TEAM NOTES

ABOUT VANDERBILT

- After falling to UT, 92-84, two weeks ago, Vanderbilt (7-12, 2-5 SEC) would drop its next two games, part of a four-game skid, before picking up a win over LSU at home this past Saturday, 77-71.
- Despite surrendering a 16-point lead, VU was able to defeat the Tigers behind a 26-point performance from senior guard Riley LaChance, while senior forward Jeff Roberson chipped in an additional 20 points.
- The Commodores are 0-5 on the road this season, losing by an average of 11.4 ppg in those contests. However, Vanderbilt has won the last three matchups in Knoxville against the Vols.
- Vanderbilt is paced by Roberson, who leads the team in scoring (15.1 ppg) and rebounding (7.4 rpg).
 Matthew Fisher-Davis has been the team's second best scorer, posting 11.9 ppg and 5.1 rpg, but the senior hasn't played the last two games.
- LaChance and freshman guard Saben Lee round out VU's primary scoring attack, averaging 11.4 and 11.0 ppg, respectively. Both players shoot better than 45 percent from the floor on the season and are crucial in running the offense, as they combine for 51 percent of the team's assist this season. Lee leads the Commodores with 3.4 apg.

FAST BREAK

The Volunteers under head coach **Rick Barnes** are a perfect 3-0 at home against bitter rival Kentucky, defeating the Wildcats in Thompson-Boling Arena in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

LAST MEETING WITH VANDERBILT

- A career night by Grant Williams lifted the 24thranked Tennessee Volunteers to a 92-84 victory over in-state rival Vanderbilt at Memorial Gymnasium on Jan. 9, 2018.
- Williams finished with a career-high 37 points on 12-of-20 shooting from the field to go along with seven rebounds, three blocks and a pair of assists.
- Admiral Schofield posted his second straight 20-point performance, tying his career-high with 22 points to go with a game-high nine rebounds.
- Tennessee sophomore Jordan Bowden scored all 12 of his points in the second half.
- UT's 92 points in Memorial Gym was the most ever scored by a Tennessee squad, assisted by 40 points in the paint to match Vanderbilt's hot shooting from beyond the arc.
- Despite a 10-point deficit at the half, the Volunteers opened the second half by hitting 8-of-10 shots from the field and using a 10-0 run to give UT a 57-56 lead with 12:39 remaining.
- After that, it was all Tennessee, as the Vols outscored the Commodores 57-39 in the second half to earn the road win. UT shot 57 percent (30-of-53) from the field to fuel its second double-digit comeback win away from home this season (other vs. Purdue).
- Despite a strong start by Tennessee, Vanderbilt was dialed in during the first half, connecting on 59

percent (17-of-29) of its shots from the field. The Commodores knocked down eight threes, including one at the buzzer to make it a 45-35 game at intermission.

 The Dores were paced by freshman guard Saben Lee, who posted 21 points on 7-of-10 shooting in 32 minutes of action.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST VANDERBILT

- Josh Richardson (now a season-long starter with the Miami Heat) helped the Vols rally from two separate double-digit deficits in the second half by scoring 15 of his game-high 22 points in the final stanza to lift Tennessee to a 67-61 comeback win over Vanderbilt in the 2015 SEC Tournament in Nashville on March 12, 2015. In what was the second-to-last game of his career, Richardson also led all players with three steals and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line
- Dyron Nix (17 points, 18 rebounds) and Doug Roth (10 points, 10 rebounds) recorded double-doubles and Tennessee beat Vanderbilt 79-69 in overtime in Stokely Athletics Center Feb. 4, 1987, in Knoxville.
- Dick Johnston made six free throws in doubleovertime to lift UT to a 77-72 win over the Dores in Nashville on Feb. 2, 1970. Jimmy England led the charge with 27 points, and Bobby Croft had an 18-16 double-double.
- Danny Schultz holds UT's single-game scoring record against Vanderbilt, as he dropped 35 points on the Dores on Feb. 15, 1964, in Nashville.
- Tennessee All-Century Team member Paul "Lefty"
 Walther (1948-49) never lost to Vanderbilt during
 his career as a Vol. The Covington, Kentucky, native
 helped lead Tennessee to a 4-0 record over the
 Dores, beating Vandy by an average of 9.8 points.

SEVERAL VOLS BOAST IMPRESSIVE STATS VS. THE COMMODORES

- In three career games against Vanderbilt, sophomore forward **Grant Williams** averages 20.0 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.7 blocks
- Junior wing Admiral Schofield has faced Vandy six times previously, and he averages 12.7 points and 5.3 rebounds in those meetings while shooting .524 overall (33-63) and .417 from 3-point range (5-12).
- Sophomore point guard **Jordan Bone**—a Nashville native and graduate of The Ensworth School—averages 11.0 points and 3.0 assists with a +3.0 assist/turnover ratio in three career games vs. the Commodores. Bone shoots .571 overall (12-21) and .667 from 3-point range (6-9) against Vanderbilt.

"GOOD" LOSSES

- All five teams who have defeated Tennessee this season occupy a top-40 spot in the latest NCAA RPI, and three of those teams— Villanova (2), North Carolina (3) and Auburn (8)—own a top-10 RPI.
- Those five teams, which also include Arkansas and Missouri, own a combined record of 77-19 (.802).
- Finally, three of those five squads are ranked in this week's AP top-25 poll: No. 1 Villanova, No. 10 North Carolina, No. 19 Auburn

WILLIAMS HAD HISTORIC SCORING EFFORT IN NASHVILLE

- Sophomore forward **Grant Williams** scored a careerhigh 37 points while leading Tennessee to a 92-84 win at Vanderbilt on Jan. 9. He earned SEC Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career as a result
- Williams' 37 points were the most by any SEC player in a league game this season.
- Williams' 37 points were the most in a game by a Vol since 2003 SEC Player of the Year Ron Slay scored 38 vs. New Mexico on Jan. 4, 2003.
- Williams' 37 points were the most by a Vol in a road game since All-American guard Allan Houston scored 37 at Oregon State on Dec. 22, 1990.
- Williams' 37 points were the most by a Vol without making a 3-pointer since All-American guard Tony White scored 49 at Florida State on Dec. 30, 1986.

SCHOFIELD STUFFING STAT SHEET OVER LAST FIVE GAMES

- Tennessee head coach Rick Barnes said that junior wing Admiral Schofield had his best game as Vol when UT defeated Kentucky on Jan. 6. That win started a streak of stellar play for Schofield.
- Over the last five contests, Schofield is averaging 15.4 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 2.2 steals per game. He is shooting .536 overall and .444 from 3-point range during that span.
- Schofield also has scored in double figures and made multiple 3-pointers in each of the last five games.
- He ranks second in the SEC with 1.7 steals per game during conference play.

TENNESSEE HAS MATCHED LAST SEASON'S ROAD WINS TOTAL

- With four true road wins in only six tries this season, Tennessee has already matched its total for true road wins from a season ago.
- The Vols have logged road wins at Georgia Tech, Wake Forest, Vanderbilt and South Carolina.
 Tennessee also has neutral-site wins over Purdue and NC State.
- It looks to be a positive trend for the Vols under head coach Rick Barnes. In his first season at UT, the Big Orange won just two true road games. Last year, they won four, and they have six more opportunities to best that total this season.

ALEXANDER LOCKED IN

- Junior forward **Kyle Alexander** is 12-for-13 from the field over UT's last three games. He is averaging 9.7 points and 2.7 blocks per game over that span.
- In Tennessee's win over Texas A&M on Jan. 13, Alexander scored a career-high 14 points, and he followed that up with 12 points on perfect shooting at Mizzou on Jan. 17.
- The Missouri game marked the first time in Alexander's career that the Vols lost when he scored in double-figures (4-1).
- Through 18 games, Alexandeer has essentially doubled his production from his first two seasons as an underclassman, tallying 6.0 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.8 blocks in 20.0 minutes per game while starting every contest.

- In SEC play, Tennessee leads the league in assists per game (14.6) and rebounding defense (32.4 rapg) while ranking second in scoring offense (77.9), and field-goal percentage (.459).
- The Vols have 27 steals over their last three games.
- In Saturday's road win at South Carolina (who was 7-1 at home entering that game), Tennessee posted a season-best field-goal percentage of .575 while attempting a season-low 40 field goals.
- Sophomore guard Lamonté Turner has made 17 consecutive free throws dating to Tennessee's Jan.
 6 win over Kentucky. In SEC play, his .944 free-throw percentage (34-of-36) ranks third in the league.
- Junior forward Kyle Alexander has eight blocks over UT's last three games.

VOLS REMAIN IN TOP 25

- Tennessee on Dec. 4 made its first appearance in the AP top-25 poll since 2010—nearly seven full years. The Vols landed at No. 24 in that week's AP poll.
- Prior to that week, the last time UT appeared in the top 25 was Dec. 20, 2010 (19th AP, 18th coaches).
- This week, UT stands at No. 22 in the AP poll and No. 21 in the coaches poll.
- UT's best AP ranking this year was No. 19, on Dec. 25.
- The Vols are riding a streak of eight straight weeks in the top 25. As a ranked team, Tennessee is 7-3 this season.

UT IN RARE RANKED COMPANY

- Tennessee is one of five schools whose men's and women's basketball teams are <u>both</u> ranked in the latest Associated Press top-25 poll.
- The Vols are ranked 22nd, and the Lady Vols (16-3) are ranked 10th under coach Holly Warlick.
- Other schools with two ranked hoops squads (AP poll) are Arizona State, Duke, Ohio State and West Virginia.

BOWDEN ON TARGET FROM DEEP

- While he no longer meets the SEC's "attempts per game" stat-ranking requirements, Tennessee sophomore **Jordan Bowden** would lead the SEC with a red-hot 3-point percentage of .517 (30-of-58) through 18 games this season.
- The Knoxville native's 30 3-pointers made are the second-most on the team.

FIRST-HALF DEFENSE STIFLING

- Through 18 games, UT has held opponents to an average 29.5 points during the first half.
- Tennessee's average lead at halftime this season is 7.6 points, and the Big Orange have trailed just three times at the break (vs. Auburn and Kentucky and at Vanderbilt).

UT 13th IN NCAA IN ASSIST RATE

- According to noted college basketball statistical analyst Ken Pomeroy of KenPom.com, Tennessee ranks 13th nationally with an assist rate of 63.0 percent (meaning that 63.0 percent of the Vols' made field goals have been assisted on).
- That is the highest assist rate among SEC teams.
- The Volunteers average 16.6 assists per game, which ranks second in the SEC and 36th in the country.

- Graduate transfer James Daniel III is the first Vol to log multiple games of 10 or more assists in a single season in 24 years.
- LaMarcus Golden had two double-digit assist games during the 1993-94 campaign, dishing out 12 vs. UT Martin (11/26/93) and 14 at South Carolina (1/19/94).
- Daniel distributed a career-high 10 assists in the win over High Point on Nov. 14 (his second game as a Vol). He then recorded 10 assists during UT's victory over Mercer on Nov. 29. And he didn't have a turnover in either game.
- Daniel's assist-turnover ratio this season is an impressive +2.74. That ranks fourth in the SEC and 37th nationally.

J-BIRD REACHES 2K MILESTONE

- Graduate transfer James Daniel III is Division I's second-leading active career scorer, and on Dec. 20 vs. Furman (his 100th career game played), he eclipsed the 2,000 career point milestone. He now has 2,049 total collegiate points.
- 90 of those games, and 1,933 of those points, were scored during Daniel's standout career at Howard University.

VOLS WIN IN BARNES' 1,000th GAME

- Head coach Rick Barnes—who is in his third season at Tennessee but his 31st season as a Division I head coach—hit a career milestone on Jan. 13, as UT's win over Texas A&M marked his 1,000th career game as a college head coach.

STREAK BUSTERS

- Tennessee has snapped three opponent win streaks of four games are longer this season, including streaks of five and six games.
- Furman had won five straight before falling in Knoxville Dec. 20, and Wake Forest had its six-game win streak snapped by the Vols Dec. 23 in Winston-Salam
- Earlier in the season, Purdue had won four straight to open the year before UT halted that streak at the Battle for Atlantis on Nov. 22.

TENNESSEE IS FIFTH-YOUNGEST TEAM IN DIVISION I THIS SEASON

- Bowling Green State University basketball SID James Nahikian painstakingly compiled a list of the youngest teams (based on class/eligibility) in college basketball this season, and Tennessee was one of three SEC teams to make the top five.

- The UT men's basketball program has improved its multi-year GSR 29 percentage points in four years—from 60 percent in 2014 to 89 percent in 2017.

 Furman, 66-61, at home on Dec. 20. That is UT's
 fourth-best RPI win of the season (No. 98).
- This article from HeatCheckcbb.com outlines why, based on their schedule, the Vols have more opportunities to log resumé-boosting wins than any other team in the country.
- As of Jan. 21, UT's strength of schedule was rated No. 1 nationally by ratings analyst Ken Pomeroy of KenPom.com.

VOLS IN THE NBA

- Tennessee alums enjoyed a noteworthy presence in the NBA during the 2016-17 season—highlighted by Tobias Harris (2010-11) leading the Detroit Pistons in scoring.
- In his sixth NBA season, Harris played in all 82 games for the Pistons. He made 48 starts but thrived in the team's sixth-man role during the second half of the season. His 16.1 points per game led the team. For his career, the forward averages 13.8 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game.
- Miami Heat guard Josh Richardson (2011-15) completed his second NBA season with the Miami Heat in 2016-17, and he agreed to a new four-year, \$42 million contract in September 2017. In his first two seasons in the league, the 24-year-old has appeared in 105 games and averaged 8.4 points, 2.6 rebounds and 2.0 assists. He also shoots at a .374 clip from 3-point range.
- Point guard C.J. Watson (2002-06) completed his 10th NBA season in 2016-17 as a member of the Orlando Magic. He appeared in 62 games. with nine starts, and averaged 4.5 points and 1.8 assists. For his decade-long NBA career, Watson has seen action in 600 games and averages 7.2 points and 2.5 assists while shooting .373 from 3-point range and .812 from the foul line.
- Shooting guard Jordan McRae (2010-14), a member of the Cleveland Cavaliers 2016 NBA Finals championship team, saw action in 37 games with the Cavs last season before being released. In 59 career NBA appearances, the 2014 draft pick averaged 4.4 points and shot .384 from 3-point range.
- 2014 NBA Draft pick Jarnell Stokes (2011-14), who has played for three different franchises during his three-year professional career, appeared in two games with the Denver Nuggets last season before suffering a season-ending foot injury. Stokes owns a .581 field-goal percentage in 28 career NBA games played.
- A pair of Tennessee alums continue lengthy tenures as NBA front-office executives in 2017-18. Washington Wizards President Ernie Grunfeld (1973-77) completed his 14th season as the team's top executive last year. And New York Knicks Assistant General Manager Allan Houston (1989-93) continues to play a key insider's role with that storied franchise.

FAST BREAK

Tennessee has made five NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances since 2000.

TENNESSEE PICKED 13TH IN THE SEC

- Tennessee was predicted to finish 13th in the 2018 SEC race by an SEC and national media voting panel.
- The Volunteers also were picked 13th last season before posting an 8-10 SEC record to finish ninth.
- The Vols have outperformed their preseason SEC projection every season under head coach Rick Barnes.

EIGHT BARNES' PUPILS ACTIVE IN NBA

 There are currently eight Rick Barnes pupils active on NBA rosters, including one of the top players in the world: 2014 NBA MVP and 2017 Finals MVP Kevin Durant.

The pants made intermittent appearances in the last decade but, thanks to **Rick Barnes**, are now worn for all games starting last season.

NOTES FROM "THE SUMMITT"

HOOPS FACILITY ENHANCMENTS OVER THE LAST DECADE

- Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketballonly practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, which houses two full-size gymnasiums (a men's court and a women's court) as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.
- Construction of Pratt Pavilion also marked the beginning of the "first phase" of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena. This \$19 million phase included the addition of 32 luxury suites located in the north balcony, a loge area just below the suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.
- In the "second phase" of Thompson-Boling Arena renovations, the athletics department overhauled the men's and women's basketball offices during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for both programs.
- New to Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2013-14 season was a 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.
- In March of 2014, Thompson-Boling Arena became the third college basketball arena to install an LED lighting system, which features fixtures that are smaller, brighter, and up to 85 percent more efficient than conventional arena metal halide lights. The system—developed and manufactured by Oak Ridge-based LED North America at the Tech 20/20 incubator facility in Oak Ridge, Tennessee incorporates Oak Ridge National Laboratory technology and was installed by Knoxville-based Bandit Lites
- The weight room in Pratt Pavilion was renovated and expanded to 4,350 square feet in the summer of 2016. Additions include a full-court-length stretch of synthetic turf, a custom rubber floor, a 40-foot, steel-reinforced throwing wall, six Keiser Functional Trainers, four TRUEStretch Cages, three custom, 10foot Power Lift pulley units (ideal for taller studentathletes), seven sets of 90-pound PowerBlocks and a zoned, high-powered stereo system.
- Work is set to conclude in January on a \$5 million locker-room overhaul at Thompson-Boling Arena, which will feature the addition of a hydrotherapy athletic training facility.

WELCOME TO YEAR NO. 31

- Thompson-Boling Arena is hosting its 31st season in 2017-18.
- The Vols have won nearly 75 percent of their games in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols have ranked in the top 10 nationally in average home attendance 12 times at TBA and own an active streak of 12 consecutive seasons ranked in the top 20.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Tennessee is 361-129 (.737) at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- Since the 1997-98 season, the Vols are 256-69 (.788) in Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols are 119-50 against SEC teams at home over the last 12 seasons.
- Tennessee finished both the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons with a 16-0 home record.
- The Vols have won five of their last six home games against the defending national champions (wins over Kentucky in 2013, UConn in 2012, Florida in 2008, Florida in 2007, Kentucky in 1999).

HOME CROWDS OF 20,000+ NOTHING NEW FOR VOLS

- Tennessee has played in front of 52 home crowds larger than 20,000 dating to the 2005-06 season.
- The crowd of 22,326 for the 2009 Gonzaga game was the largest at Thompson-Boling Arena since capacity was reduced from 24,535 to 21,678 prior to the 2007-08 campaign.
- UT has hosted ESPN College GameDay twice at Thompson-Boling Arena, winning both games.

"Rick Barnes always told me I would be a franchise player, a go-to guy. I can't say that I always believed him, but he was right. He told me if I kept working hard and stayed with it, then I would be a go-to guy in the NBA, and it worked out. He kept me positive and kept me going in the right direction when I could have stopped believing in myself. That was a key to my development as a player."

TENNESSEE GOES 3-1 IN ACC PLAY

- Tennessee went 3-1 during its four games against ACC opponents over a 30-day span during preconference action, with all three wins coming away from Knoxville. UT's scoring margin in those four games was +7.5.
- The Vols defeated NC State, 67-58, in Atlantis.
 Tennessee then toppled Georgia Tech, 77-70, in Atlanta. UT fell at home to No. 7 UNC, 78-73, before routing Wake Forest, 79-60, in Winston-Salem.
- Additionally, Tennessee traveled to Clemson for a charity exhibition on Nov. 5. The Vols defeated the Tigers, 71-67.

UNC WAS SHOWCASE GAME FOR UT

- Tennessee's Dec. 17 showdown vs. defending national champion North Carolina was UT's first home sellout since Feb. 17, 2015. The crowd of 21,678 was the seventh-largest crowd in the NCAA to date this season (fourth-largest non-neutral-site crowd).
- The UNC game marked the first time two ranked men's teams collided at Thompson-Boling Arena since Feb. 27, 2010, when the 19th-ranked Vols upset second-ranked Kentucky, 74-65.
- VFLs and current NBA standouts Tobias Harris (Pistons) and Josh Richardson (Heat) teamed up to purchase 100 tickets for Knoxville-area children's charities.
- A stunning visual was created in Thompson-Boling Arena via a human checkerboard of 21k fans coordinated through CheckerTBA.com.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vols' 2017-18 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) representing nine states as well as Ontario, Canada, and France.
- There are five Vols who hail from the state of Tennessee, two from North Carolina and one each from Alabama, Delaware, Illinois, Missouri, Ohio, Texas and Virginia.
- This is the first time since 2006-07 that the Vols' roster has not included at least one player from the state of Georgia.
- Tennessee has one senior (a graduate transfer), five juniors, four sophomores and six freshmen (including three redshirt freshmen).
- This is the tallest roster third-year head coach Rick Barnes has had at Tennessee. This season's team includes six players listed at 6-7 or taller. For each of the previous two seasons, UT had just three players listed at 6-7 or taller.

LANIER GIVES VOLS ADDITIONAL HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Rick Barnes isn't the only person on Tennessee's bench with Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach Rob Lanier was the head coach at Siena from 2001-05.
- During that span, the Saints posted a 58-70 mark, and advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.
- Under Lanier, Siena also won the 2002 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship.

VOLS LOOK TO EXTEND 13-YEAR STREAK OF TOP-20 ATTENDANCE

- Tennessee finished 20th nationally in average regular-season home attendance last year, drawing an average of 13,636 fans to 16 games at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- This season, UT ranks eighth in attendance with a home average of 16,211.
- The Vols have ranked among the top 20 in men's college basketball attendance for 13 consecutive years, including six seasons ranked in the top five nationally.
- Tennessee has played in front of 52 home crowds larger than 20,000 over the last 13 seasons.

VOLS' ROSTER BOASTS INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- Junior forward **Kyle Alexander** is just the second Canadian ever to letter for the Vols (joining Hamilton, Ontario, native **Bobby Croft**, 1967-70).
- From his freshman to sophomore campaigns, Alexander saw an increase in his minutes, points, rebounds and blocks per game. His field-goal percentage also improved.
- Tennessee head coach Rick Barnes boasts an impressive history of signing and developing Canadian standouts, including Cory Joseph (Toronto; now plays for the Toronto Raptors), Myck Kabongo (Toronto; now plays in Romania) and Tristan Thompson (Brampton, Ontario; now plays for the Cleveland Cavaliers).
- Barnes added another international team member this season in true freshman wing Yves Pons, from Fuveau, France.
- Pons—who was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti attended the INSEP (National Institute of Sport and Physical Education) Academy in Paris. Other notable INSEP basketball alums include Boris Diaw, Tony Parker and Ronny Turiaf.
- Pons is Tennessee's first-ever men's basketball player from France and just the eighth international player in program history.
- The Tennessee roster has included at least one international student-athlete every year since Barnes took over as head coach.

PONS RANKED AMONG TOP INTERNATIONAL NEWCOMERS

- Tennessee true freshman Yves Pons, who hails from Fuveau, France, was included on Evan Daniels' (a college hoops writer for 247sports.com) list of the eight "best international newcomers in college basketball" in late October.
- Writes Daniels: "Pons is an active, energetic and aggressive combo forward that impacts the game with his toughness and physicality. Pons stands at 6-foot-7 and has a chiseled frame and tremendous athleticism. He has value as a rebounder, multipositional defender and finisher at the rim."
- Pons was born in Haiti and was adopted by French parents when he was a toddler.


