VANDERBILT VS. FCS FOES

Vanderbilt is 15-1 all-time against FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) opponents since the NCAA created the I-AA classification in 1978 and redefined it in the early 2000s.

In its most recent game against an FCS foe, the Commodores defeated Elon 45-23 last season.

In the last decade, the Commodores have defeated all nine FCS opponents on its schedule. Besides the Elon game, other victories have come over Western Carolina (45-0, 2009), Richmond (41-17, 2007), Tennessee State (38-9, 2006), Richmond (37-13, 2005), Eastern Kentucky (19-7, 2004), Chattanooga (51-6, 2003), Furman (49-18, 2002) and Richmond (28-22, 2001).

MATTHEWS: OFF TO STRONG START

Jordan Matthews (Jr., WR) has opened the 2012 campaign just as he finished a year ago – as one of the SEC's most productive receivers.

One week after catching eight passes for 147 yards and a touchdown against South Carolina, Matthews produced six more receptions at Northwestern, including a

22-yard scoring catch from **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Sr., QB).

Matthews tops the SEC with 222 receiving yards. He is also tied for second with 14 catches and two touchdowns.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in four of his last eight games. During that span, which includes the team's Liberty Bowl, Matthews is averaging 110.5 receiving yards. All of Matthews' 100+ receiving yard games have come against SEC competition.

Matthews' 147-yard total ranks as the program's third highest total in a season opener, trailing Earl Bennett's 223-yard total vs. Richmond in 2007 and M.J. Garrett's 219-yard effort vs. MTSU in 2001. That performance included a 78-yard touchdown catch, the longest by the Commodores since QB Mackenzi Adams and WR Sean Walker teamed for a 79-yard TD vs. Duke in 2010.

LARGE CROWD AT VANDERBILT OPENER

One of the largest crowds in years to watch a Vanderbilt home opener cheered for the Commodores against South Carolina last Thursday.

The announced audience of 38,393 was the largest to view a season opener in Vanderbilt Stadium since 39,885 fans entered the turnstiles for the Middle Tennessee-Vanderbilt game on Aug. 30, 2001.

The VU-SC crowd also stands as the most partisan Vanderbilt crowd in recent memory.

The audience watching Vanderbilt and South Carolina was the program's second highest attended home opener since an 1,800-capacity bleacher section was removed from its north end zone in 2000.

It also marked the largest on-campus crowd since Oct. 3, 2009 when 39,625 spectators attended the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game.

VANDERBILT IN NON-SEC PLAY

Vanderbilt plays Presbyterian Saturday looking to notch its first victory of the season against a non-Southeastern Conference member.

The Commodores fell to Northwestern 23-13 on Sept. 8 in its first non-conference game of the year.

Last year, the Commodores went 4-0 in regular season non-SEC play during James Franklin's first year at Vanderbilt. It marked the first time since 1994 for Vanderbilt to register an unblemished out-of-conference regular season.

In the last decade, the Commodores are 21-19 in games against out-of-league teams.

STACY MOVING UP CAREER RUSH LIST

Zac Stacy (Sr., RB) needs 11 yards to move into sole position of sixth place on the Vanderbilt rushing charts.

Stacy rushed for 38 yards on 13 carries against the Northwestern defense, pushing his career rushing total to 2,086 yards.

In the season opener, Stacy passed former standout Rodney

Williams (2,021 yards, 1998-2001) into seventh place with 58 rushing yards.

The program's rushing record appears well within Stacy's reach, especially if he continues on the pace from 2011 when he established a new team single-season rushing mark (1,193 yards). The team career mark is held by Frank Mordica, who rushed for 2,632 yards on 546 attempts from 1976-79.

Stacy also is tied for fourth all-time among Commodores with 20 rushing touchdowns. He needs three touchdowns to

surpass Charley Horton (1952-55) on the list.

Stacy's 5.2-yard career rushing average is well ahead of any of Vanderbilt's Top Ten all-time rushers. He also has 86 less career carries than any of the team's top six career rushers.

COMMODORES NAME EIGHT TEAM CAPTAINS

Eight veterans, including three offensive standouts and four defensive stalwarts, will serve as team captains for the upcoming season. The group represents both the junior and senior classes.

ARCHIBALD BARNES **R-Sr. • LB**

Ranks fourth on team with 13 tackles . Played in all 13 games in 2011, setting career highs in solo tackles (37), total tackles (59), TFLs (4.5), sacks (two) and INTs (two).

JORDAN RODGERS **R-Sr. • QB**

Passed for 431 yards and two touchdowns this year. Played in all 13 games, starting seven, while going 108-216 passing for 1,524 yards and nine TDs and rushing for 420 yards on 117 carries.

ZAC STACY **Sr. • RB**

Has 84 rushing yards on 26 carries. Team's leading rusher and offensive MVP, going for 1,193 yards and 14 TDs on 201 carries in 2011, earning All-SEC honors.

JOHNELL THOMAS **R-Sr. • DE**

Has contributed seven total tackles in first two games. Played in all 13 games in 2011 while starting five, making 26 total tackles and five sacks.

WALKER MAY **R-Jr. • DE**

Has seven tackles, including two for losses, and a QB sack this season. Started eight games in 2011, including the last seven games, making 30 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

JAVON MARSHALL **R-Jr. • Safety**

Ranks third among Commodores with 15 total tackles. Also shared team lead with 12 solo stops. Shared starting safety role in 2011, playing in all 13 games despite injury and making 42 total tackles and grabbing two picks.

WESLEY JOHNSON **R-Jr. • OT**

Teams offensive lineman of the year in 2011, starting at center, guard and tackle while playing nearly every snap.

CAREY SPEAR **Jr. • PK**

Spear has made 4-of-5 field goals, including a career-long 44-yarder. Place kicker made 4-of-7 FGs last year. He is the only returning captain among the eight players.

Rodgers and May were elected by teammates after spring practice. The other six co-captains were selected by teammates and players.

LOOKING FOR OFFENSIVE BALANCE

The Commodores are searching for the offensive balance that characterized the vastly improved 2011 unit.

Through two games, Vanderbilt is averaging 81 rushing yards, less than half of the Commodores' 2011 average. The unit also has not registered a rushing touchdown after averaging two per game last year.

All-Southeastern Conference running back Zac Stacy is averaging 42 rushing yards, and owns a 3.0-yard rush average after posting a 5.2-yard career average.

The 2011 Vanderbilt offense, which ended the year as the SEC's most improved with a 26.7-point scoring average, featured excellent balance. It averaged 339.1 yards of total offense: 164.5 rushing yards and 174.6 passing yards.

PRESBYTERIAN A.D. FORMER VANDY LEADER

Presbyterian Athletics Director Brian Reese was a long-time Vanderbilt football administrator before accepting the PC position.

Reese worked eight years with the Vanderbilt Athletics program. Reese served as Associate Director of Athletics at Vanderbilt working with head coaches Bobby Johnson and Robbie Caldwell. His responsibilities included direct oversight of the Vanderbilt football program.

NOTES FROM NORTHWESTERN GAME

★ **Richard Kent** (R-Sr., punter) established a new career long effort with his first punt went 67 yards. He averaged 45.0 yards on six punts.

★ **Chris Boyd** (R-So., WR) matched a career high with six receptions. Boyd's team-high 76 receiving yards was his second highest single-game total.

★ **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Sr., QB) had 17 completions, tying the second most of his career. Rodgers also ended with 217 passing yards, pushing him with 45 yards of 2,000 for his career.

★ **Carey Spear** (Jr., placekicker) was 2-of-2 in field goals, converting from 32 and 26 yards. He is 4-of-5 on the season, and ranks second among SEC kickers in total conversions.

★ **Zac Stacy** (Sr., RB) took a screen pass 55 yards in the fourth quarter. It marked the longest catch of his career.

★ **Karl Butler** (R-Jr., LB) posted a career high with 2.5 tackles for loss. He is tied for fourth in the SEC with 3.5 tackles for loss.

★ **Trey Wilson** (Sr., CB) contributed on his first career tackle for loss and broke up a pair of Wildcat pass attempts.

★ The Commodore defense registered six tackles for loss, but just one quarterback sack against the Wildcats. The sack was a career first by the **Caleb Azubike** (Fr., DE).

★ **Brian Kimbrow** (Fr., RB) was used as a kickoff returner for the first time, averaging 25.3 yards on three returns.





'DORE DEFENSE PLAYING NEAR 2011 LEVEL

Before the the 2012 season began, many college football observers expected the Vanderbilt defense to have a tough time duplicating its 2011 results due to the loss of three-time All-SEC linebacker Chris Marve and three other standouts currently on NFL rosters.

Through two early-season games, coordinator Bob Shoop's young unit has played up to its 2011 standard and should continue to develop.

The Commodores rank fifth in the SEC – and 29th nationally – in total defense, allowing an average of 298 yards to its two opponents. The current average is 24 fewer yards than last year when the Commodores ranked among the NCAA's most improved units in total defense.

The defense also is allowing an average of 20.0 points per game, 1.6 points than it did last year.

The unit has been stellar against opponent pass attacks. It ranks first in the conference in passing defense (100.0 ypg) and second in the league in pass defense efficiency. Both statistics also place the unit among the NCAA's Top Ten.

In the weeks ahead, Shoop's defense will look to create more turnovers and improve against the running game. The unit has produced just two turnovers (1 fumble/1 INT) against South Carolina and Northwestern. In 2011, the defense had seven turnovers (2 fumbles/5 INTs) in its first two games, both eventual Vanderbilt wins.

SCHEU JOINS FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Redshirt freshman **Steven Scheu** earned his first career start at Northwestern at tight end for the Commodore offense.

Scheu joins three other Commodores who have enjoyed their first career starts against South Carolina and Northwestern. Others include **Karl Butler** (R-Jr., safety), **Spencer Pulley** (So., center) and **Kris Kentera** (R-Fr., TE).

Butler has contributed 10 total tackles as an outside linebacker, and leads the defense with 3.5 tackles for loss. Butler also forced and recovered a fumble early in the game. Pulley has started both games at center while Kentera and Scheu have yet to collect catches from the tight end position.

FOURTEEN FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS

Fourteen underclassmen have experienced their their initial action in a Commodore uniform during the Northwestern and South Carolina games.

First-time defensive players include **Caleb Azubike** (Fr., DE), **Darien Bryant** (R-Fr., DE), **Larry Franklin** (R-Fr., LB), **Darreon Herring** (Fr., LB), **Derek King** (R-Fr., DB), **Jahmel McIntosh** (R-Fr., safety), **Jimmy Stewart** (R-Fr., DE), **Kellen Williams** (R-Fr., LB) and **Andrew Williamson** (R-Fr., safety).

First-time players on offense are **Jake Bernstein** (Fr., OL), **Josh Grady** (R-Fr., WR), **Kris Kentera** (R-Fr., TE) and **Brian Kimbrow** (Fr., RB) and **Steven Scheu** (R-Fr., TE).

Butler, Pulley, Kentera and Scheu have earned starting assignments.

COMMODORES FROM SOUTH CAROLINA

A pair of Commodore student-athletes, **Ryan Fowler** (R-Sr.) and **Patrick Sutton** (Jr.), hail from South Carolina where Presbyterian is located.

Fowler, a product of Eastside H.S. in Taylor, is a three-year letterwinning placekicker. He has 28-of-41 for his career in field goals, with a long of 47 yards. As a redshirt freshman, he made 16 of 21 field goals. He currently serves as the Commodores' backup placekicker and punter.

Sutton, a graduate of Bishop England School in Charleston, is a reserve linebacker for the Commodores.

VANDY GRADUATE ASSISTANT IS FORMER PRESBYTERIAN STANDOUT

Joey Orck, completing his third year as a Vanderbilt offensive graduate assistant coach, earned four letters as a center at Presbyterian College.

The Orck family has deep ties to Presbyterian. Joey's dad, John, serves as color analyst for the Blue Hose Radio Network. The elder Orck was an honorable mention All-America middle linebacker at Presbyterian during the mid-1970s.

As a senior captain, Joey Orck helped Presbyterian to the 2005 NCAA Division II playoffs.

Guides Commodores to 6-6 regular record and appearance in AutoZone Liberty Bowl in first year... Team shows vast improvement, ranking as the SEC's most improved offense and defense...Wins five home games, most by Vanderbilt in more than a decade...Four players earned postseason recognition, including defensive back Casey Hayward (All-America by Walter Camp Foundation) and team rushing record setter Zac Stacy... Builds enthusiasm among fan base and works non-stop growing support for program on campus and in the community... Excites fans after the season by inking strong signing class of prep recruits.

2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/QBs)

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 first-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets numerous school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-America player by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... In 2011, he starts on Green Bay's world champion squad.

2005 GREEN BAY PACKERS-NFL (assistant coach/wide receivers)

Assisting Head Coach Mike Sherman, Franklin mentors a strong receiving arsenal that includes Donald Driver, Javon Walker and Robert Ferguson catching passes from Brett Favre... Despite an injury to Walker, the Packers rank sixth in team receiving yards... Driver sets career highs with 86 receptions for 1,221 receiving yards.

2000-04 MARYLAND (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator)

Franklin helps Maryland to three consecutive bowl appearances starting with the 2001 squad... Maryland also achieves three straight seasons of 10 wins or more (2001-03), including appearance in 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl...Terps followed Orange Bowl berth with 30-3 victory over Tennessee in 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 41-7 win over West Virginia in 2003 Toyota Gator Bowl... Promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2003, Franklin delivers back-to-back recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's Top 25.

1999 IDAHO STATE (wide receivers)

As receivers coach, Franklin helps ISU finish ninth nationally in total offense.

1998 WASHINGTON STATE (graduate assistant coach/tight ends)

Franklin joins highly successful Cougar Coach Mike Price as grad assistant.

1997 JAMES MADISON (wide receivers)

Franklin mentors James Madison wide receivers... Junior receiver Earnest Payton finishes his career as the school's leader in receptions with 185.

1996 EAST STROUDSBURG (defensive backs)

Franklin returns to his alma mater, Division II East Stroudsburg.

NFL MINORITY COACHING FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Franklin participates in the program in 1998, serving an internship with Miami. He also enjoyed stints with Philadelphia in 1999 and Minnesota in 2008.

VANDY-SOUTH CAROLINA: BIG TV RATINGS

The Vanderbilt-So. Carolina game last Thursday notched superb TV ratings for ESPN. The VU-SC game was ESPN's most watched Thursday night game since 1998, earning a 3.0 national rating (4.13 million viewers nationally). It also was ESPN's most viewed Thursday season opener since 1994.

RODGERS: NINE STRAIGHT STARTS AT QB

Jordan Rodgers (R-Sr.) earned his ninth consecutive start at quarterback against Northwestern last week hooking up with Jordan Matthews (Jr., WR) on a 22-yard TD in the first quarter. The senior QB was 17-of-33 for 217 yards and a touchdown against the Gamecocks in the season opener.

Rodgers, the younger brother of Green Bay Packers' QB Aaron Rodgers, was inserted as the Vanderbilt quarterback midway through the 2011 season. Afterward, Rodgers gave the Commodore offense a lift as a dual-threat out of the backfield.

Rodgers' backup is a capable junior, Austyn Carta-Samuels. A transfer from the University of Wyoming, Carta-Samuels passed for 3,655 yards and 19 TDs as a 21-game starter for the Cowboys. He also accumulated 4,400 yards of total offense. In 2009, Carta-Samuels became the first true freshman to start at quarterback for the Cowboys in 35 years and capped the MWC Freshman of the Year campaign by leading Wyoming to a win in the New Mexico Bowl.

MARC PANU —YOUTUBE SENSATION

On Aug. 10, James Franklin surprised FB Marc Panu by presenting the walk-on with a full scholarship for 2012-13. Franklin broke the news to Panu in a team meeting and the moment was captured for posterity, however no one imagined the amount of attention the moment would garner.

Within one week, the video of the announcement had received over 330,000 views on YouTube, while Panu and Franklin had been interviewed by media outlets ranging from The Tennessean to FOX News.

Panu began at Vanderbilt as a walk-on LB/DE and was named defensive scout team MVP as a freshman. In 2010, he appeared in 11 games on special teams. When Franklin arrived at Vanderbilt, Panu moved to fullback where he saw action in all 12 regular season games primarily as a short-yardage blocker and special teams contributor.

BARLOW, GATTIS: NEW COMMODORE COACHES

Two new assistant coaches, George Barlow and Josh Gattis, will be on the Commodore sideline for the first time this fall.

Both Barlow, a Marshall University graduate who comes from the University of New Mexico staff, and Gattis, a Wake Forest grad who served last year at Western Michigan, will have key recruiting roles in addition to position responsibilities. Barlow will coach defensive backs and serve as defensive recruiting coordinator. Gattis will mentor wide receivers and serve as offensive recruiting coordinator.

The Vanderbilt football program and athletics department has undergone several upgrades and renovations since last fall. Here's a look at some of new and improved areas on West End.

LOOK GOOD, PLAY GOOD

Head Coach James Franklin and the senior members of the football team unveiled the team's 2012 uniforms during a pep-rally style event at the Barnes & Noble Vanderbilt Bookstore on July 11.

The stylish uniforms, designed by the Vanderbilt football staff, are made with Nike's high-tenacity Cordura knit fabric and feature black, gold and white jerseys and pants. The final piece of equipment that was shown to the crowd was a white helmet. Last season, Vanderbilt debuted a black helmet that the team wore in addition to their gold helmet.

The Commodores can mix-and-match any combination of the black, gold and white elements (helmet, jersey and pants), creating 27 possible combinations.

Several key changes are incorporated in the 2012 design:

- For the first time since 1994, "Vanderbilt" will be displayed on the front of Commodore jerseys. The name will be in all caps above jersey numbers.
- A gold "anchor" emblem adorns the homeplate or front "V" neck of all jerseys. Last year, the Star V logo was stitched there.
- "Anchor Down" text is stitched in the interior of each jersey neckline.
- Nike's iconic "flywire" stitching is incorporated into the high impact shoulder area of each jersey.
- The gold jersey top features black shoulder coverings, black lettering and black numbers. Last year, the gold jersey had white numbers.
- All jerseys have an updated circular SEC patch stitched over the right breast. The Nike swoosh is over the left breast.
- Star V logos will adorn each hip of the pants. In 2011, a lone Star V logo was located on the left front of the uniform pant.

STADIUM UPGRADES

Several upgrades have been put in to place prior to the start of the 2012 season at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The most noticeable is the new video board in the north end zone of the stadium. The high definition board measures 40 x 71 feet and is one of the largest video boards in college football.

In front of the video board is a new grass berm for fan seating. The berm can accommodate approximately 400 fans and provide one of the most unique seats in the country.

The field itself has a new look and feel, as the old grass playing field has been replaced with a synthetic turf called Legion 46. Installed by Shaw Sportex, the field has several new features. The redzone features the phrase "Anchor Down," an anchor logo has replaced the traditional X that marks the kickoff location and the end zones are painted black with "Vanderbilt" and "Commodores" framed by the Star-V logo. The Star-V logo remains at midfield, with Southeastern Conference logos on the 25-yard lines.

In addition, new lighting has been installed at Vanderbilt Stadium. While they aren't as noticeable until nightfall, they will improve television viewing drastically while focusing more light on the field (and less in the stands), creating a more dramatic stage for Commodore football.

Across Jess Neely Drive, football was one of several Vanderbilt programs to benefit from renovations and additions at the McGugin Center. New meeting rooms and a 140-seat auditorium-style classroom all adjacent to the coaches offices will benefit football, while meeting rooms have also been added to McGugin for Vanderbilt's Olympic sports.

THREE EARN PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt was represented on both sides of the football when the Southeastern Conference announced Preseason All-SEC teams in advance of SEC Media Days.

★ **Zac Stacy** (Sr., RB) was named second team running back by both the coaches and writers that cover the league. Stacy set several school records as a junior, including the single-season rushing record at 1,193 yards. Stacy added 14 rushing touchdowns and eclipsed 100 yards in five games, including a stellar 198-yard performance against Army and a 135-yard, two-touchdown performance against Kentucky that earned him SEC Player of the Week honors.

UPDATE: Stacy has rushed for 82 yards in the first two games.

★ **Trey Wilson** (Sr., CB) was named third team defensive back by the writers after making 30 tackles, three interceptions and 11 pass break-ups in 2011. He became the first Vanderbilt player since 1974 to return to interceptions for touchdowns in the same season, returning picks against Ole Miss and Elon. He also had another pick against the Rebels and earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

UPDATE: Wilson posted three tackles, and contributed two defended passes against Northwestern.

★ **Rob Lohr** (R-Sr., DT) received third-team defensive honors. He has started 25 consecutive games for the Commodores. In 2011, he was second on the team with five sacks and 11.5 tackles for loss. He also forced a pair of fumbles and made 41 total tackles. He leads all active Vanderbilt players in career sacks (nine) and tackles for loss (20.5).

UPDATE: Lohr posted five tackles this year and has shared with a tackle for loss.

VANDERBILT'S NEW RADIO FLAGSHIP

Vanderbilt football and men's basketball games will be carried on one of the nation's strongest radio signals following a flagship agreement announced in August between Vanderbilt Athletics and Nashville's **NewsRadio WLAC AM-1510**.



Starting with the Vanderbilt opener against South Carolina on August 30, all Commodore football and men's basketball games will air on WLAC 1510, a station that boasts one of the nation's most powerful evening signals. WLAC can be heard across middle America, from Canada to the Gulf of Mexico.

The flagship agreement was finalized in August by Vanderbilt Athletics, its multimedia rights holder IMG College and Clear Channel Media & Entertainment (CCM+E), one of America's largest media companies.

NewsRadio WLAC 1510 will air all radio programming related to Vanderbilt football and men's basketball, including game broadcasts and weekly coach's call-in shows.

FRESHMAN CLASS AMONG BEST EVER

Vanderbilt's freshman class is regarded as perhaps the most talented recruiting class ever to enroll at Vanderbilt.

Three members of the class – **Caleb Azubike**, **Darreon Herring** and **Brian Kimbrow** – have played this season.

The 2012 signing class represents the first in school history where every recruit in the class was rated three stars or better, while the group also includes four four-star players. Those four four-star players are the most recruits of that caliber to ever be in one class at Vanderbilt. In fact, Vanderbilt had signed just three four-star players in the decade prior.

Of the 22 signees, 15 are nationally ranked at their position.

Vanderbilt was especially successful in its home state of Tennessee, where all six recruits who are staying in their native state to become Commodores were among the top-25 players in Tennessee.

"Maybe it's good for us," Spurrier said. "You look at the preseason press we thought we were hot stuff. Then we almost got that stuff beat out of us."

But Shaw bruised his right, throwing shoulder late in the first half and missed the first two series of the third quarter before returning. The junior drove the Gamecocks for the go-ahead touchdown and ran 12 yards to the Vandy 1 before rolling in pain in the end zone.

Lattimore scored the go-ahead TD on a 1-yard run with 11:25 to go.
