LSU Travels To Face Vanderbilt In SEC Opener On ESPN

LSU stays on the road for the second straight week as the Tigers head to Nashville on Saturday to take on Vanderbilt in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams. Kickoff for the Tigers and the Commodores is slated for 6 p.m. CT from Vanderbilt Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN. It's the first time since 1995 that LSU plays its first two games on the road. LSU goes into the game with a 1-0 overall record following last week's 30-24 season-opening win over No. 18 North Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. A total of 18 players, including nine true freshmen, saw their first collegiate action for LSU in the season-opener. Vanderbilt dropped its season-opener, 23-21, to Northwestern of the Big 10. Saturday's game will be the first between the teams in Nashville since the 2005 season when LSU posted a 34-6 victory. Last year, LSU beat Vanderbilt, 23-9, in Tiger Stadium in a game that was also played during the second week of the season. LSU is 21-7-1 all-time against the Commodores, while **Les Miles** is 2-0 against Vanderbilt. This will be the earliest LSU and Vanderbilt have played as of the 29 previous meetings between the teams, only three times have the games been played in September (1990, 1991, and 2009). LSU brings a 14-game winning streak during the month of September into the Vanderbilt contest. Miles is 17-2 in September games at LSU and he's 32-4 against unranked opponents in his 5-plus years with the Tigers. LSU's last loss during the month of September came at Auburn by a 7-3 count on Sept. 16, 2006. LSU has won three straight SEC openers and the Tigers are 3-2 in conference openers under Miles. LSU's top player is cornerback/return specialist **Patrick Peterson**, who set a school-record with 257 return yards (157 punt returns and 100 kickoff returns) in the win over North Carolina. Peterson added five tackles, including one for a loss, against the Tar Heels. Offensively, QB **Jordan Jefferson** opened the season by throwing for 151 yards and a pair of TDs in the win over North Carolina, while RB **Stevan Ridley** rushed for a career-best 81 yards on 19 carries in the opener. WR **Russell Shepard** scored both on the ground (50-yard run) and through the air (6-yard TD catch) against North Carolina as he finished with 67 rushing yards and two catches for 12 yards. Defensively, LB **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tigers with 10 tackles.

STORYLINES

• LSU looks to go 2-0 for the fifth time in six years under **Les Miles**.

• Miles is 10-7 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 1-1 mark in the SEC title game. LSU has won at least two games against the SEC Eastern Division in nine of the last 10 years (exception came in 2008 when LSU was 1-2 vs. SEC East).

• **Patrick Peterson** made his impact felt immediately as LSU's return specialist, setting the school record for return yards with 257 vs. North Carolina. Peterson ranks No. 2 in the nation in punt returns (39.2), No. 3 in all-purpose yards (257.0) and No. 11 in kickoff returns (33.3).

• LSU had a total of eight first-time starters (5 defense, 3 offense) in the season-opening win.

• LSU played nine true freshmen and 18 first-timers in the season-opener.

• LSU is 16-7 in road games, which includes a 13-7 mark in SEC away games, under Miles.

• LSU surrendered only 24 yards rushing, the fewest amount by an opponent since Alabama had 20 yards rushing on Nov. 3, 2007.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON

LSU goes into the 2010 season coming off the best decade in the history of the program – winning a pair of national titles along with 99 games – and the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level has been head coach Les Miles.

Now in his sixth year with the Tigers, Miles has guided the Tigers to unmatched success – both on and off the field – in his first five years at the school, winning more games than any other coach in LSU history during a 5-year span and claiming both the BCS National Championship and the Southeastern Conference title in 2007.

It's been under Miles' leadership that LSU has established itself as one of the elite college football programs – winning 52 games overall, including four bowl contests, graduating 116 players, having 31 players selected in the NFL Draft, seven of which were first round picks, and producing nine first-team All-Americans.

Under Miles, the Tigers have also posted at least 11 victories in a season three times and they've finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and '07), a first at LSU.

With an astonishing 52-15 record in his first six years with the Tigers, Miles has climbed to the third-winningest coach in school history, while his four bowl victories rank second among all LSU head coaches.

In addition to his 52 victories, some other notable accomplishments during his first five years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season – and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; and the only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. Since the 2005 season, LSU has placed 89 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 116 earning their college diploma.

Going to back the 2007 season, LSU has graduated 52 of its 65 seniors, including 19 of 24 from the national championship team, 16 of 18 from the 2008 squad, and 17 of 23 from the 2009 team. Ten of the 13 players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL. The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, Tigers have produced 31 NFL Draft picks over the past five years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 52 wins, including 19 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with five straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

LAST TIME OUT: CHICK-FIL-A KICKOFF • #21/16 LSU 30, #18 NORTH CAROLINA 24

LSU held off a furious North Carolina rally as the Tigers opened their sixth season under **Les Miles** with a 30-24 victory over the 18th-ranked Tar Heels in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. Leading 30-10 early in the fourth quarter and with North Carolina backed up on its own 3-yard line, the Tigers spotted the Tar Heels a 97-yard TD pass to close the gap to 30-17 with 10:34 to play. That TD changed the momentum of the game as the Tiger offense couldn't get anything going. LSU went 3-and-out on its next possession before the Tar Heels marched 67 yards on 13 plays to pull with 30-24 with 2:31 to play. After UNC recovered its onside kick, the Tiger defense stepped up, forcing what appeared to be a game-ending turnover on fourth down. With the ball on the UNC 39-yard line and with just over a minute left, LSU tried to run out the clock but a fumble by **Stevan Ridley** gave the ball back to UNC with 1:08 left in the contest. With no timeouts, the Tar Heels marched all the way to the LSU 6-yard line before the Tiger defense batted away passes in the endzone on consecutive downs to seal the victory. LSU jumped out to a 30-10 halftime lead thanks to a series of big plays in the second quarter, including an 87-yard punt return for a TD by **Patrick Peterson**, a 50-yard TD run by **Russell Shepard** and a 51-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to **Rueben Randle**. Peterson finished with a school-record 257 return yards, just nine yards shy of tying the SEC record. LSU's defense limited UNC to just 24 yards rushing, while the Tigers racked up 162 yards on the ground, 81 coming from Ridley and 67 from Shepard.

NOTEBOOK

Patrick Peterson – Special All The Way Around

He's been labeled the best cornerback in college football. After his debut as LSU's primary return specialist, **Patrick Peterson** may add best return man in college football to his resume. Peterson set an LSU record for return yards against North Carolina with 257 yards - 157 on punt returns, 100 on kickoff returns. The 257 return yards were just 10 shy of breaking the SEC mark of 266 held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. The 157 punt return yards ranked as the second-most in LSU history, only behind Norman Jefferson's 169 return yards versus Ole Miss in 1983. Peterson returned a punt 87 yards for a second quarter touchdown, which tied for the sixth-longest punt return in school history. He also set up another LSU touchdown with a 47-yard return to midfield midway through the second quarter. Peterson ranks No. 2 in the nation in punt returns (39.2), No. 3 in all-purpose yards (257.0) and No. 11 in kickoff returns (33.3). And, oh by the way, Peterson added five tackles, including one tackle for a loss, from the cornerback position. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts.

Two Straight On Road To Open Season

For the first time since 1995, LSU will play its first two games of the year away from Tiger Stadium as the Tigers travel to face Vanderbilt in Nashville on Saturday night. The last time LSU played its first two games away from home, Gerry DiNardo was in his first year with the Tigers in 1995. LSU lost at Texas A&M, 33-17, in the season-opener in 1995, but followed that with a 34-16 win over Mississippi State in Starkville. LSU also played its first two games in the Curley Hallman era on the road in 1991 – losing at Georgia and at Texas A&M. Prior to that, you have to go all the way back to 1958 to find another time that LSU played its first two games of the season away from Tiger Stadium. LSU beat Rice and Alabama on the road to start its run to the national title in 1958.

Who's In and Who's Out for the Tigers

LSU lost starting right guard **Will Blackwell** on its first offensive play of the year last week against North Carolina. Blackwell suffered a broken ankle and will be out at least six weeks. The Tigers may get the services of starting linebacker **Ryan Baker** (jaw) back this week. Baker has missed the last three weeks after suffering a broken jaw in practice. Starting tight end **Deangelo Peterson** (foot) and backup safety **Karnell Hatcher** (knee) remain out of action this week.

Saturday Night Special

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 38-4 in night games under Miles compared to a 14-11 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 10-2 in night games away from Tiger Stadium, which includes a 34-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 2005.

The ESPN Family of Networks Streak at 22 Straight Wins

LSU goes into the Vanderbilt game riding a 22-game winning streak on games played on the ESPN family of networks (excluding ABC). The last time LSU lost a game played on one of the ESPN networks came in 2005 when the Tigers dropped a 30-27 overtime decision to Tennessee on a Monday night (due to Hurricane Rita) on ESPN2. Since then, it's been 22 consecutive victories for the Tigers on the ESPN family. Here's a breakdown of the streak:

Rush Defense Has Big Night Against North Carolina

LSU's rushing defense came up big in the season-opener against North Carolina as the Tigers allowed just 24 yards on the ground. The 24 rushing yards were the fewest by an opponent since Alabama had 20 yards rushing on Nov. 3, 2007. It was also the third-lowest total in a season-opener dating back to 1970 when the Tigers set a school-record by holding Texas A&M to minus-42 yards on the ground in a 20-18 loss. The other season-opener low total came in 2007 when the Tigers surrendered just 10 rushing yards in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. Other defensive highlights from the North Carolina game include: four sacks from four different players and 15 total tackles for losses (-62 yards).

LSU-Vanderbilt Ties

Former LSU offensive lineman and member of the LSU Hall of Fame Kevin Mawae is a coaching intern with the Commodore football team this year ... Mawae lives in Nashville fulltime now after spending the 2006-09 seasons as the starting center for the Tennessee Titans.

LSU's Brings 16-7 Record In Road Games Under Miles Into Vanderbilt

LSU goes into the Vanderbilt game with a 16-7 record in road games under **Les Miles**. The Tigers are 13-7 in SEC away games under Miles. LSU was 2-2 in league road games last year – beat Mississippi State and Georgia and losing to Alabama and Ole Miss.

LSU vs. the SEC Eastern Division

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 10-7 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 1-1 mark in the SEC title game. LSU has won at least two games against the SEC Eastern Division in nine of the last 10 years (exception came in 2008 when LSU was 1-2 vs. SEC East).

LSU In the Top 25

When LSU kicked off the 2010 season last week against North Carolina, they did so ranked in the top 25 for the 10th straight year. LSU is currently ranked No. 16 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and they are No. 21 in the AP Top 25. Note: This week's poll come out tomorrow due to games on Labor Day. LSU has been ranked in both the AP and USA Today Coaches' Preseason Polls dating back to the 2001 season. Dating back to start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 103 of 105 games ranked in the top 25. Since the start of the 2005, LSU has played 65 of its 67 games under Les Miles ranked in the top 25.

LSU Rebounds Following Loss Under Miles

For the first time during the Les Miles era, LSU went into a new season coming off a loss as the Tigers dropped a 19-17 decision to Penn State in the Capital One Bowl in January. LSU responded by beating North Carolina, 30-24, to run its record under **Les Miles** to 14-1 in games following a loss. LSU has only loss back-to-back games once under Miles, that coming in 2008 when the Tigers dropped consecutive games to Ole Miss and Arkansas in late November.

Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With last year's win over Georgia, LSU coach **Les Miles** has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 27-13 in SEC regular season games and 28-14 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 48 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but two of them – Texas and Penn State.

Russell Shepard On The Ground And Through The Air

WR **Russell Sheppard** made the full-time move to wide receiver this offseason and his 2010 debut was a success. Shepard accounted for 67 yards rushing, including a 50-yard touchdown run with 8:06 left in the second quarter. He scored the season's first touchdown on a 6-yard pass from Jordan Jefferson with 8:57 left in the first quarter. Shepard became the first LSU player to record a receiving touchdown and a passing touching in the same game since Early Doucet vs. Tulane on Sept. 23, 2006 (2 receiving, 1 rushing).

LSU's Won 14 Straight Games During Month of September

LSU brings a 14-game winning streak during the month of September into the Vanderbilt game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 17-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

Miles Is 19-11 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is now 19-11 in games against ranked opponents following the win over North Carolina. Last year, LSU was 1-2 vs. top 25 teams with the win coming against Georgia in Athens. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 8-7.

A New Face At Left Tackle

For the first time in 53 games, LSU started a new player at left tackle as senior **Joseph Barksdale** has taken over the spot this year. Barksdale, who has started a team-high 27 straight games (26 at right tackle), replaced Ciron Black, who started a school-record 53 games at left tackle over the past four years. As a matter of fact, since the start of the 2002 season, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Andrew Whitworth and Black. Whitworth, now a starter for the Cincinnati Bengals, started 52 straight games at left tackle from 2002-05 with Black starting every game at the position from 2006-09.

Murphy To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior running back **Richard Murphy** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined the Richard Murphy would wear the jersey in 2010.

He Must Be A Former Lineman

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman. In 66 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 48-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 32-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 31-0. The following is a look at LSU's rushing numbers during the Miles era and have the Tigers have fared in those games:

LSU Capped Decade of Dominance In 2009

LSU put an end to the most successful decade in school history in 2009 by posting a 9-4 overall record and advancing to a major New Year's Day Bowl. LSU's 99 wins during from 2000-09 ranked second to only Florida (100) in the SEC. The decade saw LSU claim a pair of national championships in 2003 and 2007 and three SEC titles (2001, 2003, and 2007). LSU played in a bowl game each year, winning seven, four of which were BCS games. Five national award winners, 18 first-team All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans, 53 NFL Draft picks and 180 college graduates highlight a decade that has seen LSU establish itself as one of the premier football programs – on the field, in the classroom and in the community – in college athletics. Some other highlights for LSU during the decade include:

- Tied for first in the SEC in bowl appearances (10), SEC Championships (3) and Top 25 final rankings (9).
- Won more home games (59) than any other team in the SEC.
- Had the best regular-season non-conference record in the SEC with a 34-2 mark.
- Led the SEC in shutouts with 10
- With 99 wins from 2000-09, only three teams in the history of the SEC have won more games in a decade than LSU – Alabama (103) in the 70's, and Florida, who won 102 games in the 90's and 100 games from 2000-09.
- The Tigers played 111 of its 130 games from 2000-09 ranked in the top 25.

LSU's Won At Least 8 Games For 10 Straight Years

By going 9-4 in 2009, LSU ran its streak of consecutive season with at least eight wins to 10 straight. LSU won at least eight games every year from 2000-09, and its current streak ranks as the fifth-longest in the nation. Here's a look at those teams with a current streak of winning at least eight:

LSU Has Become D-Line U

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn a total of six First-Team All-America honors and 10 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. Speaks at his former high school about the value of leadership in the community and responsible decision making ... Nickname is "Snug", which his mother gave him.

Nickname is "Pep" ... Motivated by his mother ... A single parent, she motivated him to go to school and get an education ... His little sister, Marquesha, got shot in the head and was "an inch away from dying" ... His father, Patrick Peterson and his mother, formerly Shandra Johnson, were not married until Patrick Jr. was 12 years old ... Patrick Jr. kept his mother's name until he could legally change it on his own ... Relative of Washington Redskins wide receiver Santana Moss and New York Giants wide receiver Sinorice Moss ... Strong Defensive Effort and Efficient Offense Lead LSU Past Vanderbilt, 23-9

Keiland Williams rushed for 71 yards and a pair of TDs and the LSU defense limited Vanderbilt to just 210 total yards as the Tigers opened conference play with a 23-9 win over the Commodores on a rainy night in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead on a 6-yard TD run by Williams late in the first quarter. LSU stretched the lead to 10-0 on a 32-yard field goal by Josh Jasper at the 10:22 mark in the second quarter. Vanderbilt responded with a 12-play, 80-yard drive to pull to within 10-7 on a 6-yard run by Larry Smith at the 7:20 mark in the second quarter. LSU needed just over a minute to go 64 yards just before halftime as another Jasper field goal extended the lead to 13-7 at intermission. A third Jasper field goal stretched the margin to 16-7 midway through the third quarter. With the Tiger defense holding Vanderbilt in check, the LSU offense couldn't put the Commodores away though. An errant snap on a punt deep in LSU territory resulted in a safety for Vanderbilt, pulling the Commodores to within 16-9 with 1:35 to go in the third quarter. LSU's defense stepped up again in the fourth quarter, halting a Vanderbilt drive at the LSU 23-yard line on an interception by Brandon Taylor. LSU put the game away with a 7-play, 46-yard drive capped on a 14-yard TD run by Williams with 6:05 to play. Jordan Jefferson completed 20-of-29 passes for 138 yards, while Charles Scott added 49 yards on the ground for LSU. LaFell led all LSU receivers with 7 catches for 38 yards. Harry Coleman paced the defense with 10 tackles, while Rahim Alem added 7 tackles and a sack.

Tigers Survive North Carolina Rally To Win Season-Opener, 30-24

LSU held off a furious North Carolina rally as the Tigers opened their sixth season under Les Miles with a 30-24 victory over the 18th-ranked Tar Heels in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. Leading 30-10 early in the fourth quarter and with North Carolina backed up on its own 3-yard line, the Tigers spotted the Tar Heels a 97-yard TD pass to close the gap to 30-17 with 10:34 to play. That TD changed the momentum of the game as the Tiger offense couldn't get anything going. LSU went 3-and-out on its next possession before the Tar Heels marched 67 yards on 13 plays to pull with 30-24 with 2:31 to play. After UNC recovered its onside kick, the Tiger defense stepped up, forcing what appeared to be a game-ending turnover on fourth down. With the ball on the UNC 39-yard line and with just over a minute left, LSU tried to run out the clock but a fumble by **Stevan Ridley** gave the ball back to UNC with 1:08 left in the contest. With no timeouts, the Tar Heels marched all the way to the LSU 6-yard line before the Tiger defense batted away passes in the endzone on consecutive downs to seal the victory. LSU jumped out to a 30-10 halftime lead thanks to a series of big plays in the second quarter, including an 87-yard punt return for a TD by **Patrick Peterson**, a 50-yard TD run by **Russell Shepard** and a 51-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to **Rueben Randle**. Peterson finished with a school-record 257 return yards, just nine yards shy of tying the SEC record. LSU's defense limited UNC to just 24 yards rushing, while the Tigers racked up 162 yards on the ground, 81 coming from Ridley and 67 from Shepard.
