Vanderbilt Takes On SEC Regular Season Champion LSU Wednesday

The Commodores make their last regular season road trip of the season on Wednesday when they take on SEC regular season champion LSU at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The game tips off at 7 p.m. CT, with no television scheduled for the contest. The action can be heard live on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson on the call.

The Commodores and Tigers will meet for the 104th time on Wednesday, with Vanderbilt holding a 55-48 overall advantage in the series. LSU leads 28-19 in games played in Baton Rouge, although Vanderbilt claimed the last meeting at the PMAC, 64-53, on January 24, 2007 over the 24th ranked Tigers. Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 6-6 all-time against the Tigers, and is 2-2 against LSU in Baton Rouge. The Tigers will be the second ranked team Vanderbilt has faced this year (84-69 loss to #24 Florida on January 25), and the highest ranked team the Commodores have played since beating #1 Tennessee, 72-69, on February 26, 2008, at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt improved to 17-11 overall, 6-8 in SEC play, with an impressive, 96-83, win over SEC East Division leading South Carolina on Saturday. The Commodores had their highest scoring output of the season and their highest since scoring 97 points against UMass on January 5, 2008, in the win, and fired a 2008-09 SEC-game best 62.0% from the floor against the Gamecocks. Commodore center A.J. Ogilvy and guard Jermaine Beal both had career highs in the win - Ogilvy with 28 and Beal with 27 - and two other Vanderbilt players scored in double figures in Jeffery Taylor (17) and Brad Tinsley (16). The 13-point winning margin tied for the highest in SEC play this season for the Commodores - Vanderbilt also defeated Kentucky by 13 (77-64) on February 17.

Ogilvy leads the Commodores in scoring on the 2008-09 season at 15.2 points per game. Beal adds 12.1 points per game, and Taylor chips in 11.9 points per contest. Tinsley also averages double digits with 10.5 points per contest. Ogilvy leads all VU players on the glass with 7.0 rebounds per game. Taylor pulls down 6.2 rebounds per contest and is

VANDERBILT STORYLINES



- ★ 1. Vanderbilt defeated South Carolina, 96-83**, on Saturday in their **highest scoring output** of the season. It was Vanderbilt's first 90+ point game of the season, and the **most points scored by a Commodore team since Vanderbilt defeated UMass, 97-88**, at Memorial Gym on January 5, 2008.
- ★ 2. Sophomore A.J. Ogilvy scored a career-high 28 points against South Carolina**, and junior point guard **Jermaine Beal scored a career-high 27 points in the win over the Gamecocks**. Ogilvy's 12 made field goals also tied a career high.
- ★ 3. Ogilvy is 27 points away from 1,000 with 973 career points**. He set a **freshman scoring record last season with 578 points**, and if he eclipses the 1,000-point mark this season, he would become the first sophomore in Vanderbilt history to accomplish the feat. **Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee had 1,102 points** after two seasons in his sophomore and junior campaigns in 1963-64 and 1964-65, but did not compete as a freshman.
- ★ 4. Vanderbilt outrebounded South Carolina, 40-32**. The Commodores have **outrebounded their opponent** in six consecutive games and **22 of 28 games** this season. VU is **third** in the **SEC** in all games in **rebounding margin at +5.0**, and **second in SEC games only at +4.2**.
- ★ 5. The Commodores are 2-7 in designated road games in 2008-09**, and **1-6 on the road in league play**. Vanderbilt's road wins have come at UMass (1/3/09) and at Auburn (1/31/09).
- ★ 6. The Commodores are 5-3 in non televised games** this year overall, **2-2 in league play**. Vanderbilt has **one non televised game** remaining this season (at LSU, 3/4). **Beginning next year**, every one of Vanderbilt's SEC games will be televised by CBS or the ESPN family of networks.
- ★ 7. Vanderbilt shot 62.0% (31-50) from the floor against South Carolina**, and attempted an astounding **31 fewer shots** than the Gamecocks on Saturday night. South Carolina was 34-81 from the floor (42.0%). VU also **cracked the 60% barrier in a win at Auburn on January 31**, when the Commodores made **60.9% (28-46)** from the floor and **58.8% (10-17)** from three.
- ★ 8. The Commodores are 24-45 against ranked opponents** in the Stallings era (1999-present) and 2-24 against ranked opponents on the road. One of the two wins came at LSU in 2007, when the Commodores knocked off the #24 ranked Tigers, 64-53. All-time, Vanderbilt is 78-199 against ranked opponents, and 17-120 in designated road games.
- ★ 9. 52.8% of the team's points (1,034 points) are accounted for by freshmen and redshirt freshmen**, and 74.5% of its scoring offense (1,461 points) comes from underclassmen. **Vanderbilt is the eighth least experienced team in the nation, according to KenPom.com**.
- ★ 10. Vanderbilt is second in the SEC in scoring defense** in all games - opponents are averaging 65.2 points per game.
- ★ 11. Vanderbilt started junior Jermaine Beal, sophomore A.J. Ogilvy, freshmen Jeffery Taylor, Steve Tchiengang and Brad Tinsley against South Carolina**. This marks the 12th time that Vanderbilt has used this starting line-up this season. Vanderbilt has used nine different starting lineups this season - last season, the Commodores used the same starting lineup in 30 out of 34 games.
- ★ 12. Junior guard Jermaine Beal is having a sensational junior campaign - he averages 12.6 points per game and is ranked in the SEC in six categories**. He is **tied for third in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.0**.
- ★ 13. Freshman guard Brad Tinsley has scored in double figures in eight out of the last nine contests and in 20 games overall this season**. Tinsley is also **second on the team in assists** behind Jermaine Beal at 2.8 per game.
- ★ 14. Junior George Drake has scored in double figures in four SEC games this season - his previous best before this season was seven points at Georgia in his redshirt freshman season (1/13/07)**.

Scouting LSU

LSU has a 25-4 overall record this season and a 13-1 mark in SEC play, and has clinched the SEC regular season title. The Tigers have won ten consecutive games and 13 straight SEC games, and are led by Marcus Thornton, who averages 21.0 points per game. Tasmin Mitchell adds 16.8 points per contest, and Bo Spencer chips in 11.8. Chris Johnson leads the team on the glass with 7.4 rebounds per game.

Stallings Versus LSU

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 6-6 all-time against the Tigers, and is 2-2 against LSU in Baton Rouge.

Stallings Versus Ranked Opponents

Stallings is 24-45 all time against ranked opponents, and 2-24 against ranked opponents in designated road games since his arrival before the 1999-00 campaign. He is 5-29 against ranked opponents in road and neutral site games at Vanderbilt.

Freshmen Making An Impact

Two out of the four leading scorers on this year's team are freshmen, with 6'7 forward Jeffery Taylor leading the way among the freshmen at 12.1 points per game. 6'3 guard Brad Tinsley also averages 10.5 points per contest for Vanderbilt and has emerged as one of the top freshmen combo guards in the SEC. Freshman forward Steve Tchiengang has started 13 games for Vanderbilt at the power forward position, and freshman wing Lance Goulbourne has scored in double figures five times in his initial campaign with the Commodores.

Taylor is the fourth leading freshman scorer in the SEC,

while Tinsley comes in at number seven among all freshmen.

Taylor Turning Heads

Vanderbilt freshman Jeffery Taylor set a new career high when he led all scorers with 23 points at South Carolina on January 28, and he has scored in double digits in 21 of 28 games as a collegian. The athletic 6'7 wing from Norkopping, Sweden, is the team's second leading scorer behind A.J. Ogilvy. He has two double-doubles this season, with the last coming against Kentucky on January 10 (15 points and 11 rebounds) at Rupp Arena.

Taylor Wins Freshman Of The Week Honors

Taylor claimed SEC Freshman of the Week honors for the week of December 8-15 for his play against Alabama A&M. Taylor scored 18 points against the Bulldogs and led all Commodore scorers in the game.

Youth Is Served

The Commodores sport one of the youngest rosters in the SEC and the nation this season after the departure of four seniors from last year's 26-8 team. The Commodores' roster features no seniors and head coach Kevin Stallings has started three true freshman on occasion. The top 10 players in minutes played consist of two juniors, two sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and four freshmen. Vanderbilt is also the only school in the SEC without a senior on its roster.

Underclassmen Scoring

52.8% of the team's points (1,034 points) are accounted for by freshmen and redshirt freshmen, and 74.5% of its scoring offense (1,461 points) comes from underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores).

Ogilvy Rebounds In Last Eight Games

Sophomore standout A.J. Ogilvy was not his normal self in mid January because of illness and a sore foot, but the 6'11 big man has looked like his old self as of late. He has scored in double figures in the last eight games, and set a career-high in scoring against South Carolina with 28 points. He also set a new career high with five assists at Auburn and swatted away a season-high four shots against Alabama and South Carolina.

Ogilvy Named Preseason First Team All-SEC, Sets Freshman Scoring Record In 2007-08

Sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy was named as a pre-season All-SEC 1st team member at the SEC Media Days in Birmingham in late October and by the league's coaches in early November.

The Sydney, Australia native scored 20 or more points 11 times in 2007-08, and reached double-digits in 32 of his first 34 games as a collegian as a freshman. Against Alabama on March 8, he tallied 17 points to overcome Mike Rhodes for the top spot on the freshman single-season scoring list, and ended the season with 578 points, a new Vanderbilt freshmen scoring record. He also ended the 2007-08 season with the ninth-best scoring average in the nation for a freshman (17.0).

1,000 Points Within Sight For Ogilvy

Ogilvy is 27 points away from 1,000 with 973 career points. He set a freshman scoring record last season with 578 points, and if he eclipses the 1,000-point mark this season, he would become the first sophomore in Vanderbilt history to accomplish the feat. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee had 1,102 points after two seasons in his sophomore and junior campaigns in 1963-64 and 1964-65, but did not compete as a freshman.

Double-Digit Man

Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 55 out of 60 games in his two year career at Vanderbilt. He has 16 career 20-point outings and has had seven double-doubles in his career.

The Evolution Of Beal

Junior Jermaine Beal led the Southeastern Conference in Assist-to-Turnover Ratio with a 3.06 mark in 2007-08, which also ranked him third nationally in the category, and tallied 158 assists during the 2007-08 campaign, a new record for Vanderbilt sophomores. However, in his junior season, Beal has seen his scoring go up to 12.6 points per game, and he is hitting the boards at 3.7 rebounds per contest. He is also averaging 3.14 assists per game this season, and is tied for third in the SEC in assist-to turnover ratio at 2.0.

Career Night For Beal Against South Carolina

Beal set a new career high in scoring with 27 points and grabbed a career-best seven rebounds against South Carolina on February 28. Beal was 7-14 from the floor, 5-9 from three, and 8-9 from the free throw line in the 96-83 win.

Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley currently do not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings because they do not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would be ranked in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would be third at 42.4% (53-125), and Tinsley would be ninth at 39.3% (59-150). Evaldas Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 48.3% (43-89).

SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 22-23 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 88 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (172), Florida (143), and Kentucky (130). South Carolina was chosen fifth (56), and Georgia was chosen sixth (41).

Alabama was chosen to win the SEC West with 151 votes, only four votes better than LSU (147). Tennessee received 23 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Florida received five votes, and Kentucky received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Stallings Wins Career Number 300

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings got his 300th career victory with Vanderbilt's 71-52 win over South Florida on December 16. Now in his 16th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 187 in his ten-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings ranks third all-time in Vanderbilt coaching wins behind Roy Skinner (278; 159, 1962-76) and Bob Polk (197; 1948-58, 1960-61).

Beal Increases Scoring Load

Jermaine Beal tallied back-to-back 20+ point games against Auburn and Alabama, and has four 20+point performances in his junior campaign, including a career-high 27 points against South Carolina on February 28. The win over Auburn snapped a four-game losing skid, and gave the Commodores their first win on the road in SEC play this season. Beal's made seven threes against the Tigers, a new career high.

40-Minute Man

Beal played the entire 40 minutes against Alabama on February 5, the first a player has done that in a regulation game since March 17, 1998. Vanderbilt senior guard and Nashville native Drew Maddux played all 40 minutes of regulation en route to scoring 17 points and leading Vanderbilt to a 72-68 win over Wake Forest in the second round of the 1998 NIT.

Balanced Scoring

The Commodores have had eight players score in double figures this season, and have had six different players score in double figures in the team's last six games.

Starting Lineups

The Commodores have started nine different starting lineups this season. Junior Jermaine Beal and freshman Jeffery Taylor have been the two constants for Vanderbilt all season. The team's results with the different lineups look like this:

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon. Of the 341 NCAA Division I teams, only eight have players from five countries, and only Vanderbilt and Northwestern hail from BCS leagues.

Vanderbilt TV Schedule

Vanderbilt will appear on television, either regionally or nationally, 20 times this season. The Commodores have been on the ESPN family of networks five times this season, and on CBS twice, both at home.

Vanderbilt Adds Two Walkons

6-0 junior guard Chris Meriweather, from Nashville, Tenn., and 6-5 freshman forward Aaron Noll, from Paris Hills, Ky., have been added to the roster after making the team in October at walk-on tryouts.

Looking Ahead: Arkansas on March 8

Vanderbilt will take on Arkansas Sunday, March 8, at Memorial Gym at 1 p.m. The game will be televised by Raycom Sports.

Arkansas leads the series with Vanderbilt, 15-7, and has won five consecutive games against the Commodores, dating back to the meeting on February 19, 2005 (79-65)..

3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 726 consecutive games after the 2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (734) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (623) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

VU Goes 4-0 In Cancun Challenge, Claims Tournament Title

Vanderbilt went 4-0 at the Cancun Challenge and captured the tournament title at the Moon Palace Resort on November 30 with a 71-66 win over VCU. The Commodores defeated Drake, 72-57, in Cancun, and won their first two games of the Cancun Challenge against Morehead State November 16, 74-48, at Memorial Gym, and Central Arkansas, 83-62, on November 26. Sophomore A.J. Ogilvy was named the tournament MVP, with Jermaine Beal also being named to the all-tournament team.

Vanderbilt Plays With Only Eight Scholarship Players In Cancun

Vanderbilt played without four key players in Cancun because of varying circumstances. Sophomore Andre Walker is out for the season with a torn ACL in his right knee that he suffered November 24 against Middle Tennessee State. Redshirt freshman Festus Ezeli missed Cancun because of family matters, true freshman Steve Tchiengang finished serving an NCAA mandated suspension, and freshman Lance Goulbourne was diagnosed with mononucleosis in late November and missed the tournament.

Walker Out With A Torn ACL

Sophomore forward Andre Walker was lost for the season with a torn ACL in his right knee after suffering the injury against Middle Tennessee State on November 24. Walker was averaging 4.7 points and 4.7 rebounds and had started two games. The versatile forward was arguably the team's best defender, and on offense, played as many as four different positions.

The Commodores, after the 2006-07 Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last five years, one of only three programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida, Tennessee).

Vanderbilt Signs One In Early Signing Period

6'4 shooting guard John Jenkins, one of the nation's top shooters, inked a National Letter of Intent with the Commodores in the early signing period and will be eligible for the 2009-2010 campaign.

Jenkins, from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn., averaged 21 points per game as a sophomore and 30.9 points per contest as a junior, and was named the Class AA Mr. Basketball for the state of Tennessee in March of 2008 after his junior season at Station Camp. He is a consensus top 40 player in most national recruiting databases and is ranked as the eighth-best shooting guard in the nation by ESPN.com and Rivals.com. He was also a Nike Chosen Ones selection, an honor that goes to the nation's top 50 players, regardless of class.

Jamie Graham Leaves Team

Guard Jamie Graham has decided to discontinue his basketball career at Vanderbilt in order to devote his full attention to football. Graham, who joined the basketball team as a walk-on in 2007, played in five games on the hardwood in 2009 and did not score. On the gridiron this year, the wide receiver/running back had three touchdown receptions and one rushing touchdown, and helped guide the Commodores to their first bowl win in 26 years in the Gaylor Hotels Music City Bowl.

Graham was the only player in the SEC to play both football and basketball in 2007-08 and 2008-09, and the first Vanderbilt player to play both sports since Fred Baker did it in the 1994-95 academic year.

A.J. Ogilvy scored a career-high 28 points and Vanderbilt had its best scoring night this season in routing South Carolina 96-83, keeping the Commodores very faint NCAA tournament dreams alive.

The Gamecocks (20-7, 9-5) came in sitting alone atop the SEC East, having won four of their last five. They scored the opening basket, and that was their only lead of the night as they trailed by as much as 25.

"In the first half, I thought we did a good job defensively," Kevin Stallings, VU head coach, said. "In the second half, we were content to score with them."

Vanderbilt (17-11, 6-8) snapped a two-game skid, coming off its worst shooting performance of the season in a loss at Georgia. The Commodores made up for that by hitting 11 of their first 13 against South Carolina.

Jermaine Beal also had a career-high with 27 points for Vanderbilt. Jeffery Taylor added 17 and Brad Tinsley 16.

"I thought we got great play from A.J. Ogilvy and Jermaine Beal," Stallings noted.

Devan Downey led South Carolina with 24 points. Zam Fredrick added 21, Brandis Raley-Ross 15 and Mike Holmes 12.

"I thought our defense on [Devan] Downey was very good," added Stallings. "He had 24 points, but it took him a lot of shots to get there."

Notes

With the 96-83 win, the Commodores move to 17-11 overall and 6-8 in the SEC Eastern Division. Vanderbilt also ends a two-game losing streak in conference play. The Commodores also improve to 12-4 in Memorial Gym and 45-7 at home in the last three years.

The win evens the VU-South Carolina series at 22-22. The Commodores are now 12-9 against the Gamecocks in Memorial Gym, and 10-12 against USC in the Kevin Stallings Era.

It marks the 187th Commodore coaching victory for Stallings. He needs 10 wins to match Bob Polk for second place on the Vanderbilt all-time list behind Roy Skinner, who coached the Commodores to 278 victories.

The game featured career-high scoring performances by sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy and junior guard Jermaine Beal. Ogilvy finished with 28 points, one more than his previous high of 27 notched against Auburn in the 2008 SEC Tournament. Beal ended the game with 26 points. Beal's previous high point of 21 came at Auburn earlier this year.

Vanderbilt Starters

The Commodores started three true freshmen: guard Brad Tinsley, wing Jeffery Taylor and forward Steve Tchiengang. Other starters were Beal and Ogilvy. Beal and Taylor had started all 28 games this season. This starting unit is 7-5 on the season.

First Half Notes

- After a quick USC basket to open the game, the Commodores responded with nine straight points in less than 90 seconds to take a 9-2 lead with 18:15 left.
- The Commodore lead reached 11 points (19-8) with 13:31 left, on a pair of Ogilvy baskets, the first of which was a drive down the middle of the lane that resulted in a dunk.
- At the 12:23 mark, Ogilvy's 3-pointer gave the Commodores a 22-11 lead. The sophomore has scored Vanderbilt's last nine points.
- By the second media timeout, Vanderbilt was hitting 81.8% from the field (9 of 11).
- A layup by Tinsley with 11:34 left pushed the Vanderbilt margin to 13 points (24-11). Seconds later, the Commodores were up by 15 points (28-13) after Beal and Tinsley each converted two free throws. Taylor helped push the lead to 18 points at 31-13 with a layup and made free throw.
- Consecutive 3-pointers by Beal, the last coming with 7:32 left, gave the Commodores a 37-17 margin.
- Beal ended a four-minute stretch with points for the Commodores with a 3-pointer at the 3:32 mark. Beal is 3 of 4 from 3-point range, with the Commodores 5 of 8 as a team from long range. With 1:16 left, Beal hit his fourth 3-pointer to open a 45-27 lead. Only once before has Beal made more than four 3-pointers in a game (at Auburn, Jan. 31, 2009).
- The Commodores enter halftime with a 47-27 lead:
- The 20-point margin is a season-high for Kevin Stallings' Commodores. It is Vanderbilt's largest halftime margin since it owned a 30-point cushion (41-11) over Kentucky on Feb. 12, 2008.
- The Commodores' 47-point total the most this year against a SEC opponent.
- The 47 points is the team's second highest halftime total (behind only a 48-point total against Central Arkansas on Nov. 26)
- Three Commodores reached double digits in scoring by halftime, topped by Beal's 16 points. Ogilvy and Taylor had 11 each.
- Vanderbilt hit 62.5% of their field goals (15 of 24) and 66.7% of their 3-point tries (6 of 9).

Second Half Notes

- The Commodores open the second half with another three-point play by Beal, as the point guard converts a free throw after being fouled on a made layup. The resulting 23-point lead (50-27) is a game high.
- Midway through the second half, seven straight points by Ogilvy allowed Vanderbilt to keep its 23-point lead (64-41). A layup by Beal with 13:22 remaining gave the Commodores their biggest lead at 66-41.
- Freshman Lance Goulbourne provided a Commodore highlight with 9:12, stuffing a missed layup by Beal. The basket came after a pair of impressive blocks by Ogilvy.

Post Game Notes

- The Commodore 96-point total marks a season high, and is the most scored by a Vanderbilt since a 97-88 victory over Massachusetts in Memorial Gym on Jan. 5, 2008.
- The Commodores 13-point winning margin matches a season high against SEC opponent. Vanderbilt also beat Kentucky by a similar margin on Feb. 17 in Memorial Gym.
- The Commodores set a season high in field goal percentage, hitting 62% from the field (31 of 50). The Commodores also hit 50% from 3-point range (8 of 16). It was also the best field goal percentage in an SEC game this season.
- Vanderbilt also owned a 40-32 advantage in rebounds. Vanderbilt has outrebounded its last six opponents, and is second in the SEC in rebounding margin in SEC games (+4.2).
- Beal made five 3-pointers, two shy of his career high set at Auburn on Jan. 31, 2009. Beal scored 27 points a new career high, and grabbed seven rebounds, also a career best.
- Ogilvy added five rebounds and four blocked shots in the stellar effort.
- It marked the first time Vanderbilt had two players with at least 20 points in a game since Ogilvy and Beal had 20 points each against Alabama on Feb. 5, 2009.
- Brad Tinsley scored in double digits for the 8th time in nine games with a 16-point performance. He was a career-best 8-for-8 from the charity stripe.

"We always try to play up tempo. On some nights, the shots go in. Jermaine [Beal] did well from three. When the shots go in, it looks like we're playing up tempo. When the shots don't go in, it doesn't look [like we're playing up tempo.] We want to be the aggressor. That's our way to win."

MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1982

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 57TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 57th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt and the venerable old facility saw its most successful season in 2007-08, when the Commodores went a perfect 19-0 and defeated another number one ranked team. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008 against Mississippi State.

* The Commodores have posted a 680-186 (.785) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.

* VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

* Vanderbilt won its 10th game of the season at home against Ole Miss on February 7, marking the 22nd time in the past 23 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.

* Vanderbilt has won 107 of its last 114 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 154-15 non-conference record at home (.911 win percentage).

* The Commodores are 87-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

"I thought we didn't take care of the ball in the first half. Our team's mentality is to come out and try to win the game in the first five minutes, but it's a 40 minute game. We need to slow down mentally."

Taylor scored 10 in the second half as the Commodores outscored the Eagles 43-24.

Vanderbilt (1-0), which has seven freshmen on its roster, also got 12 points from sophomore A.J. Ogilvy and 10 from junior Jermaine Beal.

Morehead State (0-2), which led for most of the game's first 11 minutes, got 10 points each from Robert Murry and Terrance Hill.

Vanderbilt (1-1) tied the game at 58 on a free throw by A.J. Ogilvy with 6:56 remaining, but then was held scoreless until Andre Walker made a layup and a foul shot with 2:13 to play.

The Commodores made just 13 of 21 free throws (61.9 percent) in the game. Jermaine Beal made a pair of free throws with 1:38 left that got the Commodores within two points. Beal then missed a game-tying layup with 22 seconds to go.

"Congratulations to them," Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, said. "They deserved to win. They did a better job of making shots and being aggressive on the boards. You have to tip your hat to them. We have a lot of room to get better."

"Losing at any time is disappointing," Vanderbilt sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy said, "but to be this early in the season is what's really hurting. Over the next few days we'll work on improving so we make sure we don't drop any more games."

Illinois was a perfect 11-for-11 from the line, including two each by Trent Meacham and Chester Frazier in the final 20 seconds.

"For us, it's a great win," said Illinois head coach Bruce Weber. "Hopefully it's a confidence builder."

Freshman guard Brad Tinsley led an array of Vanderbilt scorers in double figures with a career-high 19 points on 7-of-14 shooting, 5-of-8 from three-point range. Another freshman, Jeffery Taylor, added 15 points, while junior Jermaine Beal chipped in 14 points, and sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy notched 13 points, all in the second half.

Vanderbilt sophomore A.J. Ogilvy scored 25 points to lead four Commodore players in double figures in route to a 71-66 win over VCU in the finals of the Cancun Challenge at the Moon Palace Resort in Cancun, Mexico. Ogilvy was named the tournament's MVP, and junior guard Jermaine Beal was named to the Cancun Challenge All-Tournament team.

Sunday's win marked the second consecutive Thanksgiving tournament title for the Commodores. Vanderbilt captured the South Padre Island Invitational in 2007 with wins over Utah State and Bradley.

The Commodores led for most of the contest, but VCU made the game interesting in the second half behind their frenzied defense and clutch shooting Ram guard Eric Maynor, who ended the game with 31 points, 23 of those in the second half. Vanderbilt, who saw its lead balloon to as many as 18 early in the second half, struggled with the quickness of the VCU guards in the period, and had its lead cut to one, 48-47, with 11:11 to play in the game. VU responded and pushed its lead back up to seven, but once again VCU came back, this time cutting the deficit to two points with 1:19 to play in regulation.

Free throw shooting, a strong point for the Commodores in the tournament, came through again in the waning moments, as Beal knocked down two shots and sophomore forward Darshawn McClellan made one-of-two with 30 seconds remaining to give VU the winning margin of 71-66. On the night, Vanderbilt was 26-for-30 from the charity stripe (86.7%).

Josh Mayo made eight 3-pointers and scored 30 points as Illinois-Chicago defeated Vanderbilt 74-55.

"Mayo can shoot the ball," said UIC coach Jimmy Collins. "Everybody talks about the guys who are shooting from the main conferences and they just overlook Josh Mayo. Everybody saw in this building that he's a tremendous player as well as a tremendous shooter."

Mayo's big night from beyond the arc was the most 3-pointers ever by a visiting player at Memorial Gymnasium, and one short of the Flames' (4-2) single-game record. The Horizon League's preseason player of the year made two 3-pointers in an 11-0 first-half run that broke an 18-18 tie and put the Flames ahead to stay. Mayo was 5-for-5 on 3-point shots in the second half.

"We were severely outplayed, outfought, and out-hustled tonight," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "It was a very disappointing and embarrassing performance."

"It was a combination of our lack of shooting and their great defense," added Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy, who tied with Jeffery Taylor for a team-high 14 points on the night. "We didn't have the defensive effort required to keep their score to a minimum. We just didn't play well enough to win. That's what it comes down to."

Robo Kreps added 23 points, including three 3-pointers, as the Flames won their third straight game.

Overall, the Flames made 12 of 19 (63.2 percent) 3-point attempts. Vanderbilt (5-2) was 4-for-24 (16.7 percent) from beyond the arc.

"Our players and our coaching staff certainly know what we just did, coming into Nashville and beating an SEC team like Vanderbilt," added Collins. "Our guys can build off of that. Their confidence level should go up from this victory."

Gani Lawal, who had a career-high 34 points in the loss to Penn State, scored only eight on Saturday to go along with 12 rebounds. He had only three points at the half on 1-of-3 shooting and made only 1-of-5 free throws but had seven rebounds.

Vanderbilt (5-3), which was coming off a 74-55 loss to Illinois-Chicago on Wednesday night, was led by A.J. Ogilvy with 15 points. Jeffery Taylor added 11.

The Yellow Jackets trailed 44-43 with 7:58 left before going on a 13-3 run for a 56-47 lead with 1:45 left on a basket by Nick Foreman. Aminu, who shot 8 of 11 from the field, also had 11 rebounds.

Georgia Tech built its largest lead at 63-49 with 30 seconds left on a dunk by Zachery Peacock, who had 10 points.

The Yellow Jackets led 28-25 at halftime as both teams shot poorly from the field. Tech finished with 21 of 62 from the field (34 percent), and Vanderbilt shot 16 of 50 from the field (32 percent).

Shumpert led Georgia Tech with 14 points at halftime. Brad Tinsley had eight for Vanderbilt and did not score in the second half.

Shumpert suffered an apparent back injury with 13:06 remaining in the second half, but after heading to the dressing room for treatment, was back in the game two minutes later.
