MIAMI REDHAWKS (0-0; 0-0 MAC EAST; 0-0 MAC) VANDERBILT COMMODORES (0-0; 0-0 SEC)

THE COACHES

MIAMI HEAD COACH SHANE MONTGOMERY (North Carolina State, '90) is in his fourth season at the helm of the Miami program, owning a 15-21 record ... Montgomery led the RedHawks to a share of the MAC East Division title and the MAC Championship game last season and also guided Miami to a share of the East Division crown in his first season (2005) ... also serves as the offensive coordinator and has since 2001.

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH BOBBY JOHNSON (Clemson, '73) is in his seventh season guiding the Vanderbilt Commodores and owns an 80-86 record at the helm of the program ... prior to assuming his present post, Johnson was the head coach at Furman where he was named the Division 1-AA National Coach of the Year in 2001.

QUICK HITS

- Historically, Miami has been solid in season openers. Since its first game in 1888, the Red and White has posted a 79-34-6 (.689) record in season openers.
- Senior defensive back **ROBBIE WILSON**, senior offensive guard **DAVE DiFRANCO** and senior linebacker **JOEY HUDSON** have been elected by their teammates as Miami's 2008 captains.
- Seniors **CLAYTON MULLINS** and **JOEY HUDSON**, and junior **CALEB BOSTIC** are all included on the Butkus Award Watch List. It is the first time in the 24-year history of the Butkus Award that one school has had all three of its linebackers named.
- Miami University is honoring members of its famed "Cradle of Coaches" at its home games in 2008. The man being honored at the season opener is **PAUL BROWN**, NFL Hall of Famer and a 1930 Miami University graduate. Sept. 7 will mark the 100th anniversary of his birth (9/7/1908).

MIAMI VS. VANDERBILT—AUG. 28, 2008

SERIES NOTES

- Miami and Vanderbilt meet for the fourth time in series history. The Commodores make their first trip to Oxford, Ohio, as all three previous meetings have been at Vanderbilt.
- In the last meeting, Miami held 10-7 and 13-10 leads, but a Vanderbilt touchdown late in the third quarter put the Commodores up for good, while tacking on an insurance TD late in the fourth quarter to secure the 24-13 win.
- The first series meeting came on Oct. 13, 1899, with Vanderbilt recording a 12-0 win.
- When Miami picked up its lone win in the series in 2000, Miami assistant coach Mike Bath was a senior at Miami and the RedHawks' starting quarterback, wide receiver coach Brian Von Bergen was in his second season as an assistant coach on the Miami staff, and Miami Athletics Director Brad Bates was a senior associate athletics director at Vanderbilt. Bath threw the game-winning touchdown pass to Cal Murray with 20 seconds remaining to lift Miami to a 33-30 win in the season opener for both teams.

A 39-yard field goal by place kicker Nathan Parseghian gave Miami a 13-10 lead with 10:20 remaining in the third quarter, but Vanderbilt touchdowns in the third and fourth quarters lifted the Commodores to a 24-13 win ... Jamal Rogers' 40-yard TD reception was his first career touchdown and the longest reception of his career ... Miami caused turnovers on three consecutive Vanderbilt possessions—Jordan Gafford had an interception in the end zone, Martin Channels recovered a fumble and Brandon Stephens recovered a fumble on Commodore kickoff return ... Sean Redwine also recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter ... Daniel Raudabaugh racked up 212 passing yards, completing 18-of-37 attempts ... it was his third straight game with 200 or more yards passing and his fifth game eclipsing 200 passing yards this season.

NOTES FROM THE CRADLE

FOR STARTERS:

PLEASE NOTE: When referring to Miami, please use either **Miami, Miami University or Miami (Ohio)**. Please do not use **Miami of Ohio or University of Miami, etc.** The latter are not the proper names for our institution. Thank you.

SEASON OPENERS: Historically, Miami has been solid in season openers. Since its first game in 1888, the Red and White has posted a 79-34-6 (.689) record in season openers, including eight wins in the past 12 openers. However, that tempo has slowed recently with the RedHawks dropping four of their last seven season openers—with all four losses coming versus the Big Ten. The last time Miami opened at home was versus Northwestern in 2006. The RedHawks were defeated by the Wildcats, 21-3. Last season, Miami picked up a dramatic 14-13 win at Ball State in its season opener.

FOURTH MEETING BETWEEN REDHAWKS AND COMMODORES: Thursday's game marks only the fourth meeting in the all-time series between Miami and Vanderbilt, with the Commodores leading the series by a 2-1 count. The first three meetings all took place at Vanderbilt. On Sept. 2, 2000, at Vanderbilt Stadium, Miami staged a dramatic come-from-behind win, scoring with 20 seconds remaining to pull out a 33-30 triumph. Miami's current tight ends coach, **MIKE BATH**, was the RedHawk quarterback that day.

BEST MIAMI PERFORMANCES VS. VANDERBILT: In Miami's previous game at Vanderbilt, here are the RedHawks' top individual efforts:

INDIVIDUAL PASSING: Mike Bath, 358 yards (24-48-1-358, 4 TD) ... 9/2/00

INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING: Ty Buxton, 134 yards (8-134, 0 TD) ... 9/2/00; Sly Johnson, 134 yards (6-134, 1 TD) ... 9/2/00

TENNESSEE TIES: Several members of the Miami coaching staff along with members of the athletics staff have ties to the state of Tennessee and to Vanderbilt and its coaching staff. Head Coach **SHANE MONTGOMERY** coached at Tennessee-Chattanooga from 1993-01. He and Miami defensive line coach **RUSTY WRIGHT** coached with Vanderbilt defensive line coach Rick Logo at Chattanooga as Wright is a '96 graduate of Chattanooga and was an assistant from 1996-03 and Logo was an assistant from 1999-02. During the trio's time there, Miami defensive ends coach/co-special teams coordinator **JIMMY LINDSEY** was an all-conference selection for the Mocs and earned his degree in 2001. Lindsey was an assistant coach on the Mocs' staff in 2002 and spent the previous two years as a restricted earnings coach with the program. Both Montgomery and Logo earned degrees from North Carolina State, and Logo was a freshman for the Wolfpack football team during Montgomery's senior campaign. The duo was coached by current Vanderbilt assistants Robbie Caldwell (then an offensive line coach at NC State), Ted Cain (then the offensive coordinator at NC State) and Jimmy Kiser (then a receivers coach at NC State). Miami Athletics Director **BRAD BATES** earned his doctorate from Vanderbilt and spent 17 years on the Commodore athletics staff before being named director of athletics at Miami in 2002. Bates finished his stint at Vanderbilt as a senior associate athletics director. Miami Director of Marketing **ANTHONY AZAMA** was a three-year letter winner and three-time Academic All-SEC honoree at Vanderbilt from 1994-97.

MIAMI TO "WHITE OUT" VANDERBILT: Vanderbilt University and the SEC are visiting Yager Stadium for the first time on Thursday, Aug. 28, and the Miami Athletic Department is calling for a White Out! All Miami alumni, fans, students, faculty and staff are being asked to show their unified support of the RedHawks by wearing white to the game. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

THE REDHAWK CAPTAINS: Senior defensive back **ROBBIE WILSON** (Cincinnati), senior offensive guard **DAVE DiFRANCO** (LaGrange) and senior linebacker **JOEY HUDSON** (Piqua) have been elected by their teammates as Miami's 2008 captains. Hudson becomes only the third player in the modern era of Miami football history to be a two-time captain.

NOTES FROM THE CRADLE

SIZE MATTERS: Offensive linemen once again top the weight charts among Miami football players, averaging 296 pounds per man. That average includes 255-pound lightweight center **STEVE BRAY** (Cincinnati) ... Altogether, eight heavyweights tip the scales at 301 pounds or more, led by 323-pound red-shirt freshman **BRANDON BROOKS** (Milwaukee, WI). Senior line mate **JOSH SATTERTHWAIT** (Roswell, GA) is the second-heaviest RedHawk at 315 pounds. The heaviest defensive player—third among all players—is junior nose tackle **MARTIN CHANNELS** (Xenia) at 314 pounds ... After offensive linemen, defensive linemen average 272 pounds a man, followed by tight ends (250 avg.), linebackers (230 avg.) and quarterbacks (212 avg.) ... The lightest player at 160 pounds is sophomore receiver/kick returner **JAMAL ROGERS** (Ft. Myers, FL). Freshmen defensive backs **D.J. BROWN** (West Chester) and **BRIAN SUTHERLAND** (Smyrna, GA) are right behind Rogers at 167 and 168 pounds, respectively ... The heaviest tight end is 280-pound sophomore **RHYS NEWSMAN** (Oxford) ... The heaviest linebackers are **JOEY HUDSON** and **CLAYTON MULLINS** (Fairborn) at 236 and 235 pounds, respectively. The third member of the Butkus Watch List trio, **CALEB BOSTIC** (Galloway), weighs in at 231 pounds ... The heaviest quarterbacks are **CLAY BELTON** (Dayton) at 224 and **DANIEL RAUDABAUGH** (Coppell, TX) at 223 ... The players who have put on the most weight since camp began are freshman offensive lineman **NICK KEMPER** (Winter Springs, FL) (nine pounds, 269 to 278) and redshirt freshman tight end **KENDRICK BRUTON** (Miamisburg) (nine pounds, 234 to 243) ... The man who's lost the most weight since checking in on August 2 is senior offensive lineman **DAVE DIFRANCO** (12 pounds, 322 to a svelte 310).

PASSING FANCY: On Nov. 11, 1989, **SHANE MONTGOMERY** was the quarterback for a North Carolina State team that still holds the NCAA record for most consecutive passes attempted without a rushing play. In the third and fourth quarters against Duke, Montgomery attempted 32 consecutive passes, completing 16.

OHIO NATIVES: Sixty-three of Miami's 105 players hail from the state of Ohio.

MIAMI'S OFFENSE:

QUARTERBACKS: **DANIEL RAUDABAUGH** will be the starter vs. Vanderbilt. Last season in Nashville, he completed 18-of-37 passes for 212 yards and one touchdown pass. Raudabaugh passed for 2,431 yards in 2007, the eighth-best single-season yardage total in Miami history. Over two seasons, he has amassed 2,721 yards, just 279 yards shy of becoming the 11th QB in Miami history to reach 3,000 yards. **CLAY BELTON** is listed No. 2 on Miami's depth chart. Belton was a first-team all-Ohio signal-caller at Dayton's Northmont High School. He has not yet appeared in any Miami games. Coach Shane Montgomery indicates that his left-handed redshirt freshman may well see action vs. Vanderbilt.

RECEIVERS: Eleven different RedHawk receivers who caught passes in 2007 return to this year's roster. **EUGENE HARRIS** (So., Atlanta, GA) caught a team-leading 46 passes for 542 yards last season. **DUSTIN WOODS** (Jr., Cincinnati) had a team-leading 603 receiving yards on 40 catches in '07. His two-season total of 1,109 yards is 565 yards short of moving onto Miami's career

top ten. **ARMAND ROBINSON** (So., Reynoldsburg) hauled in 33 passes for 471 yards in his first season of action. Sophomore **CHRIS GIVENS** (Chillicothe) averaged a team-leading 17.2 yards for each of his 25 catches a year ago. Against Minnesota last season, Givens became only the second true freshman receiver in Miami football history to crack the century mark for single-game yardage (five catches for 112 yards). True sophomore **JAMAL ROGERS**, one of Miami's most elusive runners, caught 19 passes for 173 yards in 2007, including a season-long 40-yard TD grab vs. Vanderbilt. **DONOVAN POTTER** (So., Trotwood) made 10 catches for 81 yards, including four for 25 yards in the MAC championship game vs. Central Michigan.

TIGHT ENDS: Among Miami's receivers, three senior tight ends accounted for 31 receptions for 299 yards. **TOM CRABTREE** (Carroll), **JAKE O'CONNELL** (Naples, FL) and **PAT SHEPARD** (Pittsburgh, PA) averaged 9.6 yards per catch.

RUNNING BACKS: Miami's top three runners a year ago—Cory Jones, Austin Sykes and Brandon Murphy—have all graduated, so the job now will be shared by sophomore **THOMAS MERRIWEATHER** (Florissant, MO) and junior **ANDRE BRATTON** (Woodbridge, VA). Merriweather carried the ball 40 times for 143 yards and four touchdowns in 2007, while Bratton had 72 yards on 17 attempts before suffering an injury in game three against Cincinnati. Sophomore **JAMEL MILLER** (Tallmadge) also may see duty against Vanderbilt.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Miami coaches are confident that they have reshaped their reliable 2007 offensive line. Though it will be without a pair of four-time letterwinners in Steve Meister (center) and Charlie Norden (left tackle), veterans will be positioned at four of the five spots on the front wall. The group is led by Third-Team All-MAC left guard **DAVE DIFRANCO** and three-time letterman **STEVE SUTTER** (Sr., Saint Henry). Sutter will move from right tackle, where he started 13 games in 2007, to the all-important left tackle position. Other veterans set for starting positions include **JOSH SATTERTHWAIT** (Sr., Roswell, GA), who moves to center, and **BOB GULLEY** (So., Berea), who will man right tackle. The only non-letterwinner among the front five is giant redshirt freshman **BRANDON BROOKS**, who will start at right guard. Sophomore **NATE WILLIAMS** (Parma) and redshirt freshmen **KEVIN KONCELIK** (Seven Hills) and **KEN STAUDINGER** (Canton) are all expected to see regular playing time this fall. True freshman **ANDREW PHELAN** (West Chester) is the top back-up at left tackle.

BIG BOY: Redshirt freshman **BRANDON BROOKS** will be a starter at offensive right guard. At 6-foot-5 and 323 pounds, Brooks not only leads the team's weight-lifting lists for bench press (435 pounds), squat (635) and power-clean (380), he also ranks among the team's top ten with a 35-inch vertical leap.

NOTES FROM THE CRADLE

MIAMI'S DEFENSE

LINEBACKERS: Defending MAC Defensive Player of the Year **CLAYTON MULLINS**, perennial all-star **JOEY HUDSON** and the talented **CALEB BOSTIC** are the league's best trio and one of the best threesomes in the nation. All three starters were named to the 66-man Butkus Watch List. Add in senior key reserve **CHRIS SHULA** (Cooper City, FL) and true sophomores **RYAN KENNEDY** (Libertyville, IL) and **DAVID DAVIS** (Decatur, GA) as back-ups, and you have got one of the deepest linebacking corps in all of college football. Mullins became Miami's first player to earn MAC Defensive Player of the Year honors since 1999, tying for 10th among all collegiate defenders with 143 tackles and leading the RedHawks in tackles for loss with 13.5. Despite suffering a serious knee injury in game two of 2007, Hudson bounced back to earn Second-Team All-MAC honors for the second consecutive season. After sitting out spring drills due to a foot injury, Bostic has bounced back strong this fall and appears ready to have his best performance yet.

DEFENSIVE LINE: Last season's RedHawk defensive line was a key factor in helping Miami lead the league in quarterback sacks, and three-fourths of those starters return in 2008. Senior left end **JOE CONIGLIO** (Rockford, IL) paced all Miamians a year ago with 6.5 sacks and ranked third with 10.5 tackles for loss. Returning starters **TRAVIS CRAVEN** (Jr., right end, Ft. Wayne, IN) and **MARTIN CHANNELS** (Jr., nose tackle) combined for 10 TFLs and 5.5 sacks in 2007. Sophomore **SEAN REDWINE** (Reading) has been tabbed as the starter at left tackle. Back-ups who all have lettered include **D.J. SVABIK** (Jr., Van Wert), **JORDAN STEVENS** (So., Monroeville, PA), **MARK PAUN** (Jr., Strongsville) and **MORRIS COUNCIL** (So., Decatur, GA).

DEFENSIVE SECONDARY: A total of 16 letters have been won by the starters and back-ups among Miami's returning defensive backs. Veteran cornerback Jerrid Gaines has graduated, but 10 other letterwinners return to the 2008 roster, led by starting safeties **ROBBIE WILSON** (Sr.) and **JORDAN GAFFORD** (Jr., Columbus), plus cornerback **JEFF THOMPSON** (Jr., Worthington). **BRANDON STEPHENS** (So., Strongsville) appears to have edged out **WENDELL BRUNSON** (Jr., Ft. Pierce, FL) at the other cornerback spot. **BEN BENNETT** (So., Capitol Heights, MD), **PERIS EDWARDS** (So., Toledo), **BRYAN ROLAND** (Sr., Detroit, MI), and **DeANDRE GILMORE** (So., St. Louis, MO) provide excellent depth for the RedHawks. Wilson ranked fifth among RedHawk tacklers in 2007 with 75, led the team in pass break-ups (7) and tied for the lead in interceptions (2). Gafford, the team's fourth-leading tackler last season, had 54 solo stops among his 89 total tackles. Thompson, another of Miami's "rocks" in the defensive secondary, totaled 58 tackles at cornerback and accounted for two interceptions.

CRADLE OF LINEBACKERS?: Long known for its title as the "Cradle of Coaches," Miami University may be on the verge of adding another designation—the "Cradle of Linebackers." The Butkus Award, a prize given annually to college football's premier linebacker, announced its 66-man Watch List for 2008, and three RedHawks are among the candidates. Seniors **CLAYTON MULLINS** and **JOEY HUDSON**, and junior **CALEB BOSTIC** are all included on the Watch List. *It is the first time in the 24-year history of the Butkus Award that one school has had all three of its linebackers named.* Ten other schools—Southern California, Ohio State, Notre Dame, California, South Carolina, Texas

Christian, Boston College, Utah State, Kentucky and Stanford—had two of their athletes named to the 2008 Watch List. (NOTE: a 6' by 9' promotional banner featuring the images of Mullins, Hudson and Bostic will be affixed to the east wall of Yager Stadium during the 2008 season.)

AWARD NOMINEE: Senior linebacker **CLAYTON MULLINS** is the reigning Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Year and is on the 2008 Watch List for both the Butkus Award (linebackers) and the Bronko Nagurski Award (top defensive player).

GENETICS: **CHRIS SHULA** is the grandson of former Miami Dolphins head coach Don Shula. Chris's dad, Dave, who was head coach of the Cincinnati Bengals from 1992-96, is expected to attend Thursday's Miami-Vanderbilt game.

MIAMI'S SPECIAL TEAMS

THE SPECIALISTS: Lettermen come back to compete at every specialist position, including senior **JAKE RICHARDSON** (Oxford) at punter, senior **NATHAN PARSEGHIAN** (Sylvania) at placekicker, senior holder **KYLE DECKER** (Granville), sophomore snapper **MIKE RUMMLER** (Cincinnati), sophomore **EUGENE HARRIS** at punt returner, and sophomores **JAMAL ROGERS** and **CHRIS GIVENS** returning kickoffs. Richardson was last season's sixth-leading collegiate punter (45.0 ypp) and is a candidate for the Ray Guy Award in 2008. Parseghian took over full-time duties as placekicker and kickoff man in game six last season. He was the MAC's Special Teams Player of the Week vs. Ohio following his single-game, record-tying five field goals. Harris, Miami's sophomore wide receiver, returned 30 punts for 279 yards last season, ranking third among MAC players in that category. Rogers' 973 kickoff-return yards (43 atts.) smashed Miami's single-season record and is more than halfway toward claiming the school's career record.

PAR FOR THE KICK: Placekicker **NATE PARSEGHIAN** (par-SEE-ghee-un) is the great grand-nephew of former Notre Dame head coach Ara Parseghian. Nate will handle all field goal and PAT duties.

BIG BROTHER WITH A BIG FOOT: Senior punter **JAKE RICHARDSON** finished last year with a 45.0 average, sixth-best in the nation and less than two yards per kick behind the NCAA leader. In late April, Jake's ninth sibling (Grace) was born. Nearly 23 years separate Jake (the oldest Richardson child) from Grace.

MIAMI'S CRADLE OF COACHES

PAUL BROWN TO BE HONORED AT VANDERBILT GAME: Beginning in 2008, Miami University is honoring members of its famed "Cradle of Coaches" at its home games. The man being honored at the season opener is **PAUL BROWN**, NFL Hall of Famer and a 1930 Miami University graduate. Sept. 7 will mark the 100th anniversary of his birth (9/7/1908). Representing the late Mr. Brown at Thursday's Vanderbilt game is his wife, Mary. See more information about Mr. Brown on page 110 of Miami's football media guide.

NOTES FROM THE CRADLE

In Miami's second home game (Charleston Southern), the recently deceased **JOHN PONT** will be honored. **BILL MALLORY** will attend Miami's October 4 game (Temple). **ARA PARSEGHIAN** will be present at the October 25 contest (Kent State), while **BILL ARNSPARGER** will attend the November 11 game (Ball State). **WOODY HAYES** will be honored on November 28 when Miami hosts Ohio. Each of the six legends will be featured on the game tickets and within the game programs.

WALKER AND HOEPPNER TO BE INDUCTED INTO CRADLE OF COACHES ASSOCIATION: Two Miami University football coaching greats will be inducted into the Miami University Cradle of Coaches Association during the RedHawks' football game against Temple on Oct. 4, 2008. Former head coaches **RANDY WALKER** and **TERRY HOEPPNER**, represented by their wives Tammy Walker and Jane Hoepfner, will be the 12th class inducted into the Cradle of Coaches Association, upping the number of inductees to 52. (See the entire list on page 127 of Miami's football media guide.)

WHAT A STRETCH: In succession, from 1949 through 1977, Miami's head football coaches were **WOODY HAYES** (1949-50), **ARA PARSEGHIAN** (1951-55), **JOHN PONT** (1956-62), **BO SCHEMBECHLER** (1963-68), **BILL MALLORY** (1969-73) and **DICK CRUM** (1974-77). As a group, these six men collectively coached for 148 seasons, won 1,003 games, lost 501 games, and tied 35. Their cumulative winning percentage was .663.

FOUR LOSSES TO THE CRADLE OF COACHES IN 22 MONTHS: Within the last 22 months, four members of Miami's Cradle of Coaches have passed away: **RANDY WALKER** (June 29, 2006), **BO SCHEMBECHLER** (Nov. 17, 2006), **TERRY HOEPPNER** (June 19, 2007) and **JOHN PONT** (July 1, 2008).

MIAMI'S FOOTBALL HISTORY AND TRADITION

MAGIC NUMBERS: Three jersey numbers—7, 40 and 42—have been retired at Miami, and these three numbers are featured on the pillars beneath the scoreboard. No. 7, belonging to current Pittsburgh Steelers star **BEN ROESTHLISBERGER**, was retired last October. No. 40 belonged to **BOB HITCHENS** and No. 42 was the property of **JOHN PONT**. A review of all three men is on pages 150 and 151 of Miami's football media guide.

MIAMI FOOTBALL, A TO Z: Several notes about Miami football's most notable legends are featured on pages 110-113 of Miami's football media guide.

TOP-20: In college football history, Miami is tied for 20th nationally in terms of all-time victories with 647. That's more than Arkansas, Army, Florida, Clemson, Navy, Michigan State, Wisconsin, Illinois and 90 other Division I college football teams.

WINNING FORMULA: Miami ranks 13th best in winning percentage among schools that have played 100 or more seasons.

MIAMI WAS A UNIVERSITY BEFORE FLORIDA WAS A STATE: Miami (Ohio) has played 38 more seasons than Miami (Florida) and the RedHawks have 110 more all-time victories than the Hurricanes.

KING OF MAC FOOTBALL: Miami has won more MAC games than any other conference member (258), and its all-time MAC winning percentage of .667 (258-126-11) also leads the way. In its 61st season as a member of the MAC, Miami has won or shared 14 conference titles, more than any other program. The RedHawks have won the MAC East Division title four of the last five years.

MIAMI'S EXCELLENCE IN ACADEMICS

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE: Miami University's student-athletes are performing extraordinarily well in the classroom, and the most-recent class is among the highest in the nation according to the latest Federal Graduation Rates (FGR) report. The recent FGR figures show that 85 percent of Miami's student-athletes who began college in 2000-01 graduated within the six years permitted by the formula, up six points from the year before (1999-00) and a full 20 percent from just three years earlier (1997-98). Only student-athletes receiving athletics aid are included in the NCAA's reports.

GRADUATION RATES: Miami's graduation rates are among the highest nationally, ranking ninth among NCAA Division I public universities and first in Ohio.

BICENTENNIAL: Miami University, the nation's 10th-oldest public university, celebrates its 200th birthday on February 17, 2009.

PUBLIC IVY: In the book *The Public Ivies: America's Flagship Universities*, Miami was named one of 30 schools in the United States that offers "an education comparable to that at Ivy League universities at a fraction of the price."

TOP PUBLIC UNIVERSITY: The 2009 *U.S. News & World Report* college rankings list Miami University 26th among the top public universities in the nation.

RETENTION RATE: Miami's retention rate ranks among the best in the nation, with more than 90 percent of students returning for their sophomore year.

ACCEPTANCE RATE: Miami graduates achieve high acceptance rates to medical and law schools, at least 15 percent higher than the national average.

MIAMI MEANS BUSINESS: *Business Week* magazine ranked Miami among the nation's top 25 undergraduate business programs in the nation for 2007.

CAMPUS BEAUTY: Miami's main campus in Oxford, Ohio, encompasses more than 2,000 acres and, with its distinctive modified Georgian architecture, is widely regarded as one of the most beautiful campuses in America. Walking Miami's campus with its spacious, tree-lined quadrangles and red brick buildings, most would agree with poet Robert Frost's description of Miami as "the prettiest campus there ever was."
