VANDERBILT LOOKS TO CONTINUE WIN STREAK AT SAN JUAN SHOOTOUT

Vanderbilt (6-3) looks to extend its five-game win streak this week when it travels to Puerto Rico for the San Juan Shootout, Dec. 19-21. The Commodores play tournament-host Puerto Rico Mayaguez Tuesday at 9 a.m. CT to tip off the three-game event. Other participants include Tennessee Tech (4-4), Northwestern (6-2), Utah (4-5), Central Florida (6-1), Virginia (6-1) and Appalachian State (7-3).

Vanderbilt is coming off a 76-40 victory over visiting Nicholls State on Saturday. The Commodores held the Colonels to only 12 points in the first half -- a record for the fewest points in a half under head coach Kevin Stallings. Vanderbilt limited Nicholls State to only 13 field goals for the game while forcing the Colonels into 23 turnovers.

Junior forward Ross Neltner registered his first career double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds while freshman Jermaine Beal tossed in a career-high 15 points.

The victory was the 128th win for Stallings during his eight seasons at Vanderbilt. He is one win away from tying former Vanderbilt head coach C.M. Newton for third on the school's all-time coaching wins list. Roy Skinner is first with 278 followed by Bob Polk with 197.

The Commodores will face either Tennessee Tech or Northwestern in second-round action on Wednesday, Dec. 20. If Vanderbilt wins its first game, its second-round contest will tip at 1 p.m. CT. Should the Commodores lose their first-round matchup, their second-round game would start at 9 a.m. CT on Wednesday.

Vanderbilt owns a 23-7 all-time record against teams participating in the San Juan Shootout. The Commodores have played Tennessee Tech (12-5) most often, followed by Virginia (5-1), Northwestern (4-1) and Appalachian State (2-0). Vanderbilt has never played Puerto-Rico Mayaguez, Utah or Central Florida.

Vanderbilt's last participation in a regular-season tournament off the continental United States came during the 2001-02 campaign when the Commodores were 2-1 at the Hawaii Pacific Thanksgiving Classic, in Honolulu. This is Vanderbilt's first visit to the San Juan Shootout.

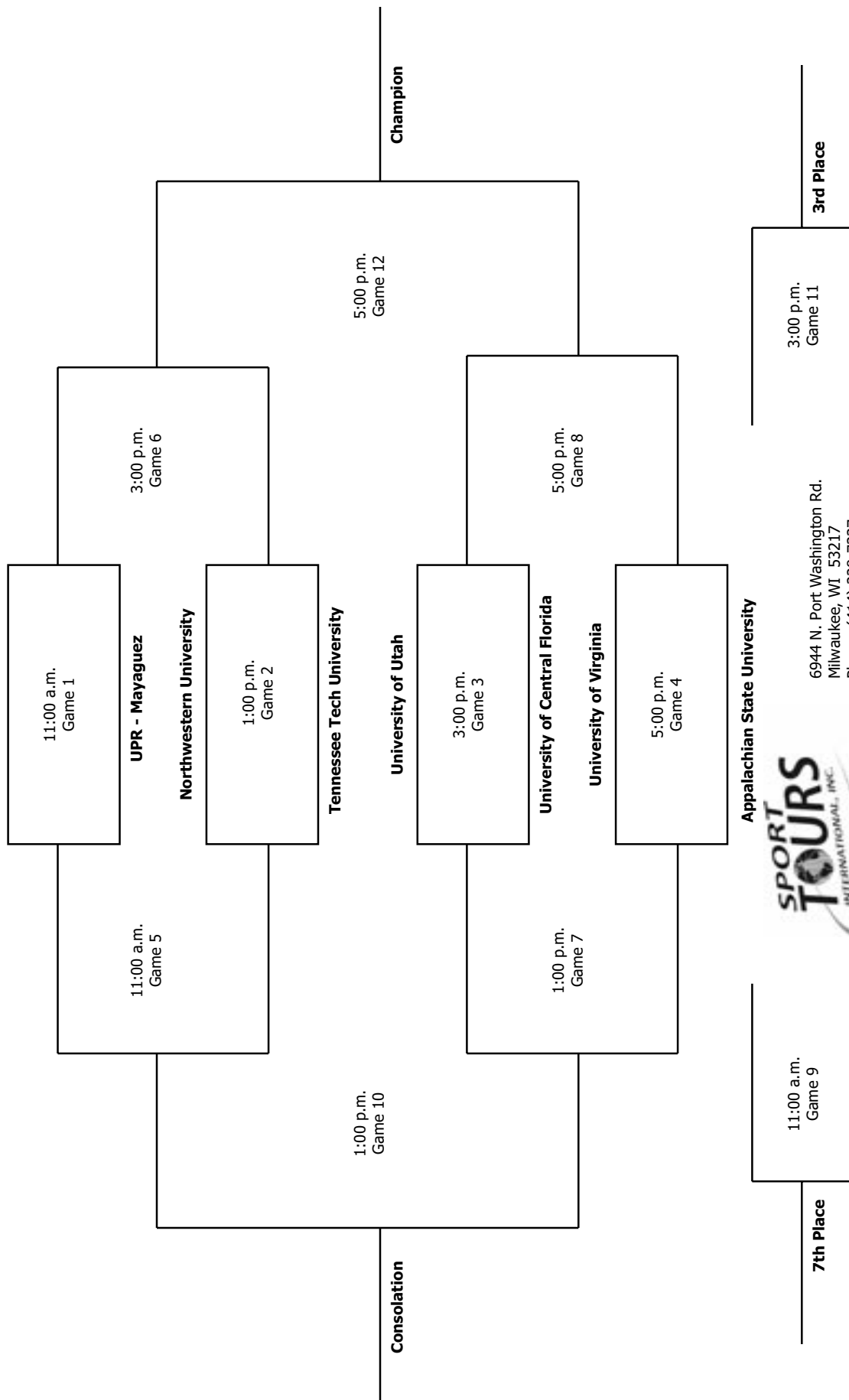

POSSIBLE SECOND-ROUND OPPONENT: TENNESSEE TECH

Vanderbilt is 12-6 all-time against Tennessee Tech... The Commodores are 11-1 against the Golden Eagles at Memorial Gymnasium in Nashville and 1-5 against Tennessee Tech in Cookeville... The Commodores have won the last four meetings in the series, including a 98-79 victory on Dec. 13, 2003 in Nashville... A matchup in San Juan would mark the first neutral site meeting in series history... Vanderbilt's Kevin Stallings is 1-0 all-time against Tennessee Tech.

The Golden Eagles (4-4) came to San Juan having not played since defeating Southeastern Missouri, 91-76 in Cookeville on Dec. 9. Guards Belton Rivers and Anthony Fisher combined for 52 points to lead TTU to victory. Rivers earned Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Week honors after scoring a career-high 33 points, including 6-of-10 shooting from 3-point range against SEMO. Anthony Fisher (19.8 ppg) and Rivers (18.8 ppg) serve as TTU's one-two punch offensively. Forward Amadi McKenzie almost averages a double-double with 13.3 points and a team-high 9.5 rebounds.

The Golden Eagles were picked to finish in third place in preseason balloting by head coaches and the league's SIDs.

AGAINST THE OVC

Vanderbilt is 48-7 (.873) all-time against teams from the Ohio Valley Conference. The Commodores' last game against an OVC opponent came in last season's opener against Jacksonville State, a 67-46 Vanderbilt victory on Nov. 16... Vanderbilt has won 24 consecutive games against teams from the OVC since Tennessee Tech's 89-76 win over the Commodores on Nov. 29, 1989 at Memorial Gymnasium. Kevin Stallings is 11-0 against the OVC. Stallings is 1-0 against Tennessee Tech.

POSSIBLE SECOND-ROUND OPPONENT: NORTHWESTERN

Vanderbilt is 4-1 all-time against Northwestern... The Commodores are 3-0 against the Wildcats at Memorial Gymnasium and 1-1 against Northwestern in Evanston... The teams have not met since an 86-66 Vanderbilt win on Dec. 3, 1992 in Nashville... The Commodores' lone loss in the series came the year prior, an 83-81 setback in Evanston... A matchup in San Juan would mark the first neutral site meeting in series history... Vanderbilt's Kevin Stallings is 2-1 all-time against Northwestern.

Northwestern (6-2) comes to San Juan having won five consecutive games after outlasting Wheaton (Ill.), 41-39, on Dec. 14. Forward Kevin Coble scored a team-high 12 points on 5-of-10 shooting and grabbed five rebounds. Guard Craig Moore added 10 points and five assists. Among Northwestern's six wins this season are home victories over DePaul (49-39) and Miami (Fla.) 61-59. Six of the Wildcats' eight games have been decided by five points or less.

AGAINST THE BIG TEN

Vanderbilt is 19-26 (.422) all-time against teams from the Big Ten Conference. Vanderbilt's last contest against a Big Ten foe resulted in a 67-60 Commodore victory over Indiana in Bloomington in the first round of the 2005 postseason NIT... Vanderbilt has won its last three games against the Big Ten since a 70-66 setback at Michigan on Dec. 21, 2002... Kevin Stallings is 3-2 against the league while at Vanderbilt and 6-6 against the conference all-time during his coaching career. Stallings is 2-1 against Northwestern.

POSSIBLE THIRD-ROUND OPPONENT: UTAH

Vanderbilt and Utah have never met on the hardwood.

Utah (4-5) comes to San Juan after earning a 77-58 victory over Cal Poly on Saturday, Dec. 16. The win snapped a mini two-game losing streak for the Utes with both setbacks coming on the road.

The Utes have lost by a combined eight points in four of their five losses this season. Utah entered last week ranked first in the Mountain West Conference and fourth in the nation in 3-point shooting percentage at 45.6 percent.

Guard Johnnie Bryant and forward Shaun Green both have 25 or more 3-pointers on the season. Sophomore center Luke Nevill leads the squad with more than 18 points and nine rebounds per contest.

AGAINST THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Commodores are 11-1 (.917) all-time against teams from the Mountain West Conference... Vanderbilt has played five MWC squads in school history, including TCU (4-1), New Mexico (3-0), Air Force (2-0), Brigham Young (1-0) and Wyoming (1-0)... Vanderbilt's last game against an MWC opponent concluded in a 78-55 home win over TCU on Dec. 18, 2004... The Commodores have won 11 consecutive games against the league since a 51-49 setback to TCU during the 1952 campaign... Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 2-0 against the league all-time with both victories coming against TCU while head coach at Vanderbilt.

POSSIBLE THIRD-ROUND OPPONENT: CENTRAL FLORIDA

Vanderbilt and Central Florida have never met one another in series history.

Central Florida (6-1) visits San Juan after suffering its first loss of the season, 74-63, at Minnesota on Dec. 12. UCF's 6-0 start was its best mark to begin a year since the 1980 season. The Golden Knights began the year with six consecutive home games.

Sophomore guard Jermaine Taylor leads all Golden Knights in scoring with more than 18 points a contest. He had connected on a team-best 21 3-pointers entering this week's tournament. Senior forward Josh Peppers is the only other UCF player averaging double figures with more than 11 points per game.

AGAINST CONFERENCE-USA

Vanderbilt owns a 65-18 (.783) all-time mark against teams from Conference-USA... The Commodores have played nine of the 12 current league members with the exception of Central Florida, Marshall and UTEP... Vanderbilt visits Rice in the Commodores final non-conference game of the season on Jan. 2... The Commodores lost their last game against a C-USA league member, dropping an 81-68 decision at Memphis in third round of the 2005 postseason NIT... Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 8-6 all-time against current members of the league.

POSSIBLE THIRD-ROUND OPPONENT: VIRGINIA

Vanderbilt is 5-1 all-time against Virginia... The Commodores are 4-0 against the Cavaliers at Memorial Gymnasium and 1-1 against Virginia in Charlottesville... Vanderbilt has won the last two meetings in the series, including a 70-65 home win on Dec. 6, 1994 and a 61-48 victory in Charlottesville on Dec. 5, 1995... Virginia's lone win in the series came in a 70-56 decision in Charlottesville on Dec. 8, 1990... Kevin Stallings has never coached against Virginia in his career.

Virginia (6-1) came to San Juan after defeating Hampton, 77-58 on Saturday, Dec. 16. It marked the Cavaliers' first contest in 12 days due to semester finals.

Virginia is 1-0 in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season after topping N.C. State, 67-62, on Dec. 3. The Cavaliers opened the 2006-07 campaign with a 93-90 upset of nationally ranked Arizona on Nov. 12.

Preseason First Team All-ACC honoree Sean Singletary leads all UVA scorers with more than 16 points a game. The junior guard also leads the team in assists with more than six per game.

Senior guard J.R. Reynolds was tabbed Preseason Second Team All-ACC. He is averaging more than 14 points and nearly four assists.

Sophomore swingman Mamadi Diane earned league player of the week accolades after netting a career-high 25 points against Arizona in the season opener. He averages more than 14 points.

AGAINST THE ACC

Vanderbilt is 74-69 (.517) all-time against current teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference... Vanderbilt is 10-12 against the ACC since 1990... Virginia would be the third member of the ACC to play the Commodores this season. The Commodores lost at Wake Forest, 88-78, on Nov. 21 but defeated then-No. 25 Georgia Tech, 73-64 on Dec. 9. Kevin Stallings is 4-5 all-time against the league. All nine of those games have come during his stay at Vanderbilt. He has never coached against Virginia.

POSSIBLE THIRD-ROUND OPPONENT: APPALACHIAN STATE

Vanderbilt is 2-0 all-time against Appalachian State with both games coming during the Kevin Stallings era... The Commodores topped the Mountaineers, 63-48, on Dec. 22, 2003 and 68-51 on Dec. 22, 2004.

Appalachian State (7-3) visits San Juan after posting a 87-84 victory over Georgia Southern on Dec. 16. The victory moved the Mountaineers to 3-0 in the Southern Conference.

Senior guard D.J. Thompson leads the team with more than 15 points and four assists per outing. He has more than 40 3-pointers on the season. Junior forward Jeremy Clayton averages more than seven rebounds per game.

AGAINST THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Vanderbilt is 39-5 (.886) all-time against teams from the Southern Conference... The Commodores dropped a 70-62 decision at home against Furman on Nov. 28. The loss was Vanderbilt's first against the league since a 101-84 setback at Davidson on Dec. 7, 1968... Commodore Head Coach Kevin Stallings is 13-1 against current members of the Southern Conference, including a 12-1 mark while at Vanderbilt.

UPWARD TREND

After losing three of its first four games of the season, Vanderbilt has won five consecutive contests and enters the San Juan Shootout with a 6-3 overall mark. The five-game win streak is Vanderbilt's longest since stringing together six consecutive wins during the 2004-05 campaign.

MORE ON THE NICHOLLS STATE WIN

- Vanderbilt surrendered only 12 points in the first half against Nicholls State. It marked the fewest points allowed in a half during the Stallings era.
- Vanderbilt's 15 steals against Nicholls State were the most under Kevin Stallings. Nine of the 10 Commodores who played against the Colonels recorded at least one steal. Jermaine Beal led the team with three.
- The Commodores held Nicholls State to only 13 field goals on the night, marking the fewest by an opponent

since Auburn made only 13 in Vanderbilt's 67-43 win at Auburn on Feb. 16, 2005.

- Vanderbilt limited Nicholls State to only 24.5 percent shooting from the field (13-of-53). It was the lowest shooting percentage by a Commodore opponent since Alabama A&M shot 19.3 percent (11-of-57) in Vanderbilt's 68-40 home win on Nov. 24, 2002.

- The Commodores tied their season high for free throw shooting percentage against Nicholls State, making 17 of 21 attempts (81.0 percent). Vanderbilt posted those exact figures against Lipscomb on Dec. 7. Vanderbilt has made 15 or more free throws in six of its nine games this season.

FOSTER & BYARS LEADING OFFENSIVE ATTACK

- The wing tandem of Shan Foster (18.6 ppg) and Derrick Byars (16.4 ppg) are currently averaging a combined 35.0 points and 9.0 rebounds during Vanderbilt's current five-game win streak. Foster is shooting 50.8 percent from the field (32-63) and 47.2 percent (17-of-36) from 3-point range during the five games. Byars is shooting at a 48.3 percent clip (29-of-60) from the field and 40.0 percent clip (10-of-25) from beyond the arc.

- Either Foster or Byars has led the Commodores in scoring in six of nine contests this season.

- Either Foster or Byars has led the Commodores in rebounding in six of Vanderbilt's nine games this year.

Shan Foster (16.0 ppg) and Derrick Byars (15.9) entered the Nicholls State game as the top scoring wing duo (31.9 ppg) in the Southeastern Conference. Foster was tied for sixth in the league in scoring while Byars was tied for eighth.

FOSTER NETS NOTEWORTHY WEEK

- Shan Foster posted a standout week averaging 19.7 points and 6.3 rebounds in three Commodore victories over East Tennessee State, Lipscomb and Georgia Tech. The wing player shot 52.7 percent from the field (20-of-38) and 50.0 percent (11-of-22) from 3-point range last week.
- Foster recorded his first career double-double with 29 points and a career-best 10 rebounds carrying Vanderbilt to a 104-62 win over East Tennessee State on Dec. 5. His seven 3-pointers against the Bucs were also a career-high.
- Foster netted 25 points on 9-of-14 shooting and five 3-pointers in Vanderbilt's 73-64 win over No. 25 Georgia Tech on Dec. 9. His two jumpers and a 3-pointer helped key the Commodores rally from a five-point deficit in the second half.

BYARS KEYS WINS OVER TOLEDO, LIPSCOMB

Vanderbilt senior Derrick Byars sparked the Commodores to a key 98-93 overtime win against Toledo on Dec. 2 that has set the stage for Vanderbilt's current five-game win streak.

The Memphis native poured in a career-high 28 points and five 3-pointers against the Rockets. Byars also stepped up with a game-high 18 points on 6-of-12 shooting to help Vanderbilt rally past a pesky Lipscomb squad, 59-50 on Dec. 7.

STALLINGS' SUCCESSES IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL (AS A PLAYER, ASSISTANT AND HEAD COACH)

- In 28 seasons as a player and coach, his teams have made 23 tournament appearances, including 13 NCAA berths and three Final Fours.
- Stallings has posted just one losing season in 28 seasons as a player and coach.
- He has posted 20-win seasons 19 times and has won 12 conference championships.
- Stallings ranks as the third-winningest coach in Vanderbilt history with 128 victories. He needs eight wins this season to pass C.M. Newton for third place.
- Stallings became the first active SEC coach to earn 100 wins at two schools when Vanderbilt won at Auburn 67-43 on Feb. 16, 2005.

NELTNER A STEADY PERFORMER

Junior transfer Ross Neltner has made a strong start this season and enters the San Juan Tournament as the third-leading scorer (12.7 ppg) for the Commodores.

Neltner has scored in double figures in six of Vanderbilt's last seven games and recorded his first career double-double (15 points, 11 rebounds) against Nicholls State on Dec. 16.

For the season, the 2003 Kentucky Mr. Basketball honoree is shooting a team-best 59.4 percent from the field (41-of-69).

- He accounted for 20 points on 8-of-12 shooting as well as eight rebounds against Toledo.
- He posted 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting to go along with five rebounds, five assists and three steals against ETSU.
- He tallied 13 points on 4-of-8 shooting from the field and 5-of-5 shooting from the foul line against Lipscomb.
- Neltner has led Vanderbilt in scoring against Elon (18), Furman (12) and Nicholls State (15).

CASHING IN AT THE LINE

- Vanderbilt shot 81.0 percent (17-of-21) at the foul line against Nicholls State to improve their free throw shooting percentage to .743 for the season. The Commodores entered the Nicholls State contest ranked second in the SEC in free throw shooting at 73.5 percent (122-of-166). Three Vanderbilt players were listed among the league leaders, including Ross Neltner (third at 81.5 percent), Shan Foster (tied for fifth at 80.0 percent), and Derrick Byars (12th at 73.5 percent).
- Dan Cage has made 42 of his last 46 free throw attempts (91.3 percent) dating back to the start of last season and 51-of-55 attempts (92.7 percent) since Dec. 1, 2004.

WORTH NOTING...

- Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings (128) needs one win to tie C.M. Newton (129) for third place for most coaching victories at Vanderbilt. Roy Skinner ranks atop the list with 278 wins at Vanderbilt, followed by Bob Polk with 197.
- Stallings moved past Polk into second place following the Nicholls State game for most coaching victories at Memorial Gymnasium with 97. Stallings ranks second behind Roy Skinner who collected 181 wins in the storied building.
- Vanderbilt has forced its opponent into 48 turnovers in its last two games. The Commodores saw Georgia Tech turn the ball over 25 times and Nicholls State on 23 occasions. The 25 turnovers by the Yellow Jackets were the most turnovers by a Vanderbilt opponent since Alabama A&M had 28 in a 68-40 Vanderbilt victory on Nov. 24, 2002.
- Vanderbilt's 73-64 win over No. 25 Georgia Tech snapped a nine-game losing to ranked opponents. The Commodores' last win against a Top 25 team came at home against then-No. 19 Alabama, 70-56, on Jan. 5, 2005. Vanderbilt's last home win against a Top 25 non-conference opponent came against then-No. 20 Virginia, 70-65, on Dec. 6, 1994.
- Vanderbilt cruised to a 104-62 win over East Tennessee State on Dec. 5. It marked the most points scored by a Commodore team since a 113-71 victory against Alabama A&M on Dec. 30, 1998. Previously, the most points scored by Vanderbilt under head coach Kevin Stallings were 101, posted in a 101-77 win over Western Kentucky on Dec. 18, 1999 and again three months later in a 101-89 win over Georgia on March 1, 2000.
- Vanderbilt's 42-point win against ETSU marked the Commodores' largest margin of victory since the 113-71 victory against Alabama A&M on Dec. 30, 1998. Previously, the largest margin of victory under Stallings was 36 points occurring twice in victories against Georgia

Southern (96-60 on Nov. 26, 200) and Texas Pan-America (90-54 on Feb. 7, 2005).

- Three Commodores scored 20 or more points against Toledo in Vanderbilt's 98-83 overtime win on Dec. 2. Senior Derrick Byars netted a career-high 28, junior Shan Foster added 21 and junior transfer Ross Neltner posted a career-high 20. It marked the first time a trio of Commodores scored 20 or more points in a contest since the 1996 campaign. Malik Evans (29), Frank Seckar (27), and Drew Maddux (20) helped lead Vanderbilt to a 107-97 win over South Carolina in Memorial Gymnasium on Feb. 17, 1996.

- The Commodores trailed Toledo by as many as five points in overtime (92-87 with 2:27 left) before rallying for the victory. Vanderbilt scored 14 points in the extra stanza, the most points the Commodores have scored in an overtime period since posting 14 points in an 87-83 overtime home win against Arkansas on Feb. 8, 1997.

- Cage swiped six steals against Furman on Nov. 28, tying for the most by a Commodore during the Kevin Stallings era. James Strong also has six steals against UT-Martin (W, 84-67) in the second game of the Stallings era on Nov. 27, 1999.

INJURY TO SIDELINE METCALFE

Vanderbilt junior forward Alan Metcalfe will be sidelined for an estimated six weeks after suffering a fracture in his left foot during the Wake Forest game on Nov. 21.

The native of St. Helens, England broke the second metatarsal in his left foot midway through the second half of Vanderbilt's 88-78 setback in Winston Salem.

Metcalfe, who started both of the Commodores' first two games this season, was averaging 5.5 points and 3.5 rebounds.

STALLINGS EARNS CAREER WIN 250

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings earned his 250th career coaching victory when Vanderbilt defeated No. 25 Georgia Tech, 73-64 on Dec. 9. In doing so, Stallings became the sixth active coach in the SEC to achieve 250 or more career coaching wins.

For his career, Stallings owns a 250-162 (.607) overall mark in his 14th year. Stallings is 126-99 (.560) in his eighth season at Vanderbilt.

Stallings coached six seasons at Illinois State (1994-1999) where he amassed a 123-63 (.661) record before coming to Vanderbilt.

He played three seasons (1980-1982) at Purdue under Gene Keady before serving as an assistant in West Lafayette for six campaigns (1983-1988). He then worked as an assistant under Roy Williams at Kansas from 1989 to 1993.

Stallings reached the NCAA Final Four as a player at Purdue in 1980 and twice as assistant at Kansas in 1990 and 1993.

MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM TOUGH ON NON-CONFERENCE FOES

- Vanderbilt has won 88 of its last 94 home games against non-conference opponents.

- The Commodores are 68-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 135-13 non-conference record at home (.912 win percentage).

- The Commodores own an all-time record of 642-183 (.778 win percentage) in Memorial Gymnasium since the building opened for the 1952-53 campaign.

- Last season's 92-83 setback to Cincinnati on Dec. 10 snapped a 28-game home winning streak against non-SEC foes.

- VU won 40 consecutive non-conference home games from the 1996 season to the 2001 campaign.

- Vanderbilt won a school record 17 home games during

the 2004-05 season.

- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home and won 10 or more games at the site in 19 of the past 20 seasons.

NEXT GAME: ALABAMA A&M

Following Vanderbilt's trip to the San Juan Shootout and its Holiday break the Commodores return to Memorial Gymnasium to play host to Alabama A&M, Friday, Dec. 29 at 7 p.m. The matchup marks Vanderbilt's final non-conference home game of the 2006-07 season.

The Commodores are 3-0 all-time against the Bulldogs, including last season's 74-58 victory in Nashville.

COMMODORE SCHEDULE KICKS INTO HIGH GEAR

After playing an SEC-low four games during the month of November, Vanderbilt is playing nine contests (tied with LSU for most in the league) during the month of December. The Commodores played four games in eight days leading up to finals week. This week, Vanderbilt takes part in three games at the three-day San Juan Shootout.

Vanderbilt has not played as many as nine games in the month of December since the 1996-97 campaign. The school record for the most games during December is 11 (1966, 1970 and 1971).

FOSTER CLIMBING VANDY CHARTS FOR 3-POINTERS MADE & ATTEMPTED

Junior swingman Shan Foster made a career-high seven 3-pointers against ETSU to move past former Commodore Sam Howard into eighth place on the all-time list with 173. He made three 3-pointers against Nicholls State and has 180 for his career. Foster ranks ninth in career 3-pointers attempted with 431.

The Kenner, La. native led the Commodores a year ago in 3-pointers made (90) and attempted (217). His 217 attempts from beyond the arc ranked fourth in the SEC.

3-POINT STREAK NOW IN 20TH SEASON; VU ONE OF THREE TEAMS TO HIT A TREY IN EVERY GAME SINCE 1986-87 SEASON

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 639 consecutive games entering today's contest. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (640#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (558) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

★ SEASON NOTES ★

NWANKWO REMAINS A VALUED COMMODORE

College Park, Md., native Davis Nwankwo will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice last March — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbed 30 rebounds last season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and attends Commodore practices. He will be present at all home and road contests.

METCALFE SHARES GRIEF IN TOLEDO'S LOSS

Vanderbilt junior forward Alan Metcalfe shares in the grief felt by the Toledo basketball program following the tragic loss of center Haris Charalambous earlier this fall.

The 21-year old reserve center for Toledo passed away on October 9 after collapsing near the start of a morning conditioning session.

Metcalfe and Charalambous were teammates in England as members of both the "Manchester Magic" Senior League Team and the England Junior National Team from 2000-2003.

Charalambous played in 23 games and averaged 0.8 points and 0.8 rebounds in 5.4 minutes for Toledo last season.

Metcalfe is from St. Helens, England while Charalambous was a native of Manchester.

COACHES TAB FOSTER FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt junior swingman Shan Foster was named Preseason First Team All-Southeastern Conference by the league's coaches.

Foster, who earned a similar postseason award from the coaches last year, ranks as the league's third-leading returning scorer, averaging 15.9 points a year ago.

Foster finished his sophomore campaign ranked among the SEC's leaders in 3-pointers per game (second with 3.00), 3-point shooting percentage (fourth at .415), and field goal percentage (ninth at .451).

"Shan is very deserving of the award," head coach Kevin Stallings said. "For the better part of two years he has been very consistent and has proven to be one of the league's best players.

"Preseason awards are nice but postseason honors have more meaning. I wouldn't be surprised if both Shan and Derrick (Byars) were on the list at the end of the season."

Foster is shooting 42.7 percent from 3-point range for his career - fourth best in school history. The Kenner, La. native ranks ninth at Vanderbilt with 159 career 3-pointers. His 90 3-pointers made a year ago tied for third place all-time.

The coaches' preseason All-SEC first and second teams consist of a minimum eight players on each squad. No ties were broken and no predicted order of finish was made.

SEC MEDIA PICKS COMMODORES FOURTH IN EAST

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by media attending the league's annual media days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

The Commodores received 138 points to finish behind defending national champion Florida (30), Kentucky (62) and Tennessee (84). South Carolina (146) was chosen fifth while Georgia (149) ended up sixth. Florida earned 28 of 29 first-place votes to win the division and 21 votes to be crowned the overall champion.

Alabama edged LSU in voting to win the Western Division title. The Crimson Tide received 16 votes to LSU's 13 votes.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM NOW IN 55TH SEASON

Storyed Memorial Gymnasium is in its 55th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

COMMODORES INK THREE SIGNEES

The Vanderbilt men's basketball program has received written commitments from three prospects during the fall signing period.

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced Nov. 10 that center A.J. Ogilvy, guard Keegan Bell and forward Andre Walker have signed national letters of intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2007.

“This is the start of a class that would be comparable to or even better than our current junior class,” Stallings said. “We’re off to a good start and look forward to signing one or maybe two more prospects.”

Ogilvy, a 6-10, 250-pound big man from Canberra, Australia, is in his third season attending the Australian

Institute of Sports where he has developed into one of the nation's premier post players. He averaged 16.5 points, 9.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks in the 2006 Under-20 Nationals.

Ogilvy was named to the Oceania Under 19 Championship All-Star team after averaging 15 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks while competing in the 2006 qualifying series against New Zealand.

Other accolades for the Australian include representing the country at the Youth Olympics and being named the 2005 New South Wales Junior Basketball Player of the Year.

Ogilvy picked Vanderbilt over New Mexico, UNLV and St. Mary's.

“Some people have considered A.J. the best big man from Australia since Andrew Bogut,” Stallings said. “He’s a very exciting signee for us. He’s almost seven-feet tall, moves very well and has a strong physical presence inside.

“He will come to us as one of the most complete post talents we’ve recruited at Vanderbilt.”

Bell, a 6-1, 180-pound floor leader from Hazel Green, Ala. is listed among the nation's top 25 point guards by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. Bob Gibbons All-Star Report lists Bell as the 60th-best overall prospect.

Bell averaged 25 points and 11 assists as a junior at Bob Jones High School where he earned First Team All-State, All-Metro and All-Area accolades last season. He will play his senior campaign at Hazel Green High School.

Bell selected Vanderbilt over LSU and Ole Miss.

“Keegan has all the instincts you’d expect from someone who grew up in a basketball family,” Stallings said of Bell whose father, Dan, has been a successful high school coach Alabama and Division I coach in Louisiana. “Keegan is an excellent ball handler and passer who possesses exceptional shooting skills and good quickness.”

Walker is a 6-7, 210-pound forward from Flossmoor, Ill. The versatile Walker averaged 15 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists at Homewood-Flossmoor High School as a senior last season. He is currently playing a post-graduate year at Brewster Academy, a prep school in Wolfeboro, N.H.

Named one of the most complete players in Chicago by the Chicago Tribune, Walker helped lead the Vikings to the Illinois Class 2A sectionals in both his junior and senior seasons. In summer 2005, Walker was a member of a Chicago Ferrari squad that won the 17-and-under AAU National Championship.

Walker chose Vanderbilt over Arizona State, Colorado and Seton Hall.

“What sets Andre apart is his ability to shoot the basketball,” Stallings said. “He has great range and an easy release. He’s got a body similar to Derrick Byars and is a great ball handler and passer for someone his size. He had foot surgery in the summer that limited some of his recruiting, but we feel fortunate to get him. He should be a good addition to our program.”

Shan Foster scored 23 points for the Commodores (0-2), who hung around but struggled to get the defensive stops they needed to get back in the game. Fellow wingman Derrick Byars added 18 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

Most of that difficulty started with Smith, a 5-foot-11 freshman from Concord with impressive baseline-to-baseline speed. He provided the perfect floor leadership for coach Skip Prosser's up-tempo attack, repeatedly attacking the rim for easy baskets or to create opportunities for teammates. Behind Smith, the Demon Deacons shot 48 percent and finished with 17 fast-break points.
