Head Coach Melanie Balcomb





The 2007-08 season marks the sixth year for Melanie Balcomb in the Music City. The New Jersey native brought her uptempo style to the Southeastern Conference prior to the 2002-03 season, and success followed close on her heels.

Last season, the Commodores made their eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament after winning the school's fifth SEC Tournament championship. It was Balcomb's second time to cut down the nets as a Commodore, and promises not be her last. She won her 100th game as Vanderbilt's head coach on Nov. 30, 2006, a 85-63 victory at UAB.

Now in her 15th season as a collegiate head coach, Balcomb is nearing 300 career victories and has won more than 65 percent of her games all-time. Before coming to Nashville, Balcomb led her Xavier team to the NCAA Tournament three times, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001.

Balcomb has coached 15 players who have received all-conference accolades, and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft. Last year, Carla Thomas was a first-round selection while Dee Davis was chosen with the first pick in the second round.

MEDIA PRESEASON PICKS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth overall in the Southeastern Conference, according to media voting that preceded 2007 Media Day.

Melanie Balcomb's sixth squad at Vanderbilt was predicted to finish behind Tennessee, LSU and Georgia.

Commodore junior forward Christina Wirth was chosen as an All-SEC Second Team honorees by the media.

PRESEASON COACHES' PICKS

Vanderbilt was also chosen fourth overall by a vote of Southeastern Conference coaches.

In the coaches' All-SEC selections, Christina Wirth earned first-team honors, while Liz Sherwood was chosen to the second team.

GREAT GRADS

With the loss of three All-SEC seniors from last year's squad, the Commodores have a new look in 2007-08. The chart below highlights the production that Vanderbilt graduated in May.

STILL SHOOTING

Vanderbilt ranked first in the nation in threepoint field-goal percentage last season, and, despite the loss of the most accurate shooter in the history of the Southeastern Conference (current VU grad assistant Caroline Williams), the Commodores have shown few signs of cooling off this season.

The Commodores hit 10-of-21 three-point attempts (47.6 percent) in their season opener against UAB, led by junior Christina Wirth (4-of-5) and sophomore Merideth Marsh (3-of-5). Sophomores Ashlee Bridge and Lauren Lueders also connected from downtown.

Vanderblt shot 43.7 percent during the 2006-07 season -- a full 3.5 percentage points better than runner-up lowa among all NCAA Division I schools.

BEST SHOOTING HALVES

LIGHTS OUT!

Vanderbilt senior center Liz Sherwood is quite a force on the low block. The Castle Rock, Colo., native is shooting an unbelievable 80 percent from the field this season. Sherwood has made 44 of her 55 field goal attempts this season, including a 10-of-11 performance at Clemson. Sherwood's only miss of that game on her third attempt -- she promptly rebounded the ball, connected on the put-back and would not miss again in the contest.

For her career, Sherwood has connected on 66.6 percent of her field goal attempts (345-518), including an outstanding 70.9 percent of her shots during regular season non-conference games (200-282). Sherwood entered the season just behind the Commodores' all-time leader in career field goal percentage, All-American Chantelle Anderson (1,020-of-1,568, 65.1 percent). Anderson holds the SEC record for career shooting accuracy, and her mark ranks fifth all-time in the NCAA (minimum of 400 made field goals).

MAKING A POINT

Freshman point guard Jence Rhoads earned a spot in the starting lineup for her collegiate debut against UAB. Rhoads and sophomore Merideth Marsh have shared time running the Commodore offense like a well-oiled machine.

Vanderbilt is averaging 82 points and 18 assists per game in its first five contests. The Commodores' averaged 18 assists a season ago to rank third in the nation behind only Maryland and Arizona State.

Rhoads handed out nine assists against only three turnovers in her first two games, while Marsh had seven assists.

Both players share the daunting task of replacing the Commodores' all-time assists leader, Dee Davis. Davis graduated in 2007 after totalling 724 assists in her four-year career. She ranks sixth all-time in the SEC for assists.

Game Recap

DURHAM, N.C. -- The 11th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team suffered its first defeat of the season at the hands of fourth-ranked Duke, 69-48, Thursday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Senior Carla Thomas led the Commodores with 14 points, while senior Dee Davis had a season-high 12. Alison Bales, Duke's 6-7 senior center, led four Blue Devils' in double-figures with 16 points.

The Commodore defense forced Duke into a season-high 23 turnovers, holding the Blue Devils under 70 points for the first time this year.

Davis led the Commodores with eight points in the first half, matching her season-high from the UAB game. Duke took a seven-point lead into the break after outrebounding Vanderbilt, 21-12, in the opening stanza. Of Duke's 29 first-half points, 11 came after offensive rebounds.

Vanderbilt scored the first four points of the second half to get within three (29-26) on a jumper by sophomore Christina Wirth. The Duke lead swung between five and 11 points for most of the second half, but with just over four minutes remaining in the game the Blue Devils put together an eight-point possession to stretch their advantage.

An intentional foul was whistled on Vanderbilt as Duke made a breakaway lay-up. The foul was judged to be after the shot, giving Duke two free throws. The Commodore bench was assessed a technical foul after the first free throw was missed, giving Duke two additional free throws. The Blue Devils would make three charity tosses and sink a three-pointer on the ensuing possession to stretch the lead to 17 points at 57-40.

Ten of Duke's final 12 points came at the free throw line, expanding the lead to 23 points before Davis made a lay-up at the buzzer.
