Vanderbilt takes four-game winning streak to Orange Beach for SEC Tournament

The Vanderbilt soccer team will take its four-game winning streak to Orange Beach, Ala., this week for its first SEC Tournament appearance since 2006. The seventh-seeded Commodores will face-off against the No. 2 seeded LSU Tigers in Wednesday's opening round. The two teams needed overtime to decide the winner of its only regular season meeting with the Tigers coming away with a 2-1 win on Oct. 11 in Nashville. Vanderbilt's Nicole Lukens and Megan Forester are the lone Commodores that have played at the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach as VU returns to postseason for the first time in three years.

LSU is ranked No. 16 by the NSCAA; 18th by Soccer Times; 19th by Soccer America; 26th by Top Drawer. LSU is 22nd in the latest NCAA RPI.

Vanderbilt is not ranked in the national polls. VU is ranked No. 7 in the NSCAA South Regional Rankings (10/27/09). Vanderbilt is No. 46 in the latest NCAA RPI.

SEC Tournament History

Vanderbilt is making its 14th appearance at the SEC Tournament this week as they return to the conference tournament for the first time since 2006. The Commodores have advanced to the SEC Tournament championship game four times and won back-to-back titles in 1993 and 1994. VU is 11-9-1 all-time at the SEC Tournament and has hosted the event twice (1993 and 1999). VU has now played in 14 of the 17 conference tournaments.

Ronnie Woodard is entering her ninth season as the head coach of the Vanderbilt women's soccer program.

Last season Woodard guided the Commodores to a ninewin season with a team comprised of mainly freshmen and sophomores.

Woodard led Vanderbilt to back to back NCAA tournament appearances in 2005 and 2006 and armed with back-toback stellar recruiting classes looks forward to continuing the program's upward progression.

Soccer Buzz tabbed Vanderbilt soccer's 2006-07 recruiting class as the best in the Central Region and the SEC and ninth best in the country, the highest ever achievement for the program. The 2007-08 class was rated No. 5 in the Central Region and SEC and No. 35 nationally.

After losing the majority of starters from the two NCAA clubs, Vanderbilt fell a notch in 2007 to 6-10-3 overall and 3-6-3 in SEC play. The youthful team was competitive throughout the year with six of the losses by just a goal, including three in overtime.

In 2006 Vanderbilt went 10-4-7 overall and tied for second in the SEC with a 6-3-2 mark in league play.

The team also advanced into NCAA play for the second straight year, an achievement that had not been done at the school since the 1997-98 seasons.

In 2005, Vanderbilt sported a 16-3-3 record, which more than doubled the number of wins from the previous two seasons combined. This accomplishment did not go unnoticed by her conference peers, as she was named SEC Co-Coach of the Year. In addition, SoccerBuzz also named her Coach of the Year.

The 2005 season, which ended in a dramatic doubleovertime shootout against Samford in the first round of the tournament, marked the team's second-strongest performance since 1998.

The 2005 team notched the program's best-ever winning percentage (.795), ended the season ranked among the country's top 21 in three separate polls, first in the Central regionby Soccer Buzz magazine, and was second in the nation for shutout percentage (0.73).

Woodard has made great strides in building the Commodore soccer program back up in her eight years here.

Since her start with the Commodores in 2001, she has brought the team steadly closer to becoming an elite national team, rising from 5th in the SEC East in 2001 and 2002, to 4th in 2003 and 2004, 3rd in 2005 and tied for second in 2006.

Woodard has also taken the 'Dores to the SEC tournament four times. And, most recently, her team advanced to back-to-back NCAA tournaments in 2005 and 2006 for the first time in her Vanderbilt career.

In 2005-06, her team won Vanderbilt's coveted "Tolbert Cup," named in honor of Vanderbilt's former national track champion Ryan Tolbert. The Tolbert Cup is presented annually to the varsity team that sports the best combination of athletic, academic, and community service success.

Woodard and her husband Tom gave birth to their first child, Thomas Woodard IV at the end of August.

Series History (LSU)

Vanderbilt leads the all-time series with LSU 9-4-2. The Tigers have won the last three meetings. VU won the first four meetings between the Tigers a combined 21-0, including a 6-0 win over LSU in the school's first meeting in 1995. The Commodores last win against LSU came on September 25, 2005 when VU shutout the Tigers 2-0 in Nashville. VU won seven of the first nine meetings but has since lost three straight in the series. Vanderbilt has faced LSU only once in the SEC Tournament, posting a 3-0 win over the Tigers in the first round of 1998 tournament.

The four straight shutout wins is also the most clean sheets since the 5-0 start in conference play back in 2005.

Vanderbilt started the season 6-1-1 for the second consecutive season. The 6-1-1 mark is the best start to the season under Head Coach Ronnie Woodard since the 'Dores started the 2005 season 11-1.

Team enters Soccer America Top-25 poll for the first time in three years (2006). VU came in at No. 25 in the Sept. 8 Soccer America poll.

Bachtel Having Strong Junior Year

VU goalkeeper Rachel Bachtel recorded her seventh shutout of the year in Vanderbilt regular season finale in a 2-0 win over Kentucky on Oct. 31. Bachtel has recorded four straight shutouts heading into the conference tournament and now has 16 career shutouts, ranking third in school history. The Dublin, Ohio native was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 26. Bachtel was also named to Soccer America Team of the Week on Oct. 17.

Forester, Kinsella, Stewart Named to All SEC Teams

Senior Megan Forester, junior Molly Kinsella and freshman Chelsea Stewart earned All-Southeastern Conference honors as voted by the coaches and released by the league office. Forester, a Hendersonville, Tenn., native, picked up first-team honors while Kinsella, a Memphis, Tenn., native, earned secondteam plaudits. Stewart, a Highlands Ranch, Colo., native was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. It marked the first time in her four-year career that Forester had received all-conference honors while Kinsella picked up league honors for the third straight year. She was named to All-Freshmen team in 2007 and was a first-team all-league pick a year ago. The junior midfielder led the team in scoring her first two years in Nashville and did so again in 2009 with six goals and a career-high eight assists (20 points). Forester added two goals and a career best seven assists during the regular season, ranking second on the team. Stewart started in 17 of the team's 19 games, missing time due to a minor concussion suffered during the Georgia contest on Oct. 4. The highlytouted freshman had three goals and an assist during the regular season.

Kinsella Named to CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Team

Junior Molly Kinsella was one of four soccer players from the SEC to garner first-team academic all-district honors from CoSIDA and ESPN the Magazine. It marked the second consecutive year that Kinsella was named to the District IV first-team. The Memphis, Tenn., native has now received academic honors in all three years and is now eligible to become the first academic all-american since Sarah Dennis and Tyler Griffin.

Stewart, Lukens earn Individual plaudits in September

Chelsea Stewart and Nicole Lukens were named to Top Drawer Soccer's National Team of the Week during non-conference season. Stewart earned honors on Sept. 8 after scoring the game winning goals against Oklahoma and Belmont while Lukens was named to the Sept. 21 National Team of the Week after scoring two goals and adding an assist in a 3-0 win over UT-Martin on Sept. 18.

Freshman class making immediate impact

Vanderbilt's most recent recruiting class is already paying dividends on the field in 2009 as all seven of Vanderbilt's true freshman have made an immediate impact to the program. Midfielders Chelsea Stewart, CJ Rhoades, and Margaux Andrews have started a combined 23 of 24 games this season while Amanda Essay has started all eight games at defense.

Lukens leads the team in goals with five; Molly Kinsella leads the team in points with 15, (four goals, seven assist) and Chelsea Stewart is third on the team in points with seven (three goals, one assist).

Freshman Stewart Takes Game Overseas; Beijing Summer Olympics Freshman Chelsea Stewart spent the 2008-09 season competing for the Canadian National U-20 Team at the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics. The

Highlands Ranch, Colo. had 17 caps and two goals for the Canadians while participating in the FIFA U-20 World Cup. She won a gold medal at the 2008 CONCACAF Women's Under-20 Championships in Puebla, Mexico.

'Dores Picked Fifth in SEC East in Preseason Poll

Vanderbilt was picked to finish in fifth place in the Eastern Division of the Southeastern Confernece Preseason Coaches' Poll. Florida was picked as the favorite to claim the 2009 SEC women's soccer title after winning it in 2008.
