What's On Tap

For the second straight weekend Vanderbilt will hit the road against a Top 10 opponent, this time against No. 1 South Carolina in Columbia. The series starts on Friday at 6 p.m. and will continue on Saturday at 3 p.m. and on Sunday at 12:30 p.m. (All Times Central). Fox Sports Net will broadcast Saturday's game regionally.

Scouting South Carolina

South Carolina is 22-4 overall and 4-2 in SEC play after taking two of three from Mississippi State over the weekend. The Gamecocks took care of Elon by a 10-6 count in midweek action on Tuesday.

Catcher Trent Kline leads the squad with a .392 batting average to go with four homers and 24 RBI, while first baseman Justin Smoak is the top power source with nine homers and 26 RBI. The Gamecocks are hitting .319 as a team with 44 homers and 231 runs scored in 25 games (9.2 runs per game).

SC will use an all righthanded rotation this weekend. Harris Honeycutt (6-0, 1.42 ERA) will take the hill on Friday, Mike Cisco (2-1, 3.51 ERA) on Saturday and Blake Cooper (3-0, 1.00 ERA) on Sunday.

Wynn Pelzer is the team's relief ace with a 1.11 ERA and a save with 26 strikeouts and four walks in 11 appearances. As a team, South Carolina leads the SEC with a 2.54 ERA and 263 strikeouts in 237.2 innings pitched.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt lost its first series of the year on the road against Top 10 Arkansas last week ... The Commodores lost their first one-run game of the season on Friday 8-7 in 10 innings. They were 8-0 in one-run games prior ... Vanderbilt has come from behind in 14 of the 24 wins this year ... VU rapped out a season high 22 hits in the win over Middle Tennessee on Wednesday ... 91 of Vanderbilt's 191 RBI this season have come with two outs ... Dominic de la Osa went 7-for-17 (.412) with a homer and three RBI in four games last week. Three of his hits came in Sunday's finale against Arkansas ... Ryan Davis went 4-for-7 (.571) with a double and four RBI in three games, including a start against Western Kentucky ... Ryan Flaherty has a six game hitting streak going into the week with Brad French carrying a five game one ... Vanderbilt hit .299 as a team with three homers and 31 runs scored last week ... Jason Cunningham, a team manager a year ago, made his first two career relief appearances last week and did not allow a run in 2.1 innings pitched. He got an out to close out the Western Kentucky game, then threw two innings of three hit relief against Arkansas on Sunday ... Cameron Betourne made his first appearance of the year against WKU and threw a scoreless inning as did Josh Zeid in his second appearance of 2007 ... Mike Minor struck out nine in five innings of relief work in two appearances on the week. He picked up his first SEC save against Arkansas on Saturday, allowing one run on one hit in 1.2 innings of action ... Nick Christiani picked up his first career SEC win in his second conference start on Saturday. He made nine relief appearances last season as a freshman and lost in his first start last week against Ole Miss. He gave up two runs on five hits in 7.1 innings with three strikeouts and five walks in the 6-3 win over the Razorbacks on Saturday. The pitching staff had a 5.05 ERA in four games on the week 31 strikeouts and 19 walks in 35.2 innings ... David Price had a string of five straight double-digit strikeout games snapped against Arkansas on Friday (Finished with eight). He also had a string of three straight complete games snapped as he went six innings against the Razorbacks ... Brett Jacobson had his shortest stint this season with 1.1 innings against Arkansas on Sunday. It was also the shortest outing of any starter this year ... The Commodores are in the midst of playing three of four SEC series on the road (at No. 9 Arkansas, at No. 2 South Carolina, home vs. No. 25 Alabama, at No. 11 Kentucky).

Commodores Drop From Top Spot, Face New No. 1

Vanderbilt dropped from the top spot for the first time in five weeks after losing two of three at No. 9 Arkansas last weekend.

The Commodores will face the new No. 1 South Carolina this weekend, marking the second time this season they will face a top rated squad (Rice in the season opener).

The Commodores at 24-3 are off to the best start in school history and the team's 20-0 start was the best start of any sport at Vanderbilt. It bested the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team.

When ranked No. 1 the baseball ranking joined women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to post-season play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Shea Robin Named To Johnny Bench Watch List

Junior catcher Shea Robin was named to the initial Johnny Bench Award List by The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.

Twenty-seven catchers from seventeen conferences were nominated for the award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 7, 2007.

Robin is one of four catchers from the Southeastern Conference to be on the list, joining Tennessee's J.P. Arencibia, Mississippi State's Edward Easley and LSU's Robert Lara.

The Woodlands, Texas, native is hitting .314 on the season with a homer and 13 RBI. He has made only two errors on the season in 217 chances and has thrown out nine base runners as well. He is leading the team in hitting over the last 10 games, with a .387 batting average with seven RBI and nine runs scored.

The watch list will be narrowed down to ten semi-finalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2007.

Commodores Crush Middle Tennessee 14-2

Vanderbilt pounded out a season 22 hits en route to a 14-2 win over Middle Tennessee Wednesday evening at Hawkins Field.

Every Vanderbilt starter had at least one hit, with Pedro Alvarez leading the way with three hits and five RBI. Dominic de la Osa, Ryan Flaherty, Alex Feinberg, Brian Harris, Brad French and David Macias each had two hits in the winning cause.

The Blue Raiders jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first on a RBI single by Rawley Bishop and a RBI groundout by Zach Barrett off of starter Brett Jacobson.

Vanderbilt stormed right back to take the lead with three runs in the bottom of the first. Dominic de la Osa led off with a double to right and scored on Pedro Alvarez' mammoth homer to left to tie the game. Ryan Flaherty followed with a bunt single and stole second and third before scoring on a sacrifice fly by Andrew Giobbi to make it 3-2.

The Commodores loaded the bases in the second when Brian Harris and Brad French led off with back-to-back singles and David Macias was hit by a pitch. de la Osa and Alvarez followed with RBI groundouts to make it 5-2.

VU then blew the game open with six runs on seven hits in the bottom of the fifth. Andrew Giobbi, David Macias and Pedro Alvarez had RBI doubles, while Dominic de la Osa roped a RBI triple off the Green Monster wall in left to key the inning.

Alvarez added a RBI single in the seventh as did Carter Hawkins which was also his first hit of the year.

After the shaky first, Brett Jacobson (5-1) settled down and pitched four shutout innings. His final line was five innings, two runs, a walk and five strikeouts. Stephen Shao, Josh Zeid, Cameron Betourne and Casey Weathers each pitched a scoreless inning of relief.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In addition, the 10 previous finalists for the Clemens Award are also issued ballots. The 2007 award will be presented at a gala dinner next July. The event is administered by the Greater Houston Baseball Association, which has donated more than \$300,000 to the charities from the net proceeds from the first three dinners.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up preseason plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by Baseball America and Rivals.com this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. Baseball America listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

Price is expected to be one of the top picks in this June's amateur draft.

In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA base ball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division Il status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.















