## VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- Vanderbilt picked up its first SEC Tournament win in 10 years with a 2-1 victory over Georgia in the opening round on Monday.
- VU is making its 16th trip to the SEC Tournament, but first since 2010. VU has a 13-10-3 record in the tourney. Vanderbilt won the first two SEC Tournament championships in 1993 and 1994 and have reached the championship game four times.
- Wednesday's quarterfinal match against Florida will be a rematch from Sept. 25 when then-No. 9 UF won 3-2 in Nashville. Vanderbilt last defeated the Gators in 1997.
- Under first-year head coach Darren Ambrose, the 'Dores have their most wins (nine) since 2009, their first non-losing season in SEC play since 2006 and wins over two ranked opponents, including No. 8 South Carolina — the highest ranked foe the team has ever beaten since the NSCAA began its coaches rankings in 1996.
- Simone Charley and Lydia Simmons have led the charge on offense. Charley, an All-SEC forward and three-time All-American in the triple jump, leads the team in goals (six), assists (four) and points (16). Simmons, the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week, has five goals and an assist and scored the game winner against No. 12 Ole Miss to clinch a SEC tourney spot.

# VU IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT



Vanderbilt is making its 16th trip to the SEC Tournament.

The Commodores are 13-10-3 all-time in SEC Tournament play.

Vanderbilt has won the SEC Tournament championship twice, in 1993 and 1994 — the first two years of the SEC Tournament.

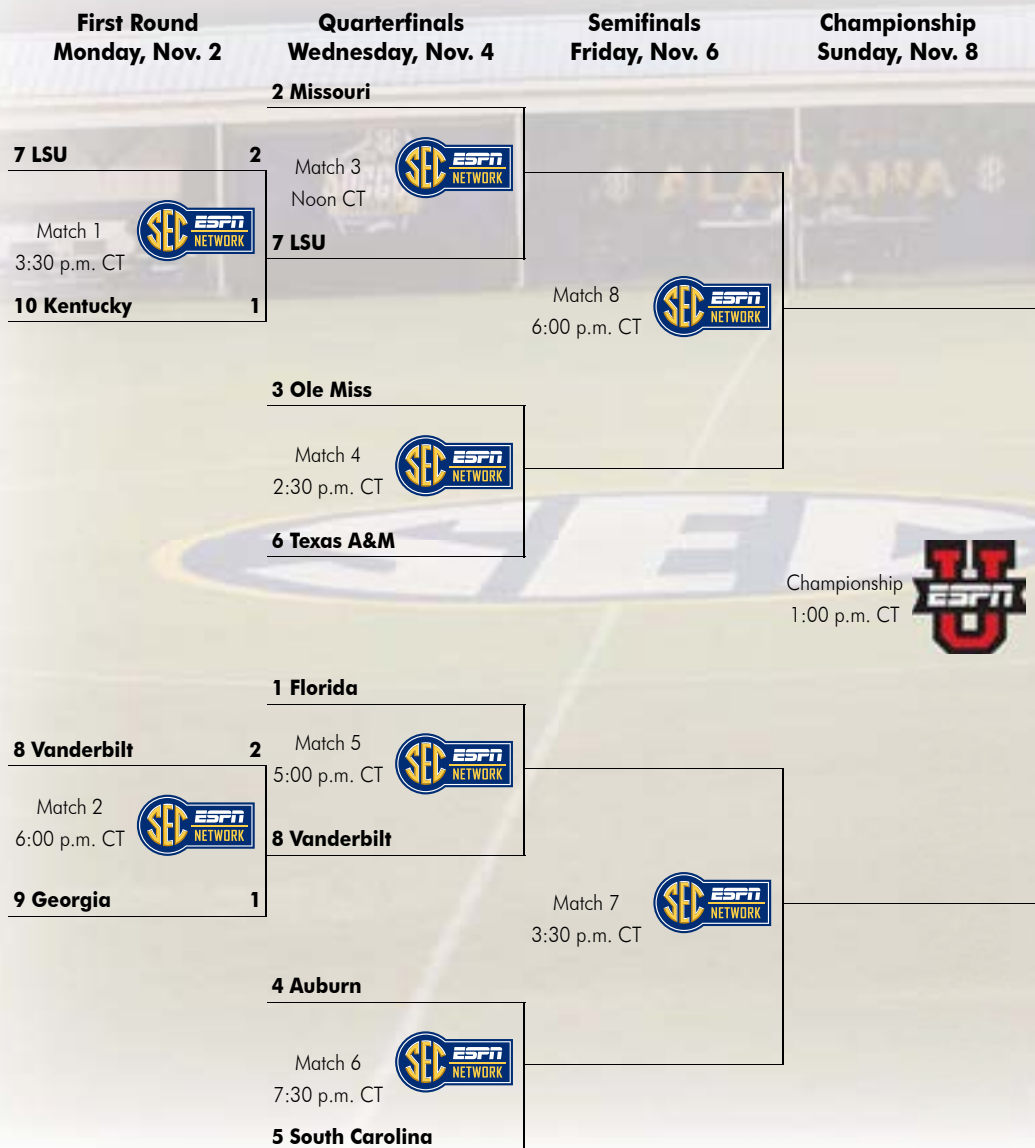

## COACH DARREN AMBROSE

Darren Ambrose is in his first season at Vanderbilt after a successful run at the University of Pennsylvania.

Ambrose spent the last 15 years as the head coach at Penn, and was the program's all-time winningest coach. He is the sixth head coach in the history of the program.



In 15 years at Penn, Ambrose compiled an impressive record of 148-71-35, including a 54-34-17 mark in the Ivy League. His teams reached the NCAA Tournament three times and won three Ivy League championships. His teams finished in the top three of the Ivy League in 10 of his 15 seasons, including seven of the past eight years.

Ambrose never had a losing season at Penn as the Quakers averaged nearly 10 wins a year under his watch. He coached the team's first two All-Americans as well as its first NSCAA Scholar All-America, CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year, Ivy League Player of the Year, Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year and Ivy League Rookies of the Year. In addition, Ambrose was at the helm for all of Penn's Ivy League championships (2001, 2007, 2010), three of its four NCAA Championship berths (2001, 2007, 2010), and an ECAC title in 2000.

Under Ambrose, more than 80 percent of the Penn women's soccer players have graduated with GPAs above 3.0, and Penn is the only Ivy League program to have earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award each of the last 14 years.

Prior to Penn, Ambrose served as an assistant coach at Florida State, Rhodes College (in Memphis) and Connecticut. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in management accounting from USC-Spartanburg, where he played goalie and was the Division II National Player of the Year in 1992-93. He received his master's degree in sports administration from Memphis in 1995.

Ambrose, who was born in Sheffield, England, lives with his wife, Sherry, and their two daughters, Madison and Ainsley.

## BACK TO THE BEACH

Vanderbilt is back in the SEC Tournament for the first time since 2010. None of the current players or coaches were on the team the last time VU made it.

The 'Dores clinched a spot on the final day of the regular season Thursday with a 1-0 upset of No. 12 Ole Miss on the road as Lydia Simmons scored the game winner.

Vanderbilt picked up its first SEC Tournament win since 2005 on Monday night with a 2-1 victory over Georgia. Simone Charley and Taylor Elliott scored to stake a 2-0 lead, and the defense held on for the final 10 minutes after UGA scored in the 80th minute.

VU is 13-10-3 all-time in the SEC Tournament, winning the championship twice.

## SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

Vanderbilt plays No. 5 Florida, the top seed, in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament on Wednesday.

The teams met on Sept. 25 in Nashville, with the Gators picking up a 3-2 victory. VU scored two goals in a span of two minutes in the first half to take a 2-1 lead and the game was tied at halftime. UF scored in the 56th minute, though, to pull out the win.

Florida (14-3-1, 8-2-1) has won six straight as it captured its 14th SEC regular-season crown. The Gators possess a high-scoring attack led by Savannah Jordan (19 goals), Brooke Sharp (10 goals) and Christen Westphal (10 assists).

Florida is 24-2-1 in the series and has won 10 straight. The 'Dores last defeated the Gators in 1997. UF is 6-0 against Vandy in SEC Tournament play.

## WEEKLY REPORT

Vanderbilt defeated Georgia 2-1 in the opening round of the SEC Tournament on Monday for its first tournament since 2005.

Simone Charley scored a breakaway goal in the 39th minute on an assist from Kacy Scarpa. Senior Taylor Elliott then notched the first game-winning goal of her career when she headed in her fourth goal of the season. Kelsey Tillman's cross in the 69th minute set up the goal.

Georgia scored in the 80th minute but the VU defense allowed just one shot the last 10 minutes. It was Vanderbilt's first win over Georgia since 2006.

## SIM CITY

Simone Charley continues to build on what has already been an impressive career. The 5-foot-8 junior forward from Hoover, Ala., leads active VU players with 20 career goals, including a team-high nine last year.

Her six goals this season (four game winners) are the most on the team. Against South

Carolina she scored for the second time in as many games when she scored the game winner in the 97th minute. She also has a team-high four assists to lead the squad with 14 points.

In 2014, she accounted for seven of the team's nine goals in SEC play and scored six goals in her last six games. She was named First Team All-SEC and All-South Region Second Team last year.

Charley also is a standout on the track as a three-time All-American. She placed fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and then reached the podium at the NCAA Outdoor Championships with a third-place finish in June. In the process, she leapt 44-3.25, breaking her own school record.



## BIG WIN

Vanderbilt's win over No. 8 South Carolina on Oct. 16 was an historic victory.

It marked the highest ranked opponent the program had ever beaten since the NSCAA started compiling rankings in 1996. It was also only the second time VU has beaten a Top 10 team (No. 10 Virginia, Oct. 4, 1998).

Vanderbilt is 2-2-1 against ranked foes this year with wins over No. 8 South Carolina and No. 12 Ole Miss, a tie with No. 20 Kentucky and one-goal losses to No. 5 Texas A&M and No. 9 Florida.

## STINGY DEFENSE

Vanderbilt's defense has been the catalyst for the Commodores all season.

The 21 goals allowed is the fewest surrendered in the regular season since 2006.

Earlier this season, the Commodores went 401 minutes, spanning five games, without allowing a goal for their longest scoreless stretch since 2005. They have posted six shutouts, including four in the SEC for their most in five years.

Five of the league's top seven scorers have failed to score against the Commodores.

On top of that, Christiana Ogunsami has played better in goal as the season has progressed. The sophomore, who was named the SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 12, has allowed just 10 goals in the last 10 games. The Cherry Hill, N.J., native is second in the SEC in saves (86), third in save percentage (.811), third in saves per game (4.30), tied for third in shutouts (six) and seventh in goals against average (1.00).

## SIMMONS EARNS SEC HONORS

Midfielder Lydia Simmons was named the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Friday. The redshirt sophomore scored the game winner in the 85th minute against No. 12 Ole Miss for a 1-0 victory on Thursday. It was her

fifth goal of the season and second game winner. The midfielder from Londonderry, N.H., is second on the team with five goals and also has an assist for 11 points.

Prior to this season, Simmons, who was named an SEC All-Freshman a year ago, had not scored a collegiate goal.

## CAPTAIN CONSISTENCY

Since the start of the 2012 season, there has been one constant in the Commodores' lineup — Erin Myers.

The senior, who has played midfield and now center back, has started every game of her career. The three-year captain has started 78 straight games.



Coach Darren Ambrose calls Myers, a native of Armonk, N.Y., the "heart and soul" of the team, and she is one of the squad's most vocal leaders.

## TASTING THE WORLD CUP

Redshirt junior Lina Granados made the 23-player roster for Colombia at the Women's World Cup in June in Canada and traveled with the team during its four games. Colombia advanced out of pool play for the first time and fell to the United States, the eventual champ.

Granados hails from Ashburn, Va., but has dual citizenship as she was born in Bogota, Colombia. She has played for the Colombia Football Federation since she was 15, and has played in international tournaments three times. She has made her first five career starts in the last five games.

## ELLIOTT STEPPING UP

Redshirt senior Taylor Elliott is making the most of her fifth year. The forward has scored four goals this season after notching just one the three previous years.

Against Georgia on Monday, she scored the first game-winning goal of her career with a header in the 69th minute of a 2-1 win.

The Armonk, N.Y., native was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 19. She had the game-tying goal and a game-winning assist in a win over No. 8 South Carolina in overtime. Elliott was also named to College Soccer 360's Primetime Performers Weekly Honor Roll.

## TRANSFERS PLAY KEY ROLES

ACC transfers Danae O'Halloran (R-So.) and Kacy Scarpa (R-Jr.) have been huge contributors this season. O'Halloran (North Carolina) has started all 20 games on defense and has an assist. Scarpa (Florida State) has started and played in every game this season except the regular-season tilt against Florida on Sept. 25 due to a concussion.

Miami-Ohio scored in the 80th minute to hand Vanderbilt a 1-0 loss on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. The Commodores outshot the Redhawks 22-8, with 13 shots on goal, but none found the back of the net.

Haley Walter scored the lone goal in with 10 minutes left in the game on an assist from Courtney Evans. Walter nudged a shot off the feet of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, who tried to cut down Walter's angle, and the ball bounced up into the goal.

It was a tough loss for Vanderbilt (0-1) and Ambrose, who was coaching his first game as Commodores head coach after spending the previous 15 years at Penn. VU outshot Miami 16-4 in the first half and a couple of solid looks that were snuffed out.

Simone Charley, who led the team with 12 shots and seven on goal, nearly put the Commodores in front in the 19th minute. On a breakaway, Charley aimed a shot toward the right corner. But Miami goalkeeper Vic Maniaci got enough of her mitt on the ball that it deflected off the near post. It was one of Maniaci's 11 saves.

Twice Vanderbilt had empty nets in the first half, but Miami defenders knocked the ball away. Off a corner kick, Charley headed the ball toward the goal. Vanderbilt defender got a foot on it and steered it toward the net but Redhawks defender was right there on the goal line to keep the shot from going in. Lina Granados also had a chance as she beat Maniaci to her left just inside the five yard-mark, but the ball was cleared by a defender at the goal line.

Senior Taylor Elliott had the team's best look in the first half. She settled the ball after heading it and tried to slip a shot past Cincinnati goalkeeper Sam Pavlika but a defender was there at the line to knock it away. Later in the half, redshirt sophomore Lydia Simmons fired in a free kick from 25 yards out that Pavlika had to jump and swat away. Vanderbilt's lone shot attempt in the second half by Simone Charley's was immediately blocked.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Fittingly, Vanderbilt head coach Darren Ambrose's 150th career victory came against a foe from the league where he accumulated a huge chunk of those wins.

Sophomore midfielder Lydia Simmons scored her first career goal in the 41st minute to lift Vanderbilt to a 1-0 victory over Dartmouth on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. It was win No. 150 for Ambrose, who compiled 148 wins when he was at Penn the last 15 years and competing against Dartmouth and the rest of the Ivy League. More than a third of his victories (55) have come against Ivy League foes.

Though he was the all-time winningest coach at Penn, Ambrose picked up just his second win as Vanderbilt's head coach and first at home with Friday night's win over Dartmouth (1-1). On Thursday night after practice, Ambrose told his team it would mean a lot to beat Dartmouth because of his time in the Ivy League. The Commodores (2-3) responded with arguably their most complete effort of the season to boost their coach to the milestone victory.

Simmons booted her first career goal in the 41st minute after a corner kick from Jamie Kator bounced off the head of Simone Charley and ricocheted off the foot of a Dartmouth defender. The ball rolled just outside of the box and toward Simmons, who dove into the shot and smashed the ball into the top right corner.

It was enough for the Commodores, who outshot Dartmouth 17-8. Only three of the Big Green's shots were on goal, though. Led by strong defensive performances from Cristina De Zeeuw and Danae O'Halloran, Dartmouth never mounted a serious threat.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Before Sunday's game, Lipscomb hadn't allowed a goal or suffered a loss.

Vanderbilt changed that.

Sasha Gray and Claire Anderson each scored their first goals of the season to lift the Commodores to a 2-0 victory over the Bisons on a balmy Sunday afternoon at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. The Commodores (3-3) picked up their second straight victory and posted their second consecutive shutout to reach .500 for the first time this season. Gray's fifth career goal in the 27th minute proved to be all the Commodores needed against a previously stingy Lipscomb defense.

For 605 minutes this season, the Bisons (4-1-2) had held opponents scoreless. Their six straight shutouts to open the season are an Atlantic Sun record. Vanderbilt outshot Lipscomb 20-9 and controlled the pace of the game. Gray grabbed a pass from Lydia Simmons down the sideline in the near corner and race toward the box. Gray, a junior, turned the corner and sailed in a shot about eight yards out just inside the near post.

Anderson gave the Commodores more than an enough insurance with her first career goal in the 75th minute. The Commodores were stout again, allowing just two shots on goal. Sophomore Christiana Ogunsami had two saves and notched her second shutout of the season. Vanderbilt last allowed a goal against Seattle University a week ago in the 37th minute. The Commodores haven't surrendered a goal in 233 minutes.

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** — A slight delay couldn't slow down the Vanderbilt soccer team's winning streak.

Thanks to an early second-half goal by Simone Charley the Commodores picked up a 2-1 victory over Mississippi State on Friday night for their third straight win and fourth in five games. Vanderbilt also won its SEC opener for the first time since 2005.

The start of the game was delayed by 20 minutes due to a bank of lights at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex that malfunctioned after heavy storms swept through the area earlier in the afternoon. But Vanderbilt (4-3, 1-0 SEC) shook off the delay to match its longest winning streak in four years.

Sophomore midfielder Lydia Simmons scored her second goal of the season just four minutes in. Simmons smashed a shot from the top right wing just outside of the box over goalkeeper Tanya de Souza and into the top center of the net. Mississippi State (1-5-1, 0-1) responded just four minutes later when Kiley Martens followed up on shot that Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami initially saved. Martens knocked the ball away from Ogunsami and tapped in the rebound to tie the game 1-1 in the eighth minute.

The Commodores had chances to pull ahead with 12 shots in the first half, including nine on goal. But de Souza was spectacular in goal for the Bulldogs, posting eight of her 10 saves before halftime.

In the 47th minute, though, shortly after halftime, Charley scored her team-leading third goal of the season that would stand up as the game-winner. Jamie Kator, who just a minute before had two cracks at the goal on a penalty kick, sent in a cross to Charley just inside the box. Charley then scored her 17th career goal.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas – Against one of the best teams in the country, in a hostile environment and on a nationally televised stage, the Vanderbilt soccer team sent a warning to the rest of the Southeastern Conference.

The Commodores put together arguably one of their best performances of the season, falling just short in a 1-0 loss to No. 5 Texas A&M on Friday night in front of 2,851 fans at Ellis Field and many more watching around the nation on the SEC Network.

The Aggies, a Final Four team a year ago, scored in the 70th minute to hold off the upset-minded Commodores and snap their four-game unbeaten streak.

Vanderbilt outshot the Aggies 12-9 (with seven shots on goal) and won the corner kick battle 8-2. The Commodores created seven corner kick opportunities before A&M registered its first. Redshirt sophomore Lydia Simmons led the way with four shots, while Lina Granados, Jamie Kator and Kacy Scarpa each had two shots.

From the start, Vanderbilt (4-4-1, 1-1 SEC) controlled possession and snuffed out opportunities by the Aggies, who made the Final Four a year ago and swept the SEC regular-season and tournament titles. The league's second highest scoring offense had just four shots at halftime.

Texas A&M (8-1, 2-0 SEC) scored with 20 minutes left. Haley Pounds sent in a cross from the right side, 25 yards out and into the box. The ball bounced into the box and past Texas A&M's Ally Watt, who tried to deflect the shot. The run by Watt threw off the Commodores as the ball slipped into the bottom left corner. It was the team's first loss since falling to Seattle University on Aug. 30.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – For the second straight Friday, the Vanderbilt soccer team threw a scare into a Top 10 foe.

The Commodores hung with No. 9 Florida, even taking the lead in the first half before falling short in a 3-2 loss at the VU Soccer Complex on a rain-drenched Friday night.

Similar to a 1-0 loss to No. 5 Texas A&M last week, Vanderbilt showed it belonged on the same field as the Gators, who were the preseason pick to win the SEC. Last year, the Commodores lost to A&M and Florida – both Top 10 teams then as well – by a combined score of 12-3, conceding six goals to both. That margin closed to 4-2 this season, with a pair of one-goal losses and, in both games, Vanderbilt went into halftime tied with its opponent.

Florida (8-2, 2-1 SEC) scored first with a goal by Sarah Troccoli that went off VU goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami's glove, deflected off the inside of the right post and in.

But the Commodores (5-5-1, 1-2) didn't back down. Two goals within less than two minutes of each other put Vanderbilt in front. Both were set up All-SEC forward Simone Charley. Both passes that ended in goals went in the direction of Taylor Elliott. In the 25th minute, Elliott settled in Charley's assist and struck the ball with her right foot, slipping a shot just inside the near post for her second goal in as many games.

Less than two minutes later, in the 27th minute, Charley again centered a pass toward Elliott. This time the ball went off the back of a Florida defender and right to Lydia Simmons, who one-timed the ball out of the air and into the net for her fourth goal.

Senior midfielder Jamie Kator scored in the 74th minute as Vanderbilt battled back to tie the Vols 1-1 after two overtimes on Sunday at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. Kator's goal on a free kick helped Vanderbilt salvage a point after UT scored just 35 seconds into the second half.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Simone Charley found the back of the net and the Vanderbilt defense continued its stingy string of shutout soccer.

The Commodores capped off a pivotal four-point weekend with a 1-0 victory over Arkansas on Sunday afternoon at the VU Soccer Complex. Charley scored in the 12th minute and the defense posted its third straight shutout. Vanderbilt last strung together three straight shutouts in 2009. The Commodores haven't allowed a goal in more than two weeks, spanning four games and 375 minutes.

Charley provided all the offense the team would need in the 12th minute. Redshirt sophomore transfer Danae O'Halloran picked up her first assist as a Vanderbilt Commodore as she raced down the sideline and sent a cross into the box. Her pass bounced off an Arkansas defender and right to Charley. The All-SEC forward settled the ball down with her right foot and finished a shot through an Arkansas defender's legs, past goalkeeper Jordan Harris and just inside the near post. It was Charley's fourth goal of the season, but first in exactly a month.

The Razorbacks threatened a little bit more in the second half, but the defense and goalkeeper Christiana Ogunnsami thwarted their chances. Several crosses into the box resulted in headers by Charley and the back line as Arkansas had just three shots in the second half. The Commodores outshot Arkansas 12-7 and won the corner kick battle 12-4.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The Vanderbilt soccer team had been knocking on the door all season against ranked opponents.

On Friday night, the Commodores broke through in dramatic fashion.

Simone Charley scored in the 97th minute as Vanderbilt rallied to beat No. 8 South Carolina 2-1 in overtime to stun the Gamecocks and 1,848 at Stone Field. The win extends the team's unbeaten streak to five games — its longest stretch since 2009 — and is the first win over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 23 Wisconsin on Sept. 6, 2013.

Vanderbilt defeated South Carolina (11-3-1, 5-2-1), which entered the game in first place in the SEC, for the first time since 2008. It was also the team's first road win at South Carolina since 2007, and the first SEC road win for Ambrose. The Commodores had come close against ranked opponents this season, tying No. 20 Kentucky last Friday and suffering one-goal losses to Top 10 opponents Texas A&M and Florida.

Against South Carolina, Charley scored 6:39 into overtime for her fifth goal of the season and fourth game winner. She was assisted by fifth-year senior Taylor Elliott, who scored the game-tying goal in the second half. Around midfield in the 97th minute, Elliott headed a lob toward Charley. The All-SEC forward settled the ball and sprinted past two South Carolina defenders. She then rocketed a shot from 16 yards out that went past Gamecocks goalkeeper Caroline Kelly to end the game.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — With one team battling for a spot in the SEC Tournament and the other vying for an SEC crown, Vanderbilt and Missouri slugged it out on a rainy, windy Sunday afternoon.

Unfortunately for the Commodores, Missouri's goal in the 49th minute stood up in a 1-0 loss at the VU Soccer Complex on Senior Day in the final home game of the season. Vanderbilt (7-7-4, 3-4-3 SEC) will now have to wait until Thursday at No. 13 Ole Miss to try to clinch a spot in the 10-team SEC Tournament. The Commodores played even all game with Missouri (9-7-4, 7-2-1), which can clinch at least a share of the SEC regular-season championship on Thursday. But Reagan Russell's goal less than four minutes out of halftime proved to be the difference.

Vanderbilt kept Missouri at bay for most of the game, especially the first half. The Tigers had just three shots before halftime and none on goal. On the flip side, Vanderbilt had five shots at the break, putting the pressure on with shots on goal from Erin Myers and Lina Granados.

But Missouri grabbed momentum early in the second half. The Tigers' Kaitlyn Clark kept the ball in play near the end line and sent a pass into the box. Russell got a foot on it despite pressure from the Vanderbilt defense and laced a shot over goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami and into the bottom left corner.

Lydia Simmons nearly tied it up in the 55th minute but her long-distance shot clanged off the crossbar. Teammate Taylor Elliott was there for the second-chance shot, but her header was stopped by Missouri goalkeeper Kristen Rivers.

OXFORD, Miss. – In their first meeting with new head coach Darren Ambrose in February, the Vanderbilt soccer team made it clear they wanted to reach the SEC Tournament.

On Thursday, the Commodores reaped the benefits of their hard work and accomplished their goal.

Vanderbilt clinched a berth in the SEC Tournament for the first time in five years with a 1-0 victory over No. 12 Ole Miss in the regular-season finale. Lydia Simmons scored the game winner in the 85th minute to stun the Rebels and send the Commodores to the conference tournament in Orange Beach, Ala.

When Vanderbilt last made the 10-team, single-elimination tournament in 2010 none of the current players were on the team. The 'Dores (8-7-4, 4-4-3) are the eighth seed and will play No. 9 seed Georgia at 6 p.m. (CST) on Monday at the Orange Beach Sportsplex. The game will be aired on the SEC Network.

With less than six minutes remaining, Simmons broke a scoreless tie with her fifth goal of the season. Senior Jamie Kator dropped a pass to Simmons, who was outside the box on the left wing. The sophomore midfielder juked a defender, turned and scorched a shot with her left foot into the top left corner and out of reach of diving Ole Miss goalkeeper Marnie Merritt.

The goal lifted the Commodores to their first victory over Ole Miss (13-4-2, 7-4) since 2009, which was also the last year they won their regular-season finale.

It was the second win over a Top 20 opponent this season after knocking off No. 8 South also their Carolina two weeks ago. Both victories came on the road. Vanderbilt is 2-2-1 against ranked opponents.

ORANGE BEACH, Ala. – Vanderbilt made the most of its first SEC Tournament game in five years – and the Commodores guaranteed they'd be playing another.

No. 8 seed Vanderbilt jumped in front and held on for a 2-1 victory over No. 9 seed Georgia in the opening round on Monday night at the Orange Beach Sportsplex. The Commodores picked up their first SEC Tournament win since 2005 and advance to the quarterfinals to play No. 1 seed Florida at 5 p.m. (CST) on Wednesday on the SEC Network.

Vanderbilt (9-7-4) avenged a regular-season loss to Georgia and defeated the Bulldogs for the first time since 2006. With nine wins the Commodores have their most victories in a single season since 2009.

Two-time All-SEC forward Simone Charley scored her sixth goal of the season in the 39th minute on a breakaway goal off an assist by Kacy Scarpa to give the Commodores a 1-0 lead. Charley's 20th career goal — most among active VU players — came off a counter attack in which Scarpa unleashed a 40-yard pass. Charley chased down the ball and tapped in a shot between a Georgia defender and goalkeeper Louise Hogrell into the bottom right corner of the net.

Taylor Elliott then provided a huge insurance goal in the 69th minute. Elliott headed in her fourth goal of the season on a brilliant cross from Kelsey Tillman on the far sideline. Georgia scored in the 80th minute, but VU held on the final 10 minutes.
