### Vanderbilt Opens Road Schedule At Toledo Tuesday Night

The Commodore men's basketball team hits the road for the first time in the 2007-08 campaign when they travel to Mid-American Conference foe Toledo at Savage Hall. Tip time is 6 p.m. CT and can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson on the call. There is no television for the game.

The Rockets and Commodores met last year in Memorial Gym, and in that game, Vanderbilt escaped with a narrow, 98-93 win in overtime on December 2, 2006. Then-freshman Jermaine Beal gave the Commodores the winning margin on a three-point play with 4.4 seconds remaining in overtime after Toledo had led by as many as five with 2:27 to go in overtime.

The Commodores lead the all-time series between the two schools, 3-0, but have never played on the Rockets' home court. Two of the meetings have come in Nashville, and the other came on December 30, 1970, in the Sugar Bowl Tournament in New Orleans, La.

Vanderbilt opened its regular season Saturday evening with an 81-67 win over Ohio Valley Conference favorite Austin Peay at Memorial Gym. VU senior Shan Foster, a preseason All-SEC first team selection by the media and coaches, led three Commodore players in double figures with 21 points on seven made threes, which tied a career high. Senior guard Alex Gordon added 19 points and tied a career high with five three-pointers, and freshman post man A.J. Ogilvy nearly garnered a double-double in his first career game with 18 points and nine rebounds.

The Commodores jumped on the Governors early with an 18-3 run to start the game and held Austin Peay to only one made basket in the opening eight minutes of the contest.

The win pushed Vanderbilt to 89-32 all-time in season openers and 29-3 in openers at Memorial Gym.

## Scouting Toledo

The Toledo Rockets are the defending MAC West regular season champions after finishing the season 19-13 and 14-2 in the Mid-American Conference in 2006-07. The Rockets finished in the postseason NIT and lost to Florida State, 77-61, in the first round in Tallahassee. Top returning player Kashif Payne is out for Toledo after taking a leave of absence from the team for personal reasons. Guard Tyrone Kent picked up the slack for Payne in the season opening, 57-53 win over Missouri State Saturday night when he scored a career-high 27 points, the only Rocket to score in double-digits. Toledo coach Stan Joplin, a former standout player for the Rockets, is in his 12th season and has a 193-136 all-time record.

A driving layup and free throw by guard Jermaine Beal with 4.4 seconds remaining lifted Vanderbilt to a 98-93 overtime victory over Toledo on Saturday night.

The Rockets (2-4) led 92-87 with 2:27 remaining in overtime, but the Commodores (2-3) grabbed the lead at 93-92 with 48.5 seconds left on back-to-back 3-pointers by Derrick Byars and Ross Neltner.

Toledo's attempt to send the game into a second overtime failed when an intentionally missed free throw by Justin Ingram was grabbed by Neltner with 3.6 seconds left.

Forward Derrick Byars led Vanderbilt with a career-high 28 points. Guard Shan Foster added 21 and Neltner scored a career-high 20. Keonta Howell led Toledo with 32 points.

The Commodores trailed 57-49 with 13:34 left in regulation, but slowly narrowed the margin until they took a 70-69 lead with 5:22 left on a bucket by Neltner.

The teams tied four times in the final 3:10 of regulation. Toledo went ahead 84-82 with 52.3 seconds left on a jumper by Howell. Byars sent the game into overtime by making a pair of free throws with 33.3 seconds remaining.

The Rockets appeared to grab control early in the overtime period when Tyrone Kent made two free throws to give Toledo a five-point lead. The Rockets did not score another basket.

## SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Ogilvy Makes Collegiate Debut

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy, from Canberra, Australia, made his collegiate debut Saturday night with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action.

Ogilvy, a 6'10 center, played in the FIBA Under-19 World Championships this summer for his native Australia and averaged 22.3 points and 9.8 rebounds in nine games. He finished third in scoring at the event and posted six double-doubles, including a 32-point, 11-rebound effort against Spain.

Best Start For A Freshman Since...

Ogilvy's 18-point collegiate debut is the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since Phil Cox scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

Ogilvy Named SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance against Austin Peay. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida). In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Vanderbilt Posts 15th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 15th 20-win season in school history with a 99-90 overtime win at South Carolina on Feb. 28. It marked the third 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

Commodores Among Nation's Best Versus Ranked Opponents In 2006-

07

Vanderbilt's six wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation during the regular season in 2006-07. Vanderbilt won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams in 2006-07 -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before losing at top-ranked Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000 campaign.

3-Point Streak Continues In 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 665 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (669#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (576) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and

1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 651-184 (.779) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.
- Vanderbilt has won 90 of its last 96 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 137-13 non-conference record at home (.913 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 70-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition -- detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 -- concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

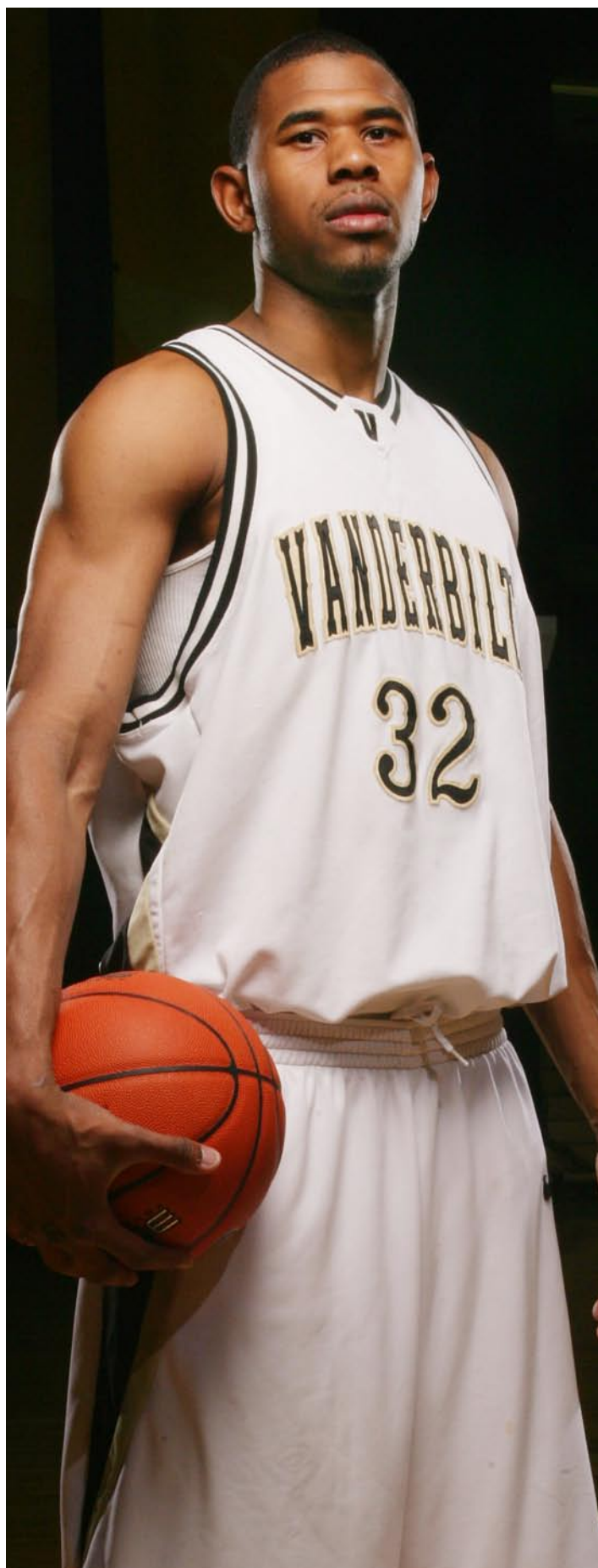

Shan Foster scored 21 points to lead Vanderbilt to an 81-67 victory over Austin Peay in the season opener for both teams.

Foster tied his career-high with seven three-pointers, including three straight in the second half, to help the Commodores lead by as much 18 points.

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Alex Gordon answered for the Commodores, hitting a three-pointer to push the score to 70-59. Vanderbilt led by no less than 10 points the rest of the game.

Gordon added 19 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 18 points and nine rebounds for Vanderbilt. Todd Babington led Austin Peay with 21 points, while Fernandez Lockett recorded 14 points and 12 rebounds.

The Commodores shot 60.0 percent from the field in the second half and 54.5 for the game. The Governors shot only 32.4 percent in the second half and finished at 34.5.

Babington opened the second half with a three-pointer, trimming Vanderbilt's lead to 43-35. Ogilvy scored six straight points inside, keeping the Commodores ahead 49-37.

Moments later, Foster swished three straight treys, pushing the lead to 60-42, the largest of the game.

Vanderbilt raced to an 18-3 lead to open the game, highlighted by two three-pointers by Foster. Austin Peay did not score its second basket until the 10:50 mark.

The Commodores made eight of 15 three-pointers in the first half and 50 percent from the field. The Governors shot 37.5 in the first half.
