COACH DEREK GREENE

A dynamic recruiter, excellent tactician and passionate leader, Derek Greene officially was named the head coach of the Vanderbilt women's soccer program after the 2011 season, which he spent as the interim head coach for five months.

A 18-year veteran of collegiate women's soccer, Greene's coaching career has been highlighted by success at a number of schools in



the southeast. As an assistant and associated head coach at Ole Miss, Greene helped lead the Rebels to their first three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a second-round appearance in 2003. Greene helped guide Ole Miss to seven consecutive SEC Tournament berths — including an SEC Western Division title and second-place overall finish in 2005 — and recruited four Freshman All-America selections to Oxford.

Greene got his start in coaching nearly 20 years ago with the Knoxville Stars Soccer Club. He developed a team that went from third to second to first in the Tennessee youth soccer ranks over a period of three years, and guided that program to a Region III semifinal appearance. Five years of club experience led Greene to a position with the University of Tennessee's new varsity women's soccer program in 1996.

After serving on staff at his alma mater for a year, Greene was named the head coach at Division II Carson-Newman College. In 2000, he led the Eagles to their first South Atlantic Conference semifinal appearance with a victory over nationally ranked Wingate.

Greene made his way back to the SEC in 2002 and immediately made his mark on the recruiting trail. Among the recruits he helped bring to Ole Miss was 2005 Freshman of the Year Jennifer Hance, a four-time All-SEC honoree who went on to play professionally. Team success once again followed Greene. The Rebels would advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2003 and 2005 while posting the fourth-highest conference winning percentage from 2002 to 2008. Ole Miss also boasted a 15-game unbeaten streak in conference play spanning the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

After helping Belmont to its best finish in the A-Sun in 2009, Greene was brought to Vanderbilt as coach Ronnie Woodard's top assistant.

Just weeks before the 2011 season, Woodard retired and Greene was elevated to interim head coach. Under Greene's direction the Commodores won eight games, including victories over SEC foes LSU and Arkansas.

Shortly after the season ended, athletic director David Williams named Greene head coach — just the fifth coach in program history.

In 2013, Greene guided a Commodores bunch that scored 35 goals — the most in a season since 2005. They also averaged 2.06 goals a game for their highest average in 13 seasons.

Greene and wife Gail reside in Nashville with their two sons, Max and Miller.

'DORES WEEKLY REPORT

A two-game homestand saw the Commodores tie Auburn and lose 1-0 to Alabama. On Friday, Vanderbilt battled Auburn to a 0-0 tie in double overtime. After winning their first four home games and tying Auburn, the Commodores suffered their first loss of the season at the VU Soccer Complex.

Against Auburn, Vanderbilt survived a barrage of shots in the first half and put 10 shots on a goal. But none found the back of the net as the team tied for the first time all season. Freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami made a career-high nine saves.

Vanderbilt fired off 25 shots — the second-most all season — against Alabama and had eight corner kicks but again couldn't score. The Crimson Tide netted the lone goal in the 61st minute to get the win. Ogunsami made eight saves and has only given up one goal in the last 203 minutes. But the Commodores are also struggling to score, going without a goal for more than 283 minutes, last scoring in a 3-1 loss to then-No. 24 Georgia on Sept. 21.

SCOUTING AUBURN AND ALABAMA

Vanderbilt hits the road this weekend and heads west to play Arkansas on Friday and Missouri on Sunday.

The Commodores are 18-8-2 against Arkansas but dropped last year's meeting 5-4 in overtime. Vanderbilt has won its last two games in Fayetteville, including a 3-2 victory in double overtime in 2012. The Razorbacks (5-2-4, 1-0-2) are currently riding a five-game unbeaten streak, which is tied with Texas A&M for the longest in the SEC. Arkansas has two wins and three ties during that stretch and last weekend tied Ole Miss and LSU in double overtimes.

Arkansas has three players who have scored four goals — Ashleigh Ellenwood, Claire Kelley and Alexandra Fischer. Goalkeeper Cameron Carter is third in the SEC with 45 saves.

Missouri (7-2-2, 2-1) split a pair of games against ranked opponents last weekend. On Friday, the Tigers upset No. 14 South Carolina 1-0 on the road. But on Sunday, they dropped a 3-1 contest to No. 7 Florida. The Tigers are led by Taylor Grant's six goals and Kaysie Clark, who is tied for fourth in the country with nine assists. Goalkeeper McKenzie Sauerwein has posted four shutouts.

Vanderbilt is looking for its first win against Missouri as it holds an 0-2-3 record in the series. The teams tied last year in Nashville and Missouri won 2-0 in 2012 in its first year in the SEC.

WINS UP

Already through ninegames, Vanderbilt has more wins than it had all of last season. The Commodores needed just eight games to win five this fall. Last year, they finished the season 4-12-3 and entered league play 3-3-2. One more win will give Vanderbilt its most wins since the 2011 season when the team went 8-11.

'DORES SOLID AT HOME

Protecting the house, indeed. The Commodores are an impressive 4-1-1 at home this year. On Sunday, they suffered their first home loss, a 1-0 setback to Alabama. But they won their first four games before tying Auburn on Friday. The four wins are the most at home since 2011. The Commodores last started a season 4-0 at home in 2009.

STOUT FIRST HALF D'

Vanderbilt is the only team in the SEC that hasn't allowed a goal in the first half this season. Through nine games, 71 shots have been fired against the Commodores in the opening 45 minutes but none have gotten past freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami and the Vanderbilt defense.

SHOOTING FRENZY

Vanderbilt put up some numbers that hadn't been seen in a while when it blanked Chattanooga 6-0 on Sunday, Sept. 14.

The 47 shots were nearly double the Commodores' previous season-high of 25 against Mercer and the most since Sept. 15, 2005 when they fired off 47 shots in a 1-0 win over Morehead State. In addition, sophomore forward Simone Charley's 10 shots against the Mocs tied for the second most in a single game.

CIARROCCA BREAKS OUT

Freshman Colby Ciarrocca has emerged as a scoring threat, leading the team with five goals. Ciarrocca was named the SEC Freshman of the Week and the Tennessee Sportswriters Association's Player of the Week on Sept. 2. The Montgomery, N.J., native was honored after she scored her first two career goals, including the game-winning goal, in a 3-2 overtime win against Cincinnati on Aug. 29. Two days later, at Memphis, she scored twice more in a 2-1 win. She scored her fifth goal of the season against Chattanooga on Sept. 14.

OGUNSAMI NEAR TOP OF SEC CHARTS

It hasn't taken Christiana Ogunsami long to rise to the top of the SEC charts. The freshman goalkeeper from Cherry Hill, N.J., ranks first in the league with 5.18 saves a game, second with 57 saves and is fourth in save percentage (.814). The 5-foot-11 Ogunsami has started all 11 games, made a career-high nine saves against Auburn and has posted three shutouts.

SIMONE SAYS

Sophomore Simone Charley returns as the team's top scorer and points leader after scoring five goals, dishing out five assists and notching 15 points in 2013.

The two-sport athlete from Hoover, Ala., was named an SEC All-Freshman selection last year. So far, she has continued her stellar play with three goals and three assists. She scored against Cincinnati and scored in back-to-back games, against Chattanooga and Georgia. She has assisted twice on goals by freshman Colby Ciarrocca, including the game-winner against Cincinnati. Charley is also tied for fourth in the SEC with 45 shots. Her 10 shots against Chattanooga were the second-most in a single game in program history.

She kept busy in the spring, too, by breaking the school record five times in the triple jump. She finished ninth at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships to earn second team All-American honors. At the USATF Junior Championship in June, she broke the school record again with a leap of 43-2.5 to finish third.

EXPERIENCED GROUP

The Commodores bring a wealth of experience for a team full of freshmen and sophomores, which count for 16 of the squad's 30 players. Twenty-one letterwinners return from 2013, including nine starters. The trio of forward/defender Kelsey Tillman, defender Cherrelle Jarrett and midfielder Erin Myers (a team captain) started all 19 games.

SEC All-Freshman forward Simone Charley started 16 of 17 games before suffering a MCL sprain. Forward/midfielder Sasha Gray started 18 of 19 games. Midfielders Jamie Kator and Andie Lakin each made 16 starts. Defender Taylor Richardson made 14 starts. As a freshman, Olivia Liebman started 13 games in goal after Alexa Levick suffered an

ACL injury. In 2013, Vanderbilt scored 37 goals for its highest single-season scoring output since 2005. The Commodores also averaged 2.06 goals a game — their highest average in 13 years.

SEC EXPECTATIONS

Three Commodores were tabbed as SEC preseason players to watch — sophomore forwards Simone Charley and Sasha Gray and redshirt freshman midfielder Lydia Simmons.

As a team, the Commodores were picked to finish 13th in the league by the SEC coaches. They finished ahead of Mississippi State, which VU defeated for its lone conference win of 2013.

GRANADOS WINS GOLD

Redshirt sophomore Lina Granados did not play for the Commodores in 2013 in order to pursue a dream of representing her country in international play. Granados, a 5-foot-6 forward, helped the Colombian U-20 team win the gold medal in the 2013 Bolivarian Games last November. Granados, who first started playing with the team when she was 15, and Colombia defeated Venezuela in penalty kicks of the tournament in Peru.

In January, Granados and the U-20 team narrowly missed qualifying for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup. Colombia finished third in the South American qualifier in Uruguay, falling short by one point as the top two teams qualify. Granados also spent part of this summer on the training roster of the full national team. Granados was born in Bogota, Colombia before her family moved to Costa Rica and then Ashburn, Va., where she has lived since she was five.

OSWALD DONE FOR SEASON

Senior forward/midfielder Ashley Oswald is out for the rest of the season after doctors discovered a blood clot on her lung on Sept. 15.

Oswald experienced discomfort hours after scoring her first goal of the season and dishing out a personal-best two assists in a 6-0 victory over Chattanooga on Sept. 14. Oswald is undergoing treatment and remains with the team. The native of Pembroke Pines, Fla., played in 58 games with 16 starts and had four goals, six assists and 14 points.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Last year, Vanderbilt dominated its season opener against UAB, only to fall short. On Thursday, in an exhibition game to kick off 2014 on the first broadcast of SEC Network +, the Commodores once again outplayed the Blazers throughout this contest.

But, this time, Simone Charley made sure Vanderbilt would be on the winning end.

With 5:17 left, the sophomore drilled a shot from the top of the penalty box just inside the post to lift the Commodores to a 1-0 victory in front of a jubilant crowd at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex.

Vanderbilt, which just began preseason camp nine days ago, powered through a sluggish start to overwhelm UAB 24-3 in shots. Last year, the Commodores outshot UAB 19-6 but lost 3-1.

The Vanderbilt defense, anchored by back line Taylor Richardson, Cherrelle Jerrett, Claire Anderson and Kelsey Tillman and defending midfielders Erin Myers and Andie Lakin, never let the Blazer offense get off the ground. UAB had just three shots, including only one after halftime, as freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami made one save in her collegiate debut.

The Commodores had plenty of chances to break through.

Charley fired a game-high 10 shots, including five that were on goal. Simmons, a redshirt freshman, showed off her impressive footwork and dropped in five shots.

But UAB goalkeeper Angelica Jimenez kept Vanderbilt off the board for nearly 75 minutes, making 10 saves. Sasha Gray had a shot just veer to the right of the net. Jamie Kator kicked a laser that blasted off the post. Charley had several good looks, including a header on a cross that the 5-foot-3 Jimenez snagged.

"Opening game last year we outshot UAB 13-1 in the second half and lost that game," Greene said. "So we did what we needed to do. We grinded it out, held onto the lead late. I'm proud of our kids. They deserved it 100 percent."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Jamie Kator and Ashley Oswald met at the same spot, both determined to be the player to deliver a go-ahead goal for Vanderbilt.

But on a hot and muggy Friday night, it was Kator's time to be the star. And the junior came through. In the 67th minute, Kator scored on a penalty kick to lift the Commodores to a 1-0 victory at the Vanderbilt Soccer/Lacrosse Complex in the season opener for both teams.

"When I stepped up Ashley Oswald was there too and we kind of had a silent exchange like, 'Who is going to get this one?" Kator said. "But it came down to me. I saw the keeper moving and I knew it was just so easy. So I hit it straight, hit it hard and it went in. It was just really exciting."

Kator scored the first goal for Vanderbilt in 2014 after forward Simone Charley drew a foul in the box. Charley, who scored the lone goal in the Commodores' exhibition victory against UAB last week, fell to the ground after she was tangled with Mercer's Rachel Buffalo. The two were fighting for a loose ball and Buffalo was whistled for a foul just inside the box.

That set up Kator, who scored two goals last year. The striker stepped up to the penalty kick spot just 12 yards from the goal. She saw Mercer goalkeeper Christina Mursuli lean to her left and fired a laser down the middle of the goal and to the right of Mursuli.

As they did in their exhibition victory over UAB, the Commodores (1-0) dominated possession of the game.

With eight shots on goal, Vanderbilt had several chances to score early but the Mercer goalie duo of Maggie Cropp and Mursuli made seven saves. In fact, Vanderbilt outshot Mercer 25-4, including an impressive 14-1 advantage in the second half.

After the game, head coach Derek Greene reminded his team that they had a similar shooting effort in the 2013 season opener. But this time the result was different.

"Opening game last year we outshot UAB 13-1 in the second half and lost that game," Greene said. "So we did what we needed to do. We grinded it out, held onto the lead late. I'm proud of our kids. They deserved it 100 percent."

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - In the season opener, the Vanderbilt women's soccer team fired off a bevy of shots.

On Sunday, opportunities were far fewer.

Less than 48 hours after opening the 2014 season with a win, the Commodores mustered just three shots in a 3-0 loss to Rutgers in the first road game of the season. The Scarlet Knights scored all three goals in the second half and outshot Vanderbilt 19-3.

After recording 25 shots in a 1-0 victory over Mercer on Friday, Vanderbilt faced a quick turnaround. The team boarded a plane early Saturday afternoon and flew nearly 900 miles to play Rutgers, an NCAA Tournament team a year ago.

The Commodores (1-1) and the Scarlet Knights (2-0) played an evenly match first half. Neither team scored over the first 45 minutes. Rutgers outshot Vanderbilt 6-2 in the opening half but freshman Christiana Ogunsami, playing in her native state of New Jersey, made three saves.

Forward Simone Charley had the team's best chance at scoring in the 14th minute. She kept playing through a play that looked like an easy pickup for Rutgers goalie Casey Murphy and knocked the ball loose. But her header was cleared away by a Rutgers defender at the goal line.

After halftime, Rutgers proved to be the aggressor, outshooting Vanderbilt 13-1. Stefanie Scholz broke up a scoreless tie in the 51st minute on a goal to the right of a diving Ogunsami. It was the first goal Ogunsami had allowed in her first 141 minutes of collegiate action.

Nearly 15 minutes later, Rutgers added insurance with the first of two goals by Amy Pietrangelo. After Rachel Cole's header hit the post, Pietrangelo chipped in the rebound. In the 89th minute, with the Commodores stretching the field in hopes of a desperation goal, Pietrangelo added the final goal of the game on a breakaway attempt that slipped into the bottom right corner.

Ogunsami made a total of six saves, including knocking away breakaway attempt in the opening minutes of the game.

Along with Ogunsami (Cherry Hill, N.J.), junior midfielder Andie Lakin (Wayne, N.J.) and freshman forward Colby Ciarrocca (Montgomery, N.J.) returned to their home state.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - With no timeouts, college soccer coaches have to rely on their players to stick together and rally each other when faced with adverse situations.

On Friday night, Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene witnessed his team grow up a little.

Trailing by a goal late in the second half, the Commodores were determined to fight back against a scrappy, physical Cincinnati team. Behind the first two career goals of freshman Colby Ciarrocca, including the game-winner in overtime, Vanderbilt rallied for a 3-2 win over the Bearcats at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex.

In rallying past Cincinnati (2-1), Vanderbilt avoided a second straight loss and appeared to learn from its setback at Rutgers on Sunday when three second-half goals spelled doom.

"I really think they thought, 'We're not going to go through this again. We're still going to get this and we're going to fight for this," Greene said. "I think it is just a belief in each other and trust in each other... We have some really good players right now. We're still a little bit young but the determination on their faces when we went down 2-1, you could see it."

Coming off the bench, Ciarrocca tied the game on a header in the 81st minute, thanks to a brilliant cross by her roommate and fellow freshman Cristina De Zeeuw. Standing in the box, Ciarrocca out-jumped a Cincinnati defender and headed a shot just inside the post.

She won the game 12 minutes later. After Erin Myers forced a turnover in the midfield, the junior captain sent a pass up the field to Simone Charley. The sophomore, who scored the first goal of the game, laid the ball off to her left for Ciarrocca. The forward then put on a move to separate from one defender and fired a missile past Cincinnati goalkeeper Natalie Smith.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - Colby Ciarrocca continued her magnificent play Sunday at Memphis, helping lead Vanderbilt to a 2-1 victory and its second win in a row.

After coming off the bench to score two goals Friday, including the game-winner, to lift the Commodores' to a 3-2 overtime win against Cincinnati, the freshman did it again Sunday.

The Montgomery, N.J., native scored the first two goals of the game against Memphis to lead the Commodores (3-1) to their first road win of the season, while handing the Lady Tigers (1-1-1) their first defeat. The two goals by Ciarrocca were the only of the game for the Commodores, but they had a pair of near misses, hitting the crossbar and post on two second-half shots by Lydia Simmons and Andie Lakin, respectively.

"It was a gritty performance," Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said. "We knew going in that Memphis was a very good, hardworking team with really good players. We were very confident going into the game. One concern we had was that they had Friday night off and didn't play, so that was a concern in how we would finish the game. I couldn't be more proud of the effort, determination and heart that we showed to fight for this win on the road against a really good team."

Ciarrocca scored on her only two shot attempts, the first coming at the 17:45 mark and the second at 30:38. She was unassisted on her first goal and was setup by Simone Charley on her second as Ciarrocca buried a shot into the left side of the net.

"We are just so proud of Colby," Greene said. "She absolutely deserves this. She was our fittest player in preseason this year and it has just taken a little time to get her confidence up at this collegiate level. I'm just so proud of her and I know her teammates are. She's such a humble kid and I'm just so happy that her hard work is paying off."

Ciarrocca replaced fellow freshman Cristina De Zeeuw at the 14:29 mark. Meanwhile, Vanderbilt's defense was rock solid behind another good game by freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami. She made five saves to earn her third win in net.

The Tigers' only goal came at the 65:34 mark by Valerie Sanderson, who was assisted by Kaitlyn Atkins.

Both teams had 10 shots. The Commodores had three shots in the first half and seven in the second. Sasha Gray led Vanderbilt with three shots.

But victory was snatched away from the Commodores.

Rice scored in the 90th minute to force overtime and then scored the game-winner in the opening minute of overtime to hand Vanderbilt a 2-1 loss on Friday night.

Coming off a tough 2-1 overtime loss at Rice on Friday, Vanderbilt (3-3) mustered just three shots in the opening half against North Texas. The Commodores managed 10 shots in the second half. But it wasn't enough as they had just four shots on goal. Sasha Gray led the team with five shots. Simone Charley had three shots, including two on goal and one that hit the post. Jamie Kator and freshman Colby Ciarrocca, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week, each took two shots.

North Texas (5-0) stayed undefeated on a goal midway through the second half. Molly Grisham scored on a shot outside the penalty box that soared into the top right corner and well beyond the reach of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami for the game-winner. Ogunsami made six saves, just one shy of tying a career-high.

"The second half we imposed our will on the game and dominated every phase other than the scoreboard," Greene said. "There were some really bright spots and quality chances in the second half, but we played down to their level in the first half and that ultimately cost us the game. That's unacceptable and we have to learn from it."

Inbusch's goal in the 43rd minute was enough for Vanderbilt to snap a two-game losing streak and stay undefeated at home this season.

Both Oswald and Inbusch came off the bench to provide a spark for the Commodores (4-3), who are 3-0 at home this year.

Off a pass from fellow senior Cherrelle Jarrett, Oswald immediately felt pressure from a Lipscomb defender as she neared the edge of the penalty box. Oswald, picking up her first assist of the season, surged forward to defend against the tackle and the ball popped over to Inbusch. The 5-foot-10 forward from Upper Arlington, Ohio took one dribble and fired a shot with her left foot from 18 yards out that breezed by a defender and soared into top right corner. It was her eighth career goal.

The Commodores fired off 15 shots, including eight on goal. Sophomore Simone Charley led the way with six shots, including three on goal. Lipscomb (4-3-1) had eight shots, but just two came after halftime as Vanderbilt controlled possession. The loss snapped a program-best three-game losing streak for the Lady Bisons.

"We had a little chip on our shoulder being from the same city," Oswald said. "Throughout the full 90 both teams gritted it out. Our coaches said in the first half we were a bit more clean and crisp. We had to do what he had to do to get points on the scoreboard. They were a definitely a good team and it was tough but we gritted it out until the final minute and it was a great win."

Freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, who entered the game with a SEC-high 30 saves, made three saves to post her second career shutout. Through seven games, Vanderbilt hasn't allowed a first-half goal.

The win snapped a two-game winning streak and gave Vanderbilt some much-needed confidence after a pair of one-goal losses on the road last weekend to Rice and North Texas.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt soccer team capped off non-conference play with a scoring outburst the program hasn't seen in seven years.

With Southeastern Conference play set to begin next weekend, the Commodores boosted their confidence with a 6-0 win over Chattanooga on Sunday afternoon at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. Six players scored for Vanderbilt, which last scored six goals in a game on Sept. 9, 2007 against Tennessee Tech.

The Commodores used 28 players and fired off an astonishing 47 shots while Chattanooga (1-6) had just one. Through eight games, Vanderbilt (5-3) already has more wins than they had all of last season.

"I told the team before the game I'm not sure what to expect from Chattanooga. We didn't have a ton of information on them. But we knew what to expect from us," coach Derek Greene said. "It took about 10 minutes to get flowing in that game but once we did, we never looked back. I think the fact we could score some quality goals and do some things in the attacking third we haven't done. Could have had more but we stuck six in and that is really good. We were very aggressive going forward and we never looked back."

Simone Charley broke open the scoring with her second goal of the season in the 20th minute. Seventy-seconds later Colby Ciarrocca netted her team-high fifth goal and the rout was on.

In the 29th minute, off an assist from Charley, Ashley Oswald netted her first goal of the season. Oswald also added two assists to tie Charley for the team-high with three for the season. Later in the half, Oswald then recorded her second assist in as many games when her shot bounced off the crossbar and right to fellow Gena Inbusch, who scored her second goal in as many games.

Oswald also dropped off a pass to redshirt junior Taylor Elliott, who wrapped up the first-half scoring by booting her first career goal with 13 seconds before halftime for a 5-0 lead. Sophomore Sasha Gray capped off the scoring in the 47th minute with her first goal of the season.

ATHENS, Ga. - On the road, against a ranked team in the Southeastern Conference opener, the Vanderbilt soccer team pounced first and had chances to increase its lead.

But the Commodores couldn't manufacture the same energy after halftime, allowing three goals in a 3-1 loss to No. 24 Georgia on Sunday at UGA Soccer Stadium in the Southeastern Conference opener.

An early first-half goal by Simone Charley was the only score for the Commodores, who outshot Georgia 11-8 at halftime. But the Bulldogs were the aggressor in the second half, outshooting Vanderbilt 14-5 in the second half.

Vanderbilt (5-4, 0-1 SEC) jumped ahead 1-0 in the seventh minute. Charley scored her third goal of the season by depositing a shot from the top of the box into the bottom left corner. It was the first Vanderbilt goal against Georgia since 2007 - a span of seven games and more than 520 minutes.

In total in the first half, Vanderbilt put six shots on goal but only one went in as Hogrell made four saves. The Commodores also had five corner kicks compared to Goergia's two in the first half (those numbers would flip in the second half).

The Bulldogs (6-1-1, 1-0-1) came out of halftime more aggressive and rallied to win its fifth straight game. They knotted up the game on a putback by Marion Crowder in the 59th minute. VU freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami made an initial save but couldn't hop on the loose ball before Crowder swooped in.

Kelsey Killean scored the game-winner in the 76th minute as Vanderbilt was trying to clear a Georgia corner kick. The Bulldogs then sealed the victory in the 86th minute with Crowder's second goal. Ogunsami made her ninth start and tied a career-high with nine saves.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After holding strong against a flurry of Auburn shots in the early going, the Vanderbilt soccer team battled back to stay undefeated at home on Friday night.

Neither team scored but the Commodores picked up their first point of the young SEC season with a 0-0 double overtime tie against the visiting Tigers in the conference home opener.

"We were lucky not to be down 1-0, I told the team, in the first 15 minutes," Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said. "Honestly, I've seen a lot of video on Auburn and I think that's the best game they've played all year... I haven't seen them be the that mobile in the attacking half of the field so credit to them. But really proud of our team's response. It was a really good response by us. I felt like after the first 15 (minutes) we were unlucky not to win the game. I think we created a ton of chances. But, again, credit to Auburn. It was a really good game."

In front of a lively, student-heavy crowd of 876 - a season-high - at the VU Soccer Complex, Vanderbilt (5-4-1, 0-1-1 SEC) came alive after a sluggish first half. Thirteen of the Commodores' 15 shots came after halftime, including 11 in the second half. Jamie Kator led the way with four shots, including three on goal. Kator had several good looks but Auburn goalkeeper Alyse Scott snuffed out every chance with a season-high 10 saves.

Vanderbilt's goalkeeper was up to the challenge, too. At one point in the first half, Auburn (6-3-1, 0-1-1) outshot Vanderbilt 7-0. But VU freshman goalie Christiana Ogunsami didn't let any of Auburn's 21 shots sneak by her. Ogunsami set a career-high with nine saves and posted her third shutout of the season - and fourth for the team.

She made a couple big saves late in regulation, diving to her left to snatch a couple shots. She also snuffed out a possible finish on an Auburn corner kick late in the game by just using all of her 5-foot-11 frame to pluck the ball out of the air.

"She just goes up and snags a ball out of the air that you don't see very often in the women's game," Greene said. "Her game management was good. We gave her some balls under pressure a couple times and she dealt with it very well. So I'm really proud of her and she is developing so well. (Assistant coach) Sebastian (Vecchio) is doing a great job with her. She comes to work every day with the other goalkeepers with Sebastian and they're just bringing an effort and they're all making each other better."

It was the first tie for both teams, each recording a point in the SEC standings.
