OPENING KICK

★ Vanderbilt plays its first road game of the 2016 season playing at Georgia Tech for the first time since 2002.

★ RB Ralph Webb moved into fourth all-time in career rushing at Vanderbilt with 211 yards rushing last week and needs 777 yards to break Zac Stacy's school record. His 211 yards are the third-most rushing yards in a single game at Vanderbilt joining Frank Mordica (1978) and Doug Matthews (1969) as the only Commodores to go over 200 yards rushing in a game.

★ LB Zach Cunningham enters Saturday with a streak of six games with at least 10 tackles after he recorded a game-high 10 last week. He has 66 tackles during the streak.

★ The Commodores and Yellow Jackets have combined to rush for 883 yards in their two respective games but GT does not have a player with 100 yards rushing.

A Vanderbilt victory would...

- ★ Give head coach Derek Mason his second career road victory.
- ★ Snap a five-game losing streak to Georgia Tech that started in 1966.
- ★ Be Vanderbilt's first win over Georgia Tech since 1941.

Last time vs. Georgia Tech

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Turns out Georgia Tech coach Paul Johnson has a few more tricks in his offense than just the triple option.

Josh Nesbitt ran for two touchdowns and threw for two scores, Jonathan Dwyer ran for a career-high 186 yards rushing with three TDs, and No. 11 Georgia Tech rallied to beat Vanderbilt 56-31 Saturday night.

The Yellow Jackets ran less triple-option than usual.

"They decided they were going to take that away, and they did. We tried to play with our auxiliary stuff, and it worked out well," Johnson said.

The Yellow Jackets (8-1) rolled up a season-high 597 yards total offense against a Vanderbilt defense that was ranked 34th nationally, giving up 320 yards per game. They wore Vanderbilt out, holding the ball for nearly 40 minutes and rolling up 404 yards rushing.

WEBB CHASING STACY, VANDY RUSHING RECORD

Ralph Webb entered his junior season chasing history and former Commodore Zac Stacy.

Webb started the season eighth all-time in rushing at Vanderbilt but has moved up to fourth on the list with his 308 yards rushing in the first two games of the season - including a career-high 211 yards against Middle Tennessee - passing Lonnie Sadler, Jared McGrath, Jermaine Johnson and Jamie O'Rourke.

Webb rushed for 1,152 yards last season - the most ever by a Vanderbilt sophomore - to run his career total to 2,059 yards in just two seasons on the gridiron for VU. Webb's 1,152 yards came up just 41 yards short of Stacy's single-season Vanderbilt record of 1,193 yards set in 2011.

In his two years carrying the ball for the Commodores, Webb already owns the second-most yards in a single-season at Vanderbilt and the eighth-most yards in a single season, set in 2014 with 907 yards a VU freshman record. Webb owns rushing records for sophomores and freshman at VU already. Stacy set the school record as a junior and followed it up with 1,141 yards as a senior in 2012.

Webb became the first Vandy rusher to top the 1,000-yard mark since that 2012 season by Stacy and just the fifth VU running back to ever cross the milestone. Stacy is the only Commodore in history to post two 1,000-yard seasons.

IRON WEBB

Junior Ralph Webb has been a workhorse for the Commodores in his two years of action on West End. The Gainesville, Fla. native has started all 26 games of his career and enters the season with the most career starts on the VU roster.

Webb has also carried the rock for the Dores, racking up 538 carries in his two seasons, including a school-record 277 last year.

On the other side of the ball, seniors Adam Butler and Torren McGaster have the most career starts with 25 each. Will Holden holds the second-most career starts behind Webb on offense with 24.

RALPH'S BIG DAY

Ralph Webb posted one of the biggest single-game rushing totals in Vanderbilt history with a big day against Middle Tennessee.

The junior toted the rock 29 times for 211 yards to become just the third Commodore to ever eclipse 200 yards in a game, joining record holder Frank Mordica (1978) and Doug Mathews (1969).

Webb reached the end zone twice on Saturday to record his second career game with two TDs as part Vanderbilt's five rushing touchdowns in the win.

In two games against the Blue Raiders, Webb has rushed for 366 yards.

**NEW YOUNG TARGETS**

Despite having five of the team's top six returning pass catchers back from last season, VU has had numerous new targets emerge early in the season.

Freshman WR Kalija Lipscomb hauled in a 16-yard pass for his first career touchdown in the second quarter against Middle Tennessee. Lipscomb's TD catch was the first scoring reception of the year for the Dores.

Redshirt freshman TE Jared Pinkney caught the first pass of his career in the victory over the Blue Raiders, catching a pass over the middle for 23 yards before later adding a nine-yard grab for a team-best 32 yards receiving in the game.

Sophomore TE Sam Dobbs added his first two career catches in the win as well, totalling 18 yards.

ZACH THE TACKLER

Zach Cunningham has picked up where he left off the 2015 season, as a tackling machine.

The junior led the Commodores with 12 tackles in the season opener to register his fifth straight game with at least 10 tackles dating back to last season when he made a team-best 103 stops.

He followed up with 10 more tackles against Middle Tennessee to extend the streak to six games to push his total to 80 tackles over his last nine games. Through two games he ranks second in the league in tackles with 22 and tackles for loss with 4.5.

The Pinson, Ala. native finished 2015 in a flurry, racking up 10 tackles against Florida and Kentucky, 14 against Texas A&M and 10 solo tackles against Tennessee. Add in his 12 tackles against South Carolina and 10 against the Blue Raiders and Cunningham has 66 tackles over his last six games back to last season.

He has also been in opponents back-

fields, making 15.0 tackles for loss over his last nine games, including a game-high three against the Gamecocks.

BLACK & GOLD ZONE

Vanderbilt's offense has began the season a remarkable nine-for-nine in the red zone, scoring points in all nine trips inside the 20-yard line.

The Commodores' offense scored points in both trips inside the red zone against South Carolina in the season opener and kept the trend going with seven scores in seven attempts in the red zone against Middle Tennessee last week.

VU is one of 35 teams in the nation to be perfect in the red zone through the first two weeks, including fellow SEC teams Ole Miss (10/10), Alabama (9/9) and Tennessee (7/7).

The Commodores struggled in the red zone a year ago, converting just 21-of-33 trips into points. Vanderbilt did not have a game last year in which they scored points in every trip into the red zone.

PUTTING UP POINTS

Vanderbilt's 47 points against Middle Tennessee were the most for the Commodores since a 2013 victory over UAB that saw VU roll to a 52-24 win.

A 28-point second quarter led the Dores to 33 first half points, the most in any half under head coach Derek Mason and the most for VU since scoring 38 in the first half against Austin Peay in 2013.

Vandy's 47 points were also the most under Mason and marked the second time VU has passed 40 points with Mason at the helm. Vanderbilt is 2-0 in those games.

RUNNIN' COMMODORES

The Commodores have run the ball 40+ times in both games this season to push the total to 10 of the 14 games under offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig, rushing for over 100 yards in every game since Ludwig's arrival.

The victory over Middle Tennessee saw the Dores rush for 217 yards, the most

under Ludwig and the fourth game in the Mason era. Vandy is 3-1 under Mason when rushing for 200+ yards.

Ralph Webb has rushed for 1461 yards in 14 games (104.4 per game) with Ludwig calling the plays for VU. The Commodores have averaged 161.1 yards (2256 yards) rushing over the last two years.

DEREK MASON: HEAD COACH & DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Head coach Derek Mason is on a very short list of head coaches that also serve as their own offensive or defensive coordinators in college football.

Mason and San Diego State head coach Rocky Long are the only two head coaches in the country that run both the team and the defense. Mason and Long are two of eight college head coaches to serve as both head coach and coordinator joining head coaches that run the other side of the ball with Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson, Massachusetts' Mark Whipple, New Mexico State's Doug Martin, Washington State's Mike Leach, Kansas' David Beaty and Tulsa's Philip Montgomery running their respective teams' offenses.

Mason, Beaty, Johnson and Leach are the only ones to pull double duty at the Power 5 level. Mason and Johnson will put their teams on the field against each other on September 17 in Atlanta when the Commodores travel to Atlanta to take on Johnson's Yellow Jackets.

VANDERBILT COACHES YOUNGEST IN SEC

Vanderbilt's coaching staff has skewed much younger this year under Derek Mason in his third season. During the offseason, Mason hired former Vanderbilt All-SEC LB and 27-year-old Chris Marve to coach the team's linebackers and former Oklahoma DL and 34-year-old C.J. Ah You to coach the Commodores' defensive line. Adding Marve and Ah You to the coaching staff dropped the Does' average age on the coaching staff to 41.6. Mason's staff is the youngest staff in the Southeastern Conference, narrowly in front of South Carolina's new coaching staff. Marve and Ah You join Marc Mattioli (29), Cortez Hankton (35) and new offensive line coach Cameron Norcross (39) as VU coaches to begin the season under 40-years-old.

The SEC by average age (44.5) is the second-youngest league among the Power 5 conferences led by the Atlantic Coast Conference with an average coach age of 43.9. The SEC is in front of the Pac-12 (44.7), Big 12 (44.7) and the Big 10 (45.1).

HEAD COACH/COORDINATOR

LOADS OF EXPERIENCE BACK FOR VU IN '16

The Vanderbilt roster is loaded with experience coming into the 2016 season with eight returning starters on offense, seven on defense and kicker Tommy Openshaw back. The Commodores' skill positions return virtually everyone from a year ago led by QB Kyle Shurmur. The now sophomore quarterback led Vandy to Southeastern Conference wins over Missouri and Kentucky as part of his five-game starting stretch as a true freshman. Ralph Webb is back after a record-setting sophomore campaign that saw him rush for more yards than any Vanderbilt sophomore in history with 1152 yards. The receiving corps welcomes back Trent Sherfield, Darrius Sims and Caleb Scott while the line has Barrett Gouger, Bailey Granier and Will Holden back up front.

Defensively, Vanderbilt is happy to have first team All-SEC LB Zach Cunningham back in the middle of the defense. The now junior led VU with 103 tackles last year as a sophomore and will get more help this year with the return of Nigel Bowden to the defense. Bowden missed the majority of last year

after suffering a concussion. Nehemiah Mitchell started seven games last year as a linebacker but has made the move to the defensive line and joins Adam Butler and Nifae Lealao up front for the Does' D. The Vandy secondary returns nearly intact with the return of three starters. Torren McGaster, Tre Herndon and Oren Burks are all back with Burks transitioning into the created Star position in Mason's defense. Burks will now serve as a hybrid safety-linebacker.

JELKS, STANKAVAGE SIDELINED FOR SEASON

OL Andrew Jelks and QB Shawn Stankavage will be sidelined for the 2016 season with injuries. It's the second straight season missed for Jelks due to injury and second in the last three years for Stankavage.

Jelks has started 22 games in his career but has not played since 2014.

VETERAN VANDY SECONDARY

Vanderbilt's defense returns four starters in the secondary led by senior Torren McGaster and junior Oren Burks. The squad has been impressive in individual and team drills during camp.

McGaster's 37 career games are tied with Darrius Sims for the most on the roster and McGaster's 23 starts are matched only by Adam Butler on the defensive side of the ball.

Burks led the Commodores with three interceptions in 2015 and will fill the Does' new Star position this fall as a hybrid safety/linebacker in head coach Derek Mason's defense.

Tre Herndon started all 12 games in 2015 and returns as one of team's top corners.

Arnold Tarpley saw action in all 12 games last season, starting seven games for the team when the Does started the game in a nickel package.

5 OF TOP 6 RECEIVERS RETURN IN 2016

The Vanderbilt offense returns five of the team's top six pass catchers from a year ago led by junior Trent Sherfield, who led the team with 51 catches.

Caleb Scott (24 receptions), Ralph Webb (24), Latevius Rayford (19) and Darrius Sims (10) join Sherfield as the Does' top returning pass catchers.

Directing one of nation's youngest teams, with 31 true or redshirt freshmen seeing action... At conclusion of 2014 season, took over Vanderbilt defensive coordinator responsibilities... STANFORD – 2013 (Willie Shaw Director of Defense)

Hired by former Nebraska head coach Frank Solich, Mason coached Ohio receivers for two years, helping the Bobcats improve from 4-7 in 2005 to a 9-5 campaign in 2006 that ended with a GMAC Bowl appearance.

NEW MEXICO STATE – 2004 (wide receivers)

In lone season at New Mexico State, the Aggie offense with Mason mentoring wide receivers corps topped the Sun Belt Conference in numerous passing categories.

Andre Hal (2010-13 // Houston // Hal started at free safety for the Texans and helped the team hold the Chicago Bears to just 258 yards, the third-lowest yardage total in the league. Hal was also responsible for the Texans lone forced turnover of the day after snagging an interception during the third quarter in a win over the Bears.

Casey Hayward (2008-11) // San Diego // Contributed four tackles and two passes defended to the Chargers defense in a 33-27 loss to the Chiefs in overtime.

Wesley Johnson (2010-13) // New York Jets // Johnson saw action as a reserve lineman in the Jets loss to the Bengals, 23-22.

Jonathan Krause (2010-13) // San Diego // Signed with the Chargers' practice squad joining fellow former Commodore Spencer Pulley, who is on the team's active roster.

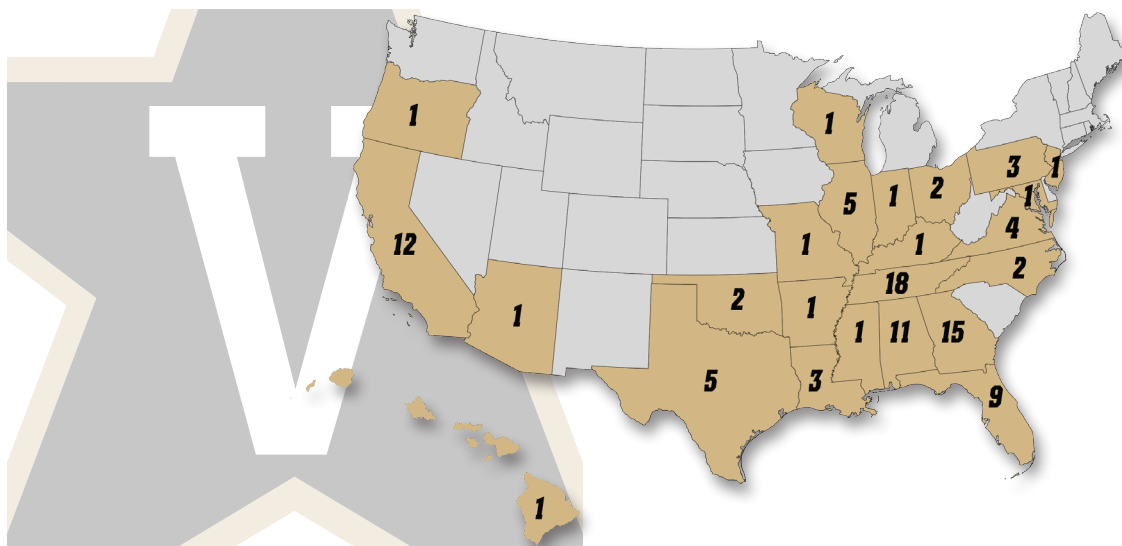
Jordan Matthews (2010-13) // Philadelphia // Had the sixth-most receiving yards in the NFL through Sunday's games with 114 yards on seven catches. Matthews also caught rookie quarterback Carson Wentz's first career touchdown in the Eagles victory over the Browns, 29-10.

Spencer Pulley (2011-15) // San Diego // Pulley made his regular season NFL debut on Sunday after earning a spot on the active roster as an undrafted free agent. The Chargers lost to the Chiefs in overtime, 33-27.

Stephen Weatherly (2012-15) // Minnesota // Signed to the Vikings' practice squad.

Andrew Williamson (2012-15) // Indianapolis // Signed with the Indianapolis Colts as an undrafted free agent. Placed on injured reserved in preseason.

Vanderbilt's 2016 roster is comprised of 103 athletes from 24 states from coast-to-coast and beyond. Tennessee leads all states with 18 Commodores calling the Volunteer State home. FOUR NEW COACHES ON STAFF FOR 2016

Heading into his third season at Vanderbilt head coach Derek Mason has just one original member of his coaching staff in Gerry Gdowski remaining on the staff. But Gdowski has a new role for the 2016 campaign as the former Nebraska QB now coaches the Commodores' QBs. Former QBs coach and offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig traded spots with Gdowski and now coaches the Dores' tight ends.

Four new coaches have joined the staff in veteran coaches Jeff Genyk and Cameron Norcross along with young coaches C.J. Ah You and Chris Marve rounding out Mason's staff.

Genyk brings head coaching experience to the table, having served as the head coach at Eastern Michigan 2004-08. He also has stops as an assistant at Northwestern, California, Nevada and Wisconsin. He joins VU from Northwestern, where he served as a quality control for the Wildcats. For the Dores, Genyk serves as the teams special teams coordinator and running backs coach.

Norcross coached in the Mountain West Conference for 15 years prior to his move to West End, coaching for 11 years at his alma mater, Nevada, and four years at Fresno State most recently. He helped the Bulldogs to an 11-2 season in 2013 and helped Nevada head coach Chris Ault develop an innovative offense for the Wolfpack.

Ah You joins the Commodores from Oklahoma, where he played for Bob Stoops prior to an NFL career. Back with the Sooners, Ah You served as a defensive quality control assistant working with the team's defensive line. He was a seventh round pick of the Buffalo Bills in 2007 but played six seasons with St. Louis, ending his career after the 2012 season.

Marve is no stranger to Vanderbilt having earned All-SEC honors with the Commodores as a LB in 2010 and 2011. Marve led the Dores in tackles in 2009 and 2011, including a remarkable 121 total tackles in 2009 which made him the last Dore to surpass 100 tackles in a season until Zach Cunningham did it last year with 103 tackles. The Memphis, Tenn. native owns three degrees from Vanderbilt.

MASON CREATES PLAYER PERSONNEL DEPT.

Head Coach Derek Mason unveiled the program's new player personnel department in early July with an impressive five-member team to be directed by former University of Nebraska administrator and Nashville-area native Austen Everson.

In addition to Everson, who serves as Director of Player Personnel, Eric Lammers is the Director of Recruiting, and Corey Phillips and Donielle White are the Assistant Recruiting Coordinators. Andrea Poole Cain, a veteran staffer, serves as Director of Recruiting Relations.

CUNNINGHAM, WEBB ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Zach Cunningham and Ralph Webb enter their junior seasons with numerous accolades, including being named to a pair of awards watch lists.

Cunningham is on the Bednarik Award watch list after a stellar 2015 that saw him earn first team All-SEC honors. The Bednarik Award is given annually to the nation's best defensive player.



Webb finds himself on the Doak Walker Award watch list. The Gainesville, Fla. native became just the fifth Commodore to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark last season, rushing for 1,152 yards. The Doak Walker is awarded annually to college football's top running back.





THREE COMMODORES EARN PRESEASON ALL-SEC NOD

A trio of Commodores earned preseason recognition from the league's coaches last week when LB Zach Cunningham and RB Ralph Webb were tabbed second team All-SEC and LB/S Oren Burks was tabbed as a third team member.

Cunningham is coming off a first team All-SEC season as a sophomore last year when he led the Commodores in tackles (103), tackles for loss (16.5) and sacks (4.5).

Webb enters his junior season needing 1,085 yards to break Zac Stacy's all-time rushing record. Webb rushed for 1,152 yards as a sophomore last season - the most ever by a sophomore at Vanderbilt - on a school record 277 carries. Webb holds the record for rushing yards for sophomores and freshmen (907). Stacy holds the record for rushing yards for a junior with 1,193, which is also the school single-season record.

Burks moves into the Vanderbilt defense's new star position this year after posting a solid sophomore season in 2015. He made a career-high 58 tackles and led the Commodores with three interceptions.

The nod from the league's coaches adds to the media voting Cunningham and Webb to their All-SEC second team at SEC Media Days in July.

WELCOME TO POLY-VILLE

The Vandy roster features an island-like feel to it in 2016 with three players coming from Polynesian decent.

Junior Nifae Lealao is the elder statesman of the trio and has been joined by freshmen Josiah Sa'o and Sean Auwae-McMoore. Sa'o plays alongside Lealao on the defensive line with Auwae-McMoore on the offensive line. Auwae-McMoore calls Hawaii home while Lealao and Sa'o both call California home.

Vanderbilt's soccer team joined the Polynesian party, adding freshman Taiana Tolleson to the growing 'ohana' (family) at Vanderbilt.

Even with four Polynesians in athletics on West End, the most famous Polynesian in Nashville remains Heisman Trophy winner and Tennessee Titans QB Marcus Mariota.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

WR Caleb Scott and DB Donovan Sheffield are second-generation Commodores. Both following their dad's collegiate path through Vanderbilt. Scott is the son of former Commodore TE Chuck Scott (1981-84). Scott's dad was a 1983 All-America and two-time All-SEC pick who still ranks T-3rd all-time among Commodores with 20 TD catches, sixth in receiving yards (2,219), and seventh in receptions (145).

Caleb Scott produced his best season at VU last year, catching 24 passes for 339 yards and two TDs.

Sheffield is the son of DB Robert Sheffield (1993-95). Sheffield's dad was a three-year letterwinner at cornerback from 1993-95.

Donovan Sheffield played in six games as a freshman in 2015, making five tackles, including two for loss.

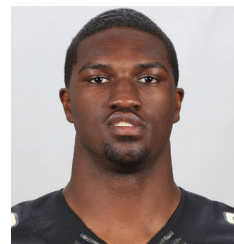

NASHVILLE – Will Muschamp had no worries about sending Elliott Fry out for the longest field goal of his career. Even though this was the coach's first game with South Carolina, he had seen the kicker connect repeatedly in clutch situations.

Fry kicked a career-long 55-yard field goal with 35 seconds left, and the South Carolina Gamecocks rallied from a 10-point halftime deficit to beat Vanderbilt 13-10 Thursday night in Muschamp's debut as head coach.

Muschamp started Orth at quarterback and also played freshman Brandon McIlwain. But it was Orth who went back into the game in the third quarter and threw for 152 yards rallying the Gamecocks to their eighth straight victory over Vanderbilt in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

Vanderbilt now is 0-3 in season openers under coach Derek Mason, though his Commodores did manage to score an offensive touchdown in the first half. But Tommy Openshaw missed a 45-yard field goal wide left with 3:44 left, and Vandy turned it over on downs with 14 seconds left.

"Every decision we made will be questioned," Mason said. "The bottom line is we didn't win this game. Now we have to get back to next week and play MTSU."

Fry also kicked a 48-yard field goal in the third quarter, and Deebo Samuel atoned for a fumbled punt in the first quarter by scoring an 8-yard TD on an end-around with 7:30 left. Fry had total confidence he could connect from 55 after barely coming up short from 62 in warmups.

NASHVILLE – Vanderbilt coach Derek Mason turned the lights out in the locker room for 10 minutes during a weather delay that lasted for an hour, 44 minutes. He wanted his Commodores to picture themselves playing good football.

Aside from a blocked punt on the first play once the game resumed, Ralph Webb and the Commodores did just that.

Webb ran for a career-high 211 yards and two touchdowns as Vanderbilt easily handled the weather delay and beat Middle Tennessee 47-24 Saturday.

"We did what this team hasn't done since I've been here," Mason said. "I mean just responded all the way around."

Vanderbilt (1-1) took control with a 28-point second quarter after trailing 10-5 at the end of the first, the final two TDs coming after the storm. Middle Tennessee blocked a field goal on the first play after resuming the game, setting up Brent Stockstill's 5-yard TD pass to Ty Lee to pull within 19-17.

The Commodores answered by scoring two TDs in a span of 87 seconds, the last a 3-yard TD by Webb giving him 102 yards before halftime. Vanderbilt also forced two turnovers to win its second straight in this series against an in-state rival.

Stockstill finished with 399 yards passing and three TDs for Middle Tennessee (1-1), which was trying to start 2-0 for the first time since 2001.
