#18/19 Vanderbilt Home For Showdown With Auburn

#18/19 Vanderbilt returns home to the friendly confines of Memorial Gym for a Saturday afternoon tip-off against SEC West Division foe Auburn at 4 p.m. CST. FSN South will carry the game live on television, and Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson will have the call on the Vanderbilt/ISP Radio Network.

Saturday's game with the Tigers is the first appearance for the Commodores at Memorial Gym since January 19, when Vanderbilt came away with a 92-76 win over LSU. VU is 13-0 on its home floor in 2007-08, and dating back to last season, Vanderbilt has won 26 of its last 27 games played in Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt has lost two consecutive games and four out of its last five, all on the road in the Southeastern Conference. The Commodores have played and lost at four of the toughest places to play in the SEC - at Kentucky, Tennessee, Florida, and Ole Miss, to open league play. The Commodores return home to play Auburn, but then hit the road for two more at Georgia (2/6) and at South Carolina (2/9), before returning home for four straight.

Against Ole Miss, the Commodores trailed by only three at the half, 29-26, and by three with 8:08 to go in regulation, 52-49. Ole Miss then reeled off a 15-2 run over the next 5:43

Season Tickets Sold Out!

Season tickets for the 2007-08 season are sold out for this season. There will be no individual game tickets for the SEC season. It marks the first time since the 1992-93 season that Memorial Gym has sold out.

to put the game out of reach.

Shan Foster scored 14 points to lead the Commodores in Oxford. Foster moved past VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95) for third place all-time on the Commodore all-time scoring list. He now has 1,723 career points, one point shy of the 2nd place position, currently occupied by Phil Cox (1982-85).

A.J. Ogilvy was the only other Commodore in double figures with ten points.

Vanderbilt and Auburn will meet for the 127th time, with the Commodores holding a 75-51 advantage in the series. All-time in Nashville, VU is 44-16 against the Tigers. Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is a career 5-5 against the Tigers, and 4-0 against Auburn at Memorial Gym.

Scouting Auburn

Auburn enters the game with a 12-7 overall record, 2-4 in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers lost their last time out against LSU, 81-80, at home on Wednesday night. Quan Prowell led all Tiger scorers and rebounders with 26 points and seven rebounds, respectively.

Rasheem Barret scored a game-high 22 points as Auburn held off Vanderbilt for a 68-65 victory in both teams' conference opener. Josh Dollard and Korvotney Barber had 12 points each to round out the double-digit scoring for the Tigers.

It was a close game throughout with the lead changing eight times and eight tied scores.

Auburn (11-5, 1-0 SEC) led 38-31 at the half and built a 12-point advantage with 16:20 left on a 3-pointer by Dollard. However, Vanderbilt rallied back and tied the game at 51 on a pair of free throws by Ross Neltner at 9:25. The Commodores even grabbed a four-point lead at 60-56 after a layup by Jeramine Beal at 4:55.

But Auburn outscored Vanderbilt 12-5 the rest of the way. Barber broke a 61-61 tie on a layup with 3:05 left to play and the Tigers never trailed again.

Vanderbilt (10-5, 0-1) was led by Dan Cage with 19 points and Shan Foster posted his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Stallings Versus Auburn

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is a career 5-5 against the Tigers, and 4-0 against Auburn at Memorial Gym.

Stallings Gets 150th Win As VU Coach

Kevin Stallings got his 150th win as head coach of Vanderbilt after the Commodores' 91-88 win over South Alabama on November 29. He's only the third coach in Commodore history to record at least 150 victories.

Dores' Strong At Memorial Gym

The 'Dores are 13-0 on their home floor this year, and dating back to last season, Vanderbilt has won 26 of its last 27 games played in Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt On The Road In Tough Environments

Vanderbilt is 0-4 in SEC road contests so far this season, but those four places are four of the toughest home courts in the SEC. Here's a look at those teams' accolades on their home floors.

Kentucky - The 'Cats are 410-55 all-time at Rupp Arena.

Tennessee - The Volunteers have won 27 in a row at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Florida - The Gators are 12-1 this year at the O'Connell Center and 159-27 under Billy Donovan.

Ole Miss - The Rebels are 25-1 in their last three seasons under Andy Kennedy.

Commodores Struggling In SEC Play

Vanderbilt, currently with a record of 2-4 in SEC play, has seen their offensive numbers decrease since league play started. In non-conference play, the Commodores averaged 87.3 points per game in 15 contests, but so far in SEC competition, VU is averaging 71.2 points per game. Vanderbilt is shooting only 42.0% from the field in SEC play, compared to 49.2% in non-conference action, and from three, VU is converting on 32.4% of its shots, compared to 45.3% in the first 15 games of the season.

McClellan Makes First Career Start

Freshman forward Darshawn McClellan made his first collegiate start against Ole Miss on January 30. It was the first starting lineup change for the 'Dores in 18 games.

Two Freshman Start For Vanderbilt For First Time Since...

Freshman forward Darshawn McClellan and freshman center A.J. Ogilvy were in the starting lineup against Ole Miss, the first time two freshman had been in the starting lineup since March 23, 2005, when Vanderbilt played Memphis in the postseason NIT. Then-freshmen Shan

Foster and DeMarre Carroll started for the Commodores against the Tigers.

Senior-Laden 'Dores

Vanderbilt is one of only two teams in the SEC (Arkansas) to have at least four seniors averaging over 15.0 minutes per contest. Commodore seniors Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, Alan Metcalfe, and Ross Neltner all average over 15 minutes per game for Vanderbilt.

Helpers Galore...

Vanderbilt is second in the SEC in assists per game at 18.52, and the Commodores have an assist on 66.2% of their baskets this season.

VU Goes 16-0 To Start 2007-08

The Commodores' 16-0 start was the best start for a Vanderbilt basketball team in the history of the university. VU has been playing basketball since 1900-01.

2007 Calendar Year Ties For Best Ever

Vanderbilt had 26 wins in the 2007 year tied for the most successful calendar years in the history of the program. The 1965 calendar year also saw the Commodores win 26 games.

Dynamic Duo

Senior Shan Foster and freshman A.J. Ogilvy rank four and six, respectively, in scoring in the Southeastern Conference as of January 31. Foster pours in 19.2 points per contest, while Ogilvy adds 17.7 points per game, and leads all SEC freshmen.

Shan Foster Now School's Three-Point Made Leader

Shan Foster made two threes against South Carolina on January 9, which pushed him into first place in the Vanderbilt annals for three-pointers made in a career. Foster passed VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95), who ended his career with 296 threes. Foster currently has 312 made three pointers in his career.

Foster Moves Up Career Scoring List

Senior Shan Foster, after his 14-point performance against Mississippi on January 30, he moved past VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95) for third place all-time on the Commodore all-time scoring list. He now has 1,723 career points, one point shy of the 2nd place position, currently occupied by Phil Cox (1982-85).

Foster needs 169 points to over come Matt Freije for the all-time scoring record at Vanderbilt. Freije, who played from 2001-04, scored 1,891 points in his career.

Foster To Make 110th Start Vs. Auburn

Senior Shan Foster will play in his 120th game as a Vanderbilt Commodore this Saturday vs. Auburn, and will make his 110th career start. Senior Alex Gordon will also be playing in his 120th career game.

Shan One Of SEC's Best

Senior Shan Foster ranks in the top 30 in the SEC (all games) in scoring (4th, 19.2 ppg), rebounding (28th, 4.8 rpg), field goal percentage (7th, .500), 3-point field goal percentage (1st, .466), 3-point field goals made (1st, 3.86), and minutes played (10th, 33.33 mpg).

A.J. Ogilvy One of Nation's Top Freshmen

6'11 freshman center A.J. Ogilvy has started his first season in collegiate basketball with a bang.

The Sydney, Australia native has scored 20 or more points nine times thus far in 2007-08, and has reached double-digits in 20 of his first 21 games as a collegian.

Ogilvy's scoring averages is the best in the SEC for a freshman, and ranks as one of the best freshman scorers in the nation so far.

Ogilvy is on pace to become the first center to average double-digit points since Greg LaPointe in the 2000-01 season (11.1), and could challenge Clyde Lee for the best season ever by a Vanderbilt center (22.6 ppg in 1965-66).

Best Collegiate Start For A VU Freshman Since...

Ogilvy made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action on November 10, the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since **Phil Cox** scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

Ogilvy Named SEC Freshman Of The Week For Third Time

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Dec. 31-Jan. 7 for the third time and the second consecutive week when he averaged 20.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. Ogilvy tallied his second double-double of the year with 25 points and 11 rebounds against UMass, with all 11 rebounds coming in the second half. He also won the award for the week of Dec. 24-31 for his 21-point, nine rebound performance against UT Martin and Nov. 5-12 for his play against Austin Peay, when he scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

Vanderbilt Among Nation's Best In 3-Pt Field Goal Percentage

As of January 31, Vanderbilt is eighth in the nation in 3-point FG % at 41.2%. Shan Foster, at 46.6%, and Alex Gordon, at 40.9%, rank one and four in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage as of January 31.

Free Throw Shooting Sparks 'Dores

For the season, VU is shooting 73.6% at the line, and the Commodores have shot 75% or better from the free throw line in 11 games this year, and have made 20 or more free throws in seven contests in 2007-08.

Speaking of the Charity Stripe...

The Commodores made 30 of 38 free throw attempts against Iona, the most since Vanderbilt made 28 free throws against Bradley at the South Padre Invitational. Vanderbilt's 28 made free throws against the Braves was the most for a Commodore squad since December 30, 2000, when VU made 29 in a 97-74 loss at Boston College.

Beal And Bell Get Offense Going

Sophomore Jermaine Beal and freshman Keegan Bell have done an outstanding job for the Commodores at the point guard position so far in 2007-08. Their play is reflected in Vanderbilt's national standing in total assists and assists per game, which rank sixth and eighth, respectively. Both have combined for a 2.35 to 1 assist to turnover ratio on the year.

Point Guard Play A Plus

Sophomore point guard Jermaine Beal has raised his level of play this year. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, had 10 assists against one turnover in the two games at the South Padre Invitational, averaged 13.5 points per game, and was named to the All-Tournament team. Beal is also fifth in the Southeastern Conference in free throw percentage at 81.4%.

More On Beal...

From November 24 through December 8 and from January 9 through January 31, Beal dished out five or more assists in at least four consecutive games, the first time that has happened since Atiba Prater accomplished the feat in 2000 [(9) vs. Boston College, 2/6/2000; (7) vs. Mississippi State, 2/9/2000; (5) at Alabama, 2/12/2000; (8) vs. Auburn, 2/16/2000.] Against UMass, the sophomore scored a career-best 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting, with three made threes.

The Beal Deal

Beal currently has 104 assists on the season, the sixth-best single season for a sophomore in the history of the program. All-time Vanderbilt assist leader Atiba Prater holds the single season record for a sophomore with 155 in 1998. Beal currently ranks 1st in assist-to-turnover ratio in all games (3.06) and SEC games only (5.14).

Bell Rings True Against DePaul

Freshman Keegan Bell scored 12 points, all on threes, and dished out eight assists against no turnovers in Vanderbilt's 91-85 overtime win at DePaul on December 12. Bell, who played a career-high 20 minutes against the Blue Demons, kickstarted Vanderbilt's offense in the second half and propelled the team to the comeback victory. Bell's 63 assists as a freshman puts him in 9th place on Vanderbilt's single season assist list for freshmen.

'Dores Going 90

Vanderbilt scored 90+ points in the three games against Bradley (11/24), South Alabama (11/29), and Georgia Tech (12/1), the first time VU had done that since the 1999-2000 season.

December 20, 1999 - 94 vs. Stetson

For the season, VU has scored 90+ points nine times, and 80+ points 14 times. It is the most times a Commodore team has scored 90 or more points since the 1992-93 season, when Vanderbilt also scored 90+ points nine times. The school record is 13 90+ points in 1965-66.

Andre Walker Has Career Day At Florida

Freshman forward Andre Walker, from Flossmoor, Illinois, scored a career-high 10 points in a career-best 25 minutes at Florida on January 27. He also set a career high in field goals (four), field goal attempts (nine), and rebounds (six).

VU On The Road...

Two out of the next three games for the Commodores will be on the road. After Saturday's game against Auburn, Vanderbilt takes to the road to take on Georgia and South Carolina on Wednesday and Saturday, respectively.

Metcalfe Plays Career-Best Ball

Senior center Alan Metcalfe scored 18 points off of the bench, a new career high, in the Commodores' 91-85 win over DePaul on December 12. Metcalfe surpassed his career high in points, field goals made, field goal attempts, and three-point field goals made, and tied his career high for three-point field goal attempts and assists against the Blue Demons. For the season, Metcalfe has made 51 field goals, four more than his career total (47) heading into his senior year.

Darshawn McClellan Has Career Day On Boards

Freshman Darshawn McClellan, from Fresno, Calif., came off the bench against UMass on January 5 and grabbed nine rebounds. McClellan, who spells forward Ross Neltner, scored ten points against Kentucky and went for eight points and six rebounds against LSU.

Foster Named SEC Player of the Week For Third Time In 2007-08

Foster also became the first Vanderbilt player to win three SEC Player of the Week awards in one season and the first SEC player since Chris Lofton won the award three times in the 2006-07 season when he captured the league's Player of the Week honors for his play last week against Iona, Rice, and UMass. He averaged 25.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, and 2.7 assists per game in three games, and against UMass, Foster led the Commodores in scoring with a season-high 32 points, one off his career high of 33, and he nailed eight three-pointers, a career high and the most by a Commodore in a game since Mario Moore made nine against Wichita State on March 21, 2005. Foster was also named the SEC Player of the Week for his play against South Alabama and Georgia Tech November 27-Dec. 3 when he averaged 21.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game and for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13.

Foster and Ogilvy Sweep SEC Weekly Awards

Vanderbilt senior swing man Shan Foster and freshman center A.J. Ogilvy were honored as the SEC Player and Freshman of the Week for the week of December 31-January 7, respectively, for their play in three games against Iona, Rice, and UMass by the SEC Office in Birmingham. Foster and Ogilvy became the third duo to sweep the awards, joining Chris Lofton and Duke Crews of Tennessee, who won Christmas week of 2006, and LSU's Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas, who captured the awards for the week of February 20, 2006.

Vanderbilt last won a regular season tournament in November of 2000, when the Commodores won the America's Youth Classic, which was held at Memorial Gym. VU defeated South Carolina State, Western Carolina, and St. Joseph's that year.

Jamie Graham Joins Basketball Team

5-11 guard Jamie Graham, a member of the Commodore football team, joined the basketball team at the end of the football season and made his first appearance on the floor against UT Martin on December 29. Graham, who redshirted on the gridiron in 2007, played six minutes and had three points, two assists, a rebound and a steal in his Commodore debut. He is the first Vanderbilt football player to play on the basketball team since 1994-95 when Fred Baker played for both squads.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 lead-

ing up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

Commodores Sign Two In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that forwards Lance Goulbourne and Steve Tchiengang have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2008.

"We are extremely excited to add Lance and Steve to our program," Stallings said. "Not only do I feel strongly about their playing ability and versatility, but they are the kind of young men we want to have at Vanderbilt. They both come from excellent families and are diligent students."

Goulbourne, from Brooklyn, N.Y., and currently attending The Hun School in Princeton, N.J., is a 6'7, 215 pound small forward averaged 12 points and eight rebounds per game his junior year in 2006-07. He also stood out this summer at the Nike Global Challenge in Beaverton, Oregon, an elite tournament for high school rising seniors where his team went 5-3 against international competition. Goulbourne was ranked 90th by Rivals.com and was rated 18th among small forwards.

"I just felt comfortable there, and my family loved it," Goulbourne said. "It was just one of those feelings that came to me. I just felt like Vanderbilt was where I needed to be. They really have a good program academically and athletically."

Goulbourne chose Vanderbilt over Marquette, Rutgers, Louisville and Notre Dame.

Steve Tchiengang is a 6'9, 235 pound power forward from Montverde Academy in Florida. Originally from Cameroon, Tchiengang is rated No. 81 by Rivals.com and is the 25th best prospect at the power forward position. He chose the Commodores over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

"I felt comfortable that Vanderbilt is the place that God wanted me," Tchiengang said. "The coaching staff did a great job of recruiting me and making me feel wanted. I feel there is a great opportunity there and I get to play in a great Conference. I am very excited."

"We targeted these young men very early in the recruiting process, even before their junior year of high school began," Stallings said. "We are thrilled they have chosen Vanderbilt and feel they will be great additions to our team."

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08.

Vanderbilt Posts 15th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 15th 20-win season in school history with a 99-90 overtime win at South Carolina on Feb. 28. It marked the third 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

Notes From Vanderbilt's Last Time Out Vs. Ole Miss

Team Records and Series Notes:

- Vanderbilt falls to 17-4 on the season and 2-4 in Southeastern Conference play, while Ole Miss improves to 16-3 overall, 3-3 in SEC action.
- The Commodores lead the all-time series with the Rebels, 69-39. Ole Miss leads the series 29-19 in Oxford. Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is now a career 2-3 at Tad Smith Coliseum.
- The 'Dores are now 2-4 on the road this season overall, and 0-4 on the road in SEC play (Kentucky, Tennessee, Florida, Ole Miss).
- Vanderbilt is 0-2 against ranked opponents in 2007-08 after the loss to the Rebels, who entered the game ranked 22nd in the ESPN/USA Today Poll and 24th in the Associated Press rankings. The Commodores' other loss to a ranked opponent came at Tennessee (L, 60-80) on January 17.

Vanderbilt Team Notes:

- Key Run: With Vanderbilt trailing by three, 52-49 with 8:08 to go in regulation, Ole Miss reeled off a 15-2 run over the next 5:43 to put the game out of reach.
- Key Stat: Vanderbilt, one of the top shooting teams in the nation, struggled from the floor against the Rebels, converting on only 34.9% of its shots from the field. Ole Miss, meanwhile, made 46.7% of its shots. The Rebels also outscored Vanderbilt, 42-20, in the paint.
- Vanderbilt attempted only four free throws against Ole Miss, its lowest total on the 2007-08 season and the fewest since the Commodores shot four free throws at Tennessee on January 8, 2005.
- Vanderbilt's 34.9% from the field was its lowest in 2007-08.

Vanderbilt Individual Notes:

- Senior Shan Foster scored 14 points to lead Vanderbilt scorers. With the 14 points against the Rebels, he moved past VU great Ronnie McMahan (1992-95) for third place all-time on the Commodore all-time scoring list. He now has 1,723 career points, one point shy of the 2nd place position, currently occupied by Phil Cox (1982-85).
- Freshman center A.J. Ogilvy was the only other Vanderbilt player in double figures with 10 points.
- Freshman forward Darshawn McClellan made the first start of his collegiate career against Ole Miss.
- Senior forward Ross Neltner led all Vanderbilt players on the glass with seven rebounds.

"We got off to a bad start in the second half, and that was the difference in the game. We talked at the half about continuing to do the things that kept us in the game in the first half. Obviously, my message didn't get through."

"Polynice was the difference for Ole Miss in the first half. He had six layups and was better off the dribble. Warren was the difference in the second half. We couldn't keep their perimeter players in front of us. We've had a hard time guarding the perimeter all year long."

"We missed a lot of open shots in the first half. We had an opportunity to be up big at the half, but we didn't make our shots. We've got a lot of work to do. We need to get better. We played harder tonight and were able to battle Ole Miss on the boards in the first half. This is not fun right now."

Ole Miss Head Coach Andy Kennedy:

On the win:

"I thought our intensity was where it needed to be. Defensively we were really locked in. (Vanderbilt) is a team that averages 85 points a game and we held them to 58. It was a team effort inside and out. It was a quality win and we got some quality contributions from a variety of players."

On the progress made through 19 games:

"We're still a work in progress. The young guys are starting to understand that if you relax in this league, you're going to get taken advantage of. We're going to continue to work, grind and try to get better."

On the play of Kenny Williams:

"Kenny brought a great deal of energy tonight and was very efficient. He's an energy guy. We challenge him to be active. He has great strength. The last few games, he's gotten into foul trouble early. Tonight, by playing 34 minutes, I think his production followed."

On holding A.J. Ogilvy in check:

"I thought our ball pressure was good. We did a good job pressuring him. Ogilvy, because of his production and him being so good, we forget the fact that he's a kid. We're in the grind of the season and it wears on these young kids."

On the play of Eniel Polynice:

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10, 2007, in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 663-184 (.783) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU is 13-0 so far in 2007-08, marking the 21st time in the past 22 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.
- Vanderbilt has won 100 of its last 106 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 147-13 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 80-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 23 points to lead four Vanderbilt double digit scorers in Vanderbilt's 95-86 win over Bradley in the finals of the South Padre Island Invitational evening at the South Padre Island Convention Center. Shan Foster, who added 22 points for Vanderbilt in the win over the Braves, was named the tournament's MVP, with Ogilvy and sophomore guard Jermaine Beal joining Foster on the All-Tournament team.

The Commodores led from the opening tip, and heading into the half, Vanderbilt held a comfortable 53-35 lead. VU's lead, which had ballooned to as many as 24 with 1:33 to go in the first half, quickly evaporated in the second half, as the Braves chipped away at Vanderbilt's lead, and closed the gap to one point with 2:40 to play on a Theron Wilson layup to make the score 85-84 in favor of the Commodores.

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84. VU made their last eight free throws of the game to keep the Braves at bay.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

Ogilvy led all Vanderbilt scorers with 23 points, with Foster chipping in 22. Beal added 13 points, and Alex Gordon tallied 10 points in the winning effort.

Freshman Patrick Patterson had 23 points and 12 rebounds to lift the Wildcats to a 79-73 double-overtime win over No. 13 Vanderbilt.

Ramel Bradley added 20 points, and Joe Crawford had 17 for Kentucky (7-7, 1-0), which gave Gillispie his first win against a ranked opponent this season.

They allowed Vanderbilt (16-1, 1-1) to crawl back from 16-point second half deficit, then blew an overtime lead before mounting a comeback.

Shan Foster had 20 points for Vanderbilt, which started the day as one of five unbeaten teams in Division I. Andrew Ogilvy struggled early for the Commodores, but ended with 16 points and five rebounds.

Bradley's jumper in the second overtime put Kentucky ahead 77-73, clinching the first win over a ranked opponent this season.

Ogilvy's putback with 1.8 seconds left in the first overtime tied it at 72.

After Vanderbilt took a 69-68 lead in the first overtime on a layup by Alan Metcalfe, Bradley answered with a layup for Kentucky. Patterson would put the Wildcats ahead 72-69 on a tip-in, pumping his fist in a premature celebration.

Foster hit a 3-pointer with 14 seconds left in regulation that tied the game at 65, one possession after the Commodores forced Crawford into a turnover.

Derrick Jasper hit two 3-pointers to cap a 10-0 run that gave the Wildcats a 23-10 lead with 9:36 to play in the opening half.

Wayne Chism's career-high 18 rebounds -- 11 on defense -- were the most by any Tennessee player since 1996, and his season-high 18 points led No. 6 Tennessee to an 80-60 win over No. 16 Vanderbilt.

Tennessee (15-1, 3-0 SEC) grabbed 43 rebounds and scored 30 points off 22 turnovers, quieting one of the SEC's best shooting teams.

Vanderbilt (16-2, 1-2) entered the game averaging 86 points per game, second only to Tennessee's 86.7. They also were averaging 9.29 3-pointers a game, just behind Tennessee's 9.73.

But the Commodores, who have dropped two straight after a 16-0 start, completed only 3 of their 21 attempts from behind the arc while the Volunteers went 8-for-22 on 3s.

Vanderbilt's 36.8 percent on field goals and 14.3 percent from behind the arc were its worst of the season.

Tennessee went on a 17-6 run to open the second half, ending with a 3-pointer by Chris Lofton to put the Vols up 59-38 with 11:24 left.

Vanderbilt responded with a 15-2 run that ended with Shan Foster's 3 to narrow the gap to 61-53.

But Tyler Smith grabbed a steal and went in for a dunk, and the Vols scored the next three points to stretch the lead to 13. Vanderbilt would get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster sank 14 points and grabbed six rebounds, A.J. Ogilvy had 12 points and Darshawn McClellan also had six rebounds.
