#### Vanderbilt Opens Exhibition Season Against Tusculum

Vanderbilt plays its one and only exhibition game this Monday night against Tusculum in Memorial Gym. Tip-time is at 8 p.m. and the game will not be televised.

The Commodores return six letterwinners and three starters from its 2007 Sweet Sixteen team, including senior swing man **Shan Foster**, who was recently named to the preseason All-SEC first team by selected media members and the league's coaches. A candidate for the SEC's top performer, Foster ranks as the conference's third-leading returning scorer after pouring in 15.6 points per contest as a junior. Known for his outside shooting prowess, the Louisiana native and three-time All-SEC selection is within striking distance of becoming Vanderbilt's all-time leader in points (needs 572) and 3-pointers made (needs 64). But during his time in Nashville his resume also has grown to include the duties of clutch performer and defensive stopper.

Senior point guard **Alex Gordon** also returns for the Commodores. Gordon proved himself as a trustworthy facilitator at the point last season, finishing fourth in the conference with a 2.22-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio. A steady ball handler, Gordon committed only 51 turnovers on the season – the fewest among starting SEC point guards – and made just 12 miscues during 10 road games.

Senior 6'9 forward **Ross Neltner** is the other returning starter for Vanderbilt. Neltner provided head coach Kevin Stallings with a versatile option in the post last season – the forward's first at Vanderbilt since transferring from LSU following the 2004-05 campaign. The Kentucky native helped provide toughness and rugged play in the interior, leading all SEC newcomers with a team-high 5.7 rebounds per game. At the same time, Neltner showed Commodore followers he could connect from beyond the arc (11-of-28 attempts from 3-point range) and pass the ball to open teammates (74 assists).

Joining Foster and Gordon at the guard position will be sophomore **Jermaine Beal**, redshirt-sophomore **George Drake**, freshmen **Keegan Bell** and **Charles Hinkle**, and freshman walk-on **Elliott Cole**.

Beal, who brings good size to the Commodore backcourt, averaged 3.8 points in 16.8

#### **SEC Preseason Polls**

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Drake averaged 2.7 points and 10.3 minutes in his first season on the court. An athletic leaper and great worker, Drake hit a pair of 3-pointers early and finished with eight points against George Washington, helping ignite the Commodores to an easy 77-44 first round win at the NCAA Tournament

Bell brings good basketball instincts from Hazel Green High School in Alabama where he averaged a doubledouble with 19.3 points and 10 assists in his lone year as a Trojan.

Hinkle comes to Vanderbilt as a talented wing prospect with a strong feel for the game. He averaged 10.0 points and 5.0 rebounds as a senior for his Los Alamitos (Calif.) High School team, who won a sectional championship for the first time in school history

Cole joined the Vanderbilt squad after a stellar senior season at Memphis University School, where his team captured the Tennessee Division II state championship in 2007.

Accompanying Neltner at the forward position will be freshmen Andre Walker. Darshawn McClellan, and walkon Joe Duffy.

Walker comes to Nashville as a versatile player who possesses great shooting range. Named one of the most complete players in the Chicago area by the Chicago Tribune following his senior season of 2006, Walker averaged 15 points and 8.2 rebounds at Homewood Flossmoor High School in Illinois. He attended Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, N.H., last season where a foot injury kept him from playing most of the season.

McClellan posted a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds in his senior year at Edison High School in Fresno, Calif.

Duffy, a Charlotte, N.C. native, joins the Commodores as a walk-on after averaging 15 points and nine rebounds at Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire.

Senior Alan Metcalfe and freshman A.J. Ogilvv will roam the center position for Vanderbilt. True freshman Festus Ezeli, who signed in early August with the Commodores, will redshirt the 2007-08 season.

Metcalfe had an outstanding summer leading into the 2006-07 campaign and started the first two games of last season before a foot injury sidelined the Englishman for a good portion of the non-conference schedule. Metcalfe possesses a good scoring ability around the basket and also can hit from the perimeter. He managed 7.5 minutes a contest a year ago, averaging 2.6 points and 1.9 rebounds.

Ogilvy attended the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) for four years where he has developed into a highly regarded interior player. The big man owns a strong presence inside and recently averaged 18.3 points and 7.4 rebounds in a partial season for AIS in the South East Australian Basketball League. Ogilvy's time in the SEABL was cut short while he prepared to complete at the Under 19 World Championship in Nov Sad, Serbia in July, where he averaged 22.3 points and 9.8 rebounds in nine games for Australia.

#### Scouting Tusculum

Tusculum ended the 2006-07 season with a 13-15 record and finished 6-10 in the South Atlantic Conference.

Tusculum coach Jim Boone, former coach at Eastern Michigan, is in his third season with the Pioneers and has posted a 27-30 record.

#### Vanderbilt's Next Opponent: **Austin Peay**

Vanderbilt opens its regular season on Saturday, November 10th, at 8 p.m. against preseason Ohio Valley Conference favorite Austin Peay at Memorial Gym. The game will be televised by Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast.

#### How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In **Last Four Years**

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, has now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

#### Vanderbilt Posts 15th 20-win Season in school History

Vanderbilt recorded the 15th 20-win season in school history with a 99-90 overtime win at South Carolina on Feb. 28. It marked the third 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted to more 20-win seasons



#### Commodores Among Nation's Best Versus Ranked Opponents In 2006-

Vanderbilt's six wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation during the regular season in 2006-07. Vanderbilt won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams in 2006-07 -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before losing at top-ranked Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000

## STALLINGS' SUCCESSES IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL (AS A PLAYER, ASSISTANT AND HEAD COACH)

- In 30 seasons as a player and coach, his teams have made 24 tournament appearances, including 14 NCAA berths and three Final Fours.
- He has posted 20-win seasons 20 times and has won 12 conference championships.
- Stallings has posted just one losing season in 28 seasons as a player and coach.
- Stallings ranks third among the winningest coaches in Vanderbilt history with 144 victories.
- Stallings is the first Vanderbilt coach to lead two Commodore squads to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 since the field expanded to as many as 64 teams in 1985.
- Stallings is only the second coach in Vanderbilt history to register three 20-win seasons (Roy Skinner six).
- All 18 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree.

#### 3-Point Streak Concludes 20th Season; VU one of three teams to hit a trey in every game since 1986-87 season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 664 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (667#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (576) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

#### Foster Joins 1,000-Point Club

Shan Foster joined the 1,000-point club with a bang, with 29 points in Vanderbilt's 74-69 win at Rice on Jan. 2. Foster netted 26 of his 29 points in the first half, an output that nearly surpassed Rice's point total for the half of 27. For the game, Foster shot 11-of-17 from the field, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range.

The junior from Kenner, La. joined the 1,000-point club in his 78th game as Commodore, tying Perry Wallace for 17th among the fastest players to join the elite club.

Among Commodores who played during or since the adoption of the 3-point line (1986-87), Foster is the second fastest Commodore to reach 1,000 points, behind only Billy McCaffrey. The Duke transfer joined the club after only 50 games as a Commodore.

#### Historic Memorial Gymnasium Begins 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to

more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter next season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently. Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 650-184 (.779) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.
- · Vanderbilt has won 89 of its last 95 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 136-13 non-conference record at home (.913 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 69-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home

#### **Nwankwo Remains A Valued** Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md. and high school teammate of Georgetown's Roy Hibbert, will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 - concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbed 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.
