### The Series with Vanderbilt

Overall - First Meeting

Siena vs. the SEC

Siena is 1-2 all-time against the 12 schools that currently make up the Southeastern Conference...The Saints defeated South Carolina 63-58 at home in the 1991 Postseason NIT...Siena lost 71-67 at Florida at the beginning of the 1988-89 season and 94-80 to Arkansas in the 1999 NCAA Tournament First Round in Denver.

Siena in the NCAA Tournament

Siena holds a 2-3 overall record in three NCAA Tournament appearances (1989, 1999, 2002)...Siena defeated Stanford 80-78 in the 1989 First Round in Greensboro, N.C. in one of the NCAA Tournament's greatest upsets behind 32 points from all-time leading scorer Marc Brown who sealed the win with a pair of free throws...The season was especially memorable because a measles outbreak on campus caused all games from February 10 through the North Atlantic Conference Tournament to be quarantined...The school received national attention from the incident, and the win over #3 seed Stanford also marked the first time #14 seed Siena played in front of an audience in five weeks...The nickname "Saints" was also adopted in March of 1989...A decade later, Siena made its second appearance in the Big Dance where it lost to Arkansas 94-80 in a First Round Game in Denver...In 2002, Siena became just the second school to reach the Tournament with a losing record...The Saints won four games as the #7 seed in the MAAC Tournament to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA's...After an Opening Round win over Alcorn State 81-77 in Dayton, Siena lost to eventual National Champion Maryland, 85-70, in Washington.

## Quick Hits

- ▶ Siena is making its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance
  - ✓ The Saints are the champions of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference
  - ✓ Siena shared the regular-season MAAC title (with Rider) and was the #1 seed in the conference Tournament which was played on its home floor (Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y.)
- ▶ With an enrollment of 2,900, Siena is the second smallest school in this year's NCAA Tournament field (Davidson)
  - ✓ Freshman Ryan Rossiter's brother Stephen is a sophomore forward for the Wildcats
- ▶ Siena's three previous NCAA appearances were in 1989, 1999 and 2002
  - ✓ As a #14 seed and champion of the North Atlantic Conference in 1989, Siena knocked off #3 seed Stanford in Greensboro, N.C.
  - ✓ As a #13 seed in 1999, Siena lost to #4 Arkansas in the First Round
  - ✓ Siena won the Opening Round game over Alcorn State in 2002 before losing to eventual National Champion Maryland in the First Round
- ▶ The Saints enter the NCAA Tournament on a season-long six game winning streak
  - ✓ This marks the program's second consecutive 20-win campaign
  - ✓ Siena has won 20 games 16 times in program history
- ✓ The Saints set a program record with 24 losses in 2004-2005 – the year prior to Fran McCaffery's arrival
- ▶ McCaffery has brought three different schools to the NCAA Tournament (Lehigh 1988 and UNC-Greensboro 2001)
  - ✓ He is the 31st coach in NCAA history to do so, and just the 15th active head coach to have brought three teams to the Tournament
  - ✓ All three of McCaffery's teams have been their conference's only representative the year they advanced, making him the only coach to have led three different one-bid-league teams to the NCAA Tournament
- ▶ Siena had just nine turnovers in its MAAC Championship game win
  - ✓ It marked the 11th time this season the Saints have had fewer than 10 turnovers in a game
  - ✓ Siena owns a +6.2 turnover margin
  - ✓ The Saints have committed an average of just 11.1 turnovers per game – a mark that ties for the seventh fewest in the nation
  - ✓ Siena has had 15 turnovers or fewer in 23 straight games and more assists than turnovers in 12 straight
  - ✓ Siena leads the MAAC and ranked 23rd nationally with 9.4 steals per game
- ▶ The Saints have three players averaging 15 points or more
  - ✓ Alex Franklin has averaged 20 points and 10.4 rebounds over the last seven games
  - ✓ Kenny Hasbrouck was named MAAC Tournament MVP after averaging 14.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.3 assists in Siena's three wins
  - ✓ Edwin Ubiles has reached double figures in 31 of Siena's 32 games
  - ✓ All three players have scored 30 points or more in a game this season
- ▶ Siena held its opponents to an average of just 58 points in its three MAAC Tournament wins
  - ✓ The Saints allowed 72.4 points per game during the regular-season
  - ✓ Siena averaged just 68 points in the MAAC Tournament after averaging better than 77 points during the regular-season
  - ✓ The Saints shot just 31% from 3-point range in the MAAC Championships, but limited their opposition to 29% Ronald Moore's brother Chuck played for Vanderbilt (2001-2002)
    - ✓ Moore has had 91 assists and just 25 turnovers over the last 17 games
    - ✓ He has had more assists than turnovers in 53 of the 58 games he has started
    - ✓ Moore has averaged 5.3 assists and owns a 2.64 assist/turnover ratio
- ▶ Tay Fisher is the only senior on this year's team
  - ✓ Fisher came off the bench to scored 21 points (six 3-pointers) in the MAAC Championship game on his 22nd birthday (3/22)
  - ✓ Fisher enters the Tournament just two 3-pointers shy of third place on the school's all-time 3-point charts
- ▶ Kenny Hasbrouck and Edwin Ubiles were MAAC Preseason and Postseason First Team selections
  - ✓ It marked the first time since the league expanded to 10 teams (1997-98) that two players from the same team made the Postseason First Team
  - ✓ Alex Franklin was named to the MAAC Second Team (despite missing five games with a back injury - 12/28-1/8)

## Meeting with McCaffery

**Each week head coach Fran McCaffery meets with the local media. Below are some of his comments from Monday's media lunch at Siena.**

### On the first impressions seeing Vanderbilt on film:

It was interesting because I didn't know their players. Usually I have a feeling of who's there. And I've never coached against Kevin before, but I've coached against Roy Williams and I figured there might be some similarities. Of course he's been on his own for a long time now. But there were similarities in how they run the quick-up, how they get it in and up the floor. They're dangerous because of how they shoot the ball and they're big. Usually in our league, it's one or the other. They have 3-point shooters, they've got size, and Ogilvy's a handful. We've played guys like that before. Foster, the Player of the Year, ... They have different guys who can make multiple 3's in a game. The more tape I watch, I see that they're deep. They start three seniors and they have one senior who comes off the bench. Four of their top six guys are seniors, but he plays a lot of freshmen. They have a good freshmen class. Obviously they're a good team with 26 wins in the SEC. They're very impressive.



### On scouting Vanderbilt:

We watched two tapes (Sunday) night, the Iona game and the Arkansas game. We're watching the Alabama game now. They have a lot of weapons. They push it. They have a big guy in Andrew Ogilvy, Shan Foster is the Player of the Year in the SEC. They've got a lot of good players that come off the bench. They're very well coached. They mix defense well. They can play fast and in the half court.

### On there being any help playing Ogilvy after playing Jason Thompson and Robin Lopez:

I think those are very good comparisons. He's a wide body, he's got great hands and he's got moves. He can put it on the deck if he catches it at the free throw line. A lot of big guys can only play on the block. He can play up on the free throw line, catch, make a move and shoot. Those guys are hard not to foul. Those guys can make two guys foul out just by themselves.

### On Vanderbilt being so much better at home:

It is a unique place. I've coached there before. The benches are under the hoop, there's a raised floor. Kevin Stallings has made that an exciting program. When he got there, it wasn't like that. The fans pack the place and I think the team feeds off that. They've struggled a little bit on the road. They have a lot of character on this team.

### On Vanderbilt's style of play:

They're going to try and score right on top of you, which is what we like to do. So it's going to be interesting. They may try to make it more half-court to use their size.

### On Seth Davis picking Siena:

Well I would expect Digger Phelps to pick us (because of relationship from Notre Dame). Seth Davis, I certainly respect his opinion. Jay Bilas didn't pick us, but the fact that experts think that we have a chance, it shows great respect for our players.

### On his relationship with Kevin Stallings:

I have a lot of respect for him. He's a terrific guy. He's one of those guys that after he's had a ton of success he's the same exact guy. I would run into him on the road when we were young assistant coaches recruiting the same players. So I always have a lot of respect for those kinds of people. And I root for him.

### Will your regular media coverage help the players at the tournament?

It can. The last two times I went as a head coach we didn't get any attention from the media at all. We might have had a writer or two at games. Then there's five or six cameras filming your bus leaving to go to the airport. It's really eye opening to the players. But we get covered like a high profile program. There's cameras every day at practice, there's radio spots, and they've been up on a podium before. That can be an overwhelming experience if you've not been through it. So from that standpoint, I think we'll be okay.

### Do you think neutral fans will root for Siena being the lower seed?

Probably, yeah. When we played Temple in 1988 there were a whole lot of people rooting for Lehigh. And we took them right to the wire. Now, in 2001 there weren't a whole lot of people rooting for us, but we were on the west coast playing Stanford, so a lot of people were rooting for Stanford. We didn't play well so they didn't get as much to cheer about.

### On what makes Siena special:

I think it's the tradition. You talk to people in their 60's, 70's, 80's; they've been following this program for a very long time. It's had a unique rise. We used to play down at the Armory against Providence and teams like that. We weren't Division I but we were good. And we'd pack the house. So the players that played here have a sense of tradition. And the alumni follow this program. It's very important to our alumni. We also have a very unique fan base because we have a lot of season ticket holders who didn't go here. They follow our team because we play off campus. I think there are some other unique qualities to Siena. It's small, there's only 2,900 students. We eat in the cafeteria with the students. The faculty knows the administration, the administration knows the faculty, and we know the students. Over 9,000 people for the championship game for a school this size says a lot. When we played UAlbany, we had 13,000 people for a mid-major game. So I think I recognize my role in that. It's important we protect the integrity and tradition of this program but it's important that we stay competitive.

## Scouting Siena

The champions of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference come to Tampa riding a season-long six-game winning streak...The high-powered Saints feature a dynamic offense led by three players who each average more than 15 points per game...Just one senior appears on the 2008 postseason roster and all five starters will return next year when Siena figures to be among the most hyped mid-major programs in the nation...But the attention is solely focused on the present for the time being as the Saints make their fourth NCAA appearance Friday following a meteoric rise from last to first in the MAAC in the three years since head coach Fran McCaffery's arrival...If this is your first time seeing Siena, buckle up...McCaffery's motion offense and pressure defense make for an exciting brand of basketball with plenty of points the goal each night...Sophomore point guard Ronald Moore efficiently runs the Saints' attack, pushing the basketball off makes and misses and involving all the players on the floor...Classmate Edwin Ubiles is one of the league's most talented players...The high-flying, above-the-rim talent has had a masterful sophomore campaign, reaching double figures 31 of the 32 times he took the floor...Junior Kenny Hasbrouck is the most experienced starter and was McCaffery's first recruit...Hasbrouck has a smooth game, and like Ubiles he is at his best off the bounce and in transition...The biggest X factor this season has been the emergence of sophomore forward Alex Franklin...Franklin is the team's go-to man inside, plays well above his 6-5 size and is an excellent finisher around the basket...He missed five games with a lingering back injury but has been at his best in recent weeks...The lone starter not mentioned is junior Josh Duell who has the only NCAA Tournament experience on the team...Duell helped Vermont knock off Syracuse in the 2004 NCAA Tournament...Like the Saints, the Catamounts were a #13 seed that year...Duell has showed a tremendous ability to perform under pressure...He was the key in the team's signature win over Stanford and has two game-winning shots to his credit – the most recent in the MAAC semifinals against nemesis Loyola...Siena is the second smallest school in this year's NCAA Tournament field with an enrolment of just 2,900.

## Scouting Vanderbilt

Like the Saints, the Commodores have little trouble scoring the basketball...They enter the NCAA Tournament averaging 80.6 points per game and are led by senior Shan Foster – the associated press SEC Player of the Year...Vanderbilt started the year 16-0 before losing a double overtime decision at Kentucky...The Commodores were 19-0 at home this season, but just 4-6 on the road...They have lost three of their last five games...Five seniors return from last year's team which advanced all the way to the Sweet 16...Vanderbilt is shooting an SEC-best 40.4% from 3-point range and has 299 makes on the season, led by Foster who is shooting 133-281 from beyond the arc...The Commodores are allowing 74.4 points per game – the most in the SEC

## Third Time's the Charm

Fran McCaffery becomes the 31st head coach all-time (and 15th active) to bring three different schools (Lehigh, UNC Greensboro, Siena) to the NCAA Tournament...He is the only one to take three teams that were their conference's only representative the year they advanced...McCaffery is one of just 15 active coaches to have taken three different schools to the Dance...He is 0-2 in NCAA Tournament games.

## First Things First

Edwin Ubiles and Kenny Hasbrouck both lived up to preseason expectations when they were named to the MAAC First Team (3/3)...It was just the second time Siena placed two players on the MAAC First Team (1993 – Lee Matthews and Doremus Bennerman)...It marked the first time any league member had two players named to the MAAC First Team since the year the conference expanded to its current 10 teams (1997-98).

## A For Alex and A's for Josh

Alex Franklin was named to the MAAC Second Team and All-Tournament Team, while junior Josh Duell was a MAAC All-Academic Team honoree...Franklin earned three MAAC Player of the week awards this season and led the Saints in rebounding (eight/game) and field goal percentage (56.6%).

Kenny Hasbrouck was named MAAC Tournament MVP...Alex Franklin, Edwin Ubiles and Tay Fisher were named to the MAAC All-Tournament team.

## Tay's Day

Regardless of how Siena's postseason run concludes, lone senior Tay Fisher has had a storybook end to his career...Fisher is the only holdover from the 2004-2005 team that set a program record with 24 losses...He helped put an exclamation mark on the Saints' dramatic turnaround with a 21-point performance in Siena's 74-53 MAAC title game win over Rider...The effort also coincided with his 22nd birthday...Fisher enters the NCAA Tournament with 222 career 3's, ranking fourth all-time at Siena...All of his 17 field goal attempts during the MAAC Tournament were three-pointers...Fisher made 49% (17-35) of his 3-pointers in road MAAC games this season and has made 30-32 free throws over the last 21 games.

Edwin Ubiles has averaged 19.6 points over the last 10 games...Ubiles has reached double figures in every game but one (Rider 2/10) and scored

# The Last Time

20 points or more 11 times...He was named MAAC Player of the Week December 24, after registering a career-high 29 points in the Holy Cross win...Ubiles is shooting 53% from the field and 44% from 3-point range...Both numbers rank him with the league leaders.

## Protecting the Rock

The Saints have turned the ball over just 11.1 times per game... Siena has had 15 turnovers or fewer in 23 straight games (dating back to December 22 vs. Holy Cross) and more assists than turnovers in 12 straight...Siena owns a MAAC-best +6.3 turnover margin...On the other side of the court, the Saints have forced 17.4 turnovers per game – the most in the MAAC...Siena is averaging 20 points per game off turnovers.

## Franklin Rebounding Nicely

Alex Franklin had his 10th double-double of the season in Siena's MAAC semifinal win over Loyola...He averaged 19.3 points and 8.3 rebounds in Siena's three MAAC Tournament games...He has averaged 18.4 points and 10.3 rebounds over the last nine games...Franklin is shooting 56.6% from the field – the fifth best percentage in the MAAC... Franklin missed five games with a back injury before making his return to the Saints' rotation at Niagara (1/11)...Franklin has a history of big performances when the stakes are high...He scored 27 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in last year's MAAC title game and had career highs with 30 points and 18 rebounds in Siena's BracketBusters win at Boise State.

## Moore Than Assists

Ronald Moore has had 91 assists and just 25 turnovers over the last 17 games...Moore is averaging 5.3 assists and just two turnovers per game this season...He has had more assists than turnovers in all but five of the 58 games he has started...Moore also is averaging 8.7 points and is third on the team with 4.1 rebounds per game...Moore set a career high with 11 assists and had no turnovers in Siena's loss to Syracuse...He followed the effort up with a nine-assist, one-turnover performance in the win over FDU, finishing the NIT Season Tip-Off with 20 assists and just one turnover... In the season-opener at James Madison, he equaled a career-high with 19 points... Moore is second in the MAAC with 5.3 assists and second with a 2.6 assist/turnover ratio.

## Stealing the Show

He played 16 minutes of turnover-free basketball in the Stanford win (11/17), providing a calming influence while running the offense efficiently for the majority of the second half...De La Rosa started and played seven minutes at Cornell (11/25)...He played 12 minutes with two assists and no turnovers against Memphis (1/3), meaning he has played 28 minutes without a turnover against ranked teams this season...De La Rosa has appeared in all but one game this season (at Rider 2/10).

## Introducing Clarence

Freshman Clarence Jackson scored a career-high 13 points in the win at Canisius (1/13)...He had eight points and four steals in the home win over the Griffs...Jackson missed the first five games of the season with an ankle injury... He played 10 minutes, scoring five points and grabbing five rebounds in the home win over Marist and added six points in nine minutes in the road win over the Red Foxes...McCaffery indicated he would have been in the opening day starting lineup.

Siena has averaged 6,162 fans per home game this season...The attendance represents a 5.6% increase from last year's total of 5,834...A crowd of 13,262 turned out for Siena's 75-71 win over crosstown rival UAlbany Saturday...It was the second largest crowd ever to watch a Siena regular-season home game and the fourth largest Siena home attendance in program history...9,279 fans turned out for Siena's MAAC Championship win over Rider at Times Union Center.

## Home Sweet Home

The Saints have won 15 of their last 19 home games...The team has won 14 of its last 16 non-conference home games... Siena had just one home game – its win over Stanford – in the month of November.

## MAAC Daddies

Siena has posted double digit MAAC wins this season for the 11th time in its 19 years in the league – the most of any league member over that span...Siena leads the league in steals, turnover margin and assist/turnover ratio.

## Fantastic Four

Edwin Ubiles, Kenny Hasbrouck, Alex Franklin and Ronald Moore have combined for 71% of the team's scoring production...Ubiles, Hasbrouck and Franklin are each averaging more than 15 points per game – and all three are ranked in the top-10 in the MAAC in scoring...Both Hasbrouck and Ubiles were named to the Preseason All-MAAC First Team...Franklin has been named MAAC Player of the Week three times this season...Ubiles and Franklin were named to the All-Tournament Team and Hasbrouck was named tournament MVP.

## Fresh Face

Ryan Rossiter has played fewer than 10 minutes in each of the last 12 games and scored just five points in the last 10 games combined...Rossiter has started 11 of the Saints' 32 games this season and has averaged 11 minutes per game.

## Party Like It's 1989

The Saints' stunning win over then-#20/20 Stanford November 17 was its first over a ranked opponent since the team defeated the 13th ranked Cardinal in the First Round of the 1989 NCAA Tournament in Greensboro, N.C...It was the team's first win over a ranked opponent at Times Union Center...The victory garnered quite a bit of national attention, and even a vote in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll...Siena's student section stormed the floor following the win.

## Expectations Were High

Siena was the MAAC coaches' choice to win the league following last year's 20-win campaign and MAAC title game appearance...In addition to Preseason First Team All-MAAC selections Kenny Hasbrouck and Edwin Ubiles, six players who averaged 10 minutes or more returned this year...Tay Fisher stands as the only senior on this year's roster.

## It's Been a While

Siena had not been selected as the Preseason MAAC favorite since the 1999-2000 season...That year, the Saints won the MAAC regular season before falling to Iona in the MAAC Championship game...Siena advanced to the Second Round of the Postseason NIT that year and finished with a 24-9 record.

## Youth is Served

Despite the lofty expectations and results, Siena has just three upperclassmen on this year's roster – the fewest in (the 66 year) program history...The Saints have just one senior (Tay Fisher) and two juniors (Kenny Hasbrouck and Josh Duell) on this year's roster...Three members of Siena's spectacular sophomore class start...Fran McCaffery welcomes four new faces this season –Chris De La Rosa, Steven Priestley, Ryan Rossiter and Clarence Jackson.

## The Road Has Been Tough

The Saints had an arduous non-conference schedule that featured four teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last year (UAlbany, Holy Cross, Memphis and Stanford) and one NIT team (Syracuse)... Throw in the road games at WAC leader Boise State, Ivy League winner Cornell and the game with 2004 Elite Eight participant St. Joseph's and you have what

many consider the most difficult schedule the program has assembled in its 31 years at the Division I level.

## McCaffery's Magic

Head coach Fran McCaffery (57-35 at Siena – 3rd season, 196-162 overall – 12th season) has completely reversed the fortunes of Siena's program in his two+ years at the helm...McCaffery took over a program that had set a program record with 24 losses in 2004-2005 and promptly guided Siena to the fifth greatest turnaround in all of Division I (15-13)...Last year he led the Saints to a 20-win season and MAAC title appearance...In his first season, all 10 coaches picked Siena to finish last in the league's preseason poll (the team finished 4th)...Just three years later, Siena won the MAAC Championship.

## ...And This Shouldn't be a Surprise

McCaffery has a history of turning programs around...As the youngest head coach in the country at age 26, he inherited a Lehigh program in 1985 that had posted just four winning seasons in the 55 years prior to his arrival...He guided the Engineers to a pair of winning seasons in his three years at the helm, culminating with the 1987-88 team's 21-win, NCAA Tournament campaign...After spending 11 years as an assistant coach at Notre Dame on the staffs of Digger Phelps and John MacLeod, McCaffery accepted his second head coaching position at UNC-Greensboro in 1999...He quickly got things moving in the right direction, overseeing the 18th-most improved record in the country in his first season...In his second year, the Spartans won the So-Con Championship, advancing to the NCAA Tournament...The team posted its first 20-win season since joining the league the following year and was rewarded with a postseason NIT bid...McCaffery has also won the right way...When hired at Siena, 100% of the student-athletes he had coached - who exhausted their eligibility - graduated... McCaffery was a high school standout in Philadelphia, garnering the nickname "White Magic" during his playing days at LaSalle High School.

## Removing the Red Shirt

Three Siena players red-shirted last season, receiving an additional year of eligibility...Josh Duell sat out per NCAA regulations after transferring from Vermont...Erik Harris took advantage of the one-time NCAA red-shirt policy to fine tune his skills and James Carr was awarded a medical red-shirt after briefly appearing in five games.

## Back to Back

The Saints have posted back-to-back 20-win season for the fifth time since turning Division I (1976-77)...Siena won 20 games this season for the 16th time in program history.

## Seeing Plenty of Siena

The Saints had 14 regular-season games telecast this season, including 13 of the 18 scheduled since the start of the calendar year...The record 14 telecasts included five national telecasts: three ESPNU games, the ESPN360.com contest and an ESPN2 game...The entire MAAC Tournament was telecast, highlighted by Monday's (3/10) ESPN2 Championship game – Siena's fourth ESPN2 appearance in the last two years (1-3).

AP - Josh Duell scored 16 points to lead Siena over No. 20 Stanford 79-67, a win reminiscent of the Saints' stunning victory over the Cardinal in the 1989 NCAA tournament.

Alex Franklin had 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds for Siena, and Kenny Hasbrouck added 12 points in a rare meeting between the teams. In 1989, a 14th-seeded Siena squad knocked No. 3-seed Stanford out of the NCAA tournament in the first round with an 80-78 win.

On Saturday, the Siena student section raced onto the court after the final buzzer sounded. It was Siena's first win over a ranked opponent in 18 years.

Edwin Ubiles scored 11 points for the Saints (2-2). Trailing by one midway through the second half, Siena broke the game open with an 11-0 run, including three straight 3-pointers, two by Duell and the other from Tay Fisher to make it 56-46.

Kenny Brown had 12 points for Stanford (4-1). Lawrence Hill scored 11 points, while Robin Lopez had eight points and 11 rebounds.

The Saints, up by seven with eight minutes left in the first half, eventually took a 33-31 lead into the break. The game featured 10 ties and eight lead changes.

The Saints cut the lead to its final margin in the last minute on a Hasbrouck 3 and a Ronald Moore layup. The game-ending sequence resulted after Darryl Crawford missed a 3 and Alex Franklin corralled Chris Smith's errant follow up with four seconds left.

Franklin scored 12 of his 17 points in the second half and rounded out his sixth double double of the season with 13 rebounds. But the sophomore misfired on five of his eight free throws and Siena shot just 9-17 from the line on the night.

Alex Franklin had career highs with 30 points and 18 rebounds and Siena never trailed in a 93-70 BracketBusters win over WAC leader Boise State at Taco Bell Arena in Boise, Idaho Saturday night. Edwin Ubiles added 22 points and Kenny Hasbrouck had 19 as Siena clicked on all cylinders and won with stunning ease before 5,982 fans and a national audience on ESPN360.com.

Kenny Hasbrouck scored 32 points and Edwin Ubiles added 25 to lead Siena past Niagara 94-78 in front of 7,366 fans at Times Union Center. With the win, Siena remains in a tie for first place in the MAAC standings. The Saints will play for a share of the league's regular-season title Sunday at Saint Peter's.

**Siena 65, Loyola 63 - MAAC Semis**

Junior forward Josh Duell scored his only basket of the game with 20 seconds to go capping off a miraculous comeback from 17 points down as the Saints stunned Loyola in the MAAC Tournament Semis, 65-63. Sophomore forward Alex Franklin had another monster game posting 22 points and 12 rebounds, propelling Siena to the Tournament Championship game for a second consecutive year.

After Siena (21-10) took a 12-11 lead on a free throw by Alex Franklin at the 12:36 mark, the Greyhounds (19-14) erupted with a 27-9 run over the following nine minutes building a lead of 17 (38-21) capped off by a Brian Rudolph three.

The Greyhounds connected on five first half threes, but the Saints reeled off seven quick points to end the half to pull within 38-28 at intermission. Franklin posted 16 of Siena's 28 first half points.

In the second half Siena would continue to slowly chip away at the deficit, getting as close as four (45-41) on a Franklin lay-up with 12:12 remaining. The Green and Gold dominated the paint throughout, posting a 36-22 edge in points in the paint.

Unable to get any closer than four for most of the half, the Saints finally cut the deficit to two on a Kenny Hasbrouck jumper off an inbounds with 2:16 to go. The junior stepped up in the second half when it mattered most, scoring all 17 of his points after intermission.

After the Saints earned a tie at 63 on a Franklin tip-in moments later, it was Duell who came up as the unlikely hero. Scoreless over his first 27 minutes of action, Duell took a feed from Hasbrouck and hit an off-balance shot off the window as he was getting fouled to send the partisan Siena crowd into bedlam.

The Greyhounds would get two final chances to answer back, but the final shot attempt by Rudolph was swatted away by Franklin to send the Saints into the Championship game. The Saints played outstanding team defense down the stretch, holding Loyola scoreless over the final 3:43 of the contest.

Siena placed four in double figures, led by Franklin and Hasbrouck along with Edwin Ubiles and Ronald Moore who added 14 and 10 respectively. Marquis Sullivan came off the bench to lead all Loyola scorers with 14 points, connecting on four of his seven three point attempts.

**Siena 74, Rider 53 - MAAC Championship**  
**March 10 - Times Union Center, Albany, N.Y.**

Tay Fisher matched his career high with six 3-pointers in scoring 21 points, and top-seeded Siena beat Rider 74-53 to win the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship and earn the school's fourth berth in the NCAA tournament.

It was the sixth straight win for Siena (22-10), which last went to the NCAA tournament in 2002. Rider (23-10), the second seed and seeking its first tournament appearance since 1994, likely is headed to the NIT.

Kenny Hasbrouck had 17 points, Edwin Ubiles added 15, and Alex Franklin 10 for the Saints.

MAAC player of the year Jason Thompson led Rider with 22 points and 12 rebounds and Mike Ringgold had eight points. Harris Mansell, who was averaging 14, finished with just five.

The Saints, who entered the game shooting only 25 percent on 3s in the previous five games, were 6-for-13 in the opening period. They scored 11 points off the Broncs' 11 turnovers to take a 41-30 lead into the break despite being outrebounded 24-14 and 9-0 on the offensive glass.

If not for Thompson, who scored 32 points - including the 2000th of his career - and grabbed 18 rebounds in Rider's 76-71 semifinal victory over Marist, the halftime deficit would have been much more daunting. He made a pair of 3s from the top of the key in scoring 14 points, but never became a factor in the second half.

Siena overcame a 17-point first-half deficit and beat Loyola 65-63 in the semifinals on Duell's go-ahead basket with 19.4 seconds remaining. There was little drama in this one.

Rider moved within nine points three times in the second half. But after Kamron Warner hit a 3 from the left corner to pull the Broncs within 54-45, Ubiles hit a baseline jumper, Fisher swished a 3 from the top of the key, and Hasbrouck made a midrange jumper to give Siena a 61-45 lead with 8:17 left.

Fisher, who turned 22 on Monday, followed with another 3 less than a minute later and the Broncs were finished.
