WILDCATS START 2010 SEASON AT VANDERBILT

For Openers

- Northwestern kicks off its 123rd season of intercollegiate football competition this Saturday against the Vanderbilt Commodores. The Wildcats are 74-44-4 (.623) in season-opening contests. In the last 15 years (since 1995), the Wildcats are 11-4 (.733) in lid-lifters. NU is seeking its sixth straight season-opening victory. Head coach Pat Fitzgerald is a perfect 4-0 in season openers and 1-0 when opening on the road (2006 win at Miami (Ohio)).
- Vanderbilt represents the Wildcats' second successive game against a Southeastern Conference opponent. NU ended the 2009 season with a matchup against Auburn University in the Outback Bowl on New Year's Day. Northwestern dropped that contest 38-35 in overtime in one of the most riveting games of the 2009-10 bowl season.
- Since 1995, the Wildcats have posted nine seasons with six or more victories, including seven in the past decade. NU also had six bowleligible teams in the 2000's.
- NU has won a combined 17 games the past two seasons, which ranks as the third-most wins in a two-year period in school history. Since the start of the 2008 season, only three other Big Ten teams have won more than 17 games—Penn State (22), Ohio State (21) and Iowa (20).
- Northwestern is seeking a third consecutive bowl berth this season after playing in the Valero Alamo Bowl (2008 season) and the Outback Bowl (2009 season) the past two years.
- Northwestern, which is returning a school-record 56 letterwinners, has a young but experienced squad in 2010. The Wildcats plan to start just five seniors against Vandy—four on defense (tackle Corbin Bryant, linebacker Quentin Davie, linebacker Nate Williams and cornerback Justan Vaughn) and one on offense (wide receiver Sidney Stewart). Northwestern, however, expects to start 12 juniors, 11 of whom are fourth-year players. That gives the Wildcats 17 upperclass starters on their offensive and defensive units.
- The Wildcats are returning 16 starters this season (eight on offense, six on defense, two

on special teams), but overall, have 31 players returning who have started at least one college game. **Jeremy Ebert** (9 starts), **Josh Rooks** (8 starts) and **Brian Peters** (7 starts) lead NU's group of returning letterwinners with the most starts.

Fitzgerald's Coaching Record by Month

Coaching from the Press Box Four of Northwestern's nine full-time assistant coaches will be positioned in the press box during each game. Those four are: offensive coordinator Mick McCall, superbacks coach Bob Heffner, linebackers coach Randy Bates and defensive backs coach Jerry Brown.

Northwestern Head Coach Pat Fitzgerald announced on Aug. 27 that seniors Corbin Bryant (Chicago, Ill./Morgan Park) and Quentin Davie (St.

Louis, Mo./Cardinal Ritter) will join juniors Dan Persa (Bethlehem, Pa./

Liberty) and Al Netter (Rohnert Park, Calif./Cardinal Newman) as the

Northwestern is one of just 27 FBS programs returning its entire fulltime coaching staff from a year ago.

Northwestern-Vanderbilt Series Information

Northwestern and Vanderbilt, widely recognized as the top academic institutions in the Big Ten and Southeastern Conferences, respectively, are meeting on the gridiron for the first time in 58 years. NU and Vandy last met on Oct. 4, 1952 in Evanston, and played to a 20-20 tie. Vanderbilt won the only other meeting, a 3-0 decision in 1947, which also was played in Evanston. This is just the 10th time in school history that NU has played an SEC school, and the second one in succession.

Northwestern Coach Pat Fitzgerald

No matter what the setting, 2008 College Football Hall of Fame inductee Pat Fitzgerald invariably feels comfortable using his passion, unwavering set of core values and outward enthusiasm to inspire and improve those around him.

It's apparent to anyone who has watched Fitzgerald join in his squad's linebacker drills during practice to demonstrate proper tackling form. Or to the hundreds of Northwestern freshmen to whom Fitzgerald teaches the right way to sing the school fight song at the start of each academic year. It's even clear to members of the state government of Illinois, whom two winters ago invited Fitzgerald to serve on the Illinois Reform Commission aimed at rooting out political corruption.

That passion was also a primary factor in Fitzgerald's Hall-of-Fame playing career at Northwestern, when he was a two-time Bronko Nagurski and Chuck Bednarik Award winner and team leader of NU's backto-back Big Ten title-winning teams in the mid-'90's. The 'Cats posted a two-year Big Ten record of 15-1 and made appearances in the 1995 Rose Bowl and 1996 Citrus Bowl with Fitzgerald serving as the centerpiece of a defense that ranked among the nation's best.

Although Fitzgerald's passion and commitment to excellence may be difficult to quantify, his positive impact in Northwestern's on-field performance since he took the reins as head coach in 2006 is not.

The past two years (2008-09), Fitzgerald has guided the Wildcats to 17 wins and back-to-back bowl berths. NU has earned bowl eligibility four times in the last five seasons. For his 2008 efforts when he guided the 'Cats to nine victories, Fitzgerald was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, and a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year Award and a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

An assistant football coach for the Wildcats from 2001 through the summer of 2006, Fitzgerald was named Northwestern's 29th head coach on July 7, 2006, succeeding Randy Walker, who died suddenly on June 29, 2006. He was the youngest head football coach among Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I-A) schools until Lane Kiffin (six months younger) was hired by the University of Tennessee on Dec. 1, 2008.

Fitzgerald and his wife, Stacy, have three boys: Jack (5), Ryan (3) and Brendan (19 months). (For Fitzgerald's complete bio, refer to pages 76-79 in the NU yearbook.)

Nonconference Success

Northwestern is set to face four new nonconference opponents this year: Vanderbilt, Illinois State, Rice and Central Michigan. The Wildcats have played Vandy (last in 1952) and Rice (last in 1998) before, but the meetings with Illinois State and Central Michigan represent first-time encounters. NU's three FBS foes have all played in at least one bowl game the past two years, while Central Michigan, the defending MAC champion, has played in the postseason four straight years.

Northwestern has won eight of its last nine nonconference games.

Dating to 1993, Northwestern has posted a .500 or better record against its nonconference opposition each year with one exception (2004). For 15 of the last 17 years, the Wildcats have won at least two non-league games. Last year, the Wildcats went 3-1 against their nonconference opponents.

Academic Achievement

In addition to Northwestern's successes on the football field, the Wildcats continue to excel in the classroom. For the second time in as many years, Northwestern's football program achieved a team grade point average of 3.0 or better for the 2010 winter quarter. For the year, the Wildcats touted a record 171 3.0's (for three quarters).

A school-record 60 players recorded GPA's of 3.0 or higher during the winter quarter (2010) and a school-record 29 players were named Academic All-Big Ten in 2009. Eight players were named to the Big Ten's Distinguished Scholar Award (posting a 3.70 or better GPA for the 2008-09 academic year).

In addition, Northwestern has won the AFCA's Academic Achievement Award three of the last seven years. Northwestern posted a perfect 1,000 APR for the 2008-09 campaign and now has a multi-year rate of 986, placing it in the top 10 percent of all FBS and FCS programs.

Bet You Didn't Know ...

In the last seven years, the Wildcats own the sixth-best Big Ten record at 29-27 (.518). The 'Cats are bunched with Penn State and Purdue in the middle of the standings. Here's a look at the composite Big Ten records since 2003:

Depth Chart Notes

Northwestern has released its depth chart for Vanderbilt and there were few surprises for the Wildcats coming out of the spring and preseason.

Only one true freshman, wide receiver Venric Mark (Tomball, Texas/St. Pius X), cracked the two-deep and begins the season as a backup wide receiver and a possible punt returner.

The Wildcats have just five seniors in their starting lineup, with four on the defensive side of the ball and just one on offense. Other notes on the initial two-deep:

- Junior linebacker Bryce McNaul (Eden Prairie, Minn./Eden Prairie) was rewarded for his strong spring and preseason showing by being named the starting outside will linebacker.
- For the second consecutive year, no true freshman or redshirt freshman is slated to start on defense this year. In addition, no true freshman or redshirt freshman will be starting on NU's offense either.
- Senior Stefan Demos (Scottsdale, Ariz./Horizon) will handle just the place-kicking and kickoff duties this year while redshirt freshman Brandon Williams (Nappanee, Ind./North-Wood) takes over as the team's starting punter.
- Northwestern is returning its entire starting offensive line from a year ago, however, none of the starters up front is a senior. NU is starting two sophomores and three juniors on its offensive line.
- In the defensive secondary, senior cornerback Justan Vaughn (Pearland, Texas/Pearland) and sophomore safety Jared Carpenter (Bowling Green, Ky./Bowling Green) have locked up the two starting positions at their respective spots.
- In addition to the one true freshman (Venric Mark) on the two-deep, only five redshirt freshmen landed backup spots on the depth chart. Those five are: quarterback Evan Watkins (Carol Stream, Ill./Glenbard North), wide receiver Drew Moulton (Freeland, Mich./Midland), left tackle Brian Smith (Medina, Ohio/Walsh Jesuit), defensive end Tyler Scott (Warren, Ohio/ Howland) and outside linebacker Damien Proby (North Las Vegas, Nev./Cheyenne).

Notes on Northwestern's 2010 Offense

- Of the projected 11 starters in Saturday's season opener at Vanderbilt, only two Wildcat players will be making their first collegiate start—quarterback **Dan Persa** and right tackle **Patrick Ward**. While Persa has played in 21 career games, and earned significant game minutes against Penn State and Iowa last year, Saturday marks his first collegiate start. Ward saw reserve duty on the offensive line as a true freshman last year, but did not start any contests.
- Left tackle **Al Netter** leads all NU offensive players with a team-best 26 career starts.
- Senior **Stephen Simmons**, who is one of three Wildcats who could start at running back Saturday night, is Northwestern's leading active career rusher with 408 yards.
- Senior **Sidney Stewart** is Northwestern's leading active career receiver with 59 catches. Superback **Drake Dunsmore** leads all current players with 664 receiving yards (Stewart is second with 604 yards).
- The past three years, Northwestern has ranked among the nation's leaders in third-down conversion percentage. NU ranked 19th in 2007, 21st in 2008 and 17th in 2009.
- Northwestern's hurry-up, no-huddle offense produced an average of 79.5 plays per game in 2009, the third-most of any FBS team. The Wildcats set an NCAA record with 115 offensive plays vs. Auburn in the 2010 Outback Bowl.
- The Wildcats have scored in double figures 34 straight games.
- In recent years, Northwestern has been one of the least penalized teams nationally. The Wildcats ranked 25th nationally in fewest yards penalized a year ago.

Notes on Northwestern's 2010 Defense

- Only one projected defensive starter for Saturday's season-opening game at Vanderbilt has yet to start at least one career game for the Wildcats—junior defensive tackle **Jack DiNardo**. DiNardo has played in 16 career games.
- Ten of Northwestern's 11 defensive starters are either juniors or seniors. The lone non-senior or -junior in the lineup is safety **Jared Carpenter**, a sophomore.
- Northwestern's leading active career tackler is senior linebacker Quentin Davie, who has racked up 172 tackles thus far in his career.
 Fellow linebacker Nate Williams ranks second on the squad with 158 career hits.
- Davie, along with defensive end **Vince Browne**, are the Wildcats' top two pass sackers. Browne has 9 career pass sacks while Davie has contributed 8.5 sacks throughout his career.
- Northwestern totaled 17 interceptions last year, which ranked 16th nationally for most INT's per game. NU also ranked 11th nationally with its 30 turnovers gained.

Several Wildcats Named to Preseason Watch Lists

Four Northwestern players have been named to preseason watch lists for their respective position's player of the year award.

Drake Dunsmore, who ranked second among all Big Ten tight ends in receptions a year ago, is on the John Mackey Award preseason list. **Quentin Davie**, NU's top returning tackler, is on the Dick Butkus Award preseason watch list.

Stefan Demos, a consensus preseason All-Big Ten place-kicker and a second-team All-Big Ten honoree in 2009, is on the Lou Groza Award watch list. And center **Ben Burkett**, who has started 26 straight games, in on the Rimington Award preseason watch list once again.

Corbin Bryant a Nominee for AFCA's Prestigious 2010 Good Works Team@

Senior defensive tackle **Corbin Bryant** is a nominee for the Allstate American Football Coaches Association's Good Works Team@. He is trying to become Northwestern's fifth consecutive Good Works Team@ recipient. NU has had a student-athlete named to the prestigious 11-player team four consecutive years: Adam Kadela in 2006, Joel Howells in 2007, Eric Peterman in 2008 and Andrew Brewer in 2009

In the areas of giving back and volunteerism, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® represents the "best of the best" among more

than 50,000 student-athletes participating in the sport at all four-year institutions. The total eclipses the 106 nominees achieved last season, demonstrating the continued growth of a platform that is widely recognized as the most prestigious community service award in college football.

2010 Graduates

Seven Northwestern players have already earned their degree with the other seven seniors on pace to graduate in the coming year. NU's seven players with a degree, include: Sidney Stewart, Stefan Demos, Corbin Bryant, Justan Vaughn, John Henry Pace, Lee Coleman and Keegan Grant.

National Football League Bloodlines

NU has three players who have fathers who played in the NFL: **David Arnold** (father, David, played for Pittsburgh), **Hunter Bates** (father, Bill, played for Dallas) and **Drake Dunsmore** (father, Pat, played for Chicago). Another player, redshirt freshman **Mike Trumpy**, is the nephew of former Cincinnati Bengal All-Pro tight end, Bob Trumpy.

Cardiac Cats

In recent years, when Northwestern is involved in a close game, the "Cardiac 'Cats" have had great success winning the tight battles. After several close wins in 2009, NU is now 24-7 in its last 31 games decided by seven points or less. Northwestern won four road games in 2008, and all of them by seven points or less. In 2009, Northwestern went 6-2 in games decided by seven points or less. Under current head coach Pat Fitzgerald, the Wildcats are 14-6 in games decided by seven points or less.

Top-20 Matchup

While NorthTwestern and Vanderbilt are missing from the preseason football rankings, there's no question that Saturday's matchup with the Commodores will pair two of the nation's elite academic institutions. Northwestern is ranked 12th in the latest *U.S. News* college rankings while Vanderbilt is positioned 17th. NU and Vandy are the only two private institutions among the 23 current schools in the Big Ten and SEC.

Trash-Talking at Halas Hall

There might be a little extra chatter in the Halas Hall locker room this week as the Chicago Bears' roster is filled with Northwestern and Vanderbilt graduates. There are three Wildcats on the current Bears' roster, linebacker Nick Roach, defensive end Corey Wootton and wide receiver Zeke Markshausen. There are five Vandy grads on the Bears roster, led by quarterback Jay Cutler and linebacker Hunter Hillenmeyer. Hillenmeyer recently earned his MBA from Northwestern.

Wildcats Set to Play at the Friendly Confines

The Chicago Cubs and Northwestern University announced on Friday, April 23 that the Wildcats would host the University of Illinois at Wrigley Field at 2:30 p.m. CT (ESPNU) Saturday, Nov. 20, 2010. The matchup will mark the first college football game at Wrigley Field since 1938, when DePaul University played home games at the ballpark. The contest will be the first football game of any kind at the Friendly Confines since the Chicago Bears last played there in December of 1970.

On Friday, Aug. 27, it was announced that Allstate Insurance Company would be the game's title sponsor, and the "Allstate Wrigleyville Classic" logo was unveiled.

Tickets for this game will be available through the Northwestern Ticket Office. In order to purchase a ticket for the November 20 game, fans must purchase season tickets for Northwestern's five home games at Ryan Field. Season tickets are now on sale through Wildcat ticket outlets (Ryan Field Box Office, 847-491-CATS [2287] or NUsports. com).

This will be the first time in more than 87 years that Northwestern and Illinois will play at Wrigley Field. On October 27, 1923, the Wildcats and the Illini squared off at the Friendly Con-



fines (then called Cubs Park) in front of 32,000 fans. This year's Northwestern-Illinois game with mark the 104th game between the Big Ten Conference rivals since the two first met in 1892.

'Cat Tails

- Northwestern owns one of the best NCAA overtime records, having gone 8-3 in OT contests. The Wildcats are 7-0 all-time in overtime games versus Big Ten teams and 4-0 all-time in extra sessions at Ryan Field. Interestingly, NU was 8-1 all-time in overtime before suffering back-to-back overtime losses in the Valero Alamo and Outback bowls the past two years.
- Northwestern led the Big Ten Conference in passing offense in 2009, marking the third time in the last five seasons that the Wildcats have topped the Big Ten in that category. In 2005, NU averaged a then-school record 306.8 yards per game. In 2007, the Wildcats topped that mark by averaging 307.9 yards per game. And then last year, NU averaged 286.5 yards per game to lead the league.

"The Pat Fitzgerald Show" and "Wildcat Insider"

Two recent additions to the Chicagoland sports airwaves is "The Pat Fitzgerald Show," a weekly half-hour show on Northwestern football that is being produced by Northwestern Athletics, in conjunction with Northwestern Sports Properties. Head coach Pat Fitzgerald and WGN sports director Dave Eanet will recap each week's football game and preview the upcoming opponent each week. The first show debuts at 11 p.m. next Tuesday (Sept. 7) with a rebroadcast at 1 p.m. on Sept. 8 on Chicago's Comcast SportsNet. The Big Ten Network also will air the coaches' show at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 9.

Northwestern's weekly radio show on WGN, "Wildcat Insider," is back for a second season and will air on Friday evenings throughout the 2010-11 school year. Most shows will be aired between 10 and 11:30 p.m. depending upon WGN programming. That half-hour radio show is hosted by Eanet and Northwestern Director of Athletics Jim Phillips.
