### #18/14 Vanderbilt Welcomes #1/1 Tennessee To Memorial Gym For Tuesday Night Tilt

Vanderbilt will welcome the number one-ranked Tennessee Volunteers to Memorial Gym Tuesday night, the ninth time a #1 team (Associated Press) has visited the 56-year old arena, in a nationally televised game on ESPN. Tip off is at 8 p.m. CST, with Brad Nessler and Jimmy Dykes handling announcing duties on the television side, and Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson calling the game on the Vanderbilt/ISP Radio Network.

Vanderbilt, who owns a 5-3 record all-time at Memorial Gymnasium against #1-ranked opponents, has won the last three meetings with the top ranked team. The Commodores defeated #1 Florida, 83-70, on February 17, 2007, ending the Gators' 17-game winning streak, knocked off #1 Kentucky, 101-86, on January 13, 1993, and took out North Carolina, 78-76, on December 5, 1987.

All-time against number one-ranked teams, Vanderbilt is 6-13 both home and away since the Associated Press poll began in February of 1949.

The Commodores are riding a six-game SEC winning streak, the longest of the Kevin Stallings-era (1999-present) and the longest since 1996-97, when Vanderbilt won six

straight in SEC competition (2/1-2/19, 1997).

Vanderbilt, now with 23 wins and only four losses, equals the most wins in a season for Vanderbilt in the Kevin Stallings' era. The 2003-04 team also recorded 23 wins. The 23 regular season wins also ties for the second-most in school history. The 1964-65 and 1972-73 teams also recorded 23 victories in the regular season. The record for most wins in a regular season is 25 set during the 1992-93 season. In addition, the Commodores have won 45 games over the last two seasons, the most victories over a two-season span since Vanderbilt won 48 over the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons.

In Vanderbilt's last time out, the Commodores knocked off Georgia, 86-74, to garner their first regular season sweep of the Bulldogs since the 1999-2000 campaign. Shan Foster tallied 29 points to lead all scorers, while Alex Gordon scored a season-high 23 points on a career-best seven made three pointers.

The Bulldogs, who led by one at the half, 38-37, fell victim to a Vanderbilt 21-5 run in the early minutes of the second half to take a 64-47 advantage. Alex Gordon made a pair of three-pointers during the run and A.J. Ogilvy capped off the run with an old fashioned three-point play. After struggling in the first half with its shooting, Vanderbilt made 17-of-27 (63.0 percent) shots from the field in the second half, including 7-of-12 (58.3 percent) from beyond the arc. Vanderbilt made 50.8 percent of its shots for the game, and 46.2 percent from three for the game. The Commodores have shot 50% or better in nine games so far this season.

The Commodores, who lost to Tennessee, 80-60 on January 17 in Knoxville, will look to even the series in their final SEC East match up of the season. Vanderbilt avenged earlier losses to Kentucky and Florida in the last two weeks at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt and Tennessee will meet for the 173rd time Tuesday evening, with the Volunteers holding a 106-66 advantage in the career series. The Commodores, however, hold a 45-31 series lead in games played on Vanderbilt's home court.

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 8-10 all-time against Tennessee, and is an even 4-4 against the Volunteers at Memorial Gymnasium.

### Scouting Tennessee

Tennessee enters the game ranked number one in the nation in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls after knocking off previous number one, Memphis, 66-62, on February 23. The Volunteers have a 25-2 overall record and an 11-1 mark in SEC play. The only blemishes on the Tennessee record is a 97-78 loss to Texas on November 24 and a 72-66 loss to Kentucky at Rupp Arena on January 22.

Senior Chris Lofton, the SEC's all-time leader in three pointers made, leads the Volunteers with 15.1 points per game. JaJuan Smith and Tyler Smith also average double digits in points with 14.1 and 13.5 points per game, respectively.

### Stallings Versus Tennessee

Head coach Kevin Stallings is 8-10 all-time against Tennessee, and 4-4 against the Volunteers in Memorial Gym.

### Both Teams Ranked At Memorial Gym

Tuesday's meeting with #1 ranked Tennessee at Memorial Gym is the first time both teams have been ranked in the AP Poll on Vanderbilt's home floor since February 17, 1968, when Tennessee was ranked seventh and the Commodores were ranked ninth. Vanderbilt won that game, 75-63.

Wayne Chism's career-high 18 rebounds -- 11 on defense -- were the most by any Tennessee player since 1996, and his season-high 18 points led No. 6 Tennessee to an 80-60 win over No. 16 Vanderbilt.

Tennessee (15-1, 3-0 SEC) grabbed 43 rebounds and scored 30 points off 22 turnovers, quieting one of the SEC's best shooting teams.

Vanderbilt (16-2, 1-2) entered the game averaging 86 points per game, second only to Tennessee's 86.7. They also were averaging 9.29 3-pointers a game, just behind Tennessee's 9.73.

But the Commodores, who have dropped two straight after a 16-0 start, completed only 3 of their 21 attempts from behind the arc while the Volunteers went 8-for-22 on 3s.

Vanderbilt's 36.8 percent on field goals and 14.3 percent from behind the arc were its worst of the season.

Tennessee went on a 17-6 run to open the second half, ending with a 3-pointer by Chris Lofton to put the Vols up 59-38 with 11:24 left.

Vanderbilt responded with a 15-2 run that ended with Shan Foster's 3 to narrow the gap to 61-53.

But Tyler Smith grabbed a steal and went in for a dunk, and the Vols scored the next three points to stretch the lead to 13. Vanderbilt would get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster sank 14 points and grabbed six rebounds, A.J. Ogilvy had 12 points and Darshawn McClellan also had six rebounds.

## SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

## SEC Winning Streak

Vanderbilt has won six consecutive SEC games since starting the conference season 2-4. The winning streak is the longest of the Kevin Stallings era, and the longest since the 1996-97 season, when the Commodores won six in a row.

The longest SEC winning streak for a Commodore team is 12, which came in the 1973-74 season.

## Vanderbilt vs. Ranked Teams

The game on Tuesday will be Vanderbilt's third game against a ranked opponent this season. The Commodores lost an 80-60 matchup to Tennessee (#6) in Knoxville on January 17, and dropped a 74-58 decision to Ole Miss (#24) in Oxford on January 30. All-time, the Commodores have a 77-198 record against ranked opponents, and a 54-67 record at home against ranked opponents.

## 'Dores Win 20

With the win over South Carolina, Vanderbilt reached the 20-win plateau for the 16th time in the program's history, and it marked the quickest a Commodore team has gotten to 20 wins. The 1973-74 SEC championship team held the previous record, getting their 20th win on February 16. This year's team got its 20th win in 24 games, but the 1973-74 team got to 20 wins in only 21 contests.

Combined with last year's 22-12 finish, this marks the fifth time Vanderbilt has had consecutive 20-win seasons. Previously, the Commodores put up four straight years with 20 wins or more (1964-65 through 1967-68), then had back-to-back 20-win campaigns in 1972-73 and '73-74, 1992-93 and '93-94 and 2003-04 and '04-05.

## Regular Season Wins

The 2007-08 edition of the Commodores has won 23 regular season games, two off of the regular season record of 25 set by the 1992-93 team. This year's team has tied the 1964-65 and 1972-73 teams with 23 wins for second place all-time.

## Stallings Gets 150th Win As VU Coach, Gets To 20 Wins For Fourth Time

Kevin Stallings got his 150th win as head coach of Vanderbilt after the Commodores' 91-88 win over South Alabama on November 29, and against South Carolina, Stallings passed the 20-win mark for the fourth time in his nine years at Vanderbilt. He's only the third coach in Commodore history to record at least 150 victories, and only legendary VU coach Roy Skinner has had more 20 win seasons (six).

## Dores' Strong At Memorial Gym

Vanderbilt is 17-0 at Memorial Gym in the 2007-08 season and including last season, the Commodores have won 30 of its last 31 home games. It is the most single season wins in the history of the 56-year old facility.

## Senior-Laden 'Dores

Vanderbilt is one of only two teams in the SEC (Arkansas) to have at least three seniors averaging over 15.0 minutes per contest. Commodore seniors Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner all average over 15 minutes per game for Vanderbilt.

## A.J. Ogilvy One of Nation's Top Freshmen

6'11 freshman center A.J. Ogilvy has started his first season in collegiate basketball with a bang.

The Sydney, Australia native has scored 20 or more points nine times thus far in 2007-08, and has reached double-digits in 26 of his first 27 games as a collegian.

Ogilvy's scoring averages is the best in the SEC for a freshman, and ranks as one of the best freshman scorers in the nation so far.

Ogilvy is on pace to become the first center to average double-digit points since Greg LaPointe in the 2000-01 season (11.1), and could challenge Clyde Lee for the best season ever by a Vanderbilt center (22.6 ppg in 1965-66).

Ogilvy made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action on November 10, the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since Phil Cox scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

## Ogilvy Three-Time SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Dec. 31-Jan. 7 for the third time and the second consecutive week when he averaged 20.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. Ogilvy tallied his second double-double of the year with 25 points and 11 rebounds against UMass, with all 11 rebounds coming in the second half. He also won the award for the week of Dec. 24-31 for his 21-point, nine rebound performance against UT Martin and Nov. 5-12 for his play against Austin Peay, when he scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

## 2007 Calendar Year Ties For Best Ever

Vanderbilt had 26 wins in the 2007 year tied for the most successful calendar years in the history of the program. The 1965 calendar year also saw the Commodores win 26 games.

## Dynamic Duo

Senior Shan Foster and freshman A.J. Ogilvy rank two and six, respectively, in scoring in the Southeastern Conference as of February 25. Foster pours in 19.3 points per contest, while Ogilvy adds 17.1 points per game, and leads all SEC freshmen. The Foster-Ogilvy combination is the top scoring duo in the Southeastern Conference (36.4 ppg).

## Shan Foster Now School's Three-Point Made And Attempts Leader

Shan Foster made two threes against South Carolina on January 9, which pushed him into first place in the Vanderbilt annals for three-pointers made in a career. Foster passed VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95), who ended his career with 296 threes. Foster currently has 334 made three pointers in his career. Against Georgia in Athens on February 6, he surpassed McMahan's three-point attempts record of 774 three attempts. Foster now has 811 attempts.

### Beal And Bell Get Offense Going

Sophomore Jermaine Beal and freshman Keegan Bell have done an outstanding job for the Commodores at the point guard position so far in 2007-08. Their play is reflected in Vanderbilt's national standing in assists per game, which ranks ninth. Both have combined for a 2.38 to 1 assist to turnover ratio on the year.

### Point Guard Play A Plus

Sophomore point guard Jermaine Beal has raised his level of play this year. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, had 10 assists against one turnover in the two games at the South Padre Invitational, averaged 13.5 points per game, and was named to the All-Tournament team. Beal is also sixth in the Southeastern Conference in free throw percentage at 74.7%.

### More On Beal...

From November 24 through December 8 and from January 9 through January 31, Beal dished out five or more assists in at least four consecutive games, the first time that has happened since Atiba Prater accomplished the feat in 2000 [(9) vs. Boston College, 2/6/2000; (7) vs. Mississippi State, 2/9/2000; (5) at Alabama, 2/12/2000; (8) vs. Auburn, 2/16/2000.] Against UMass, the sophomore scored a career-best 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting, with three made threes.

### Dollar Beal

Beal currently has 123 assists on the season, the third most by a sophomore in Vanderbilt history in the history of the program. All-time Vanderbilt assist leader Atiba Prater holds the single season record for a sophomore with 155 in 1998. Beal currently ranks 1st in assist-to-turnover ratio in all games (3.00) and SEC games only (3.87).

### Beal Hits Game Winner At South Carolina

With Vanderbilt trailing by one point with six seconds remaining in regulation at South Carolina, Jermaine Beal went coast-to-coast and hit a running, ten footer to give the Commodores the winning two points in a 66-65 win over the Gamecocks on February 9.

### Gordon Contributing For 'Dores

Senior Alex Gordon, who has started in every game this season, is currently ranked in four categories overall in the SEC - 3-point FG % (3rd, .430), 3-point FG made (8th, 2.37/g), and assist-to-turnover ratio (14th, 1.39). In SEC games only, he can be found in the top 30 in 3-point FG made (7th, 2.75/g), 3-point FG % (5th, .429), and minutes played (29th, 31.42). He recently scored a season-high 23 points against Georgia and made a career-high seven three pointers in the Commodores' 86-74 win.

### Bell Rings True Against DePaul

Freshman Keegan Bell scored 12 points, all on threes, and dished out eight assists against no turnovers in Vanderbilt's 91-85 overtime win at DePaul on December 12. Bell kickstarted Vanderbilt's offense in the second half and propelled the team to the comeback victory. Bell's 79 assists as a freshman puts him in sixth place on Vanderbilt's single season assist list for freshmen.

### 'Dores Going 90

Vanderbilt scored 90+ points in the three games against Bradley (11/24), South Alabama (11/29), and Georgia Tech (12/1), the first time VU had done that since the 1999-2000

Vanderbilt will close out the SEC East portion of its schedule Tuesday when the Commodores close out a four-game homestand at Memorial. Vanderbilt and Alabama are the only two SEC teams this year to have a four-game conference homestand.

### Metcalfe Plays Career-Best Ball

Senior center Alan Metcalfe scored 18 points off of the bench, a new career high, in the Commodores' 91-85 win over DePaul on December 12. Metcalfe surpassed his career high in points, field goals made, field goal attempts, and three-point field goals made, and tied his career high for three-point field goal attempts and assists against the Blue Demons. For the season, Metcalfe has made 58 field goals, four more than his career total (47) heading into his senior year.

### Darshawn McClellan Has Career Day On Boards

Freshman Darshawn McClellan, from Fresno, Calif., came off the bench against UMass on January 5 and grabbed nine rebounds. McClellan scored ten points against Kentucky and went for eight points and six rebounds against LSU.

### Foster Named SEC Player of the Week For Third Time In 2007-08

Foster also became the first Vanderbilt player to win three SEC Player of the Week awards in one season and the first SEC player since Chris Lofton won the award three times in the 2006-07 season when he captured the league's Player of the Week honors for his play last week against Iona, Rice, and UMass. He averaged 25.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, and 2.7 assists per game in three games, and against UMass, Foster led the Commodores in scoring with a season-high 32 points, one off his career high of 33, and he nailed eight three-pointers, a career high and the most by a Commodore in a game since Mario Moore made nine against Wichita State on March 21, 2005. Foster was also named the SEC Player of the Week for his play against South Alabama and Georgia Tech November 27-Dec. 3 when he averaged 21.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game and for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13.

### Foster and Ogilvy Sweep SEC Weekly Awards

Vanderbilt senior swing man Shan Foster and freshman center A.J. Ogilvy were honored as the SEC Player and Freshman of the Week for the week of December 31-January 7, respectively, for their play in three games against Iona, Rice, and UMass by the SEC Office in Birmingham. Foster and Ogilvy became the third duo to sweep the awards, joining Chris Lofton and Duke Crews of Tennessee, who won Christmas week of 2006, and LSU's Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas, who captured the awards for the week of February 20, 2006.

### Foster Named As A Finalist For Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

Senior wing Shan Foster has been selected as a finalist for the 2007-08 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, given to the nation's top 10 senior male and female college basketball players who exemplify a total student-athlete.

The award - presented annually to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete of the Year in eight sports - focuses on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA will award the winners with trophies during the respective men's and women's NCAA Final Four weekends.

### Foster A Wooden Award Candidate

Senior wing Shan Foster was recently named to the Wooden Award Midseason Watch List, a list of 30 players competing for the prestigious player of the year honor. A national ballot will be released in March. On the Tuesday preceding the Final Four, the 10-player Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced.

## Commodores Sign Two In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that forwards Lance Goulbourne and Steve Tchiengang have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2008.

"We are extremely excited to add Lance and Steve to our program," Stallings said. "Not only do I feel strongly about their playing ability and versatility, but they are the kind of young men we want to have at Vanderbilt. They both come from excellent families and are diligent students."

Goulbourne, from Brooklyn, N.Y., and currently attending The Hun School in Princeton, N.J., is a 6'7, 215 pound small forward averaged 12 points and eight rebounds per game his junior year in 2006-07. He also stood out this summer at the Nike Global Challenge in Beaverton, Oregon, an elite tournament for high school rising seniors where his team went 5-3 against international competition. Goulbourne was ranked 90th by Rivals.com and was rated 18th among small forwards.

"I just felt comfortable there, and my family loved it," Goulbourne said. "It was just one of those feelings that came to me. I just felt like Vanderbilt was where I needed to be. They really have a good program academically and athletically."

Goulbourne chose Vanderbilt over Marquette, Rutgers, Louisville and Notre Dame.

Steve Tchiengang is a 6'9, 235 pound power forward from Montverde Academy in Florida. Originally from Cameroon, Tchiengang is rated No. 81 by Rivals.com and is the 25th best prospect at the power forward position. He chose the Commodores over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

"I felt comfortable that Vanderbilt is the place that God wanted me," Tchiengang said. "The coaching staff did a great job of recruiting me and making me feel wanted. I feel there is a great opportunity there and I get to play in a great Conference. I am very excited."

"We targeted these young men very early in the recruiting process, even before their junior year of high school began," Stallings said. "We are thrilled they have chosen Vanderbilt and feel they will be great additions to our team."

## How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

## Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08.

## Vanderbilt Posts 16th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 16th 20-win season in school history with a thrilling, 66-65, win over South Carolina on February 9. It marked the fourth 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

Georgia coach Dennis Felton figured it was only a matter of time before Vanderbilt started to click offensively Saturday. His Bulldogs led by one point at halftime but he sensed trouble brewing.

Right on cue, Vanderbilt (No. 16 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) shot 63 percent from the field in the second half and pulled away for an 86-74 victory.

Vanderbilt (23-4, 8-4) extended its winning streak to six games and remained one game behind Kentucky for second place in the Southeastern Conference East Division.

Shan Foster scored 29 points and Alex Gordon added 23 for the Commodores.

Sundiata Gaines had 24 points for Georgia (12-13, 3-9), which led 38-37 at halftime.

The Commodores made 17 of their first 24 shots in the second half to take an 86-68 lead on a 3-pointer by Foster with 4:38 remaining.

Vanderbilt completed a season sweep of Georgia for the first time since the 1999-2000 season.

Gordon hit four 3-pointers in the first half as the Commodores took an eight-point lead. But for the half, Vanderbilt shot only 40 percent.

Gaines scored eight points in a span of 2:30 late in the first half to pull the Bulldogs within 34-33. A 3-pointer by Terrance Woodbury with 30 seconds left in the half gave the Bulldogs the 38-37 lead.

Gordon's play was key for Vanderbilt. The senior guard hit a career-high seven 3-pointers and had the most points he's scored in a game since getting 30 against Tennessee as a freshman.

Gordon's 3-pointer with 14:33 left was his sixth in seven attempts and handed the Commodores a 59-47 lead, their largest of the game to that point.

Georgia made a final charge, cutting the lead to 71-62 with 8:42 left on a jumper by Zac Swansey. Vanderbilt answered with a 7-0 run, highlighted by five points from Foster, to finish the Bulldogs.

## Notes From Vanderbilt's Last Time Out Vs. Georgia

### Vanderbilt Team Notes:

- The 23 wins equals the most in a season for Vanderbilt in the Kevin Stallings' era. The 2003-04 team also recorded 23 wins.
- The 23 regular season wins is tied for the second-most in school history. The 1964-65 and 1972-73 teams also recorded 23 victories in the regular season. The record for most wins in a regular season is 25 set during the 1992-93 season.
- The Commodores have won 45 games over the last two seasons, the most victories over a two-season span since the 'Dores won 48 over the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons.
- The win marks the sixth-consecutive SEC win for the 'Dores. It is the first time Vanderbilt has won six straight conference games since the 1996-97 season.
- Vanderbilt improves to 666-184 all-time in Memorial Gym. The 'Dores have won 17 straight home games and 30 of its last 31 games at home.
- The 17 home wins in a season are the most by a Vanderbilt team since Memorial Gym was opened in 1952. The previous record was 16 home wins by the 1964-65 Commodores.
- Key Run: Leading 43-42 with 18:20 to play, Vanderbilt outscored Georgia 21-5 over the next six minutes to take a 64-47 advantage. Alex Gordon made a pair of three-pointers during the run and A.J. Ogilvy capped off the run with an old fashioned three-point play.
- Key Stat: After struggling in the first half with its shooting, Vanderbilt made 17-of-27 (63.0 percent) shots from the field in the second half, including 7-of-12 (58.3 percent) from beyond the arc. Vanderbilt made 50.8 percent of its shots for the game, and 46.2 percent from three for the game.
- Vanderbilt used the starting lineup of Jermaine Beal, Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, Ross Neltner and A.J. Ogilvy for the 24th time this season. The 'Dores are 21-3 when using this starting combination.
- The Commodores held Georgia to 30-of-64 (46.9 percent) from the field in today's game. Vanderbilt has not allowed the opposition to shoot better than 50 percent from the field in a game this season.
- Vanderbilt tied a season-low with six turnovers.
- The 'Dores had 17 assists on 30 made baskets, assisting on 56.7 percent of their baskets in the game.
- Vanderbilt scored 14 points off of nine Georgia turnovers, while Georgia only scored three points off turnovers.

### Vanderbilt Individual Notes:

- Senior swingman Shan Foster led the Commodores in scoring for the 19th time this season, scoring 29 points. Foster now has 1,841 points in his Vanderbilt career and is 51 points shy of surpassing Matt Freije as Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer. Foster also knocked down three three-pointers to bring his season total to 101, two three-pointers shy of the Vanderbilt record for most three-pointers made in a single season. Foster also grabbed six rebounds and dished out four assists.
- Senior guard Alex Gordon scored a season-high 23 points on a career-high seven three-pointers. Gordon also had four assists.
- Freshman center A.J. Ogilvy added 14 points and six rebounds for the 'Dores. Ogilvy also had two block shots to bring his season total to 38. The 38 blocks are the fourth most in a single season in Vanderbilt history and the most in a season since Chris Woods blocked 50 in the 1994-95 season.
- Senior forward Ross Neltner was the fourth Commodore in double figures, with 11 points. Neltner grabbed six boards, dished out three assists and had two blocks.
- Jermaine Beal scored nine points and had three assists. He now has 126 assists on the season, which is the third most by a sophomore in Vanderbilt history.

## Quotes Last Time Out Vs. Georgia

### Vanderbilt Head Coach Kevin Stallings:

#### Opening Comments...

"Dennis [Felton's] team always play hard and always play physical and Georgia made shots today also. That made the game a bit more difficult than we would have liked, but we knew it'd be a difficult game coming in. We got on a roll offensively in the second half and, maybe because of their lack of depth, we were able to wear them down. I'm pleased with our second half performance and wasn't with the first half."

#### On perhaps overlooking Georgia...

"We have a ton of respect for Georgia. They've slapped us around on a couple of different occasions that ended up having a damaging difference in our season. We never discussed our next game and were totally focused on Georgia. The reason we didn't play well in the first half was because of Georgia's play, not because of us looking ahead."

#### On Shan Foster and Alex Gordon...

"Shan missed some wide open threes, but was phenomenal on offense, especially in the second half. When [Alex] shoots like that, it opens things up for A.J. inside. It's good to see both of them get on that sort of roll. In the second half, we didn't stand around on offense and didn't hold the ball. That's what it will take for us to get on a roll offensively."

#### On Alex Gordon's leadership...

"He's a great team guy. He's been a good leader for us for the last couple of years. His growth in the last month or so has been in his play."

### Georgia Head Coach Dennis Felton:

#### On Vanderbilt's run to take the lead in the second half...

"I don't care who were are playing against, I'm never going to be satisfied when our defense is giving up 63 percent shooting from the field. We had a couple of breakdowns defensively (in the opening minutes of the second half) that were just unacceptable and led to quick baskets. Vanderbilt is a very good offensive team that's very explosive. Our defense just wasn't good enough in the second half to give us a chance to win. But if we don't have those two (early second half) breakdowns, maybe they don't get off to that start. Absolutely give credit to Vanderbilt. They are a very good team, one of the best in the nation, but that (defense) was unacceptable."

### Vanderbilt Player Quotes

#### Senior Shan Foster

#### On the possibility of overlooking today's game...

"Not at all. We have four seniors on this team that have been around here and that is where maturity comes in. We try to take things one game at a time and that starts in practice, and carries on into games. We never look past games. We knew (Georgia) was going to come in and they were going to play hard, they were going to play well and we were going to have to be on top of our game in order to have a chance to win."

#### On why the team was trailing by one at the half...

"In my opinion it was a direct relation to the way we practiced the last two days. It really wasn't up to our capability and that's the way we came out and played. We were lackadaisical in terms of our defensive intensity and effort, and we came in and allowed 38 points in the first half. Coach (Stallings) came in and said it at the end of the game today that, 'you can't go out and play medium, you have to play with an edge in this league every single night, every possession in order to have a chance to win.'"

## Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952



### Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also has a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10, 2007, in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 666-184 (.784) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU is 17-0 so far in 2007-08, marking the 21st time in the past 22 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games. It also marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season.
- Vanderbilt has won 100 of its last 106 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 147-13 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 80-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Shan Foster scored 21 points to lead Vanderbilt to an 81-67 victory over Austin Peay in the season opener for both teams.

Foster tied his career-high with seven three-pointers, including three straight in the second half, to help the Commodores lead by as much 18 points.

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Alex Gordon answered for the Commodores, hitting a three-pointer to push the score to 70-59. Vanderbilt led by no less than 10 points the rest of the game.

Gordon added 19 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 18 points and nine rebounds for Vanderbilt. Todd Babington led Austin Peay with 21 points, while Fernandez Lockett recorded 14 points and 12 rebounds.

The Commodores shot 60.0 percent from the field in the second half and 54.5 for the game. The Governors shot only 32.4 percent in the second half and finished at 34.5.

Babington opened the second half with a three-pointer, trimming Vanderbilt's lead to 43-35. Ogilvy scored six straight points inside, keeping the Commodores ahead 49-37.

Moments later, Foster swished three straight treys, pushing the lead to 60-42, the largest of the game.

Vanderbilt raced to an 18-3 lead to open the game, highlighted by two three-pointers by Foster. Austin Peay did not score its second basket until the 10:50 mark.

The Commodores made eight of 15 three-pointers in the first half and 50 percent from the field. The Governors shot 37.5 in the first half.

For the game, Carroll scored only 11 points, ten points under his season average.

Foster led all Commodore scorers with 15 points, with Beal adding his 14 points. Alex Gordon, A.J. Ogilvy, and Ross Neltner all added ten points for Vanderbilt in the winning effort. Alan Metcalfe came off the bench and led Vanderbilt in rebounding with six rebounds.

"We started slowly, but we guarded very well in the first half," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We got better defensively tonight, and when we got on track offensively, we got things going in the second half."

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84. VU made their last eight free throws of the game to keep the Braves at bay.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

Moments later, Georgia Tech cut the lead to 64-48 on a basket by Jeremis Smith. Vanderbilt responded by going inside to Ogilvy, who scored five consecutive points to keep the Commodores ahead 69-49.

Vanderbilt led by 27 points three times in the final 7:11 before emptying its bench.

The Commodores shot 65.4 percent from the floor in the first half and raced to a 28-13 lead with 8:52 remaining before halftime.

The lead grew to 20 at 48-28 with 1:13 left in the half on a 3-pointer by Gordon. Metcalfe and Foster each scored 10 points in the first half.

Georgia Tech shot 37.9 percent from the floor in the first half. Morrow attempted only one shot in the first 20 minutes.

Shan Foster and A.J. Ogilvy nearly beat Wake Forest by themselves.

Foster tied a season-high with 26 points, and Ogilvy tied a career-high with 23 points to give Vanderbilt (No. 25 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) an 83-80 win over Wake Forest.

Ogilvy made a hook shot with 30 seconds left, and Foster's late 3-point shooting sealed the game and kept the Commodores unbeaten.

The duo has scored in double digits every game this season for Vanderbilt (8-0), which is off to its best start since the 2003-2004 season -- when they reached the regional semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

Harvey Hale and James Johnson led Wake Forest with 18 points apiece, but late fouls cost Wake Forest.

Johnson put the Demon Deacons (5-2) ahead 78-76 with 1:45 to play for their first lead since 5-4. Ogilvy then scored six-straight points, and Jermaine Beal hit a free throw to give Vanderbilt its second consecutive win over an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. The Commodores also defeated Georgia Tech 92-79 on Saturday.

Wake Forest kept it close, but couldn't take advantage of some great opportunities in the closing minutes.

Each team was in the bonus the final 11 minutes, but Wake Forest failed to capitalize. The Commodores shot 23-for-27 from the stripe, while the Demon Deacons were just 13-for-20.

Ogilvy's inside scoring and Foster's perimeter shooting have keyed Vanderbilt's 9-0 start, its best in four years.

Ogilvy scored six points during an early 14-0 run that put the Commodores ahead 18-4. Vanderbilt led by no fewer than eight points the rest of the game.

Despite the low shooting percentage, Vanderbilt went into the break with the lead because of a high defensive intensity level that forced the Aggies into 12 first half turnovers, and limited their leading scorer, Jaycee Carroll, to only six hard-fought points in the first half. For the game, Carroll scored only 11 points, ten points under his season average.

In the second half, Vanderbilt's offense got on track and opened the period with a 12-2 run that would put Utah State away. In the second stanza, the Commodores shot 60.9% from the floor, 55.6% from three, and 73.3% from the free throw line.

Foster led all Commodore scorers with 15 points, with Beal adding his 14 points. Alex Gordon, A.J. Ogilvy, and Ross Neltner all added ten points for Vanderbilt in the winning effort. Alan Metcalfe came off the bench and led Vanderbilt in rebounding with six rebounds.

"We started slowly, but we guarded very well in the first half," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We got better defensively tonight, and when we got on track offensively, we got things going in the second half."

No. 15 Vanderbilt got out to the best start in school history, beating Iona 97-73 behind A.J. Ogilvy's 20 points and nine rebounds. The Commodores (13-0) are one of six unbeaten Division I teams.

North Carolina, Memphis, Kansas, Washington State and Mississippi are the others.

Vanderbilt's defense struggled against another inferior opponent Monday, allowing Iona to shoot 49 percent from the floor. The Gaels (5-9) scored 41 points in the first half -- more than they had in a 67-37 loss Saturday at Louisville -- and Vanderbilt found itself clinging to a 5-point lead at home after the opening half.

Shan Foster added 20 points, and Alan Metcalfe scored 14 for Vanderbilt, which won its first 12 games in 2003-04 and advanced to the regional semifinals of the NCAA tournament.

The 97 points were the most this season for Vanderbilt, topping the previous high of 95 against Bradley. The Commodores say they still haven't played their best.

Gary Springer led Iona with 17 points, and Devon Clarke added 15 points and four rebounds for the Gaels.

The Commodores led 46-41 at the break, then used a 26-5 spurt at the start of the second half to stretch their lead to 72-46, turning a competitive game into the expected blowout.

Senior Shan Foster scored 24 points to lead the #15/15 ranked Commodores to a 76-58 victory over Rice at Memorial Gym. The win pushed Vanderbilt's record to 14-0, the best start in school history.

Foster had 24 points and Vanderbilt swarmed Rice defensively to remain undefeated, forcing a season-high 24 turnovers and showing they can win with more than a high-scoring offense.

Led by their defense, the Commodores extended the best start in the program's 108-year history. The 2003-04 Vanderbilt team won its first 12 games en route to the regional semifinals of the NCAA tournament.

A.J. Ogilvy added 14 points and nine rebounds, and Alex Gordon scored 11 points for the energized Commodores, who forced 21 turnovers against Tennessee-Martin earlier this season.

Paulius Packevicius led Rice with 17 points, and Ghoram added 15 points and six rebounds.

The Commodores held the Owls to just one field goal over the first 6:11 of the second half to build a 44-28 lead. Stallings used a 10-man rotation to keep his players fresh, allowing Vanderbilt to swarm Rice constantly without tiring.

Shan Foster and Gordon both added 13 points for the Commodores (16-0, 1-0), who stretched their best start ever and the school's longest winning streak by beating the Gamecocks (8-7, 0-1) for the fourth straight time.

Wayne Chism's career-high 18 rebounds -- 11 on defense -- were the most by any Tennessee player since 1996, and his season-high 18 points led No. 6 Tennessee to an 80-60 win over No. 16 Vanderbilt.

Tennessee (15-1, 3-0 SEC) grabbed 43 rebounds and scored 30 points off 22 turnovers, quieting one of the SEC's best shooting teams.

Vanderbilt (16-2, 1-2) entered the game averaging 86 points per game, second only to Tennessee's 86.7. They also were averaging 9.29 3-pointers a game, just behind Tennessee's 9.73.

But the Commodores, who have dropped two straight after a 16-0 start, completed only 3 of their 21 attempts from behind the arc while the Volunteers went 8-for-22 on 3s.

Vanderbilt's 36.8 percent on field goals and 14.3 percent from behind the arc were its worst of the season.

Tennessee went on a 17-6 run to open the second half, ending with a 3-pointer by Chris Lofton to put the Vols up 59-38 with 11:24 left.

Vanderbilt responded with a 15-2 run that ended with Shan Foster's 3 to narrow the gap to 61-53.

But Tyler Smith grabbed a steal and went in for a dunk, and the Vols scored the next three points to stretch the lead to 13. Vanderbilt would get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster sank 14 points and grabbed six rebounds, A.J. Ogilvy had 12 points and Darshawn McClellan also had six rebounds.

The Commodores were 9-for-19 from 3-point range and shot 49.2 percent overall from the field.

Ross Neltner added 16 points for the Commodores (17-2, 2-2 Southeastern Conference), while Jermaine Beal had 10 points and nine assists.

Marcus Thornton had 27 points for the Tigers (7-11, 0-4) and Anthony Randolph added 14 points and 19 rebounds.

Vanderbilt blew the game open at the start the second half. Foster and Gordon swished two 3-pointers each in the first 3:28, pushing the lead to 57-41.

The Commodores led by no less than 16 points the rest of the way and pushed the lead to 23 with 4:47 remaining on a 3-pointer by Gordon.

Vanderbilt, sixth in the nation in 3-point shooting percentage entering the game at 42.3 percent, made eight of its first 14 from long range. LSU was only 4-of-13 for the game.

Beginning at the 9:25 mark of the first half, Vanderbilt reeled off a 20-4 run, turning a 24-23 deficit into a 43-28 lead.

Neltner, A.J. Ogilvy and Gordon scored four points each during the spurt, which gave Vanderbilt the lead for good.

Freshmen scored 18 of Ole Miss' first 26 points in the pivotal opening minutes of the second half as the Rebels (16-3, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) snapped a two-game losing streak and sent the Commodores (17-4, 2-4) to their fourth loss in five games.

The game was vital for two teams slumping after setting school records for consecutive wins to start the season.

The win snapped a six-game losing streak to Vanderbilt and helps the Rebels remain in the SEC West race behind Mississippi State after a brutal January run that included three ranked opponents.

Another slow start doomed Vanderbilt. The Commodores trailed the Rebels 29-26 at halftime. It was third time in the four losses they failed to reach 30 points in the first half and followed a 22-point loss at Florida where they scored just six points in the first 12 1/2 minutes.

The Rebels, in one of their best defensive efforts of the season, held the Commodores to 32.3 percent shooting in the first half and 34.9 percent overall. Vanderbilt missed 41 shots and 20 3-pointers.

Shan Foster finished with 14 for Vanderbilt and A.J. Ogilvy had 10, but both were held below their season averages for the second straight week. Kenny Williams added 10 points and 10 rebounds for Ole Miss and had a crucial steal and transition dunk with 6 minutes left that helped the Rebels pull away.

Down by one with six seconds left, Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings told Jermaine Beal to drive the ball until he was stopped.

No one stepped in front of Beal until he was a few feet away from the basket and his short fadeaway jumper with 0.6 seconds left gave the No. 23 Commodores a 66-65 win over South Carolina.

It was the sophomore's only basket of the game. It was the last of four lead changes in the final two minutes and gave Vanderbilt (20-4, 5-4 Southeastern Conference) its fourth straight win over the Gamecocks. The Commodores have also reached 20 wins faster than any previous Vanderbilt team.

Beal's winning points came after Devan Downey's driving reverse lay-up with six seconds to go put South Carolina (11-11, 3-5) ahead.

Beal made things a lot easier for teammate Andrew Ogilvy, who missed the front ends of 1-in-1s twice in the final minute. The freshman is Vanderbilt's leading free throw shooter at 79.5 percent, but went 1-for-6 on Saturday.

Before Beal's winner, it was Shan Foster who was bailing out the Commodores.

His 3-pointer with 50 seconds to go put Vanderbilt up 64-63.

Foster led Vanderbilt with 21 points, while Ogilvy added 15 points and eight rebounds.

South Carolina was led by Evaldas Baniulis' 19 points. Zam Fredrick added 14 points, but turned the ball over and badly missed a 3-pointer in the final minute.

The Commodores held Downey, tied for the SEC lead in scoring at 19.8 points a game, to just 10 points, all in the second half.

## 2007-08 Game Recaps and Boxscores

### Game Twenty-Five

**Kentucky ..... 52**  
**vs. Vanderbilt ..... 93**  
 Nashville, Tenn. (Memorial Gym)

Shan Foster scored 20 points and Andrew Ogilvy added 19 points and 12 rebounds as Vanderbilt handed the NCAA's winningest team its worst league loss ever and one of its worst losses in decades, beating Kentucky 93-52.

Kentucky thought it had fixed the problems that led to a 6-5 start under first-year coach Billy Gillispie, which included an 84-68 loss to Gardner-Webb at Rupp Arena and a 70-51 loss to Indiana that had been the biggest margin in a loss by the Wildcats. They had won five straight, including a victory over Tennessee, before Tuesday's blowout.

The Commodores started a four-game homestand by winning their fourth straight. The only SEC team to open league play with six of their first nine away from home had lost 79-73 in double-overtime at Kentucky on Jan. 12.

It was the worst loss for Kentucky (12-10, 6-3) since losing by 55 to Kansas on Dec. 9, 1989.

Making it sweeter for Vanderbilt? This 41-point margin matched a 52-11 loss to Rose Polytechnic on Feb. 10, 1910, as the fifth-biggest loss in Wildcats' history and their worst loss in SEC history. LSU had a 35-point win over Kentucky, 76-41, on Jan. 18, 1987.

Vanderbilt had never beaten Kentucky by this big a margin. The Commodores' previous best was an 81-51 victory Feb. 8, 1989, and now they have won three straight in Memorial Gym and five of the last six in this series.

Kentucky native Ross Neltner added 15 points for Vanderbilt, and Jermaine Beal had 10.

Joe Crawford had 11 for Kentucky, and Patterson finished with 10.

The Commodores led 41-11 at halftime and led by as much as 43 several times, the first when Ogilvy hit two free throws with 11:36 left at 66-23.

Senior Alex Gordon hit all four free throws over the final 24 seconds, and No. 24 Vanderbilt held off Florida 61-58 to remain undefeated at home this season.

Vanderbilt (22-4, 7-4 Southeastern Conference) now is a perfect 16-0 at home and has won 29 of its last 30 at Memorial Gym dating to last season. The Commodores' fifth straight win moved them into sole possession of third place in the SEC's Eastern Division.

This win also was the 1,400th in school history against 999 losses.

Coach Kevin Stallings was happy to take the win following their 41-point victory against Kentucky earlier in the week, especially with his Commodores not scoring a field goal after Andre Walker's 3 with 7:14 left. They did finish 9-of-10 at the line.

Florida (19-7, 6-5) had every reason to feel comfortable here, having won four of the last six on this floor. The Gators led 58-57 with 54 seconds left but didn't score again in losing for the fourth time in five games.

Shan Foster led Vanderbilt with 19 points. Gordon, whose two free throws with 24 seconds to go put VU ahead to stay, finished with 12. A.J. Ogilvy also had 12 points.

Nick Calathes and Marreese Speights both had 11 points for Florida, the two-time defending national champion, and Walter Hodge added 10.

The Commodores, who lost 86-64 in Gainesville on Jan. 27, got a little help from Florida's freshmen and a sold-out crowd in sealing the victory.

Florida turned the ball over on a backcourt violation by Calathes, who caught a pass from fellow freshman Jai Lucas with one foot on the wrong side of the mid-court line with 18 seconds left.

Georgia coach Dennis Felton figured it was only a matter of time before Vanderbilt started to click offensively Saturday. His Bulldogs led by one point at halftime but he sensed trouble brewing.

Right on cue, Vanderbilt (No. 16 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) shot 63 percent from the field in the second half and pulled away for an 86-74 victory.

Vanderbilt (23-4, 8-4) extended its winning streak to six games and remained one game behind Kentucky for second place in the Southeastern Conference East Division.

Shan Foster scored 29 points and Alex Gordon added 23 for the Commodores.

Sundiata Gaines had 24 points for Georgia (12-13, 3-9), which led 38-37 at halftime.

The Commodores made 17 of their first 24 shots in the second half to take an 86-68 lead on a 3-pointer by Foster with 4:38 remaining.

Vanderbilt completed a season sweep of Georgia for the first time since the 1999-2000 season.

Gordon hit four 3-pointers in the first half as the Commodores took an eight-point lead. But for the half, Vanderbilt shot only 40 percent.

Gaines scored eight points in a span of 2:30 late in the first half to pull the Bulldogs within 34-33. A 3-pointer by Terrance Woodbury with 30 seconds left in the half gave the Bulldogs the 38-37 lead.

Gordon's play was key for Vanderbilt. The senior guard hit a career-high seven 3-pointers and had the most points he's scored in a game since getting 30 against Tennessee as a freshman.

Gordon's 3-pointer with 14:33 left was his sixth in seven attempts and handed the Commodores a 59-47 lead, their largest of the game to that point.

Georgia made a final charge, cutting the lead to 71-62 with 8:42 left on a jumper by Zac Swansey. Vanderbilt answered with a 7-0 run, highlighted by five points from Foster, to finish the Bulldogs.
