- Was named Conference USA Freshman of the Week, Dec. 2, after averaging 17.0 points per game and 4.5 assists per game vs. Western Kentucky (Nov. 26) and ETSU (Nov. 30)
- Has started in all seven games for Marshall at point guard and has recorded two
 double-doubles, vs. Rio Grande (Nov. 12) and vs. UNC Wilmington (Nov. 23)

NOTES

HAVE YOU HERD?

Looking for its first road win of the season in its second try, the Marshall men's basketball team's comeback bid fell short with an 88-78 loss to ETSU Saturday at Freedom Hall Civic Center.

Marshall was led by Kareem Canty's (Harlem, N.Y.) 19 points, followed by 17 from Chris Thomas (Denver), Elijah Pittman's (Lexington, Ky.) 16, Shawn Smith's (Sacramento) 11 and Ryan Taylor's (Indianapolis) 10. Taylor also racked up 14 rebounds for the double-double as the Herd outrebounded ETSU 40-37. Canty added 6 assists as well.

ETSU made 53.6% from the field (30-56), while the Herd shot 42.9% (27-63). Neither team shot particularly well from long-range, as ETSU made just 7-23 attempts (30.4%), while Marshall connected on 6-30 (20%). ETSU made 70.0 percent on its trips to the free throw line (21-30), while the Herd made good on 18 of 35 attempts (51.4%).

CONFERENCE USA HONORS

Coming off a week that included overcoming a 16-point deficit to defeat two-time defending Sun Belt Champion Western Kentucky (Nov. 26), redshirt freshman guard Kareem Canty (Harlem, N.Y.) has been named Conference USA Freshman of the Week, the league office announced Monday afternoon.

This marks the first weekly honor in Canty's career and the 11th Freshman of the Week honor in program history. The last player for the Thundering Herd to receive the honor was DeAndre Kane, who did so for the week of Feb. 7, 2011.

Over the two-game week, Canty averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 assists 33.5 minutes. Against WKU, Canty ranked second on the team in scoring with 15, before scoring 19 and recording six assists in a losing effort to ETSU (Nov. 30).

Ranking sixth in the nation in assists per game (7.3) and ninth in the country in total steals (51), Canty has helped the Herd greatly from the point position.

Canty and Pittman were both named to the College Hoops Daily All-Conference USA team for the month of November at their respective positions, with Pittman taking home C-USA Player of the Month.

JIMMY V WEEK FOR CANCER RESEARCH

In its seventh consecutive year, ESPN's Jimmy V Week for Cancer Research began Tuesday, Dec. 3, across all domestic ESPN platforms. For the first time, the initiative will expand to two weeks to continue driving awareness of and donations to The V Foundation for Cancer Research. Last year, Jimmy V Week raised nearly \$1.6 million, bringing the six-year total of contributions to more than \$6.5 million.

"It's been 20 years since Jim Valvano's courageous words inspired us all to work tirelessly in the fight against this terrible disease," said John Skipper, President, ESPN. "Over those two decades, we've seen enormous strides in cancer research and treatment options - progress that comes as a direct result of Jim's vision."

SCOUTING THE COMMODORES

Vanderbilt's streaks of winning and losing has mirrored that of Marshall as both teams began the season with two two-game winning streaks separated by a two-game losing streak, followed by a loss. Both sides enter the contest with identical 4-3 records. As part of the Big 12/SEC Challenge, the Commodores most recently fell at Texas (Dec. 2).

Redshirt sophomore guard Eric McClellan leads Vanderbilt in scoring with 17. 6 points per game in seven starts. Leading the way on the boards is senior forward Rod Odom with 5.0 per game, in addition to his 13.3 points per game.

The Commodores are coming off a 2012-13 campaign that was below average as the squad finished with a 16-17 record, 8-10 in Southeastern Conference play.

HOW BIG IS BASKETBALL IN HUNTINGTON?

- Huntington's main thoroughfare that runs from I-64 to Third Avenue on the Marshall campus is named Hal Greer Boulevard, in honor of the Marshall basketball great, former Philadelphia 76er, and enshrinee in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Hal Greer was named one the NBA's 50 Greatest Players. The Huntington native was the first African-American to receive a scholarship at Marshall and the first to play intercollegiate athletics in West Virginia.
- Cam Henderson, the legendary Marshall coach whom the arena is named, invented the zone defense and the fast break. His style of play spread across the nation and changed basketball forever.
- Marshall's **Charlie Slack** holds the NCAA single season record for most rebounds per game (25.6, 1954-55).
- **Keith Veney** holds the NCAA Division I record with 15 made three-pointers in a game. In addition, the Herd's Ronald Blackshear connected on a NCAA record 11 consecutive three-pointers in a game.
- •2005 NBA Coach of the Year **Mike D'Antoni** (now with the Los Angeles Lakers) is one of seven players at Marshall to have his number retired. D'Antoni was taken in both the NBA and ABA drafts and was selected as an Academic All-American.

-Current NCAA DI coaches that have coached the Herd are **Billy Donovan** (Florida), **Dana Altman** (Oregon) and **Donnie Jones** (UCF).

• Hassan Whiteside became the 21st Marshall University player to be taken in a professional draft when he went 33rd overal to the Sacramento Kings in the 2010 NBA Draft.

FOUL PLAY

Against Morehead State on Sunday, Marshall got its first look at how the new rules that are designed to increase scoring and bring offensive flow back to college basketball will influence the game flow.

The Herd and Eagles combined for 76 personal fouls and 108 free-throw attempts. The 44 fouls called against Marshall marked the most whistles against a team in the NCAA this season — second most is 37. Morehead's 64 free throws attempted were the most in the NCAA this season, and nine more than the previous high. The Herd ran past its school record for fouls – 41 against Ohio in December 1991.

THE WINNINGEST C-USA PROGRAM

Entering the season, Marshall's 1,396 program wins were the most among current Conference USA member programs. Tulsa ranks second with 1,338 and UTEP ranks third with 1,287. Only two schools have played more seasons of men's basketball than Marshall's 101, Tulane (103) and Tulsa (102). Current Sun Belt Conference member and 2014 C-USA member, Western Kentucky has recorded 1,675 wins in 94 seasons of men's basketball.

- JP Kambola played eight games in an 18-day tour of China sponsored by Reach USA sports ministry out of Kentucky. In one game he put up 10 points and 14 rebounds.

NEW COURT

A new \$156,500 hardwood floor was installed at Cam Henderson Center in late September, replacing the old floor which had been in place for the past 15 years. The new floor will come from Robbins Sports Surfaces in Cincinnati, the same firm that has built and designed floors for Duke, North Carolina, Kentucky, Louisville, Indiana, Michigan and numerous NBA teams, including the Heat, Knicks, Cavaliers and Spurs.

Marshall is one of seven Conference USA schools that are playing on a new surface this season. The others are UAB, Florida Atlantic, FIU, Louisiana Tech, Old Dominion and UTEP.

PRESEASON PERSPECTIVE

In preseason polls, Marshall's C-USA Preseason selection was 7th by Lindy's, 7th by Athlon Sports, 11th by USA Today and 10th by Blue Ribbon.

Marshall has nine newcomers on the 2013-14Thundering Herd squad with five returning lettermen (DeVince Boykins, Elijah Pittman, JP Kambola, Tamron Manning and Yous Mbao) and one returning starter (Pittman) completing the roster.

The Herd looks to improve upon its 13-19 overall record from last season and 6-10 mark in Conference USA play. Pittman was named a C-USA Men's Basketball Preseason Player to Watch entering the season, along with being named a C-USA preseason first teamer by College Sports Madness at his position. Also receiving a College Sports Madness C-USA preseason nod was redshirt freshman Ryan Taylor who was named Freshman of the Year. Athlon has Pittman as a preseason first team selection, while Lindy's and USA Today has him listed as a second teamer.

BEAUTY WAY TO GO, EH?

From Aug. 16-20, the Herd bused around Canada for five games in five days, covering 1,225 miles on the six-day journey. Marshall returned to Huntington with a flawless 5-0 record to show for the trip. Marshall was led by redshirt freshman point guard Kareem Canty who averaged 18.8 ppg and 5.3 apg, while Pittman added 16.4 ppg and 7.4 rpg for the Herd. With chances for newcomers to gain experience, transfer forward TyQuane Goard was a significant contributor as he recorded 10.4 ppg and 7.0 rpg on the trip.


NEW FACES

Pittman Scores, Defense Doesn't Rest in Herd Win

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - On the list of schools with the most 1,000-point scorers in NCAA men's basketball history, Marshall resides in a neighborhood with some big-time bluebloods ... North Carolina, Louisville, Duke, Kentucky, Syracuse, Kansas, UCLA, etc.

The Thundering Herd has had 49 players score 1,000 or more points in green and white. Elijah Pittman played the 2013-14 opener like he's intent on being No. 50

Pittman scored 31 points Friday night at the Henderson Center as Marshall rolled to an 85-69 victory over South Carolina State to start the Herd's 102nd season. He was far from alone in establishing a new vibrancy in the Herd's style of play in coach Tom Herrion's fourth season.

It was the collegiate scoring high for the 6-foot-9 senior from Covington, Ky., and that includes his two seasons in junior college ball in Florida and Texas. It also was the most points for a Marshall player in a season opener since guard Ronald Blackshear hit 32 in a 92-90 victory at Niagara on Nov. 22, 2002.

Marshall shared the ball as it hasn't in recent seasons, and cut off passing lanes with aggressiveness. The Herd didn't allow the Bulldogs' 6-foot-11 All-MEAC post man, Matthew Hezekiah, to become a factor until it was too late. Eleven of his 19 points came in the final 11 minutes, after MU had built a 30-point cushion that eroded.

Pittman, who scored 516 points in his Herd debut last season and is the leading returning scorer (16.1 ppg) in Conference USA, missed two of his first three shots, but by the finish he was 9-of-17, including 5-of-11 behind the arc.

Pittman did his offensive damage in only 29 minutes, and he added four of the Herd's 12 steals. Marshall reached a dozen steals only once in last season's 13-19 finish, in the opener with the same number against Longwood.

In their first collegiate games as redshirt freshmen after sitting out last season to meet NCAA eligibility requirements, forward Ryan Taylor and point guard Kareem Canty gave Pittman plenty of help.

The 6-6 Taylor battled long and hard inside (mostly) for a double-double of 17 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Canty scored 15 points and had five assists, and cut down his turnovers to three after having eight in the Herd's Oct. 28 exhibition win over Concord.

Marshall also had only five of its 13 turnovers in the second half.

The Herd has nine newcomers - tying UTSA for the most in Conference USA in that department and new faces in Herd uniforms played 118 of the 200 Marshall minutes.

The Herd still left a lot of points behind the arc (7-of-30) and at the free throw stripe (26-of-41) and was outrebounded 51-46, but as a feeling-out opener went, it was a feel-good night for a club on which Pittman got more than enough help.

Herd Handles Rio Grande, 119-77

Marshall has seven score in double figures

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - With a chance to hone its skills early in the season, the Marshall men's basketball team downed NAIA member Rio Grande, 119-77, on Tuesday night at Cam Henderson

The win keeps the Thundering Herd unbeaten as Marshall is now 2-0, with its win bringing the Red Storm's record to 2-1 on the year.

Wasting no time early on, the Herd opened the game with a 27-4 run to get its offense in rhythm while the defense buckled down on the Rio Grande offense. Marshall did not allow Rio Grande to convert a field goal for a span of 8:53 in the early part of the game, allowing the Herd to seize control and never look back.

Just days after his first collegiate appearance, freshman guard Kareem Canty (Harlem, N.Y.) made his presence felt even more as he recorded his first career double-double on 18 points and 11 assists while commanding the Marshall offense from the point.

Another Herd freshman made an impact as Austin Loop (South Webster, Ohio) recorded his first career points on a kick out three in the waning moments of the first half. His conversion from long range got the home crowd on its feet heading into the break with Marshall leading 65-38. The Herd's 65 first-half points tied for the 8th most in Marshall program history.

When the second half began, Marshall seemed focused on putting the Red Storm away and removing any chance for Rio Grande to make a run and close the deficit. Senior forward Elijah Pittman (Covington, Ky.) started the second half with a flurry of points to keep the Herd offense in motion. Pittman, named a Conference USA Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 11, finished the game with 29 points on 11-of-20 shooting to lead the Herd in scoring for the second-straight game this season

An even offensive balance from seven Marshall players, which scored in double figures helped Marshall cruise to a win until the final buzzer sounded.

Loop finished the game with 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the field and 3-of-4 from beyond the arc. Fellow freshman Ryan Taylor (Indianapolis, Ind.) scored 15 points and pulled in nine rebounds to lead the Marshall on the glass and junior Shawn Smith (Sacramento, Calif.) added 11 points of his

A pair of sophomores rounded out the group of double-figure scorers as Chris Thomas (Denver) recorded 15 points and Tamron Manning (Georgetown, Ky.) scored 11 to help Marshall keep an even offensive distribution in its 119-77 victory.

Marshall remained unbeaten in its series with Rio Grande as the Herd has now won all 15 contests against the Red Storm dating back to 1921.

Herd Drops Game, Whistles Work Overtime

MOREHEAD, Ky. – The 95th Marshall-Morehead State basketball game was one for the ages ... and a lot of people aged quite a bit during it Sunday afternoon at Ellis Johnson Arena.

I don't really know where to start. Thundering Herd coach Tom Herrion said in his 25 years on various sidelines in the college game, he'd never seen a game with 108 free throws.

 Γ ve sat courtside on press row for 44 college basketball seasons, and it's the first time Γ ve witnessed a first half that lasted one hour, two minutes. It's the first time Γ ve seen 108 free throws in a game, or seen 79 fouls – that includes three technicals — in a game.

Welcome to college basketball, version 2013-14.

Eventually, the host Eagles outlasted the Herd, 102-94 in overtime, a 29-point swing from Marshall's 48-27 lead with 1:00 left in the first half.

To call this one foul-marred would be an understatement the length of Yous Mbao's inseam. Even with an overtime period, there were 2.4 free throws every minute played. Eight players fouled out.

Marshall (2-1) was two personals from having to finish with four players on the floor, after five in green fouled out.

Morehead (3-1) had 21 fouls by halftime. Marshall, in its road debut of the season, had an astounding 27 in the second half and OT. The Herd ran past its school record for fouls – 41 against Bowling Green in December 1985.

They had two aggressive teams that like to push tempo. Add in the new rules on hand checks, arm bars and impeding an offensive man who is in motion toward the basket and you have the carnage witnessed by a noisy crowd of 3,506.

It long appeared like Marshall was going to land the 1,399th victory in school history. The Herd took control of the first half as the Eagles sank so deeply into foul trouble that coach Sean Woods went to a 2-3 zone.

After halftime, it was a different game. Morehead scored the final six points of the first half, then climbed within four eight minutes into the second half, at 59-55. In a game with multiple astounding boxscore figures, Morehead was 40-of-65 at the foul stripe. The Eagles won despite not being able to get the Herd lead down to fewer than four points until the final 30 seconds of regulation.

That's because Morehead was a miserable 12-of-29 at the stripe in the second half, then inexplicably was perfect on 14 FTs in OT.

Marshall became unglued as the game dragged on and players fouled out (besides five disqualifications, two other MU players finished with four fouls)

Marshall had only 11 turnovers at halftime and ruled the glass, 22-12. By the finish, the Herd had 26 turnovers (Morehead had 14 steals in the game) and the Eagles won the boards, 40-39.

Pittman's 31 points in his home state (Covington, Ky.) led Marshall for a third straight game, and as Stephen F. Austin (2-1) comes to the Henderson Center on Thursday for a first meeting with the Herd to open the four-game Roundball Showcase, the forward is averaging 30.3 points.

And while he made 10-of-11 at the stripe, his finished the game 3-for-11 from the 3-point line. Through one long stretch of the second half, freshman point guard Kareem Canty's scoring and leadership kept the Herd in front.

With 3:57 to go in regulation, Canty had 16 points, 9 assists and 4 turnovers and 32 minutes. He played every minute (9 more) the rest of the way, but had only three points, no assists and five turnovers to finish with 9 and 9 in the last two categories.

And after a very good free-throwing performance in the first half (21-of-27, 78 percent), the Herd was only 8-of-16 after halftime

Pittman said the 26 turnovers were most costly and that the Herd – just like all other teams – will have to cope with a game that is being called tighter in hopes of opening up the offensive side of the game.

Marshall Falls to Lumberiacks in Overtime

Men's basketball suffers 80-73 defeat to Stephen F. Austin

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - In a game that saw eight ties and 12 lead changes, Stephen F. Austin pulled out an 80-73 overtime win on the road against Marshall, Thursday night, in Cam Henderson Center as part of the Roundball Showcase

With the loss, the Thundering Herd now sits at 2-2 on the season, while the Lumberjacks improve to 3-1 overall with the victory. With the contest marking the first meeting between the two teams, Stephen F. Austin now leads the series 1-0.

In a game that had a slow start as each defense honed in, Marshall was able to speed up the pace of the game to one that SFA was not accustomed to

Both sides exchanged blows early on with the first the 'Jacks remaining close courtesy of a strong rebounding advantage, primarily on the offensive end, and Herd's struggles from the charity stripe. SFA led, 27-18, in rebounding with Marshall shooting 1-of-10 from the free-throw line.

Neither team led by more than six through the first 20 minutes of play as Marshall took a slim 32-30 advantage into halftime. The first half consisted of four ties and nine lead changes. At the break, senior forward Elijah Pittman (Covington, Ky.) led the Herd on the offensive end with eight points and five rebounds.

Sophomore guard Chris Thomas (Denver, Colo.) added six points in eight first-half minutes to give the Herd an offensive spark off the bench.

The Herd held onto its lead in the second half, even extending it to eight points on multiple occasions, until guard Thomas Walkup flipped the script, completing a three-point play to put the 'Jacks on top, 62-61.

Stout defense allowed Marshall to jump ahead, 64-62, after a steal and score from sophomore guard Tamron Manning (Georgetown, Ky.) with 28 seconds to play

SFA then fell down by three after a free throw from redshirt freshman point guard Kareem Canty (Harlem, N.Y.). The 'Jacks gained hope when fouled on a three-point attempt with 0.7 seconds remaining that allowed Desmond Haymon to go to the line and convert all three free throws to tie the game at 67 before the end of regulation

The Herd was unable to regroup as the 'Jacks shot 4-of-5 from the field in overtime, including two from beyond the arc, while Marshall shot 2-of-10. When the final buzzer sounded, Marshall suffered its first home loss of the season 80-73

Marshall's two consecutive overtime contests, at Morehead State (Nov. 17) and vs. Stephen F. Austin (Nov. 21), are the first for a Herd team since Dec. 6 and 8, 1980.

Pittman finished as the leading Marshall scorer with 21 points, while SFA's Jacob Parker finished the game with 31 points and 11 rebounds to help his 'Jacks to a 47-37 rebounding advantage over the Herd.

Marshall will continue its three-game home stretch as part of the Roundball Showcase when the Herd hosts UNC Wilmington, Saturday, Nov. 23, at noon.

Pittman's 35 Leads Herd Past UNC Wilmington

Two record double-doubles as Marshall defeats UNCW, 96-78

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - Before a crowd of 4.718, the Marshall men's basketball team defeated UNC Wilmington, 96-78, snapping a two-game losing streak, Saturday afternoon, at Cam Henderson

The win improved the Thundering Herd to 3-2 overall and 3-1 at home, while the Seahawks fell to 3-4 on the season.

Making his first career start, sophomore guard Chris Thomas (Denver) filled the place of sophomore guard DeVince Boykins (Forest City, N.C.). Thomas scored the first points of the game on a jumper with 19:22 remaining in the first half. Marshall would not surrender its lead after taking the early 2-0 advantage

Senior forward Elijah Pittman (Covington, Ky.) started off hot from the field as he has 12 of Marshall's 22 points on 4-of-4 shooting from beyond the arc. The Herd led, 22-16, with under 12 minutes until the half

Proving deserving of a starting spot, Thomas stepped up big to extend the Marshall lead late in the first half as he scored four straight points to put the Herd up by 13, 40-27, with 2:46 remaining until the break

The crowd was awakened with 1:07 remaining in the first half as Pittman threw a no-look pass off the backboard to freshman Ryan Taylor (Indianapolis), who finished the play with a powerhouse slam.

Marshall closed the half on an 18-2 run that lasted 4:47, starting with the Herd's advantage at just three and the score at 30-27. The Herd took a 48-29 lead into halftime that came courtesy of 60 percent shooting (18-of-30) from Marshall in the first half.

In the second half, UNCW would battle to come within 11 as 15:39 remained in the contest and the score at 54-43. Having blown leads in each of its last two games, Marshall was prepared and remained composed to ensure the Seahawks got no closer to the Herd.

Marshall's largest lead came later when Pittman drained a three from Thomas to make it 70-49 with 11:08 remaining in the contest.

The knockout blow was dealt by freshman Kareem Canty (Harlem, N.Y.) with 1:12 to play on a drive and right-hand layup, making it 90-73.

As the clock ran out. Marshall got back on track with a 96-78 win over the Seahawks in game two for the Herd in the Roundball Showcase. Pittman finished with 35 points to lead all players in scoring, while Thomas finished with 15 in his first career start. Canty (19 points and 10 assists) and Taylor (11 points and 10 rebounds) each finished with double-doubles.

Pittman's 35 points set a career high, while his eight three-point field goals also set a career high for the senior swingman.

Thomas Gives Herd Boost to Down Western Kentucky

Men's basketball rallies from 16 down to beat Hilltoppers

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. – Despite falling behind by 16 points in the first half, the Marshall men's basketball team battled back to beat Western Kentucky, 74-64, as sophomore guard Chris Thomas (Denver) poured in 27 points for the Thundering Herd, while recording six steals, Tuesday night, at Cam Henderson Center in front of a rowdy crowd of 5,113.

The win lifted Marshall to 4-2 on the season, while Western Kentucky fell to 3-2 on the year with the road loss.

With both sides starting the game fast, Western Kentucky started faster against the Herd as the Hilltoppers jumped out to a 24-8 lead with 10:10 remaining in the first half.

Facing a Western Kentucky team that has made two consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances by winning the Sun Belt Conference Tournament, the Herd did not waiver.

Marshall answered with a 12-0 run at the midway point of the first half to cut the Hilltoppers lead to five, 25-20, with 6:06 remaining in the half.

Western Kentucky flexed its muscles to answer with a 9-0 run of their own, extending its lead to 36-22 with 1:51 remaining until halfitime. The Herd would not roll over as Thomas fueled the Herd to make an 8-0 run to close out the half with Marshall down, 36-30, at the break.

Providing a much needed spark, Thomas led the Herd in scoring at the half with 11 points in 16 minutes as he was making his second straight start. For the Hilltoppers, guard Payton Hulsey led a balanced WKU scoring attack with 10 points through the first 20 minutes of play.

Coming out rejuvenated in the second half, Marshall continued its run to come within one of WKU, 36-35.

Marshall battled all the way back at the 15:42 mark to lead, 40-39, as part of an 18-3 run that spanned both halves.

Thomas put the Herd ahead, 44-43, on a bucket that gave him 20 points on the night with just over 13 minutes to play in the contest. After a steal, Thomas was fouled and sank both free throws putting the Herd up, 46-43, with 22 points on the night as 12:35 remained.

The HilltoppersiHilltoppersiHi found themselves in foul trouble in the second half as three players had committed four fouls each with 12:03 remaining in the game.

With 7:54 to play, sophomore guard Tamron Manning (Georgetown, Ky.) sank a pair of free-throws putting Marshall up, 57-52.

As Marshall still leading by five with 6:44 to play, Thomas took a charge on the defensive end, forcing 2013 Sun Belt Conference Tournament Most Outstanding Player T.J. Price to foul out. 11 seconds later, 2012 Sun Belt Conference Tournament Most Outstanding Player George Fant recorded his fifth foul and headed to the bench.

A TyQuane Goard (Roxboro, N.C.) rebound off a WKU missed shot with 1:14 left and the Herd leading, 65-59, tied the game in Marshall's favor for good once Goard made two free-throws after being fouled to put Marshall up, 67-59.

In a facet of the game that Marshall has struggled in at times, foul shooting, the Herd came up big down the stretch. The Herd made nine of its last 10 free-throws and came away with a 74-64 win.

Freshman guard Kareem Canty (Harlem, N.Y.) finished second in scoring to Thomas with 15 points, while adding three assists on the night.

The Marshall defense clamped down on the Hilltoppers, forcing 23 turnovers and recording 28 points off of

Senior Elijah Pittman (Covington, Ky.) was assessed a flagrant-two foul with 15:07 remaining in the first half, thereby forcing him to be ejected from the game.

Marshall will conclude its participation in the Roundball Showcase with a road contest versus ETSU, Saturday, Nov. 30, at 4 p.m.

Herd Unable to Rally to Beat ETSU

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. - Looking for its first road win of the season in its second try, the Marshall men's basketball team's comeback bid fell short with an 88-78 loss to ETSU Saturday at Freedom Hall Civic

The Bucs improved to 3-5 overall, while Marshall fell to 4-3.

ETSU's Kinard Gadsden-Gilliard had a masterful all-around performance, totaling 19 points, seven rebounds and seven assists. Hunter Harris had 17 points (on 8-9 shooting) with 13 rebounds. RaShawn Rembert and Lester Wilson (before fouling out) added 13 points each.

Marshall was led by Kareem Canty's (Harlem, N.Y.) 19 points, followed by 17 from Chris Thomas (Denver), Elijah Pittman's (Lexington, Ky.) 16, Shawn Smith's (Sacramento) 11 and Ryan Taylor's (Indianapolis) 10. Taylor also racked up 14 rebounds for the double-double as the Herd outrebounded ETSU 40-37. Canty added 6 assists as well.

ETSU made 53.6% from the field (30-56), while the Herd shot 42.9% (27-63). Neither team shot particularly well from long-range, as ETSU made just 7-23 attempts (30.4%), while Marshall connected on 6-30 (20%). ETSU made 70.0 percent on its trips to the free throw line (21-30), while the Herd made good on 18 of 35 attempts (51.4%).

The game flow was back and forth early on, before ETSU got a boost from its home crowd to go out front 23-14 with 7:56 remaining in the first half. At the time, 12 of the Bucs 23 points had come off of eight Marshall turnovers

After a Marshall run cut the deficit, the Bucs answered go up by 13 points for the second time in the first half, this time 41-28 with 1:52 remaining in the first half.

ETSU took a 46-34 advantage into the half as the Bucs' balanced scoring attack trumped that of the Herd. Thomas and Canty tied for the team lead in scoring as each had eight points.

At the break, both sides had struggled from beyond the arc as the two sides combined to shoot 5-of-27. Marshall was 2-of-14 from three-point range in the first 20 minutes.

From the field, ETSU's 51.6 field goal percentage on 16-of-31 shooting trumped Marshall's 37.1 field goal percentage on 13-of-35 shooting in the game's first 20 minutes.erd'sHerdH

Despite countless efforts from Marshall to climb back into the contest, the Herd struggled to slow what began as a hot shooting night from the Bucs

In the second half, the Herd made a run with numerous Bucs in foul trouble. Marshall cut the lead to four points with 8:30 remaining on a drive and score from Thomas, making it 66-62.

With 5:41 remaining the Herd came within two of ETSU in a 70-68 deficit after a made free throw from TyQuane Goard (Roxboro, N.C.), but unfortunately for Marshall the game would get no closer down the stretch as the Bucs countered with a run to collect the victory.
