## No. 12 Commodores Face Final Non-Conference Test Before SEC Play

The No. 12 Vanderbilt women's tennis team faces Middle Tennessee State on Wednesday at 2:30 p.m. The match serves as the final tune-up for the Commodores before opening Southeastern Conference play.

Vanderbilt moved to 6-0 on the year with a 6-1 victory over East Tennessee State last Wednesday. The Commodores quickly secured the doubles point as Caroline Ferrell and Keilly Ulery recorded the first win, while Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery followed closely behind to grab the point for the 'Dores. In singles play, Ferrell and Courtney Ulery recorded wins to stay perfect in singles play on the year. The only Commodore to fall against ETSU was Taylor, who split the first two sets with her opponent and then lost a 10-point tiebreaker 12-10.

Middle Tennessee State enters the match with a 3-7 record. The Blue Raiders have won two of their last three matches, including wins over Belmont and Chattanooga. In its most recent match, MTSU suffered a 5-2 loss at the hands of Indiana State.

The Commodores have controlled the all-time series against MTSU, leading 25-3, including a 6-1 victory in last year's meeting.

Vanderbilt opens up conference play on Friday, February 29, as it travels to Gainesville, Fla., to face the No. 6 Florida Gators. The Commodores will also travel to No. 32 on Sunday to conclude the SEC weekend road trip.

# 2008 Vanderbilt Women's Tennis Match Notes



## The Coaches

**Vanderbilt:** Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's tennis program. Under his direction, the Commodores have made 13 consecutive NCAA Tournaments and have been to the round of 16 in the last nine tournaments. Macdonald owns a 287-90 record at Vanderbilt, making him the winningest coach in Commodore history. He has been named Coach of the Year three times, including earning that recognition from the SEC in 2000. Macdonald recently picked up his 400th career victory in Vanderbilt's 4-3 victory over Notre Dame. His career record stands at 401-126.

**Middle Tennessee State:** Alison Ojeda enters her third year as the head coach at MTSU. Last year, she guided the Blue Raiders to an 8-13 record. Ojeda previously served as an assistant coach at Alabama and Texas A&M. While at Texas A&M, she earned the 2004 Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year honor. She enjoyed a fine playing career at the University of Tennessee, as she earned All-America honors in singles as a junior and was named a four-time Academic All-SEC selection.

## Scouting Middle Tennessee State

Middle Tennessee State enters Wednesday's match with a 3-7 overall record. A member of the Sun Belt Conference, the Blue Raiders have won two of their last three matches, including victories over Belmont and Chattanooga. In their last match, the Blue Raiders fell 5-2 to Indiana State.

## Last Time vs. Middle Tennessee State

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The Vanderbilt women's tennis team snapped their five-match losing streak with a 6-1 win over cross-town rival Middle Tennessee State Friday afternoon.

After sweeping the doubles point, the Commodores took straight set wins at Nos. 2-6 to set the final score.

The Commodores will return to the Currey Tennis Center next Thursday, February 22 to face No. 3 Georgia Tech, recent ITA National Indoors Champions.

## In Our Last Match...

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The No. 12 Vanderbilt women's tennis team showed no ill effects from a 19-day layoff as they easily defeated East Tennessee State 6-1 on Friday afternoon at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores improved to 6-0 with the win, while ETSU dropped to 1-4.

"ETSU has a really good team," Vanderbilt head coach Geoff Macdonald said. "It was good to get a match under our belts outside. I think we handled the shift pretty well."

Playing outside for the first time in the spring season, the Commodores quickly secured the doubles point. Caroline Ferrell and Keilly Ulery easily defeated Whitney Trotter and Vita Moskaliova 8-2 at the No. 3 doubles position. Catherine Newman and Taka Bertrand clinched the doubles point with an 8-4 win over Tara Byrne and Tara Sheets at the second doubles position. Playing at the No. 1 doubles position for the first time this season, Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery won over Yevgeniya Stupak and Olya Batsula 8-5.

Ferrell made quick work of Moskaliova at No. 6 singles with a dominating 6-0, 6-1 win to put Vanderbilt up 2-0. The senior from Blythewood, S.C., improved to 6-0 on the season with the victory.

No. 24 Newman gave the Commodores their third point with an equally impressive 6-1, 6-0 win over Byrne at No. 2 singles.

Bertrand clinched the match for the Black and Gold with a 6-0, 6-1 win over Sheets in the fourth singles position. The win improved Bertrand's singles record to 5-1.

Keilly Ulery quickly followed with the fifth point for the 'Dores as she did not lose a game in her 6-0, 6-0 win over Trotter at No. 5 singles.

"I'm excited about having Keilly in our program," Macdonald said. "She's just a dynamite player. She's going to get better and better and better."

No. 13 Courtney Ulery earned her sixth singles win of the year as she defeated Batsula 6-2, 7-5 at the third singles position.

No. 24 Taylor suffered the only loss of the day for the Commodores in a hard-fought match against Stupak at the No. 1 singles position. After losing the first set 6-3, Taylor bounced back with a 6-2 win in the second set. Stupak was able to win a 10-point tie-breaker in the third set 12-10 for the win.

## Courtney Ulery Named SEC Player of the Week

Junior Courtney Ulery was named SEC Player of the Week after her performance against No. 23 Michigan and No. 9 Notre Dame. Ulery, who has opened the spring season 5-0, defeated No. 88 Colleen Rielley to even the match against the Fighting Irish. Ulery also partnered with Amanda Taylor to down the 50th-ranked doubles team of Kali Krisik and Rielley 8-5 in Vanderbilt's win over Notre Dame. The honor was the first for a Vanderbilt player since February 8, 2007, when Amanda Taylor received the same award.

## Closing in on 300

Vanderbilt head coach Geoff Macdonald stands just 13 victories shy of 300 in his career as the Commodore head coach. Macdonald's 287-90 record at Vanderbilt makes him the winningest coach in school history. Macdonald also picked up another milestone against No. 9 Notre Dame, picking up his 400th career victory. ## 'Dores Make History in Albuquerque

The 2008 Vanderbilt women's tennis team made history with the pair of victories it picked up in Albuquerque, N.M. With the wins, the 2008 squad became the first Vanderbilt team to win a match in the Mountain Time zone. The 'Dores defeated New Mexico 5-2 and bettered Colorado 7-0.

## Vanderbilt Picked Third in SEC East By Conference Coaches

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team was picked to finish third in the SEC East by the league coaches in a poll released January 16. Florida was selected to win the overall league title.

The Commodores are ranked 16th in the preseason poll released last week by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. The 'Dores return five letterwinners and four starters from a team that finished 19-9 last season and advanced to the NCAA round of 16 for the 10th consecutive year.

Florida received 67 points in the poll and eight votes as the overall league champion. Perennial power Georgia was picked to finish second in the eastern division, with 59 points and two votes as overall league champion. The Commodores were selected third by the coaches, receiving two votes for overall league champion and 46 points overall. Rounding out the predicted eastern division standings was South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky.

In the west, Arkansas was predicted to win the division, followed closely behind by LSU. Auburn was picked third in the division, while Ole Miss was expected to finish fourth. Alabama and Mississippi State were predicted to finish fifth and sixth, respectively.

The preseason poll is voted on by the SEC women's tennis coach and is based on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 tally.

## Familiar Face Joins Commodore Coaching Staff

Former Vanderbilt standout Aleke Tsoubanos joins the Commodore coaching staff this season as an assistant coach. Tsoubanos enjoyed one of the most decorated careers in Vanderbilt women's tennis history. She earned NCAA All-American honors from 2002-04, was a three-time ITA All-American and was a first-team All-SEC selection. Tsoubanos still holds the record for most doubles victories in a season and in a career. Before returning to

## A Perfect 13

Junior Courtney Ulery (Wellington, Fla.) enjoyed a breakout fall season, finishing with a perfect 13-0 record. Ulery won her singles flight at the Furman Fall Classic, the Hoosier Classic, the June Stewart Invitational and the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic. During her run, Ulery defeated three nationally ranked players. Because of her success, the previously unraked Ulery stormed into the rankings, earning a No. 13 ranking in the first national poll released by the ITA.

## Vanderbilt Signs Three in Fall

Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald announced that Chelsea Preeg, Heather Steinbauer and Jacqueline Wu have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play women's tennis for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2008.

"I'm thrilled to sign these three players," Macdonald said. "They are future stars at Vanderbilt and great student-athletes. They were widely recruited across the country. We're thrilled to be able to land what I think is one of the best recruiting classes in the country."

Preeg from Naples, Fla., has been one of the top ranked junior players in the United States for the past eight years. Currently ranked sixth in the girls 18 and under division, Preeg has won numerous junior championships and has been ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation. Preeg captured the Florida State Girls 18 and



under Championships when she was only 14 years old. She chose Vanderbilt over Clemson, Duke and North Carolina.

A native of The Woodlands, Texas, Steinbauer currently attends The Woodlands College Park High School. She is ranked No. 36 in the country according to tennisrecruiting.net and is the No. 2 ranked player in the state of Texas. Steinbauer has finished highly in several national events, including winning the girls' 18 division at the 2007 Houston Coca-Cola SCMZ and finishing second at the 2007 USTA National Opens. She chose Vanderbilt over Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and TCU.

Wu from Holmdel, N.J., is ranked 59th in the country and is the top ranked player in her state, according to tennisrecruiting.net. She advanced to the semifinals at the 2007 International Grass Court Championships. Wu was also a member of the victorious East team at the 2006 USTA National Girls' 18 Team Championship.

### Three Commodores Ranked in First ITA Poll

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team is ranked 16th in the first national Intercollegiate Tennis Association poll, released Tuesday. Also, three Commodores were ranked nationally in singles.

The Commodores, who finished last season also ranked 16th, return four starters and five letterwinners from last year's squad. Vanderbilt is the third-highest Southeastern Conference school in the poll, with Florida and Georgia ranked fourth and fifth, respectively. Future opponent and defending national champion Georgia Tech opens the season as the number one team in the country.

Junior Courtney Ulery (Wellington, Fla.) is the highest-ranked Commodore in the singles poll, coming in at No. 13. Ulery is coming off a fall season that saw her go a perfect 13-0, including three victories over ranked players. Ulery won four tournaments over the fall, including winning her flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic.

Sophomore Catherine Newman (Greensboro, N.C.) is ranked 24th in singles. Newman earned first-team All-SEC honors last season and finished the fall with a 10-3 record, including winning the 'A' flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic. Newman finished last season ranked 40th in singles.

Senior Amanda Taylor (Richland, Wash.) enters the singles rankings at No. 34. Taylor,

a two-time first-team All-SEC honoree, defeated then-No. 1 Megan Falcon of LSU at the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships this past fall. Last season, Taylor finished with the season ranked 32nd in singles and was named an ITA All-American for her doubles play with former Commodore Amanda Fish.

### Commodores Seek 10th Consecutive Sweet 16

The Commodores enter the 2008 season looking for their 10th consecutive appearance in the NCAA round of 16. Last season, the Commodores made it nine in a row by easily dispatching of Murray State and Tennessee in the opening two rounds played at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores fell in the round of 16 to perennial power Stanford. The Commodores have made the NCAA Tournament in each of Geoff Macdonald's 13 years with the team, advancing as far as the national championship match in 2001.

### SEC Title For Newman

Sophomore Catherine Newman (Greensboro, N.C.) finished the fall season in style, winning the singles 'A' flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic in Auburn, Ala. Newman, who was ranked No. 28 in the fall by the ITA, defeated three ranked players to win the title, including No. 17 Megan Alexander of Florida in the semifinals and South Carolina's Gira Schofield, ranked 36th, in the finals. Newman also won three matches at the ITA Southeast Indoor Championships. For the fall season, Newman finished with a 10-3 record.

## Beating No. 1

The highlight of senior Amanda Taylor's fall came at the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships. In the opening round of the main singles draw, Taylor defeated No. 1 Megan Falcon of LSU in straight sets 6-2, 6-3. Assistant coach Aleke Tsubanos called Taylor's performance "some of the most flawless tennis I've ever seen her play." Taylor went on to fall in the second round of the tournament, dropping a hard-fought, three-set match to No. 14 Laura Vallverdu of Miami (Fla.).



## Geoff Macdonald

Virginia (1981), 14th Year

Record at Vanderbilt: 287-90 (.761)

Career Record: 401-126 (.761)

Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season as the head coach of the women's tennis team. During the previous 13 seasons, the two-time SEC Coach of the Year has placed the Commodores among the nation's elite programs on a consistent basis.

Since Macdonald joined the Vanderbilt staff in 1994, the Commodore tennis program has developed a reputation for rapid player improvement, strong commitments to coaching, and unmatched excellence on the court and in the classroom.

Before Macdonald's arrival, the Vanderbilt women's tennis program had never been ranked higher than No. 28 in the nation. Under his leadership, the Commodores have finished no lower than No. 16 in each of the past nine years, including a school record No. 2 ranking at the end of the 2004 season. Vanderbilt has ranked in the top three of the Southeastern Conference eight of the past 10 years, and has cultivated several nationally ranked players and doubles teams.

Last season may have been one of Macdonald's finest coaching jobs. After starting off the season 2-5, the Commodores rebounded to win their next 12 matches. The Commodores finished third in the Southeastern Conference with a 9-2 record and advanced to their 13th straight NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt easily disposed of Murray State and Tennessee in the first two rounds of the tournament before falling to perennial powerhouse Stanford in the round of 16. The Commodores finished the year with a 19-9 record and were ranked 16th by the ITA.

While Macdonald's leadership continues to improve the Commodore program every season, Macdonald's impact was felt immediately in his very first year at Vanderbilt in 1995. The team finished the year 16-8, including an 8-3 mark in the SEC and advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history.

Once Vanderbilt began its rise to the top, the achievements kept coming. In 1996, the Commodores posted a 24-7 record, finished second in the SEC, advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time and, once again, earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, advancing to the Round of 16. The team's 24 wins were the third most in the nation that year.

The team continued to improve with each successful season and in 2001 the 'Dores finally found themselves in the national spotlight as they competed in the NCAA finals. The event marked the first time that any Vanderbilt sports team had played for a national championship. Despite falling to the Stanford Cardinal, Macdonald's squad ended the season with a 26-5 record and a No. 4 national ranking, while three singles players and two doubles teams earned individual bids to the NCAA championships.

The following season, Macdonald not only matched the success of the previous year, but led the 'Dores to a record setting 27 wins. The team also advanced to the finals of the National Team Indoors tournament, which features sixteen of the top ranked teams in the country. Following the season, Sarah Riske and Aleke Tsoubanos were both named ITA All-Americans.

In 2003, Macdonald oversaw the final year of Sarah Riske's career, who became a two-time All-American in both singles and doubles. Riske left VU as the winningest doubles player, but Tsoubanos has since grabbed that title.

In 2004, the Commodores returned to the Final Four in the NCAA Tournament where they lost to undefeated Stanford, the eventual national champions. The 2004 Commodore team included All American, All Academic and ITA Scholar Aleke Tsoubanos who is entering her first year as an assistant for the women's tennis team. Other honors achieved by Commodores included Annie Menees' All Academic and ITA Scholar awards, while Audra Falk and Kelly Schmandt landed All-American honors.

In 2006, the Commodores posted a 23-5 record en route to the team's eighth consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, despite the young team's lack of senior representatives. Following the season, junior Amanda Fish became the seventh

Commodore under Macdonald to receive ITA All-American honors.

Macdonald has earned three Coach of the Year honors, including SEC recognition for his 2000 team, which included four ITA ranked singles players. He previously earned the title at Duke and Louisiana State University, where he began his coaching career in 1988.

Before coming to Nashville, Macdonald was the head coach at Duke University. Macdonald was honored with ACC Coach of the Year honors in 1992. While in Durham, he guided the Blue Devils to three conference championships and three appearances in the NCAA tournament, where Duke made two appearances in the quarterfinals and one semifinal appearance.

During his three years with the Tigers, Macdonald took LSU from last in the SEC to the NCAA Championship as the No. 13 seed in just three years. Following the Tigers' 1991 season, Macdonald was named the SEC Coach of the Year. Macdonald amassed a 50-24 record while at the helm of the LSU women's tennis program.

As a player at the University of Virginia, Macdonald capped off a successful collegiate career by winning the ACC singles title in 1981. He advanced to the NCAA Championship, where he defeated David Pate in the first round.

Macdonald was named the ACC's Most Valuable Player and also won the league's Sportsmanship Award. He finished second to basketball great Ralph Sampson in the Athlete of the Year voting at Virginia in 1981.

After his collegiate career, Macdonald played professionally for three years. Macdonald scored wins over David Pate, Wally Masur, Jacob Hlasek and Juan Aguilera. He also gained Grand Slam experience, playing in the U.S. Open. Among his victories was the Florida State Closed Men's Singles Championship.

Following his pro playing career, Macdonald became a private instructor until being named head coach at LSU. And now, as a Commodore, Macdonald believes the climate at Vanderbilt is right to produce national championship caliber teams. And, toward that end, he adheres to a simple coaching philosophy: Hard work and hours of individual attention for each player every week.

Macdonald is married to Kate Daniels, a highly acclaimed English professor at Vanderbilt, who also has taught at Wake Forest, LSU, Virginia, UMass and Bennington College. They have three children – Sam, 21; Gus, 16; and Jane, 14.
