HAYWARD: THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALIST

The 2011 Commodores are scoring more and allowing less points than the 2010 squad.

James Franklin, in his first year at the helm of Vanderbilt football, also has the 'Dores with a better record (4-4) than the 2010 team (2-6).

In a comparison of the 2010 and 2011 teams through eight games, Franklin's offense is averaging more points (25.2-18.2), more rushing yards (167.6-142.6), more total yards (320.2-286.8) and more first downs (15.3-12.9) than in 2010.

The defense is also improved this year. The unit is giving up less points (22.8-27.9), total yards (331.9-414.0), rushing yards (125.0-177.2), passing yards (206.9-236.8) and first downs (18.0-20.3).

Vanderbilt is improved in all rushing categories, averaging more yards per carry (4.1) than its opponents (3.3-4.1).

The defense also has nine more interceptions and five more quarterback sacks this year than in 2010.

COMMODORE OFFENSE STARTING TO CLICK

The Vanderbilt offense has shown improvement in virtually every area in recent weeks.

Since facing the nation's top defense in Alabama, the unit has more than held its own in a three-game homestand

against Georgia, Army and Arkansas. The offense has averaged 437 yards and 33.3 points in its last three games.

The most positive sign to coaches is that production is coming from different directions: **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) is averaging 234 yards of total offense during the stretch; **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR) and **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR) ave produced impressive receiving yardage totals; and the reshaped offensive line has allowed the team's rushing attack, paced by **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) to reach at least 200 yards in each game.

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) was announced today (Oct. 31) as one of 15 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to the nation's top defensive back.

Hayward is tied for fourth nationally with five interceptions and is the SEC active career leader with 13 picks.

On Saturday, Hayward set a career high with six defended passes against Arkansas.

In mid-October, Hayward was listed as a first-team midseason All-America by SI.com and a second-team All-America by CBSSports.com.

Hayward's 13 career picks is tied for second all-time among 'Dores with former standouts **D.J. Moore** (2006-08) and **Ken Stone** (1970-72). The team's career leader is **Leonard Coleman** (15 INTs, 1980-83).

Only eight Commodores have ever intercepted more passes in a season than Hayward's current five-pick total.

2011 VANDY FOOTBALL: AGGRESSIVE, INNOVATIVE

James Franklin is living up to his preseason pledge of bringing an aggressive, innovative style to all three aspects of Commodore football.

Franklin's promise to bring exciting football to West End has been on full display in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Commodores are 4-2 at home, with losses to ranked Georgia and Arkansas by a total of eight points.

Vanderbilt fans witnessed Franklin's innovation and daring calls Oct. 29 as the underdog 'Dores played the No. 8 Razorbacks to a near draw with the use of several crowd-pleasing plays.

Here's a sample of what fans have witnessed from Franklin's 'Dores in recent weeks:

OFFENSE

★ **Halfback Passes** **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) has tried four halfback passes, with one resulting in a 43-yard TD toss to **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR).

★ **Multiple Reverses** **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) is averaging 19.0 yards on three reverses.

★ **Fourth Down Attempts** Vanderbilt has succeeded on eight of 11 fourth downs. On the team's second possession vs. Arkansas, Franklin's 'Dores were successful on 4th-and-1 from the Vandy 28-yard line. Eight plays later, Vanderbilt scored its second touchdown.

DEFENSE

★ **Multiple Blitz Packages** The Commodores have developed numerous schemes aimed at creating offensive mistakes with added pressure. Four different defensive backs had tackles for loss.

★ **Opportunistic** Playing with confidence, the aggressive unit has accumulated 15 interceptions, 17 QB sacks, and 58 tackles for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS

★ **Fake Punts** The latest fake punt – from the Vandy 23-yard line – resulted in a 25-yard rush vs. Arkansas. One of the most unique fake punts in recent team history – a pass from **Ryan Fowler** (R-Jr., punter) to **Andrew East** (R-Fr., snapper) – worked to perfection against Georgia, gaining 35 yards on a 4th & 10 from the Vanderbilt 22-yard-line.

★ **Bringing the House** With seconds left against Georgia, a 10-player rush resulted in a blocked punt by **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR).

★ **Onside Kicks** After a TD closed the UGA score to 10-7 early in the game, the 'Dores tried a short pooch kick just behind the Bulldog front wall.

MORE ON THE SERIES

★ Florida has captured the last 20 games played between the schools, dating back to a 24-9 Vanderbilt victory in 1988. The Commodores are 2-18-1 all-time in games played on the Gainesville campus.

★ Vanderbilt controlled the series in its infancy, winning five of the first seven games played between the schools from 1945-1955.

★ From 1974-1988, Vanderbilt captured three of six games played in the series. All three victories came in Nashville.

FOURTEEN FLORIDA RESIDENTS ON VANDY ROSTER

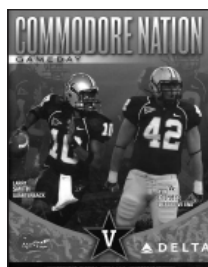

NASHVILLE – Chris Rainey blocked two punts and caught a 40-yard touchdown pass from John Brantley as Florida defeated Vanderbilt 55-14.

Vanderbilt (2-7, 1-5) lost its fourth straight, ensuring a second straight losing season under first-year coach Robbie Caldwell. The Commodores trailed 41-0 when Ryan van Rensberg blocked a punt Javon Marshall recovered and ran in for a touchdown.

The Gators (6-3, 4-3) started a little slow with a rare morning kickoff with a temperature of a chilly 44 degrees. But Florida still rolled up a season-high in points. They also had season highs with 88 plays for 480 yards.

The Florida defense had four sacks and forced three turnovers in holding Vandy to 109 yards.

STACY JUMPS TO 15TH ON TEAM'S CAREER RUSHING LIST

Zac Stacy (Jr., RB) passed five former Commodores on the all-time rushing charts with a 128-yard, 1-TD performance against Arkansas.

Stacy moved up to No. 15 on the team's career rushing list during the performance against the Razorbacks. He has 1,516 rushing yards and 12 TDs on 270 carries.

Stacy has 707 yards on just 97 carries this year, averaging 7.3 yards per attempt. His total is 10th all-time among single-season rushers, and third all-time by a Vanderbilt junior. He has a team-high six rushing TDs.

Stacy passed **Norval McKenzie** (1,491 yards, 2001-04), **Corey Harris** (1,486 yards, 1988-91),

Marcus Wilson (1,468 yards, 1989-92), **Chris Nickson** (1,463 yards, 2005-08) and **Charley Horton** (1,458 yards, 1952-55) on the all-time list during the effort vs. Arkansas Saturday.

Stacy has passed 13 rushers on the career in the last two games by combining for 326 rushing yards against Arkansas and Army.

Stacy needs 17 yards to pass **Tony Jackson** (1989-93) into 14th all-time.

VANDY OFFENSE PRODUCING MORE EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

Vanderbilt is producing more big plays under first-year offensive coordinator **John Donovan**.

Through eight games, the offense has 56 explosive plays (rush of 12 or more yards; pass of 15 or more yards). This total is 13 more than through the eighth game last year.

More big plays are coming from the 'Dore running game. The unit has 34 plays of 12 yards or more, matching the 2010 season total with four games remaining on the schedule.

THREE 'DORES OUT FOR YEAR

Mason Johnston (R-So., TE) became the third Commodore to prematurely exit the season when he suffered a leg injury at Alabama.

Johnston has had tough luck with injuries at Vanderbilt. He also sustained a season-ending leg injury last year at Kentucky.

Other contributors who will not return this year due to in-season injuries are **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jabo Burrow** (R-Jr., OG).

In the midst of his first year as a starter and ranking among the team's top tacklers, Strong went down at South Carolina with a leg injury. Burrow was forced to stop his career in September due to injury concerns.





DEFENSE: HOLDING TEAMS UNDER RUSH AVERAGE

The defense continues to play well against solid rushing attacks. Last week, the unit held Arkansas to 72 yards on 26 carries (2.8 yards per attempt). The Razorbacks entered the game averaging 140.3 rushing yards.

The effort has been a consistent theme for the defense this year. Amazingly, the unit has held all seven Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents under their season rushing average. Those seven teams have been held nearly 80 yards below their average entering the game.

The unit has held four teams – Elon, UConn, Ole Miss and Arkansas – under 100 rushing yards.

SCORING MORE POINTS

Vanderbilt has scored 202 points this season, just two less than during the entire 2010 season and six points more than in the 2009 campaign.

The Commodores' current 25.2-point average would rank as the team's third highest scoring average in the last 25 years.

COMMODORES OFF TO SOLID START

Only five Vanderbilt teams in the last three decades have put together a better record through eight games than the squad's current 4-4 mark.

The best Commodore record since 1982 through eight games is 5-3. It has happened in 1982, 1984, 1999, 2007 and 2008).

With four games left to play, the 2011 'Dores have doubled the Vanderbilt win totals from each of the last two years.

STACY'S RUSH EFFORT VS. ARMY NO. 3 ALL-TIME

Zac Stacy (Jr.) produced one of the finest rushing performances in team history against Army.

Stacy rushed for 198 yards on 21 carries in the 44-21 victory. He also rushed for three touchdowns. Both the yardage and TD totals are career highs.

Stacy's effort ranks third all-time by a Commodore – and is the best in 33 years dating to the school-record 321-yard effort by **Frank Mordica**.

FUGGER GETS MIDSEASON RECOGNITION

The superb early-season performance by **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) hasn't gone unnoticed. Fugger was the lone Commodore to garner first team midseason All-SEC honors by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*.

Fugger ranks among the SEC leaders with 11 tackles for loss and five QB sacks. He has also set a new single-season career high with 24 tackles.

Two other standouts, **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB) and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) were named to Phil Steele's second team midseason All-SEC team.

VANDY, UMASS TO PLAY FOUR-GAME SERIES

Vanderbilt and Massachusetts have finalized an agreement to play a four-game series in football starting in 2012. The teams will play twice in Nashville, the first coming on Oct. 27, 2012, and twice in Gillette Stadium.

The teams will play in consecutive years through 2015. Besides the 2012 game, other series dates include Sept. 21, 2013 in Foxborough, Mass., Oct. 4, 2014 in Nashville, and Oct. 29, 2015 in Foxborough.

In April, UMass announced a jump to NCAA's Football Bowl Championship division (FBS), as a member of the MAC Conference.

DEFENSE RANKS AMONG SEC LEADERS

The Commodore defense continues to perform well under a new coaching staff directed by first-year coordinator **Bob Shoop**.

In addition to being among the NCAA leaders with 15 interceptions, the veteran-laden unit ranks high in NCAA stats in several areas, including total defense, rushing defense, pass defense and passing efficiency.

Through eight games, the defense has limited opponents to 22.8 ppg, ranking 38th in the NCAA. The unit also ranks high in total defense (27th), rush defense (35th), pass defense (41st), defensive pass efficiency (27th) and first downs allowed (T-30th).

The unit has 15 picks, ranking second in the Southeastern Conference behind South Carolina and tied for fourth nationally.

Despite the total, Vandy has posted just one pick in its last four games. The secondary has their hands on several Arkansas pass attempts, but could not a single interception.

On Sept. 24, the defense registered four interceptions in a loss to ranked South Carolina. In Vanderbilt's first SEC game, the 'Dores nabbed five picks during a win over Ole Miss.

Casey Hayward (Sr., CB) and **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) are team leaders in interceptions with five and three, respectively. Both rank among the NCAA leaders in the category.

The Commodores also are making the most of the interceptions. For the first time in team history, Vanderbilt players

registered an interception return for touchdown in three consecutive games. It also marks the first time that Vanderbilt has scored on three interceptions in a single season.

Wilson also became only the second 'Dore to have two pick-sixes in a season with returns vs. Ole Miss and Elon.

REVAMPED O-LINE PRODUCING

Vanderbilt's revamped offensive front is showing positive results.

The unit, retooled four weeks ago, helped produce 462 total yards and four touchdowns against Arkansas. It marked a season high yardage total for the Commodores against an SEC opponent.

The offense also gained 530 total yards and 344 rushing yards against Army on Oct. 22, and 349 total yards vs. Georgia on Oct. 15.

Also, the unit has given up just three sack in the last four games.

After a sub-par effort at South Carolina, the staff shifted starters **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.) and **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) to new positions and inserted **Logan Stewart** (So.) into the starting unit. Johnson moved from center to LT, Seymour moved inside from LT to LG, and Stewart took the center role.

OWENS EARNS FIRST CAREER START

Al Owens (R-Jr., LB) became the 12th Commodore to enjoy their first career start in Vanderbilt's narrow loss to Arkansas on Oct. 29.

Owens is the fifth defensive player to earn their initial career start this year. Others are **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB), **Chase Garnham** (So., LB), **Javon Marshall** (So., safety) and **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB).

First-time offensive starters are **Chris Boyd** (WR, R-Fr.), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Mylon Brown** (R-So., OG), **Fitz Lassing** (TE/FB, So.), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Wesley Tate** (R-So., WR) and **Chase White** (OL, R-Fr.). Brown has started all eight games this year.

FIVE TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Five true freshmen have played midway through the season, including **Barron Dixon** (Fr., DT). Dixon's initial action came against Georgia on Oct. 15 where he rotated in on the 'Dore defensive front.

Other true freshmen contributing are **Jerron Seymour** (RB), **Spencer Pulley** (OG), **Joe Townsend** (C) and **Dillon van der Wal** (TE).

Seymour is the team's No. 2 rusher with 207 yards on 54 carries. He also has four rushing TDs. Pulley and Townsend have played on the offensive front. Van der Wal saw his first action vs. Connecticut.

In 2010, the Commodores played 13 true freshmen.

FOURTEEN FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS

Barron Dixon (Fr., DT) became the 14th underclass Commodore to see their initial action this season when he played against Georgia on Oct. 15.

Dixon is one of six defensive players have played their first snaps this year. Others are **Robby Barbieri** (R-Fr., LB), **Reggie Ford** (So., DB), **Thomas Ryan** (R-Fr., DE), **Vince Taylor** (R-Fr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Fr., DE).

First-time offensive players are **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Trent Pruitt** (R-Fr., WR), **Spencer Pulley** (Fr., OG), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) and **Joe Townsend** (Fr., C). **Andrew East** (R-Fr.) is in his first year as the primary snapper.

Thirty players saw their initial action as Commodores in 2010.

VANDY FEATURED IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED

First-year Head Coach **James Franklin** and the Vanderbilt football were featured in the recent edition of *Sports Illustrated*.

SI staff writer Michael Rosenberg attended SEC Media Days, then spent three days on campus during camp doing research for the in-depth look at the program Franklin intends to build in Nashville.

2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEAR GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: **Kyle Fischer**, **Casey Hayward**, **Chris Marve**, **Larry Smith** and **Carey Spear**.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) will serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams.

Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

FISCHER: A 33-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role last spring. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

HAYWARD: The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (13) and enters the season with a team-leading 32 consecutive starts.

MARVE: A three-year starter and candidate for numerous postseason defensive awards, Marve is the SEC's active leader with 367 career

tackles. He also has a team-high 44 starts.

SMITH: The fifth-year senior has shown determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith has jumped into the team's all-time Top Ten in passing early in the season.

SPEAR: After earning the placekicking duties in preseason, Spear is 4-7 this year in field goals, including a late-second game winner vs. UConn.

The 'Dores also name additional captains prior to each game.





NOTES FROM THE ARKANSAS GAME

★ The Commodores produced 462 yards of total offense, 240 passing and 222 rushing, in the 31-28 loss to Arkansas.

It represents Vanderbilt's highest total offense against a Southeastern Conference team since amassing 621 yards at Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.

★ **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) had another excellent performance, contributing four solo tackles that resulted in three tackles for loss and a pair of quarterback sacks. Fugger also forced a fumble.

Fugger leads the Commodores and ranks among the SEC leaders with five sacks and 11 tackles for loss. Only two Commodores in the last decade have more tackles for loss in a season than Fugger's current total:

LB **Marcus Buggs** (12, 2007) and DE **Jovan Haye** (12.5, 2003).

★ **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR) broke out of a season-long slump in a big way, hauling in six receptions for 151 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown from **Jordan Rodgers** that gave Vanderbilt its first score.

Matthews also had catches for 39 yards and a career-high 48 yards.

Matthews' yardage total is a team single-game high this season and the most by a Commodore receiver since **Earl Bennett** set the existing school record with 223 receiving yards against Richmond on Sept. 1, 2007.

★ **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) set a career high with six defended passes. Three of the defended passes were potential picks for the SEC's active career leader in interceptions.

★ **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) continues to be productive since being inserted as the Commodores' starting quarterback.

In just his third start in a Vanderbilt uniform, Rodgers put together his best performance. He amassed 306 yards of total offense by throwing for 240 yards and rushing for 66 yards. Rodgers also accounted for three scores: rushing TDs of 12 and 19 yards and a 21-yard pass to WR **Jordan Matthews**.

Rodgers completed 15 of 27 passes and did not commit a turnover. His 240-yard passing performance was the most by a Commodore QB since Jared Funk passed for 277 yards in the 2010 finale vs. Wake Forest.

★ The Commodores applied constant pressure on Arkansas QB Tyler Wilson, who ranks as the SEC's leading passer.

Wilson was sacked three times, resulting in losses of 20 yards, and was harassed on nearly a half-dozen other attempts. **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) and **Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) were credited with the sacks.

★ **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) became the first Vanderbilt running back since **Kwane Doster** (2002) to surpass 100 rushing yards in three games.

Stacy finished with 128 rushing yards on 19 carries, and scored his sixth touchdown of the season. In the performance, Stacy jumped from No. 11 to No. 3 in rushing yards by a Vanderbilt junior.

Stacy is now the SEC's fourth leading rusher with 707 yards on just 97 carries. Stacy's yards per carry average (7.3) is second in the league only to Alabama RB **Eddie Lacy**.

The junior is also on a personal surge. In the last three games, Stacy has 423 rushing yards, an average of 141 yards per contest.

★ The Commodore defense held Arkansas (the SEC's leading offense) to 388 total yards, 76 yards under their average.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) returned to excellent form against the Razorbacks, averaging 44.6 yards on five punts, including a 59-yarder in the second quarter than went out-of-bounds at the Arkansas 6-yard line.

★ **Javon Marshall** (R-So.) and **Kenny Ladler** (So.) both contributed five total tackles while alternating at one safety position.

★ The Commodores' continued improvement in third-down conversions (6-15) helped Vanderbilt own a 31:34-28:26 advantage in time of possession.

★ Vanderbilt limited Arkansas running backs to a 2.8-yard average on 26 carries.

★ The Commodores was flagged for just five penalties, resulting in 35 yards.

MARVE, HAYWARD TOP SQUAD IN STARTS

Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) has started more games than any other position player on the current Commodore roster. The two-time All-SEC performer and defensive co-captain made his 44th career start against Arkansas.

Brandon Barden (R-Sr., TE) ranks second on the team with 35 starts. Barden is followed by **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr., OL) with 33 starts. Two other veterans – **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) and **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) – have at least 29 career starts.

Hayward leads the team with 32 consecutive starts entering this season. He is followed by Richardson (26) and Fischer (25). Three other Commodores – **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., OL), **Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) and **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) – have started 20 consecutive games.

BARDEN AMONG TOP 20 RECEIVERS

Brandon Barden (TE, R-Sr.) needs just three receptions to surpass the 100-catch plateau for his career.

Barden, who did not have a catch in the Commodores' narrow loss to Arkansas, surpassed the 1,000-yard plateau for career receiving yards earlier this season.

The fifth-year senior is returning to full health after a leg injury suffered in the victory over UConn.

For his career, Barden has 97 receptions, good for 1,079 yards. He ranks 18th on the team's all-time catches list.

Barden is currently second all-time among Vanderbilt tight ends, and needs 19 catches to surpass **Allama Matthews'** school record of 114 receptions.

MARVE: 11TH ALL-TIME COMMODORE TACKLER

Chris Marve, a two-time All-SEC linebacker, is nearing the team's all-time Top Ten for career tackles.

Marve had four tackles, and shared in a tackle for loss, in Vanderbilt's narrow loss to Arkansas. He leads the team with 61 total stops.

Marve is 11th all-time among Vandy defenders with 367 career tackles. He passed **Gerald Collins** (1990-94) during the Commodores' win over Army on Oct. 22.

He also pushed his tackles for loss career total to 27, tying **Steve Bearden** (1980-83) for No. 9 all-time in the category.

A senior, Marve is not expected to challenge the team's top three career tacklers: **Andrew Coleman** (458), **Joe Staley** (457) and **Chris Gaines** (440).

The Memphis product is under consideration for several honors, including the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus and Bednarik awards, and the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

A two-time captain, Marve garnered 80 stops last year while nursing an injury. He posted more than 100 tackles as a freshman and sophomore.

The team's second leading active tackler, **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) had four tackles vs. Arkansas. He needs 22 tackles to join the team's all-time career top 25 list.

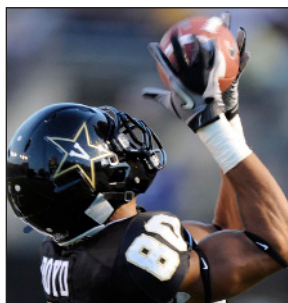

RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR VANDERBILT COACHES

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, became the first coach to register victories in his first three games since World War II.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 come-from-behind win over UConn on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to open the season.

Franklin's 'Dores defeated Army 44-21 on Oct. 22 to conclude a three-game losing streak to three talented SEC squads: South Carolina and Alabama on the road and Georgia at home.

The last new coach to guide Vanderbilt to wins in his first three games was E.H. Alley in 1943. Before that, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was Dan McGugin in 1904.

Franklin has matched or bettered the first-year win total of the four previous Vanderbilt head coaches. Only Gerry DiNardo (1986) has posted more victories (5) than Franklin among the team's last eight coaches.

SEEKING TWO BOWL APPEARANCES

Nine Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – **Brandon Barden** (TE), **Tim Fugger** (DE), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Casey Hayward** (DB), **Josh Jelesky** (OL), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Sean Richardson** (safety), **Larry Smith** (QB) and **Udom Umoh** (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- Franklin is the first Vanderbilt coach to start his Commodore career 3-0 since the World War II Era.
- As a quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with several other top QBs, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Farve as a Green Bay WR coach in 2005.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

- **DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement**
For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.
- **JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff**
Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.
- **JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator**
For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.
- **CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator**
Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture – changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

POSTS WINS IN FIRST THREE VANDY GAMES ★ September, 2011

Franklin becomes the first new Vandy coach to win his opening three games since World War II.

Franklin's Career At a Glance

2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 first-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets numerous school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-America player by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... In 2011, he starts on Green Bay's world champion squad.

Assisting Head Coach Mike Sherman, Franklin mentors a strong receiving arsenal that includes Donald Driver, Javon Walker and Robert Ferguson catching passes from Brett Favre... Despite an injury to Walker, the Packers rank sixth in team receiving yards... Driver sets career highs with 86 receptions for 1,221 receiving yards.

2000-04 MARYLAND (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator)

Franklin helps Maryland to three consecutive bowl appearances starting with the 2001 squad... RYAN SEYMOUR EARNS SEC O-LINE AWARD

Ryan Seymour (R-Jr., LG) was recognized as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 24 for his strong play in the Commodores' 44-21 win over Army.

The Kingsland, Ga., native was named for his role in Vanderbilt's line play that paved the way for a season-high 530 yards and 344 rushing yards. Of the rushing yards, **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) gained 198 of them. Stacy's total was the third-highest rushing total in school history by a Vanderbilt player.

Seymour registered seven knockdown blocks in just his third game at left guard after starting the season at left tackle. Seymour and the O-Line also did not allow a quarterback sack and helped Vanderbilt own an eight-minute advantage in time of possession.

WILSON, JOHNSON EARN SEPT. 17 SEC AWARDS

Trey Wilson (Jr., CB) and **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., center) were named SEC Defensive Player and Offensive Lineman of the Week for their efforts in Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Wilson picked off two Rebel passes, returning one for a 52-yard TD. He also contributed three defended passes in the stellar performance.

With two picks returned for touchdowns, Wilson becoming the 'Dore to achieve the feat in a single season since Jay Chesley in 1974.

Johnson anchored an offensive line effort that helped produce 281 rushing yards for the Commodores. It was the team's highest rushing total against an SEC opponent since 1994.

Johnson also won the league's offensive line award last year for his performance playing tackle against Ole Miss.

LOHR GETS SEC D-LINE AWARD ON SEPT. 10

Rob Lohr (R-Jr., DT) earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his effort in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut on Sept. 10.

Lohr, who contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, was selected over several SEC standouts.

Lohr's four tackles for loss ties for the most by a Commodore defender since linebacker **Jamie Winborn** contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000. **Casey Hayward** also accomplished the feat at LSU in 2009.

Lohr became the first VU's defensive player to earn SEC honors since **D.J. Moore** was named after the 'Dores' win over Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2008.

VANDERBILT VS. RECENT NON-SEC FOES

FORMER COACH MACINTYRE HONORED SEPT. 10

Former Vanderbilt Head Coach Coach **George MacIntyre** was honored during halftime of the Connecticut game for his incredible contribution to the legacy of Commodore football and also to assist in raising awareness within the Commodore community for finding a cure to multiple sclerosis.

Coach MacIntyre, a longtime resident of Nashville, was known throughout his coaching career as a powerful motivator and infectious personality. Those qualities have never been more apparent than in his current battle with multiple sclerosis.

More than 50 of MacIntyre's former players joined Vanderbilt Athletics officials during the on-field ceremony.

"Coach Mac," as he's been known throughout much of his career, served as head coach of the Commodores from 1979-1985 and led Vanderbilt to some of the university's biggest victories. In 1982, MacIntyre's team upset 14th-ranked Florida 31-29 and went on to finish the season 8-3 with an appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. That year, he received the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, the *Sporting News* College Football Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year.

The eight wins posted in 1982 were the most wins posted by a Commodore team since 1955 and a mark that has not been matched since.

IMPORTANT OF TURNOVER MARGIN TO SUCCESS

While Vanderbilt held a big advantage in turnover margin getting out to a 3-0 start, the stat has tightened in the Commodores' current losing streak.

The Commodores are +2 in turnover margin through seven games, picking off 15 passes and recovering seven fumbles. On offense, Vanderbilt has lost 17 turnovers: 12 interceptions and eight fumbles.

The Commodores won the turnover margin stat and got the victory over Army. They forced three turnovers and committed just two.

In its 31-28 loss to Arkansas, Vanderbilt trailed in the turnover stat line 3-2.

Earlier this season, the defense picked off nine passes facing Ole Miss and South Carolina. Vanderbilt's five-interception total against Ole Miss was the most against an SEC opponent since the Commodores picked off five Kentucky passes on Nov. 6, 1982.

After seven games, the 'Dores rank eighth in the SEC in turnover margin.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the importance of holding an edge in turnovers.

VANDERBILT HOMECOMING RESULTS

Vanderbilt is 26-38-3 in its homecoming games since World War II.

The 'Dores topped Army on Oct. 22 to end a nine-game losing streak in homecoming affairs dating back to 2002.

Since WWII, Vanderbilt is 10-3 in homecoming encounters against non-SEC teams.

Aaron Murray threw for a career-high 326 yards and three touchdowns, and Blair Walsh kicked four field goals as the Georgia Bulldogs held off Vanderbilt 33-28 for their fifth straight victory Saturday night.

Georgia coach Mark Richt agrees, saying he was more thankful than anything else for a win that helped the Bulldogs (5-2, 4-1) keep pace in the East with South Carolina, a 14-12 winner over Mississippi State earlier.

Vanderbilt (3-3, 1-3 SEC) hadn't beaten Georgia in Nashville since 1991, and Udom Umoh blocked Drew Butler's punt with 7 seconds left to give the Commodores one last chance at the Georgia 20 before a substitution infraction backed the Commodores up to the Georgia 25.

He rushed for 96 yards and a touchdown, threw for another and helped open up the field for Zac Stacy's career highs of 198 yards rushing and three scores in a 44-21 win over Army on Saturday.
