What's On Tap

No. 1 Vanderbilt starts a seven-game homestand this weekend as in-state foe Tennessee comes to town for a three game series. The teams will open play Friday night at 7 p.m. and will continue on Saturday at 6 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m. Saturday's game will be broadcast regionally on CSS. Check your local listings for coverage in your area.

Scouting Tennessee

Tennessee is 22-14 overall and 6-7 in SEC play after losing to a game to Mississippi State in a rain shortened three-game series last weekend in Knoxville. The Vols won a pair of midweek games against Furman, 11-7, and Lincoln Memorial, 5-4.

Utility man Andy Simunic leads the team with a .369 batting average to go along with 19 stolen bases in 27 attempts. First baseman Yan Gomes is the top power source with six homers and 30 RBI. Catcher J.P. Arencibia (.296, 3 HR, 21 RBI) and outfielder Julio Borbon (.286, 2 HR, 11 RBI), both of whom played under Tim Corbin for the USA National Team last summer, have battled through injuries that have cost them playing time.

Tennessee is hitting .287 as a team with 30 homers and 236 runs scored through 36 games (6.6 per game).

UT will throw southpaw James Adkins (4-5, 3.11 ERA) in Friday's series-opener. Senior right-hander Craig Cobb (6-2, 4.86 ERA) will start on Saturday, with left-hander Lance McClain (5-4, 4.80 ERA) set to start on Sunday. Freshman lefthander Jeff Lockwood is a two-way player that closes for the Vols with a 1.59 ERA and four saves to go with 21 strikeouts and just four walks in 22.2 innings.

Series Notes: Prior to last year Vanderbilt had won the first three series against UT under Tim Corbin ... VU is 5-1 in the last two series in Nashville and 8-4 since 1999.

Team USA Connections

Five players on the teams, Vanderbilt's David Price, Pedro Alvarez and Casey Weathers and Tennessee's J.P. Arencibia and Julio Borbon were on the 2006 USA National Team, coached by Tim Corbin. That team culminated its summer skein with a gold medal at the FISU World Championships in Havana, Cuba last August. Alvarez, Borbon and Arencibia were the top three hitters on the team, while Price was the top pitcher. UT infielder Tony Delmonico also participated in the USA Trials but did not make the final team.

Price Sets New School Career Strikeout Record

With nine strikeouts against Kentucky last Friday, junior lefthander David Price broke a 35-year old school record with 355 career strikeouts. With his fifth strikeout against the Wildcats, he broke Mike Willis' school record of 350 set from 1969-72. Of note, Willis achieved the mark in four years at Vanderbilt, compared to Price in three. The fellow southpaw went on to a five year career in the major leagues with the Toronto Blue Jays (1977-81) and finished with a 7-21 record and 15 saves with a 4.59 ERA. Price can put considerable distance between him and the others on the list as he has at least five regular season starts left this year.

Casey Weathers Named To Stopper of the Year Watch List

Senior closer Casey Weathers was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year Watch List this week.

He was one of forty players named to the list for the award given to the top relief pitcher in Division I college baseball.

Weathers has had a breakout campaign in 2007 as he leads the Commodores in wins with seven and saves with three. He sports a 7-2 overall record with a 1.80 ERA to go with 44 strikeouts and 12 walks in 30 innings pitched entering the weekend. The Northern California native picked up two wins last week, retiring the lone batter he faced against Belmont (4/11) and took care of all 12 batters he faced in the Commodores 10-8 extra inning win over Kentucky last Friday.

At the end of the regular season, the Division I leader in saves and four other relief pitching stand-outs will be selected as the award's finalists. These finalists will be released on Wednesday, May 30, just prior to the beginning of NCAA regional play.

From the list of finalists, the NCBWA's All-America Committee will select a winner. The third annual winner will be announced on Wednesday, June 6, two days prior to the beginning of NCAA super regional action. Last year's winner was Don Czyz from Kansas. J. Brent Cox of Texas won the inaugural award in 2005.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt (32-8, 9-6 SEC) went 3-1 last week, including winning two of three against Kentucky over the weekend. The team has won the last three SEC series and are in a tie for first with South Carolina in the SEC East ... The Commodores were 23-0 in non-conference games before dropping both midweek games this week. It also marked the first time this season VU has lost back-to-back contests this year ... Vanderbilt hit .338 in four games last week with three homers, 13 doubles and 32 runs scored (eight per game) ... The pitching staff sported a 6.25 ERA with 36 strikeouts and 10 walks in 36 innings ... Andrew Giobbi led the way offensively going 7-for-15 (.467) with a double, triple and three runs scored. Four of his hits came against Kentucky on Friday, a career high ... Ryan Flaherty got back on track with a 7-for-18 (.389) week with two doubles and a team high six RBI ... Brad French went 4-for-11 (.364) with two doubles and David Macias went 7-for-19 (.368), Pedro Alvarez 5-for-14 (.357) and Matt Meingasner 4-for-12 (.333) to close out the .300 hitters ... Ryan Davis came up big on the weekend (3-for-3) with a pinch hit game tying RBI single late in the Commodores 10-8 extra inning win over Kentucky on Friday. He then had two hits off the bench against the Wildcats on Sunday including a two run home-run in the ninth to put the game out of reach ... Jonathan White was 2-for-6 (.333) in a limited role and came up with the game winning RBI double in the 12th inning on Friday ... Alex Feinberg has eight RBI over his last five games and now has a new career high of 28 on the season, besting the 23 he recorded last year ... Mike Minor continues to perform as a freshman as he limited the powerful Kentucky offense (led the league with a .341 batting average) to just two hits and an unearned run in five innings of work on Saturday. He retired the last 14 guys he faced in order. Rain forced his outing to be cut short as the game was suspended and continued the next day. He now leads the Commodores with a 6-0 record and 1.69 ERA ... VU is tied with UNC with the second most wins in the country entering the week. Florida State leads the nation with 35 ... VU plays its next seven at home, including two SEC series against Tennessee and Florida.

Commodores Retain No. 1 National Ranking

With the series win over Kentucky last weekend, Vanderbilt remained the No. 1 team in the country in four of the five major polls.

The Commodores have been ranked No. 1 in at least one of the polls in eight of the last nine weeks.

The Commodores at 32-8 are off to the best start in school history and the team's 20-0 start was the best start of any sport at Vanderbilt. It bested the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team. The team picked up its 30th win on Wednesday, marking the fourth straight year they have achieved the feat.

The No. 1 baseball ranking joins women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports

to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to postseason play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Shea Robin Named To Johnny Bench Watch List

The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission named junior catcher Shea Robin to the initial Johnny Bench Award Watch List.

Twenty-seven catchers from seventeen conferences were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 7, 2007.

Robin is one of four catchers from the Southeastern Conference to be on the list, joining Tennessee's J.P. Arencibia, Mississippi State's Edward Easley and LSU's Robert Lara.

The Woodlands, Texas, native is hitting .292 on the season with a homer and 20 RBI. He is third on the team with a .286 batting average in 15 SEC games entering the weekend. The watch list will be narrowed down to ten semi-finalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2007.

Record Watch

With 11 homers this year, Pedro Alvarez is now in 10th place with 33. He needs three homers to move past Greg Smith into ninth place on the all-time list. Alvarez needs 16 more round-trippers to tie Scotty Madison's mark of 49 set from 1977-80.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
