OWLS COMPLETE TENNESSEE TOUR

The Rice Owls, coming off a remarkable 42-35 win at Memphis last Saturday, wrap up a twogame road swing in the state of Tennessee, facing Southeastern Conference unbeaten Vanderbilt.

This is Rice's first appearance in Nashville, having played the previous three games of the series with the Commodores in Houston. This will also be the Owls' first game against a team from the Southeastern Conference since they dropped a 52-7 decision at LSU in 1995. Saturday's game will be played one week shy of the 33rd anniversary of the last game between the two schools (September 20, 1975).

NEELY BOWL

Saturday's game matches two college programs closely associated with Hall of Fame coach Jess Neely.

Neely played at Vanderbilt from 1920-22 where he was one of three teammates who went on to earn berths in the College Football Hall of Fame as coaches (Red Sanders and Wallace Wade). Neely came to Rice as head coach in 1940 and became the most successful football coach in school history, posting a 144-124-10 mark and leading the Owls to seven bowl berths.

He left Rice after the 1966 season to return to Vanderbilt to become Athletic Director, where he remained until he retired in 1971. Rice will be looking for its first 3-0 start in school history since 1953, when Neely led them to a 9-2 mark, a share of the Southwest Conference title and a Cotton Bowl win over Alabama.

LAST WEEK

Chris Jammer's 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 11 seconds left capped a furious fourth-quarter rally as Rice defeated Memphis 42-35 at the Liberty Bowl.

The Owls scored the final 22 points of the game, including 15 in the final 1:15, to start a season 2-0 for the first time since 2004. It was the Owls' 11th Conference USA win since 2006, and the ninth in which the outcome was decided in the game's final moments.

Chase Clement broke the Rice career passing record, completing 26 of 44 passes for 318 yards and a touchdown. He ran his career total to 6,242, surpassing Tommy Kramer's mark of 6,197 with a 47-yard completion to James Casey on the Owls' game-tying drive in the last two minutes.

David Bailiff entered his second season at Rice with a welcomed sense of familiarity surrounding the football program.

One year ago, Bailiff and his staff were faced with familiarizing themselves with the personnel on the field as well as simultaneously gaining the trust of athletes who were under their third set of coaches in as many seasons. Their introduction period in the Spring of 2007 was further impeded by a roster that had been depleted by injuries, slowing the learning and evaluation process as players were plugged into positions of need to complete drills, rather than ones of potential.

His initial campaign at Rice saw the Owls reach dizzying offensive heights and shred whole chapters of the record book. Quarterback Chase Clement shattered all the Owls' total offense marks, thanks in large part to the efforts of receivers Jarett Dillard and James Casey. Dillard continued his march up the NCAA career charts and enters 2008 as the active career leader in receptions, yardage and touchdown catches. Casey, who out of necessity was used as a defensive end during Bailiff's first set of spring drills, became a man for all positions in 2007, especially at the Y receiver, and went on to earn freshman All-America honors.

But the offensive production was negated by a merciless parade of injuries to key defenders and Bailiff's first campaign on South Main closed at 3-9.

While the injuries robbed the Owls of experience on defense, it also presented opportunity to a large chunk of Bailiff's first Rice recruiting class, and the results they produced on the field gave Owls fans a glimpse of the type of future student-athletes that Bailiff and staff are intent on bringing into the program.

True freshmen defensive ends Scott Solomon and Cheta Ozougwu became stalwarts and earned postseason accolades, as did freshman offensive tackle Scott Mitchell. All told, the Owls played 15 true freshman in 2007.

After a healthy and productive set of spring

drills this year, Bailiff comes into the fall with a team that has jelled and is poised to compete for the conference title.

Bailiff, 49, came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference championship and the semifinals of the NCAA Division 1-AA playoffs in 2005. During Bailiff's three-year tenure, Texas State was 10-6 in SLC games.

In his last two seasons at Texas State, Bailiff produced standouts both on the field and in the classroom. He produced both the Southland Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in 2005 (Barrick Nealy and Fred Evans) and the league's Student Athlete of the Year for football in 2006 (Walter Musgrove). Overall, he produced a total of 14 All-Southland Conference first-team selections, and 13 players who were named to the academic all-conference squad in his last two years.

While his own background has been as a defensive coach, Bailiff's squads have led the league in total offense in each of the last two seasons.

Faced with a rebuilding season after his 2005 Southland title, Bailiff's 2006 Bobcats closed with a rush, winning four of their last six and wrapping up with a 28-21 win at Sam Houston State. That victory knocked the Bearkats out of contention for the league title and gave the Bobcats their first win in Huntsville since 2000.

The 2005 season was truly a magical one. The Bobcats went 9-2 during the regular season with their lone losses coming on the road at Division I-A Texas A&M as well as at Nicholls State, the 2005 SLC co-champion.

Bailiff was named the American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 Coach of the Year and finished third in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA.

Bailiff's coaching career began at Texas State, his alma mater, and included stops at New Mexico and TCU.



MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

All requests for working credentials at Rice stadium should be made in writing to Chuck Pool at least two weeks in advance of the game to be covered. All requests should come from sports editors or directors and will be fully screened to ensure good working conditions.

GAME DAY AT RICE STADIUM

The three-level press box is located atop the west stands of Rice Stadium. Admission to the press box elevator, located on the north end of the main west stadium concourse, will be by media pass only.

Level one houses VIP seating and nine booths: 1 - Public Address; 2 - Scoreboard/Message Board; 3 - Rice Coaches; 4 - Rice Coaching Highligh Video; 5 - Television (game telecasts only) 6 - Replay; 7 - Rice Radio; 8 - Visiting Coaches; 9 - Visiting Radio

Level two is the main working press area. The press food service area is also on level two. Level three is the photo deck with space for all other video cameras covering the game.

SIDELINES AT RICE STADIUM

Rice University follows NCAA and C-USA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not permitted inside the team areas (between the 20-yard lines) and must wear a photo armband at all times. Armbands are available in the press box prior to the game only. There is no media access from the sidelines to the south tunnel.

PARKING AT RICE STADIUM

Parking at Rice Stadium is free and there is not a designated lot for members of the media. Members of the media are encouraged to use the East Lot of Rice Stadium and enter the stadium through Gate Four.

DURING THE WEEK INTERVIEW OPPORTUNITIES WITH COACH

Rice head coach David Bailiff is very accessible to the media and will answer telephone calls at the earliest opportunity. The best time to reach coach Bailiff other than during his weekly news

conference is from 12:30 to 1:00 Tuesday through Thursday each week. Please call Rice Football contact Chuck Pool (713) 348-5775 to set up an interview. There are two regularly scheduled media availabilities for Coach Bailiff:

Monday C-USA Conference Call

The 12 Conference USA coaches will be available on a Monday teleconference throughout the season. David Bailiff will be on the call at 1:40 p.m. each week. Call the C-USA office or Rice athletic news bureau for the schedule and telephone number.

Weekly Media Conference

Bailiff will meet with the media every Monday of game weeks during the season. Bailiff will be available following a light lunch which will be served at noon in the Owls Club. The media may interview requested players, subject to class schedules, at 12:30 p.m..

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the athletic news bureau. Players' home telephone numbers will not be released and no interviews will be allowed following the Thursday practice through game time during game weeks. The Rice locker room, weight room, equipment room and training room areas are considered private team areas. These areas are off-limits to media representatives unless accompanied by athletic news bureau personnel.

PRACTICE

The media is welcome at Rice practice sessions, but advance notice to the athletic news bureau of attendance at a practice session will be appreciated.

Access to the stadium will be through the tunnel in the South End Zone. No player interviews will be allowed during practice. A member of the athletic news bureau will be present at all sessions. The bureau will also file a practice report following the Tuesday and Wednesday sessions

CONFERENCE USA TELECONFERENCE

Conference USA coaches are featured on a weekly teleconference from 1-2:30 p.m. (Central Time) during the 2008 football season. The call is held on Mondays during the season. Media representatives wishing to participate on the teleconference should contact the conference office to obtain the access phone number. Clement completed 13 of 14 passes for 176 yards in the final quarter. He also rushed for 47 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a nine-yard scamper with 1:15 left. He then hit Casey with the two-point conversion to tie the game at 35-35.

Casey set a school record with 208 yards in receiving, while matching his career-high with 11 receptions. Jarett Dillard added eight catches for 66 yards and his five-yard scoring pass from Clement in the third quarter allowed him to set Rice career marks for touchdowns (44) and points (264).

ON THE ROAD

After going winless in its initial season in C-USA on the road, Rice has posted a 6-3 record in conference road action the past three years and has won six of the last eight C-USA games away from Rice Stadium.

Rice was 0-2 on the road outside the conference last year and the Owls last non-conference road win came at Army in 2006. This week's game with Vanderbilt is the second of three consecutive games on the road for the Owls, who will play at Texas next Saturday before returning home to play host North Texas on Sept. 27.

ON THE TUBE

The Memphis game was the second of three national-television appearances for the Owls this season. The SMU game was broadcast nationally on ESPN, and the Owls will be back on CBS College for their road game at Tulsa. In addition to the previously announced national coverage, the Owls home game with North Texas will be televised back to Dallas on station TXA 21, while a final determination on television plans as well as the kickoff time for the Owls' game at Texas have not been finalized.

FOLLOW ALONG

All Rice football games this season will be broadcast on ESPN 97.5 The Ticket. David Saltzman moves into the play-by-play chair this season and he is joined in the booth by Nate Griffin. Matt McCabe, who Rice fans will recognize as the voice of the Owls baseball team the past several seasons, takes over sideline duties this season.

VS. C-USA

This season is the Owls' fourth season as a member of Conference USA. Rice is 12-14 all-time in the conference (11-7 since 2006), and that mark is split evenly between home and road.

THREE TO START

The last time Rice opened a season 3-0 was 1953 when the Owls opened the year by defeating Florida 20-16, Cornell 28-7 and Hardin-Simmons 40-0. That team went on to finish the season 9-2, tie for the Southwest Conference title and play Alabama in the Cotton Bowl.

RICE STADIUM, YEAR 59

This season marks the 59th year that the Owls have played football at Rice Stadium, which opened its gates for the first time when Rice hosted Santa Clara on September 30, 1950. The Owls defeated the defending Orange Bowl champions 27-7. The Owls have an all-time mark of 143-171-

7 at Rice Stadium.

One of the few existing on-campus facilities to host a Super Bowl, the historic stadium debuted a new FieldTurf Duraspine system this year. It is the same playing surface used at the home stadiums of the New England Patriots, Ohio State Buckeyes and West Virginia Mountaineers among others.

COACHES TAB FOUR

Conference USA coaches selected more Rice position players than any other school in the conference for their pre-season All-Conference team that was announced in July. Jarett Dillard and Chase Clement were both picked on offense, while Brian Raines and Andrew Sendejo were named on defense.

IN THE CLASSROOM

In March 2008, eight of Rice's 16 teams received the NCAA Public Recognition Award for having an Academic Progress Rate (APR) in the top 10 percent for their sport. This is the second-highest percentage for any school in the Bowl Subdivision in football. (The APR is a term-by-term measure of eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes).

HONOR ROLL

In their third year in Conference USA (2006-07), 172 Owls were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll with a 3.0 cumulative GPA, representing more than half of Rice's total number of student-athletes.

MEDALIST

James Casey was one of 24 Rice student-athletes who were awarded the C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal last spring. This honor is presented to student-athletes in the conference who have maintained an GPA of 3.75 or better.

THE GRADUATE

Jarett Dillard is playing his final season of college football with degree in hand. The political science major received his diploma in graduation ceremonies last May.

COLLEGE PRIDE

In 2007, RIce head coach David Bailiff began the tradition of each Rice player wearing the logo of his residental college on the back of his helmet to help promote the relationship between the team and the members of the Rice student body. Once again in 2008, Rice players will sport their college logos on their helmets.



NICE TO HAVE YOU BACK

When Joel Armstrong hauled in a scoring pass from Chase Clement in the final moments of the Owls' loss to Tulsa to close out the 2007 season, it marked the only six of the school-record 377 points that Rice scored in 2007 that were not returning for the 2008 season. Rice returned its top five rushers, eight of the nine receivers who caught at least 10 passes last year and its top five tacklers.

30 OR BETTER

Rice is tied with Texas and Texas Tech as the national leaders having scored 30 or more points in six consecutive games. Rice set a school record for points last season with 377 (31.4) and ranks seventh in the nation after the first two weeks with an average of 49.0 so far this year.

ALSO IN THE NCAA STATS

Rice is tied for fourth after two games, averaging just 2.5 penalties per game. On the offensive side of the ball, the Owls are tied for sixth with a 57.1 conversion rate on third downs, tied for eighth with 27 first downs per game.

Defensively, Rice is tied for second with 2.0 interceptions per game, tied for sixth in turnovers (7) and 28th in rushing defense (80.5). Individually, Chase Clement is second in the country in points responsible for (29 per game), sixth in total offense (371.5), 13th in passing (25 completions per game), 14th in passing yards (576) and 15th in passing yards per game (288). James Casey is sixth in both receptions per game (8.5) and receiving yards per game (130.5). Jarett Dillard is tied for 12th in scoring (12 per game). Brandon King is tied for fifth with his two interceptions.

DILLARD/CLEMENT AIM FOR DUO MARK

Two of the players responsible for the bulk of the returning offense for the Owls, Jarett Dillard and Chase Clement, moved to within three touchdown passes of tying the NCAA career record for a passing duo. The pair from San Antonio, who originally came to Rice to play in an option offense, has combined for 36 touchdown passes. Tim Rattay and Troy Edwards of Louisiana Tech completed 39 scoring passes in a career that ended in 1998. while Colt Brennan and Davone Bess of Hawaii matched that total last season.

DILLARD LOOKS PAST 40

Jarett Dillard caught his fourth touchdown pass of the year at Memphis, after tying his school record by catching three TD passes against SMU (the sixth time he has caught three in a game). He now has 44 career touchdown catches, which ranks third on the NCAA career list. He needs three to tie Darius Watts of Marshall for second and six to match Troy Edwards for the NCAA career mark.

Dillard has reached 44 career touchdowns in just 220 receptions, which is more than 50 receptions fewer than any of the other receivers who are ranked among the top three in career touchdown receptions. Darius Watts (47) caught 272 and Edwards caught 280.

DOWN TO THE WIRE IS THE NORM

In the past three years of C-USA action, the Owls are 11-7, winning four times on their last offensive play of the game (UAB, Tulsa and ECU in 2006 and SMU in 2007), once on a interception return with 11 seconds remaining and once by eating up the final 7:30 of the clock to preserve a seven-point lead. In two other games, they took the lead for good in the final 4:00 (SMU in 2006 and UTEP in 2007) and needed a fumble recovery with 1:08 left to seal the win at Southern Miss last year.

CHASE IN THE FOURTH

Chase Clement has been at his best in the fourth quarters of C-USA games the last two years. In 10 conference games, he has completed 64% of his passes in the final frame (97-of-152) for 1,113 yards and 10 touchdowns. Clement has also rushed for 150 yards on 23 carries (6.5 yards per carry) and scored three times. He was been responsible for 15 of the 17 Owls' TDs in fourth quarter conference action since 2007.

TEAM STREAKS

Rice has not been shutout in a game since a 37-0 loss at TCU in 2000, a span of 88 games.

Rice has not shut out an opponent since blanking UNLV 38-0 to open the 1995 season (150 games).

INDIVIDUAL STREAKS

Jarett Dillard has caught at least two passes in each game of his career (38 games), the longest streak of its kind in the country.

Chase Clement has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 12 consecutive games overall and in 18 consecutive C-USA games.

Toren Dixon has caught a pass in 15 consecutive games.

James Casey has caught a pass in 11 straight games and at least five passes in eight straight contests.

Brandon King has defended at least one (breakup or interception) in 10 straight games.

ON THE RUN

Through two games, the Owls are averaging 4.5 yards per carry on the ground (71 carries for 320 yards), which is a one yard better than they averaged in 2007. Rice rushed for 208 yards on 44 attempts against SMU, its most productive effort on the ground since they ran for 238 yards on 48 carries at UTEP in 2006. Chase Clement leads the Owls with 167 yards rushing, followed by C.J. Ugokwe (65) and James Casey (57).

VS. VANDERBILT

This is the fourth meeting between the two schools and the first to be played in Nashville. Vanderbilt holds a 2-1 lead in the all-time series, winning 13-12 at old Rice Stadium in 1939, and spitting a pair of games at Rice Stadium. The Owls' lone win against the Commodores came on October 10, 1954 when Dickey Maegle rushed for 87 yards and scored three touchdowns in a 34-13 win in front of 28,000 fans on Homecoming Day.

PUTTING A STOP TO THINGS

Through two games this year, Rice has held opponents to an average of 3.2 yards per carry,

compared with a final average of 4.8 yards last season. Rice's defense held SMU was to 11 yards rushing on 14 carries in the opener, the lowest total against the Owls since they held June Jones' Hawaii team to just seven yards on 13 carries in 2004. Their 14 carries are the third fewest by an opponent in school history. The Owls held SMU to 337 yards of total offense, their lowest total since they allowed 281 yards to Nicholls State, and the lowest against a C-USA opponent since they held SMU to 277 yards in 2006.

The 27 points given up by the Owls were their fewest since allowing 16 to Nicholls State last year, and their fewest against a C-USA opponent since they held SMU to 27 in 2006.

Rice's defense created five turnovers, their most since they had five against Houston last season. Four of those five turnovers resulted in touchdowns.

SIX PACK

Chase Clement tied his conference and school record by tossing six touchdown passes against SMU. He is the first C-USA quarterback to throw six in more than one game. To put the effort in a different perspective, in the 10 years prior to Clement's redshirt freshman season (1995-2004) the Owls did not throw more than six touchdown passes in a season eight times.

TWO MORE RECORDS

With his touchdown catch against Memphis on Saturday, Jarett Dillard added two more Rice career records to his resume. He moved past 1992 Doak Walker Award winner Trevor Cobb for the school record with 44 career touchdowns, and his 264 points. Cobb scored 43 touchdowns and scored 260 points from 1989-1992.

THE CENTURY MARK

Prior to the 2006 season, only six players in Rice football history had topped 100 career pass receptions, but the Owls could have as many as four players on that list by the end of this season.

LAST MEETING • VANDERBILT 9, RICE 6 • SEPT. 20, 1975 • RICE STADIUM

Mark Adams of Vanderbilt kicked a 25-yard field goal with 32 seconds left to give the Commodores a 9-6 win over Rice in Houston.

Both teams entered the game unbeaten after winning their season-openers, but Vanderbilt held Rice's Tommy Kramer out of the end zone to run its record to 2-0.

Adams had given Vanderbilt a 6-0 at halftime on a pair of second quarter field goals, but Rice rallied to tie the game on a pair of three-pointers by freshman Alvaro Arenas.

Jarett Dillard, who holds the career mark with 220 catches, leads the way. Senior Tommy Henderson is second on the squad with 90 career catches, followed by sophomore James Casey (63) and junior Toren Dixon (54).

CHANGING TIMES

Jarett Dillard has 220 receptions in his career at Rice. In the three years prior to his arrival, the Owls completed a total of 187 passes. He has 44 touchdown receptions over that period, in the seven seasons prior to 2005, the Owls threw a total of 48 touchdown passes.

STANDING ALONE

Chase Clement shattered most of the Rice offensive records in 2007, and has continued that onslaught in the first two games of 2008. With 318 yards passing against Memphis, he moved past Tommy Kramer as the Owls' career passing yardage leader with 6,242. He needs just five completions to move past Randy Hertel (1977-80) for the top mark in school history (561) and needs 22 attempts to be the third Owl to top 1,000 career attempts and 188 to break Hertel's mark of 1,121.

VETERAN LEADERSHIP

Jarett Dillard, Chase Clement and Brian Raines may be the only seniors in the country who come into their last season having been honored by teammates who voted them team captains after both their sophomore and junior years. Junior Andrew Sendejo was also voted as a team captain at the end of the 2007 season. Game captains are appointed each week and the final determination of team captains is made in a vote by the team at the end of the season.

CASEY IN CONFERENCE

Over his last seven games (all against C-USA opponents) James Casey has averaged 113 all-purpose yards (794 total) and has topped 100 yards receiving four times. He has caught 62 of his 63 career passes during C-USA play. After catching two against Southern Miss and four against Houston, Casey has not caught fewer than five passes in his last eight conference games, and has topped double-figures in catches twice in the last three (11 vs. Tulsa in 2007 and Memphis this year).

BREAKING THE ICE

James Casey has scored Rice's first touchdown

in each of the last two years. In 2007, he opened the Owls' march to a school record 377 points with a two-yard run vs. Nicholls State. In the 2008 opener against SMU, he caught a seven-yard scoring pass from Chase Clement for the first points of the season.

MAKING THE TURNOVERS COUNT

Rice continued its recent trend of converting turnovers into points, scoring 30 points off seven turnovers this year. Last season, the Owls scored 96 points in eight C-USA games off a total of 20 turnovers.

Over the past three seasons, the Owls created 62 turnovers, which matches East Carolina for the most by a conference school since 2006, followed by Southern Miss (61).

KNOWING THE GUY NEXT TO YOU

Due to a rash of injuries on the defensive side of the ball, the Owls used a total of 10 different starting lineups on defense in 2007, and did not start the same unit in consecutive games until the 11th game of the season. The Owls had four true freshmen make a total of 24 starts on defense last

RAINES TAKES AIM

Senior linebacker Brain Raines, who was added to the watch list for the Rotary Lombardi Award last week, has 233 career tackles heading into his senior season. He needs 46 stops to move into the Owls career top ten (Emmett Waldron and Andray Downs are currently tied for ninth with 278) and 67 to become the seventh Owl to top 300 career tackles. Fellow Willowridge HS product O.J. Brigance holds the Owls career record with 367 from 1987-90.

SENDEJO FOR THE DEFENSE

Andrew Sendejo was forced to make the jump from KAT to free safety after the first game in 2007 after Bencil Smith was injured and he responded by leading the team in tackles (107) and picking off five passes, the most by an Owl since 2000. Over the past two years, he has been a part of 12 of the Owls 32 turnovers (six interceptions, three forced fumbles, two fumble recovery, one pass deflection that was intercepted). He leads the team with 17 tackles in the first two games this year, including 13 against Memphis for his fifth career game in double figures.

PICKING UP THE PACE

Brandon King has eight career interceptions heading into his senior year, and all of them have come against C-USA opponents. King intercepted one pass as a freshman, two as a sophomore, three last year and two in the opener against SMU. His twin picks against the Mustangs moved him into a four-way tie for ninth on the Rice career chart, joining Larry Brune (1974-75), William McClay (1985-88) and Jeff Sowells ((1992-95). Michael Downs and Brian Patterson are tied for seventh with nine, while Jason Hebert is sixth with 10.

GETTING THEIR PICKS

Brandon King (8) Andrew Sendejo (6), Ja'Corey Shepherd (5), Bencil Smith and Chris Jammer (1) have a combined 21 interceptions between them in the Owls' defensive backfield. Linebacker Terrance Garmon is fourth among current Owls with three career interceptions.

FANGMEIER HEADS UP THE CHARTS

Junior Clark Fangmeier moved into the Rice career scoring chart with 10 points against Memphis, matching his career best set last year vs. Houston. He now has 144 career points, which ties him for seventh with Mark Williams and Chad

Nelson. Fangmeier kicked his first two field goals of the year, to tie his single-game high. Fangmeier, who set a school record last year with 46 PATs, moved into second on the Owls' career list while tying his school record with eight conversions against SMU. Fangmeier now has 94 conversions in 95 career attempts, 25 shy of Brennan Landry's (2002-05) school mark of 118. The last three kickers for Rice hold the top three spots on the career PAT chart. Fangmeier hit on his first 68 PAT attempts, the longest streak by an Owl to start his career, before he missed one last season against SMU.

CANADIAN CONNECTION

Four members of the 2008 Owls are products of the Canadian high school football circuit. Sophomore Scott Mitchell joined the program last year and became the starter at left tackle for the final five games, earning C-USA All Freshman honors. He was joined by offensive lineman Stefan Nazar in January when Nazar enrolled early as part of the 2008 recruiting class. That class also included tight end Luke Willson when it was first announced. Defensive end Arnaud Gascon-Nadon was signed in June and is now listed as an alternate on the Owls depth chart.

FOR THE FIRST TIME

Five Owls made their first career starts against SMU, while a total of 15 made their college debuts.

Offensive tackle Tyler Parish made his first start in his first college game, and was joined as a first-time starter by guard Charlie Wiebusch, wide receiver Patrick Randolph, nose guard Chris Ptaszek and defensive tackle Chance Talbert (who was making his first start on defense).

Of the 15 players making their debuts, seven were redshirt freshmen (Parish, Brent Hotard, Travis Bradshaw, Tanner Shuck, Jake Hicks, Davon Primus and Brandon Yelovich) and eight were true freshmen (Jarrett Ben, Xavier Webb, Shane Turner, David Falgout, Chris Jammer, Kyle Martens, Arnaud Gascon-Nadon, and Michael Smith). Falgout is a true freshman walkon from Beaumont, while the other seven were members of the Owls 2008 recruiting class.

GAMERS

Jarett Dillard has played in all 38 games over the past three seasons, the most of any member of the '08 Owls. He is followed by David Berken, Vernon James and Brian Raines (37), Ja'Corey Shepherd (36), Brandon King (35), Tommy Henderson (34), Chase Clement and Austin Wilkinson (33).

WALKONS INCREASE

Rice kicker Clark Fangmeier is one of five walkons who saw action against SMU in the season opener. Fangmeier and Ryan Craig are both returning lettermen. Redshirt freshmen Brandon Yelovich and Travis Bradshaw made their college debuts on Friday, as did true freshman David Falgout. The Owls have a total of 11 walkons on this year's roster.

PUTTING IN THE WORK

Brian Raines led a group of 27 Owls who were honored for their work in the summer conditioning program at the start of preseason camp. For the second consecutive year, Raines earned the title of "Elite Owl" after topping the charts in final testing.

Rice Assistant AD for Performance Enhancement, Yancy McKnight, ranks the players using a Power Index that uses each player's totals in three lifts (power clean, back squat and bench press). Any player who scores an index of 620 or better is named an All American, those who score from 570-619 are designated as All Conference.

Raines was one of four players to top 700 in the index, joining running back C.J. Ugokwe and defensive tackle Chris Ptaszek.

IN THE NFL

Three Rice products were on rosters as the NFL heads into the opening week of the 2008 season, while a fourth was placed on injured reserve and a fifth is on a practice squad in the CFL.

Heading the list is linebacker Larry Izzo, who is heading into his 13th season and has played in 144 games, including four Super Bowls with the New England Patriots.

Defensive end N.D. Kalu is heading into his 12th season and his third as a member of the Houston Texans. He is the first Rice product to play professionally in Houston since Vince Courville played for the USFL's Gamblers in 1985. Prior to Courville, the last had been Randy Kerbow, who was a wide receiver for the Oilers in 1963-64.

Deep snapper Ryan Pontbriand is heading into his sixh season with the Cleveland Browns, and was selected to the Pro Bowl last year.

hase Clement and Jarett Dillard picked up right where they left off while Rice's defense created five turnovers

to lead the Owls to a 56-27 win over SMU at Rice Stadium in front of 23, 146 on Friday night.

The win was the Owls' third straight overall against the Mustangs and their 10th straight over SMU at Rice Stadium. The 56 points for the Owls were the second-most they have scored to open a season. They defeated Galveston Army-Air Force 57-0 and the last time they topped 50 points in an opener was in 1969 when they beat VMI, 55-0.

Rice won its opener for the first time since 2004, when the Owls defeated Houston 10-7, twice exploding for 28 unanswered points to put a damper on SMU coach June Jone's debut with the Mustangs.

Clement tied his school record by tossing six touchdown passes, including three to Dillard to match his own school mark, including four in the first half after Rice had spotted the Mustangs an early 13-0 lead. Clement and Dillard's three TD connections raised their career combined total to 35, just three shy of the NCAA record for a passing duo.

Dillard's three touchdown receptions vaulted him into a tie for third on the NCAA career list with Aaron Turner of Pacific. Troy Edwards of Louisiana Tech holds the record with 50, while Darius Watts of Marshall is second with 47.

SMU opened the scoring, taking advantage of a fumbled punt by Bran-

don King and then upped the lead to 13-0 before Clement capped the first of four consecutive scoring drives by the Owls when he hit James Casey on a seven-yard pass for a score. After Mustang freshman quarterback Bo Levi Mitchell fumbled moments later, Clement wasted no time, hitting Patrick Randolph for a 35-yard scoring strike on the first play.

Clement and Dillard then hooked up for the first of three scores, a 21-yard strike that extended the lead to 21-13. Clement found Corbin Smiter for a 12-yard score with just over four minutes left to cap the Owls' first 28-point burst.

SMU closed the gap to 28-20 thanks to a second kick return miscue by the Owls, but Clement led the Owls back down the field and found Dillard for a nine-yard score to answer the Mustang tally.

Brandon King and Andrew Sendejo provided the spark for the Owls' final 21 points of the night. King picked off a Mitchell pass and returned it a career-best 54 yards to the SMU one, setting up a short plunge by Casey. Sendejo then did King one better, picking off a Mitchell pass and returning it 55-yards for a score. It was the second straight year that Sendejo has returned a pass for a touchdown against SMU

Sendejo had one more chance to run with the ball, scooping up a ball stripped by safety Max Anyiam and returning it 34 yards to set Clement and Dillard up for a nine-yard score to close out the Rice scoring.

he Rice football team exploded for 22 points in the final 6:28 capped by a Chris Jammer 69-yard interception return to snatch a thrilling 42-35 comeback victory over Memphis Saturday night in a Conference USA contest at the

"It's been a trademark of these seniors that they don't quit, and they don't ever believe they can't win," head coach David Bailiff said. "This was one of those games that we just kept plugging away for four quarters, and really not a win right

quarters and really got a win right there at the very end."

Down 35-20 after Maurice Jones hauled in a 39-yard touchdown from Arkelon Hall at the 8:33 mark in the fourth quarter, Rice (2-0, 2-0 C-USA) fired right back with a six-play, 69-yard drive keyed by a James Casey 41-yard reception.

On the next play, Chase Clement found Jarett Dillard for a 5-yard scoring strike to trim the deficit to 35-27 with 6:22 on the clock. The touchdown allowed Dillard to surpass Trevor Cobb as Rice's all-time leader in total points and touchdowns.

The Rice defense stepped up with a critical stop on the next Memphis (0-2, 0-1 C-USA) series. A Brent Sutherland 56-yard punt pinned the Owls at their own six-yard line with 2:58 left.

Clement went to work and hooked up with Casey for 47 yards moving the Owls into Tiger territory. Casey finished with 11 receptions for 208 yards, both career highs. Casey's 208 receiving yards set a school re-

cord previously held by David Houser's 196-yard effort at Florida during the 1976 season.

After two more completions, Clement scampered 9-yards into the endzone inside the left pilon to draw Rice within 35-33 with 1:15 to go.

On the two-point conversion attempt, Clement lobbed a pass towards the middle of the endzone into the arms of Casey to even the score at 35-35. With 318 passing yards, Clement moved past Tommy Kramer for the top spot on Rice's career passing list. The Alamo Heights product now has 6,242 career passing yards.

Memphis took four plays on its ensuing drive to get down to the Rice 38-yard line. On third-and-one, Hall's slant pass was intercepted by Jammer, who broke a tackle and sprinted 69-yards to paydirt with 11 seconds left giving the Owls its fifth conference win over the last three seasons on seemingly the last play of the game.

"All this (win) means is we're 2-0 in conference play. There's 10 guaranteed opportunities left," Bailiff said. "We're going to go home, put this behind us and get ready for Vanderbilt next Saturday."
