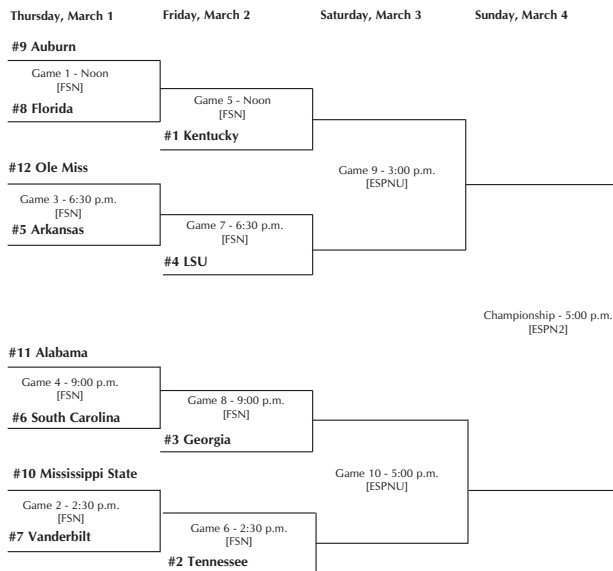

SCOUTING VANDERBILT

Vanderbilt clinched the seven seed in this week's tournament with a 21-8 overall record and 9-7 conference mark. The Commodores ended last week 24th in the USA Today/WBCA poll and receiving votes in the Associated Press ranking.

The Commodores snapped a two-game losing streak with a 67-54 home win against Alabama in Sunday's regular-season finale. Christina Foggie, the SEC's leading scorer, paced Vandy with 18 points.

Foggie is averaging 17.9 ppg this season behind 46-percent shooting, including a 42-percent tally from three-point range. Tiffany Clarke tops the team in rebounds with 7.3 per game while averaging 11.8 ppg.

LOOKING BACK AT FEB. 5

In the season's first meeting, the Lady Bulldogs battled the Commodores to the final couple of minutes before Vanderbilt scored seven-straight points to break a 54-54 tie and claim a 65-59 win in Starkville.

Vanderbilt built a nine-point advantage late in the first half, but a 7-1 run by the Maroon and White moved State within 29-26 at the intermission. After falling down seven early in the second half, State went on an 11-4 run to bring the teams even. Vanderbilt reclaimed a seven point lead, but MSU forced one last tie at 54-54 before the Commodores rallied for the win.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 26-70 shots from the field (37.1 percent), 4-13 shots from 3-point range (30.8 percent) and 3-7 shots from the foul line (42.9). The Commodores hit 47.4 percent from the field, 14.3 percent from three and 9-12 shots from the foul line (75.0 percent).

Diamber Johnson paced the Lady Bulldogs with 17 points. Catina Bett tied her career high with 16 points, while Martha Alwal had a team-best eight rebounds and two blocked shots.

Stephanie Holzer had a double-double for Vanderbilt with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Christina Foggie added 17 points.

STATE IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

Mississippi State is the 10 seed in this week's SEC Tournament. The Lady Bulldogs are 14-32 all-time in the SEC Tournament. Ten of those 14 wins coming under the guidance of Sharon Fanning-Otis.

MSU, VANDY MEET AGAIN IN NASHVILLE

State and Vanderbilt will be meeting in Nashville for the SEC Tournament for the second-straight season.

MSU had its stay in Nashville halted by Vandy last season with a 69-55 second-round decision. Last season's 49-47 win against Auburn in the opening round marked the third-straight year State has won its first game in the tournament.

FANNING-OTIS' MSU SWAN SONG

Mississippi State head coach Sharon Fanning-Otis coached her final home game Sunday after announcing earlier in the week that she will retire from coaching at the end of the season. She will move into an athletic development position with the Bulldog Club following the season.

Fanning-Otis has produced a 608-459 record during her 36 years as a collegiate head coach. She served as head women's basketball coach at UT-Chattanooga, Kentucky and Mississippi State. She is the all-time winningest women's basketball coach in Mississippi State history with 281 victories, and she became just the 14th Division I head women's basketball coach to amass 600 career wins earlier this season.

A 1975 graduate of UT-Chattanooga, she served her alma mater as Coordinator of Women's Athletics, head volleyball, and head women's basketball coach during her 11 years. She was inducted into the Tennessee-Chattanooga Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993. Fanning-Otis was head women's basketball coach at Kentucky from 1987-95, winning a WNIT Championship in 1990 and advancing to the NCAA Tournament the following year.

During her coaching tenure at Mississippi State, she has directed the Bulldogs to 11 postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournament berths and the school's only women's basketball Sweet 16 appearance. Ten of her Bulldog players earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference recognition and two players were named Kodak All-American a collective five times.

Fanning-Otis was named the SEC Coach of the Year in 2000 after leading her team to the championship game of the SEC Tournament.

During her tenure, she has served on numerous NCAA and WBCA committees, and she was named MSU's Outstanding Professional Non-Faculty Woman Award by the President's Commission on the Status of Women in 1999.

FANNING-OTIS CLOSES HOME CAREER VS. UK

Fanning-Otis' final home game, ironically, came against the same Kentucky program she came to MSU from 17 seasons ago. In eight seasons in Lexington, Fanning-Otis compiled a 134-97 record and guided the program to a WNIT and NCAA Tournament appearance.

FANNING-OTIS TAKES MSU TO NEW HEIGHTS

In the 21 seasons prior to Fanning-Otis taking over the reigns of the Mississippi State program, the Lady Bulldogs had never been to an NCAA Tournament. That changed under her guidance as she took State to the "Big Dance" for the first of six appearances in just her fourth season at the helm.

Mississippi State had never seen a 20-win season before her tenure, but in 17 seasons she has guided MSU to 20 victories on four occasions.

SEC SCORING LEADER SHOWDOWN

MSU's Diamber Johnson and Vanderbilt's Christina Foggie have been two of the SEC's top scorers this season. Foggie tops the league with a 17.9 ppg average. Johnson follows in fourth with a 14.7 average.

Johnson hopes to get back on track Thursday, as she has averaged 6.8 ppg over the final five games of the regular season.

STELLAR DEFENSE

Mississippi State's defense has been solid this season, rating second in the SEC and 51st nationally with a 36.2 field goal percentage defense.

ARC DEFENDERS

Kentucky hit 38.9 percent from three-point range, the highest tally MSU has allowed since Auburn connected on the same percentage on Jan. 22. Despite that tally, State has been stellar defending the arc this season. MSU has held foes to 27.1 from three-point range, the second-lowest mark in the SEC and the 36th-best tally in the nation.

PORTER SEC'S TOP THIEF

Part of the reason for State's defensive stinginess has been Porsha Porter's thievery. She has been a steals machine this season, averaging an SEC-best 3.1 per game that is the 18th-most in NCAA Division I. This season she has registered a career-high 86 steals, good for ninth in single-season records and fourth-most ever by an MSU senior. She has 142 steals for her career.

PORTER HEATING UP DOWN THE STRETCH

Porter has also been solid on offense over the last five games, scoring double figures in three of those. The Chicago native scored eight against Kentucky after pacing MSU with 17 against Florida, nine at Arkansas, 15 against Tennessee and 18 versus Ole Miss. During the last five games, Porter has been MSU's top scorer with a 13.4 average.

Porter passed the 500-point mark for her career in a 16-point effort at Alabama on Jan. 12, and the 600-point plateau in the Feb. 12 overtime win against Ole Miss. She collected her 100th collegiate assist with a team-high three dishes at Ole Miss on Jan. 19.

DIAMBER AIMING FOR ANOTHER BIG SEC TOURNAMENT SHOWING

Bridgestone Arena was good to Johnson last season. She averaged 18.0 points in State's two games in the tournament. Johnson also dished out 4.5 assists in the contests. Johnson has also enjoyed an outstanding career against Vanderbilt. The past two seasons she is scoring at a 12.8 clip against the Commodores. She had a team-high 17 points in the season's first meeting.

JOHNSON A GILLOM TROPHY FINALIST

Johnson's stellar senior season has earned her a spot as one of three finalists for the Gillo Trophy, which is presented annually to Mississippi's top female college basketball player. She is a finalist along with Ole Miss' Valencia McFarland and last year's winner Veronica Walker of Delta State. Former Lady Bulldog Alexis Rack won the award in 2009 and 2010.

JOHNSON WITH THE ASSIST

Johnson has been struggling to get the shots to fall, but she has helped setup her teammates through her passing. In the last four games, she is averaging 4.3 assists per game. Averaging an SEC fifth-most 3.8 assists per game, Johnson has dished 351 for her career. The seventh player in school history to notch 900 points and 300 assists for a career, she passed Julian Harris (1976-80) for seventh on MSU's career assists list.

DIAMBER KEYS WINS

Johnson has been key in Mississippi State's victories this season, averaging 18.4 ppg on 42.1-percent shooting. She is scoring 11.2 ppg on 28.3-percent shooting in MSU's 15 losses.

THE NEWEST 1,000-POINT CLUB MEMBER

Johnson's first of two free throws with 15:58 left in the second half at LSU on Feb. 9 gave her the 1,000th point of her outstanding Mississippi State career. Johnson scored 15 points against LSU, becoming the 19th Lady Bulldog to join the 1,000-point club.

With 1,038 career points, Johnson is three points away from tying Robin Porter (2006-09) for 18th on MSU's career scoring list.

SENSATIONAL SWAN SONG

The 1,000-point milestone is part of a stellar senior season for Johnson. Here are some other accomplishments during her spectacular final campaign:

- Scored 20 or more points nine times this year, the first player to do so since Alexis Rack, who had nine 20-plus point games in the 2009-10 season.
- Scored 23 in the non-conference finale against Nevada (Dec. 30) behind a career-high four three-pointers.
- Recorded her second career double-double with 14 points and a career-high-tying 10 assists against Louisiana-Lafayette.
- Scored 22 against South Alabama, 28 versus Tulane and 25 at Louisiana Tech, becoming the first player to score 20-plus points in three-straight games since Tan White accomplished the feat to close the 2004-05 season.
- Opened the year with a career-best 30 points against Jacksonville State, the most points in the season opener since 2000-01 when LaToya Thomas notched 48 at Memphis.

GRANT, ROBINSON FINISHING STRONG

Freshman Kendra Grant led MSU with nine points on Sunday. Including a career-best 17 points against Tennessee on Feb. 16, the Richland, Miss., native is averaging 9.5 ppg in her last four contests. Her 17-point burst, 11 of which came in the first half, came after she had scored seven points in the team's previous three games.

Fellow rookie Shamia Robinson has also stepped up her scoring. She had seven points Sunday, one off her career high set at Arkansas on Feb. 19. In the last three games of the year, Robinson is averaging 6.3 ppg.

ALWAL LEADS BLOCKS BRIGADE

Freshman Martha Alwal blocked her 82nd shot of the season Sunday afternoon, putting her one swat from tying Chanel Mokango for second in single-season annals. Her 2.8 average tops the SEC and is 16th-best in the nation. She broke the MSU freshman record of 32, previously held by LaToya Thomas (1999-00), in just nine games, and in her debut season, she already has taken over fifth place on the career chart.

Here are some other accomplishments from Alwal's rookie campaign:

- Finished two blocks shy of a triple-double against Mississippi Valley State (eight blocks, 12 rebounds and a season-high 17 points).
- Set an MSU freshman record with 22 rebounds against Alcorn State, bettering the previous best of 20 set by Sandra Butler against Alcorn State (2/28/83) and LSU (1/24/83), and tying LaToya Thomas for fifth-highest in MSU single-game history (vs. Montana on Dec. 16, 2001).
- Registered 10 offensive boards against ASU, the first time an MSU player has grabbed 10 or more offensive rebounds in a game since Sophie Ratliff pulled in 12 en route to a school-record 26 total boards vs. Shorter College (Feb. 15, 1988).
- Had 14 points and 11 rebounds in a Nov. 14 win against Xavier, hours after being named SEC Freshman of the Week for an 11-rebound, 10-block debut against Jacksonville State on Nov. 11. Alwal's 10 swats against the Gamecocks set a new single-game school record, passing Chanel Mokango's nine against Ole Miss on Jan. 11, 2009.
- Became the first Lady Bulldog freshman since Robin Porter (2006) to register a double-double, and the first to open the year with back-to-back double-doubles since Sharon Thompson in 1997-98.

SWAT TEAM

As a team, Mississippi State has blocked 151 shots this season, second-most in the SEC and 21st nationally with a 5.2 average. The Lady Bulldogs, who rejected a school-record 14 shots in a season-opening win against Jacksonville State (Nov. 11), eclipsed the 100-block mark for the fourth-straight year and passed the 2009-10 team for the second-most blocks in a season.

SHARON FANNING-OTIS HEAD COACH

17TH SEASON AT MISSISSIPPI STATE (281-231)

36TH SEASON OVERALL (608-459)

Now in her 17th season at the helm of the Mississippi State women's basketball team, Sharon Fanning-Otis continues to guide the program to new heights. When Fanning-Otis first came to Mississippi State University, she had a vision of building a quality Lady Bulldog basketball program. Time, combined with hard work and dedication has paid off, as the program has reached national prominence since her arrival before the 1995-96 season, going to the postseason 11 of her first 16 seasons. Six of her squads have advanced to the NCAA Tournament, with five reaching at least the second round, including the 2009-10 team that made the program's first Sweet 16.

On November 30, 2011, Fanning-Otis became the 14th NCAA Division I coach to win 600-career games. Five years earlier (November 2006), Fanning-Otis became the 29th NCAA Division I head coach to record 500 wins. Fanning-Otis' career win total is tied for 24th among active coaches in all divisions and 14th among active Division I coaches.

During her tenure at MSU, Fanning-Otis has tutored two Kodak (now State Farm) all-Americans in Tan White (2002-2005) and LaToya Thomas (1999-2003). As a senior, White led the nation in scoring, averaging 23.5 points per game, was named to the Associated Press's All-America Second Team, Frances Pomeroy Naismith recipient, all-SEC First Team selection and became the SEC's all-Time Career Steals Leader in addition to finishing atop five MSU career categories. She became the second Lady Bulldog to be drafted into the WNBA when she went as the No. 2 pick in the 2005 Draft to the Indiana Fever. She led the program to new heights during the 2009-10 campaign, taking the Lady Bulldogs to the Sweet 16. She had three players drafted in the WNBA Draft including Chanel Mokango, Armelie Lumanu and Alexis Rack.

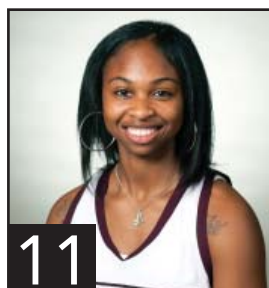

Mississippi State's Diamber Johnson poured in a game-high 24 points as the Lady Bulldogs rolled over Arkansas-Fort Smith 84-48 in a women's basketball exhibition game played Sunday afternoon in the Humphrey Coliseum.

The Lady Bulldogs controlled the contest from start to finish. MSU excelled on the defensive end, holding the Lady Lions to 21.5 percent field goal shooting, while forcing 17 turnovers. Offensively, Johnson was joined in double figures by Porsha Porter with 20 points and Ashley Brown with 10 points.

The contest was never in doubt as the Lady Bulldogs used a 16-1 run to build an 18-3 lead less than nine minutes into the contest. Arkansas-Fort Smith, an NCAA Division II member from the Heartland Conference, struggled to find any type of offensive rhythm in the opening half.

The Lady Lions connected on only 4-of-38 shots from the field for 10.5 percent shooting in the opening half.

After Fort Smith scored five straight points to close within 21-9, the Lady Bulldogs seized complete control of the contest with a 13-3 run to open up a 34-12 lead with 3:29 left in the half.

Johnson had 14 first-half points and three assists on 5-of-9 shooting from the field.

Thanks to 41.2 shooting on the offensive end, the Maroon and White eased into a 36-18 advantage at halftime.

An Ashley Brown layup capped a 9-0 run for the Lady Bulldogs over the first two minutes of the second half. The lead pushed past 30 points on a 3-point basket by Shamia Robinson. Robinson's tray capped another 9-0 run and ran the advantage to 59-28 with 12:28 left in regulation.

The lead grew to as many as 38 in the closing minutes.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 31 of 72 shots from the field (43.1 percent), 5 of 18 shots from 3-point range (27.8 percent) and 17 of 30 shots from the foul line (56.7 percent). The Lady Lions hit 14 of 65 shots from the field (21.5 percent), 0 of 13 shots from 3-point range (0.0 percent) and 20 of 30 shots from the foul line (66.7 percent).

The Lady Bulldogs held a 55-48 rebounding advantage. MSU had 14 assists and 17 turnovers, while Fort Smith had four assists and 21 turnovers.

Coby Hill paced Arkansas-Fort Smith with 13 points.

Mississippi State blocked its way to victory Friday night in a women's basketball season opener.

The Lady Bulldogs set a new school record with 14 total blocks as MSU scored the first 16 points of the game and cruised to a 78-41 victory over Jacksonville State at Humphrey Coliseum.

The victory was the 300th home win in program history. The Lady Bulldogs moved to 22-0 against Ohio Valley Conference foes and 36-2 in home openers. MSU has now won 26 straight home openers.

In her MSU debut, freshman Martha Alwal also set a school record with 10 blocked shots. A 6-foot-4 freshman from Worthington, MN, Alwal posted a double-double with four points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocked shots.

For the Lady Bulldogs, it was a good start all the way around. The offensive charge was led by Diamber Johnson, who poured in a new career high with 30 points on 12-of-23 shooting.

A pair of 3-points by fellow newcomer Kendra Grant sparked the game-opening 16-0 run. After the Lady Gamecocks closed within 18-5, the hosts scored the game's next 10 points.

In the opening half, the Lady Bulldogs defensively held Jacksonville State to 14.8 percent shooting. The Maroon and White eased into halftime with a 35-13 advantage.

In the second half, the Lady Bulldogs scored the first eight points to extend the lead to 30 points. The hosts would lead by as many as 39 on three occasions in the final half.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 31 of 65 shots from the field (47.7 percent), 5 of 18 shots from 3-point range (27.8 percent) and 11 of 18 shots from the foul line (61.1 percent).

The Lady Gamecocks hit 15 of 53 shots from the field (28.3 percent), 3 of 10 shots from 3-point range (30.0 percent) and 8 of 18 shots from the foul line (44.4 percent).

MSU held a 46-32 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 14 assists and 15 turnovers, while the Lady Gamecocks had 13 assists and 26 turnovers.

Porsha Porter added 10 points to the MSU cause.

Jacksonville State received 11 points from Destiny Lane and 10 points from Danielle Vaughn.

Martha Alwal posted her second double-double of the young campaign and Diamber Johnson poured in 21 points as the Lady Bulldogs knocked off Xavier 71-65 at Humphrey Coliseum.

Trailing 18-15 midway through the first half, the Lady Bulldogs (2-0) scored 10 points and did not trail for the remainder of the contest. MSU led by as many as 13 points and withstood one final Xavier rally to post a second consecutive victory at home.

Alwal, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week, scored 14 points and pulled down a team-high 11 rebounds in 32 minutes of work. This effort came on the heels of 11 rebounds and 10 blocked shots in MSU's season-opening win over Jacksonville State.

Xavier sprinted to a 10-2 advantage at the first media time out, but Johnson scored on two of her team's next three possessions to bring the hosts within 10-8. Xavier ran the lead back out to 16-9 and led 18-15 before defensive pressure started the game-deciding run.

A jumper by Alwal placed the Maroon and White in the lead for good. Porsha Porter followed with a steal and fast-break layup. Another Xavier turnover led to an Ashley Brown layup as the hosts grabbed a 25-18 lead with 7:43 left before halftime.

The Lady Bulldogs eased into halftime with a 37-32 advantage.

In the second half, Xavier closed within 37-35, but State extended the lead with a 12-1 run. A layup by Porter gave the hosts a game-best 49-36 lead with 14:37 remaining.

Xavier would get within two on three different occasions in the second half, including at 67-65 with 53 seconds left, but Johnson sank four free throws to clinch the win.

For the contest, MSU hit 28 of 69 shots from the field (40.6 percent), 3 of 9 shots from 3-point range (33.3 percent) and 12 of 18 shots from the foul line (66.7 percent). The Musketeers hit 22 of 51 shots from the field (43.1 percent), 7 of 22 shots from 3-point range (31.8 percent) and 14 of 20 shots from the foul line (70.0 percent).

Xavier held a 43-37 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 13 assists and eight turnovers, while the Musketeers had 15 assists and 19 turnovers.

Porter was also in double figures with 14 points, while Brown pulled down seven rebounds in 21 minutes. MSU had a remarkable 13 steals, including six by Porter. Johnson dished out a team-high seven assists.

Xavier received a double-double from Jessica Pachko (14 points, 11 rebounds). Others in double figures included Tyeasha Moss with 14 points, Shatyrta Hawkes with 12 points and Lynette Holmes with 12 points.

MISSISSIPPI STATE 66, ALCORN STATE 48
NOV. 17, 2011 - STARKVILLE, MISS.

Mississippi State overcame a sluggish start to post a 66-48 victory over Alcorn State in a women's basketball game played Thursday night at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Lady Bulldogs shot 29.4 percent in the opening half and only led 24-15 at the break. The lead was still only seven points midway through the final half before a game-deciding 13-3 run.

Senior Diamber Johnson paced the Lady Bulldogs with 14 points, her 11th-straight game in double figures going back to the 2010-11 season. She was one of three MSU players in double digits, as Porsha Porter and Kendra Grant tallied 13 and 11, respectively.

Freshman Martha Alwal finished one point shy of her third-straight double-double as she paced the MSU defense with 22 rebounds, a mark that tied LaToya Thomas for fifth-most in a game. The tally was also the most ever by a Lady Bulldog freshman, and her 10 offensive boards were the most in a game since 1988.

Both teams struggled through a turnover-marred first half. The Maroon and White scored the game's first seven points and actually never trailed in the contest. A Grant layup moved the MSU advantage to 12-4 with 14:42 left in the half. From there, the Lady Bulldogs would only manage five field goals for the remainder of the half.

While the Lady Bulldogs (3-0) were frigid in the first half, Alcorn State (0-2) was ice cold. The Lady Braves only hit on 4-of-23 first-half field goal attempts. Each team had 12 turnovers in the opening half.

Still, the Lady Bulldogs were rarely threatened in the game's final 20 minutes. A 3-point basket by Grant – one of five by MSU in the contest – placed the hosts on top, 33-19 with 15:35 left in regulation. From there, Alcorn State responded with an 11-4 run to climb back within, 37-30.

A 13-3 run by the Lady Bulldogs moved the lead back out to 50-33 with 7:32 left in regulation. A 3-point basket by Porter capped the monster run.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 26 of 67 shots from the field (38.8 percent), 5 of 16 shots from 3-point range (31.3 percent) and 9 of 20 shots from the foul line (45.0 percent). The Lady Braves hit 18 of 55 shots from the field (32.7 percent), 2 of 8 shots from 3-point range (25.0 percent) and 10 of 21 shots from the foul line (47.6 percent).

MSU held a 59-34 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 12 assists and 24 turnovers, while the Lady Braves had seven assists and 21 turnovers.

Alcorn State received 15 points from Kiara Ruffin and 12 points from Renelle Richmond.

Mississippi State saw its modest season-opening three-game win streak snapped with a 93-47 loss to sixth-ranked Texas A&M in a women's basketball game played Sunday afternoon at Reed Arena.

The Lady Bulldogs (3-1) could not overcome a slow start on the offensive end. After MSU scored the game's first two points on a pair of free throws, the Aggies (4-0) scored the next 17 points. MSU went more than 11 minutes without a field goal, while missing its first 12 shots from the floor.

By the time Porsha Porter did score for MSU, the Aggies had sprinted out to a 25-6 advantage. A layup by Skylar Collins ran the A&M lead to 27-6. The Maroon and White closed back within 31-14 on a pair of free throws by Diamber Johnson.

The Aggies ran the lead back out to 24 twice before easing into halftime with a 43-21 advantage. In the opening half, MSU only hit on 5-of-24 shot attempts, while missing all seven 3-point attempts.

The defending national champions opened the second half on a 22-5 run. A layup by Adaora Elon ran the advantage to 65-26 with 14:30 left in regulation.

The lead would grow to as many as 48 once and 47 twice before the Aggies closed out the victory.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 14 of 56 shots from the field (25.0 percent), 1 of 14 shots from 3-point range (7.1 percent) and 18 of 27 shots from the foul line (66.7 percent). The Aggies hit 38 of 68 shots from the field (55.9 percent), 1 of 7 shots from 3-point range (14.3 percent) and 16 of 25 shots from the free throw line (64.0 percent).

Texas A&M held a 53-27 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had eight assists and 18 turnovers, while the Aggies had 23 assists and 13 turnovers.

Johnson finished with 14 points, while Porter scored 12 points. Ashley Brown had a team-high five rebounds for MSU.

Kelsey Bone posted a double-double for A&M. Bone had 20 points and 13 rebounds. Others in double figures included Karla Gilbert with 12 points, Tyra White with 11 points, Adrienne Pratcher with 11 points and Elonu with 10 points.

Behind freshman Martha Alwal's third double-double of the season and a season-high 18 points from senior Porsha Porter, the Lady Bulldogs put away a pesky Mississippi Valley State squad 64-47 at the Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU improved to 4-1, including a perfect 4-0 at home this season. MVSU dropped to 1-3.

Alwal had 17 points and 12 rebounds, and she finished two blocks shy of a triple-double. Diamber Johnson joined Alwal and Porter in double figures with 10 points, her 13th-straight game scoring double figures.

MSU scored the game's first four points, built an early 14-3 lead and never trailed in the contest. MVSU hung tough, thanks to seven 3-point baskets in the first half, including four from De'Kisha Fondon. The long-range shooting allowed the guests to close out the half with only a 33-31 deficit.

While the Lady Bulldogs strived for better offensive production, the defense took over the contest. After closing within 51-47, MVSU did not score over the final six minutes, seven seconds. State held the Devilettes to 11.4-percent shooting over the game's final 20 minutes.

MSU built an early 7-3 lead on a 3-point play by Alwal. Back-to-back baskets by Catina Bett extended the advantage to 14-3. MVSU then closed within 19-15 with four straight free throws by Brittany Lakes.

MSU held a 54-46 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 14 assists and 18 turnovers, while the Delta Devilettes had nine assists and 21 turnovers.

MVSU was led by Fondon with 14 points (two in the second half) and Olivia Kennedy with 10 points.

MISSISSIPPI STATE 56, SAVANNAH STATE 42
NOV. 26, 2011 - SAVANNAH, GA.

Mississippi State parlayed a brilliant defensive effort and a career-high 18 points from Ashley Brown into a 56-42 victory over Savannah State Saturday afternoon at Tiger Arena.

The Lady Bulldogs (5-1) only allowed three second-half field goals. MSU was nursing a 26-25 lead at halftime. Savannah State (3-2) did not convert its first field goal of the final half until 7:26 remained in the contest.

Brown went 7-for-9 from the field and 4-for-5 from the free-throw line as she bettered her previous personal-best of 17 set last season against North Texas. Brown came one rebound shy of a double-double as she pulled in nine boards, including six on the offensive glass.

For Fanning-Otis, this was career win No. 599. Fanning-Otis is now 599-445 in 35 seasons of coaching Division I basketball. With one more victory, she will become the 14th active coach in Division I women's basketball with 600 or more victories.

The teams played a nip-and-tuck first half. Neither team led by more than six points in that half, while the lead changed hands on three different occasions. An 8-0 run over the first four minutes of play lifted the Maroon and White to an 8-2 advantage. The run was capped by a 3-point basket from Kendra Grant. The lead still remained at four before Savannah State reeled off a 7-0 run of its own.

A 3-point play by Jasmine Kirkland gave Savannah State a 13-12 lead, and the Lady Tigers ran the lead to three as MSU went more than seven minutes between baskets before Ashley Brown hit a layup to break the draught. A 3-point basket by Porter put the Lady Bulldogs up four before they eased into halftime with a 26-25 lead.

In the final half, Savannah State hit only 3-of-21 second-half shots and committed six of their 10 turnovers. A 12-1 run allowed MSU to sprint out to a 38-26 advantage with 16:37 left in the contest. The lead stayed in the double figures range before Gaynor ran it to 14 on an old-fashioned 3-point play. The free throw make meant MSU led 45-31 with 10:19 left.

MSU would build the lead to 15 on two different occasions before posting the victory.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 19 of 51 shots from the field (37.3 percent), 4 of 18 shots from 3-point range (22.2 percent) and 14 of 18 shots from the foul line (77.8 percent). The Lady Tigers hit 12 of 48 shots from the field (25.0 percent), 2 of 12 shots from 3-point range (16.7 percent) and 16 of 28 shots from the foul line (57.1 percent).

MSU held a 43-31 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had eight assists and 13 turnovers, while the Lady Tigers had two assists and 10 turnovers.

In addition to Brown's career-high 18, Diamber Johnson, Porter, Grant and Gaynor each added eight points. Johnson had a team-high three assists, while Bett blocked four shots.

MISSISSIPPI STATE 63, SOUTH ALABAMA 47
NOV. 30, 2011 - STARKVILLE, MISS.

Mississippi State women's basketball coach Sharon Fanning-Otis joined some elite company Wednesday night. Fanning-Otis recorded career victory No. 600 as the Lady Bulldogs won their third straight with a 63-47 victory over South Alabama at Humphrey Coliseum.

Fanning-Otis becomes one of 14 active Division I coaches with 600 or more victories. A former head coach at both the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga and the University of Kentucky, Fanning-Otis is now 600-445 in her 36 seasons as a Division I head coach.

In her 17th season at MSU, Fanning-Otis has posted a 273-217 record. Fanning-Otis has led the Lady Bulldogs to 11 postseason appearances, including the only six NCAA appearances in the program's history.

The Lady Bulldogs (6-1) were rarely threatened after erasing an early 7-2 deficit. MSU scored the game's next 19 points, while holding South Alabama (5-2) scoreless for 9 minutes, 26 seconds.

The Lady Bulldogs shot only hit 1-of-11 3-point shots in the opening half but did shoot 40 percent overall, while building a 29-17 halftime advantage. Defensively, MSU held South Alabama to 14.7 percent shooting in the opening half, as the Lady Jaguars at one time missed 13 straight shots and finished 5-of-34 for the half.

South Alabama closed within 36-30 on a 3-point basket by Jennifer Johnson with 14:19 left in regulation. The hosts tacked on the next six points to reestablish a 42-30 lead with 11:34 left.

The lead would grow to 14 before South Alabama took advantage of heavy foul trouble on MSU to close within eight on two different occasions. Strong free throw shooting and a reemerged inside presence allowed the Maroon and White to close out a third straight win against the Lady Jaguars.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 23 of 52 shots from the field (44.2 percent), 2 of 13 shots from 3-point range (15.4 percent) and 15 of 22 shots from the foul line (68.2 percent). The Lady Jaguars hit 14 of 65 shots from the field (21.5 percent), 4 of 26 shots from 3-point range (15.4 percent) and 15 of 24 shots from the foul line (62.5 percent).

MSU held a 46-40 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had five assists and 17 turnovers, while the Lady Jaguars had seven assists and 13 turnovers.

Johnson paced the Lady Bulldogs with 22 points, while Porsha Porter and Catina Bett each added 11 points. Porter and Bett were both slowed by foul trouble with each player finishing with four fouls. Bett had a team-high eight rebounds and three blocked shots, while Johnson had three assists.

South Alabama received 16 points from Mansa El and 13 points from Sarda Peterson.

Diamber Johnson scored 28 points on 10-of-17 shooting as the Lady Bulldogs won their fourth straight with a 70-55 victory over Tulane at the Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU also received a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds) from Ashley Brown. For Brown, it was her first double-double of the season and fourth for her career.

MSU (7-1) did not trail over the final 24 minutes as the Lady Bulldogs won their fourth straight. Tulane (6-2) lost a second straight contest in this arena as Sunday's defeat came four seasons after a WNIT second-round setback.

Johnson topped the 20-point mark for a second straight game. The last Lady Bulldog to do that was Porsha Porter against Alabama and Auburn a season ago.

The Maroon and White opened the contest with a 12-4 run. Johnson scored her squad's first 10 points. Tulane righted the ship and closed within 13-11 on a 3-point make by Jamie Kaplan. MSU answered with a 3-point basket from Kendra Grant, before Tulane reeled off a 7-2 run to tie the teams at 18.

The lead then swung back and forth before MSU seized control for good to end the first half. Trailing 26-23, the Lady Bulldogs scored the half's final eight points. Porter scored all eight points, including a pair of treys.

The Lady Bulldogs stretched the lead to double digits at 41-30 with 16:09 left to play. MSU maintained at least a five-point push the rest away, shooting a solid 43.3 percent from the field in the second half.

A 12-2 run late in the second half allowed the Lady Bulldogs to lead by as many as 20 at 70-50. Tulane scored the final five points to create the game's final margin.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 25 of 63 shots from the field (39.7 percent), 9 of 24 shots from 3-point range (37.5 percent) and 11 of 15 shots from the foul line (73.3 percent). The Green Wave hit 18 of 58 shots from the field (31.0 percent), 4 of 21 shots from 3-point range (19.0 percent) and 15 of 24 shots from the foul line (62.5 percent).

Tulane held a 45-39 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 11 assists and 16 turnovers, while the Green Wave had 14 assists and 20 turnovers.

Joining Johnson and Brown in double figures were Porter with 14 points and Grant with 11 points. Johnson, Porter and Grant each finished with three 3-point baskets as the Lady Bulldogs had a season-best nine makes from long range.

Tulane received a double-double (13 points, 11 rebounds) from Adesuwu Ebomwonyi and 10 points from Kaplan.

Trailing by eight with less than two minutes remaining, the Lady Bulldogs pulled even before later missing its final two shots in the last eight seconds of the contest, falling 63-62 to Louisiana Tech at Thomas Assembly Center.

MSU (7-2) actually hit eight first-half 3-point baskets. The Lady Bulldogs parlayed the fast start to a 35-28 halftime lead, but after Louisiana Tech (4-6) grabbed its first second-half lead, MSU could not respond as it shot 29.4 percent from the floor in the second half, missed nine free throws and missed all nine 3-point attempts.

For MSU, Diamber Johnson and Porsha Porter hit back-to-back 3-point baskets to open the contest. The Lady Bulldogs led 9-2 less than three minutes in the contest before Johnson and Porter hit back-to-back treys to run the MSU advantage to 20-13. Louisiana Tech scored the game's next nine points and took its only first-half lead at 22-20. A 3-pointer by MSU's Darriel Gaynor placed the Lady Bulldogs back on top, 25-22. The half would end with MSU going on an 8-3 run for a 35-28 halftime advantage.

Louisiana Tech pulled even again with a 13-5 run. The teams would tie twice more, before the hosts seized the lead for good with a 9-0 run. The Lady Bulldogs missed four shots from the field, two shots from the free throw line and turned the ball over once as Louisiana Tech sprinted to a 57-49 advantage.

Still MSU rallied once more. Down 61-53, the Lady Bulldogs used defensive pressure to spark a 7-0 run. A steal and layup by Porter brought State within 61-60 with 54 seconds left.

Louisiana Tech's Courtney Hayes hit one of two free throws before Johnson answered with a game-tying basket with 36 seconds left. Hayes again hit one of two free throws with 24 seconds left for a 63-62 lead.

The Lady Bulldogs had the final shot, however Johnson missed a pair of baseline jumpers and the final rebound was being batted around as the game clock expired.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 22 of 66 shots from the field (33.3 percent), 8 of 25 shots from 3-point range (32.0 percent) and 10 of 21 shots from the foul line (47.6 percent). The Lady Techsters hit 21 of 61 shots from the field (34.4 percent), 5 of 17 shots from 3-point range (29.4 percent) and 16 of 29 shots from the foul line (55.2 percent).

Behind a season-high 25 points from Porsha Porter, the Mississippi State women's basketball team rolled to a 71-57 victory over in-state rival Southern Mississippi Friday night at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Lady Bulldogs improved to 8-2 overall and 7-0 at home.

The Lady Bulldogs forced 25 Southern Miss turnovers and turned those takeaways into 31 points. The Maroon and White scored the game's first 12 points and immediately sprinted out to a 15-1 advantage. After that, the Lady Bulldogs would not lead by less than five the rest of the way.

The Lady Bulldogs also got good balance for the fast scoring start. Kendra Grant scored the game's first five points, before Ashley Brown and Porter hit back-to-back baskets. Porter rammed a 3-pointer home for the 12-0 lead.

MSU shot 46.2 percent from the field in the opening half and led 36-30 at the intermission.

The Lady Bulldogs did indeed finish strong with a brilliant second half. MSU opened the final half with 24-6 run as the lead suddenly grew to 60-36 with 8:41 left in the contest. Defensively, Southern Miss was held to eight field goals in the final half, including a 9 minute, 35 second stretch with only one field goal.

The Lady Eagles closed the game with a 9-2 run to create the final margin.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 23 of 54 shots from the field (42.6 percent), 6 of 17 shots from 3-point range (35.3 percent) and 19 of 25 shots from the foul line (76.0 percent). The Lady Eagles hit 19 of 57 shots from the field (33.3 percent), 4 of 18 shots from 3-point range (22.2 percent) and 15 of 19 shots from the foul line (78.9 percent).

Porter posted her monster night on 8-of-10 shooting from the floor. The senior guard also hit three 3-pointers and 6-of-8 foul shots. Porter is averaging 20.7 points per game in her last three starts. Also in double figures for MSU were Grant with a career-high 13 points and Johnson with 11 points. Brown had a team-high 10 rebounds and a career-high six steals. Johnson added seven assists and a career-high three blocked shots.

Southern Miss received 21 points from Tanecka Carey, 13 points from Niesha Pierce and 11 points from Ance Celmina.

Mississippi State erased a 16-point second-half deficit as the Lady Bulldogs rolled past Nevada 67-63 in the Peppermill Classic consolation game.

The Lady Bulldogs only shot 25 percent from the field, while hitting 9-of-36 shots, including 5-of-13 shots from 3-point range.

Nevada pulled away from an early 11-11 tie with eight straight points. MSU went better than four minutes without scoring before Porsha Porter rammed home a 3-point basket. After a steal and layup by Porter, Diamber Johnson hit a game-tying 3-point basket.

This time, Nevada went on the offensive attack. The Maroon and White went another four minutes without scoring as Nevada opened a 10-point advantage on a 3-point basket by Kate Kevorken. Nevada shot 56.5 percent from the floor in the first half and led 35-24 at the intermission.

The Wolfpack actually enjoyed a 16-point lead on three occasions, the last of which was at 47-31 with 15:23 left in the contest. The Lady Bulldogs were within nine two minutes later. MSU got within six on a Porter layup at 59-53 with 9:16 left. Porter would later tie the teams at 59 as she capped an 11-0 run with a 3-point basket at the 7:26 mark.

Nevada quickly built the lead back to four before MSU answered with a Jerica James 3-point at the 5:27 mark. The Lady Bulldogs took the lead on a Shamira Johnson jumper with 2:40 left. Kendra Grant scored a critical insurance basket with 43 seconds left.

The MSU defensive effort saved the day as Nevada was held to two field goals over the final 9:47 of play.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 23 of 67 shots from the field (34.3 percent), 10 of 24 shots from 3-point range (41.7 percent) and 11 of 16 shots from the foul line (68.8 percent). MSU hit 10 second-half free throws after only attempting two in the first half. The Wolfpack hit 24 of 53 shots from the field (45.3 percent), 5 of 19 shots from 3-point range (26.3 percent) and 10 of 15 shots from the foul line (66.7 percent).

MSU held a 45-35 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 14 assists and 15 turnovers, while the Wolfpack had 15 assists and 18 turnovers.

Johnson had 23 points, four assists and three steals to pace MSU. Porter added 19 points, three assists and two steals. Robinson had a career-high 10 rebounds, while Bett had nine boards. James dished out a career-high five assists 13 minutes of playing time.

Kevorken paced the Wolfpack with 27 points and seven rebounds. Emily Burns had 11 points, while Amanda Johnson handed out eight assists.

Mississippi State let a late nine-point lead slip away as the Lady Bulldogs dropped a 53-48 decision to LSU at Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU dropped its fourth straight in the series, despite holding LSU to its lowest point total in 22 career meetings in this arena. The Lady Bulldogs fell to 10-4 overall and 0-1 in league play, while the Lady Tigers improved to 11-3 and 2-0.

The Lady Bulldogs actually held a 40-31 lead with 9:15 left in the contest. The lead was still 46-39 with 6:16 left to play. However, the Maroon and White surrendered a 14-2 run to end the contest. The Lady Bulldogs went almost six minutes without scoring before Catina Bett hit a layup with 22 seconds left.

Both defenses delivered as each team shot less than 35 percent from the field. The score was tied five times and the lead changed hands five times. MSU erased an early 7-4 deficit by scoring seven straight points. The Lady Bulldogs then ran the advantage to 16-9 on a 3-point basket by Kendra Grant. Both teams struggled inside missing numerous shots inside the paint.

LSU climbed back into the contest with a 10-0 run. A tip-in by LaSondra Barrett placed the Lady Tigers on top 19-16 with 3:22 left in the half. The hosts battled back for a 22-21 advantage on a 3-point basket by Darriel Gaynor. MSU led 23-21 at halftime.

The Lady Bulldogs quickly built a 32-25 lead with a 9-2 run over the early stages of the second half. A tenacious defensive effort coupled with strong ball movement allowed the Maroon and White to hold that advantage for much of the half.

A 3-point basket by Danielle Rector ran the Lady Bulldogs out to a 38-29 advantage with 11:07 left. The lead was again at nine at 40-31. Defensive pressure allowed the guests to reel off six straight points, closing within 40-37.

Four points by Catina Bett helped allow the Maroon and White to push the lead back out to 46-39 before the game-deciding run. The Lady Bulldogs then missed six straight shots from the field and a pair of critical free throws when the lead was one with 3:00 left.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 20 of 58 shots from the field (34.5 percent), 6 of 22 shots from 3-point range (27.3 percent) and 2 of 8 shots from the foul line (25.0 percent). The Lady Tigers hit 20 of 62 shots from the field (32.3 percent), 2 of 9 shots from 3-point range (22.2 percent) and 11 of 15 shots from the foul line (73.3 percent).

LSU held a 43-41 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had 10 assists and 15 turnovers, while the Lady Tigers had eight assists and 13 turnovers. Destini Hughes paced LSU with 17 points, while Barrett scored 13 points and Courtney Jones added 11 points. Bett and Grant had 11 points apiece for MSU. The Lady Bulldogs' leading scorer Diamber Johnson was held to six points of 3-of-11 shooting but dish out five assists.

KENTUCKY 88, MISSISSIPPI STATE 40
JAN. 8, 2012 - LEXINGTON, KY.

A pair of early 9-0 runs placed Mississippi State in an early hole Sunday afternoon. The Lady Bulldogs were unable to recover, dropping an 88-40 decision to No. 11 Kentucky at Memorial Coliseum.

Kentucky improved to 14-2 overall and 3-0 in league play. For the Lady Wildcats, it is their best start in league play since 1993. UK coach Matthew Mitchell, a Mississippi State alumnus, also became the third UK women's coach to post 100 career victories with Sunday's win.

MSU dropped to 10-5 overall and 0-2 in league play. The Lady Bulldogs suffered a season-high 29 turnovers, while allowing UK to hit a school-record 14 3-point shots. MSU's cause was also greatly affected by the absence of senior guard Porsha Porter, who missed the contest due to illness.

Kentucky forced five turnovers over the first three minutes as the hosts quickly sprinted to a 9-0 advantage. After jumpers by Shamia Robinson and Jerica James brought the Lady Bulldogs within 11-4, UK quickly answered with another 9-0 run.

The Lady Wildcats then needed less than two minutes to piece together a 10-0 run. A pair of free throws by UK's Keyla Snowden ran the lead to 30-5 with 9:10 left before halftime.

UK hit 14-of-34 first-half shots, including 8-of-16 shots from 3-point range. The Lady Wildcats worked 12 players into the ballgame in the opening half and led 50-21 at the intermission.

Kentucky opened the second half with an 11-5 run to open a 61-26 advantage. A 9-0 run followed, pushing the lead past 40 for the first time in the contest. The Lady Wildcats led by 48 on two different occasions, including the final margin.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 13 of 47 shots from the field (27.7 percent), 1 of 4 shots from 3-point range (25.0 percent) and 13 of 21 shots from the foul line (61.9 percent). The Lady Wildcats hit 29 of 74 shots from the field (39.2 percent), 14 of 30 shots from 3-point range (46.7 percent) and 16 of 27 shots from the foul line (59.3 percent).

UK held a 51-34 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had two assists and 29 turnovers, while the Lady Wildcats had 18 assists and 12 turnovers.

Diamber Johnson paced the Lady Bulldogs with 16 points. Robinson had a team-high six rebounds.

Kentucky received 22 points from Snowden, 20 points from A'dia Mathies, 13 points from Bria Goss and 10 points from Bernisha Pinkett.

GAME 16

MISSISSIPPI STATE 66, ALABAMA 61
JAN. 12, 2012 - TUSCALOOSA, ALA.

While the University of Alabama remains proud of Foster Auditorium, the new home of its women's basketball team, Mississippi State has also found the facility to its liking.

Trailing for most of the contest Thursday night, MSU notched its first Southeastern Conference victory of the season and a second straight win in this building. A late Kendra Grant 3-point basket broke a tie as the Lady Bulldogs posted a 66-61 victory. That basket came at the 1:18 mark and actually gave the Lady Bulldogs their first lead of the second half. Alabama missed two shots on its offensive end before MSU received possession after a loose ball went out of bounds.

Porsha Porter, back in the lineup after missing Sunday's loss at Kentucky due to illness, sank two free throws to close out the Lady Bulldogs' fifth straight win on the Alabama campus.

The Lady Bulldogs struggled on the defensive end early. After a basket by Johnson gave MSU a 16-15 lead, The Crimson Tide grabbed a 26-20 lead with an 11-4 run. Thanks in part to a 3-point from Porter, the Maroon and White closed back within one.

Alabama (10-8 overall, 0-4 SEC) answered with the game's next seven points to take a 33-25 lead with 3:28 left in the half. UA would run the advantage to 11 points before taking a 41-34 halftime lead.

In the opening half, the Crimson Tide hit 44.4 percent of its shots. Defensively, MSU changed some things around in the second half. Alabama missed all five of its 3-point attempts in the final half and also never made it to the free throw line in the final 20 minutes.

The Lady Bulldogs held Alabama to two field goals over the first seven-plus minutes of the final half. A jumper by Alwal brought MSU within two at 43-41. Alabama quickly reestablished a six-point lead and held some type of lead until Grant hit a game-tying 3-point basket with 4:17 left. Alabama had only one field goal the rest of the way.

Two free throws by Porter again created a 61-61 tie with 2:26 left. Slightly more than a minute later, Grant hit the eventual game-winner.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 23 of 54 shots from the field (42.6 percent), 9 of 26 shots from 3-point range (34.6 percent) and 11 of 17 shots from the foul line (64.7 percent). The Crimson Tide hit 22 of 56 shots from the field (39.3 percent), 5 of 15 shots from 3-point range (33.3 percent) and 12 of 15 shots from the foul line (80.0 percent).

Johnson paced four Lady Bulldogs in double figures with 22 points. Porter added 16 points, while Grant scored 13 points and Catina Bett scored 11 points. Porter's efforts pushed the Chicago native past 500 career points.

Alabama received 15 points from Celiscia Farmer and 11 points from Jasmine Robinson.

Mississippi State could not build on its first Southeastern Conference women's basketball victory of the season. The Lady Bulldogs hung tough and competed for 40 minutes, before falling to No. 19 Georgia 68-51 Sunday afternoon in the Humphrey Coliseum.

With the defeat, MSU fell to 11-6 overall and 1-3 in league play. Georgia moved to 15-3 overall and 4-1 in league play.

The homestanding Lady Bulldogs hit on a season second-best 46 percent of its shots from the field. However, the hosts were partially done in by 22 turnovers and a solid all-around game from Georgia's Anne Marie Armstrong, who poured in a game-high 22 points.

Georgia scored the first five points of the game and never trailed. The guests forced 13 half-turnovers and led by as many as 12 before jumping out to a 34-26 halftime advantage.

Georgia again scored the first five points of the second half and the Maroon and White could not knock the spread into single digits for the remainder of the contest.

Georgia's defense was extremely effective on Johnson, holding her to 10 points. Her 10 points did push Johnson past the 900-point mark, making her the 21st Lady Bulldog to reach that mark.

The guests parlayed the early 5-0 start into a 15-6 lead on a jumper by Armstrong with 13:51 left in the half. The lead moved to 10 at 20-10 on a jumper by Jasmine Hassell. Solid play by Shamia Robinson and Kendra Grant helped MSU close within four with six straight points. Georgia pushed the lead back out to 11 twice before moving into halftime with the 34-26 advantage. While the Lady Bulldogs fought hard in the second half, no sustained run could get the home team back in the contest.

For the contest, MSU hit 23 of 50 shots from the field (46.0 percent), 2 of 11 shots from 3-point range (18.2 percent) and 3 of 4 shots from the foul line (75.0 percent). UGA hit 30 of 71 shots from the field (42.3 percent), 5 of 13 shots from 3-point range (38.5 percent) and 3 of 5 shots from the foul line (60.0 percent).

UGA held a 40-29 rebounding advantage. MSU had 11 assists and 22 turnovers, while UGA had nine assists and 15 turnovers.

Porsha Porter led MSU in scoring with 12 points. Grant and Johnson each added 10 points. Grant now has double-figures in back-to-back games. Martha Alwal pulled down a game-high 11 rebounds. Alwal also added four blocked shots, giving her 48 for the season, which is third in a single-season all-time at MSU.

Georgia received 17 points from Khaalidah Miller and 12 points from Hassell. Armstrong and Hassell each had nine rebounds, both narrowly missing a double-double.

Mississippi State saw its modest two-game win streak snapped with a 51-35 loss to Arkansas Thursday night at Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU shot 25.5 percent from the field — second worst in a game this season — and was held below 40 points for the first time this year.

Again, MSU battled back to a 34-30 deficit with one free throw from Bett at the 10: 17 mark. Alas, the hosts would then go the rest of the way without another field goal. The second half draught would encompass the final 11:55 without a made basket and six made free throws.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs made 13 of 51 shots from the field (25.5 percent), 1 of 15 shots from 3-point range (6.7 percent) and 8 of 13 shots from the foul line (61.5 percent).

Mississippi State took Vanderbilt to the wire Sunday afternoon before dropping a 65-59 Southeastern Conference women's basketball decision in the Humphrey Coliseum.

Celebrating National Women in Sports Week on campus, the Lady Bulldogs battled the highly-touted Commodores to the final couple of minutes. Vanderbilt broke a 54-54 tie with seven straight points to seal the victory.

MSU dropped to 13-10 overall and 3-7 in league play. The Lady Bulldogs have lost four straight conference decisions. Vanderbilt improved to 18-5 and 6-4. VU has now four straight in the series, after MSU had won the previous three matchups.

The Lady Bulldogs' only lead of the contest took place when Porsha Porter scored on the opening possession of the game. Vanderbilt then used a 10-2 run to build a 10-4 advantage. The Lady Commodores continued the early defensive pressure to stretch the lead to a 13-point advantage at 19-6.

MSU closed back within eight on a 3-pointer by Porter. Vanderbilt still maintained a nine-point advantage before a 7-1 run to close the half brought the Maroon and White within 29-26. MSU missed its final three shots of the half and still trailed by that margin at the intermission.

The Lady Bulldogs fell back down seven points in the early stages of the second half. Six straight MSU points then capped an 11-4 run to bring the teams even. Back-to-back baskets by Porter and Diamber Johnson tied the game 40-40.

Vanderbilt again reclaimed a seven point lead before MSU forced one last tie at 54-54 with 4:05 remaining. From there, the Commodores got a go-ahead basket from Stephanie Holzer and a back-breaking 3-pointer Jasmine Lister with 2:45 left. That trey was one of only two made by the Commodores in the contest.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 26 of 70 shots from the field (37.1 percent), 4 of 13 shots from 3-point range (30.8 percent) and 3 of 7 shots from the foul line (42.9). The Commodores hit 27 of 57 shots from the field (47.4 percent), 2 of 14 shots from 3-point range (14.3 percent) and 9 of 12 shots from the foul line (75.0 percent).

Vanderbilt held a 45-34 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had nine assists and 13 turnovers, while the Commodores had 21 assists and 19 turnovers.

Johnson paced the Lady Bulldogs with 17 points, while only making one turnover in 30 minutes at the point guard position. Catina Bett tied her career high with 16 points, while Martha Alwal had a team-best eight rebounds and two blocked shots.

Holzer had a double-double for Vanderbilt with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Christina Foggie added 17 points.

Rallying from down 10 points late, the Lady Bulldogs snapped a five-game losing streak with a 53-50 overtime win over Ole Miss before a season-best crowd of 1,638.

The Lady Bulldogs have won five straight in the series and seven of the last eight. MSU has swept the season series in three of the past four seasons.

Neither team displayed an offensive shooting clinic Sunday afternoon. Both teams shot below 30 percent from the floor and hit a combined 5-of-26 shots from 3-point range. A total of 17 free throws were missed, while the teams combined for a remarkable 110 rebounds.

The Lady Bulldogs hit one 3-point basket in the contest, a Diamber Johnson tying trey with five seconds remaining. Teammate Porsha Porter stole the inbounds but could not get an off-balanced 10-footer to fall as the horn for regulation time expired.

In the overtime, the Lady Bulldogs took the lead for good at 47-45 on a layup by Martha Alwal with 2:38 left. After a steal by Jerica James, Porter hit a jumper in the lane, giving the Maroon and White a four-point advantage – their largest in the contest.

The lead changed hands five times during a competitive first half, but a late jumper by Danielle McCray placed the Lady Rebels on top 24-23 at the intermission. Ole Miss scored the first six points of the game's final half to stretch the lead to 30-23. The Lady Bulldogs went close to four minutes before Porter finally scored her team's first basket of the second half.

A 3-pointer by Amber Singletary allowed Ole Miss to stretch the lead to 35-25 with 13:36 remaining. The lead was still 10 at 37-27 with 12:45 left. The Lady Bulldogs then found a different intensity on defense. Ole Miss was charged with 10 second-half turnovers, including two in overtime.

A James jumper and layup by Porter started a 9-0 MSU. Two free throws by Porter brought the Lady Bulldogs within one at 37-36 with 5:50 left. Ole Miss went close to eight minutes before McCray broke the draught with a layup. Two free throws by Monique Jackson ran the UM lead to 41-36. MSU answered with back-to-baskets by Porter. After two free throws by UM's Valencia McFarland with 16 seconds left, Johnson had the game-tying answer on the other end.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 22 of 74 shots from the field (29.7 percent), 1 of 11 shots from 3-point range (9.1 percent) and 8 of 15 shots from the foul line (53.3 percent). The Lady Rebels hit 17 of 67 shots from the field (25.4 percent), 4 of 15 shots from 3-point range (26.7 percent) and 12 of 22 shots from the foul line (54.5 percent).

Ole Miss held a 62-48 rebounding advantage. The Lady Bulldogs had six assists and nine turnovers, while the Lady Rebels had nine assists and 18 turnovers.

Porter paced the Lady Bulldogs with 18 points, while Alwal had a team-high 10 rebounds. Ole Miss received 16 points from McFarland. McCray and Tia Faleru each had a team-high 12 rebounds.

Mississippi State could never get the offense going Thursday night as the Lady Bulldogs dropped a 79-45 decision to Florida in a Southeastern Conference women's basketball game played in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

MSU dropped to 14-14 overall and 4-11 in league play. Florida improved to 18-10 and 8-7. Florida has won six straight in the series, including the last four played in Gainesville.

The Lady Bulldogs were playing their first game since Fanning-Otis announced her retirement Monday after 17 seasons at the school. Fanning-Otis has led MSU to 11 postseason appearances, including six trips to the NCAA tournament.

On this night, Florida proved way too much to handle. Florida scored the game's first 11 points and never trailed in the contest. The Lady Bulldogs went close to five minutes before finally scoring.

After a 3-point basket by MSU's Kendra Grant finally broke the ice, the Gators quickly moved the lead to double digits. MSU could not get back inside 10 the remainder of the way. Florida used a 6-0 run to build a 16-point lead and later held a 33-18 advantage at halftime.

In the opening half, the Lady Bulldogs hit 26.7 percent of their shots from the field and could not manage to get to the free throw line.

The Gators scored the first five points of the second half to build a 20-point advantage. The UF lead ran past 30 points in the closing minutes, while a 9-0 run allowed the Gators to go up by 36 points in the final minute.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 17 of 55 shots from the field (30.9 percent), 3 of 16 shots from 3-point range (18.8 percent) and 8 of 12 shots from the foul line (66.7 percent). The Gators hit 29 of 67 shots from the field (43.3 percent), 9 of 28 shots from 3-point range (32.1 percent) and 12 of 14 shots from the foul line (85.7 percent).

MSU had nine assists and 21 turnovers, while UF had 23 assists and 17 turnovers.

Porsha Porter led the Lady Bulldogs with 17 points.

Florida received 18 points from Jordan Jones, 13 points from Azania Stewart and 12 points from Jennifer George.

Mississippi State dropped a 76-40 decision to Kentucky on Senior Day in a Southeastern Conference women's basketball game played at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Lady Bulldogs were playing the final regular season game under the direction of head coach Sharon Fanning-Otis, who announced her retirement Monday.

The Lady Bulldogs finish the regular season at 14-15 overall and 4-12 in league play. The 10th-ranked Wildcats improved to 24-5 overall and 13-3 in league play.

MSU will enter the SEC Tournament as the No. 10 seed. The Lady Bulldogs will play No. 7 Vanderbilt in a first-round game 2:30 p.m. Thursday at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn. The contest will be televised regionally by Fox Sports Net.

On Sunday, the Lady Bulldogs said good-bye to six seniors in pre-game ceremonies. Fanning-Otis was honored with a postgame video tribute, which moved the 36-year head coaching veteran to tears. A reception in her honor was held postgame in the Mize Pavilion.

The Wildcats used their frantic full-court pressure to force a season-worst 33 turnovers by the Lady Bulldogs. Kentucky built on an early 8-7 advantage by scoring the game's next 11 points.

A follow-up 10-0 run allowed the guests to take a commanding 29-10 advantage with 4:28 left in the half. The Lady Bulldogs shot 22.2 percent from the field in the opening half and trailed 41-17 at halftime.

A 9-2 run to start the second half pushed Kentucky to a 30-plus point advantage in the early stages of the game's final half.

For the contest, the Lady Bulldogs hit 14 of 53 shots attempts from the field (26.4 percent), 2 of 8 shots from 3-point range (25.0 percent) and 10 of 16 shots from the foul line (62.5 percent). The Wildcats hit 27 of 67 shots from the field (40.3 percent), 7 of 18 shots from 3-point range (38.9 percent) and 15 of 22 shots from the foul line (68.2 percent).

The teams were even at 42 on rebounds. MSU had nine assists and 33 turnovers, while UK had 10 assists and 16 turnovers.

Kendra Grant paced MSU with nine points, while Johnson and Porter each had eight points in their final game.

Kentucky received 13 points from A'dia Mathies and Bernisha Pinkett, while Samarie Walker had a game-high 10 rebounds.
