No. 11 Vanderbilt Opens NCAA Tournament Against Indiana State

The No. 11 Vanderbilt women's tennis team opens its 14th straight NCAA Tournament against Indiana State on Friday at 1 p.m. at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores are also hosting the first and second rounds of the tournament for the 10th consecutive year.

Vanderbilt enters the NCAA Tournament with an 18-5 record and a No. 11 national ranking. The Commodores dropped a 4-2 decision to No. 5 Florida in their last match at the SEC Tournament.

The Commodores have enjoyed success in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the round of 16 in the last nine tournaments. Vanderbilt has an all-time record of 30-13 in the NCAA Tournament and is a perfect 18-0 at the Currey Tennis Center since 1999.


Indiana State has a 13-6 record and is currently ranked 70th by the ITA. The Sycamores earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after defeating Wichita State 4-3 in the championship match of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Indiana State has won 11 consecutive matches and finished the MVC regular season with a perfect 8-0 record.

Kentucky faces Boise State in the other first round matchup at 10 a.m. on Friday. The winner of that match and the Vanderbilt-Indiana State match will meet on Saturday at Noon (CT) for the right to advance to Tulsa, Okla., and the round of 16.

Tickets for both Friday's and Saturday's action can be purchased the day of the event. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$3 for children and college students with valid IDs.

Home Sweet Home

Vanderbilt was selected as a host school for the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the 10th consecutive year. Vanderbilt is a perfect 18-0 at home in the NCAA Tournament since 1999. Last season, the Commodores defeated Murray State and Tennessee, both by 4-0 scores to advance to the round of 16.

<u>Commodores Seek 10th Consecutive</u> <u>Sweet 16</u>

The Commodores enter the 2008 season looking for their 10th consecutive appearance in the NCAA round of 16. Last season, the Commodores made it nine in a row by easily dispatching of Murray State and Tennessee in the opening two rounds played at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores fell in the round of 16 to perennial power Stanford. The Commodores have made the NCAA Tournament in each of Geoff Macdonald's 13 years with the team, advancing as far as the national championship match in 2001.

The Coaches

Vanderbilt: Geoff Macdonald is in his 14th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's tennis program. Under his direction, the Commodores have made 13 consecutive NCAA Tournaments and have been to the round of 16 in the last nine tournaments. Macdonald owns a 299-94 record at Vanderbilt, making him the winningest coach in Commodore history. He has been named Coach of the Year three times, including earning that recognition from the SEC in 2000. Macdonald recently picked up his 400th career victory in Vanderbilt's 4-3 victory over Notre Dame. His career record stands at 413-130.

Indiana State: Malik Tabet is in his fourth season at the helm of Indiana State. Tabet recently earned 2008 MVC Coach of the Year, his second coach of the year honor from the Missouri Valley Conference. In 2008, Tabet led the Sycamores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history. Tabet was the 2007 Midwest Region Coach of the Year. Tabet has compiled an impressive 30-4 mark in MVC play and an overall record of 60-31.

Scouting Indiana State

Indiana State has a 13-6 record and is currently ranked 70th by the ITA. The Sycamores earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after defeating Wichita State 4-3 in the championship match of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Indiana State has won 11 consecutive matches and finished the MVC regular season with a perfect 8-0 record.

The Sycamores have one player ranked nationally in singles. Jennifer Migan is ranked 123rd and recently received an invite to the NCAA Singles Championships to be played in Tulsa.

In Our Last Match...

AUBURN, Ala. - The No. 12 Vanderbilt (18-5, 7-4 SEC) women's tennis team picked up singles victories from seniors Amanda Taylor and Taka Bertrand, but it wasn't enough as No. 5 Florida (20-1, 11-0 SEC) claimed a 4-2 victory in the semifinals of the Southeastern Conference Women's Tennis Tournament on a beautiful Saturday afternoon at the Yarbrough Tennis Center.

Florida jumped out to an early lead by capturing the doubles point. The 50th-ranked duo of Julia Cohen and Anastasia Revzina struck the first blow for Florida, defeating Taka Bertrand and Keilly Ulery 8-3 at No. 3 doubles.

The Gator tandem of Whitney Benik and Csilla Borsanyi clinched the doubles point for Florida with an 8-3 victory over Vanderbilt's Caroline Ferrell and Catherine Newman at the second doubles position.

The match between No. 6 Megan Alexander

and Marrit Boonstra and VU's No. 29 Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery at No. 1 doubles was suspended with Florida leading 7-5 when the doubles point was decided.

Florida extended its lead to 2-0 when Boonstra defeated No. 62 Courtney Ulery in straight sets. Boonstra won the opening set 6-2, and captured the second set 6-0 for the win.

Vanderbilt registered its first point of the match at No. 1 singles. No. 23 Taylor had no trouble with SEC Freshman of the Year and No. 27 Cohen, winning 6-2, 6-0. Taylor ran her singles winning streak to eight and improved to 19-4 in dual match play.

No. 118 Bertrand's win at No. 3 singles squared the match at two. The Vanderbilt senior won 6-3, 6-2 over Benik to improve her dual match record to 20-3.

The Gators regained the advantage with Lolita Frangulyan's win at No. 6 singles over Ferrell. Frangulyan won the opening set 6-2, and was victorious in the second set 7-5.

Florida clinched the match with No. 33 Borsanyi's win at No. 2 singles over No. 46 Newman. Borsanyi won in straight sets 6-3, 6-4 to send the Gators into the championship match.

The singles match between No. 110 Revzina and Keilly Ulery was suspended when Florida clinched the match. Ulery won the opening set 7-6 (2), but Revzina battled back to win the second set 6-2. Revzina had a 3-1 advantage in the third set when the match was stopped.

Florida now leads the overall series against Vanderbilt 35-2 and is a perfect 9-0 against the Commodores when the two teams meet in the SEC Tournament.

Three Commodores Selected for NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships

Senior Amanda Taylor and sophomore Catherine Newman were selected to represent Vanderbilt at the NCAA Singles Championships May 21-26 in Tulsa, Okla. The Commodore duo of Taylor and Courtney Ulery were also awarded a bid in the NCAA Doubles Championships.

"I'm delighted for all three of them," Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald said. "This is quite an accomplishment for Courtney (Ulery) and for Catherine to be going for the second straight year as a sophomore is also a great accomplishment. I'm excited for all three of the girls and happy that Vanderbilt will be well represented."

The singles field for the NCAA Championships consists of the top 64 players, while 32 teams are selected for the doubles field.

Taylor, a 2008 First Team All-SEC recipient, will be making her second-straight appearance in the NCAA Singles Championships. The Richland, Wash., native advanced to the round

of 32 in last year's singles championships, defeating Southern California's Sarah Fansler in the first round. Taylor, currently ranked 17th nationally in singles by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association, finished the regular season with a 19-4 dual match record and 26-8 overall singles record.

Newman will also be making her second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Singles Championships. Currently ranked 48th in singles, Newman was a second-team All-SEC honoree. She also advanced to the round of 32 in last year's singles championships, upsetting No. 19 Laura Vallverdu from Miami in the first round. This season, Newman has compiled a 14-8 dual match record in singles and a 24-11 overall singles record.

The doubles team of Taylor and Courtney Ulery were selected for the NCAA Doubles Championships. Taylor will be making her third appearance in the doubles championships, while Ulery will be making her initial appearance. Taylor becomes the first Vanderbilt player to make three appearances in the NCAA Doubles Championships with three different partners. Last season, Taylor teamed with Amanda Fish and advanced to the quarterfinals before falling. Taylor and Ulery are currently ranked 21st in doubles and have a 15-6 dual match record, including an 8-3 mark in conference matches.

Vanderbilt wins Tolbert Cup

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team was awarded the Tolbert Cup at the annual Black & Gold Banquet. Named for Ryan Tolbert, who won Vanderbilt's only individual national championship in track in 1996, the Tolbert Cup recognizes the team with the best comination of community service, athletic performance and academic achievement.

Doubles Point Critical for 'Dores

The doubles point has proven critical for the Commodores in 2008. The Black and Gold has won the doubles point 15 times during the season. Vanderbilt is 14-1 in matches where it wins the doubles point, with its only loss coming to No. 10 Georgia.

Reaching the Century Mark

Two of Vanderbilt's seniors have reached the 100 singles wins mark in their Vanderbilt career. Taka Bertrand is the all-time leader in singles wins with 122, while Amanda Taylor has won 106 matches in her four-year Vanderbilt career. Bertrand is also nearing the 100-win mark in doubles play, as she currently has 98 doubles victories in her career.

Bertrand Sets Vanderbilt All-Time Singles Wins Record

Senior Taka Bertrand became the winningest singles player in Vanderbilt history as she defeated Auburn's Melissa Koning in straight sets 6-3, 6-4. The win was the 115th of Bertrand's career, surpassing the pervious record of 114 held by Julie Ditty. Bertrand's career record is 122-34.

Four Commodores Earn SEC Weekly Honors

Junior Courtney Ulery, seniors Taka Bertrand and Amanda Taylor and freshman Keilly Ulery have all earned weekly honors from the SEC this season. Ulery received the honor after her performance against No. 23 Michigan and No. 9 Notre Dame. Ulery, who opened the spring season with seven straight victories, defeated No. 88 Colleen Rielley to even the match against the Fighting Irish. Ulery also partnered with Amanda Taylor to down the 50th-ranked doubles team of Kali Krisik and Rielley 8-5 in Vanderbilt's win over Notre Dame.

Bertrand received the award on March 12 after picking up three singles victories the week before. One of those victories was an 6-2, 6-3 upset win over No. 33 Kirsten Flower of Georgia Tech. The award marked the third time in her career that she had received the recognition.

Taylor received the award a week later on March 19. She defeated two ranked opponents, including No. 88 Liset Brito. After dropping the first set 6-4 to Brito and falling behind 5-2 in the second set, Taylor came back to win the second set 7-5 and won a 10point tiebreaker 10-2 to clinch the match.

Keilly Ulery earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after her performance in the season finale against Kentucky. Ulery came back to defeat Whitney Spencer. Ulery was down 5-2 in the third set, before coming back to win the next five games to win the set 7-5 and capture the match.

'Dores Make History in Albuquerque

The 2008 Vanderbilt women's tennis team made history with the pair of victories it picked up in Albuquerque, N.M. With the wins, the 2008 squad became the first Vanderbilt team to win a match in the Mountain Time zone. The 'Dores defeated New Mexico 5-2 and bettered Colorado 7-0.

Macdonald One Win away from 300 at VU

Vanderbilt head coach Geoff Macdonald stands just one victory shy of 300 in his career as the Commodore head coach. Macdonald's 299-95 record at Vanderbilt makes him the winningest coach in school history. Macdonald also picked up another milestone against No. 9 Notre Dame, picking up his

Vanderbilt Picked Third in SEC East in Preseason Poll

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team was picked to finish third in the SEC East by the league coaches in a poll released January 16. Florida was selected to win the overall league title.

The Commodores are ranked 16th in the preseason poll released last week by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. The `Dores return five letterwinners and four starters from a team that finished 19-9 last season and advanced to the NCAA round of 16 for the 10th consecutive year.

Florida received 67 points in the poll and eight votes as the overall league champion. Perennial power Georgia was picked to finish second in the eastern division, with 59 points and two votes as overall league champion. The Commodores were selected third by the coaches, receiving two votes for overall league champion and 46 points overall. Rounding out the predicted eastern division standings was South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky.

In the west, Arkansas was predicted to





win the division, followed closely behind by LSU. Auburn was picked third in the division, while Ole Miss was expected to finish fourth. Alabama and Mississippi State were predicted to finish fifth and sixth, respectively.

The preseason poll is voted on by the SEC women's tennis coach and is based on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 tally.

Familiar Face Joins Commodore Coaching Staff

Former Vanderbilt standout Aleke Tsoubanos joins the Commodore coaching staff this season as an assistant coach. Tsoubanos enjoyed one of the most decorated careers in Vanderbilt women's tennis history. She earned NCAA All-American honors from 2002-04, was a three-time ITA All-American and was a first-team All-SEC selection. Tsoubanos still holds the record for most doubles victories in a season and in a career. Before returning to Vanderbilt, she played three years of professional tennis and most recently played for the St. Louis Aces in World Team Tennis.

A Perfect 13

Junior Courtney Ulery (Wellington, Fla.) enjoyed a breakout fall season, finishing with a perfect 13-0 record. Ulery won her singles flight at the Furman Fall Classic, the Hoosier Classic, the June Stewart Invitational and the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic. During her run, Ulery defeated three nationally ranked players. Because of her success, the previously unraked Ulery stormed into the rankings, earning a No. 13 ranking in the first national poll released by the ITA.

Vanderbilt Signs Three in Fall

Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald announced that Chelsea Preeg, Heather Steinbauer and Jacqueline Wu have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play women's tennis for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2008.

"I'm thrilled to sign these three players," Macdonald said. "They are future stars at Vanderbilt and great student-athletes. They were widely recruited across the country. We're thrilled to be able to land what I think is one of the best recruiting classes in the country."

Preeg from Naples, Fla., has been one of the top ranked junior players in the United States for the past eight years. Currently ranked sixth in the girls 18 and under division, Preeg has won numerous junior championships and has been ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation. Preeg captured the Florida State Girls 18 and under Championships when she was only 14 years old. She chose Vanderbilt over Clemson, Duke and North Carolina.

A native of The Woodlands, Texas, Stein-

bauer currently attends The Woodlands College Park High School. She is ranked No. 36 in the country according to tennisrecruiting.net and is the No. 2 ranked player in the state of Texas. Steinbauer has finished highly in several national events, including winning the girls' 18 division at the 2007 Houston Coca-Cola SCMZ and finishing second at the 2007 USTA National Opens. She chose Vanderbilt over Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and TCU.

Wu from Holmdel, N.J., is ranked 59th in the country and is the top ranked player in her state, according to tennisrecruiting.net. She advanced to the semifinals at the 2007 International Grass Court Championships. Wu was also a member of the victorious East team at the 2006 USTA National Girls' 18 Team Championship.

Four Commodores Ranked Nationally in Singles

Vanderbilt has four players ranked nationally in singles in the latest poll released by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Senior Amanda Taylor is the highest-ranked Commodore, coming in at No. 17. Taylor has a 19-4 dual match record and has won 11 of her last 12 matches.

Sophomore Catherine Newman is ranked 48th in the latest poll. Newman is 14-8 on the season in singles play.

Junior Courtney Ulery is the third Commodore ranked in singles, coming in at No. 69. Ulery has a record of 15-7 in singles.

Senior Taka Bertrand checks in at No. 117 in the latest singles poll. Bertrand has the best singles record on the Commodore squad, with a 20-3 mark.

SEC Title For Newman

Sophomore Catherine Newman (Greensboro, N.C.) finished the fall season in style, winning the singles 'A' flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic in Auburn, Ala. Newman, who was ranked No. 28 in the fall by the ITA, defeated three ranked players to win the title, including No. 17 Megan Alexander of Florida in the semifinals and South Carolina's Gira Schofield, ranked 36th, in the finals. Newman also won three matches at the ITA Southeast Indoor Championships. For the fall season, Newman finished with a 10-3 record.

Beating No. 1

The highlight of senior Amanda Taylor's fall came at the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships. In the opening round of the main singles draw, Taylor defeated No. 1 Megan Falcon of LSU in straight sets 6-2, 6-3. Assistant coach Aleke Tsoubanos called Taylor's performance "some of the most flawless tennis I've ever seen her play." Taylor went on to fall in the second round of the tournament, dropping a hard-fought, three-set match to No. 14 Laura Vallverdu of Miami (Fla.).

Geoff Macdonald

Virginia (1981), 14th Year Record at Vanderbilt: 299-95 (.759) Career Record: 413-131 (.759)

Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season as the head coach of the women's tennis team. During the previous 13 seasons, the two-time SEC Coach of the Year has placed the Commodores among the nation's elite programs on a consistent basis.

Since Macdonald joined the Vanderbilt staff in 1994, the Commodore tennis program has developed a reputation for rapid player improvement, strong commitments to coaching, and unmatched excellence on the court and in the classroom.

Before Macdonald's arrival, the Vanderbilt women's tennis program had never been ranked higher than No. 28 in the nation. Under his leadership, the Commodores have finished no lower than No. 16 in each of the past nine years, including a school record No. 2 ranking at the end of the 2004 season. Vanderbilt has ranked in the top three of the Southeastern Conference eight of the past 10 years, and has cultivated several nationally ranked players and doubles teams.

Last season may have been one of Macdonald's finest coaching jobs. After starting off the season 2-5, the Commodores rebounded to won their next 12 matches. The Commodores finished third in the Southeastern Conference with a 9-2 record and advanced to their 13th straight NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt easily disposed of Murray State and Tennessee in the first two rounds of the tournament before falling to perennial powerhouse Stanford in the round of 16. The Commodores finished the year with a 19-9 record and were ranked 16th by the ITA.

While Macdonald's leadership continues to improve the Commodore program every season, Macdonald's impact was felt immediately in his very first year at Vanderbilt in 1995. The team finished the year 16-8, including an 8-3 mark in the SEC and advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history.

Once Vanderbilt began its rise to the top, the achievements kept coming. In 1996, the Commodores posted a 24-7 record, finished second in the SEC, advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time and, once again, earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, advancing to the Round of 16. The team's 24 wins were the third most in the nation that year.

The team continued to improve with each successful season and in 2001 the 'Dores finally found themselves in the national spotlight as they competed in the NCAA finals. The event marked the first time that any Vanderbilt sports team had played for a national championship. Despite falling to the Stanford Cardinal, Macdonald's squad ended the season with a 26-5 record and a No. 4 national ranking, while three singles players and two doubles teams earned individual bids to the NCAA championships.

The following season, Macdonald not only matched the success of the previous year, but led the 'Dores to a record setting 27 wins. The team also advanced to the finals of the National Team Indoors tournament, which features sixteen of the top ranked teams in the country. Following the season, Sarah Riske and Aleke Tsoubanos were both named ITA All-Americans.

In 2003, Macdonald oversaw the final year of Sarah Riske's career, who became a two-time All-American in both singles and doubles. Riske left VU as the winningest doubles player, but Tsoubanos has since grabbed that title.

In 2004, the Commodores returned to the Final Four in the NCAA Tournament where they lost to undefeated Stanford, the eventual national champions. The 2004 Commodore team included All American, All Academic and ITA Scholar Aleke Tsoubanos who is entering her first year as an assistant for the women's tennis team. Other honors achieved by Commodores included Annie Menees' All Academic and ITA Scholar awards, while Audra Falk and Kelly Schmandt landed All-American honors.

In 2006, the Commodores posted a 23-5 record en route to the team's eighth consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, despite the young team's lack of senior representatives. Following the season, junior Amanda Fish became the seventh

Commodore under Macdonald to receive ITA All-American honors.

Macdonald has earned three Coach of the Year honors, including SEC recognition for his 2000 team, which included four ITA ranked singles players. He previously earned the title at Duke and Louisiana State University, where he began his coaching career in 1988.

Before coming to Nashville, Macdonald was the head coach at Duke University. Macdonald was honored with ACC Coach of the Year honors in 1992. While in Durham, he guided the Blue Devils to three conference championships and three appearances in the NCAA tournament, where Duke made two appearances in the quarterfinals and one semifinal appearance.

During his three years with the Tigers, Macdonald took LSU from last in the SEC to the NCAA Championship as the No. 13 seed in just three years. Following the Tigers' 1991 season, Macdonald was named the SEC Coach of the Year. Macdonald amassed a 50-24 record while at the helm of the LSU women's tennis program.

As a player at the University of Virginia, Macdonald capped off a successful collegiate career by winning the ACC singles title in 1981. He advanced to the NCAA Championship, where he defeated David Pate in the first round.

Macdonald was named the ACC's Most Valuable Player and also won the league's Sportsmanship Award. He finished second to basketball great Ralph Sampson in the Athlete of the Year voting at Virginia in 1981.

After his collegiate career, Macdonald played professionally for three years. Macdonald scored wins over David Pate, Wally Masur, Jacob Hlasek and Juan Aguilera. He also gained Grand Slam experience, playing in the U.S. Open. Among his victories was the Florida State Closed Men's Singles Championship.

Following his pro playing career, Macdonald became a private instructor until being named head coach at LSU. And now, as a Commodore, Macdonald believes the climate at Vanderbilt is right to produce national championship caliber teams. And, toward that end, he adheres to a simple coaching philosophy: Hard work and hours of individual attention for each player every week.

Macdonald is married to Kate Daniels, a highly acclaimed English professor at Vanderbilt, who also has taught at Wake Forest, LSU, Virginia, UMass and Bennington College. They have three children – Sam, 21; Gus, 16; and Jane, 14.






