What's On Tap

No. 1 Vanderbilt closes out its 11-game home stand this weekend with a three-game series against Xavier starting on Friday at 4 p.m. at Hawkins Field. Saturday's contest is set for a 2 p.m. start, while Sunday's game is at 1 p.m.

Scouting Xavier

Xavier is 1-7 on the year under second year head coach Scott Googins. The Musketeers started the year 0-6 before picking up a 14-9 win over Oakland in the first game of a double-header in Lexington on Tuesday. They then lost the nightcap to Kentucky by a 6-2 count. Offensively, utility man Jordan Wolf leads the team with a .357 batting average to go along with a homer and five RBI. As a team, XU is hitting .234 with 63 strikeouts and 17 walks in eight games.

The Muskeeter rotation for the weekend will be junior righthander Michael Lucas (0-0, 4.91 ERA) on Friday and senior righty Bill Konecny (0-1, 1.50 ERA) on Saturday. The starter for the series finale on Sunday is to be determined.

Commodores Take No. 1 Ranking Into Second Week

The Vanderbilt baseball program achieved a historic milestone on Feb. 19 as *Collegiate Baseball* newspaper ranked the Commodores No. 1 in its weekly poll, a first ever in baseball. This week saw no change as Vanderbilt sat atop the rankings for a second straight week. The publication had VU ranked No. 3 on Feb. 12, besting the previous high of No. 6 set in March of 1973.

The baseball ranking joins women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to postseason play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Several teams have achieved a No. 2 ranking including men's basketball, bowling and men's and women's tennis.

Minor Outstanding In Win Over Austin Peay

Freshman southpaw Mike Minor is staking a claim for a spot in the starting rotation following a stellar performance in the Commodores 8-0 win over Austin Peay on Tuesday. The Lewisburg, Tenn., native struck out eight and walked just one in eight innings of three-hit shutout baseball against the Governors. He picked up his first collegiate win and now sports a team starter best 1.84 ERA to go along with 18 strikeouts and only three walks in 14.2 innings this season.

Commodores Out To Fast Start For Second Time In Three Years

With Tuesday's win over Austin Peay, Vanderbilt moved to 11-0 on the year and is now one win away from matching the best start in school history. VU went 12-0 to open the 2005 season and before that, the previous best was a 10-0 start in 1998. Since Tim Corbin took over, the Commodores have gone 6-4 (2003), 9-1 (2004), 10-0 (2005), 5-5 (2006) and 10-0 (2006) in the first 10 games of the season.

Commodore Tidbits

The team won two one-run games last week, including a ninth-inning rally against Boston College Sunday afternoon ... The team has trailed in seven of 11 games this year ... The team hit .356 for the week with six homers, seven doubles and 42 runs scored ... The pitching staff sported a 4.50 ERA with 50 strikeouts and 10 walks in 36.0 innings. Sophomore Ryan Flaherty led the offensive attack going 8-for-16 with two homers, a double, six runs scored and seven RBI. He hit a two-run walk-off homer with two outs in the bottom of the ninth to lift VU to a 7-6 win over Boston College Sunday afternoon ... After a slow start to the season Dominic de la Osa is heating up. He opened the year 1-for-14 and a .071 batting average. Last week he went 8-for-16 with two homers, four RBI and five runs scored to bump his average up to .314. He carries a seven game hitting streak into this week ... Pedro Alvarez had four hits on Tuesday to bump his season average to a team best .458. He had two doubles, a triple and a single and had two chances to complete the cycle but came up short against APSU ... Two players, Parker Hanks and Kurt Lipton made the most of their opportunity to play. Hanks was 4-for-7 (.571) with two doubles and three RBI in three games, including a start against Boston College. Lipton played in four games, with three starts and went 5-for-10 with two runs scored ... Nick Christiani had the most successful start on the week, pitching six innings of shutout ball against Ball State last Saturday. He allowed four hits and struck out a career high nine to move to 2-0 ... Ace David Price recorded another double digit strikeout performance in a 4-3 win over Pittsburgh on Friday. He allowed three runs on five hits with 10 strikeouts in 5.2 innings to improve to 2-0 on the year ... Closer Casey Weathers struck out all nine batters he faced in three innings of relief (vs. Ohio (2/18), vs. Lipscomb (2/21) and vs. Pittsburgh (2/22). His streak ended when he pitched a second inning against the Panthers when he gave up a hit. On the week he picked up a save against Pitt and a win against Boston College. Weathers has struck out 13 over 7.2 innings this year and has just given up two hits ... Reliever Stephen Shao pitched a career high six innings against Boston College on Sunday. He kept the Eagles at bay after they had scored five runs through the first three innings on starter Brett Jacobson.

Commodore Baseball Gaining National Pub

This week saw the Commodore baseball team featured in a variety of different media outlets. ESPN.com has a feature on Tim Corbin and how he has raised expectations at Vanderbilt and both Baseball America and SEBaseball.com has feature stories on senior closer Casey Weathers. Another national publication is working on a feature on the success of athletics at Vanderbilt and that article should be published in the coming weeks.

National Expectations Highest Ever To Start Season

It started last summer when *Baseball America* tabbed Vanderbilt as one of the early favorites to reach the 2007 College World Series. The early buzz resulted in the Commodores being ranked the highest they have ever been to start the season.

With eight position starters returning along with a veteran pitching staff, Vanderbilt will find out quickly how the team stacks up against some of the premier programs in the country.

Price along with sophomore slugger Pedro Alvarez starred for Team USA last summer and along with head coach Tim Corbin helped guide the squad to a gold medal at the FISU World Championships last August.

Both players are preseason All-Americans and are on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List, recognizing the top player in the country by the College Baseball Foundation.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In addition, the 10 previous finalists for the Clemens Award are also issued ballots. The 2007 award will be presented at a gala dinner next July. The event is administered by the Greater Houston Baseball Association, which has donated more than \$300,000 to the charities from the net proceeds from the first three dinners.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up preseason plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by *Baseball America* and *Rivals.com* this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. *Baseball America* listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

Price is expected to be one of the top picks in this June's amateur draft.

For more information on that you can visit www.vucommodores.com. This season, ISP has joined forces with baseball flagship WNSR 560 AM to broadcast 44 regular season contests. Eric Jones will handle the play-by-play to start the season before handing off to Voice of the Commodores Joe Fisher once the men's basketball season concludes.

Six Commodore games are currently scheduled to be televised this year. College Sports Southeast will broadcast four games, the April 21st game against Tennessee at 6 p.m., the April 29th game against Florida at 1 p.m. and the May 18th and 19th games against LSU at 7 p.m. and noon CT respectively. Fox Sports South will broadcast the South Carolina game on March 31 at 3 p.m. The Sun Network will show the Florida contest on April 28 at 3 p.m.

Head Coach Tim Corbin



In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
