WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss returns home for the first time since Sept. 9 to take on Vanderbilt at for Homecoming. It marks the start of a three-game home stretch, which continues with LSU (Oct. 21) and Arkansas (Oct. 28).
- Saturday marks the 92nd meeting between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt dating back to 1894. It is the third-most
 played series of all-time between Ole Miss and its 2017 opponents (Mississippi State, LSU). The Rebels lead
 the series 50-39-2 overall and 23-6 in Oxford. The Rebels have also won three of the last four with Vandy.
- After playing the No. 1 and No. 12 team, Ole Miss gets a break from top 25 competition this week.
- **Matt Luke** is in his 10th season at Ole Miss but first season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in program history ... Luke became the fifth straight Ole Miss head coach to post a victory in his first game on the Rebel sideline.
- In the last outing, Ole Miss outscored Auburn 20-9 in the second half and went on to tally 429 yards of total offense.
 Senior RB Jordan Wilkins went over the 100-yard mark for the second-straight game after rushing for 65 and hauling in a career high 66 yards off five catches.
- The Rebels lead the SEC and rank sixth nationally in passing offense (358.4 ypg).
- Ole Miss is also second in the league and 18th nationally in pass efficiency (156.15)
- Sophomore QB Shea Patterson leads the SEC in completions/game (26.8), passing TDs (13), passing yards (1792) and passing ypg (358.4). He's second in the league in completion percentage (66.3), points responsible for/game (15.6) and yards per pass attempt (8.87).

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Matt Luke at approximately 11:30 a.m. Defensive coordinator Wesley McGriff and offensive coordinator Phil Longo will follow Coach Luke at the podium. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m. The number for the two-way teleconference may be obtained by contacting the Athletics Communications office. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT INTERVIEWS: Coordinators will take part in the Monday press conference. Select players and assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesday. Coach Luke and select players will be available after practice on Wednesday. All media interviews will be held in the team meeting room. There is no availability on Thursday or Friday.

PRACTICES: All practices are closed to the public and open to media for select periods on Tuesdays. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. On available days, media will be alerted which periods are available for video. Live video is prohibited, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and not formations. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Communications office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of practice footage, interviews and game highlights for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/ parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter. Day passes are also available online at www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystems.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must agree to the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) daily newspapers; 2) network affiliate television stations; 3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. All season credential requests need to be submitted by August 18. Credential demands are heavy, and we hope you understand the space limitations we must deal with each year. For those of you who are not credentialed for all of the games you requested, we hold onto your request and will contact you if space becomes available on a gameby-game basis. Media wishing to cover the Cal game on Sept. 16 should email their credential request to Daniel Snowden at desnowde@olemiss.edu.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the 4-way stop. Those with garage parking passes should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with Tad Smith Coliseum passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passed marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested at least seven days prior to gameday to ensure delivery.

RECRUITS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect -- from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit. In addition, media may not be present during any recruiting contact and may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST VANDERBILT

November, 19, 2016 - Vanderbilt 38, Ole Miss 17: Ole Miss scored the first 10 points of the game, but the Rebels couldn't overcome 31 unanswered points by Vanderbilt, falling 38-17 in Nashville. True freshman guarterback Shea Patterson made his second career start and linked up with tight end Evan Engram for 102 yards, but the Rebels couldn't establish an offensive rhythm in the road defeat.

September 26, 2015 - #3 Ole Miss 27, Vanderbilt 16 at Oxford: The Rebels entered the game with the nation's highest-scoring offense averaging 64.0 points per game, and scored just 20 points through the first three quarters, but No. 3 Ole Miss outlasted the Commodores 27-16 in front of a sellout crowd of 60,654 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to improve to 4-0 (2-0 SEC) on the season.

September 6, 2014 - #15 Ole Miss 41, Vanderbilt 3 at Nashville: No. 15 Ole Miss scored early and often, while the Rebel defense gave up only a field goal in the fourth quarter en route to a dominating 41-3 win over Vanderbilt in both teams' SEC opener. Bo Wallace threw for 320 yards and a touchdown to lead the charge. Ole Miss scored on seven of its first eight possessions with the shortest drive

covering 67 yards, and the Rebels never punted.

August 29, 2013 - Ole Miss 39, Vanderbilt 35 at Nashville: Bo Wallace tied a career high of 31 completions of 47 attempts for 283 yards and WR Laquon Treadwell had his college debut with nine catches for 82 yards, the most catches by a Rebel since Mike Espy had nine against Auburn in 2005. The Rebels managed to snap Vanderbilt's threegame win streak in the series after scoring 29 points in the second half and securing the 39-35 victory.

November 10, 2012 - Vanderbilt 27, Ole Miss 26 at Oxford: Bo Wallace passed for a career-high 403 yards and Ja-Mes Logan had eight receptions for 160 yards - both career highs - but the Rebels couldn't hold on and fell to Vanderbilt 27-26. Vanderbilt scored 14 unanswered points in the third quarter to cut the Rebels' lead to three points.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke (Ole Miss, 2000) is in his 10th season at Ole Miss but first season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in school history. The Rebels are 65-52 with Luke on staff as a full-time coach, including 2-3 with him leading the program. He was born a Rebel as his family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. During his 23 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 17 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson. Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), spent the past five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), he served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH DEREK MASON

Derek Mason (Northern Arizona, 1993) is in his fourth year as Vanderbilt's head coach and has an 16-27 record with the Commodores, including a 3-3 mark so far this season. Last year, Mason led Vanderbilt to a 6-6 record during the regular season to earn a bowl berth for the first time since 2013. He served as associate head coach and Willie Shaw Director of Defense for the Stanford Cardinal from 2011-13 and helped Stanford win consecutive Pac-12 championships and make back-to-back Rose Bowl appearances. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award (nation's top assistant) in 2012. Before going to Palo Alto, Mason coached in the NFL with the Minnesota Vikings (2007-09). His pro career also included stops with the St. Louis Rams, New York Giants and Oakland Raiders. Other college stops include Ohio University, New Mexico State, Bucknell, Idaho State and Weber State.

VANDERBILT SCOUTING REPORT

The Vanderbilt Commodores are 3-3 overall, winning all three of their non-conference games before dropping three consecutive SEC contests. During the three-game winning streak to start the season, Vanderbilt only allowed 13 points. However, during the current losing skid, the Commodores have surrendered 142 points (47.3 ppg). Vanderbilt is coming off a 54-14 setback to Georgia at home to fall to 0-3 in conference play. Derek Mason's squad is anchored by junior QB Kyle Shurmur has thrown 12 TDs compared to only one INT. The signal caller totals 1,157 yards through the air, completing 56.8 percent of his passes. Responsible for 84 of the team's 122 points this season, Shurmur leads the SEC in that category. C.J. Duncan has been Shurmur's favorite target with 22 catches, but Trent Sherfield boasts a team-high 334 receiving yards. On the defensive side of the ball, LB Charles Wright has been a sack machine. With 6.0 sacks on the season, Wright is second in the conference and ranks sixth nationally.

REBELS VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

- Last season, Ole Miss had multiple wins over AP top-15 (#8 Texas A&M, #11 Georgia) teams in consecutive years (2014-16) for the first time since 1967-69.
- The Rebels have nine wins over top-15 teams in the last four years ... They had five such wins in the previous 22.
- Ole Miss is 70-156-2 all-time versus ranked teams.
- Ole Miss went 2-5 against top-25 opponents last year, with wins over No. 11 Georgia and No. 8 Alabama as well as losses to No. 4 Florida State, No. 1 Alabama, No. 22 Arkansas, No. 23 LSU and No. 15 Auburn.
- In 2015, Ole Miss went 5-2 against ranked foes with wins over No. 2 Alabama (43-37), No. 15 Texas A&M (23-3), No. 15 LSU (38-17), No. 21 Mississippi State (38-27) and No. 16 Oklahoma State (48-20). The five wins over ranked teams were a school record.

DYNAMIC OFFENSE

Ole Miss has produced a dynamic offense through the first five games of the game as shown by the numbers below:

- Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally in passing offense averaging 358.4 yards per game and is second in the league and 18th in the country in passing efficiency at 156.15.
- Sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally in passing yards per game (358.4) ... He is also third in the league and 19th nationally in passing efficiency (156.2) and 16th in touchdowns (13).
- Sophomore WR A.J. Brown leads the SEC and ranks 18th nationally in receiving yards per game (100.8) and is 36th
 nationally in touchdowns (4), while fellow wideout junior DeMarkus Lodge is fifth in the league in receiving yards per
 game (72.8), and is tied with Brown and D.K. Metcalf in touchdowns.

NFL REBELS

Ole Miss has a big presence in the league again this year. There are currently 25 former Rebels on NFL rosters, including two-time Super Bowl MVP Eli Manning, recent Super Bowl LI champions Brandon Bolden and 2017 first-round draft pick Evan Engram.

PATTERSON BREAKS PASSING RECORD AGAINST SKYHAWKS

Sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** threw for a school-record 489 yards and a career-best five touchdowns in Ole Miss win over UT Martin. He broke Chad Kelly's previous Ole Miss record of 465 yards set last season against Auburn and finished one TD shy of tying Eli Manning's school record six touchdown passes set against Arkansas in 2001. Patterson completed 32 of 43 attempts (74.4 pct.) to nine different receivers. The 489 yards passing is the 13th-most in SEC history just behind Tim Couch and Peyton Manning, who each threw for 492 yards.

FINAL CAMPAIGN FOR SACK-MASTER HAYNES

Preseason All-American DE **Marquis Haynes** ranks third in school history with 25.0 career sacks, and recently moved up to a tie for second all-time in career TFLs with 39.5 (Greg Hardy). He led the Rebels in sacks as a freshman (7.5), sophomore (10.0) and junior (7.0). The Jacksonville, Florida, native is a unanimous preseason All-SEC first-team pick and made watch lists for the Bednarik, Nagurski, Hendricks and Lott IMPACT awards.

PATTERSON PUTS ON A SHOW VERSUS JAGS

Sophomore QB **Shea Patterson** put on a show Saturday versus the Jaguars, throwing for a career-best 429 yards and four scores in the Ole Miss victory. Patterson completed 28 of 35 attempts (80.0 pct.) finishing just shy of Eli Manning's school record 80.6 completion percentage (min. 30 attempts). The 429 yards passing was the most since Chad Kelly threw for 465 yards against Auburn last year and the third most in school history trailing only Kelly and Archie Manning (436). The four TD passes were a personal best and the most since Kelly tossed four scores against Florida State a year ago. Patterson connected with sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** on a pair of 71 and 77-yard touchdown passes in the third quarter. The 77-yarder was Patterson's longest career completion and the longest TD pass since Jevan Snead connected with Mike Wallace for 88 yards in 2008 versus Louisiana-Monroe. Patterson also joined Eli Manning as the only two Rebel QBs with two 70-plus yard touchdown passes in the same game. Manning recorded the feat against Vanderbilt in 2002.

BROWN'S CAREER DAY LEADS REBELS OVER SOUTH ALABAMA

Sophomore WR **A.J. Brown** had a career day for the Rebels Saturday against South Alabama. The Starkville, Mississippi native hauled in eight receptions for 233 yards and two scores, breaking Eddie Small's Ole Miss record of 210 receiving yards set versus Vanderbilt in 1993. Brown's total of 233 yards also tied Pharoh Cooper of South Carolina for the 13th most receiving yards in a game in SEC history. His two TD catches of 71 and 77 yards also marked the first time in school history a receiver posted two 70-plus yard touchdowns in the same game.

GARY "WUNDER-KICK"

After a nearly flawless junior season, K/P **Gary Wunderlich** enters his senior season as one of the nation's top placekickers, while also being able to handle punting and kickoff duties from time to time. The Memphis, Tennessee, native led all NCAA kickers with an SEC-record 95.7 field-goal percentage last year, converting 22 of 23 attempts. Dating back to last season, he made 19 straight field goals before a miss in the fourth quarter against South Alabama. He broke Bryson Rose's previous school record of 17 straight and ranks second in SEC history for consecutive field goals made trailing only Georgia's Marshall Morgan by one. A Lou Groza Award semifinalist last year, he has been named to the watch list this preseason, as well as to various preseason All-America and All-SEC squads.

Dating back to the 2016 season, Wunderlich has made a field goal in 16-straight games, the longest active streak in the NCAA. He is one of only five kickers nationally with a streak of 10 or more, and becomes the second Rebel to have a streak of 16-straight after Josh Shene did it back in 2008.

 (1st-round pick, Giants), DT D.J. Jones (6th-round pick, 49ers), RB Akeem Judd (UFA, Titans), QB Chad Kelly
 (7th-round pick, Broncos), WR Damore'ea Stringfellow (UFA, Dolphins) ... CB Derrick Jones (6th-round pick,
 Jets) and CB Carlos Davis (UFA, Rams) are also in the league.
- Record-breaking QB Chad Kelly is now in the NFL, but sophomore QB Shea Patterson gained crucial experience when
 he started the final three games last season after Kelly went down with a knee injury ... In his first game as starter, Patterson
 led a second-half comeback in a 29-28 win at No. 8 Texas A&M.
- Ole Miss lost three of its top four receivers from 2016 (Engram, Stringfellow, Adeboyejo), but the cupboard is still
 quite full at receiver with the likes of senior Markell Pack, junior DaMarkus Lodge, sophomores A.J. Brown,
 Van Jefferson and redshirt freshman D.K. Metcalf, among others.

WELCOME BACK

- The following players are returning from injuries or ineligibility last season and are expected to play key roles this fall:
- DB **C.J. Moore**: Starter at free safety, Moore missed all of 2016 with a torn pectoral.
- RB Eric Swinney: After a redshirt in 2015, missed all of 2016 after a knee injury in the opener vs. Florida State.
- DB Ken Webster: Missed all of 2016 after suffering a knee injury in the opener vs. Florida State ... Full-time starter at CB in 2015.
- RB Jordan Wilkins: Rushed for 379 yards and four TDs as a sophomore in 2015.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Ole Miss returns five starters and 28 lettermen from last year's offense that led the SEC in passing and ranked top four in scoring and total offense.
- Shea Patterson returns after starting the final three games of his freshman season following Chad Kelly's (now with Denver Broncos) ACL injury.
- Leading rusher Akeem Judd (826 yards) graduated, leaving senior Jordan Wilkins as the leader of the RB corps ... Senior Eugene Brazley and sophomores D'Vaughn Pennamon and Eric Swinney compete for carries.
- The Rebels replace full-time starting WRs Damore'ea Stringfellow (Miami Dolphins) and Quincy Adeboyejo (Baltimore Ravens) who were Nos. 3 and 4 on the team in receiving yards, respectively, last year.
- Top returning WRs are sophomore Van Jefferson (who started every game last year and earned Freshman All-America honors), sophomore A.J. Brown, junior DaMarkus Lodge, senior Markell Pack and redshirt freshman D.K. Metcalf, who combined for 10 TD catches last year.
- Gone is first team All-American and statistically the best tight end in school history **Evan Engram** (New York Giants) who is the only four-time All-SEC pick in school history and finished his career with 162 receptions, 2,320 receiving yards and 15 TD catches.
- Ole Miss returns four of five starters from last year's O-line and several others who earned starts and significant snaps throughout the season.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, Landshark is a term that was first adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "Fins Up" also contributes to the players' persona. With the popularity of both the players and the hand gesture, Ole Miss fans and student-athletes from other sports embraced the spirit of the Landshark, and in October 2017, the university announced the Landshark as the official mascot of the Ole Miss Rebels. The Landshark mascot is expected to be unveiled before the 2018 season.

Roots of the Landshark at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-American Peria Jerry and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term Landshark originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the Landshark.

GENERAL NOTES: Today's attendance was 62,532 ... This game marked the kickoff of the 123rd season of football at Ole Miss and the first under head coach **Matt Luke** ... The Rebels now boast an all-time record of 661-511-35 (.563 winning percentage) ... Ole Miss' last five head coaches have all been victorious in their debut on the Rebel sideline ... The Rebels are now 91-27-5 all-time in season openers (.760 winning percentage) and have taken 18 of the last 22.

OFFENSIVE NOTES: The Rebels' 531 total offensive yards were the most since Auburn last season (570) and the 429 passing yards were also the most since the game versus the Tigers a year ago (465) ... Sophomore QB Shea Patterson connected with sophomore WR A.J. Brown on 71 and 77-yard touchdown passes in the third quarter ... The 77-yarder was Patterson's longest career completion and Brown's longest career reception, and the longest TD pass since Jevan Snead connected with Mike Wallace for 88 yards in 2008 versus Louisiana-Monroe ... It also marked the first time in school history a receiver recorded two 70-plus yard TD catches in the same game ... Moore is the first Rebel with two picks in the same time since **Zedrick Woods** last year against Memphis ... He finished the game with nine tackles (four solo) and 0.5 TFL ... Senior LB **DeMarquis Gates** tied a career high with 14 tackles including a career-best 11 solo stops ... Junior DT **Breeland Speaks** posted his first QB sack of the season with a solo stop in the second quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES: Freshman K Luke Logan attempted his first career field in the fourth quarter ... He missed the attempt from 48 yards.

COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke was born a Rebel. His family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. Now, he has achieved a lifelong dream by taking over the reins of his alma mater. On July 20, 2017, Ole Miss announced Luke as interim head coach, making him the 38th head coach in program history

During his 23 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 17 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson.

Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), enters his 10th season as a coach at Ole Miss. He spent the past five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), Luke served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

Since returning to Oxford in 2012, Luke has helped the Reb-

els earn a bowl berth in four seasons, including a 10-3 record and Sugar Bowl victory to cap the 2015 season.

A former Rebel player and assistant coach, Luke spent the previous four seasons as Duke's offensive coordinator/running game while coaching the offensive line. His line ranked among the ACC's top five in fewest sacks allowed throughout his tenure, including finishing third in 2009 and 2010.

Luke came to Duke following two seasons at Tennessee where he served as recruiting coordinator while coaching the tight ends and assisting with the offensive line. During his two-year stay (2006-07) in Knoxville, the Volunteers went 19-8 with an SEC Eastern Division championship and two appearances in the Outback Bowl.

On the recruiting front, Tennessee's 2007 class was rated third-best nationally by Rivals.com and fourth-best in the country by Scout.

A native of Gulfport, Mississippi, Luke lettered four seasons (1995-98) as a center at Ole Miss. A starter in 33 career games for the Rebels, he served as team captain in 1998 as Ole Miss posted a 7-5 ledger and defeated Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. He was named the 1998 Ole Miss Most Valuable Senior by the Jackson (Miss.) Touchdown Club and twice earned Academic All-SEC honors.

Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration.

Luke then spent two years (2000-01) coaching the offensive line at Murray State before returning to his alma mater to guide the Rebel tight ends and offensive line for four seasons (2002-05). Ole Miss won two bowl games during that stretch, defeating Nebraska in the Independence Bowl to close the 2002 season and upending Oklahoma State in the Cotton Bowl a year later to cap a 10-3 campaign that included a share of the SEC Western Division championship.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Ole Miss scored the first 10 points of the game, but the Rebels couldn't overcome 31 unanswered points by Vanderbilt, falling 38-17 in a Southeastern Conference showdown.

Mackey Award semifinalist Evan Engram recorded his seventh career 100-yard receiving game, hauling in six catches for 102 yards and a touchdown. The senior tight end was Shea Patterson's favorite receiver on the night. In his second career start, the true freshman completed 20 of 42 for 222 with two touchdowns. Senior running back Akeem Judd totaled 97 yards of offense, rushing 10 times for 63 yards and making three receptions for 34 yards.

Ralph Webb ran for 123 yards and three touchdowns for Vanderbilt. Quarterback Kyle Shurmur added 273 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air.

Patterson led the Rebels 75 yards down the field on the opening drive, using his feet as well as his arm. The freshman rushed three times for 19 yards, while completing a pair of passes for 22 yards. Judd contributed on the ground with a pair of carries for 34 yards. However, Vanderbilt limited Ole Miss to a field goal as Gary Wunderlich connected on a 23-yard boot.

Ole Miss increased its lead to double digits after taking advantage of a Vanderbilt miscue. After the Commodores forced a fourth down, Carlos Davis recovered a muffed punt to bring the Rebel offense back on the field. Ole Miss took advantage of the turnover as Patterson found a wide-open Judd for a 21-yard strike. With 6:51 left in the opening quarter, Ole Miss led 10-0.

Getting the ball to start the second half, Vanderbilt marched 90 yards down the field for a touchdown and controlled the entire third quarter. Scoring 17 points and holding the Rebel offense in check, the Commodores built its lead to three touchdowns, 31-10.

On the second play of the fourth quarter, Patterson scrambled and launched a deep ball into the end zone. Engram leaped and made an incredible catch for the 38-yard touchdown to slice into the deficit. However, Vandy countered with a touchdown on its own for the final 38-17 tally.

AUBURN, Ala. - A tumultuous three-game road trip came to an end for Ole Miss on the Plains in a 44-23 loss to No. 12 Auburn.

The Rebels dug themselves into a multi-score hole early on that was far too deep to climb out of. Kerryon Johnson opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown rush, his first of three in the first half. Johnson touched the ball 28 times and gained 204 yards on the day. Auburn as a team rushed for 326 yards. The defense struggled to defend the ground attack for much of the afternoon, and penalties only compounded that.

Ole Miss drove down the field and answered with a field goal, but it was quickly negated by a screen play that resulted in a 75-yard touchdown pass from Jarrett Stidham to Ryan Davis on Auburn's first play from scrimmage. Everything was set up by Auburn's ability to run the football at will. The Tiger offense picked up large chunks of yardage for most of the game and averaged 7.8 yards per snap.

The latter two of Johnson's touchdown rushes followed that, one from 48 yards out and one from five yards. Auburn had four 70 plus-yard drives in the opening half, and compiled 339 yards of total offense. It led 35-3 at halftime. The Tigers compiled 561 yards of total offense in the game.

Ole Miss found the end zone for the first time in the game early on in the third quarter when Shea Patterson found D.K. Metcalf in space for a nine-yard touchdown pass. It completed a 75-yard drive and brought the score to 38-10. The two found each other again early on in the fourth quarter, this one a five-yard strike to make the score 41-17. As much as the offense sputtered in the first half, it found its footing in the second half and totaled 429 yards in the game.

OXFORD, Miss. - Ole Miss blitzed South Alabama in the second half en route to a 47-27 win over the Jaguars to deliver Matt Luke his first career victory as a head coach.

The Rebels started fast with 10 quick points in the first 13 minutes of the game, but endured a sluggish end to the first half that saw South Alabama climb back into the game at 13-10.

The story of the second half - at least the early portion of it - was A.J. Brown and Shea Patterson. The two hooked up for a pair of long touchdown passes in the first two drives of the half from 71 and 77 yards, respectively. Brown had 8 receptions for 233 yards and the two touchdowns. Patterson finished the game 28 of 35 for 429 yards and four scores. He threw all over the Jaguars in a strong opening performance for the sophomore quarterback who is the centerpiece of Phil Longo's offense.

Brown broke the school record for receiving yards in a game. He and Patterson connected on a lot of broken plays when Patterson was flushed out of the pocket. It is a byproduct of their timing together and being on the same page.

Brown was one of seven Rebels to record catches on the day as the most explosive element of the Ole Miss offense dominated South Alabama's secondary.

DaMarkus Lodge had five receptions for 51 yards and a pair of touchdowns. D.K. Metcalf caught eight balls for 84 yards on the night.

Ole Miss kept pouring it on after the two early second half strikes between Patterson and Brown. Jaylon Jones took a kickoff 97 yards for a score to give Ole Miss a 33-13 lead midway through the third quarter. Lodge followed that with the second of his touchdown catches that put the game out of reach at 40-13.

OXFORD, Miss. -- An early kickoff was accompanied by a sluggish start for Ole Miss, but it persevered to a 45-23 win over UT Martin to improve to 2-0 on the season.

The Rebels finished the game in a much more appealing fashion than they started. UT-Martin jumped out to a 9-0 lead early on behind a rushing attack that tallied 67 yards in the opening quarter. Ole Miss was stopped on its opening drive, but the offense quickly gelled after that. Shea Patterson found A.J. Brown for a 58-yard touchdown pass. UT Martin answered that with a score of their own to go up 16-7.

Ole Miss proceeded to score 31 consecutive points after that highlighted by a 21-point third quarter in which the offense scored on every drive. Patterson found Brown on a two-yard touchdown pass for a second time just before halftime to give the Rebels a 17-16 lead.

For a second consecutive week, the Rebels hit the ground running in the second half. Jordan Wilkins completed a nine play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown rush on the first drive of the second half.

Both Brown and Lodge had touchdown catches on the day and both surpassed the 100-yard mark by the third quarter. Brown caught eight balls for 156 yards while Lodge had 6 receptions for a career-high 133 yards.

Ole Miss continued to show how dynamic it can be in the passing game. Patterson threw for 489 yards and five scores. He broke the school record for passing yards in a single game, completed 74.4 percent of his throws and threw passes to nine different receivers. Four different receivers caught touchdown passes.

BERKELEY, Calif. - Ole Miss faced adversity from multiple angles, and fell short in the second half in a 27-16 loss to Cal.

Nothing came easy for the Rebels in California after a fast start.

Shea Patterson and the offense marched the football down the field on the team's opening possession and settled for a Gary Wunderlich field goal. The senior kicker injured his hamstring shortly after and would not return to the game after missing an extra point later in the half.

Two drives later, Cal cashed in on a Patterson interception and took a 7-3 lead. That evaporated in the blink of an eye after Patterson found DaMarkus Lodge for a 72-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the ensuing drive. It was the first of two long touchdown passes as Patterson hit D.K. Metcalf in stride for a 71-yard score in the second quarter that pushed the Rebels' lead to 16-7.

C.J. Moore had two interceptions in the second quarter that kept Cal off of the scoreboard and gave the Rebels a 16-7 heading into the half.

The third quarter was not kind to Ole Miss as Cal outscored the Rebels 10-0 and took a 17-16 lead highlighted by a Ross Bowers 23-yard touchdown pass to Vic Wharton III on the Bears' opening possession of the half.

Penalties thwarted Ole Miss' momentum for much of the night, but particularly in the third quarter. The team was penalized 16 times for 113 yards in the game.

A bulk of the penalties were shouldered by the offensive line, who had to shift around after it lost veteran center Sean Rawlings to an ankle sprain in the first half. Luke did not know how long he will be out, but anticipated it being a couple of weeks.

Patterson was flushed out of the pocket often and was forced to try to extend plays with his feet. The offense sputtered for much of the second half as a result. The Rebels mustered just 131 yards in the second half. Cal had 201 by comparison.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Alabama proved why it is the most dominant team SEC in more ways than one in its 66-3 win over Ole Miss. After the two teams exchanged three-and-outs to begin the game, Alabama took control in every facet of the game. Bo Scarbrough opened up the scoring with a six-yard touchdown rush. Levi Wallace made it 14-0 less than a minute later when he picked off a Shea Patterson pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown.

Gary Wunderlich added a 26-yard field goal to make it 14-3, getting the Rebels on the board. The Rebels' tumultuous opening quarter was capped off by the first of two Jalen Hurts touchdown passes, this one to tight end Hale Hentges that capped off an 85-yard drive. Hurts hit Josh Jacobs for an 18-yard score a short time later and capped off the half with a rushing touchdown to give the Crimson Tide a 35-3 lead at the break.

Alabama cruised the remainder of the way and piled on 31 second half-points. Hurts was 12-19 for 197 tards and two touchdowns. He rushed for 101 yards and compiled a passer rating of 185. Ole Miss struggled to find a rhythm offensively for much of the night, largely due to Alabama's pass rush that repeatedly flushed Shea Patterson out of the pocket and sacked him five times. Patterson was 14 for 29 on the night and threw for 165. Ole Miss was 0-13 on third down.

Jordan Wilkins had his best game of the 2017 season in a night where Ole Miss rushed the football with more effectiveness than it did in the first three games. The senior running back tallied 101 yards on 12 carries and broke runs of 21 and 44 yards. D.K. Metcalf led all receivers with three catches for 46 yards.

#12 AUBURN 44, OLE MISS 23

AUBURN, Ala. - A tumultuous three-game road trip came to an end for Ole Miss on the Plains in a 44-23 loss to No. 12 Auburn.

The Rebels dug themselves into a multi-score hole early on that was far too deep to climb out of. Kerryon Johnson opened the scoring with a 17-yard touchdown rush, his first of three in the first half. Johnson touched the ball 28 times and gained 204 yards on the day. Auburn as a team rushed for 326 yards. The defense struggled to defend the ground attack for much of the afternoon, and penalties only compounded that.

Ole Miss drove down the field and answered with a field goal, but it was quickly negated by a screen play that resulted in a 75-yard touchdown pass from Jarrett Stidham to Ryan Davis on Auburn's first play from scrimmage. Everything was set up by Auburn's ability to run the football at will. The Tiger offense picked up large chunks of yardage for most of the game and averaged 7.8 yards per snap.

The latter two of Johnson's touchdown rushes followed that, one from 48 yards out and one from five yards. Auburn had four 70 plus-yard drives in the opening half, and compiled 339 yards of total offense. It led 35-3 at halftime. The Tigers compiled 561 yards of total offense in the game.

Ole Miss found the end zone for the first time in the game early on in the third quarter when Shea Patterson found D.K. Metcalf in space for a nine-yard touchdown pass. It completed a 75-yard drive and brought the score to 38-10. The two found each other again early on in the fourth quarter, this one a five-yard strike to make the score 41-17. As much as the offense sputtered in the first half, it found its footing in the second half and totaled 429 yards in the game.
