## RICHMOND SPIDERS at VANDERBILT COMMODORES

### QUICK SLANTS

- Richmond begins its fourth season under head coach **Dave Clawson** tonight, playing a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for the fourth consecutive season and seventh time in eight seasons.

- The Spiders blanked Duke in last season's opener, 13-0, in Durham to mark the team's first victory over an FBS opponent since beating Arkansas State in 2000. It also marked Richmond's first triumph over an ACC opponent since beating North Carolina in 1978.

- Richmond and Vanderbilt last met in 2005, with the Commodores winning 37-13 at Vanderbilt Stadium. The first meeting came in 2001 -- a 28-22 Vandy win.

- The Spiders begin their first year of competition in the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007. CAA Football, regarded as one of the nation's top Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) conferences, is comprised of the same 12 teams that played in the Atlantic 10 Conference until last season.

- The Spiders are 1-2 under Clawson in season-openers, beating Duke 13-0 last year, but falling at North Carolina State in 2004 and at home to 15th-ranked Massachusetts in 2005.

### LAST MEETING

Former Commodore (and current Denver Bronco QB) **Jay Cutler** threw for 263 yards and three touchdowns as Vanderbilt improved to 4-0 with a 37-13 victory over Richmond on Sept. 24, 2005. Cutler was 28-of-40 with no interceptions in front of 38,446, then the largest crowd at Vanderbilt Stadium in four years. Former Richmond QB (and current New York Jets FB) **Stacy Tutt** led the way for Richmond with 277 total yards as the Spiders gained 337 yards. Current Spider DL **Sherman Logan** recorded the only two sacks in the game, both on Cutler.

### UP NEXT

The Spiders are on the road for their second of three games to open the 2007 season at Northeastern next Saturday (12:30 p.m. ET). That game marks the CAA Football opener for both.

#### A RICHMOND WIN WOULD

- Give the Spiders a season-opening win for the second-consecutive season and second time since 2000.
- Mark the second time head coach Dave Clawson has opened a season at Richmond with a win.
- Make the Spiders **1-0** on the road this season and **10-8** all-time on the road under Clawson.
- Mark the first win all-time versus Vanderbilt and the first ever over a team from the SEC.
- Move Clawson to **48-46** overall as a head coach and **19-17** at Richmond.
- Mark Richmond's second-consecutive win over an FBS opponent after blanking Duke 13-0 last year.
- Make UR's all-time record **456-594-53**.

#### THE CLAWSON ERA

- Richmond has recorded back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1997-98, and just the second time since 1984-85.
- Richmond has combined to win at least 15 games for the first time in consecutive seasons since 1997-98.
- The Spiders' 621 points over the last two years are the most in back-to-back seasons since scoring 649 from 1984-85.
- Richmond's defense allowed just 430 points over the last two seasons marking the fewest since giving up 391 from 2001-02.
- The Spiders allowed just 199 points in 2006, the fewest since giving up 189 in 2001.
- The Spiders scored 349 points in 2005, the second-most in school history after scoring 358 points in 1984.
- The 2005 Spiders outscored their opponents by a margin of 118 points, the widest margin of victory since 1998 when they outscored the opposition by 146.
- Richmond has combined to garner 8,817 yards of total offense over the past two seasons, marking the most-ever in back-to-back seasons.
- The Spiders' 4,957 yards of total offense in 2005 was the most in school history.
- Richmond's 4,558 passing yards over the last two seasons equal the school record in combined seasons dating back to 1984-85.
- The Spiders' 4,259 rushing yards in the last two years mark the most in back-to-back seasons since rushing for 4,933 from 2001-02.

#### HIGHTOWER, HOWELL NAMED 2007 CAPTAINS

Prior to the team's Spring Game, seniors RB Tim Hightower and DB Stephen Howell were announced as the captains for 2007. It's a team tradition for the players to vote and the captains to be unveiled before taking the field in the annual Spring Game.

#### NEW NAME, SAME GAME

This season marks the inaugural year of the Colonial Athletic Association sponsoring football, assuming control of the football conference after 10 successful seasons under the banner of the Atlantic 10. The membership of CAA Football enjoyed a sensational 2006 campaign in which multiple teams were selected to postseason play for the 16th-straight year, extending the longest active streak in the nation.

The quality and depth of CAA Football is unmatched in the FCS. Ten of the league's 12 teams have made the NCAA playoffs over the past six seasons and at least one team has advanced to the national semifinals in seven of the past 10. National Championships have gone to James Madison (2004), Delaware (2003) and Massachusetts (1998).

Since 1978, then known as the Yankee Conference, CAA Football members have collected 64 playoffs berths, 17 Lambert Cups, 77 final Top 25 rankings and 37 final Top 10 rankings.

Richmond has been among the member schools since 1986 -- tied for the second-longest current stretch with Delaware and behind charter members Maine, UMass, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.

#### FOUR SPIDERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA FOOTBALL

Senior wide receiver Arman Shields and senior offensive lineman Tim Silver represented the Spiders on offense, while senior defensive end Sherman Logan and sophomore cornerback David Horton were defensive honorees. The Spiders' four Preseason All-Conference selections were surpassed only by the seven from Massachusetts and the five from James Madison.

### SPIDERS ON TV FIVE TIMES IN 2007

CAA Football unveiled the nation's most comprehensive television package for an FCS conference and the Spiders find themselves in the spotlight five times in 2007. The CAA as a whole will have a record 31 television games this year across ESPN's and Comcast's family of networks.

The Comcast Network -- CN8 -- will carry the Spiders' home-opener versus New Hampshire (Sept. 29, 3:30 p.m. ET) and the home game against Villanova (Nov. 3, 3:30 p.m.). Comcast SportsNet will broadcast Richmond's season-finale at home versus William & Mary (Nov. 10, Noon), along with road games at Towson (Oct.6, Noon) and James Madison (Oct. 27, Noon).

Richmond's five TV appearances in second-most in the league.

### BOBBY JOHNSON VS. RICHMOND

Vanderbilt head coach Bobby Johnson is 1-1 versus Richmond all-time, having faced the Spiders once as an assistant coach and once as a head coach. During his first year as an assistant coach at Furman (defensive ends coach) in 1976, the Spiders downed the Paladins 13-9 on the road.

Richmond lost 17-7 at seventh-ranked Furman in 2002 -- the year after Johnson left Furman for Vanderbilt.

### COACHING CONNECTIONS

One member of Bobby Johnson's staff -- QB coach Jimmy Kiser -- was the Spiders' offensive coordinator in 2001. That season Kiser's offense nearly pulled out a victory over Vanderbilt, falling 28-22.

Richmond defensive coordinator Russ Huesman and Vandy LB coach Warren Belin were on the same staff at William & Mary in 1995-96.

### STATE CONNECTIONS

Two Spiders on the roster hail from the Volunteer State -- junior QB Will Healy (Chattanooga / Air Fore Prep) and sophomore DB Max Prokell (Memphis / Memphis Univ. HS).

One Commodore on the roster -- senior DT Gabe Hall (Virginia Beach / Fork Union Military) -- is from Virginia.

### NEW FACES ON DEFENSE

Arguably the most scrutinized position early on for the Spiders in 2007 will be at linebacker. Richmond graduated all three starters from 2006 and two of which -- Adam Goloboski and Lance Gray -- were No. 1 and No. 2 respectively in tackles last season. Among the names in line to fill the voids, redshirt sophomore Colin McConaghy in the only one with game experience. He saw action in 10 games last year with 29 tackles and a sack.

Redshirt freshmen Eric McBride, Jordan Shoop and Tyler Sullivan are the leading names to start at linebacker as well.

In all, Richmond returns just four starters from last year's team on defense -- DL Sherman Logan and DBs Stephen Howell, Andrew Harris and David Horton.

The Spiders lost 58 percent of their tackles from last season

### EXPERIENCE RETURNS ON OFFENSE

Although eight defensive starters graduated, nine of 11 starters on the offense are back, including QB Eric Ward, RB Tim Hightower, WR Arman Shields and four along the offensive line.

The Spiders return nearly 85 percent of their scoring from last season, including leading scorers K Andrew Howard (64 points), Hightower (42), Shields (30) and RB Josh Vaughn (30).

### OFFENSIVE LINE BOASTS SIZE, EXPERIENCE

Richmond boasts one of the most experienced and talented offensive lines in the league, headlined by Preseason All-CAA Football selection senior Tim Silver. Including Silver at left tackle, four starters are back from last year's line that allowed just 96 sacks (second-fewest in the league). The Spiders were fifth in rushing offense (163.1 ypg) behind the line that also includes senior center Derek Stoudt, and junior right guard Adam Miller.

The projected starting line for the Vanderbilt game of Silver, LG Matt McCracker, Stoudt, Miller and RT Michael Silva averages **6-foot-5** and a robust **301** pounds.

### DEPTH AT WIDE OUT

The expectations are high for Preseason All-CAA Football selection **Arman Shields** as he enters his final year as a wide receiver. Shields enters 2007 **fourth** in career receptions at Richmond (**146**), **seventh** in career reception yards (**1,805**) and **eighth** in career TDs (**13**).

But a suddenly deep and young receiving corps could be a blessing in disguise for Shields. Redshirt freshman Kevin Grayson, redshirt sophomores Jordan Mitchell and Scot Riddell each enjoyed solid preseason camps and positioned to be targets for Ward, thus taking the focus of defenses off Shields.

#### PLAYING IN THE RED

Richmond's ability to both score and defend inside the Red Zone last season proved to be critical. The Spiders ranked as the league's best team on defense inside the Red Zone, holding the opposition to just a 65.6 percent success rate (21-of-32).

While on offense inside the 20, the Spiders were the league's second-most efficient team with a 87.9 percent success rate (29-of-33).

Of Richmond's 272 points last season, 171 came by way of Red Zone scores.

Defensively, the Spiders held three opponents last year scoreless in the Red Zone -- Duke, Northeastern and Rhode Island. Each of those teams had two possessions inside the 20 and came up empty. Northeastern missed a pair of field goals, while the Spiders' defense forced Duke and Rhode Island each to fumble once and turn the ball over on downs.

#### DRIVING 80

Over the past two seasons, the Spiders are a spotless **17-for-17** producing points on drives of 80 yards or longer. Richmond had eight such drives last year and nine in 2005. Of those **17** scoring drives, an impressive **15** have resulted in touchdowns and two in field goals.

The longest drive last season was an 83-yard, 18-play jaunt that consumed 9:09 of the third quarter and resulted in a field goal against Duke. The Spiders went 97 yards for a touchdown versus VMI in 2005 (the third of three 80+ yard drives in that game) and 94 yards for a touchdown against William & Mary.

#### MAGIC NUMBER IS 30

The Spiders are **11-0** all-time under Clawson when scoring 30+ points in a game. Of Richmond's six wins last season, four came in contests that saw the Spiders surpass the 30-point plateau -- including back-to-back 58-7 and 48-21 wins over VMI and Bucknell. One of the biggest wins in Clawson's era at Richmond was a 38-10 thumping (on the road) against No. 2 Hampton in the First Round of the 2005 NCAA Playoffs. Under Clawson, Richmond's average margin of victory when scoring 30+ points is **26.8** ppg.

#### HIGH ON HIGHTOWER

A Third Team All-Conference selection in 2006, senior RB Tim Hightower is on pace to crack the Richmond career Top 10 in both rushing yards and rushing TDs this season.

With **1,788** career rushing yards, he needs just **153** to crack the Top 10. With **14** career rushing TDs, he needs **three** to make the list.

#### THE SHERMAN-ATOR

Also a Third Team All-Conference pick in 2006 and a Preseason All-CAA Football selection this year, DL Sherman Logan is the anchor to Richmond's defense. Logan, who sacked Jay Cutler twice in the Spiders' 2005 visit to Vandy, was the A-10's Defensive Rookie of the Year that year. He has **14** career sacks to his credit and needs just a **half-sack** more to crack Richmond's Top 10 list.

#### THE CRONE EFFECT

Redshirt junior RB **John Crone** missed three consecutive games late last season due to injury and Richmond was winless in those contests. After going down with a leg injury against Delaware on Oct. 21 (a 28-24 UR loss), Crone did not return to the field until the season-finale versus William & Mary (a 31-14 UR win). The Spiders were 6-2 with Crone on the field and 0-3 without him. All-time, Richmond is **15-6** with Crone on the field.

#### PERFECT PAT

Sophomore kicker Andrew Howard made his mark last season as a true freshman, converting all 34 of his extra-point attempts and hitting 10-of-13 field goals to lead the team in scoring with 64 points. The hometown product from Hermitage HS was 6-for-6 inside 30 yards and 3-for-4 from 40-49 yards, with his career long of 45 yards coming against James Madison.

Howard accounted for 12 points against Bucknell (the third-best single-game total in school history) on six extra points and two field goals. The eight extra points he nailed in Richmond's 58-7 win over VMI is tied for the most in school history.

Howard was a late addition to the Spider recruiting class for the 2006 season. He finished his two-year prep kicking career 101-for-104 in PATs and 13-for-18 in field goals.

#### STAFF PROMOTIONS

In the off-season, head coach Dave Clawson announced the promotion of two assistant coaches. He elevated Latrell Scott to assistant head coach and Bill Durkin to offensive run-game coordinator. Scott is in his third season with the Spiders, and will continue to be the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. Durkin is entering his 11th season at Richmond and is responsible for the offensive line.

#### TOP 25

On the heels of its 2005 Atlantic 10 Championship season, which saw the Spiders go 9-4, reach the NCAA Second Round and finish No. 8 in the national polls, the Spiders spent much of last season ranked again.

The Spiders crawled around last year's Sports Network poll for 10 consecutive weeks, which



matched the school's longest streak since 2000.

Starting the season ranked 15th in the pre-season polls, the Spiders jumped to eighth after beating Duke and as high as seventh for three consecutive weeks after a 4-0 start. Richmond slipped to 25th for the Towson game, then fell out prior to the finale at William & Mary.

The Spiders are not ranked heading into 2007.

### NEW PRESIDENT AT RICHMOND

Dr. Edward L. Ayers, who made the charter flight with the team to Vanderbilt, became the University of Richmond's ninth president on July 1, 2007.

In one of Dr. Ayers' first interviews with the *Richmond Times-Dispatch*, he noted his commitment to bringing Richmond Football back to campus: "I would like to get the stadium on line as soon as we can do so responsibly...I want us to have it. I think that if you're going to be playing Division I-AA football, bringing it on campus and using it for sort of the cohesion and the homecomings and all that, it seems my responsibility in some ways [to have on-campus football]."

### SPIDER IN SPACE

Former Richmond football player and current NASA astronaut Leland Melvin is continuing to prepare for his first-ever space mission, planned for late December of this year. On what will probably be his only space trip, the 43-year-old will help deliver a European laboratory to the International Space Station. His main responsibility will be the operation of the shuttle's robotic arm.

Melvin graduated in 1985 and still holds the Spiders' career records for receiving yards (2,669) and receptions (198).

### SPIDERS ANNOUNCE FUTURE FBS OPPONENTS

Richmond, who opens at Vanderbilt this year and is set to return in 2015, announced an agreement this summer to play Virginia four times over the next seven years. The in-state rivals will play in Charlottesville in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014.

The Spiders went on the road and shutout Duke 13-0 last year in Durham and makes return trips there is 2009 and 2011.

### WHITE BEATS BLUE, 20-13, IN SPRING GAME THRILLER

Jonathan Mayfield caught a 30-yard pass from Will Healy as time expired to lead the White Team to a 20-13 victory in the annual Spring Game, played in front of 1,426 at First Market Stadium.

Healy led the White Team, which was comprised of Richmond's second-team offense and first-team defense, by going 17-for-28 with 181 yards and a touchdown. The rising junior from Chattanooga, Tenn. also ran for a score.

For the Blue, starting sophomore QB Eric Ward was 14-for-26 with 147 yards and two touchdowns. Both QBs threw an interception. The Blue's Arman Shields was the game's leading receiver as the rising senior reeled in both of Ward's TD passes and finished with 107 yards on nine receptions.

### HEAD COACH DAVE CLAWSON

Dave Clawson, Richmond's fourth-year head coach, has proven himself as a program builder after just eight years as a head coach.

Clawson, 40, guided the biggest two-year turnaround in Spider football's 124-year history in his first two seasons, going 3-8 in 2004 and 9-4 in 2005. The Spiders finished a storybook season in 2005 which included a six-win turnaround from 2004, an eight-game win streak and a nine-game win streak over I-AA opponents. Clawson helped the Spiders to their third Atlantic 10 Conference title in eight years and guided them into the NCAA I-AA Playoffs for the first time since the 2000 season.

Clawson, who was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year twice at Fordham, was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year in only his second year in the league. It marked his third Conference Coach of the Year honor in his first seven years as a head coach.

National honors came Clawson's way that same season as he garnered the National Coach of the Year award from I-AA.org. That award made Clawson a two-time national award honoree, earning it once at two different schools. Clawson was also given both the Virginia Sports Information Directors Association (VaSID) Commonwealth Coach of the Year honor and the Richmond Touchdown Club College Coach of the Year award over the likes of Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer and Virginia's Al Groh.

As the Clawson Era rolls into its fourth season, the Spiders continue to steamroll under his guidance. The offense has combined for 8,817 yards over the past two seasons, which is the most-ever in back-to-back seasons in Richmond football history.

Richmond has combined to win at least 15 games for the first time in consecutive seasons since 1997-98. His squads combined to allow just 430 points dating back to the beginning of 2005, marking the fewest points allowed in consecutive seasons since opponents scored 391 points from 2001-02.

Twenty-four All-Conference honors have been won by Clawson-coached players in his first three years on the Richmond campus. That list is headlined by Adam Goloboski's back-to-back First Team All-Atlantic 10 mentions in 2005 and 2006, Sherman Logan's A-10 Defensive Rookie of the Year honor in 2005 and Eric Ward's 2006 A-10 Offensive Rookie of the Year.

After posting a school-record 4,957 yards of total offense in 2005, the Spiders tacked another impressive season on the record books with 3,860 yards last year (10th-best in school history). Clawson's 2005 season featured a senior-laden offense under the direction of future NFL player, quarterback Stacy Tutt. Redshirt freshman QB Eric Ward led the offense last season.

Clawson also aided in individual achievement during the 2005 season, as Tutt placed himself in second place all-time on the Spiders' single-game total offense list. The Richmond quarterback threw for 376 yards and rushed for 74 yards (450 total yards) in the Spiders' double-overtime win against Hofstra. Tutt's 3,047 yards of total offense in 2005 gave him the all-time career lead for the Spiders, while his career total of 6,872 ranks second all-time in Richmond annals.

The successes over the last three years are no surprise, considering what Clawson's prior teams had shown. Clawson's offense shattered 16 team and 45 individual records in his five years at Fordham (1999-2003). While in the Bronx he led a program which had endured 12-straight losing seasons, to a resurgence which produced the 14th-best winning

percentage in I-AA football over his final three seasons (72.2 percent/26-10 record). The Rams' 19 combined wins in 2002 and 2003 were the most in back-to-back seasons since 1918-19.

An All-Conference quarterback has emerged from Clawson's offense nine of the past 13 years, including all three of his final years at Fordham. The other four honorees came in Clawson's tenure as offensive coordinator at Villanova (1996-98) and Lehigh (1994-95).

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.
