## PREVIOUS 'DORES-TIGERS GAME IN NASHVILLE WAS UNIQUE

The only game Vanderbilt and Missouri have played in Nashville features one of the most bizarre statistical lines in team history.

On Sept. 21, 1957, Vanderbilt and Missouri played through a rainstorm to an eventual 7-7 tie at old Dudley Field.

What made the game unique? Due to the conditions, neither team completed a single pass.

## 'DORES NOW 10-2 OVER LAST 12 GAMES

The Commodores are an impressive 10-2 in their last 12 games dating back to midseason a year ago.

Vanderbilt's margin of victory in the 10 wins is 23.8 points. Of the 10 wins, six have come against teams from BCS conferences – Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss and Tennessee from the Southeastern Conference and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The last time Vanderbilt enjoyed a 10-2 record over a 12-game stretch came in 1955-56.

## RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

## OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

The Commodores are tallying points at a better average than 2012 when the squad witnessed its highest point total in nearly 100 years.

Through five games, Vanderbilt ranks sixth in the SEC with a 34.8-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 4.8 points higher than in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points.

The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the highest Vanderbilt single-season total since Dan McGugin's 1915 Vanderbilt squad averaged 51.4 points during a 9-1 campaign.

The increased scoring continues a trend started at midseason one year ago. In its last 11 games, Vanderbilt is averaging 38.6 points and has tallied at least 24 points in each contest.

## FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

**James Franklin** is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer **Dan McGugin**, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 18-13 overall. His .581 winning percentage is the best by a Vanderbilt mentor since **Red Sanders** roamed the Vanderbilt sidelines in the World War II era.

## SENIOR O-LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON RANKS AS TEAM LEADER WITH 43 CAREER STARTS

**Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OL) paces all active Commodore position players with 43 career starts.

Johnson has started every game of his Commodore career, seeing assignments at four line positions: center, right and left tackle, and left guard. He has started at left tackle in each of Vanderbilt's first five games this year.

If Johnson starts every game this year, he will become the all-time team leader in career starts. **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07) share the mark with 48 starts.

## SPEAR SETS NEW TEAM MARK WITH FOURTH FIELD GOAL OF 50 OR MORE YARDS

Coming off the best season ever by a Vanderbilt kicker, **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) has continued his excellent form early in the 2013 campaign.

Spear, an All-SEC recipient in 2012 after setting a team record with 20 field goals, is 4-of-5 on FGs and 22-of-22 PAT attempts this year.

The Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yards during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

The 54-yarder is also the longest field goal in the SEC this year.

**MORE ON THE MISSOURI SERIES** Four of the five previous meetings between the Commodores and Tigers have been played in the state of Missouri. In the lone game played in Nashville, the teams played to a 7-7 tie in the 1957 season opener. Though infrequently played, the series between Missouri and Vanderbilt dates to the infancy of both programs. Vanderbilt's victory in Columbia last year started a three-game road win streak in SEC play.

## UNIQUE MEETING OF OPPOSING FRANKLINS

The Vanderbilt-Missouri game renews the unique matchup of James Franklins.

While Vanderbilt fans will cheer for the James Franklin-guided Commodores, Missouri followers have their own Franklin to support – the Tiger offense is directed by senior QB James Franklin.

Missouri's Franklin and Vanderbilt starting QB **Austyn Carta-Samuels** rank among SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense.

## FRANKLIN'S COMMODORES MOVE TO 10-1 IN NON-SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE PLAY

Vanderbilt captured its sixth straight regular season win against a non-Southeastern Conference member when it defeated UAB 52-24 on Sept. 28.

Besides UAB, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay and UMass, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over a non-SEC opponent, N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 10-1 in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 11-2 overall against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, VU is 22-14 against regular season non-SEC teams.

## VANDERBILT'S NARROW VICTORY AT MISSOURI MARKS FIRST SEC ROAD WIN IN TWO YEARS

**COLUMBIA, Mo.** – A botched Missouri extra-point snap and a bobbled punt attempt that led to a safety helped Vanderbilt beat Missouri 19-15, giving the Commodores their first SEC win.

Zac Stacy rushed for 72 yards and two touchdowns on 29 carries for Vanderbilt (2-3, 1-2), which earned its first conference win. Jordan Rodgers was 14 of 24 for 182 yards and one interception.

Missouri (3-3, 0-3) took an early 6-0 lead and kept Vanderbilt from gaining a first down until nearly nine minutes into the second quarter. Missouri couldn't muster much offense after an early injury to quarterback James Franklin, who sprained his left knee on a first-

quarter run and didn't return.

Vanderbilt's first points of the game came when Missouri punter Trey Barrow couldn't handle a snap while standing in the back of Missouri's end zone, with the ball rolling out the back. A 5-yard Stacy run late in the second half gave the Commodores a 9-6 lead they wouldn't relinquish.

## MORE STATISTICS AND FACTS FROM VICTORY VERSUS UAB

★ The Commodores have tallied at least 24 points in each of their last 11 games dating back to midseason one year ago.

It marks a modern day team record for the longest stretch of games with at least 24 points scored.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) established a new career high with 107 rushing yards on 12 carries. He also added 45 receiving yards on two catches.

Seymour's 58-yard rush in the first half marked a personal long carry and the team's longest play from scrimmage this season.

★ The Commodores' 52-point scoring outburst was the second highest under Head Coach James Franklin, coming just short of the team's 55-point total in the 2012 season finale at Wake Forest.

★ The Commodores were efficient on offense, converting on 5-of-10 third down attempts and all six red-zone opportunities. Each of Vanderbilt's possessions inside the UAB 20-yard line resulted in a Commodore touchdown.

★ **Barron Dixon** (Jr.) and **Adam Butler** (R-Fr.) contributed several impressive plays on the interior line.

Dixon set a single-game high with six total tackles, including his first career quarterback sack. Butler was credited with just two tackles, but both came on consecutive plays in the third quarter that resulted in lost yardage for the Blazers.

★ **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) set a Vanderbilt and collegiate best with 334 passing yards. His former high of 319 yards came as a University of Wyoming starter.

With a 300-yard effort in the opener, Carta-Samuels also becomes the first Commodore signal caller since **Jay Cutler** to produce multiple 300-yard passing performances in a season. Cutler had five 300-yard games as a senior in 2005.

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) contributed five tackles and his first interception of the season.

The senior ranks as the team's active career leader with 235 total tackles and five interceptions.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) established a new single-game high with 108 receiving yards, just one week after producing his first game surpassing 100 receiving yards.

★ **Javon Marshall** (Sr., safety) might have played his finest game of the season, registering a team-high seven tackles. Two of his stops were tackles for loss.

★ The Commodores' 540 yards of offense – 334 passing, 206 rushing – was the second highest total since James Franklin became head coach.

★ **Fitz Lassing** (Sr., FB) had his best game of the season, catching three passes for 18 yards, including a 1-yard TD toss from Carta-Samuels.

★ **Darrius Sims** (Fr., CB/KR) nearly broke two kickoff returns while averaging 24.0 yards per return. Sims had a season-best 42-yard return in the second quarter.

★ **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) tallied his first touchdown on a 6-yard rush. He had 27 yards on three carries after replacing Carta-Samuels in the final quarter.

★ Carta-Samuels connected with eight different receiving targets, the most of any game this season.

★ The Commodores' defensive starters mirrored the same unit that started against UMass.

Eight Vanderbilt defenders have started all five games this year: DE **Kyle Woestmann**, DE **Walker May**, DT **Vince Taylor**, LB **Darreon Herring**, CB **Andre Hal**, CB **Steven Clarke**, free safety **Kenny Ladler** and strong safety **Javon Marshall**.

## MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) continues to impress early in the 2013 season as one of the top receivers in the SEC and NCAA.

Last Saturday, he had 115 yards and a TD on eight receptions in Vanderbilt's 52-24 win over UAB. He opened the year with a 10-catch, 178-yard, 1-TD performance against Ole Miss, then produced back-to-back 100-yard receiving efforts against Austin Peay and South Carolina. On Sept. 21, Matthews had 76 yards, including a remarkable 11-yard TD reception, on eight catches in the win over UMass.

For the season, Matthews ranks first in the SEC with 40 catches. He ranks second in the conference with 586 receiving yards for a 117.2-yard average. His four TD receptions leads the team and is tied for third in the SEC.

Matthews continues to impact the Commodore record books. He now shares the team record of 21 career touchdown catches **Dan Stricker** (1999-2002). He ranks third all-time in two other important career categories: receptions (190) and receiving yards (2,873).

Matthews also holds the team career mark of 15 games of 100+ receiving yards. His 2012 record of seven 100+ receiving yardage games also is a team mark.

Matthews also is closing in on other significant Commodore and SEC reception marks. He needs 91 receiving yards to match the Vanderbilt career record of 2,964 yards set by **Boo Mitchell** (1985-88). Matthews also is 46 catches short of matching the Vanderbilt and SEC mark of 236 receptions held by **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews' performance in the opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his collegiate career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels. Matthews' total was the most by a Commodore against SEC competition since **Earl Bennett** amassed 220 receiving yards against Kentucky in 2006. It also equals the No. 11 total in team history.

The SEC's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb results versus conference foes. Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 10 of his last 14 games against SEC teams, averaging 120.5 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 13 of the last 17 games.

## COMMODORES GETTING SUPERB PLAY FROM SPECIAL TEAMS UNITS

The Commodores continue to receive splendid play from virtually every component of special teams.

For the third straight week, special teams play provided a huge advantage for the Commodores in the victory over UAB.

Here's examples of the continued stellar special teams effort:

• **PLACEKICKING** **Carey Spear** (Sr.) converted his only field goal attempt, a lengthy 50-yarder, made all six PAT attempts, contributed an assisted tackle on kickoff coverage, and sailed five of nine kickoffs deep into the end zone for touchbacks.

• **PUNTING** **Taylor Hudson** enjoyed another superb punting display against UAB. The sophomore averaged 43.7 yards on three punts against the Blazers, and allowed no return yards.

It marked the second straight game that opponents have failed to register return yards against Taylor.

Hudson's net punting average improved to 43.0 yards, No. 1 in the SEC and No. 2 in the nation.

• **COVERAGE UNITS** Kickoff coverage was stellar in the win over UAB, with the Blazers averaging just 12.5 yards on four returns. For the second straight game, Commodore opponents did not return a punt.

For the year, Vanderbilt coverage units rank among the best in the nation. The Commodores are holding kick returners to a 14.8-yard average, tops in the SEC and is No. 7 in the NCAA. The team's punt coverage unit of just 5.6 yards also ranks among SEC and NCAA leaders.

• **RETURN UNITS** **Darrius Sims** (Fr.) is quickly becoming the team's most exciting returner. He had 96 yards on four kickoff returns, including a 42-yarder.

Sims has averaged 26.0 yards on six returns during the Commodores' last two games.

## VANDERBILT HOMECOMING RESULTS

Vanderbilt is 26-37-3 in its homecoming games since the mid-1940s.

The Commodores have captured their last two homecoming games – against UMass in 2012 and Army in 2011.

## SENIOR SAFETIES ARE TEAM'S LEADING TACKLERS

Two senior safeties, **Kenny Ladler** and **Javon Marshall**, are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 21 solo tackles and 35 total stops. Marshall is second in both categories.

**Caleb Azubike** (So., DE) and **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) have the most tackles for loss (4) while **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) has the team lead in QB sacks (2.5).

**Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with five passes defended.

## NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores will feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

## SUMMARY OF THE COMMODORE CAPTAINS

### AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer QB is averaging 244.6 passing yards and 259.2 yards of total offense in five starts. He also has accounted for 11 TDs.

### ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He serves as the team's primary snapper in all roles.

### CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. Garnham did not play in the last four games.

### ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender has 22 total tackles, including two for losses, and a team-high seven passes defended early in the season.

### WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 43rd consecutive career start at UMass.

### JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 32 total tackles.

### JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Trophy candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in four of five early-season games, leads the SEC with 40 receptions and ranks second with 586 receiving yards.

### WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

Part of a five-player rotation, May has one QB sack to go with 12 total tackles.

### CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior, coming off the best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, is 4-of-5 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more.

## LINEBACKER LARRY FRANKLIN LATEST 'DORE TO EARN FIRST STARTING ASSIGNMENT

**Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) became the latest Commodore to earn their first career start this season as a Commodore in the team's 24-7 victory at Massachusetts on Sept. 21.

Franklin contributed two tackles for the defense in the road win.

Franklin joins nine other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts in the Commodores' first five games of the season.

Making their first collegiate starts in the opener against Ole Miss were **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT), **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Taylor Hudson Jr.**, punter), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE). **Jake Sealand** (So., LB) and **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) also enjoyed their first career starts against Austin Peay and South Carolina, respectively.

Several of the other first-time starters posted superb stats in their first start. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles, and a quarterback hurry against Ole Miss. Taylor, Clarke and Herring also played well against the Rebels: Taylor setting a single-game career high with four total tackles, Clarke notching three tackles and Herring posting five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes. Butler, who moved from offensive line to defensive tackle during spring drills, contributed one tackle against Ole Miss.

Hudson averaged 40.0 yards on five punts against the Rebels in his first appearance as a Commodore.

Sealand had a pair of tackles against Austin Peay. Seymour had 39 rushing yards on six carries, and scored Vanderbilt's first touchdown on a 1-yard rush.

Jelks started against Ole Miss lined up at tight end. He started last week at right tackle.

## SEVENTEEN COMMODORES HAVE EARNED INITIAL COLLEGIATE ACTION THIS YEAR

Seventeen underclassmen have experienced their initial action in a Commodore uniform during Vanderbilt's five games.

First-time defensive players included **Torey Agee** (R-Fr., DT), **Ladarius Banks** (R-Fr., DT), **Ja'karri Thomas** (R-Fr., LB), **Harding Harper** (R-Fr., LB), **Torren McGaster** (R-Fr., CB), **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB), **Darrius Sims** (Fr., CB) and **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., DE).

**Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) and **Colby Cooke** (R-Fr., PK) is the only specialists participating for the first time.

## THREE TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED

Three Vanderbilt true freshmen, **Latevius Rayford** (WR), **Jordan Cunningham** (WR) and **Darrius Sims** (CB), have participated in the Dores' early-season games.

Sims has impressed as a big-play kick returner and continues to get action in the Commodore secondary. Cunningham had a team-high seven passes for 67 yards in the win over Austin Peay.

Rayford also posted one catch for 24 yards against the Gobs.

No new true freshmen has played in the team's last three games.

Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith, now starting with the Ravens, also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... ### GEORGE BARLOW Def. Recruiting Coord./DBs

In 2012, Barlow mentored first-year starting CB Andre Hal to second team All-SEC honors... Another CB starter, senior Trey Wilson broke team record with five career interception returns for touchdowns... Started 2011 campaign as New Mexico's defensive coordinator, then was named interim head coach after fourth game.

## FACTS ON COMMODORE OL WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate Wesley Johnson has started 43 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

- ★ Johnson has been flagged once for holding during his 43-game career.
- ★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 6.5 sacks on 1,141 career pass attempts, or one sack every 176 pass plays.
- ★ Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012 – and has not during the first five games this year.
- ★ Johnson has produced 182 knockdown blocks, 56 intimidation blocks and 116 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.
- ★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two Vanderbilt offensive touchdowns for the last 3+ seasons.

## CARTA-SAMUELS OFF TO SOLID START TO SENIOR YEAR

**Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense through five early-season games.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB during the 2009-10 seasons for the University of Wyoming, is averaging 244.6 passing yards and 259.2 yards of total offense in five starts. He has also completed eight TD passes and ran for three other scores.

Carta-Samuels enjoyed a career outing in the 52-24 victory over UAB, throwing for 334 yards and two TDs while completing 23-of-29 attempts.

Carta-Samuels has been extremely accurate, hitting on 64.7% of his 136 pass attempts. If he maintains the percentage, it would rank as the best by a Vanderbilt QB in 60 years.

Carta-Samuels opened the season by becoming just the second Commodore QB ever to reach 300 passing yards in the season opener. His performance vs. Ole Miss in the opener ranked among the best ever by a Vanderbilt QB.

Carta-Samuels' passing average ranks fifth in the SEC and 35th in the NCAA. He also ranks fifth in the SEC in total offense.

He has six TD passes, three to Matthews and one each to **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR), **Steven Scheu** (R-So., TE), **Wesley Tate** (R-Sr., RB).

## HUDSON SUPERB AS 1ST-YEAR STARTING PUNTER

In five short weeks, **Taylor Hudson** (So., punter) has earned the respect of teammates and SEC observers.

Hudson has been superb as the replacement of 2012 All-SEC punter **Richard Kent**.

Hudson averaged 43.7 yards on three punts vs. UAB. None of the punts were returned by the Blazers.

The former prep quarterback who has aspirations of becoming a neurosurgeon is averaging 45.1 yards, fifth best in the SEC. His net average of 43.0 tops the conference.

Hudson earned the team's Specialist of the Week against Austin Peay after averaging 48.2 yards on four punts. Three of his punts landed inside the Governors' 20-yard line.

Hudson has punts of 50 yards or more in four of five games. His 75-yarder vs. So. Carolina equals the eighth longest punt in team history.

## JORDAN MATTHEWS HOLDS RECEIVING MARKS; CHASING MORE TEAM & SEC RECORDS

Wide receiver **Jordan Matthews** has established himself as one of the finest receivers to ever wear the Black & Gold. As he approaches midseason of his final year, Matthews is starting to make a strong case for inclusion alongside the greatest receivers in Southeastern

Conference history.

Matthews continued his assault on record books last week vs. UAB, hauling in eight passes for 115 yards and a touchdown.

Three of Matthews' receptions were highlight reel catches, including a 5-yarder in the fourth quarter that enabled him to tie the Vanderbilt career record of 21 TD receptions shared by **Dan Stricker** (1999-2002).

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., is a leading contender for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, given annually to the nation's leading receiver.

Matthews is on a pace this season to improve on his 2012 performance of 94 catches and 1,323 yards, which ranks as the most productive year ever by a Commodore receiver. Through five games, Matthews leads the SEC with 40 catches and ranks No. 2 with 586 receiving yards. He also has four TD catches.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in four games this year, extending his school career record to 15 100+ receiving games. He opened with 10 receptions, 178 yards and a TD vs. Ole Miss and added 111 yards against Austin Peay and 106 yards at South Carolina.

In the performance against UAB, Matthews continued to move up on both Vanderbilt and SEC all-time receiving charts. Besides tying the school career mark for TD catches, he now ranks third in both career

receptions (190) and career receiving yards (2,873).

Entering the Missouri game, Matthews ranks 10th among SEC receivers in career catches. He needs 10 receptions to move into the top five in the category.

He also needs 47 catches to surpass the SEC and team career mark of 236 receptions established by **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews could quickly move up the league's all-time receiving yardage charts. Currently 11th all-time in the SEC, he needs 61 receiving yards to reach the conference's all-time top five.

Matthews is 221 receiving yards from breaking the league's all-time receiving yards record held by former Georgia standout WR **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002).

As a junior in 2012, Matthews posted staggering numbers en route to becoming a First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America selection. Matthews' 94-reception total is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks fifth on the SEC single-season charts.

A fourth Commodore, **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) also was named as a Second-Team All-SEC member by the coaches.

It marks the most Commodores to be recognized in the coaches' preseason ballot since 2009 when five Vanderbilt players were named.

Coach Franklin's post-game press conference following the Missouri game is held after he addresses the team. Only properly credentialed media will be allowed into the conference.

The location for post-game coach and player interviews is the Vanderbilt Stadium Press Conference Room located next to the Commodores' locker room. Access to the room is provided in the south end zone tunnel.

The Vanderbilt Locker Room is closed. Up to five players will be made available for post-game interviews. These interviews will be conducted in the same room as Coach Franklin's remarks. The players will enter when Franklin concludes.

### GAME WEEK INTERVIEW POLICY

All interview requests for Coach Franklin and Vanderbilt student-athletes MUST go through the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications staff.

Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin will be available to media members at the conclusion of practice on Wednesdays. Vanderbilt student-athletes and assistant coaches will also be available to media after the Wednesday sessions.

Media outlets are permitted to shoot the closing 10 minutes of Wednesday practices.

## 'DORES FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC GRIDIRON ACHIEVEMENT

### TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

### MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

### SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

### UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

### WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

### FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

### FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

### DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

## MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

## FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS ANNOUNCES BY VANDERBILT

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

**BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL** When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

**JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL** Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

**JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING** Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

**DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE** Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

**JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE** A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

**CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL** Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

**JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL** Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Lincecum Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.
