News & Notes

- St. John's is making its first appearance in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational. The Red Storm defeated UMBC, 75-53, on Nov. 16 in the homeland game of the 32nd annual early season tournament.
- The Red Storm looks for its first win over an AP Top 25 opponent since Feb. 9, 2014 when St. John's meets No. 17/17 Vanderbilt on Monday in the first game of the Maui Invitational Championship Round.
- St. John's is two wins shy of becoming only the eighth program in NCAA Division I history to reach the 1,800-win plateau. The last program to achieve the milestone was UCLA. St. John's is one of four teams participating in the Maui Invitational that ranks in the top-10 all-time for Division I victories and winning percentage.
- The Red Storm can improve to 4-0 for only the fifth time in the past 25 seasons. The last time a first year coach started his tenure at St. John's with four straight wins since Frank Mulzoff who opened with a 6-0 mark in 1970-71.
- St. John's has not allowed more than 59 points in a game this season and is holding opponents 56.3 points per game.
- With 11 newcomers, St. John's roster underwent a complete transformation from last year's NCAA Tournament team. The Red Storm returned only three players from the 2014-15 roster, losing 96 percent of its scoring, 92 percent of its rebounds and 98 percent of its assists.

Record

St. John's leads 5-1
(2-0 home, 2-1 away, 1-0 neutral)

Overview

St. John's will meet Vanderbilt for the seventh time in program history. The series began in 1951 with a 69-54 St. John's victory at Madison Square Garden under Hall of Fame Coach Frank McGuire. St. John's has won the last two games in the series, but the programs have not met since 1977.

Coaches

Chris Mullin is in his first year as head coach at St. John's. He was named the 20th coach in program history on April 1, 2015. Mullin returned to his alma mater with nearly a decade of NBA front office experience with the Golden State Warriors and Sacramento Kings. Mullin is the only current Division I coach to be inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player. Kevin Stallings is in his 17th season at Vanderbilt. He owns a 439-269 career record, including a 316-206 mark leading the Commodores. Stallings has taken Vanderbilt to six NCAA Tournaments and advanced to the Sweet 16 twice.

St. John's mounted a spirited comeback to defeat Rutgers, 61-59, on Thursday at Carnesecca Arena as part of the inaugural Gavitt Tipoff Games. The Red Storm erased a 16-point deficit and closed the game with a 32-14 run to improve to 3-0.

Felix Balamou had a career night in 30 minutes off the bench. The senior guard recorded eight points, 11 rebounds and seven assists. Graduate student Ron Mvouika posted his second career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. With 1:18 remaining, Mvouika corralled an offensive rebound and drew a foul that sent him to the line for the go-ahead free-throws (59-58).

Freshman guard Federico Mussini led St. John's in scoring for the third time in as many games and matched classmate Yankuba Sima with 13 points. Sima, a 6-foot-11 center from Spain, finished with six blocks to go with nine rebounds and had three assists.

Five Things To Know

- ① St. John's, which is making its first-ever Maui Jim Maui Invitational appearance, has made three previous regular season tournament appearances in The Aloha State. All three prior tournament trips have been as participants in The Rainbow Classic, hosted in Honolulu by the University of Hawaii. St. John's owns a 4-5 all-time record in The Rainbow Classic, including appearances in 2007 (1-2), 1976 (2-1) and 1969 (1-2). The Red Storm defeated host-Hawaii en route to a sixth place finish at the 44th annual classic in 2007. All-Tournament selection Glen Williams helped St. John's place fifth in 1976, while All-Tournament choice Joe DePre led the squad to a fourth place finish in 1969.
- ② The Red Storm looks to take home its first regular season tournament crown since 2010-11. St. John's won both the Great Alaska Shootout in November, defeating Arizona State (67-58) in the final, and then the Madison Square Garden Holiday Festival in December, knocking off Northwestern (85-69) for the second title in 2010. In addition to winning 15 Holiday Festival titles and 20 Joe Lapchick Memorial Tournament championships, St. John's has also won the Vanderbilt Invitational (1970), Lobo Invitational (1971), Connecticut Classic (1973), Ocean State Classic (1974) and Cougar Classic (1975 & 1991).
- ③ St. John's, which leads the BIG EAST in scoring defense (56 ppg), has allowed fewer than 60 points in each of its first three games for the first time since the 1984-85 Final Four season. With then-senior Chris Mullin leading the charge as a player, St. John's held Lafayette (47), St. Bonaventure (57) and Fordham (46) below the 60-point mark. One season earlier in 1983-84, St. John's held its opponent to fewer than 60 points in each of the first five games.
- ④ St. John's is one of four teams participating in the 2015 Maui Jim Maui Invitational to appear in the 2015 NCAA Tournament along with Kansas, UCLA and Indiana. It was the Red Storm's 28th appearance all-time in the "Big Dance". With no starters returning and losing 96 percent of the scoring offense, St. John's brings a new-look 2015-16 roster to Maui. The three letterwinners who are back averaged a combined 3.2 points, 1.4 rebounds and 0.1 assists last season after seeing minimal court action. Chris Mullin and his staff went out and signed nine new players --- four transfers (Durand Johnson, Ron Mvouika, Tariq Owens, Darien Williams) and five freshmen (Malik Ellison, Marcus LoVett, Federico Mussini, Kassoum Yakwe, Yankuba Sima) --- a mix of experience, international talent and promising youth that is will be the foundation for the future the program.
- ⑤ Head coach Chris Mullin has assembled one of the elite staffs in the country, featuring a blend of NBA and collegiate experience and individuals who have reached the pinnacle of the game. St. John's is the only staff in the nation with two Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famers in Mullin and his former Golden State Warriors teammate Mitch Richmond. Associate Head Coach Barry Rohrsen brings over 20 years of coaching experience and is coming off a historic run in 2014-15 at the University of Kentucky helping the Wildcats to a 38-1 record and Final Four appearance. Assistant coach Matt Abdelmassih returns to his alma mater after helping Iowa State to the winningest four-year period in program history and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Greg St. Jean (25), the youngest assistant coach in the six high-major conferences, has an NBA pedigree and spent the last two years working with the Sacramento Kings.

Scouting Maui Jim Maui Invitational

- St. John's first opponent No. 17/17 Vanderbilt has been ranked in the Top 25 each of the first three weeks of the 2015-16 season. Damian Jones, a junior center from Baton Rouge, La., has been named to the Preseason Watch List for the Wooden Award.

- The Red Storm will meet either No. 14/15 Indiana or Wake Forest in its second game in Maui. Indiana is one of three teams in the Championship Round that is nationally-ranked. The No. 14 Hoosiers enter the tournament 3-0 after defeating Creighton, 86-65, on Nov. 19 at Assembly Hall. James Blackmon Jr. enters the Maui Invitational leading Indiana averaging 18.7 points per game.

- Wake Forest has four starters returning from last year's squad that went 13-19 with a 5-13 mark in the ACC. Head Coach Danny Manning leads the Demon Deacons to Maui with a 2-1 record. Senior forward Devin Thomas recorded double-doubles in each of three games this season and has averaged 17.0 points and 13.0 rebounds per game.

- UNLV is one of four undefeated teams entering the Maui Invitational Championship Round. The Runnin' Rebels are 3-0 and led by sophomore Patrick McCaw's team-high 16.7 points per game. The 6-foot-7 guard has shot 60.0 percent from the floor and has a 57.1 percent 3-point shooting mark.

- Led by Head Coach Steve Alford, UCLA picked up its first two wins of the season defeating Cal Poly and Pepperdine prior to Maui. Alford, a former teammate of Chris Mullin and Mitch Richmond with the Golden State Warriors, has guided the Bruins to consecutive Sweet 16 appearances. His son, Bryce Alford, is UCLA's leading scorer with 19.7 points per game to go with a 6.0 assist average.
- Upperclassmen Perry Ellis and Wayne Selden Jr. highlight a deep Kansas roster that has eight players averaging 5.0 or more points per game. The Jayhawks bring a 91.0 scoring average to Maui. Ellis leads the team with 18.5 points per game and Selden has a 13.5 scoring average. Kansas is 1-1 after a season opening victory over Northern Colorado and a six-point setback to Michigan State in the Champions Classic.

- Tournament host Chaminade played two games prior to the 32nd annual Maui Invitational. The Silverswords dropped both contests falling to Alaska Anchorage and Alaska. Senior guard Oscar Pedrosa is Chaminade's leading scorer with 20.0 points per game. The Silverswords have allowed 102.0 points per game.

Thirty years after leading St. John's to the highest point in program history with an appearance in the 1985 Final Four, Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Chris Mullin enters his first season as head men's basketball coach at his alma mater. A longtime NBA star and front office executive, Mullin is the 20th head coach in the University's storied 107-year men's basketball history.

With nearly a decade of NBA front office experience, Mullin spent the last two seasons working for the Sacramento Kings organization as a senior advisor, providing guidance to the owner and general manager regarding player transactions and supervising the organization's college and overseas scouting program. Mullin previously served five years as the Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations for the Golden State Warriors.

One of the great collegiate and NBA players of all time, Mullin was inducted into both the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame in 2011.

A two-time gold medalist who ranks seventh all-time on the USA Basketball Olympic scoring list, Mullin was first enshrined in Springfield in 2010 as a member of the 1992 United States Olympic team, also known as the original "Dream Team." He was the ninth individual affiliated with St. John's basketball program to be inducted into the national hall.

The most-decorated player in program history, Mullin is St. John's all-time scoring leader with 2,440 career points, starring at the University from 1981-85 under Hall of Fame Head Coach Lou Carnesecca. Mullin gave New York a four-year period to rival any other, leading St. John's to four-straight NCAA Tournaments. He was a two-time All American who also garnered consensus First Team All-America honors as a senior.

Mullin is the only player in conference history to be named BIG EAST Player of the Year three times (1983-85). He is also just one of three players to win the Haggerty Award three times, an honor bestowed upon the best collegiate player in New York City. A member of the 1984 United States Olympic team, Mullin took home his first gold at the 1984 Games in Los Angeles.

In his final season at St. John's, Mullin averaged 19.8 points to lead the program to its second Final Four and

its first No. 1 ranking since 1951. Mullin received the John R. Wooden Award at the conclusion of the 1984-85 campaign as the nation's top player. He was also named the Player of the Year by both United Press International and the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Mullin not only was the first St. John's player to reach 2,000 points, but he set career records for steals, field goals, and was top five in assists. He still holds St. John's career free-throw percentage and free-throws made records (84.7 pct, 682-of-805), and ranks in the top 10 in program history for 17 different statistical categories.

St. John's conferred Legacy Honors upon Mullin in 2005, permanently enshrining his No. 20 above Carnesecca Arena and at Madison Square Garden during St. John's home games. Mullin was inducted into the St. John's Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2015.

Selected by the Golden State Warriors with the seventh-overall pick in the 1985 NBA Draft, Mullin spent 13 years of his 16-season NBA career with the organization. He became the sixth player in franchise history to have his jersey number retired with his No. 17 hoisted to the rafters of Golden State's Oracle Arena on March 19, 2012.

Mullin scored 17,911 points over his career playing for the Golden State Warriors (1985-97, 2000-01) and Indiana Pacers (1997-2000). Mullin guided Golden State to five playoff appearances, and is joined by fellow Hall of Famer Wilt Chamberlain as the only two Warriors to average 25.0 points per game in five-straight seasons (1988-93).

Mullin was a five-time NBA All-Star for the Warriors (1989-93) and garnered All-NBA honors four times, including a selection to the All-NBA First Team in 1992. He averaged 18.2 points per game throughout his career while shooting 50.9 percent from the field and 86.5 percent from the free-throw line. Mullin still holds several Warriors franchise records including games played (807) and steals (1,360), and is fourth on the team's career scoring list.

Following his NBA playing career, Mullin worked in the Warriors' front office from 2002-09 and was named Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations on April 22, 2004. In this role, Mullin oversaw day-to-day operations, including college and international scouting, salary cap management and preparations for the NBA Draft. Mullin served as an NBA analyst for ESPN and ESPN radio for three years before joining the Sacramento Kings' front office on September 5, 2013 as Advisor to the Chairman.

One of New York City's greatest players, Mullin is among the most recognizable figures in the history of Big Apple basketball. The lefty from Brooklyn began his high school career at Power Memorial before starring at Xavierian for his final two years. Mullin led Xavierian on a run to a New York State Championship in 1981 and was named New York State's "Mr. Basketball" and a McDonald's All American that same year.

Born and raised in the Flatlands section of Brooklyn, Mullin and his wife, Liz, who is an alumna of St. John's, have four children, Sean, Christopher, Liam and Kiera.
