#15/15 Vanderbilt Welcomes Iona To Memorial Gym

#15/15 Vanderbilt plays its second game in three days when the Commodores take on the Iona Gaels Monday afternoon at noon at Memorial Gym. Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson will have the call on the Vanderbilt/ISP Radio Network, with no television scheduled for the contest.

The Commodores defeated UT Martin, 92-85, Saturday afternoon to move to 12-0 on the 2007-08 season, which ties for the best start in Vanderbilt basketball history. The 2003-04 Commodore squad also started the season 12-0 in route to a Sweet 16 appearance at the end of that season.

Vanderbilt survived a feisty Skyhawk team and a torrid Lester Hudson, the nation's third-leading scorer, who scored 36 points and grabbed nine rebounds. The Commodores, who led by as many as 13 in the first half, held off UT Martin in the second half to come away with its 12th win. With the score tied at 83 with 3:20 to go in the game, Vanderbilt went on an 9-2 run to close the game, with six of the nine coming on made free throws. The other three came on a shot from beyond the arc by senior Shan Foster.

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy led the Commodores in scoring, pouring in 21 points and grabbing nine rebounds. Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in six games this season. The freshman was also perfect from the foul line, shooting 9-for-9 from the charity stripe. Foster added 16 points for Vanderbilt, with nine of those points coming on three three-pointers. He has now in possession of third place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals made list. Foster also attempted eight three-pointers, which moves him into second place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals attempted list with 676.

Vanderbilt and Iona will meet for the second time Monday afternoon, with the Commodores holding a 1-0 advantage in the series. Vanderbilt won 92-56 in the first round of the Wendy's Invitational at Western Kentucky University on November 28, 1980.

Stallings Gets 150th Win As VU Coach

Kevin Stallings got his 150th win as head coach of Vanderbilt after the Commodores' 91-88 win over South Alabama on November 29. He's only the third coach in Commodore history to record at least 150 victories.

VU Moves To 12-0 In 2007-08

The Commodores' 12-0 start ties for the best start in school history. The 2003-04 team also started the year at 12-0.

2007 Calendar Year Could Be A Record Breaker

Vanderbilt has 25 wins so far in the 2007 year, which is one win shy of the school record for wins in one year. The 1965 calendar year saw the Commodores win 26 games, a record this year's team could tie with one more game left in 2007.

1-3 Punch

Senior Shan Foster and freshman A.J. Ogilvy rank one and three, respectively, in scoring in the Southeastern Conference as of December 29. Foster pours in 20.1 points per contest, while Ogilvy adds 19.2 points per game. Ogilvy is the SEC's leading freshman scorer by 1.7 points per game over Kentucky's Patrick Patterson (17.5 ppg).

Foster Moves Up Career Scoring List

Senior Shan Foster, after his 19-point performance against DePaul on December 12, moved into 9th place all-time on the VU scoring list, passing Commodore greats Barry Goheen and Tom Hagan. After the game with UT Martin, he now has 1,561 career points.

Foster made three three-pointers against UT Martin to move into sole possession of third place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals made list with 281 threes. Foster also attempted eight three-pointers, which moves him into second place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals attempted list with 684.

Foster To Make 101st Start Vs. Iona

Senior Shan Foster will play in his 111th game as a Vanderbilt Commodore this Saturday against UT Martin, and will make his 101st career start. Senior Alex Gordon will also be playing in his 111th career game.

Shan One Of SEC's Best

Senior Shan Foster ranks in the top 24 in the SEC in scoring (1st, 20.5 ppg), rebounding (T-24th, 5.2 rpg), field goal percentage (9th, .539), 3-point field goal percentage (2nd, .533), 3-point field goals made (1st, 4.00), and minutes played (9th, 32.50 mpg). Foster has also scored in double-digits in 16 consecutive games, dating back to the 'Dores opening round game in the 2007 SEC Tournament against Arkansas.

Foster Named SEC Player of the Week For Second Time In 2007-08

Foster was named the SEC Player of the Week for his play against South Alabama and Georgia Tech November 27-Dec. 3 when he averaged 21.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. Foster joins Will Perdue (1989), Dan Langhi (1999), Matt Freije (2004), and Derrick Byars (2007) as the only Commodore players to win two SEC Players-of-the-Week honors in the same season. Foster also becomes only the second SEC player to win two weekly honors in the first four weeks of the season and the first student-athlete in 18 years to accomplish the feat. Tennessee's Dyron Nix won back-to-back Player-of-the-Week honors from the league office to open the 1989 campaign. Foster also won the SEC weekly honor earlier this season for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13.

Foster Named As Candidate For Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

Senior wing Shan Foster has been selected as a candidate for the 2007-08 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, given to the nation's top 30 senior male and female college basketball players who exemplify a total student-athlete.

The award – presented annually to the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete of the Year in eight sports – focuses on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA will award the winners with trophies during the respective men's and women's NCAA Final Four weekends.

SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Media Availability

Vanderbilt men's basketball coaches and players will be available for interviews only twice weekly on Mondays and Thursdays prior to practice. While this policy is new to Vanderbilt men's basketball, it is one commonly used by the majority of schools in the SEC and is intended to channel the increasing number of media interview requests into a manageable format for Commodore players and coaches.

There will be an exception for the Commodores' games December 31 to January 5 due to the amount of games that week, and in the weeks of the Tennessee game in Knoxville and the game versus Kentucky in Nashville, because those games are on a Thursday and Tuesday, respectively. Media schedules for these weeks of the season will be emailed the week before the games take place.

Please make note of this new policy. Emails will be sent out on Monday and Thursday mornings with the exact time for player and coach availability.

Commodores And National Statistics

In the latest NCAA Statistical release of the 2007-08 season, the Commodores as a team are ranked 10th in scoring offense, 18th in shooting percentage, sixth in 3-point field goal percentage, 34th in threes made per game, and eighth in assists per game. Shan Foster is ranked nationally in scoring (31st), 3-point field goal percentage (8th), threes made per game (7th) and freshman A.J. Ogilvy is the second-best freshman in the nation in field goal percentage behind J.J. Hickson of N.C. State and seventh nationally.

Vanderbilt Captures South Padre Island Invitational Title

The Commodores captured the South Padre Island Invitational title with wins over Utah State and Bradley at the South Padre Convention Center. **Shan Foster** won MVP honors for the tournament, while freshman **A.J. Ogilvy** and sophomore **Jermaine Beal** were named to the All-Tournament team.

Vanderbilt last won a regular season tournament in November of 2000, when the Commodores won the America's Youth Classic, which was held at Memorial Gym. VU defeated South Carolina State, Western Carolina, and St. Joseph's that year.

'Dores Hot In 2007-08

Through 12 games of the 2007-08 season, Vanderbilt has shot 49.1% (349-711) from the floor and 44.4% (108-243) from three.

Free Throw Shooting Carries 'Dores Past Bradley And South Alabama

In the South Padre Island Invitational finals against Bradley and in the Commodores game against South Alabama, VU made 46 out of 53 free throws, an 86.8% clip. Vanderbilt made 28 out of 31 free throws against Bradley, a 90.3 percentage, and 18 of 22 (81.8%) against South Alabama. Against Wake Forest, Vanderbilt made 23-of-27 shots from the free throw line, and versus UT Martin, the Commodores made 24-of-30 from the line. For the season, VU is shooting 73.7% at the line, and the Commodores have shot 75% or better from the free throw line in five games this year.

Speaking of the Charity Stripe...

Vanderbilt's 28 made free throws against Bradley was the most for a Commodore squad since December 30, 2000, when VU made 29 in a 97-74 loss at Boston College. Additionally, Vanderbilt has made more free throws (233) this season than its opponents have attempted (224), and goes to the line an average of 26.3 times a game.

Point Guard Play A Plus

Sophomore point guard Jermaine Beal has raised his level of play this year, and really sharpened his game at the South Padre Invitational. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, had 10 assists against one turnover in the two games on the island, averaged 13.5 points per game, and was named to the All-Tournament team.

More Point Guard Info

Through 12 games, Jermaine Beal and freshman Keegan Bell have 91 assists against only 41 turnovers, a ratio of 2.22 to 1.

More On Beal...

From November 24 through December 8, Beal dished out five or more assists in four games, the first time that had happened since Atiba Prater accomplished the feat in 2000 [(9) vs. Boston College, 2/6/2000; (7) vs. Mississippi State, 2/9/2000; (5) at Alabama, 2/12/2000; (8) vs. Auburn, 2/16/2000.]

Bell Rings True Against DePaul

Freshman Keegan Bell scored 12 points, all on threes, and dished out eight assists against no turnovers in Vanderbilt's 91-85 overtime win at DePaul on December 12. Bell, who played a career-high 20 minutes against the Blue Demons, kickstarted Vanderbilt's offense in the second half and propelled the team to the comeback victory.

'Dores Going 90

Vanderbilt scored 90+ points in the three games against Bradley (11/24), South Alabama (11/29), and Georgia Tech (12/1), the first time VU had done that since the 1999-2000 season.

For the season, VU has scored 90+ points six times, and 80+ points ten times.

A.J. Ogilvy One of Nation's Top Freshmen

6'10 freshman center A.J. Ogilvy has started his first season in collegiate basketball with a bang.

The Sydney, Australia native has scored 20 or more points six times thus far in 2007-08, and has reached double-digits in each of his first 12 games.

Ogilvy's scoring averages is the best in the SEC for a freshman, and ranks as one of the best freshman scorers in the nation so far.

Ogilvy is on pace to become the first center to average double-digit points since Greg LaPointe in the 2000-01 season (11.1), and could challenge Clyde Lee for the best season ever by a Vanderbilt center (22.6 ppg in 1965-66).

Ogilvy made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action on November 10, the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since **Phil Cox** scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

Ogilvy Named SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Nov. 5-12 for his performance against Austin Peay, when he scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

Jamie Graham Joins Basketball Team

5-11 guard Jamie Graham, a member of the Commodore football team, joined the basketball team at the end of the football season and made his first appearance on the floor against UT Martin on December 29. Graham, who redshirted on the gridiron in 2007, played six minutes and had three points, two assists, a rebound and a steal in his Commodore debut. He is the first Vanderbilt football player to play on the basketball team since 1994-95 when Fred Baker played for both squads.

Vanderbilt Home For Six Straight

Vanderbilt is in the midst of a six-game homestand and the busiest four-game stretch of the year. The Commodores play four games in seven days, beginning with Saturday's game against UT Martin, and then plays its SEC opener at home against South Carolina on January 9. The Commodores don't hit the road until January 12 when the team travels to Kentucky.

Metcalfe Plays Career-Best Ball

Senior center Alan Metcalfe scored 18 points off of the bench, a new career high, in the Commodores' 91-85 win over DePaul on December 12. Metcalfe surpassed his career high in points, field goals made, field goal attempts, and three-point field goals made, and tied his career high for three-point field goal attempts and assists against the Blue Demons. For the season, Metcalfe has made 33 field goals, 14 more than his entire total in the 2006-07 season, and has scored 94 total points in 2007-08, 37 more points than his career total (57) heading into his senior year.

3-Point Streak Continues In 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 676 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (681) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (586) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 658-184 (.781) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games. VU is 8-0 so far in 2007-08.
- Vanderbilt has won 97 of its last 103 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 144-13 non-conference record at home (.917 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 77-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

Commodores Sign Two In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that forwards Lance Goulbourne and Steve Tchiengang have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2008.

"We are extremely excited to add Lance and Steve to our program," Stallings said. "Not only do I feel strongly about their playing ability and versatility, but they are the kind of young men we want to have at Vanderbilt. They both come from excellent families and are diligent students."

Goulbourne, from Brooklyn, N.Y., and currently attending The Hun School in Princeton, N.J., is a 6'7, 215 pound small forward averaged 12 points and eight rebounds per game his junior year in 2006-07. He also stood out this summer at the Nike Global Challenge in Beaverton, Oregon, an elite tournament for high school rising seniors where his team went 5-3 against international competition. Goulbourne was ranked 90th by Rivals.com and was rated 18th among small forwards.

"I just felt comfortable there, and my family loved it," Goulbourne said. "It was just one of those feelings that came to me. I just felt like Vanderbilt was where I needed to be. They really have a good program academically and athletically."

Goulbourne chose Vanderbilt over Marquette, Rutgers, Louisville and Notre Dame.

Steve Tchiengang is a 6'9, 235 pound power forward from Montverde Academy in Florida. Originally from Cameroon, Tchiengang is rated No. 81 by Rivals.com and is the 25th best prospect at the power forward position. He chose the Commodores over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

"I felt comfortable that Vanderbilt is the place that God wanted me," Tchiengang said. "The coaching staff did a great job of recruiting me and making me feel wanted. I feel there is a great opportunity there and I get to play in a great Conference. I am very excited."

"We targeted these young men very early in the recruiting process, even before their junior year of high school began," Stallings said. "We are thrilled they have chosen Vanderbilt and feel they will be great additions to our team."

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08.

Notes From Vanderbilt's Last Time Out Vs. UT Martin

Team Records and Series Notes:

- Vanderbilt improves to 12-0, while UT-Martin falls to 5-8.
- The 12-0 start equals the best start in school history. The 2003-04 Commodores also opened the season with 12 consecutive victories.
- The Commodores now lead the all-time series against UT-Martin 5-0.
- Vanderbilt is now 52-7 all-time against members of the Ohio Valley Conference, including 3-0 this season.

Vanderbilt Team Notes:

- Key Run: Tied at 83 with 3:20 remaining in the game, the Commodores finished the contest on a 9-2 run. Senior Shan Foster put the Commodores in front 86-83 with a three-pointer with 3:08 remaining. After UT-Martin cut the lead to 86-85, the Commodores made six consecutive free throws to pull away for the seven-point victory.
- Key Stat: Vanderbilt dominated the turnover category, committing a season-low 10 turnovers, while forcing 21 miscues from the Skyhawks. Vanderbilt won the points off turnover category 40-16. The Commodores also had a season-high 13 steals.
- The 'Dores continued their excellent free-throw shooting, making 24-of-30 (80.0 percent) from the charity stripe. Vanderbilt has shot better than 75 percent from the foul line in five games this season.
- Vanderbilt was held below 40 percent shooting for the first time this season. The Commodores finished the game 29-of-73 (39.7 percent) from the floor.
- The Commodores scored 51 points in the first half. Vanderbilt has now scored 50 or more points in a half five times this season.
- Vanderbilt has scored 90 or more points in six games this season.
- Vanderbilt and UT-Martin split the rebounding battle, with both teams bringing down 40 boards. The Commodores pulled down a season-high 23 rebounds in the contest.

Vanderbilt Individual Notes:

- Freshman A.J. Ogilvy led the Commodores in scoring, pouring in 21 points and grabbing nine rebounds. Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in six games this season. The freshman was also perfect from the foul line, shooting 9-for-9 from the charity stripe.
- Senior Shan Foster added 16 points for Vanderbilt. Foster made three three-pointers to move into sole possession of third place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals made list. Foster also attempted eight three-pointers, which moves him into second place on the Vanderbilt all-time three-point field goals attempted list with 676.
- Senior guard Alex Gordon turned in his second-consecutive, double-digit point performance, scoring 15 points. Gordon has eight double-figure games on the season. Gordon also tied a career-high with four steals.
- Freshman Darshawn McClellan scored a career-high eight points. McClellan also added five rebounds and an assist.
- Freshman Keegan Bell added nine points on 3-of-4 shooting from beyond the arc.
- Jamie Graham made his first appearance as a member of the Vanderbilt men's basketball team. Graham had three points, two assists, a rebound and a steal in his Commodore debut. He is the first Vanderbilt football player to play on the basketball team since 1994-95 when Fred Baker played for both squads.





Shan Foster scored 21 points to lead Vanderbilt to an 81-67 victory over Austin Peay in the season opener for both teams.

Foster tied his career-high with seven three-pointers, including three straight in the second half, to help the Commodores lead by as much as 18 points.

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Alex Gordon answered for the Commodores, hitting a three-pointer to push the score to 70-59. Vanderbilt led by no less than 10 points the rest of the game.

Gordon added 19 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 18 points and nine rebounds for Vanderbilt. Todd Babington led Austin Peay with 21 points, while Fernandez Lockett recorded 14 points and 12 rebounds.

The Commodores shot 60.0 percent from the field in the second half and 54.5 for the game. The Governors shot only 32.4 percent in the second half and finished at 34.5.

Babington opened the second half with a three-pointer, trimming Vanderbilt's lead to 43-35. Ogilvy scored six straight points inside, keeping the Commodores ahead 49-37.

Moments later, Foster swished three straight treys, pushing the lead to 60-42, the largest of the game.

Vanderbilt raced to an 18-3 lead to open the game, highlighted by two three-pointers by Foster. Austin Peay did not score its second basket until the 10:50 mark.

The Commodores made eight of 15 three-pointers in the first half and 50 percent from the field. The Governors shot 37.5 in the first half.

Senior wing Shan Foster scored 15 points to lead five players in double figures as the Commodores came away with a 77-56 win over Utah State in the semifinal round of the South Padre Invitational.

The Commodores led 33-30 at the break, although VU shot a season-low 36.1% from the floor in the first half. Despite the low shooting percentage, Vanderbilt went into the break with the lead because of a high defensive intensity level that forced the Aggies into 12 first half turnovers, and limited their leading scorer, Jaycee Carroll, to only six hard-fought points in the first half. For the game, Carroll scored only 11 points, ten points under his season average.

In the second half, Vanderbilt's offense got on track and opened the period with a 12-2 run that would put Utah State away. In the second stanza, the Commodores shot 60.9% from the floor, 55.6% from three, and 73.3% from the free throw line.

Foster led all Commodore scorers with 15 points, with Beal adding his 14 points. Alex Gordon, A.J. Ogilvy, and Ross Neltner all added ten points for Vanderbilt in the winning effort. Alan Metcalfe came off the bench and led Vanderbilt in rebounding with six rebounds.

"We started slowly, but we guarded very well in the first half," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We got better defensively tonight, and when we got on track offensively, we got things going in the second half."

A.J. The Commodores led from the opening tip, and heading into the half, Vanderbilt held a comfortable 53-35 lead. VU's lead, which had ballooned to as many as 24 with 1:33 to go in the first half, quickly evaporated in the second half, as the Braves chipped away at Vanderbilt's lead, and closed the gap to one point with 2:40 to play on a Theron Wilson layup to make the score 85-84 in favor of the Commodores.

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84. VU made their last eight free throws of the game to keep the Braves at bay.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

Freshman center Andrew Ogilvy scored a career-high 26 points and senior guard Shan Foster added 21 to lead the No. 23 Commodores to a 90-67 victory over Lipscomb.

Ogilvy scored 18 points in the first half to stake Vanderbilt to an early 15-point lead. When Lipscomb countered by playing a zone defense for part of the second half, Foster took over from the perimeter, making five 3-pointers.

"I'd rather have a root canal than go through this," Lipscomb coach Scott Sanderson said. "Against most teams, you only have to guard parts of the floor. Against them, you've got to guard the whole floor."

Ogilvy's inside scoring and Foster's perimeter shooting have keyed Vanderbilt's 9-0 start, its best in four years.

Ogilvy scored six points during an early 14-0 run that put the Commodores ahead 18-4. Vanderbilt led by no fewer than eight points the rest of the game.

Ard led Lipscomb with 18 points and Thomas Pfaff scored 15.

Vanderbilt led 50-35 with 15:58 remaining on a 3-pointer by Alex Gordon before Lipscomb (4-6) rallied. A jumper by Eddie Ard with 12:27 remaining capped an 8-2 run and trimmed Vanderbilt's lead to 54-46.

The Bisons then retreated into a zone, hoping to contain Ogilvy, and Foster went to work.

He swished three consecutive 3-pointers and two free throws, and Gordon added two treys, to keep the Commodores ahead 71-53 with 7:09 left.

Foster scored 17 points in the second half and finished with 21.

Lipscomb shot only 37.5 percent from the field.

Senior wing Shan Foster scored 15 points to lead five players in double figures as the Commodores came away with a 77-56 win over Utah State in the semifinal round of the South Padre Invitational.

The Commodores led 33-30 at the break, although VU shot a season-low 36.1% from the floor in the first half. Despite the low shooting percentage, Vanderbilt went into the break with the lead because of a high defensive intensity level that forced the Aggies into 12 first half turnovers, and limited their leading scorer, Jaycee Carroll, to only six hard-fought points in the first half. For the game, Carroll scored only 11 points, ten points under his season average.

In the second half, Vanderbilt's offense got on track and opened the period with a 12-2 run that would put Utah State away. In the second stanza, the Commodores shot 60.9% from the floor, 55.6% from three, and 73.3% from the free throw line.

Foster led all Commodore scorers with 15 points, with Beal adding his 14 points. Alex Gordon, A.J. Ogilvy, and Ross Neltner all added ten points for Vanderbilt in the winning effort. Alan Metcalfe came off the bench and led Vanderbilt in rebounding with six rebounds.

"We started slowly, but we guarded very well in the first half," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We got better defensively tonight, and when we got on track offensively, we got things going in the second half."
