### #4 Seed Vanderbilt Takes On #13 Siena In Tampa In First Round Of Midwest Regional

Vanderbilt, the #4 seed in the Midwest Regional, takes on the MAAC Tournament champion Siena Saints, the #13 seed, Friday evening at 6:20 CST at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla. The game will be televised by CBS, with Tim Brando and Mike Gminksi calling the action, and the contest can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson on the call.

The Commodores are making their second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the second time a VU team has accomplished the feat in the history of the program, with the only other time coming in 1988 and 1989. Last season, Vanderbilt, a #6 seed, advanced to the Sweet 16 for the second time in four years after knocking off George Washington and Washington State in the East Region. The Commodores lost in the regional semifinals to Georgetown, 66-65, on a controversial, Jeff Green layup at Continental Airlines Arena in New Jersey. The Commodores also made the Sweet 16 in 2004.

The 2007-08 edition of the Commodores was a record setter - this year's team reeled off 16 consecutive wins to begin the season, the best start to a Vanderbilt season in the history, won 25 regular season games, which tied the 1992-93 team for the most in program history, and went perfect at home with a 19-0 record, the most single-season wins at Memorial Gym in the 56-year history of the venerable facility. It was the fifth time a Vanderbilt team had gone undefeated at home, and the first time since 1992-93 a team had accomplished the feat. This year's team also set the school records for assists in a season - the 2007-08 team has 594 assists. The previous best was 577 in the 1992-93

Vanderbilt is led by consensus SEC Player of the Year Shan Foster, who averages a league-best 20.5 points per game. The 6'6 wing from Kenner, La., also led the SEC in threes made per game (4.03) and three-point field goal percentage (.473). Freshman center A.J. Ogilvy, a second-team All-SEC selection by SEC coaches, combines with Foster to form the most formidable duo in the Southeastern Conference. Ogilvy averages 17.0 points per contest.

Senior Alex Gordon averages 11.0 points per game, and in the Commodores' last game against Arkansas, he surpassed the 1,000-point barrier with 22 points against the Razorbacks.

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is in his ninth season with the Commodores and has taken the Vanderbilt program to new heights. He posted his fourth 20-win season this year, and also led VU to two Sweet 16 appearances in the last four years. In 30 seasons as a player and coach, his teams have made 25 tournament appearances, including 16 NCAA berths and three Final Fours. Stallings ranks third among the winningest coaches in Vanderbilt history with 170 victories and is only the second coach in Vanderbilt history to register four 20-win seasons (Roy Skinner - six). His players have also been very successful off of the floor - all 18 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree.

Vanderbilt and Siena will meet for the first time Friday in Tampa. The Commodores have a 3-0 record all-time against teams from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, having defeated Iona twice and Manhattan once.

Kevin Stallings has never coached against the Saints in his 15 years as a head coach.

### Scouting Siena

Siena enters Friday's game as the MAAC regular season co-champs and the tournament champions in 2007-08. It will be the Saints' fourth overall appearance in the Big Dance.

Edwin Ubiles leads the Saints in scoring, averaging 17.3 points per contest. Kenny Hasbrouck tallies 15.6 points per game, and Alex Franklin also averages double-digits with 15.2 points per game. Franklin leads Siena on the glass with 8.0 rebounds per game.

Jeff Green squeezed between two defenders, spun and banked in a short, off-balance shot with 2.5 seconds to play as Georgetown earned a 65-66 victory over Vanderbilt in the East Regional semifinals.

The victory was the seventh straight and 18th in 19 games for second-seeded Georgetown (29-6) and put the Hoyas in the regional final for the first time in 11 years.

Vanderbilt (22-12) had one last chance to win the game but a long 3-pointer by Alex Gordon was contested by Green, the Big East player of the year.

The sixth-seeded Commodores had taken a 65-64 lead with 17.9 seconds to play when Dan Cage hit two free throws after being fouled collecting the rebound of a Patrick Ewing Jr.'s missed jumper.

Green started to make a move, fumbled the ball. He recovered, made a turnaround move and banked home the short jumper with two Vandy players trying to stop him. Replays seemed to indicate he may have walked by switching his pivot foot.

Green finished with 15 points for Georgetown, which rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit against the Commodores. Hibbert added 12 points and 10 rebounds -- mostly all in the second half. Freshman Dajuan Summers added 15 points, including three clutch 3-pointers in the second half.

Cage and SEC player of the year Derrick Byars had 17 points apiece to lead Vanderbilt, which was looking to reach the regional final for the second time in school history. Shan Foster added 16 points.

Neither team led by more than four points in the final 17 minutes, which featured eight lead changes and four ties.

With the Hoyas hitting 12-of-26 from the field and Vanderbilt hitting six 3-pointers, the Commodores built a 32-24 halftime lead.

Dan Cage had eight points in an early 18-2 run that gave Vanderbilt an 18-6 edge and a late 3-pointer that helped the Commodores score the final five points of the half.

## SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings owns a 5-4 mark in the NCAA Tournament. He is 4-2 in his third appearance at Vanderbilt (2004, 2007) and 1-2 in two appearances (1997, 1998) during his six-year tenure as head coach at Illinois State from 1994-1999.

Stallings served an assistant under Roy Williams at Kansas from 1989 to 1993, helping lead the Jayhawks to four NCAA appearances (1990-1993) and two Final Four showings (1991 and 1993).

Stallings worked as an assistant to Gene Keady at Purdue from 1983 to 1988 with the Boilermakers making six NCAA Tournament appearances. Stallings played for Keady for three seasons (1980-82), including 1980 when the Boilermakers advanced to the Final Four.

### Vanderbilt's History At The NCAA Tournament

Vanderbilt is making its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and its third appearance in the last five years at the NCAA Tournament. Altogether, this will be the Commodores' 10th trip to the NCAA Tournament in school history. The Commodores have advanced to the regional semifinals in two out of the last four seasons, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference (Florida) and one of 16 teams in the nation to accomplish the feat.

In the 2007 edition of the tournament, Vanderbilt, a #6 seed, knocked off #11 George Washington, 77-44, the most lopsided win by a No. 6 seed over a No. 11 seed at the NCAA Tournament since the field expanded to as many as 64 teams in 1985, and #3 Washington State, 78-74, in a double overtime classic, at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. The Commodores were defeated by #2 Georgetown, 66-65, in the East Regional semifinals at Continental Airlines Arena in East Rutherford, N.J.

Vanderbilt also advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2004 as a No. 6 seed in the Phoenix regionals, defeating No. 11 seed Western Michigan (71-58) and No. 3 seed N.C. State (75-73) in Orlando, Fla. The Commodores then lost to eventual national champion, No. 1 seed Connecticut (73-53) in Phoenix, Ariz.

Vanderbilt is 9-10 all-time at the NCAA Tournament. Since the tournament expanded to at least 64 teams, the Commodores have advanced as far as the regional semifinals four times (1988, 1993, 2004, 2007). Vanderbilt made the regional finals of the 1965 tournament that consisted of a 23-team field.

### NCAA Tournament Tip-Ins

- Vanderbilt's highest seed at the NCAA Tournament was a No. 3 in 1993.
- Highest seeded team Vanderbilt has defeated in NCAA Tournament: No. 2 seed Pittsburgh, 80-74 in overtime (3/20/88).

### Highlights From The Big Dance

- 1965** - Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite Eight before losing to No. 1 ranked Michigan, 87-85. The Vanderbilt-Michigan game featured consensus All-Americans Clyde Lee of Vanderbilt and Cazzie Russell of Michigan.
  - Lee scored 28 points and played the entire second half with four personal fouls.
  - Lee also grabbed 20 rebounds (all-time NCAA single-game high by Commodore) in the loss vs. Michigan.
  - Lee's 24-point, 15-rebound effort led Vanderbilt's overtime win over DePaul, 83-78, to advance to the Michigan game.
  - Lee was named All-South Region Most Outstanding Player while Vanderbilt guard Keith Thomas also earned All-Region honors.

## Vanderbilt At 2008 NCAA Tournament

1974 - Vanderbilt hits 21 of 22 free throws in loss vs. Marquette (61-69, March 16) - tied for sixth best single-game performance in NCAA Tournament.

• Vanderbilt's Jeff Fosnes was named All-South Region Team.

1988 - Led by All-SEC center Will Perdue, Vanderbilt advanced to the Sweet 16 behind the shooting touch of junior guard Barry Goheen. Seeded No. 7, Vanderbilt defeated No. 10 Utah State in the first round to meet No. 2 seeded Pittsburgh. With the Commodores trailing by three in the closing seconds, Goheen launched a 25-footer at the buzzer to send the game into overtime. Goheen helped clinch the victory with four free throws and an assist in overtime.

• National Player of the Year Danny Manning scored 38 points to lead eventual national champion Kansas over the Commodores.

1993 - While advancing to the second Sweet 16, Commodore guard Ronnie McMahan puts on a 3-point shooting exhibition, hitting 13 of 19 (68.4 percent). It ranks as the eighth best performance ever in NCAA tournament history.

• As a team, the Commodores hit 47.1 percent of their 3-point attempts (32-68), tied as fifth best team effort in NCAA tournament history.

• Guard Billy McCaffrey puts on a show for the Commodores in 85-68 victory over No. 6 seeded Illinois. McCaffrey sets Commodore single-game NCAA mark with 29 points in the victory.

**2004** – In one of its most memorable NCAA Tournament games in recent history, Vanderbilt overcame an 11-point deficit with 3:45 remaining as Commodore all-time leading scorer Matt Freije poured 31 points, including 11 in the final 3:28 to help Vanderbilt rally for a 75-73 second-round win over N.C. State. Mario Moore hit Corey Smith with a backdoor pass that Smith converted for a conventional three-point play with 23 seconds remaining to help seal the victory.

**2007** – Vanderbilt dropped a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to #2 seed Georgetown in the East Regional semifinals on March 23 behind a controversial, acrobatic layup by Hoya star Jeff Green with 2.5 seconds remaining in regulation. The Commodores knocked off #11 George Washington, 77-44, in the first round, and defeated Washington State, 78-74, in double overtime at ARCO Arena in what many consider the best game of the 2007 tournament. Derrick Byars made five three-pointers in the second half to lead Vanderbilt to victory.

### Vanderbilt Versus Other Teams In Pod

#### Vanderbilt all-time vs. Clemson (Atlantic Coast)

The Commodores lead the all-time series 8-5, though the two teams have not met since the 1993-94 campaign... In the last meeting, Vanderbilt took a 89-74 decision on March 23, 1994, behind Billy McCaffrey's 27 points. The game, played in Nashville, was a second round NIT matchup. Two games later, the Commodores eventually played in the NIT championship, losing to Villanova, Vanderbilt's other potential second round opponent in the 2008 NCAA tournament, by a 80-73 margin in Madison Square Garden. Vanderbilt leads the Clemson series 4-2 in games played in Nashville. The Commodores are 2-3 overall in games played at Clemson, and 2-0 in games played at neutral sites... The Commodores and Tigers faced off in 1982 Great Alaska Shootout, with Vanderbilt claiming a 72-53 victory on Nov. 27, 1982... Kevin Stallings has never coached against Clemson... The Commodores are 74-71 all-time vs. current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

#### Vanderbilt all-time vs. Villanova (Big East)

The Commodores are 0-1 all-time vs. the Villanova Wildcats... That meeting, on March 30, 1994, came in the NIT Championship at Madison Square Garden. In that meeting, Commodore sophomore point guard Frank Seckar scored a career-high 30 points, but the Wildcats prevailed 80-73. Two games before the championship in New York City, Vanderbilt topped Clemson 89-74 in a NIT quarterfinal matchup in Nashville... Kevin Stallings has never coached against Villanova, but is 1-0 all-time vs. Wildcat Head Coach Jay Wright (a 74-46 Vanderbilt victory over Wright's Hofstra squad in Memorial Gym on Dec. 7, 1999)... The Commodores are 21-36 all-time vs. current members of the Big East Conference.

## 2007-08 Regular Season At A Glance

### 'Dores Win 20

With the win over South Carolina, Vanderbilt reached the 20-win plateau for the 16th time in the program's history, and it marked the quickest a Commodore team has gotten to 20 wins. The 1973-74 SEC championship team held the previous record, getting their 20th win on February 16. This year's team got its 20th win in 24 games, but the 1973-74 team got to 20 wins in only 21 contests.

Combined with last year's 22-12 finish, this marks the fifth time Vanderbilt has had consecutive 20-win seasons. Previously, the Commodores put up four straight years with 20 wins or more (1964-65 through 1967-68), then had back-to-back 20-win campaigns in 1972-73 and '73-74, 1992-93 and '93-94 and 2003-04 and '04-05.

### Regular Season Wins

The 2007-08 edition of the Commodores has won 25 regular season games, the most of the Stallings era and tied for the most single-season wins in Vanderbilt history (1992-93 team).

### Back-to-Back Winning SEC Seasons

With the win over Mississippi State, Vanderbilt reached the ten-win mark in SEC play, making it the first time Vanderbilt has had two consecutive over .500 records in conference play since the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons, and the first time since 1987-88 and 1988-89 that the Commodores have posted back-to-back 10-win seasons in SEC play.

### Stallings Gets 150th Win As VU Coach, Gets To 20 Wins For Fourth Time

Kevin Stallings got his 150th win as head coach of Vanderbilt after the Commodores' 91-88 win over South Alabama on November 29, and against South Carolina, Stallings passed the 20-win mark for the fourth time in his nine years at Vanderbilt. He's only the third coach in Commodore history to record at least 150 victories, and only legendary VU coach Roy Skinner has had more 20 win seasons (six).

### Dores' Perfect At Home In 2007-08

Vanderbilt finished the year 19-0 at home on the season, the first perfect home season for Vanderbilt since the 1992-93 season and the sixth perfect season in Memorial Gym history. Vanderbilt also registered perfect records at home in the 1955-56, 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1966-67 seasons.. It is also the most single season wins in the history of the 56-year old facility.

### Senior-Laden 'Dores

Vanderbilt is one of only two teams in the SEC (Arkansas) to have at least three seniors averaging over 15.0 minutes per contest. Commodore seniors Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner all average over 15 minutes per game for Vanderbilt.

### VU Goes 16-0 To Start 2007-08

The Commodores' 16-0 start was the best start for a Vanderbilt basketball team in the history of the university. VU has been playing basketball since 1900-01.

### 2007 Calendar Year Ties For Best Ever

Vanderbilt had 26 wins in the 2007 year tied for the most successful calendar years in the history of the program. The 1965 calendar year also saw the Commodores win 26 games.

### Team Three's

Vanderbilt's 299 made 3-pointers this season rank as the second-most in school history behind only the 2006 squad (322).

### Dynamic Duo

Senior Shan Foster and freshman A.J. Ogilvy rank one and seven, respectively, in scoring in the Southeastern Conference as of March 18. Foster pours in 20.5 points per contest, while Ogilvy adds 17.0 points per game, and leads all SEC freshmen. The Foster-Ogilvy combination is the top scoring duo in the Southeastern Conference (37.5 ppg).

### Commodores Ranked For 16 Consecutive Weeks

The Commodores have been ranked for 16 consecutive weeks, a streak that began with the week of December 3rd. Vanderbilt reached its highest point in the rankings on January 7, when VU was 13th in the Associated Press Poll and 12th in the ESPN/USA Today rankings. The 16 consecutive weeks ties a Vanderbilt school record for consecutive weeks ranked in the polls (1965-66, 1973-74 seasons).

### Shan Has Historical Night Vs. Mississippi State

Shan Foster scored 42 points in the Commodores' 86-85 overtime win over Mississippi State on March 5, which tied for the second-most points scored in a game in Vanderbilt history. Bo Wyenandt also scored 42 points against Alabama on February 20, 1967. Foster is the first person to score 40 points in a game since Tom Hagan tallied 44 against Mississippi State on March 8, 1969.

After missing his first six threes in the game, Foster made nine-consecutive triples from behind the arc to bring his career total to 355, which places him third all-time for made field goals in SEC history. The nine threes also equals the school record, set by Mario Moore against Wichita State on March 21, 2005.

The 42-point performance was also the best single-game scoring output in the SEC this season.

### Foster Vanderbilt's All-Time Leading Scorer

Senior Shan Foster poured in 22 points against Arkansas on March 1, vaulting him past Matt Freije (2001-04) as Vanderbilt's all-time scoring leader. Foster now has 1,998 career points.

### Closing In On 2,000 Points

Foster is only two points shy of the 2,000-point barrier after his 14-point game against Alabama. He would be only the 22nd player in SEC history to score 2,000 points.

### Foster Having One Of Vanderbilt's Best Seasons

Shan Foster has 678 points in the 2007-08 season, the second-best single season in Vanderbilt history.

### Shan Foster Now School's Three-Point Made And Attempts Leader

Shan Foster made two threes against South Carolina on January 9, which pushed him into first place in the Vanderbilt annals for three-pointers made in a career. Foster passed VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95), who ended his career with 296 threes. Foster currently has 366 made three pointers in his career. Against Georgia in Athens on February 6, he surpassed McMahan's three-point attempts record of 774 three attempts. Foster now has 867 attempts.

### Shan Sets Single Season Three-Point Mark

With Shan Foster's six three pointers against Tennessee on February 26, he eclipsed the Vanderbilt school record of 103 threes in a season by Frank Seckar (1995-96). He now has 133 made threes on the season.

### Ogilvy Sets Freshman Scoring Record

A.J. Ogilvy tallied 17 points at Alabama on March 8 to overcome Mike Rhodes for the top spot on the freshman single-season scoring list. Rhodes, who scored 507 points in the 1977-78 season. Ogilvy has 560 points in 2007-08.

### Vanderbilt Among Nation's Best In 3-Pt Field Goal Percentage

As of March 16, Vanderbilt is tied for 7th in the nation in 3-point FG % at 40.4%. Shan Foster, at 47.3%, is seventh in the nation in 3-point FG percentage, and 6th in the country in threes made per game (4.0 pg).

## Foster Wins SEC Player Of The Year Award By Coaches and Media, Ogilvy Named To All-SEC Second Team By Coaches

Senior wing Shan Foster was named as the Associated Press Player of the Year for the Southeastern Conference in 2007-08, an award Foster also won from the league's coaches last week. Foster joins former Commodore great Dan Langhi as the only Vanderbilt player to win the award from both the media and the coaches.

Foster, along with Langhi, are the only two Vanderbilt players to win Player of the Year honors from the SEC media.

Senior guard Shan Foster was named the SEC Player of the Year by the league's coaches, joining Derrick Byars as the second consecutive Commodore to win the coaches' vote for Player of the Year. Foster is the fourth Vanderbilt player to win the award, joining Byars, Dan Langhi in 2000, and Will Perdue in 1988. Only LSU (six) and Kentucky (five) have won more SEC Player of the Year award honors from the league's coaches than Vanderbilt (four) since the award's inception in 1987.

Freshman center A.J. Ogilvy, who leads all SEC freshman in scoring at 16.7 points per game, was a unanimous selection to the league's All-Freshman team and was honored on the All-SEC Second Team by the coaches. The 6'11 freshman from Sydney, Australia, has four double-doubles on the year and is one of the league leaders in field goal percentage (4th, 58.2%) and free throw percentage (4th, 78.4%). He also leads all SEC players in free throw attempts with 221 charity stripe appearances, which is also the third-highest single-season total in Vanderbilt history.

## Ogilvy Swatting Shots

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy has 49 blocked shots so far in 2007-08, the fourth-best total in a single season in Vanderbilt history and the most in a season since Chris Woods blocked 50 in the 1994-95 season.

## Ogilvy Gets Fourth Career Double-Double At Alabama

Ogilvy scored 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds at Alabama on March 8, his fourth double-double of the season and his career. The other three came against Lipscomb (26 pts, 10 rebs.), UMass (25 pts, 11 rebs.), and Kentucky (19 pts, 12 rebs.).

## Neltner Rejoins Starting Lineup, Leads 'Dores To Win Over UGA And Kentucky

Senior forward Ross Neltner, who had come off the bench in Vanderbilt's games at Ole Miss and versus Auburn, scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds and sparked Vanderbilt to a 67-59 win at Georgia on February 6. Against the Wildcats, he scored 15 points and grabbed eight rebounds, and single-handedly outscored Kentucky in the first half (13-11). Neltner has only missed three starts in his two year career at Vanderbilt (64 total games).

## Free Throw Shooting Sparks 'Dores

For the season, VU is shooting 73.6% at the line, and the Commodores have shot 75% or better from the free throw line in 15 games this year, and have made 20 or more free throws in seven contests in 2007-08.

## Beal And Bell Get Offense Going

Sophomore Jermaine Beal and freshman Keegan Bell have done an outstanding job for the Commodores at the point guard position so far in 2007-08. Their play is reflected in Vanderbilt's national standing in assists per game, which ranks sixth. Both have combined for a 2.48 to 1 assist to turnover ratio on the year.

## Point Guard Play A Plus

Sophomore point guard Jermaine Beal has raised his level of play this year. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, had 10 assists against one turnover in the two games at the South Padre Invitational, averaged 13.5 points per game, and was named to the All-Tournament team. Beal is also seventh in the Southeastern Conference in free throw percentage at 75.7%, and has scored in double figures in nine games so far this season.

## More On Beal...

From November 24 through December 8 and from January 9 through January 31, Beal dished out five or more assists in at least four consecutive games, the first time that has happened since Atiba Prater accomplished the feat in 2000 [(9) vs. Boston College, 2/6/2000; (7) vs. Mississippi State, 2/9/2000; (5) at Alabama, 2/12/2000; (8) vs. Auburn, 2/16/2000.] Against UMass, the sophomore scored a career-best 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting, with three made threes.

## Dollar Beal

Beal currently has 153 assists on the season, the second-most for a sophomore in Vanderbilt history in the history of the program. All-time Vanderbilt assist leader Atiba Prater holds the single season record for a sophomore with 155 in 1998. Beal currently ranks 1st in assist-to-turnover ratio in all games (3.06).

## Beal Hits Game Winner At South Carolina

With Vanderbilt trailing by one point with six seconds remaining in regulation at South Carolina, Jermaine Beal went coast-to-coast and hit a running, ten footer to give the Commodores the winning two points in a 66-65 win over the Gamecocks on February 9.

## Gordon Contributing For 'Dores

Senior Alex Gordon, who has started in every game this season, is currently ranked in four categories overall in the SEC - 3-point FG % (3rd, .405), 3-point FG made (7th, 2.27/g), and assist-to-turnover ratio (12th, 1.53). In SEC games only, he can be found in the top 30 in 3-point FG made (7th, 2.47/g), 3-point FG % (8th, .394), and minutes played (T-23rd, 32.00). Against Georgia, he scored a season-high 23 points and made a career-high seven three

## A.J. Ogilvy One of Nation's Top Freshmen

6'11 freshman center A.J. Ogilvy is now Vanderbilt's all-time leading freshman scorer.

The Sydney, Australia native has scored 20 or more points 11 times thus far in 2007-08, and has reached double-digits in 31 of his first 33 games as a collegian, and in his last time out against Alabama, he tallied 17 points to overcome Mike Rhodes for the top spot on the freshman single-season scoring list.

Ogilvy is on pace to become the first center to average double-digit points since Greg LaPointe in the 2000-01 season (11.1).

Ogilvy made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action on November 10, the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since **Phil Cox** scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

## Ogilvy Three-Time SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Dec. 31-Jan. 7 for the third time and the second consecutive week when he averaged 20.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. Ogilvy tallied his second double-double of the year with 25 points and 11 rebounds against UMass, with all 11 rebounds coming in the second half. He also won the award for the week of Dec. 24-31 for his 21-point, nine rebound performance against UT Martin and Nov. 5-12 for his play against Austin Peay, when he scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

Freshman Keegan Bell scored 12 points, all on threes, and dished out eight assists against no turnovers in Vanderbilt's 91-85 overtime win at DePaul on December 12. Bell kickstarted Vanderbilt's offense in the second half and propelled the team to the comeback victory. Bell's 95 assists as a freshman puts him in third place on Vanderbilt's single season assist list for freshmen.

## 'Dores Going 90

Vanderbilt scored 90+ points in the three games against Bradley (11/24), South Alabama (11/29), and Georgia Tech (12/1), the first time VU had done that since the 1999-2000 season.

Freshman forward Andre Walker, from Flossmoor, Ill., scored a career-high 10 points in a career-best 25 minutes at Florida on January 27. He also set a career high in field goals (four), field goal attempts (nine), and rebounds (six).

## Metcalfe Plays Career-Best Ball

Senior center Alan Metcalfe scored 18 points off of the bench, a new career high, in the Commodores' 91-85 win over DePaul on December 12. Metcalfe surpassed his career high in points, field goals made, field goal attempts, and three-point field goals made, and tied his career high for three-point field goal attempts and assists against the Blue Demons. For the season, Metcalfe has made 65 field goals, four more than his career total (47) heading into his senior year.

## Darshawn McClellan Has Career Day On Boards

Freshman Darshawn McClellan, from Fresno, Calif., came off the bench against UMass on January 5 and grabbed nine rebounds. McClellan scored ten points against Kentucky and went for eight points and six rebounds against LSU.

## 3-Point Streak Continues In 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 697 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (701) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (599) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

## Two Freshmen Start For Vanderbilt For First Time Since...

Freshman forward Darshawn McClellan and freshman center A.J. Ogilvy were in the starting lineup against Ole Miss, the first time two freshmen had been in the starting lineup since March 23, 2005, when Vanderbilt played Memphis in the postseason NIT. Then-freshmen Shan Foster and DeMarre Carroll started for the Commodores against the Tigers.

## Vanderbilt Captures South Padre Island Invitational Title

The Commodores captured the South Padre Island Invitational title with wins over Utah State and Bradley at the South Padre Convention Center. **Shan Foster** won MVP honors for the tournament, while freshman **A.J. Ogilvy** and sophomore **Jermaine Beal** were named to the All-Tournament team.

Vanderbilt last won a regular season tournament in November of 2000, when the Commodores won the America's Youth Classic, which was held at Memorial Gym. VU defeated South Carolina State, Western Carolina, and St. Joseph's that year.

## Hot At Charity Stripe In South Padre...

The Commodores made 30 of 38 free throw attempts against Iona, the most since Vanderbilt made 28 free throws against Bradley at the South Padre Invitational. Vanderbilt's 28 made free throws against the Braves was the most for a Commodore squad since December 30, 2000, when VU made 29 in a 97-74 loss at Boston College.

## Jamie Graham Joins Basketball Team

5-11 guard Jamie Graham, a member of the Commodore football team, joined the basketball team at the end of the football season and made his first appearance on the floor against UT Martin on December 29. Graham, who redshirted on the gridiron in 2007, played six minutes and had three points, two assists, a rebound and a steal in his Commodore debut. He is the first Vanderbilt football player to play on the basketball team since 1994-95 when Fred Baker played for both squads, and the only athlete in the SEC to compete in both football and basketball in 2007-08.

## Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

David Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an auto-

mated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

## Commodores Sign Two In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that forwards Lance Goulbourne and Steve Tchiengang have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2008.

"We are extremely excited to add Lance and Steve to our program," Stallings said. "Not only do I feel strongly about their playing ability and versatility, but they are the kind of young men we want to have at Vanderbilt. They both come from excellent families and are diligent students."

Goulbourne, from Brooklyn, N.Y., and currently attending The Hun School in Princeton, N.J., is a 6'7, 215 pound small forward averaged 12 points and eight rebounds per game his junior year in 2006-07. He also stood out this summer at the Nike Global Challenge in Beaverton, Oregon, an elite tournament for high school rising seniors where his team went 5-3 against international competition. Goulbourne was ranked 90th by Rivals.com and was rated 18th among small forwards.

"I just felt comfortable there, and my family loved it," Goulbourne said. "It was just one of those feelings that came to me. I just felt like Vanderbilt was where I needed to be. They really have a good program academically and athletically."

Goulbourne chose Vanderbilt over Marquette, Rutgers, Louisville and Notre Dame.

Steve Tchiengang is a 6'9, 235 pound power forward from Montverde Academy in Florida. Originally from Cameroon, Tchiengang is rated No. 81 by Rivals.com and is the 25th best prospect at the power forward position. He chose the Commodores over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

"I felt comfortable that Vanderbilt is the place that God wanted me," Tchiengang said. "The coaching staff did a great job of recruiting me and making me feel wanted. I feel there is a great opportunity there and I get to play in a great Conference. I am very excited."

"We targeted these young men very early in the recruiting process, even before their junior year of high school began," Stallings said. "We are thrilled they have chosen Vanderbilt and feel they will be great additions to our team."

## How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

## Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08. Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

## Vanderbilt Posts 16th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 16th 20-win season in school history with a thrilling, 66-65, win over South Carolina on February 9. It marked the fourth 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

## Shan Has Historical Night Vs. Mississippi State

Shan Foster scored 42 points in the Commodores' 86-85 overtime win over Mississippi State on March 5, which tied for the second-most points scored in a game in Vanderbilt history. Bo Wyenandt also scored 42 points against Alabama on February 20, 1967. Foster is the first person to score 40 points in a game since Tom Hagan tallied 44 against Mississippi State on March 8, 1969.

After missing his first six threes in the game, Foster made nine-consecutive triples from behind the arc to bring his career total to 355, which places him third all-time for made field goals in SEC history. The nine threes also equals the school record, set by Mario Moore against Wichita State on March 21, 2005.

The 42-point performance was also the best single-game scoring output in the SEC this season.

## Foster Vanderbilt's All-Time Leading Scorer

Senior Shan Foster poured in 22 points against Arkansas on March 1, vaulting him past Matt Freije (2001-04) as Vanderbilt's all-time scoring leader. Foster now has 1,998 career points.

## Closing In On 2,000 Points

Foster is only 2 points shy of the 2,000-point barrier after his 14-point performance against Arkansas in the SEC Tournament. He would be only the 22nd player in SEC history to score 2,000 points.

## Shan Foster Now School's Three-Point Made And Attempts Leader

Shan Foster made two threes against South Carolina on January 9, which pushed him into first place in the Vanderbilt annals for three-pointers made in a career. Foster passed VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95), who ended his career with 296 threes. Foster currently has 366 made three pointers in his career. Against Georgia in Athens on February 6, he surpassed McMahan's three-point attempts record of 774 three attempts. Foster now has 867 attempts.

## Shan Sets Single Season Three-Point Mark

With Shan Foster's six three pointers against Tennessee on February 26, he eclipsed the Vanderbilt school record of 103 threes in a season by Frank Seckar (1995-96). He now has 133 made threes on the season.

## Foster Named SEC Player of the Week For Fourth Time In 2007-08

Foster became the first Vanderbilt player to win four SEC Player of the Week awards in one season and the first SEC player ever to accomplish the feat when he was named the SEC's Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 3-10 (Marcus Thornton, LSU). Foster won the honor after averaging 31.5 points per game in a win over Mississippi State and a loss to Alabama. Foster started the week with a 42-point performance when he hit his last nine 3-point attempts including the game-winner with 2.7 seconds left in an 86-85 overtime win over Mississippi State on Wednesday. He also finished with 21 points against Alabama after managing just five in the first half. He also won Player of the Week honors for his play against Iona, Rice, and UMass for the week of December 31-January 6, when he averaged 25.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, and 2.7 assists per game in three games. Foster was also named the SEC Player of the Week for his play against South Alabama and Georgia Tech November 27-Dec. 3 when he averaged 21.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game and for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13.

## Foster To Make 122nd Start Vs. Siena

Senior Shan Foster will play in his 132nd game as a Vanderbilt Commodore this Friday vs. Siena, and will make his 122nd career start. Senior Alex Gordon will also be playing in his 132nd career game. Foster and Gordon have played in more games than any other Vanderbilt player in program history.

Foster, the lone SEC representative, joins D.J. Augustin (Texas), Michael Beasley (Kansas State), Chris Douglas-Roberts (Memphis), Tyler Hansbrough (North Carolina), Luke Harangody (Notre Dame), Robbie Hummel (Purdue), Kevin Love (UCLA), A.J. Price (Connecticut), and D.J. White (Indiana) on the 10-man squad.

The Oscar Robertson Trophy is awarded to the USBWA's Player of the Year. It is the nation's oldest award and the only one named after a former player. The legendary Oscar Robertson was the USBWA's first player of the year in 1959. The USBWA renamed its player of the year award the Oscar Robertson Trophy in 1998.

Darian Townes and Gary Ervin each scored 18 points and Arkansas defeated Vanderbilt (No. 17 ESPN/USA Today, No. 18 AP) 81-75 to advance to the Southeastern Conference tournament semifinals.

The Razorbacks (21-10) rolled to a 45-24 rebounding edge and outscored the Commodores 50-20 in the paint.

Townes and Sonny Weems each had five offensive rebounds; Vanderbilt had only six.

Vanderbilt couldn't overcome the Razorbacks' advantage inside, especially with SEC scoring leader Shan Foster scoring only 14 points, six below his average.

Alex Gordon led Vanderbilt (26-7) with 22 points. He had two 3-pointers and another long jumper in the final minute.

Foster was only 4-of-10 from the field.

The Commodores rallied to tie it twice in the second half, the last time at 58-58 on a 3-pointer by Gordon. But Ervin answered with back-to-back baskets, including a 3.

The Razorbacks made 10 of 12 free throws in the final minute after making only 3-of-7 in the first half. They finished 19-of-28 from the line for the game.

Charles Thomas finished with 13 points for Arkansas, which has won eight of the last nine in the series, including a home win over Vanderbilt on March 1. Arkansas also beat Vanderbilt in last year's quarterfinals.

Patrick Beverley and Stefan Welsh had 11 points apiece for the Razorbacks.

Vanderbilt had nine field goals in the first half but stayed close by making 16 of 19 free throws. Arkansas led 40-36 at the break on the strength of its 28-12 advantage in the paint.

## Notes From Vanderbilt's Last Time Out Vs. Arkansas

### Vanderbilt Team Notes:

- Vanderbilt falls to 26-7 on the season.
- The Commodores failed to make it out of the quarterfinal round of the SEC tournament for the fourth consecutive year. Head coach Kevin Stallings' only appearance in the SEC semifinals came in the 2004 season.
- Arkansas outrebounded Vanderbilt, 45-23, in the deciding statistic of the game, which resulted in 18 more shot opportunities for the Razorbacks (63-45).
- Vanderbilt held Arkansas' two top scorers, Sonny Weems and Patrick Beverley, to a combined 14 points in the game.
- The Commodores are 10-6 when outrebounded by their opponent.
- Vanderbilt now owns a 29-46 all-time mark at the SEC Tournament.

### Vanderbilt Individual Notes:

- Senior Alex Gordon went over the 1,000-point plateau, the 38th player in Vanderbilt history to do so, with a 22-point performance against Arkansas.
- Senior swingman Shan Foster scored 14 points, and is only two points away from the 2,000 point barrier. He would be the 22nd SEC player in history to eclipse the mark. He also has 678 points in his senior season, which is the most ever for a senior player in a year (previous best was Dan Langhi in 2000 with 664) and the second-best season in the Vanderbilt annals. Foster only trails Billy McCaffrey, who scored 699 points as a junior in 1991.
- Sophomore Jermaine Beal dished out three assists against no turnovers against Arkansas. For the tournament, he had 10 assists and no turnovers.

## Quotes Last Time Out Vs. Arkansas

### Q & A With Vanderbilt Head Coach Kevin Stallings:

**Q. Can you just talk about Shan's game today, not a typical game for him, and what Arkansas was doing you thought made it tough on him?**

**COACH KS:** Williams is a good defender and he's got good size and good strength. So he just he had a lot of help. I think that they were he had a lot of help, and again, their presence at the basket makes everything more difficult. Their athleticism at the goal is one of the deceiving parts about their defense because it's not as easy to get things right at the basket as it is against a lot of teams.

You know, I mean, they did a good job on him. I don't think we can expect Shan Foster to what did he have, 25 over in Fayetteville? I don't think we can expect him to be superman every night. He is most nights, but he can't be superman every night.

**Q. Your team played great defense today when you hold Sonny Williams and Patrick Beverley to a combined ten points. Did you think you would walk out with a loss?**

**COACH KS:** I wouldn't have thought we would have lost, but our first shot at defense was okay but it doesn't count if you don't get the rebound. We were able to get them to miss, but when you allow them to rebound the ball, then they get a second try and a third try and a fourth try, and eventually they're going to score or get fouled. I wouldn't go so far as to say that our defense was good. It was probably okay, but our rebounding effort was pathetic. And that's my fault.

**Q. Losing to Arkansas four times the past two years, what is it specifically that gives you guys problems?**

**COACH Kevin Stallings:** I think their length and their athleticism. How athletic they are in the perimeter. We don't do a good job of guarding Ervin, and he's hurt us in just about every game. I think that's it more than anything else.

**Q. As disappointed as you sound right now, do you have any hope that you guys can make another run in the next tournament?**

**COACH KS:** There's always hope. I'll feel better after we practice. I always do. We just need to get to practice and work on some things.

Yeah, I like our chances in the NCAA Tournament, quite honestly. But again, it's all about match ups and who you draw and how you fit against how they fit. So we'll just see what happens on Sunday, and then we'll go about our business.

**Q. You mentioned Gary Ervin, he had a pretty solid game all around. I was wondering what you thought of his game. Also Arkansas free throw shooting hasn't been one of their strengths and they knocked them down pretty good the last few minutes. Could you comment on that?**

**COACH KS:** They seemed to play with a confidence against us that you don't see when they play some other teams. So maybe the basket looks bigger to them when they play us.

**Q. Could you talk about Gary Ervin's game overall?**

**COACH KS:** Pretty efficient. He scored 18 points, took seven shots. That's usually a pretty good sign. A little better than he played in the last game against Auburn.

## Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952



### Historic Memorial Gymnasium Concludes 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium concluded its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season and the venerable old facility saw its most successful season in 2007-08. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10, 2007, in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 668-184 (.784) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0, marking the 21st time in the past 22 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games. It also marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 100 of its last 106 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 147-13 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 80-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

- Stallings has posted just one losing season in 30 seasons as a player and coach.
- Stallings ranks third among the winningest coaches in Vanderbilt history with 170 victories.

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Alex Gordon answered for the Commodores, hitting a three-pointer to push the score to 70-59. Vanderbilt led by no less than 10 points the rest of the game.

VU's lead, which had ballooned to as many as 24 with 1:33 to go in the first half, quickly evaporated in the second half, as the Braves chipped away at Vanderbilt's lead, and closed the gap to one point with 2:40 to play on a Theron Wilson layup to make the score 85-84 in favor of the Commodores.

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84. VU made their last eight free throws of the game to keep the Braves at bay.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

Shan Foster and A.J. Ogilvy nearly beat Wake Forest by themselves.

Foster tied a season-high with 26 points, and Ogilvy tied a career-high with 23 points to give Vanderbilt (No. 25 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) an 83-80 win over Wake Forest.

Ogilvy made a hook shot with 30 seconds left, and Foster's late 3-point shooting sealed the game and kept the Commodores unbeaten.

The duo has scored in double digits every game this season for Vanderbilt (8-0), which is off to its best start since the 2003-2004 season -- when they reached the regional semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

Harvey Hale and James Johnson led Wake Forest with 18 points apiece, but late fouls cost Wake Forest.

Johnson put the Demon Deacons (5-2) ahead 78-76 with 1:45 to play for their first lead since 5-4. Ogilvy then scored six-straight points, and Jermaine Beal hit a free throw to give Vanderbilt its second consecutive win over an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. The Commodores also defeated Georgia Tech 92-79 on Saturday.

Wake Forest kept it close, but couldn't take advantage of some great opportunities in the closing minutes.

Each team was in the bonus the final 11 minutes, but Wake Forest failed to capitalize. The Commodores shot 23-for-27 from the stripe, while the Demon Deacons were just 13-for-20.

Gerald Robinson scored Tennessee State's first 20 points of the second half, including 13 in a span of 2:38, to stake the Tigers to a 55-47 lead. A free throw by LaDarius Weaver made it 56-47 with 11:53 left, giving TSU (3-7) its largest lead of the game.

Vanderbilt stormed back behind strong 3-point shooting, going on an 18-4 run to reclaim the lead. Gordon made consecutive 3s, Keegan Bell added one and Foster sank two to give the Commodores a 65-60 lead with 7:33 remaining.

Five straight points by Tennessee State's Bruce Price, capped by a steal and layup, tied the score at 65 with 7:03 to go.

Gordon answered with a jumper and Ross Neltner scored on a layup, putting Vanderbilt ahead 69-65 with 4:26 remaining. The Commodores would not trail again, and a 3-pointer by Jermaine Beal was the final blow, pushing the Vanderbilt lead to 76-70 with 2:27 left.

The Commodores made five of six free throws in the final 1:13 to help secure the victory.

Vanderbilt shot 57.7 percent from the field in the second half after shooting only 37.9 in the first half. The Commodores made seven of nine 3-pointers in the second half.

Wayne Chism's career-high 18 rebounds -- 11 on defense -- were the most by any Tennessee player since 1996, and his season-high 18 points led No. 6 Tennessee to an 80-60 win over No. 16 Vanderbilt.

Tennessee (15-1, 3-0 SEC) grabbed 43 rebounds and scored 30 points off 22 turnovers, quieting one of the SEC's best shooting teams.

Vanderbilt (16-2, 1-2) entered the game averaging 86 points per game, second only to Tennessee's 86.7. They also were averaging 9.29 3-pointers a game, just behind Tennessee's 9.73.

But the Commodores, who have dropped two straight after a 16-0 start, completed only 3 of their 21 attempts from behind the arc while the Volunteers went 8-for-22 on 3s.

Vanderbilt's 36.8 percent on field goals and 14.3 percent from behind the arc were its worst of the season.

Tennessee went on a 17-6 run to open the second half, ending with a 3-pointer by Chris Lofton to put the Vols up 59-38 with 11:24 left.

Vanderbilt responded with a 15-2 run that ended with Shan Foster's 3 to narrow the gap to 61-53.

But Tyler Smith grabbed a steal and went in for a dunk, and the Vols scored the next three points to stretch the lead to 13. Vanderbilt would get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster sank 14 points and grabbed six rebounds, A.J. Ogilvy had 12 points and Darshawn McClellan also had six rebounds.

The Commodores were 9-for-19 from 3-point range and shot 49.2 percent overall from the field.

Ross Neltner added 16 points for the Commodores (17-2, 2-2 Southeastern Conference), while Jermaine Beal had 10 points and nine assists.

Marcus Thornton had 27 points for the Tigers (7-11, 0-4) and Anthony Randolph added 14 points and 19 rebounds.

Vanderbilt blew the game open at the start the second half. Foster and Gordon swished two 3-pointers each in the first 3:28, pushing the lead to 57-41.

The Commodores led by no less than 16 points the rest of the way and pushed the lead to 23 with 4:47 remaining on a 3-pointer by Gordon.

Freshmen scored 18 of Ole Miss' first 26 points in the pivotal opening minutes of the second half as the Rebels (16-3, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) snapped a two-game losing streak and sent the Commodores (17-4, 2-4) to their fourth loss in five games.

The game was vital for two teams slumping after setting school records for consecutive wins to start the season.

The win snapped a six-game losing streak to Vanderbilt and helps the Rebels remain in the SEC West race behind Mississippi State after a brutal January run that included three ranked opponents.

Another slow start doomed Vanderbilt. The Commodores trailed the Rebels 29-26 at halftime. It was third time in the four losses they failed to reach 30 points in the first half and followed a 22-point loss at Florida where they scored just six points in the first 12 1/2 minutes.

The Rebels, in one of their best defensive efforts of the season, held the Commodores to 32.3 percent shooting in the first half and 34.9 percent overall. Vanderbilt missed 41 shots and 20 3-pointers.

Shan Foster finished with 14 for Vanderbilt and A.J. Ogilvy had 10, but both were held below their season averages for the second straight week. Kenny Williams added 10 points and 10 rebounds for Ole Miss and had a crucial steal and transition dunk with 6 minutes left that helped the Rebels pull away.

Tolbert, who scored a career-high 32 points, tossed in 11 in the first 4:59 of the first half, including three 3-pointers, to cut Vanderbilt's lead to 42-38. Later, a basket by Quan Prowell and a three-point play by Quantez Robertson chopped Vanderbilt's lead to 45-43 with 13:34 remaining.

Foster, the team's leading scorer, came alive after scoring only three points in the first, sinking back-to-back 3-pointers and adding another basket, keeping the Commodores in front 55-47 with 11:08 left.

Ogilvy sparked Vanderbilt to its early lead, scoring 13 points in the first half against Auburn's undersized front-line. The Tigers made only two of their first 16 shots and made eight of 35 (23.1 percent) in the first half.

Beal tossed in a 3-pointer just inside the halfcourt line to beat the halftime buzzer, giving the Commodores their 12-point lead at the break.

Alex Gordon added 17 points for Vanderbilt, while Foster finished with 16.

Alex Gordon scored 14 points to lead Vanderbilt (19-4, 4-4 SEC), including two free throws with 30.3 seconds left that clinched it.

But Neltner was the best player on the court for the Commodores, hitting 6-of-9 from the field in a 13-point performance, grabbing five rebounds, dishing out two assists and coming up with two steals.

Neltner, who started all but one game as a junior and the first 20 games this season, hit a jumper from the wing with 1:57 remaining to stretch Vandy's lead to 63-59. He screamed toward the Vandy bench after the ball went through, hitting nothing but net.

Georgia has trouble winning anywhere. Gaines scored off a follow with 2:33 left to close the gap to 61-59, but that was it for the Bulldogs in their fourth straight loss.

The SEC's lowest-scoring team has gone three straight without even reaching 60 points.

Vandy had four players in double figures. Shan Foster also scored 13 points, and A.J. Ogilvy added 12. But Neltner stood out at the end.

Gaines and Jeremy Price led Georgia with 16 points apiece, but no one else had more than eight.

The Bulldogs shot 44 percent from the field, made only 5-of-17 from 3-point range and were barely above 50 percent (10-of-19) at the foul line.

Down by one with six seconds left, Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings told Jermaine Beal to drive the ball until he was stopped.

No one stepped in front of Beal until he was a few feet away from the basket and his short fadeaway jumper with 0.6 seconds left gave the No. 23 Commodores a 66-65 win over South Carolina.

It was the sophomore's only basket of the game. It was the last of four lead changes in the final two minutes and gave Vanderbilt (20-4, 5-4 Southeastern Conference) its fourth straight win over the Gamecocks. The Commodores have also reached 20 wins faster than any previous Vanderbilt team.

Beal's winning points came after Devan Downey's driving reverse lay-up with six seconds to go put South Carolina (11-11, 3-5) ahead.

Beal made things a lot easier for teammate Andrew Ogilvy, who missed the front ends of 1-in-1s twice in the final minute. The freshman is Vanderbilt's leading free throw shooter at 79.5 percent, but went 1-for-6 on Saturday.

Before Beal's winner, it was Shan Foster who was bailing out the Commodores.

His 3-pointer with 50 seconds to go put Vanderbilt up 64-63.

Foster led Vanderbilt with 21 points, while Ogilvy added 15 points and eight rebounds.

South Carolina was led by Evaldas Baniulis' 19 points. Zam Fredrick added 14 points, but turned the ball over and badly missed a 3-pointer in the final minute.

## 2007-08 Game Recaps and Boxscores

### Game Twenty-Five

**Kentucky ..... 52**  
**vs. Vanderbilt ..... 93**  
**Nashville, Tenn. (Memorial Gym)**

Shan Foster scored 20 points and Andrew Ogilvy added 19 points and 12 rebounds as Vanderbilt handed the NCAA's winningest team its worst league loss ever and one of its worst losses in decades, beating Kentucky 93-52.

Kentucky thought it had fixed the problems that led to a 6-5 start under first-year coach Billy Gillispie, which included an 84-68 loss to Gardner-Webb at Rupp Arena and a 70-51 loss to Indiana that had been the biggest margin in a loss by the Wildcats. They had won five straight, including a victory over Tennessee, before Tuesday's blowout.

The Commodores started a four-game homestand by winning their fourth straight. The only SEC team to open league play with six of their first nine away from home had lost 79-73 in double-overtime at Kentucky on Jan. 12.

It was the worst loss for Kentucky (12-10, 6-3) since losing by 55 to Kansas on Dec. 9, 1989.

Making it sweeter for Vanderbilt? This 41-point margin matched a 52-11 loss to Rose Polytechnic on Feb. 10, 1910, as the fifth-biggest loss in Wildcats' history and their worst loss in SEC history. LSU had a 35-point win over Kentucky, 76-41, on Jan. 18, 1987.

Vanderbilt had never beaten Kentucky by this big a margin. The Commodores' previous best was an 81-51 victory Feb. 8, 1989, and now they have won three straight in Memorial Gym and five of the last six in this series.

Kentucky native Ross Neltner added 15 points for Vanderbilt, and Jermaine Beal had 10.

Joe Crawford had 11 for Kentucky, and Patterson finished with 10.

The Commodores led 41-11 at halftime and led by as much as 43 several times, the first when Ogilvy hit two free throws with 11:36 left at 66-23.

Senior Alex Gordon hit all four free throws over the final 24 seconds, and No. 24 Vanderbilt held off Florida 61-58 to remain undefeated at home this season.

Vanderbilt (22-4, 7-4 Southeastern Conference) now is a perfect 16-0 at home and has won 29 of its last 30 at Memorial Gym dating to last season. The Commodores' fifth straight win moved them into sole possession of third place in the SEC's Eastern Division.

This win also was the 1,400th in school history against 999 losses.

Coach Kevin Stallings was happy to take the win following their 41-point victory against Kentucky earlier in the week, especially with his Commodores not scoring a field goal after Andre Walker's 3 with 7:14 left. They did finish 9-of-10 at the line.

Florida (19-7, 6-5) had every reason to feel comfortable here, having won four of the last six on this floor. The Gators led 58-57 with 54 seconds left but didn't score again in losing for the fourth time in five games.

Shan Foster led Vanderbilt with 19 points. Gordon, whose two free throws with 24 seconds to go put VU ahead to stay, finished with 12. A.J. Ogilvy also had 12 points.

Nick Calathes and Marreese Speights both had 11 points for Florida, the two-time defending national champion, and Walter Hodge added 10.

The Commodores, who lost 86-64 in Gainesville on Jan. 27, got a little help from Florida's freshmen and a sold-out crowd in sealing the victory.

Florida turned the ball over on a backcourt violation by Calathes, who caught a pass from fellow freshman Jai Lucas with one foot on the wrong side of the mid-court line with 18 seconds left.

Georgia coach Dennis Felton figured it was only a matter of time before Vanderbilt started to click offensively Saturday. His Bulldogs led by one point at halftime but he sensed trouble brewing.

Right on cue, Vanderbilt (No. 16 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) shot 63 percent from the field in the second half and pulled away for an 86-74 victory.

Vanderbilt (23-4, 8-4) extended its winning streak to six games and remained one game behind Kentucky for second place in the Southeastern Conference East Division.

Shan Foster scored 29 points and Alex Gordon added 23 for the Commodores.

Sundiata Gaines had 24 points for Georgia (12-13, 3-9), which led 38-37 at halftime.

The Commodores made 17 of their first 24 shots in the second half to take an 86-68 lead on a 3-pointer by Foster with 4:38 remaining.

Vanderbilt completed a season sweep of Georgia for the first time since the 1999-2000 season.

Gordon hit four 3-pointers in the first half as the Commodores took an eight-point lead. But for the half, Vanderbilt shot only 40 percent.

Gaines scored eight points in a span of 2:30 late in the first half to pull the Bulldogs within 34-33. A 3-pointer by Terrance Woodbury with 30 seconds left in the half gave the Bulldogs the 38-37 lead.

Gordon's play was key for Vanderbilt. The senior guard hit a career-high seven 3-pointers and had the most points he's scored in a game since getting 30 against Tennessee as a freshman.

Gordon's 3-pointer with 14:33 left was his sixth in seven attempts and handed the Commodores a 59-47 lead, their largest of the game to that point.

Georgia made a final charge, cutting the lead to 71-62 with 8:42 left on a jumper by Zac Swansey. Vanderbilt answered with a 7-0 run, highlighted by five points from Foster, to finish the Bulldogs.

Shan Foster scored 32 points and Vanderbilt (No. 14 ESPN/USA Today, No. 18 AP) knocked off Tennessee 72-69 on Tuesday night -- a day after the Vols moved into the top spot in the rankings for the first time in school history.

The Vols (25-3, 11-2 Southeastern Conference) beat then-No. 1 Memphis on Saturday night 66-62 on the western edge of Tennessee for their ninth straight victory to earn that spot themselves, then had to travel back to the middle part of the state to defend their top ranking for the first time.

Vanderbilt (24-4, 9-4) has hosted the No. 1 team nine times in its 56 years at Memorial Gym, and the Commodores improved to 6-3 overall in those games with victories in the past four, including then-No. 1 Florida last year. The Commodores also now have won all 18 home games this season and 31 of their last 32.

Jermaine Beal added 17 points and Alex Gordon 11 as Vanderbilt won its seventh straight.

Chris Lofton tied Tennessee with 25 points. Tyler Smith, playing with the flu, had 11 points and a career-high 17 rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 31-28 at the break after nearly blowing a 14-point lead in the opening half. The teams swapped the lead four times with three ties before Alan Metcalfe's 3-pointer broke a 43-all tie with 14:20 left, and Vanderbilt never trailed again.

Tennessee stayed close enough to keep sending Vanderbilt to the free-throw line and pulled within 72-69 on Chism's dunk with 7.5 seconds.

But Ross Neltner got the ball past the Vols' pressing defense, Foster threw it upcourt to Keegan Bell. The Vols fouled him with 1.8 seconds left, and he missed both attempts. But a late throw at the basket went deep into the seats after the buzzer.

Sonny Weems scored 20 points to lead three Arkansas players in double figures to lead the Razorbacks to a 78-73 win over Vanderbilt in SEC action at Bud Walton Arena in Fayetteville.

Shan Foster scored 22 points to become Vanderbilt's career scoring leader. Foster made six 3-pointers and helped keep his team in the game down the stretch. With Arkansas up 69-65, Foster made a high-arching 3-pointer from the right corner with 1:39 remaining. He later made a contested 3 from the left wing to pull his team within one at 72-71.

Sonny Weems made two free throws with 10.8 seconds remaining to make it 74-71, and Arkansas decided to foul rather than let Foster try another 3-pointer.

Beal's free throws made it 74-73, but Arkansas caught a break when Ross Neltner called timeout. Neltner said coach Kevin Stallings usually saves timeouts for the end -- but that players had been told they had none remaining this time.

Weems made both free throws after the technical, then added two more on the ensuing possession. He finished with 20 points.

Andrew Ogilvy scored 20 points for the Commodores. Neltner finished with 14 points, six rebounds and five turnovers.

The Razorbacks led 70-68 after point guard Gary Ervin made a free throw with 1:27 remaining. Arkansas was then on defense for a full minute as Vandy missed several attempts to tie it. Ervin finally came away with the ball for Arkansas and was fouled with 25 seconds remaining.

Ervin made both free throws to make it 72-68, but Foster's final 3-pointer of the game set up the wild finish. Foster now has 1,895 points. He passed Matt Freije on the school's career list.

Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer Shan Foster had a career-high 42 points and hit his final nine 3-point attempts, the last with 2.7 seconds left in overtime, to help the 16th-ranked Commodores to an 86-85 victory over No. 25 Mississippi State on Wednesday night.

The Senior Night victory allowed Vanderbilt (25-5, 10-5) to finish unbeaten at home this season and kept alive its chances at a first-round bye in the Southeastern Conference tournament next week in Atlanta. The Commodores also matched the 25 wins by the 1992-93 team for most in the regular season.

The Commodores finished 19-0 in Memorial Gym where they have won 32 of 33 games, and coach Kevin Stallings had tears running down his face after Foster's stunning performance.

Jamont Gordon had 24 points for the Bulldogs (20-9, 11-4), who clinched the SEC West title last weekend with a win at Florida. Mississippi State, which had a three-game winning streak snapped, needed a win to have any chance at winning the overall league title.

Andrew Ogilvy had 16 points and Alex Gordon added 14 for Vanderbilt, which trailed most of the game and even through most of overtime.

Charles Rhodes had 22 points for the Bulldogs, while Jarvis Varnardo added 16.

Foster tied for the second-best scoring performance in Vanderbilt history, matching Bo Wyenan's 42 points against Alabama on Feb. 20, 1967. His game-winning shot ensured Foster and his fellow seniors leave as the winningest group in school history with 84 victories.

It didn't look like Foster had the touch as he missed his first six 3s. With 10:43 left in regulation, he finally got going and didn't miss from outside the arc the rest of the way even with at least one defender on each attempt. Foster's 3 with 14.5 seconds left in regulation tied the game at 74.

Gordon, who scored the Bulldogs' final five points of regulation, missed the second free throw with 24.3 seconds left that could have made it a four-point game. He tried to win the game in the final seconds but missed on a drive to the basket, and a final attempt hit off the rim at the buzzer.

In overtime, Ben Hansbrough hit his first shot of the game with 4:21 to go, putting the Bulldogs ahead 77-74.

The Bulldogs led 84-80 with 36.2 seconds left on another 3 by Hansbrough. But Foster, who scored the final eight points for Vanderbilt, answered with a 3 with 29.6 seconds to go. Gordon had to be carried off the court by two teammates following a delay of a few minutes.

Hansbrough hit the first of two free throws with 29.6 seconds left. Needing a 3 to win, the Commodores ran down the clock and got the ball to Foster who hit his ninth and final 3.

Mykal Riley's ill-timed foul helped No. 16 Vanderbilt force overtime. The Alabama senior's three 3-pointers, driving basket and two free throws in the extra 5 minutes more than made up for it.

Riley scored the Crimson Tide's first 13 points of overtime in his final home game, a 78-73 win over the Commodores on Saturday.

The Tide (16-15, 5-11 Southeastern Conference) closed a disappointing regular season with its biggest win while ending Vanderbilt's bid for a second straight overtime win and a No. 2 seed and first-round bye in the SEC tournament.

The loss meant Vanderbilt (25-6, 10-6) remained tied with the 1992-93 team for the school record for regular-season wins.

Shan Foster opened the overtime with a steal and layup to give Vanderbilt a 64-62 lead, but it was all Riley from there. The Tide's only senior who plays finished with 26 points, six 3-pointers and 10 rebounds. He added two free throws with 44 seconds left.

Foster was coming off a 42-point performance when he hit his last nine 3-point attempts including the game-winner with 2.7 seconds left in an 86-85 win over Mississippi State on Wednesday. He finished with 21 points against Alabama after managing just five in the first half.

Gee finished with 16 points for the Tide while Richard Hendrix had 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Ross Neltner scored 13 points for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt trailed by 10 points early in the second half, but then put the clamps on Alabama's shooters. The Commodores used a 16-2 run to build a 48-44 lead, a stretch when the Tide missed 13 consecutive shots.

Alabama started making them after that, while Vanderbilt shot just 38 percent and made 7-of-25 3s.

A.J. Ogilvy handled things on the inside. Shan Foster took care of the outside. It proved to be a devastating 1-2 punch for Vanderbilt.

Ogilvy, a lumbering freshman from Australia, scored a career-best 27 points and Foster was right behind with 26, leading the Commodores (No. 17 ESPN/USA Today, No. 18 AP) past Auburn 93-82 in the opening round of the Southeastern Conference tournament Thursday.

Vanderbilt (26-6) shot 67 percent (33 of 49) from the field, falling just short of the tournament record. The Commodores advanced to face Arkansas in the quarterfinals Friday.

Ogilvy, a 6-foot-11 center who towered over the Tigers, teamed with Foster to provide an unstoppable inside-outside punch for the Commodores. The big man made 12 of 13 shots, nearly all of them gimmes after he got loose underneath. He did step out to hit one long jumper with his foot on the 3-point line.

Foster, the SEC's top scorer and named player of the year by the league's coaches earlier in the week, handled most of the outside shooting. The 6-6 senior connected on 6 of 9 from beyond the arc to add another notch to his brilliant season, giving him at least 20 points in six straight games and 19 overall.

Vanderbilt built a double-digit lead 5 1/2 minutes into the game, and was comfortably out front most of the first half with the Big Two leading the way. Foster had 19 points and Ogilvy 14 by halftime.

The Commodores shot 76 percent in the first half and trailed off just a bit over the final 20 minutes.

1Rasheem Barrett scored 20 points to lead four Auburn players in double figures. Senior Frank Barrett chipped in with 17 before fouling out of his final college game with less than a minute to go.

Darian Townes and Gary Ervin each scored 18 points and Arkansas defeated Vanderbilt (No. 17 ESPN/USA Today, No. 18 AP) 81-75 to advance to the Southeastern Conference tournament semifinals.

The Razorbacks (21-10) rolled to a 45-24 rebounding edge and outscored the Commodores 50-20 in the paint.

Townes and Sonny Weems each had five offensive rebounds; Vanderbilt had only six.

Vanderbilt couldn't overcome the Razorbacks' advantage inside, especially with SEC scoring leader Shan Foster scoring only 14 points, six below his average.

Alex Gordon led Vanderbilt (26-7) with 22 points. He had two 3-pointers and another long jumper in the final minute. Foster was only 4-of-10 from the field.

The Commodores rallied to tie it twice in the second half, the last time at 58-58 on a 3-pointer by Gordon. But Ervin answered with back-to-back baskets, including a 3.

The Razorbacks made 10 of 12 free throws in the final minute after making only 3-of-7 in the first half. They finished 19-of-28 from the line for the game.

Charles Thomas finished with 13 points for Arkansas, which has won eight of the last nine in the series, including a home win over Vanderbilt on March 1. Arkansas also beat Vanderbilt in last year's quarterfinals.

Patrick Beverley and Stefan Welsh had 11 points apiece for the Razorbacks.

Vanderbilt had nine field goals in the first half but stayed close by making 16 of 19 free throws. Arkansas led 40-36 at the break on the strength of its 28-12 advantage in the paint.
