DID YOU KNOW?

- This will be Elon's first ever meeting against a member of the Southeastern Conference.
- Jason Swepson will be the 20th coach to guide the Elon program.
- The previous 19 coaches have gone 11-8 in their debuts.
- Elon is playing its fourth ever game against a FBS opponent. The others are South Florida (2007), Wake Forest (2009) and Duke (2010).
- Elon has had four consecutive winning seasons, a first for the program since a stretch of nine straight winning years from 1980-88.

CONNECTIONS

- Vanderbilt first-year head coach James Franklin was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Maryland from 2008-10 where he mentored current Elon quarterback, and Maryland transfer, Tyler Smith last season.
- The Commodores' Director of Football Operations, Michael Hazel, is a former Phoenix football player. The linebacker earned his bachelor's degree from Elon in 2001 and his MBA from Elon in 2004.

THE COACHES

- Elon's Jason Swepson is in his first season as a collegiate head coach. He is 0-0 for both his career and in his tenure with the Phoenix.
- Vanderbilt's James Franklin is also in his first season as a collegiate head coach.

ELON VS. FBS OPPONENTS

Elon's Sept. 3 game at Vanderbilt marks just the fourth time that Elon has taken on a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent. The first was a 28-13 loss at South Florida to open the 2007 season. USF would later peak at #2 in the FBS polls. In 2009 Elon dropped a 35-7 decision at Wake Forest before falling 41-27 at Duke a year ago.

Elon is slated to take on North Carolina (2012) and Georgia Tech (2013) in coming seasons.

ROOKIE COACH

New Elon head coach Jason Swepson is the 20th coach in the history of the program. It is Swepson's first head coaching job. Now in his 20th season as a collegiate coach, Swepson spent the previous four seasons as the running backs coach at North Carolina State.

OPENING STATEMENT

A year ago Elon was definitely a first half team as the Phoenix outscored its opponents by a margin of 197-139, including 83-38 in the first quarter. Elon headed into halftime trailing in just three games in 2010.

A TOUGH START

In 11 games in 2010, Elon allowed an opponent to score on its opening drive on just three occasions. The teams to accomplish it were Duke, Appalachian State and Chattanooga.

ARRIVAL OF MELLETTE

In the year following the departure of the all-time leading receiver in the history of the FCS, Terrell Hudgins, Elon turned to then-sophomore wide out Aaron Mellette who would go on to earn All-America accolades.

To fill that void Mellette caught 86 balls for 1,100 yards and 12 touchdowns. His 7.82 receptions per game led the SoCon and ranked third in the FCS while his 100.00 receiving yards per outing were second in the SoCon and sixth in the nation. Mellette's 12 TD grabs also topped the league.

In Elon's game at Richmond in 2010, Mellette set a new Elon record with 19 receptions, surpassing the mark of 18 set by Hudgins.

ONES TO WATCH

Two Elon players – wide receiver Aaron Mellette and defensive back Blake Thompson – were each named to watch lists as the top player at their position by College Football Performance Awards prior to the season.

Linebacker Dale Riley also appeared on a list. Riley is one of a record 132 nominees for the 2011 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. He is one of three SoCon players on the initial list.

UNDER CENTER

Elon will look to replace four-year starting signal-caller Scott Riddle this year. In his four seasons in the maroon and gold, Riddle threw for a SoCon-record 13,264 career yards (fifth all-time at the FCS level) and 105 touchdown passes. He is the only player to ever lead the SoCon in passing for four consecutive seasons.

Junior Thomas Wilson begins the season as the heir to Riddle. Wilson started one game last year (at The Citadel) when Riddle was injured. In his career, Wilson has appeared in 12 games, passing for 443 yards and two touchdowns.

ELON AT VANDERBILT

A RETURN TO FOOTBALL

Junior defensive back David Wood joined the Elon football team this season after spending his first two years on campus as a member of the Phoenix's baseball program.

Wood, who is expected to see time both on the defensive side of the ball and returning kicks, returned to the gridiron for the first time in about two-and-a-half years this summer. Wood was an all-state performer in New Jersey as a prep and totaled 14 career INTs.

HOME COOKING

In 2010, the Phoenix went 4-1 at Rhodes Stadium, outscoring its home foes 175-112 (35.0-22.4). Elon averaged 478.6 yards per game in Rhodes Stadium and allowed an average of 331.4 yards per game.

Since 2007, Elon has gone 17-5 (.773) in the confines of Rhodes Stadium.

NESTING AT HOME

Now in the 90th year of Elon's program history, the Phoenix owns an all-time record of 477-392-18 (.548) – including a sizzling 176-84-3 (.674) in 52 seasons of home games at Burlington Memorial Stadium and a mark of 29-27 (.518) in its current home at Rhodes Stadium.

Rhodes Stadium is designed to give fans the ultimate game-day experience. Designed by architectural firm Ellerbe Becket, the seats are contoured for comfort and they're right on top of the action. All of the stadium's services are within an easy walk of any seat. Rhodes Stadium, named for trustee Dusty Rhodes, his wife, Peggy, and their family, opened its doors on September 22, 2001 for the first game against North Carolina A&T.

In 2009, the largest crowd in stadium history – 14,167 fans – was on hand to watch Elon take on Appalachian State on November 14, 2010.

McKinnon Field

Named in honor of trustee Bob McKinnon '62 and his wife, Ray, the green grass of McKinnon Field is the result of extensive research and planning, and sophisticated construction methods.

McKinnon Field is identical to the playing surfaces in many NFL stadiums. McGovernSports Fields, Inc., of Ft. Myers, Fla., which installed similar fields for venues such as Bank of America in Charlotte and Landshark Stadium in Miami, did the work for the field. Functional and attractive, these sand-based fields help reduce injuries by providing a firm, reliable surface for players to make quick cuts and turns.

"Elon has the most current, state-of-the-art field anywhere," says Bud McGovern, a turf management veteran who supervised the project.

Work on the field began in the fall of 2000 with the installation of more than 12,000 feet of plastic pipe to provide drainage. On top of this drainage network came a four-inch blanket of stone, followed by a 12-inch root zone composed of a blend of silica sand and peat moss. In May, this base was graded using laser technology, in preparation for the installation of sod at the end of June.

The 106,000 square feet of turf was grown over an 18-month period at Oakland Plantation in Council, N.C.,

and then laid down in 50-foot-long strips.

Following its installation, the sod was mowed daily and weekly tissue and soil tests helped keep an eye on the level of nutrients in the soil and make the necessary adjustments in irrigation and fertilizer amounts. McGovern says the sand base and drainage pipes will keep McKinnon Field playable even in the heaviest rain.

Theos Arch

Fans entering Rhodes Stadium will walk under Theos Arch, named in recognition of Nick Theos' lifetime accomplishments as an educator. Theos is a 1956 Elon alumnus from Charleston, S.C.

Furman Moseley, Theos' friend and former Elon football teammate, dedicated \$1 million to Elon in 1998 in honor of Theos. The two men were recruited to Elon by John L. Georgeo, Elon class of 1946, who coached football at a Mt. Pleasant, S.C., high school.

Both Theos and Moseley played guard on the Elon squad for coach Sid Varney. Varney called Theos "a truly outstanding player" and a leader who always knew what to do on the field.

Moseley went on to become chairman of an international paper company based in Seattle, while Theos had a distinguished career as principal of Bishop England High School in Charleston, S.C..

Theos is credited with building the new Bishop England High School campus on Daniel Island. When he retired in 1999, after 27 years at the school, he was honored with the Benemerenti Medal, a papal medal first bestowed by Pope Pius VI in the 18th century and given in recognition of service to the church and society. The former bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Charleston, the Most Rev. David B. Thompson, conferred the title of "honorary bishop" to Theos in a school assembly.

HEAD COACH JASON SWEPSON

Jason Swepson was introduced as the new head football coach at Elon University on January 10, 2011. Swepson is the 20th head football coach in Elon history.

Swepson came to Elon after serving four seasons as the running backs coach at North Carolina State University under head coach Tom O'Brien where he helped the Wolfpack to two bowl appearances, including a 23-7 win over West Virginia University in the 2010 Champs Sports Bowl. In 2010, NC State ranked third in the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring offense, averaging 31.8 points per game, and was fourth in total offense, averaging 338.5 yards per outing.

In 2008, Swepson helped to coach Andre Brown to over 1,000 all-purpose yards and a team-leading nine touchdowns. Brown was also second on the squad in receptions and third in receiving yards. Swepson's unit accounted for a third of NC State's receptions that year (66 of 197) as the Wolfpack rated third in the ACC in passing.

Prior to his post at NC State, Swepson served under O'Brien at Boston College from 1999-2006 as the Eagles' running backs coach. BC led the ACC in total offense in 2005 and was second in 2006. In each of Swepson's first five years at BC a running back rushed for more than 1,000 yards. While there, Swepson coached the program's all-time leading rusher in Derrick Knight as well as the nation's second-leading rusher in 2001 — consensus first-team All-America selection William Green who carried for 1,559 yards. The Eagles made eight bowl appearances during Swepson's tenure in Boston.

Swepson has performed internships with three different NFL programs, serving as a wide receivers intern with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 1998 and as a running backs intern with both the San Diego Chargers (1999) and Miami Dolphins (2000). Swepson has experience at the FCS level as well, having coached at Northeastern University (1997-98), College of the Holy Cross (1996) and the University of Rhode Island (1993). He also coached at Boston University (1994-95) and got his first collegiate coaching opportunity at Bates College (1992).

The 1992 Boston College graduate played both running back and wide receiver for the Eagles. Swepson was a two-time winner of the Big East Scholar-Athlete of the Week in 1991. Swepson holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Human Development.

A native of Seekonk, Mass., Swepson is a member of the Seekonk Hall of Fame and was a high school All-American in both football and track. He is married to the former Tanya Sparkes. The couple has two daughters, Kiana and Nadia, as well as a son, Payton.
