2011 VANDY FOOTBALL: AGGRESSIVE, INNOVATIVE

James Franklin is living up to his preseason pledge of bringing an aggressive, innovative style to Commodore football.

Franklin's promise of bringing exciting football to West End was on full display Saturday when the Commodores faced Georgia.

"When I say we are going to play aggressive on offense and defense and special teams, we are going to play that way. I want my coaches to call the game aggressively and go win the game. Don't play not to lose," Franklin said during his postgame remarks last Saturday.

Franklin's bag of tricks has appeared in every phase of the game.

OFFENSE

★ **Halfback Passes** **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) tried twice to find receivers downfield on apparent rushes. One of the attempts resulted in a 43-yard TD toss to **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR). Earlier in the year, Stacy faked a pass and turned up field for a first-down carry.

★ **Multiple Reverses** **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) is averaging 19.0 yards on three reverses. He gained 29 yards on a double reverse vs. the 'Dogs.

★ **Fourth Down Attempts** The Commodores have gone for a first down on eight fourth downs – and been successful on six occasions.

DEFENSE

★ **Multiple Blitz Packages** The Commodores have dailed up numerous schemes aimed at creating offensive mistakes with added pressure. Four different defensive backs have tackles for loss, including QB sacks by safety **Sean Richardson** and cornerback **Steven Clarke**.

★ **Opportunistic** Playing with confidence, the aggressive secondary has accumulated 15 interceptions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

★ **Fake Punts** One of the most unique fake punts in recent team history – a pass from **Ryan Fowler** (R-Jr., punter) to **Andrew East** (R-Fr., snapper) – worked to perfection against Georgia, gaining 35 yards on a 4th & 10 from the Vanderbilt 22-yard-line.

★ **Bringing the House** With seconds left against Georgia, a 10-player rush resulted in a blocked punt by **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR).

★ **Onside Kicks** After a Vandy TD closed the score to 10-7, the 'Dores were unsuccessful with a short pooch kick just behind the front wall of Georgia blockers.

DEFENSE RANKS AMONG SEC LEADERS

The Commodore defense continues to perform well under a new coaching staff directed by first-year coordinator **Bob Shoop**.

In addition to leading the nation in interceptions, the veteran unit ranks high in the SEC and NCAA in other areas, including scoring defense, rushing defense, red zone efficiency and passing efficiency.

At midseason, the defense Vanderbilt has limited opponents to 21.7 ppg. The average is sixth in the SEC and 26th in the NCAA. The unit also ranks high in total defense, rushing defense, pass defense, tackles for loss, and red-zone efficiency.

The unit also has been stellar inside the 20-yard line, ranking second in the conference and 14th nationally in red zone efficiency (71%).

VU DEFENSE: NCAA INTERCEPTION LEADER

The Vanderbilt defense continues to lead the nation with 15 interceptions.

The Commodores posted one interception in the narrow loss to Georgia.

On Sept. 24, the defense registered four interceptions in a loss to ranked South Carolina. In Vanderbilt's first SEC game, the 'Dores nabbed five picks during a win over Ole Miss.

Casey Hayward (Sr., CB) and **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) are team leaders in interceptions with five and three, respectively. Both rank among the NCAA leaders in the category. **Javon Marshall** (R-So., safety), also has two picks.

The Commodores also are making the most of the interceptions. For the first time in team history, Vanderbilt players registered an interception return for touchdown in three consecutive games. Only one other NCAA team (La.-Lafayette) can top the Commodores' three-TD total.

It also marks the first time in modern day history that Vanderbilt has scored on three interceptions in a season.

Leading the way is Wilson, who became only the second Commodore to have two pick-sixes in one season with returns vs. Ole Miss and Elon.

The 15 interceptions is higher than all but three yearly totals from the last two decades of Vanderbilt football.

THE 'DORES: ALL SQUARE AT MIDSEASON

Does Vanderbilt's 3-3 record accurately reflect the team's season? One key season stat suggests it's an appropriate mark.

After six games, the cumulative score is tied 130-130. Vanderbilt has produced 17 touchdowns and three field goals. Opponents have tallied 16 TDs and six FGs.

REVAMPED O-LINE PRODUCING RESULTS

Vanderbilt's revamped offensive front prior to the Alabama game is showing positive results.

The retooled unit helped produce 349 total yards, 19 first downs and 21 offensive points against Georgia, who entered the game with one of the nation's top-rated defenses.

After a sub-par performance at South Carolina, the offensive staff shifted starters **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.) and **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) to new positions and inserted **Logan Stewart** (So.) into the starting unit. Johnson moved from center to left tackle, Seymour moved inside from left tackle to left guard and Stewart became the primary center.

The ability to move Johnson and Seymour came as Stewart returned to full health after a preseason illness.

RESULTS AGAINST THE SERVICE ACADEMICS

The Commodores are looking to move closer to a .500 all-time record against the nation's service academics when they host Army Saturday. Vanderbilt is 8-10-2 all-time against the three institutions: 4-4 vs. Army, 2-3 vs. Air Force and 2-3-2 vs. Navy.

The Commodores have lost their last three games played against academics, to Army in 2009 and twice to Navy (2003 and 2004). One of Vanderbilt's four bowl appearances came against Air Force. In 1982, the Commodores lost a 42-38 shootout to the Falcons in the Hall of Fame Bowl, held in Birmingham, Ala.

SCORING POINTS ON DEFENSE

For the first time in modern history, Vanderbilt has returned interceptions for scores in three straight games. This marks just the second time since World War II that Vanderbilt has tallied defensive TDs in three consecutive games. The only other time it happened came against The Citadel, Mississippi State and Georgia in 1999.

2009 VANDY-ARMY GAME RECAP

Vanderbilt (13) at Army (16) - OT

WEST POINT, NY – Alex Carlton kicked a 42-yard field goal in overtime, giving Army a 16-13 victory over Vanderbilt.

With the win, the Black Knights' matched their victory total from each of the last three seasons.

The field goal, which hit the left upright, was Carlton's third of the game. He also kicked a 51-yarder in the second quarter, Army's longest field goal since 1994.

Vanderbilt (2-4) forced the game into overtime when Ryan Fowler hit a 41-yard field goal with less than 52 seconds remaining for a 13-13 tie. Fowler's field goal also hit off the left upright before going through. Quarterback Larry Smith went 4-for-7 for 79 yards on that drive. He finished 11-for-24 with 144 yards and two interceptions.

Commodore Notes



NOTES FROM THE GEORGIA GAME

★ In a game that featured imaginative plays and strange stats, the 'Dores' second leading passer was a running back, the team's second leading receiver was a snapper, and the team's second leading rusher was a quarterback.

★ Continuing a trend of starting games strongly, the defense did not allow Georgia to score in the first quarter. For the season, the unit has allowed just 10 total points in the first quarter.

★ The Commodores' last-minute blocked punt by **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR) was the first by Vanderbilt since **Ryan van Rensburg** blocked a Florida punt last year.

★ **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) produced a superb and versatile performance against the Bulldogs. The tailback rushed for 97 yards on a season-high 17 carries, caught two passes for 16 yards, and threw the team's only touchdown pass – a 43-yarder to **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR).

Stacy's rushing total through six games (381 yards) better his 2010 total, and is just 97 yards shy of his single-season career high set in 2009.

★ After struggling with production at South Carolina and Alabama, the offense impressed with 349 total yards and 19 first downs, which ties the team high against a Southeastern Conference opponent this season.

★ The 96-yard kickoff return for a TD by **Andre Hal** (So., DB) was the first by a Commodore since an 80-yarder by **Warren Norman** (Jr., RB) against Georgia Tech on Oct. 31, 2009.

★ **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) posted six tackles, including two for losses. He also contributed Vanderbilt's lone QB sack.

★ The offense improved in critical third-and fourth-down conversions. The Commodores were 4-of-12 in third-down attempts – and 2-of-2 on fourth downs.

★ Playing extended minutes for the second straight game, **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) guided the offense on three touchdown drives in relief of **Larry Smith**. Rodgers produced 127 yards of total offense – 47 passing and 80 rushing.

Though completing just 4-of-19 passes, Rodgers kept several drives alive by scrambling to elude oncoming Georgia rushers.

★ **Chase Garnham** (So., LB) continued his strong play. The team's second leading tackler with 42 stops on the season, Garnham topped the squad with nine tackles, including one for a 3-yard loss.

★ The Commodores produced 200 rushing yards for the second time this season against an SEC opponent, finishing the game with 200 yards on 36 carries.

★ The Commodore defense limited Georgia's talented **Isaiah Crowell** (Fr., RB) to 35 yards on 10 carries.

It marked the third consecutive solid performance by the defense against a top SEC running back. The unit limited **Marcus Lattimore** of South Carolina to 77 yards and kept Alabama's **Trent Richardson** well under his seasonal average.

★ The Commodores' lone struggle from special teams came in the punting game. **Richard Kent** (R-Jr.) averaged just 23.3 yards on three attempts, mishandling one in the second quarter that led to Georgia's first touchdown.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (So., WR) paced Vandy receivers with three catches before missing most of the second half. Krause also ranks as the team's No. 1 aerial target with 20 catches.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR) posted his first touchdown catch of the season, a 43-yarder from **Zac Stacy**. He had TD receptions in each of the final four games last year.

★ Vanderbilt started the same 11 defensive players against Georgia that it did against Alabama one week earlier. Eight of the team's 11 defenders have started all six games.

★ A short pass to Zac Stacy marked the 300th career completion for **Larry Smith** (R-Sr., QB).

★ **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) posted a season-high seven tackles to go with his fifth interception. Hayward is one pick shy of matching his career high set last year.

TE JOHNSTON THIRD 'DORE TO MISS SEASON WITH INJURY

Mason Johnston (R-So., TE) became the third 'Dore to prematurely exit the season when he suffered a leg injury at Alabama.

Johnston has had tough luck with injuries at Vanderbilt. He also sustained a season-ending leg last year at Kentucky.

Other contributors who are not expected

to return this season due to injury are **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jabo Burrow** (R-Jr., OG).

In the midst of his first year as a starter and ranking among the team's top tacklers, Strong went down at South Carolina with a leg injury. Burrow was forced to stop his career in September due to injury concerns.

FACING PREP TEAMMATE

Just one Commodore – **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB) – will face a prep teammate Saturday when Vanderbilt hosts Army.

Barnes attended Berkeley Prep in Tampa, Fla., playing with twin brothers on the Army rosters, **Jordan Crockett** (So., DB) and **Julian Crockett** (So., slotback).

QUICK TURNAROUND FOR 'DORES

Vanderbilt was the only team in America that has surpassed its 2010 win total through the first three games of 2011.

In fact, the Commodores' 3-0 start also surpasses the win total from the 2009 campaign.





2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEAR GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: **Kyle Fischer, Casey Hayward, Chris Marve, Larry Smith and Carey Spear**.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) will serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams.

Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

FISCHER: A 31-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role last spring. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

HAYWARD: The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (13) and enters the season with a team-leading 30 consecutive starts.

MARVE: A three-year starter and candidate for numerous postseason defensive awards, Marve is the SEC's active leader with 352 career

tackles. He also has a team-high 42 starts.

SMITH: The fifth-year senior has shown determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith has jumped into the team's all-time Top Ten in passing early in the season.

SPEAR: After earning the placekicking duties in preseason, Spear is 3-5 this year in field goals, including a 31-yard game winner vs. UConn.

The 'Dores also name additional captains prior to each game.

HAYWARD: OFF TO SENSATIONAL CAMPAIGN

Off to an sensational season, **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) ranks among the national leaders in interceptions and is on pace to challenge the team's all-time leader in picks.

Hayward shares the SEC lead with five picks this year.

Hayward set a single-game career high with two interceptions against South Carolina. He had one interception in the loss to Georgia.

Hayward has 13 career picks, tied for second all-time among 'Dores with former standouts **D.J. Moore** (2006-08) and **Ken Stone** (1970-72). The team's career leader is **Leonard Coleman** (15 INTs, 1980-83).

Only eight Commodores have ever intercepted more passes in a season than Hayward's five-pick total.

First-time offensive players are **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Trent Pruitt** (R-Fr., WR), **Spencer Pulley** (Fr., OG), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) and **Joe Townsend** (Fr., C). **Andrew East** (R-Fr.) is in his first year as the primary snapper.

FIVE TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Five true freshmen have played midway through the season, including **Barron Dixon** (Fr., DT). Dixon's initial action came against Georgia where he rotated in on the 'Dore defensive front.

Other true freshmen contributing are **Jerron Seymour** (RB), **Spencer Pulley** (OG), **Joe Townsend** (C) and **Dillon van der Wal** (TE).

Seymour is the team's No. 2 rusher with 180 yards on 44 carries. He has a team-high three rushing TDs. Pulley and Townsend have played on the offensive front. Van der Wal saw his first action vs. Connecticut.

BARNES BECOMES NINTH FIRST-TIME STARTER

Archibald Barnes (R-Jr., LB) became ninth Commodore player to enjoy his first career start this season when he was in the opening lineup at Alabama.

Barnes is one of four defensive players have enjoyed initial career starts. The others are **Chase Garnham** (So., LB), **Javon Marshall** (So., safety) and **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB).

First-time offensive starters are **Chris Boyd** (WR, R-Fr.), **Mylon Brown** (R-So., OG), **Fitz Lassing** (TE/FB, So.), **Wesley Tate** (R-So., WR) and **Chase White** (OL, R-Fr.). Brown is the only one to start all five games.

VANDY FEATURED IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED

First-year Head Coach James Franklin and the Vanderbilt football were featured in the recent edition of *Sports Illustrated*.

SI staff writer Michael Rosenberg attended SEC Media Days, then spent three days on campus during camp doing research for the in-depth look at the program Franklin intends to build in Nashville.

FRANKLIN: NORMAN EXPECTED TO REDSHIRT

The superb early-season performance by **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) hasn't gone unnoticed. Fugger was the lone Commodore to garner 1st Team Midseason All-SEC honors by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*.

On Oct. 13, the well-respected college football annual and website named Fugger as one of the league's top four defensive linemen, along with Melvin Ingram of South Carolina, Sam Montgomery of LSU and Corey Lemonier of Auburn.

Fugger ranks fifth in the conference with eight tackles for loss and eighth in the league with three quarterback sacks. With 20 total tackles through five games, Fugger is just two stops shy of matching his single-season career high.

Two other Commodore defensive standouts, **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB) and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) were named to Phil Steele's 2nd Team Midseason All-SEC team.

SHOOP, MCGRIFF HAVE ARMY TIES

Two Vanderbilt coaches, defensive coordinator **Bob Shoop** and defensive backs coach **Wesley McGriff**, have Army ties.

One of Shoop's former coaching stops came on the West Point campus. He served as the Cadets' secondary coach under Head Coach Dan Sutton in 1998.

McGriff was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Army in 1990 and was enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserves until 2001.



MARVE, HAYWARD TOP SQUAD IN STARTS

Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) has started more games than any other position player on the current Commodore roster. The two-time All-SEC performer and defensive co-captain made his 42nd career start in Vanderbilt's narrow loss to Georgia.

Brandon Barden (R-Sr., TE) ranks second on the team with 34 starts. Barden is followed by **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr., OL) with 31 starts. Four other veterans – **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB), **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) and **Larry Smith** (R-Sr., QB) – have at least 27 career starts.

Hayward leads the team with 30 consecutive starts entering this season. He is followed by Richardson (24) and Fischer (23). Four other Commodores – **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., OL), **Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) and **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) – have started 18 consecutive games.

SMITH MOVING UP CAREER PASSING LISTS

In recent weeks, **Larry Smith** (R-Sr., QB) has surpassed three career passing milestones: 300 completions, 600 attempts and 3,000 yards.

Before leaving the Georgia game, Smith completed his 300th career pass. He ended the game 5-of-10 for 24 yards and two INTs.

Smith now ranks seventh among Commodores in all-time pass attempts (611) and completions (301). He is 10th in career passing yards (3,036).

RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR COMMODORE COACHES

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, became the first coach to register victories in his first three games since World War II.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 come-from-behind win over UConn on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Franklin's 'Dores have dropped their last three games: to South Carolina and Alabama on the road and Georgia at home.

The last new coach to guide Vanderbilt to wins in his first three games was E.H. Alley in 1943. Before that, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was Dan McGugin in 1904.

Franklin has matched or bettered the first-year win total of the four previous Vanderbilt head coaches.

SEEKING PAIR OF BOWL APPEARANCES

Nine Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – **Brandon Barden** (TE), **Tim Fugger** (DE), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Casey Hayward** (DB), **Josh Jelesky** (OL), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Sean Richardson** (safety), **Larry Smith** (QB) and **Udom Umoh** (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- Franklin is the first Vanderbilt coach to start his Commodore career 3-0 since the World War II Era.
- As a quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with several other top QBs, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Favre as a Green Bay WR coach in 2005.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

- **DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement**
For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.
- **JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff**
Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.
- **JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator**
For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.
- **CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator**
Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture – changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

POSTS WINS IN FIRST THREE VANDY GAMES ★ September, 2011

Franklin becomes the first new Vandy coach to win his opening three games since World War II.

Franklin's Career At a Glance

2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 first-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets numerous school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-America player by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... In 2011, he starts on Green Bay's world champion squad.

2005 GREEN BAY PACKERS-NFL (assistant coach/wide receivers)

Assisting Head Coach Mike Sherman, Franklin mentors a strong receiving arsenal that includes Donald Driver, Javon Walker and Robert Ferguson catching passes from Brett Favre... Despite an injury to Walker, the Packers rank sixth in team receiving yards... Driver sets career highs with 86 receptions for 1,221 receiving yards.

2000-04 MARYLAND (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator)

Franklin helps Maryland to three consecutive bowl appearances starting with the 2001 squad... Maryland also achieves three straight seasons of 10 wins or more (2001-03), including appearance in 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl... Terps followed Orange Bowl berth with 30-3 victory over Tennessee in 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 41-7 win over West Virginia in 2003 Toyota Gator Bowl... Promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2003, Franklin delivers back-to-back recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's Top 25.

1999 IDAHO STATE (wide receivers)

As receivers coach, Franklin helps ISU finish ninth nationally in total offense.

1998 WASHINGTON STATE (graduate assistant coach/tight ends)

Franklin joins highly successful Cougar Coach Mike Price as grad assistant.

1997 JAMES MADISON (wide receivers)

Franklin mentors James Madison wide receivers... Junior receiver Earnest Payton finishes his career as the school's leader in receptions with 185.

1996 EAST STROUDSBURG (defensive backs)

Franklin returns to his alma mater, Division II East Stroudsburg.

NFL MINORITY COACHING FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Franklin participates in the program in 1998, serving an internship with Miami. He also enjoyed stints with Philadelphia in 1999 and Minnesota in 2008.





Commodore Notes



WILSON, JOHNSON EARN SEPT. 17 SEC AWARDS

Trey Wilson (Jr., CB) and **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., center) were named SEC Defensive Player and Offensive Lineman of the Week for their efforts in Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Wilson picked off two Rebel passes, returning one for a 52-yard TD. He also contributed three defensed passes in the stellar performance.

With two picks returned for touchdowns, Wilson becoming the 'Dore to achieve the feat in a single season since Jay Chesley in 1974.

Johnson anchored an offensive line effort that helped produce 281 rushing yards for the Commodores. It was the team's highest rushing total against an SEC opponent since 1994.

Johnson also won the league's offensive line award last year for his performance playing tackle against Ole Miss.

LOHR GETS SEC D-LINE AWARD ON SEPT. 10

Rob Lohr (R-Jr., DT) earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his effort in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut on Sept. 10.

Lohr, who contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, was selected over several SEC standouts. Two other Commodores, **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Fr., DE), also were nominated for the award.

Lohr's four tackles for loss ties for the most by a Commodore defender since linebacker Jamie Winborn contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000. **Casey Hayward** also accomplished the feat at LSU in 2009.

Lohr became the first Vanderbilt defensive player to earn SEC weekly honors since defensive back **D.J. Moore** was recognized after the Commodores' 31-24 victory over Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2008.

VANDY, UMASS TO PLAY FOUR-GAME SERIES

Vanderbilt and Massachusetts have finalized an agreement to play a four-game series in football starting in 2012.

The Commodores and Minutemen will play twice in Nashville, the first coming on Oct. 27, 2012, and twice in Gillette Stadium. Starting next year, the venue near Boston will join as home to both UMass and the New England Patriots.

The teams will play in consecutive years through 2015. Besides the 2012 game, other series dates include Sept. 21, 2013 in Foxborough, Mass., Oct. 4, 2014 in Nashville, and Oct. 29, 2015 in Foxborough.

In April, UMass announced a jump to NCAA's Football Bowl Championship division (FBS), as a member of the MAC Conference.

STRONG RUSHING EFFORT VS. OLE MISS

Vanderbilt produced 281 rushing yards in its victory over Ole Miss. The performance ranks as the team's fifth highest rushing total against a Southeastern Conference team in the 30-year history of Vanderbilt Stadium, trailing just four games from 1990-92.

The effort against Ole Miss was topped by 169 yards by **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB). Stacy's total equals the team's 10th best rushing performance since World War II, and the most against an SEC foe since **Lew Thomas** ran for 173 against Auburn in 2001.

In the last 30 years, the 281-yard rushing total ranks as the Commodores' eighth highest rushing total against an SEC foe – and the most since Vanderbilt rushed for 286 yards at Kentucky on Nov. 5, 1994.

FORMER COACH MACINTYRE HONORED SEPT. 10

Former Vanderbilt Head Coach Coach **George MacIntyre** was honored during halftime of the Connecticut game for his incredible contribution to the legacy of Commodore football and also to assist in raising awareness within the Commodore community for finding a cure to multiple sclerosis.

Coach MacIntyre, a longtime resident of Nashville, was known throughout his coaching career as a powerful motivator and infectious personality. Those qualities have never been more apparent than in his current battle with multiple sclerosis.

More than 50 of MacIntyre's former players joined Vanderbilt Athletics officials during the on-field ceremony.

"Coach Mac," as he's been known throughout much of his career, served as head coach of the Commodores from 1979-1985 and led Vanderbilt to some of the university's biggest victories. In 1982, MacIntyre's team upset 14th-ranked Florida 31-29 and went on to finish the season 8-3 with an appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. That year, he received the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, the *Sporting News* College Football Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year. The eight wins posted in 1982 were the most wins posted by a Commodore team since 1955 and a mark that has not been matched since.

EDGE IN TURNOVER MARGIN

While Vanderbilt held a big advantage in turnover margin getting out to a 3-0 start, the stat has tightened in the Commodores' current losing streak.

The Commodores are +2 in turnover margin through six games, picking off 15 passes and forcing two fumbles. On offense, Vanderbilt has lost 15 turnovers: nine interceptions and six fumbles.

The Commodores struggled in the key stat against Georgia, committing four turnovers and forcing just one.

Earlier this season, the defense picked off nine passes facing Ole Miss and South Carolina. Vanderbilt's five-interception total against Ole Miss was the most against an SEC opponent since the Commodores picked off five Kentucky passes on Nov. 6, 1982.

After six games, the 'Dores rank seventh in the SEC in turnover margin.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the importance of holding an edge in turnovers.

VANDERBILT HOMECOMING RESULTS

Vanderbilt is 25-37-3 in its homecoming games since World War II.

The 'Dores have struggled in recent homecoming appearances, and are 1-9 in their last 10 games. The 'Dores last homecoming victory came against Connecticut in 2002.

Since WWII, Vanderbilt is 9-3 in homecoming encounters against non-SEC teams. The Commodores lost 37-27 to Navy (in 2003) in their last homecoming game against a non-SEC squad.
