Fr.) and DeAndre Woods (WR, R-Fr.)

Vanderbilt's dozen true freshmen seeing action also ranks among the leaders, trailing only Tennessee (22), LSU (17) and NC State (13).

Other true freshmen besides Ellis and Freebeck to play this year are Tre Herndon, Hayden Lekacz, Nifae Lealao, Hawkins Mann, Dallas Rivers, Caleb Scott, Trent Sherfield, Emmanuel Smith, Tre Tarpley and Ladarius Wiley.

Only 16 true and redshirt freshmen saw playing time during the entire 2013 campaign.

MORE NOTES ON THE VU-SC SERIES

This marks the 24th meeting on the gridiron between Vanderbilt and South Carolina, with the Gamecocks holding a 19-4 edge in the series.

The teams met only once before South Carolina joined the SEC, with the Gamecocks earning a 23-7 road win over the Commodores in 1961.

The teams have met every season as Eastern Division foes since 1992, when South Carolina (along with Arkansas) joined the conference.

The Gamecocks have taken the last five contests in the series, with Vanderbilt's last win coming in 2008 in Nashville. The Commodores also scored victories in 2007 and 1998-99.

Historically, the Commodores have struggled against Steve Spurrier's teams at South Carolina, Florida and Duke. Vanderbilt is 2-19 all-time vs. Spurrier-coach squads.

LAST TIME VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

DORES' LATE RALLY COMES UP SHORT; TAKE 35-25 LOSS AT SO. CAROLINA

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Steve Spurrier won't hang his head after No. 13 South Carolina's 35-25 win over Vanderbilt, no matter how close the Gamecocks came to blowing a four-touchdown lead.

The Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) scored on their first-four possessions as Connor Shaw threw for three touchdowns and Jadeveon Clowney forced a third-quarter fumble despite pain in his right foot because of troublesome bone spurs he's had since high school.

South Carolina appeared to have this one finished early, scoring on its first four possessions to lead 28-0. It still led 35-10 when it opened the second half with Shaw's final TD pass, a 33-yarder to Brandon Wilds.

That's when the Commodores (1-2, 0-2) threw a scare into the Gamecocks, aided by a fumbled kickoff and punt by South Carolina. Vanderbilt scored twice in a 13-second span of the fourth quarter to pull within 10 points.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: 33 FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS EARLY THIS SEASON

Thirty-three newcomers, including 31 true or redshirt freshmen, have contributed for the Commodores in the first three games.

Three first-time players contributed in the Commodores' 34-31 victory over UMass – **Trey Ellis** (Fr., PR), **Wade Freebeck** (Fr., QB) and **DeAndre Woods** (R-Fr., WR).

One week earlier vs. Ole Miss, six first-time players contributed: **Jalen Banks** (R-Fr., DB), **Delando Crooks** (R-Fr., OG), **Chandler Dorrell** (R-Fr., WR), **Tommy Openshaw** (R-Fr., kicker), **Trent Sherfield** (Fr., WR) and **Emmanuel Smith** (Fr., safety).

Twelve of the Commodore newcomers are true freshmen.

Thirteen of the 33 newcomers have played on the Vanderbilt offensive unit, including three transfers: Dorrell, **Stephen Rivers** (Grad.) and **David Dudchock** (Grad.).

Rivers is one of three first-time players at quarterback. Freebeck started the UMass game and **Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr.) participated in a limited role against Temple.

A pair of freshman running backs, **Ralph Webb** (R-F.) and **Dallas Rivers** (Fr.), have joined Freebeck, McCrary and in the backfield. Webb ranks as the team's leading rusher with 281 yards.

Three newcomers have participated in the wide receiving corps: **C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr.), **Caleb Scott** (Fr.) and Dorrell. Duncan shares the team lead among wideouts with six receptions, including four for 72 yards against UMass. Dorrell, son of Vanderbilt offensive coordinator Karl Dorrell, posted his first catch against UMass. Scott, son of former Commodore and NFL player Chuck Scott, caught his first career pass in the fourth quarter of the Temple game.

Dudchock and **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr.) have seen their first action at tight end, with Dudchock contributing a 19-yard catch vs. Temple.

Crooks and **Sean Dowling** (R-Fr., OT) are offensive linemen new to the field this year.

On defense, an astounding 17 'Dores have witnessed their first action.

The defensive backfield has featured nine first-year players contributing, including starters **Tre Bell** (R-Fr., CB), **Ryan White** (R-Fr., NB) and **Oren Burks** (R-Fr., safety).

Nigel Bowden (R-Fr.) has seen the most action of any newcomer in the linebacking corps, registering 19 total tackles as an inside linebacker. **Jonathan Wynn** (R-Fr.) started at outside linebacker against UMass. **Zach Cunningham** (R-Fr.), **Landon Stokes** (R-Fr.) and **Hawkins Mann** (Fr.) have also contributed.

On the defensive front, **Jay Woods** (R-Fr.) earned a start against Temple and contributed 10 total tackles. **Nifae Lealao** (Fr.) has four tackles as a reserve nose tackle.

Sherfield and Smith have been limited to special teams' coverage units, but could see more repetitions at receiver and safety, respectively.

Openshaw and **Hayden Lekacz** (Fr.) have handled the kicking duties for the Commodores: Openshaw against UMass and Ole Miss, Lekacz vs. Temple.

Ellis played an important role in the win over UMass, giving the team good field position by returning two punts for 24 yards.

'DORES SEEKING .500 ALL-TIME RECORD

Vanderbilt looks to reach a .500 all-time record when it faces South Carolina.

The Commodores, in their 125th year of organized football, have an all-time program record of 583-584-50 entering the South Carolina game.

WEBB QUICKLY BECOMING TEAM'S FEATURED RUNNING BACK

Ralph Webb (R-Fr., RB) is quickly becoming the featured running back in Vanderbilt's offense.

The Gainesville (Fla.) H.S. product rushed for a career-high 116 yards and the game-winning touchdown Sept. 13 against UMass.

Webb's rushing total was the highest by a Commodore freshman since Warren Norman had 119 rushing yards in a victory at Rice in 2009. It was also the fourth highest rushing total by a Commodore freshman in the last 12 years.

Webb also had 26 carries Saturday, the most by a Commodore since Zac Stacy had 27 attempts for 169 yards in a 17-13 victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

Through three games, Webb is among the Southeastern Conference Top Ten running backs, ranking seventh with 281 rushing yards.

SEVERAL COMMODORE COACHES OWN NFL EXPERIENCE

Five coaches with National Football League experience are among the impressive 10-person staff assembled by first-year Vanderbilt head coach **Derek Mason**.

Mason also brings NFL experiences to the Commodore staff. Prior to joining Jim Harbaugh's Stanford staff in 2010, Mason worked three years as a defensive backs assistant coach in Minnesota, helping the Vikings to NFC North titles in 2008 and 2009.

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** has the most pro experience. Maxie joined Mason's staff after a two-year run as defensive backs coach with the cross-town Tennessee Titans. Prior to the Titans' role, Maxie coached 14 years in the NFL, with stops in Dallas, Miami, Atlanta, San Francisco and Carolina.

Offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Karl Dorrell** has spent nine total years in the NFL, as well as serving as head coach at UCLA from 2003-07. In 2012-13, Dorrell coached quarterbacks in Houston. From 2008-11, he worked as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach in Miami. Dorrell's first NFL experience came as a receivers coach in Denver from 2000-02.

Marc Lubick coached with Dorrell as an offensive assistant for the last two years in Houston. Lubick also spent the 2003-04 seasons in St. Louis' scouting department.

Charles Bankins developed much of his knowledge on special teams during his time as an assistant with the St. Louis Rams in 2005.

Bill Hughan has worked on the sport performance staffs of three NFL clubs: New York Jets, Atlanta Falcons and Oakland Raiders.

MASON TIES TO COORDINATORS DATE TO PLAYING DAYS, EARLY COACHING ROLES

Coordinators **Karl Dorrell** and **David Kotulski** played influential roles in the early coaching development of **Derek Mason**.

The relationship between Mason and Dorrell dates to the early 1990s when both were at Northern Arizona University – Mason as a cornerback practicing daily against NAU receivers coached by Dorrell.

Much of Mason's experience on the 3-4 defensive scheme dates to 1999-2000 when Kotulski hired him to coach defensive backs at Bucknell University. More than a decade later, Mason repaid Kotulski by bringing him to Palo Alto to mentor Stanford inside linebackers.

Mason also has long ties with new offensive assistants **Gerry Gdowski** and **Keven Lightner**. Ten years ago, Mason, Gdowski and Lightner were members of the offensive staff at New Mexico State, then joined Frank Solich's Ohio University staff for the 2005-06 seasons.

MAXIE GOES FROM TITANS TO COMMODORES

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** joined Mason's staff without leaving Nashville. Maxie, who played 13 years as a safety in the NFL, spent the last two years mentoring Tennessee Titans' defensive backs. After spending 16 years in the NFL coaching ranks, this marks Maxie's first season as a collegiate coach.

PREP TEAMMATES ON COMMODORE SQUAD

The Vanderbilt roster features several players who competed on the same high school team, then followed each other to Nashville.

- **Josh Grady** (Jr., WR) and **Kevin McCoy** (So., OL) both attended Armwood H.S. in Tampa, Fla.
- **Darreon Herring** (Jr., ILB), **Jonathan Wynn** (R-Fr., OLB) and **Dallas Rivers** (Fr., RB) are products of Stephenson H.S. just east of Atlanta.
- **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr., TE) and **Hayden Lekacz** (Fr., PK) attended Glenbard West H.S. in suburban Chicago.

VANDERBILT NOTES FROM THE UMASS GAME

• Vanderbilt's comeback from a 11-point deficit to defeat UMass marked its largest fourth-quarter rally since Oct. 19, 2013 when the Commodores scored 17 unanswered points in a 31-27 victory over Georgia.

• **Caleb Azubike** (Jr., DE) continued his outstanding early-season play, contributing seven total tackles, including a pair of quarterback sacks and three tackles for loss. Azubike's second sack forced UMass into a punting situation, with Vanderbilt taking over on its eventual winning drive.

Through two games, Azubike has matched his single-season career high with four quarterback sacks. He shares the SEC lead in the category.

• **C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr., WR) produced the finest game of his brief Commodore career, leading the team with four catches and 70 receiving yards. Duncan also made one of the game's biggest plays, coming up with an incredible grab of a deep pass from **Patton Robinette** (R-So., QB) on the team's game-winning drive. One play, Vanderbilt took the lead with a 4-yard rush by **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., RB). Duncan then added a two-point conversion catch after Webb's score.

Duncan's receptions and receiving yardage totals were a season high for Commodore wide receivers.

• A pair of young linebackers – **Nigel Bowden** (R-Fr., ILB) and **Jonathan Wynn** (R-Fr., OLB) – ranks among the team's leading tacklers. Bowden had seven tackles, including four solo stops, while Wynn contributed six tackles and a QB sack.

Wynn also made his first career start in the game.

• The Commodores scored on special teams for the second time this year. **Stephen Weatherly** (R-So., OLB) started Vanderbilt's fourth-quarter rally by scoring from 11 yards out after blocking a UMass punt. It marked Weatherly's first career punt block and touchdown.

In the opener vs. Temple, the Commodores scored a touchdown when **Oren Burks** (R-Fr., safety) recovered a poor punt snap in the end zone.

• **Patton Robinette** (R-So., QB) went a long way to becoming the team's starting signal caller.

Inserted late in the first quarter, Robinette played one of his top games as a Commodore. He was 15-of-21 for 147 yards and a TD. He also had 35 yards and a TD on six rushes.

It marked the second time for Robinette to guide the Commodores to a double-digit comeback win after being inserted into the lineup.

• **Trey Ellis**, a walk-on true freshmen from Charlotte, N.C., provided a lift to Commodore special teams, returning a pair of UMass punts for 24 yards in the fourth quarter.

Ellis' 8-yard return gave Vanderbilt possession near midfield on its eventual game-winning drive.

• **Wade Freebeck** started at QB making him the first Commodore true freshman to start at the position since David Wallace started against Alabama in 1998. Freebeck became the fifth true freshman quarterback to start since 1975, following Wallace, Kenny Simon (1993), John Gromos (1985) and Mike Wright (1975).

• Vanderbilt put itself in a deep early hole for the third straight game, trailing 14-0 after the opening stanza.

This season, Vanderbilt has been outscored 31-0 in the first quarter. It has outscored its opponents 17-3 in the fourth quarter.

• Vanderbilt held the Minutemen to 88 yards on 39 attempts for an average of 2.3 yards per carry.

• **Adam Butler** (So., DE) scored his first career touchdown, recovering a UMass fumble in the Commodore end zone prior to halftime.

• Vanderbilt converted all three of its red-zone possessions into touchdowns against the Minutemen.

TEAMMATES SELECT THREE CAPTAINS: EAST, TOWNSEND, WOESTMANN ELECTED

Returning starters **Joe Townsend** (Sr., center), **Kyle Woestmann** (Sr., outside linebacker) and **Andrew East** (Sr., snapper) have been elected co-captains for the upcoming season.

Coach Derek Mason announced the team's new captains on Aug. 18. The staff will announce a fourth Commodore to join East, Townsend and Woestmann prior to each game of the 2014 season.

East (Indianapolis, Ind.) will serve as special teams' captain for the second consecutive season. This marks the first year that either Townsend (Hendersonville, Tenn.) or Woestmann (Marietta, Ga.) have served as a Commodore captain.

Mason said East, Townsend and Woestmann were elected in a ballot by Vanderbilt teammates. "I'm pleased for all three of these players. These men stepped forward as team leaders during the summer work-outs and in (preseason) camp," the head coach said.

East is a three-year starter for the Commodores, and regarded as one of the nation's most versatile snappers. He has handled virtually every snap on conversion and punt units since arriving on campus.

East also stands out off the field. He graduated with a civil engineering degree last May and is currently enrolled in postgraduate studies at Vanderbilt's Owen School of Management. He is one of the team's most active participants in community service efforts around Nashville.

Townsend has 25 total starts, most among active Commodores. All of his starts have come at the center position.

Woestmann, who started every game last year at end, has three starts this season at outside linebacker in the 3-4 defensive alignment.

Woestmann ranks second among active Commodores with 17.5 tackles for loss and 12 quarterback sacks. He also ranks second on the team in career tackles.

BANKINS: LONE COACHING HOLDOVER

Charles Bankins, responsible for some of the most impressive special teams in Vanderbilt program history, is the lone holdover on Derek Mason's Commodore staff. Bankins also serves as Mason's running backs coach in 2014 after working with Commodore tight ends from 2011-13.

THREE TRANSFERS ADD TO TEAM DEPTH

Vanderbilt's overall depth has improved to the recent transfers of three student-athletes, all eager to help the team this season.

Davis Dudchock (Grad., TE) and **Chandler Dorrell** (R-Fr., WR) both transferred to Vanderbilt from Stanford. **Stephen Rivers** (Grad., QB) enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt after graduating from LSU.

Dorrell produced his first catch as a Commodore in the team's victory over UMass. Dudchock had one catch for 19 yards against Temple. Rivers is 18-of-50 passes for 246 yards in two appearances.

NEW INDOOR FACILITY BENEFITING COMMODORES THIS SEASON

The \$31 million indoor facility and multipurpose center that opened last November near McGugin Athletics Center and Vanderbilt's outdoor practice facilities virtually assures that Derek Mason will not lose any practices this season to inclement weather.

Head Coach Derek Mason also used the indoor facility for several preseason practices.

JOE TOWNSEND HAS 25 CAREER STARTS; CENTER HAS MOST AMONG ACTIVE PLAYERS

Joe Townsend, a senior from Hendersonville, Tenn., has the most starts of any active Commodores.

The center has 25 career starts. Two other linemen – **Jake Bernstein** (OG) and **Spencer Pulley** (OG) – have 20 starts each.

OT **Wesley Johnson**, a senior in 2013, holds team records with 51 career starts and 51 consecutive career starts.

FRANK MAILE Defensive Line

Joined Vanderbilt staff from Utah State... Known for developing physical DL at Utah State, helping Aggies to 28-13 overall record and three straight bowls in last three years... Spent six years on his alma mater... Vanderbilt DC David Kotulski also coached at Utah State.

BRETT MAXIE Defensive Backs

LEADERSHIP, PRODUCTION EXPECTED FROM VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE CORPS

A strength for the Commodores should be an offensive line unit that features four returning starters and a fifth player with previous starting experience.

The corps features four returning starters: senior center **Joe Townsend**, junior guards **Jake Bernstein** and **Spencer Pulley**, and sophomore tackle **Andrew Jelks**. Also back is senior **Andrew Bridges**, who has 18 career starts at right tackle.

Collectively, the Commodore offensive line has 97 career starts, third highest total in the SEC behind only South Carolina (105) and Texas A&M (103).

Last spring, new position coach **Keven Lightner** named Jelks to replace departed left tackle **Wesley Johnson**, the All-SEC performer who finished his career by setting team records with 51 career and consecutive starts. With Jelks at left tackle, Bridges and redshirt sophomore **Will Holden** have both started at right tackle this season.

With Townsend, Bernstein and Pulley, the Commodores are veteran interior blockers who have experienced plenty of success. The trio has combined for 65 career starts at center and guard.

JERRON SEYMOUR BACK IN ACTION

The Commodore offense got their active career rusher back last week when **Jerron Seymour** (R-Jr.) saw his first action of the season.

Seymour enjoyed limited action, rushing for 15 yards on five carries in his initial participation of the year.

With Seymour sidelined until the UMass game, the Commodores turned to a pair of freshmen, **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr.) and **Dallas Rivers** (Fr.), to provide production in the rushing attack. Webb has been superb, totalling 281 yards on 58 carries. Rivers has 39 yards on 10 attempts.

Seymour, who rushed for 716 yards and tied a team record with 14 TDs last year, has 999 career rushing yards entering the South Carolina game.

ALL NEW STARTERS IN SECONDARY

Vanderbilt's new-look defensive secondary features new starters are every position.

Oren Burks (R-Fr.) and **Andrew Williamson** (Jr.) have started both games at safety, replacing current Buffalo Bill Kenny Ladler and 2013 team captain Jovan Marshall. The duo have been supported by **Jahmel McIntosh** (Jr.).

Burks ranks third among Commodores with 18 total tackles, just one behind co-leaders **Nigel Bowden** (R-Fr., ILB) and **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., OLB), and has a team-high four defensed passes. Williamson has contributed nine solo stops and 13 total tackles.

At cornerback, **Tre Bell** (R-Fr.), **Torren McGaster** (So.) and **Paris Head** (So.) have earned starting assignments. Only Head, with a lone start in 2014, has starting gexperience.

Bell's 12 solo tackles tops the defense. He ranks fourth overall with 16 total tackles. McGaster has added 13 total tackles.

Another youngster, **Ryan White** (R-Fr.), is the team's top nickel back. White has contributed a dozen tackles.

SEC NETWORK "SEC STORIED" 'IT'S TIME' ON GAINES, MULLINS DEBUTS SEPT. 4

The SEC Network debuted the "SEC Storied" series episode "It's Time" Sept. 4. The 70-minute documentary chronicles the incredible relationship that developed between former Vanderbilt fullback Brad Gaines and the late former Ole Miss defensive back Chucky Mullins.

The emotional episode premiered on the Vanderbilt campus on Sept. 2, with Gaines, former Ole Miss head coach Billy Brewer and several of Mullins' Ole Miss teammates in the audience.

"It's Time" depicts the aftermath of a bruising hit by Mullins on Gaines during the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game on Oct. 28, 1989. During the play near the Ole Miss goal line, Mullins suffered a broken neck, leaving him a quadriplegic. But in that heartbreaking moment, a friendship was born that lasted another two years, until Mullins died of a blood clot in a Memphis hospital room, with Gaines at his side.

The tragedy took a tremendous toll on Gaines, who befriended Mullins and his family, and Mullins' coaches and teammates at Ole Miss. Each year, Gaines attends a spring banquet on the Oxford campus when one Ole Miss player is honored to wear Mullins' No. 38 jersey the following year. Gaines also continues to care for Mullins' gravesite in Russellville, Ala.

Gaines, several members of the Gaines family, and former Commodore quarterback John Gromos, the current color analyst for Vanderbilt football games who threw the pass intended for Gaines, are interviewed in the film. Interviews with Mullins' guardians, former *Tennessean* sportswriter Larry Woody, Coach Billy Brewer and several Rebel teammates also are included in the production.



SEC NETWORK'S 'SEC NATION' SHOW AIRED FROM NASHVILLE SEPT. 6

The SEC Network's two-hour Saturday morning college football show, *SEC Nation*, aired from the grounds of LP Field in Nashville prior to the Ole Miss-Vanderbilt game.

SEC Nation is the SEC Network's live pre-game show designed similar to ESPN's highly popular *College GameDay* production.

The show broadcast from 9-11 a.m. CT from LP Field. The set The *SEC Nation* set also was next to Vandyville, Vanderbilt's official tail-gate location for the game, just outside the south gates of LP Field.

SEC Nation will feature ESPN play-by-play announcer Joe Tessitore hosting the stage with several prominent SEC Network and Southeastern Conference football personalities, including 2007 Heisman Trophy winner Tim Tebow, former LSU and Dallas Cowboys defensive lineman Marcus Spears, sports talk provocateur Paul Finebaum.

SEC Network premiered *SEC Nation* August 28 before the Texas A&M-South Carolina. They also produced the show just outside Jordan-Hare Stadium Aug. 30 prior to the Arkansas-Auburn game.



COMMODORE NOTES

'DORES ARE 17-6 IN LAST 23 GAMES; TIED FOR SEC'S FIFTH BEST RECORD

Vanderbilt sports an 17-6 overall record since October 2012.

The 'Dores' 17-6 overall record in its last 23 games dating back to a victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

Vanderbilt's 17-6 stretch includes a season-ending five-game win streak in 2013 and seven-game win streak in 2012.

Among SEC teams, the Commodores' record during the span is tied for fifth with Missouri behind Alabama (21-2), LSU (18-5), South Carolina (18-5) and Texas A&M (18-5).

Twelve of the victories have come against power conference affiliates: Auburn, Kentucky (twice), Ole Miss, Tennessee (twice), Georgia and Florida from the SEC, Wake Forest (twice) and N.C. State from the ACC, and Houston from the American Athletic Conference.

TWO OF TEAM'S TOP SACK SPECIALISTS ATTACKING QBS FROM NEW POSITION

Defensive scheme changes have resulted in two of Vanderbilt's top three sack specialists from a year ago attacking opposing quarterbacks from a new position this year.

Derek Mason's highly regarded defense at Stanford offered opposing offenses multiple looks out of a 3-4 base formation.

Senior **Kyle Woestmann** and sophomore **Stephen Weatherly**, two of the team's three top sack specialists from 2013, have shifted from defensive end to outside linebackers in the new scheme.

Mason's outside linebackers at Stanford were known as aggressive playmakers, frequently causing havoc for Cardinal foes.

A third potential outside linebacker this year, junior **Caleb Azubike**, contributed a team-high two QB sacks in the Ole Miss game while staying on the defensive front.

HERRING AMONG SEC'S TOP TOP RETURNING LINEBACKERS

Darreon Herring returns for his junior season after establishing himself as one of the SEC's top productive and versatile linebackers.

Herring, one of four Vanderbilt returnees who started every game last year, has 10 total tackles through two games.

As a first-year starter in 2013, Herring finished the season with career highs in solo tackles (47), total tackles (84) and defended passes (11). He tops all active Commodore defenders in the three defensive categories. Among the returning SEC defenders, Herring's production last year ranks sixth in total tackles, eighth in solo stops, and fourth in defended passes.

THREE GRADUATE STUDENTS ON VANDERBILT ROSTER

The Commodore roster includes three student-athletes currently enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt: **Davis Dudchock** (TE, Oak Mountain, Ala.), **Andrew East** (snapper, Indianapolis) and **Stephen Rivers** (QB, Athens, Ala.).

East, a 2014 captain, earned a degree in civil engineering last May from Vanderbilt. He is enrolled at Vanderbilt's Owen School of Management. He enters his fourth season as a starter as the Commodores' primary snapper.

Dudchock and Rivers are both first-year contributors. Dudchock is working toward a master's in higher education administration from the Peabody College after graduating from Stanford last spring. Rivers graduated from LSU in May, and is taking postgraduate courses at Vanderbilt's Divinity School.

The 2013 Vanderbilt roster did not include a single graduate student.

Rivers earned his first start at quarterback in the Ole Miss loss. He has completed 18 of 50 passes for 246 yards. Dudchock has one catch for 19 yards.

VANDERBILT NOW A NOVEMBER TEAM; WON LAST NINE GAMES IN THE MONTH

Vanderbilt has become a superb late-season team.

Dating back to the 2011 finale, the 'Dores have notched nine consecutive November wins. The win streak continues into 2014 when Vanderbilt hosts Old Dominion Nov. 1.

Vanderbilt's 9-win November streak is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished in the 1903-05 seasons.

From 2001-10, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

Butler earned six starts at tackle as a redshirt freshman, and has 11 tackles this year after registering 25 tackles last year.

The duo is supported by **Caleb Azubike** (Jr.), **Barron Dixon** (Sr.) and **Jay Woods** (R-Fr.). Azubike has four QB sacks and five tackles for loss in two games. Woods and Dixon have added 10 and four tackles, respectively.
