QUICKLY...

- ◆ The No. 14/16 South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) go on the road for the first time in 2014 when they travel to Nashville, Tenn. for an SEC Eastern Division showdown on Saturday, September 20, against the Vanderbilt Commodores (1-2, 0-1 SEC). Game time is set for 7:30 p.m. ET at Vanderbilt Stadium (40,350). The game will be televised nationally on the SEC Network.
- ◆ The Gamecocks are looking for their third-straight win after a season-opening loss. After dropping the opener to No. 21/20 Texas A&M, the Gamecocks have rebounded with wins over East Carolina and No. 6 Georgia.
- ◆ Vanderbilt is coming off its first win of the season, a 34-31 nailbiter against UMass. The Commodores had lost their first two games of the season, falling to Temple, 37-7, and to Ole Miss, 41-3.
- ◆ South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier is looking for his 202nd win as an SEC coach, which would pass Georgia legend Vince Dooley for second on the all-time list. Coach Spurrier tied Dooley last week with a 38-35 win over Georgia, his 16th-career win against the Bulldogs, the most by any coach. Coach Spurrier logged a school-record 122 wins at Florida from 1990-2001, and has won a school record 79 games at South Carolina, giving him 201 wins for his career. Only Paul "Bear" Bryant (292) has more wins as an SEC head coach than Coach Spurrier.

A South Carolina win over Vanderbilt would...

- ♦ Be Steve Spurrier's 202nd win as an SEC head coach, passing Georgia legend Vince Dooley for sole possession of second on the all-time list. He currently has 201 career victories as an SEC head coach, 122 at Florida and 79 at South Carolina. Only Paul "Bear" Bryant (292) has won more as an SEC head coach.
- ◆ Be its sixth-straight over the Commodores. The Gamecocks have won five straight, 12 of the last 14 and 19 of the previous 23 meetings with Vanderbilt.
- Improve head coach Steve Spurrier's record over Vanderbilt to 20-2. His 19 wins against Vanderbilt trails only his 20 career victories over Kentucky in wins over any opponent.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: The No. 14/16 South Carolina Gamecocks (2-1, 1-1 SEC) and Vanderbilt Commodores (1-2, 0-1 SEC) meet in an SEC Eastern Division showdown at Vanderbilt Stadium (40,350) in Nashville on Saturday, September 20. The 7:30 p.m. ET (6:30 local) game will be televised nationally on the SEC Network with Brent Musburger and Jesse Palmer in the booth and Maria Taylor on the sidelines.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2014 marks the 121st season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 108th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 578-548-44. The Gamecocks were nine games under .500 until head coach Steve Spurrier took the reins in 2005, but are 39 games over since that time.

SEC HISTORY: 2014 marks South Carolina's 23rd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their first SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. Carolina was 37-66-1 (.361) in SEC action from 1992-2004, but is 42-32 (.567) in conference play since Coach Spurrier took the reins, including a 19-7 mark over the last four years.

VS. VANDY: This is the 24th all-time meeting between South Carolina and Vanderbilt, with the Gamecocks holding a 19-4 advantage, including a 10-2 record when the games have been played in Nashville and a 9-2 mark when the teams have met in Columbia. In the previous 23 outings, Vanderbilt has tallied more than 17 points just four times (24 in 2003, an all-time high 28 in 2005, 24 in 2008 and 25 in 2013). The Gamecocks won last year's meeting in Columbia by a 35-25 count and won by a 17-13 score in 2012 on their last trip to Nashville. The Gamecocks have won five straight in the series and 12 of the last 14. In those last five wins, Carolina has surrendered just 58 total points. Vandy's four wins have come in back-to-back fashion on two occasions - first in 1998 and '99, then again in 2007 and '08. Those four wins have been by a combined total of 22 points. The teams met just once (1961) before they became SEC Eastern Division rivals beginning in 1992, and have met every year since. Of the Division I FBS opponents against whom the Gamecocks have at least 10 all-time meetings, Carolina has its best winning percentage against Vanderbilt at .826.

SPURRIER VS. VANDERBILT: South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier owns a 19-2 all-time record against Vanderbilt, including a 7-2 mark as head coach at South Carolina. He was a perfect 10-0 against the Commodores while head coach at Florida from 1990-2001, and bested Vanderbilt twice in 1987 and 1988 while head coach at Duke. The only team Coach Spurrier has defeated more often than Vanderbilt in his career is Kentucky (20-1).

19 GOING ON 20: Head coach Steve Spurrier is looking for his 20th career victory against Vanderbilt. He is currently 19-2 all-time against the Commodores. Here is the list of current head coaches with the most wins against one school:

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Behind senior quarterback Connor Shaw's 368 yards of total offense, South Carolina held on to defeat Vanderbilt 35-25 on Sept. 14, 2013 at Williams-Brice Stadium. Shaw threw for 284 yards and three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing while also leading the Gamecocks in rushing with 84 yards on 19 carries. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington hauled

in eight catches for 111 yards and a score, while sophomore running back Mike Davis added 144 all-purpose yards (77 rushing, 67 receiving) in the victory. The Gamecocks opened up a 35-10 lead entering the final period, but Vandy made it interesting with a pair of quick touchdowns early in the 4th quarter. Jimmy Legree picked off a pass at the goal line with just under nine minutes remaining and Carolina put together a 17-play drive that consumed nearly eight minutes to basically run out the clock and preserve the victory.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: The Gamecocks opened the 2012 season with a hardfought 17-13 win at SEC Eastern Division rival Vanderbilt on Thursday, Aug. 30, 2012. The Gamecocks survived two turnovers on their first three plays from scrimmage and took a 10-0 advantage early in the second quarter. The Commodores rallied back to take a 13-10 lead heading into the final stanza. Carolina was able to put together a nine-play, 66-yard drive that culminated in a Marcus Lattimore one-yard plunge to go on top 17-13 early in the fourth quarter, and held on for the win. The Gamecock defense limited Vandy to just 17 yards in the final period. Lattimore led the Carolina offense with 110 yards rushing and two scores, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors, while quarterback Connor Shaw carried 14 times for 92 yards as the Gamecocks rolled up 205 yards on the ground. Senior linebacker Shaq Wilson tied for the team lead with eight tackles and also logged a key interception. Carolina recorded five sacks that night.

ROAD WARRIORS: This is Carolina's first road game of the 2014 campaign. The Gamecocks are 12-5 in their last 17 true road contests. Four of the five road losses in that stretch came to nationallyranked opponents: at No. 8 Arkansas in 2011, at No. 9 LSU and No. 3 Florida in 2012 and at No. 11 Georgia in 2013, before losing to unranked Tennessee in 2013.

TOP-10 PROGRAM: Carolina has put together three-straight Top-10 finishes, the first three in school history, finishing ninth in 2011, eighth in 2012 and fourth in 2013 according to the Associated Press. They finished eighth, seventh and fourth in each subsequent year in the USA Today/ ESPN Coaches' poll. South Carolina, Alabama and Oregon are the only Division I schools to finish in the AP Top-10 in each of the past three seasons. The Gamecocks have finished among the nation's Top 25 for four-straight seasons, another "first" in school history. Here are South Carolina's all-time final AP Top-25 rankings:

YEAR (FINAL AP): 1958 (13); 1984 (11); 1987 (15); 2000 (19); 2001 (13); 2010 (22); 2011 (9); 2012 (8); 2013 (4).

THE RANKINGS PART I: The Gamecocks finished fourth in the final Associated Press and USA TODAY/Coaches polls in 2013. It marked the highest finish in school history, surpassing the No. 8/7 rankings from the 2012 campaign.

THE RANKINGS PART II: The Gamecocks opened the 2014 campaign ranked ninth in both national polls. The Gamecocks play five teams that began the season in the top 25 including Auburn (6), Georgia (12), Clemson (16), Texas A&M (21) and Missouri (24). This marked the first time in school history that Carolina has been ranked in the AP preseason top 25 in four straight seasons. Only five schools - Alabama, Oregon, Florida State, South Carolina and LSU - have been in preseason AP Top 12 each of last four years.

THE RANKINGS PART III: After the opening game setback to Texas A&M, the Gamecocks slipped 12 spots in both polls to No. 21. After knocking off East Carolina, they slipped to No. 24 in the AP poll and to No. 23 in the Amway Coaches' poll. A thrilling 38-35 win last week over No. 6/6 Georgia lifted the Gamecocks 10 spots to No. 14 in the A.P. poll and seven spots to No. 16 in the Coaches' poll.

THE STREAK LIVES ON: The Gamecocks are tied for the fifth-longest current streak of being ranked in the A.P.'s Top-25. Carolina and Stanford have been ranked for 68-consecutive polls, trailing only Alabama, LSU, Oregon and Oklahoma. Carolina's streak started with the second week of the 2010 season and is the longest streak in school history.

THE LAST TIME OUT: No. 24/23 South Carolina surprised No. 6/6 Georgia by a 38-35 score last Saturday in Columbia. Dylan Thompson completed 21-of-30 passes for 271 yards and three TDs. Brandon Wilds (93) and Mike Davis (66) combined for 159 rushing yards. The Gamecocks put together four touchdown drives of exactly 75 yards. Skai Moore led the Carolina defense with 10 tackles. The Bulldogs had a chance to take the lead late in the contest after gaining a turnover, but the Carolina defense stiffened after facing a first-and-goal at the four, holding the Dawgs scoreless and preserving the victory.

LONG DRIVE CONTEST: The Gamecocks have put together 17 scoring drives this season, culminating in 12 touchdowns and five field goals. Ten of the 17 drives have been 75 yards or longer. Only two drives have started on the opponents' half of the field.

LARGE CROWD: The Gamecocks and Bulldogs drew 84,232 to Williams-Brice Stadium last Saturday, the fifth-largest crowd to attend a game in Columbia. The Gamecocks rank 14th in the nation in home attendance with an average of 82,659 per game. Carolina has had 10 consecutive sellouts at Williams-Brice Stadium.

FIRST START: Five Gamecocks have made their first career starts this season. Three players, all on defense, made their first career start in the season opener against Texas A&M. Getting the nod for the first time were linebackers Jonathan Walton and Bryson Allen-Williams and cornerback Al Harris Jr. Center Alan Knott and safety Chris Moody both made their first start against East Carolina

REMEMBER HIM?: Linebacker **Bryson Allen-Williams** and cornerback **Al Harris Jr.** became the first true freshmen to start a season opener for Carolina since Jadeveon Clowney in 2011.

STEPPING UP: Fifth-year senior Dylan Thompson is the starting signal-caller for the Gamecocks in 2014. Thompson has waited patiently for his turn behind Connor Shaw, the winningest quarterback in school history. The 6-3, 218-pounder from Boiling Springs, who proposed marriage to his girlfriend at midfield in August, is 5-1 as a starter in his career. He has thrown for over 300 yards in three of his six career starts, and has thrown at least three touchdowns in four of those starts. He also threw the game-winning touchdown in the final seconds of the 2013 Outback Bowl win over Michigan. In the 2104 season opener against Texas A&M, Thompson connected on 20-of-40 passes for a career-high 366 yards, the ninth-highest single-game mark in school history, and a career-high four touchdowns. He was more efficient against East Carolina, connecting on 25of-38 for 266 yards. He was 21-for-30 with three TDs against Georgia. After three weeks, he ranks fourth in the SEC averaging 301.0 yards passing per game and is fifth with 304.0 yards of total offense per game. A SPECIAL FRIENDSHIP: Fifth-year seniors quarterback Dylan Thompson and offensive guard A.J. Cann have developed a special bond. Not only are they great friends and roommates, but they also spent a week over the summer together in Israel, where they were able to teach some of the locals about football. The once in a lifetime experience was one they will both remember forever.

BE LIKE MIKE: Junior tailback Mike Davis has earned preseason All-America recognition. The 5-9, 223-pounder from Atlanta, Ga., logged the fourth-most single-season rushing yards in school history last season when he rambled for 1,183 yards with 11 touchdowns. He was limited to six carries for 15 yards in the opener against Texas A&M before leaving with bruised ribs, but bounced back with an 18-carry, 101-yard, 2 TD effort against East Carolina. He had 16 carries for 66 yards against Georgia. For the season, he has rushed 41 times for 182 yards. In his third season at Carolina, he ranks 22nd in school history with 1,640 rushing yards and owns eight 100-yard rushing games. Davis is the younger brother of former Clemson standout James Davis.

GO THE DISTANCE: Mike Davis logged four rushes of 50 yards or more in his first two seasons. He had a 50-yarder against UAB in 2012. His 75-yard burst against North Carolina in the 2013 season opener and his first career start was the longest by a Gamecock since Bobby Wallace went for 88 against Middle Tennessee in 2006. He matched that with another 75-yard sprint at Georgia. Of the 14 runs in school history of 75 yards or longer, Davis is the only one to do it twice. His fourth-career 50-yard jaunt came at UCF, a 53-yard TD run. Only Derek Watson has more runs of 50-plus yards at Carolina. Here's the list of those with three or more:

RUNNING WILDS: Although Mike Davis has received the lion's share of the publicity, he is not the only capable runner in the Gamecock backfield. Junior **Brandon Wilds** (6-2, 230) actually leads the squad in rushing after three games with 187 yards on 37 attempts, an average of 5.1 yards per carry. For his career, he has 894 yards and seven touchdowns on 187 rushes. As a true freshman in 2011, he started the year as the fifth-team tailback, but as injuries mounted, he climbed the depth chart and posted three 100-yard rushing games, including a career-high 137 against Tennessee. He had a 2014 season-high 93 yards rushing in the win over Georgia.

NOTHING CATCHY ABOUT THIS: The Gamecocks feature four wideouts that receive the bulk of the action:

♦ Junior **Shaq Roland** (6-1, 176), a former "Mr. Football" in the state of South Carolina (following in the footsteps of Stephon Gilmore, Marcus Lattimore and Jadeveon Clowney), is the most gifted of the receiving corps. He came on strong at the end of his sophomore season, posting a career-high 112 receiving yards on six catches in the 2014 Capital One Bowl win over Wisconsin. He had a career-high seven catches for 94 yards against ECU. He is second on the squad with a dozen catches for 143 yards and one score.

- ♦ Senior Nick "Governor Nicky" Jones (5-7, 168), has been consistent and sometimes overlooked throughout his Carolina career. He just has a knack for getting open and catching the ball. He logged the first 100-yard receiving game of his career against Texas A&M, catching five passes for a career-best 113 yards and two touchdowns, including a 69-yard TD reception. He leads the team and ranks among the SEC's top-10 in both receptions per game (4.7-T8th) and receiving yards per game (81.3-6th) after three contests.
- ♦ Senior Damiere Byrd (5-9, 170) is the fastest Gamecock and one of the fastest players in the SEC. He has eight career receptions of 40 yards or more, including a 46-yard TD catch against Texas A&M, is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection and was a captain on the Gamecocks' track & field squad.
- ◆ Sophomore **Pharoh Cooper** (5-11, 201) was an All-SEC Freshman selection last season as both an all-purpose back and return specialist. He had three catches in the season opener against Texas A&M, matching his career total, and topped that with five receptions against ECU. He has also seen some action at the "Wildcat" position.

Anderson has averaged 17.3 yards per catch with nine touchdowns in his career. He suffered a torn triceps muscle late in spring drills but worked his way back and caught three passes for 52 yards in the opener against Texas A&M. He had a big day against Georgia with five catches for 67 yards and a score. Junior Jerell Adams (6-6, 242) has averaged 16.6 yards per catch and had three scores in his first two campaigns. He had two catches for 40 yards against A&M. Senior Cody Gibson (6-7, 278) made the conversion to tight end this fall after spending his career at tackle. THREE OF THE BEST: The Gamecocks feature what many believe may be the best offensive line in school history, led by three veterans. Senior left guard A.J. Cann (6-4, 311) is the anchor. He has made 41 career starts, the most on the squad, and has been named to five preseason first-team All-America squads. Senior left tackle Corey Robinson (6-8, 344) has made 25 starts and was a second-team preseason All-SEC pick by both the media and coaches. Redshirt junior right tackle Brandon Shell (6-6, 333) has made 26 career starts and was a preseason third-team All-SEC selection by the league's 14 coaches.

CANN DO: Senior left guard A.J. Cann made his 41st career start against Georgia. He is one of only 11 players in school history to make 40 or more starts for the Garnet & Black. Here is that list:

MISSING MIKE: Fourth-year junior offensive lineman Mike Matulis has been sidelined with a left knee injury, suffered in a preseason scrimmage. Matulis was penciled in to be the starter at right guard. The 6-5, 307-pounder has made 10 starts in his Gamecock career, all at a tackle position. Matulis has not had the knee surgically repaired, as he hopes to return to the lineup later this season.

LIFE WITHOUT CLOWNEY: Senior defensive tackle J.T. Surratt (6-2, 310) is the leader of the defensive line. He is the only returning starter along the front four, as Carolina replaced Jadeveon Clowney, Kelcy Quarles and Chaz Sutton, the first two of whom earned All-America honors. Surratt and Gerald Dixon are the Gamecocks' active leaders in career sack with 2.0. In fact, the entire current roster has combined for just 15.0 sacks, well short of Clowney's career total of 24.0. The Gamecocks had 2.0 sacks against Georgia after notching just one in the first two games combined. Here are the current players' sack numbers:

DEEP LINEBACKING CORPS: What was perceived as the weak link of the defense a year ago is now a strength. The Gamecocks returned all of their linebackers and Spurs, and defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward is comfortable rotating as many as nine players at those positions. Because of this, the Gamecocks have incorporated some 3-4 looks in addition to their base 4-2-5 defensive scheme.

SHARING THE WEALTH: The Gamecocks distributed their tackles fairly evenly last season, with nine players recording between 39 and 56 tackles. Six of the top eight tacklers are back, led by Skai Moore (56) and Kaiwan Lewis (54). That trend seems to be continuing this season, as eight players have recorded double-digits in tackles. Skai Moore (23) and T.J. Gurley (18) lead the way.

THE SKAI'S THE LIMIT: The best linebacker in the SEC that no one has heard about may be sophomore Skai Moore. The 6-2, 213-pounder from Cooper City, Fla. led the Gamecocks in both tackles (56) and interceptions (4) as a true freshman in 2013, despite starting just four games. He logged six tackles, all solo stops, in the season opener against Texas A&M, including the Gamecocks' lone sack, and has led the team in tackles in each of the last two games with seven stops against East Carolina and a career-best 10 vs. Georgia.

YOUNG BUCKS: Defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward has been impressed by several true freshmen on the defensive side of the ball. Al Harris Jr., whose father Al Harris was an NFL Pro Bowl cornerback, started the season opener. Chris Lammons did not arrive on campus until August, but has worked his way into the cornerback rotation as well after the Gamecocks lost both starting corners from a year ago, Victor Hampton and Jimmy Legree. Despite the entire stable of linebackers returning in tact, Bryson Allen-Williams has seen significant action as well, especially when Carolina lines up in a 3-4 defense.

LEADER IN THE SECONDARY: Senior **Brison** Williams is the unquestioned leader in the secondary. The 5-11, 208-pound senior from Warner Robins, Ga., has played both safety positions during his Gamecock career, but has moved over to corner to start the 2014 campaign. He has started 27 times in his career. He is tied for fourth on the team with a dozen tackles, all solo stops.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted 18 passes a season ago, led by linebacker **Skai Moore's** four INTs, and notched their first two picks of the year against East Carolina, with **Sharrod Golightly** and **T.J. Gurley** each getting into the action. Here are the interception numbers:

THE FRISCO KID: Elliott Fry walked on to the Gamecock squad last summer and earned the starting placekicking chores. The Frisco, Texas product went 15-for-18 in field goal attempts and was successful on 54-of-55 extra point attempts for a team-leading 99 points, earning Freshman All-SEC accolades. His 99 points were the fourth-highest single-season total in school history. He missed his only field goal attempt in the opener against A&M, but that came from 54 yards out. He rebounded against East Carolina, going 4-for-4 in field goals, matching his career-best performance, and accounting for 15 points while earn-

ing SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. He hit again from 32-yards out against Georgia, giving him a streak of five in a row. He is tied for sixth in the SEC in points scored by kicking, averaging 9.0 points per game.

HULL OF A PUNTER: Senior Tyler Hull handles the punting chores for Carolina for a third-straight season. He averaged 39.4 yards as a sophomore and 37.8 yards as a junior. He is off to a better start this season, punting seven times for a 44.1-yard average, which ranks fifth in the SEC.

THREE-PEAT: The Gamecocks have put together three-straight 11-win seasons, the first back-to-back-to-back, double-digit win seasons in school history. They have logged three of their four 10-or more win seasons in the last three years. The only previous 10-win campaign came in 1984. The Gamecocks won 22 games from 2012-2013, 33 from 2011-2013, and 42 from 2010-2013, all school records.

BEATING THE BEST: The Gamecocks defeated six teams that won its 2013/14 postseason bowl game in 2013: Clemson (Orange), UCF (Fiesta), Missouri (Cotton), North Carolina (Belk), Mississippi State (Liberty) and Vanderbilt (BBVA Compass). South Carolina also posted wins over three teams that finished in the AP Top-10 (Missouri – 5; Clemson – 8; UCF – 10). In addition, Carolina posted wins over five teams that finished in the Top-25 in both the AP and Coaches' polls (Missouri – 5/5; Clemson – 8/7; UCF – 10/12; Wisconsin – 22/21; and Vanderbilt – 24/23).

TWELVE WITH 40: The Carolina 2013 senior class was the winningest class in school history with 42 victories. Only 12 Division I-A schools logged 40-plus wins over that span:

THEY'RE BACK: The Gamecocks welcomed 56 returning letterwinners for the 2014 season. The 56 lettermen consist of 27 offensive players, 23 defensive players and six special teams players. The Gamecocks lost 12 lettermen, including six on offense and six on defense.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: The Gamecocks return 78 percent of their rushing yards, 26 percent of their passing yards and 75 percent of their receiving yards from a year ago. In addition, six of the squad's top eight tacklers, return in 2014.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN: The Gamecocks said goodbye to 10 lettermen from last year's roster including eight starters. The departing starters include DE Jadeveon Clowney, WR Bruce Ellington, CB Victor Hampton, CB Jimmy Legree, OG Ronald Patrick, DT Kelcy Quarles, QB Connor Shaw and DE Chaz Sutton.

EARNING THEIR WAY: Two former walk-ons – junior wide receiver Carlton Heard and senior fullback Jordan Diaz – were rewarded with scholarships by Coach Spurrier during the preseason camp for the 2014 school year.

BROTHERLY LOVE: The Gamecocks have two sets of brothers on the squad. Redshirt sophomore offensive linemen **Brock and Clayton Stadnik** are twins. On the defensive line, **Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr.** are half-brothers. They share the same father, Gerald Dixon Sr., who played at Carolina in the early '90s.

STAFF INTACT: The Gamecocks returned their entire coaching staff from the 2013 campaign. It's the first time in Coach Spurrier's tenure at South Carolina that every member of the staff returned for a second-straight season.

GOOD HOME COOKIN': The Gamecocks had their school-record 18-game home winning streak, the longest in the nation, snapped in the season opener. The school's previous longest home

winning streak was 15 games, set from 1978-80. The Gamecocks are 20-1 in their last 21 games at Williams-Brice Stadium and 36-4 (.900) in their last 40 home games. The only home losses since the start of the 2009 season came to top-ranked Florida in 2009, to 17th-ranked Arkansas in 2010 and to defending national champion Auburn in 2011 before the 2014 loss to Texas A&M.

CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR: The Gamecocks have been frustrated by defeating the SEC Eastern Division champion in each of the past three years (Georgia in 2011 and 2012; Missouri in 2013) and having a 6-2 conference record in each campaign, yet did not represent the East at the SEC title game in any of those seasons.

SILVER ANNIVERSARY: Head coach Steve Spurrier is in his 25th season as a college head coach. He has won 221 games in that time, the fourth-highest win total among Division I coaches in their first 25 years. With a successful 2014 campaign, he could move up to second on the list, behind only Nebraska's Tom Osborne. Here is that impressive list of 200 or more wins over the first 25 seasons as a head coach:

GAMECOCKS PICKED TO WIN THE EAST:

Media attending the annual SEC Media Days in Birmingham in July picked South Carolina to win the Eastern Division of the SEC in 2014. The Gamecocks claimed the top spot in the East despite having no players listed on the first-team all-conference squad as selected by the media. It's the first time in SEC history that has occurred. Georgia, Florida and Missouri follow the Gamecocks, ahead of Tennessee, Vanderbilt and Kentucky. Alabama edged Auburn for the No. 1 spot in the West, with LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, Texas A&M and Arkansas rounding out the pack.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks won their first overtime game in school history when they defeated Missouri, 27-24, in two overtimes on October 26, 2013 in Columbia, Mo. The Gamecocks are 1-2 all-time in overtime games, with both overtime losses coming at Tennessee, a 23-20 setback on September 27, 2003, and a 27-24 loss in Knoxville on October 27, 2007.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: Nine Gamecocks will have earned their degree by the time the 2014 season commences, including A.J. Cann, Ryland Culbertson, Patrick Fish, Cody Gibson, Sharrod Golightly, Nick Jones, Connor McLaurin, Sidney Rhodes and Dylan Thompson.

WHO'S NEXT?: The Gamecocks have had a first-team All-America selection in each of the last five seasons. Eric Norwood (2009) got things started, followed by Alshon Jeffery (2010), Melvin Ingram (2011), Jadeveon Clowney (2012 and 2013) and Kelcy Quarles (2013).

NON-CONFERENCE WINS: South Carolina has won 16-straight games against non-conference opponents. Its last non-conference loss came to Florida State in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl. Since that loss they have defeated East Carolina (three times), Navy, The Citadel, Clemson (three times), Nebraska, UAB, Wofford, Michigan, North Carolina, UCF, Coastal Carolina and Wisconsin.

REGULAR SEASON NON-CON WINS: The Gamecocks have posted 21-consecutive regular season victories against non-conference opponents, dating back to the start of the 2009 season. Over the past five seasons, Carolina has logged regular season non-conference wins over Clemson (5 times), East Carolina (3 times), North Carolina State, Florida Atlantic, South Carolina State, Southern Miss, Furman, Troy, Navy, The Citadel, UAB, Wofford, North Carolina, Central Florida and Coastal Carolina.

BEST CAROLINA WINS: The Gamecocks win over No. 6 Georgia matched the sixth-best win in school history by the A.P. rankings. Here are Carolina's top wins by rankings. Five of the top seven have come since 2009:

UP NEXT: Carolina will return home next week to host the Missouri Tigers in the annual Parent's Weekend game. The teams have evenly split the four games played previously. Missouri won a pair of bowl games, the 1979 Hall of Fame Bowl and the 2005 Independence Bowl. The Gamecocks have won each of the two meetings as SEC Eastern Division rivals, 31-10 in South Carolina in 2012 and a memorable 27-24 double-overtime win in Missouri last season.

LOOKING FURTHER AHEAD: The Gamecocks 2015 non-conference schedule is set. South Carolina and North Carolina will open the college football season on Thursday, September 3, when the two bordering state flagship schools hook up at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte. The other three non-conference games will all be at home, with UCF (September 26), The Citadel (November 21) and Clemson (November 28) providing the opposition. In the SEC rotation, the Gamecocks will host LSU, while they will travel to College Station, Texas for the first time to face their permanent rival, Texas A&M. Dates for the conference games have not yet been announced.

THIS, THAT AND THE OTHER:

- ♦ Head coach Steve Spurrier has had as many 11-win seasons in nine years at South Carolina (3) as he had in his 12 years at Florida.
- ♦ In the past five seasons, Carolina has a combined 14-3 record against its top-four rivals. They are 4-0 against Clemson, 4-1 against Georgia, and 3-1 against both Florida and Tennessee.
- ◆ Steve Spurrier is one of only four coaches to record 100 or more wins as an SEC coach against SEC competition (he also has three wins against SEC teams while coaching at Duke). Only Bear Bryant (159) has won more SEC conference games than Coach Spurrier's 129. Spurrier passed John Vaught (106) and Vince Dooley (105) during the 2010 campaign.
- ◆ The Gamecocks have won five-straight "state championships" against their in-state rival, Clemson. It's the longest Carolina winning streak in the history of the series that dates back to 1896.
- ◆ Former Gamecock great quarterback **Tommy Suggs** (1968-70) is in his 41st year describing Gamecock football from the radio booth. Here are the longest tenured announcers in college football:



COLUMBIA, S.C.— Behind senior quarterback Connor Shaw's 368 yards of total offense, South Carolina (2-1, 1-1 SEC) held on to defeat Vanderbilt 35-25 on Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Shaw threw for 284 yards and three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing while also leading the Gamecocks in rushing with 84 yards on 19 carries. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington made a career-best eight catches for 111 yards and a score, while sophomore running back Mike Davis added 144 all-purpose yards (77 rushing, 67 receiving) in the victory. Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds caught his first career TD pass, while junior Nick Jones also had a TD catch.



South Carolina scored on its first four possessions of the game. The first, set up by Ellington's 12-yard punt return to the Vandy 42, needed just six plays, with all the yards (27 passing, 15 rushing) coming from Shaw. Shaw hit Jones with a bullet toward the back of the end zone for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The second Gamecock drive went much longer, as it took 11 plays to cover 93 yards. Davis capped the drive with a four-yard run. The biggest play came on Davis' 38-yard catch-and-run from Shaw that put South Carolina on the Vandy 24.

Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson piloted the third drive, an eight-play, 76-yard one that ended with his three-yard draw for the score. He went 5-for-5 for 67 yards, with all five passes going for first downs. The second quarter saw the Gamecocks keep rolling, scoring an eight-yard, 92-yard drive. Shaw hit Ellington in traffic from 26 yards out for the score, the third catch of the drive for the junior. He also had a three-yard grab and a 39-yard catch as well in the sequence.

Vanderbilt (1-2, 0-2 SEC) scored late in the first half on Jerron Seymour's one-yard run. Steven Clarke's 69-yard interception of Thompson's pass set up the one-play, one-yard score. It was the first interception given up by the Gamecocks in 72 pass attempts in 2013. The Commodores added a 54-yard field goal from Carey Spear as the half ended. South Carolina outgained Vanderbilt 381-95 in the first half and ran 52 plays to Vandy's 24.

The Gamecocks put up another touchdown on their first possession of the second half when Wilds caught a 33-yard TD pass from Shaw, finishing the 10-play, 75-yard drive in 4:38. On the ensuing Vandy possession, the Commodores drove deep into Gamecock territory before junior defensive end Jadeveon Clowney sacked VU's Austyn Carta-Samuels and forced a fumble, which senior defensive tackle Kelsey Quarles recovered, ending that Vandy threat.

But the Commodores kept coming, scoring early in the fourth quarter on Carta-Samuels' one-yard run, which ended a 10-play, 45-yard drive. The ensuing kickoff was fumbled by the Gamecocks, setting up Wesley Tate's 19-yard reception from Carta-Samuels for the score. The two-point pass to tight end Steven Schue was good, making it 35-25 in favor of South Carolina. After a stalled Vanderbilt drive, the punt hit a Gamecock defender, and VU's Darrius Sims recovered, giving the Commodores another life. But senior cornerback Jimmy Legree picked off the Carta-Samuel pass on the goal line, the first interception by a Gamecock in 2013.

The Gamecocks, taking over at the one-yard line, ran the clock down to a minute before turning the ball over on downs at the Vanderbilt 36. The Commodores' final possession was unfruitful, giving the Gamecocks the win.

NASHVILLE, TENN.—Junior running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 110 yards and two touchdowns to lead ninth-ranked South Carolina to a 17-13 victory over Vanderbilt on Thursday night in the season opener for both teams at Vanderbilt Stadium.

With the Gamecocks trailing 13-10 early in the fourth quarter, Lattimore scored the game-winning touchdown on a 1-yard run with 11:25 remaining. The Gamecock defense then buckled down and allowed just 17 yards the rest of the way to seal the win.

South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC) has now won 13 straight season openers and nine straight games against SEC Eastern Division opponents, while Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier

improves to 22-1 all-time in season openers. The Commodores (0-1, 0-1) have dropped four straight games to South Carolina.

In his first game back after suffering a knee injury at Mississippi State last season, Lattimore averaged 4.8 yards on 23 carries and led the Gamecocks with three receptions for 21 yards.

Despite missing several series with a shoulder injury, junior quarterback Connor Shaw helped guide the Gamecocks back into the game, connecting on 7-of-11 passes for 67 yards and rushing 14 times for 92 yards.

The Gamecock defense came up big early after two turnovers by the offense. With Vanderbilt facing a third and goal at the Carolina 5, linebacker Shaq Wilson stepped in front of a Jordan Rogers pass and returned the interception 37 yards to the Commodore 49.

Wilson's interception provided a spark for the offense, as Shaw ran for a 20-yard gain on Carolina's first play after the turnover. Lattimore then took care of the rest as he busted loose for a 29-yard touchdown run, breaking a tackle on his way to the end zone. The touchdown moved Lattimore into sole possession of third place in career rushing touchdown at Carolina with 28. Adam Yates tacked on the extra point to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead at the 4:55 mark of the first quarter.

Yates drilled his first career field goal attempt from 20 yards out with 11:44 left in the half to push South Carolina's lead to 10-0.

Vanderbilt fought back to tie the game before halftime, as Rogers connected with Jordan Matthews for a 78-yard scoring strike to make it a 10-7 ballgame with 10:37 remaining.

After holding the Gamecocks to a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, the Commodores drove deep into Carolina territory before Carey Spear made a 25-yard field goal to knot the game at 10-10.

Shaw left the game late in the second quarter with a shoulder injury after rushing for a 2-yard gain on first down, as the teams ran out the clock and headed into the locker room tied at 10.

Vanderbilt took its first lead of the contest in the third quarter on a 44-yard field goal by Spear that gave the Commodores a 13-10 advantage with 6:02 on the clock.

But Shaw re-entered the game to help lead the Gamecocks to victory. After the offense stalled in his first series back, he guided Carolina on a nine-play, 66-yard scoring drive in his second series, with Lattimore scoring from 1 yard out to give the Gamecocks the lead for good.

Wilson and sophomore defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles led the Carolina defense with eight tackles apiece, as the Gamecocks surrendered 276 yards. Carolina also had five sacks on the night

Rogers led the way for Vanderbilt, completing 13-of-23 passes for 214 yards and one touch-down.

Steve Spurrier, who has coached a national championship team, won seven SEC titles, garnered nine conference Coach of the Year awards, and won over 73 percent of the college games in which he has coached, is in his 10th season as head coach at the University of South Carolina. Spurrier was introduced as Carolina's 32nd head coach on Nov. 23, 2004.

Coach Spurrier has compiled a 221-80-2 (.733) won-loss record in 25 seasons as a major college head coach, including a 79-40 mark (.664) at Carolina. He became the 71st collegiate coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I to record 200 career victories when he defeated UAB on Sept. 15, 2012 and logged his 250th all-time coaching win against Georgia in 2012.

Coach Spurrier surpassed Rex Enright's school record for wins when he logged number 65 at Clemson in the 2012 season finale. In doing so, he joined the great Bear Bryant as the only coaches to boast the most coaching victories at two different SEC schools.

He led Duke to the 1989 Atlantic Coast Conference championship before returning to his alma mater, the University of Florida, as head coach in 1990. During his 12 seasons with the Gators, Spurrier's teams won seven Southeastern Conference championships, one national title and finished ranked in the nation's top 10 nine times. His record at Florida was an amazing 122-27-1 (.817). Spurrier, who won the 1966 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback for the Gators, was also head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins. He returned to the college ranks in 2005 after a one-year absence from the sidelines.

In his first season at South Carolina, Coach Spurrier led the Gamecocks to a 7-5 record and a second-place finish in the SEC Eastern Division. In doing so, he posted a five-game winning streak, the 15th-consecutive year in which he has had a five-game winning streak, something no other coach in college history has accomplished. He was honored as the SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press after leading the Gamecocks to a school-record five straight SEC wins, their first win ever at Tennessee and their first win over Florida since the 1930s.

He came back with an 8-5 record in 2006, just the ninth time in school history that the Gamecocks posted eight or more wins in a season. The season was capped with a Liberty Bowl win over C-USA champion Houston.

In his third season with the Garnet & Black, Spurrier's squad raced out to a 6-1 record and moved as high as No. 6 in the BCS rankings, before finishing the campaign with a 6-6 record. With 21 wins, he set the Carolina record for coaching victories after three seasons at the helm.

With a 7-6 record in 2008, Carolina returned to a New Year's Day bowl game for the first time since the 2001 season. The Gamecocks followed that up with another 7-6 record in 2009, their sixth-consecutive non-losing season, the longest stretch in school history since 1928-34. The 2009 season included a win over No. 4 Ole Miss, only the second time in school history that Carolina had defeated a top-five team.

His 2010 Gamecock squad posted several milestones en route to a 9-5 season, the biggest of which was the school's first SEC Eastern Division title and first appearance in the SEC Championship. The Gamecocks also defeated the nation's No. 1 team, Alabama, for the first time in school history, and finished the season ranked 22nd in both major national polls. He was named SEC Coach of the Year for the seventh time, his ninth overall Coach of the Year honor.

The Gamecocks continued to make history in 2011, winning a school-record 11 games and finishing in the the top-10 in the final A.P. poll for the first time. The squad also won a school-record six SEC games and defeated each of their Eastern Division rivals in the same season for the first time. Carolina capped the regular season with a win over Clemson, its third-straight over its Palmetto State rival, the first time that has been accomplished since 1968-70, then defeated Nebraska in the Capital One Bowl by a convincing 30-13 margin.

The 2012 season was another success, as the Gamecocks rolled up 11 wins for the second-straight season and logged double-digits in wins for just the third time in school history, capped off by a 33-28 win over Michigan in the Outback Bowl. They defeated four teams that finished among the nation's top 25 in Georgia, Clemson, Vanderbilt and Michigan. The Gamecocks defeated in-state rival Clemson for a fourth-straight year, the first time that had been accomplished since the 1950s. It's No. 8/7 final ranking was the best in school history at that time.

The success continued in 2013. Carolina posted its third-straight 11-2 campaign, finishing fourth in both major polls, the highest national finish in school history. The team defeated five teams that finished in the Top-25, including three in the Top-10. It also defeated six teams that won their bowl games, including two BCS winners. The Gamecocks won their final six games of the season, including a school-record fifth-straight win over Clemson, and a Capital One Bowl win over Wisconsin, the third-straight New Year's Day bowl win.

COLUMBIA, S.C.— No. 9 South Carolina saw its 18-game home winning streak end tonight to No. 21 Texas A&M, 52-28 at Williams-Brice Stadium in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. Aggie sophomore quarterback Kenny Hill passed for a school record 511 yards and three touchdowns. Senior quarterback Dylan Thompson threw for 366 yards and four touchdowns and senior wide receiver Nick Jones had a career-high 113 yards receiving and two touchdowns.

On a third-and five on the opening drive, Hill stepped up in the pocket to create time and found an open Ricky Seals-Jones over the middle where he weaved his way down to the 1-yard line for a 21-yard gain. Tra Carson punched it in to give Texas A&M



an early 7-0 lead just over three minutes into the game. Senior kicker Josh Lambo made it 10-0 with 5:02 left in the first quarter after converting a 33-yard field goal.

South Carolina responded quickly though on the next drive, despite staring down a three-and-out. On his own 31-yard line, Thompson took a shot down the field and found Jones streaking down the field, getting behind the defense to make a grab at the Aggie 30-yard line before heading into the end zone for a 69-yard touchdown. The drive, which took just over a minute, brought the Gamecocks within three at 10-7 with just over three minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

After getting the ball back, South Carolina was unable to sustain the momentum and was forced to punt. During the next 2:22 minutes, Hill methodically moved the ball down the field before connecting with Seals-Jones over the middle for a three-yard score to give the Aggies a 17-7 lead.

Needing a quick response, the Gamecocks found it in senior wide receiver Damiere Byrd. Moving the ball to the Aggie 46-yard line on five plays, Thompson then connected with Byrd after the wideout slipped past his defender and found a 10-yard cushion for an easy 46-yard score to bring the Gamecocks within three at 17-14.

With just over seven minutes remaining in the half, Hill and the Aggies marched down the field with an eight-play, 75-yard drive that resulted in Hill finding Edward Pope in the back of the end zone to make it 24-14.

After Carolina was forced to punt the ball back to Texas A&M with 3:35 left in the half, the Aggies strung together an 11-play, 80-yard drive on the ensuing possession that ended a on Carson's second touchdown as Hill optioned left to the tailback on third-and-goal from 2-yard line. The score gave the Aggies a 31-14 lead heading into

Early in the third quarter, Hill found Josh Reynolds in the corner of the end zone to make it 38-14. Thompson then engineered an eight-play drive, amassing 81 yards that was capped off by a five-yard touchdown pass to Cooper over the middle to make it 38-21. On the ensuing kickoff, South Carolina went for the onside kick, but it was recovered by the Aggies at the 42-yard line. Eight plays later, Carson scored his third touchdown of the game from two yards out as the Aggies extended the lead to 45-21.

A pair of 27-yard passes to Jerrell Adams and Cooper marched the Gamecocks back into the red zone on the following drive. Thompson was able to find Jones drifting out to the right side of the end zone where the wide receiver hauled in his second touchdown of the game to bring Carolina back within 17 points at 45-28. It was his second multi-touchdown game of his career.

After holding the Aggies to their second punt of the quarter, Carolina had a chance to cut into the deficit late in the third quarter, but a deep ball from Thompson was intercepted by Watts at the Texas A&M 17-yard line. Ten plays and 83 yards later, Trey Williams made it 52-28 with a two-yard touchdown run with 12:09 remaining the game.



COLUMBIA, S.C.— No. 21 South Carolina defeated East Carolina, 33-23, tonight at Williams-Brice Stadium, giving Head Coach Steve Spurrier his 200th win as a coach in the Southeastern Conference. Junior running back Mike Davis led the way with his eighth-career 100-yard rushing game, as he totaled 101 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

After forcing the Gamecocks to punt on the opening possession of the game, a 53yard punt from Tyler Hull was down at the Pirates' 3-yard line. East Carolina strung together an 11-play drive to move into the red zone, but from there, the drive stalled. The Gamecock defense clamped down and forced the Pirates to convert on a 26-yard field goal by Warren Harvey.



On the following drive, redshirt senior quarterback Dylan Thompson was intercepted by Josh Hawkins, giving ECU the ball at the South Carolina 43-yard line. The Pirates were unable to muster much and Harvey connected on a 35-yard field goal to give the visitors a 6-0 lead with 6:35 on the clock.

Trailing 6-0, the Gamecocks mounted a 10-play drive with Thompson going fourof-five and Davis rushing four times for 48 yards. The tailback capped off the drive by bursting through an open whole on the right side of the line and taking it 36 yards into the end zone to give Carolina a 7-6 lead with 1:56 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Pirates responded though as quarterback Shane Carden went five-of-six for 67 yards on the next drive. Chris Hairston finished the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run to give ECU a 13-7 lead early in the second quarter. Eleven plays later, South Carolina cut the deficit to three with a 39-yard field from sophomore Elliott Fry with 9:55 left in the half.

A three-and-out for the Pirates gave the Gamecock offense a spark and Thompson went four-of-four on the drive connecting on a 31-yard pass down the middle to junior wide receiver Shaq Roland and a 19-yard completion to Davis that got the Gamecocks down to the 3-yard line. The tailback then pounded his way into the end zone on the next play for his second touchdown of the half to give South Carolina a 17-13 lead with under five minutes remaining in the half.

ECU's Breon Allen countered on the next possession with a 42-yard run down to the Gamecock 19-yard line. South Carolina's defense then forced a pair of incomplete passes and a rush for no gain, before junior defensive tackle Gerald Dixon Jr. blocked a 42-yard field goal attempt, the Gamecocks' first blocked field goal since 2011. With just over a minute left before the end of the half, Fry connected on his second field goal, a 42-yarder to take a 20-13 lead.

Aided by a roughing the passer penalty and a 20-yard completion to Cam Worthy, the Pirates set up Harvey for a 40-yard field goal, his third conversion of the half with four seconds remaining, and the Gamecocks held a 20-16 lead at the break.

East Carolina opened the second half driving into Gamecock territory, but on a third-and-five, junior defensive end Cedrick Cooper put pressure on Carden, forcing the Pirate quarterback into a tough throw which spur Sharrod Golightly intercepted just before stepping across the sideline. It was the senior's first career interception.

Thompson completed six-straight passes on the ensuing drive before finding wide receiver K.J. Brent open in the left corner of the end zone for the junior's first-career touchdown reception to push the Gamecocks lead to 27-16 with 8:36 left in the third.

T.J. Gurley intercepted Carden on the Pirates next possession allowing the Gamecocks to use up 5:40 off the clock before Fry converted on a 26-yard field goal to put South Carolina up 30-16 heading into the final stanza. With the Gamecocks seizing control, Carden engineered an 11-play drive, capping it off with a 17-yard touchdown pass across the middle to Worthy to cut the Pirates deficit to 30-23 early in the fourth.

South Carolina put the game away with an 18-play, 86-yard drive, lasting 10:33, the second-longest drive during the Spurrier era, that culminated in a 20-yard field goal conversion by Fry, tying his career-high with four in a game.

Game 3 #24/23 South Carolina 38, #6/6 Georgia 35




September 13, 2014 Williams-Brice Stadium Columbia, S.C. 84,232



COLUMBIA, S.C.— After inclement weather caused an hour and 26-minute delay to the start of the game, lightning struck as No. 24 South Carolina took down No. 6 Georgia, 38-35. After Georgia kicker Marshall Morgan missed his second field goal of the night with 4:24 left, the Gamecocks were able to run out the clock as Dylan Thompson narrowly converted on a fourthand-inches at midfield to secure the win.

The Gamecocks took the first possession of the game 75 yards to paydirt, climaxed by a Thompson to Shaq Roland 10-yard score. It only took Georgia two plays to respond though as quarterback Hutson Mason connected with Isaiah McKenzie for a 36-yard pass down the right side. On the ensuing play, Mason dumped off a short



pass to Sony Michel for a 33-yard touchdown to tie the game at 7.

A Carolina fumble led to a 36-yard field goal from Morgan to give the Bulldogs a

The Gamecocks drove the field agaain on their next possession. Thompson found Pharoh Cooper on the left side where the receiver put a quick left-to-right move on his defender before racing into the end zone for an eight-yard score to put the Gamecocks up 14-10.

Morgan was able to pull the Bulldogs within one at 14-13 with a 26-yard field goal, but Thompson continued to find open receivers as he marched the Gamecocks down the field, finding Damiere Byrd for a 24-yard completion and Jones for a 20-yard pass, before connecting in the back of the end zone with Anderson for an 18-yard touchdown to give Carolina a 21-13 lead with 5:34 remaining in the first half.

With just over two minutes left, Cooper and Byrd rushed for back-to-back first downs as the Gamecocks tried to put together a scoring drive before the end the of the half. Jones came up with a big 25-yard reception along the sideline before taking a big hit to put Carolina at the 22-yard line. An eight-yard run from Davis set up Elliott Fry for a 32-yard field goal to give the Gamecocks a 24-13 lead heading into the half.

Georgia struck on its opening drive in the third quarter as Gurley got loose for a 40-yard run to get to the South Carolina 25-yard line. The Georgia tailback eventually punched in a two-yard touchdown run, bringing the Bulldogs' deficit to 24-20. South Carolina continued to have its way with Georgia's defense on the following drive as Thompson went two-for-two and Davis and Wilds combined for 43 yards on the ground. Thompson capped off the drive with a one-yard touchdown rush to push the lead back to 11.

With 2:13 remaining in the third quarter, a personal foul on a Carolina punt put Georgia in good field position. Six plays later, Mason found Jay Rome in the end zone. The two-point conversion cut the deficit to three.

On the ensuing kickoff, junior tailback Shon Carson found space on the left side and picked up a career-long return of 42 yards to put Carolina on the Georgia 42-yard line. Davis picked up 19 on the first two plays of the drive before Wilds finished off the drive by breaking runs of 15 and 24 yards to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 10 at 38-28 with 13:01 to play. Nearly six minutes later, Georgia responded with a one-yard touchdown run from Quayvon Hicks on an 11-play drive.

Four plays into the Gamecocks' following drive, Thompson was intercepted across the middle by Georgia's Damian Swann. With the ball on the Carolina three-yard line, Mason was called for intentional grounding as sophomore defensive end Gerald Dixon came at him unblocked. The Gamecock defense held Georgia to a 28-yard field goal attempt, but the Georgia kicker missed his second attempt of the night.

South Carolina was able to run out the final 4:24 of the game to hold on for the three-point win in front of the fifth-largest crowd in stadium history at 84,232.
