#### **Homecoming Tilt With The Commodores**

Georgia is aiming to push its win streak to two games while Vanderbilt is focused on snapping a two-game losing streak. The Bulldogs won at South Carolina 28-14 in a rare Sunday meeting while Kentucky downed Vanderbilt 20-13 last Saturday in Lexington.

Vanderbilt is one of 10 different SEC schools that has served as a Homecoming opponent for Georgia since the league was formed in 1933. The others from the SEC that Georgia has faced on Homecoming include Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi State, Missouri, Ole Miss and Tennessee. It will mark the 52nd time Georgia's Homecoming foe will be an SEC rival. Since 1922, Georgia is 75-17-2 in Homecoming contests, and the Bulldogs have won nine straight on this occasion.

#### **Inside The SEC Numbers**

(4-2, 2-2 SEC)

Georgia ranks ninth in the league in Scoring Offense (26.7 points/game) while the Commodores are 13th (19.0 points/game). However, Vanderbilt leads the SEC in Red Zone Offense, scoring in 18 out of 19 trips (95 percent). Georgia stands in ninth place, scoring in 19 out of 24 trips (79 percent). Top-ranked Alabama is averaging an SEC-best 44.8 points/game.

In Scoring Defense, the Commodores are seventh (23.0 points/game) while Georgia is 12th (28.0 points/game). Florida has the league's top-rated defense, surrendering just 11.6 points. Georgia is third in the league in Turnover Margin at +5 while Vanderbilt is fifth at +4. The Bulldogs and Gators lead the SEC with eight interceptions each.

Vanderbilt junior Ralph Webb leads the SEC in all purpose yards/game at 132.5 and ranks second in rushing at 113.7 yards/game. Georgia junior wide receiver/returner **Isaiah McKenzie** is tied for third in the conference in scoring with a team-best six touchdowns. Commodore junior linebacker Zach Cunningham ranks as the SEC's leading tackler with 62 stops (10.3 game), including 10.5 tackles for a loss.

#### **Series History**

The Bulldogs hold a 55-19-2 lead in the all-time series with the Commodores dating back to 1893. Georgia has won 29 games versus Vanderbilt in Athens and lost only six, including just one defeat (2006) at Sanford Stadium since 1995. The Bulldogs have won two in a row, eight out of the last nine and 19 out of the last 21.

#### 2015: Georgia-Vanderbilt Flashback

No. 10 Georgia dispatched Vanderbilt 31-14 at the Commodores' stadium in 2015. Isaiah McKenzie ignited the scoring with a 77-yard punt return for a touchdown late in the first quarter. He finished with 130 all-purpose yards. However, it was **Nick Chubb** who racked up 202 all-purpose yards after going for 189 yards on 19 carries (9.9 avg.). Fellow TB **Sony Michel** put the Bulldogs up 14-3 in the second period on a 31-yard scoring run and QB **Greyson Lambert** scored his only rushing touchdown of his Bulldog career in the third quarter to give UGA a 24-6 edge. Defensively, **Dominick Sanders** extended Georgia's lead with an 88-yard interception return for a touchdown in the game's final minute. Current New York Jet Jordan Jenkins led the Bulldogs' defensive attack with 11 tackles, including two sacks and 5.5 tackles for loss. ILB Jake Ganus also added six tackles and an interception.

#### The Rare Sunday Showdown

Georgia is coming off a rare Sunday matchup after topping South Carolina 28-14 in Columbia, S.C. The game was moved from Saturday night to Sunday afternoon because of conditions caused by Hurricane Matthew. This marked the fourth time in history that the Bulldogs played on a Sunday and just the first time during the regular season.

#### ON DECK: vs. FLORIDA Oct. 29, 3:30 p.m. (CBS)

Following an off week on Oct. 22, the Bulldogs will meet the Gators for the 95th time. Georgia leads the series 50-42-2 and won the 2011-13 matchups before dropping the last two.

# RBY SMART

### **Head Football Coach**



hen Georgia looked for a new head football coach after the 2015 season, the arrows all pointed to Kirby Smart, Iongtime University

> of Alabama defensive coordinator and former Bulldog player and assistant coach.

On Dec. 6, 2015, Smart officially came home

Smart has served on the Alabama staff the past nine years, the past seven as defensive coordinator. During his tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide won three BCS National Championships, one College Football Playoff national title, three Southeastern Conference crowns, six SEC western division titles, and was ranked in the nation's final top ten rankings the last eight years in a row.

A former standout defensive back and scholar-athlete at Georgia, Smart was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators. During his time at Alabama, he coached players at three different positions, in addition to his coordinating duties. He was recognized as the 2012 AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year and the 2009 Broyles Award winner as college football's top assistant coach. He was also a finalist for the 2015 Broyles Award.

A four-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, Smart received his BBA degree in Finance from UGA in 1998 and his

> M.S. in Physical Education from Florida State in 2003. The Bainbridge, Ga., native is married to the former Mary Beth Lycett of McDonough, Ga., a 4-year letterwinner, and 2-year starter, on the Georgia women's basketball team from 2000-2003. The couple met long after their undergraduate days at UGA, when Lycett -- then working in the UGAAA business office -- helped arrange Smart's trip to interview for the Bulldogs' running backs coaching job in 2005. They are now the proud parents of twins Weston and Julia (Feb. 8, 2008) and son Andrew (May 25, 2012).

to Georgia. But he had unfinished business at Alabama, which was still chasing a national title. He juggled two jobs for a month until January 11, 2016, when the Crimson Tide won its fourth national championship in a 7-year span. Twelve hours later, he was in Athens ready to go to work.

When Smart was named head coach he said "It's an honor and privilege to return home to the University of Georgia and my home state. I'm deeply appreciative of the faith President Morehead, Greg McGarity, and the Athletic Board Executive Committee have demonstrated in asking me to lead one of the truly great college football programs in the country. I also want to thank Coach Saban. I have been fortunate to spend 11 seasons with him as my mentor and have learned a tremendous amount from him as a coach and teacher. I'm honored and excited for the opportunity at Georgia and promise high energy, effort every day, and hard work every minute on the part of all our coaches, staff and student-athletes."

## DOG TRACKS

#### **Eason Gaining SEC Experience**

True freshman QB **Jacob Eason** is now 3-2 as a starter. He helped Georgia to its second SEC road win last Sunday in the 28-14 decision over South Carolina. The Bulldogs used a rushing attack that finished with 326 yards while Eason went just 5-for-17 for 29 yards with a touchdown and an interception. His scoring strike was a 6 yarder to **Isaiah McKenzie** on third down and goal in the fourth quarter that put Georgia up 21-7.

During his last home start versus #11 Tennessee, Eason finished 17-for-28 for 211 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. He fired a 47-yard touchdown to freshman **Riley Ridley** to give the Bulldogs a 31-28 lead with 10 seconds to play. It capped a four-play, 81-yard drive in 57 seconds. However, UT converted a 43-yard Hail Mary touchdown for a 34-31 road win. Eason's other touchdown pass of the game was a 50-yard bomb to freshman TE **Isaac Nauta**.

In a 45-14 road loss to #23 Ole Miss, he went 16-for-36 for 137 yards and one INT. He led the Bulldogs on a fourth quarter comeback in the 28-27 road win at Missouri in just his second career start. He finished 29-for-55 for 308 yards and three touchdowns (all career highs). This was the most attempts for a Bulldog since sophomore Cory Phillips went 36-for-62 against Georgia Tech in 2000. In the win over Mizzou, Eason and the Bulldogs converted a 4th-and-10 with 1:29 left that resulted in a 20-yard scoring strike to McKenzie. This game-winningTD capped an 80-yard drive in 10 plays that took just 2:03.

Eason became only the sixth Bulldog freshman QB to start a game and the first since Matthew Stafford (*No. 1 NFL Draft pick in 2009 to Detroit Lions*) in 2006 when he lined up behind center in the win over Nicholls. He saw his first action in the win over #22 UNC and completed 8-of-12 for 131 yards and a score (McKenzie).

**Greyson Lambert** returns for his final year of eligibility. After transferring to UGA from Virginia to start graduate school during the 2015 summer, the Jesup, Ga., native has started a total of 13 games, going 11-2 in those contests. He was Georgia's starter in the season-opening win over #22 North Carolina.

#### **Running Attack Proves Pivotal In SEC Road Win**

The centerpieces of the Bulldog backfield are juniors **Nick Chubb** and **Sony Michel**. The duo combined for 254 yards and two touchdowns on 37 carries in the win over the Gamecocks in Columbia. It marked the first time since 2014 that a pair of Bulldogs went over the 100-yard mark in the same game (Todd Gurley, Chubb).

Against #11 Tennessee, Michel had 91 yards on 16 carries and a touchdown while freshman **Brian Herrien** added 74 yards on 15 carries. At South Carolina, Herrien finished with a career-high 82 yards on just nine carries. He was the leading rusher at #11 Ole Miss with 78 yards and two touchdowns. The Bulldogs rank fifth in the league in Rushing Offense (215.7). The Commodore rushing

defense checks in at eighth in the league, allowing 176.8 yards per game.

Chubb and Michel are the first Bulldog teammates to each have 1,000-yard rushing seasons in their career. Michel returned this season after he became the 10th Georgia player in history to rush for more than 1,000 yards while starting six games in 2015 He became a starter last year after Chubb, who became the ninth running back with 1,000+ yards in 2014, went down with the knee injury against UT.

Chubb returned to the lineup in dramatic fashion in the 2016 season opener against #22 UNC, earning Maxwell Award/SEC Player of the Week honors for his efforts. After sustaining a season-ending knee injury at UT (Oct. 10, 2015), he underwent surgery and extensive rehab. Against UNC, he tallied a Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Game record 222 yards on 32 carries. This marked his third career 200-yard game with only legendary running back Herschel Walker having more with nine. Due to an ankle injury, Chubb missed the second half of the game at #23 Ole Miss and finished with 57 yards on 12 carries. He only played one snap and took a single carry in the loss to #11 Tennessee while recovering from his ankle injury.

**Elijah Holyfield**, another true freshman, got his first carries versus #23 Ole Miss and finished with 27 yards on four carries and one 19-yard catch. Junior fullback **Christian Payne**, a former walk-on from Athens and product of Prince Avenue School, was also a key to Georgia's 289 yards rushing in the win over #22 UNC. He showcased his receiving skills in the road win at Missouri, registering a career-high five catches for 41 yards, including his first career touchdown.

#### **McKenzie Displaying Versatility**

Junior WR/PR **Isaiah McKenzie** is second on the Bulldogs with 563 all-purpose yards (74 rush, 359 receiving, 130 return) and has scored five touchdowns. Chubb leads the way in all-purpose yards with 567 thanks to his 546 yards rushing. McKenzie has a team-best 26 catches, which includes a team-high four scores. His output this far eclipses his total from his first two seasons (16 rec., 190 yds., 0TDs). In the wins over Missouri and #22 North Carolina, McKenzie had a career-high 122 yards in each contest. Against Nicholls, he added another explosive play, registering a 66-yard TD reception, the longest by the Bulldogs since 2013 (Aaron Murray to Todd Gurley for 83 yards vs. Florida).

#### A Look At The Line

This season, three of the five starters on the offensive line return from 2015. Seniors **Greg Pyke** (OG/OT) and **Brandon Kublanow** (C/OG) and junior **Isaiah Wynn** (OT) have combined for 80 career starts. The Bulldogs have also benefitted from getting graduate transfer **Tyler Catalina** and the emergence of redshirt sophomore **Lamont Gaillard** as they joined the trio in the starting lineup this year. Junior guard **Dyshon Sims**, who has played in 21 games and started one, is also in the rotation.

#### **Young Defense Improving As Season Continues**

With a youthful defense, Georgia is 4-2 on the year. The win over South Carolina last week marked the only game this year that the Bulldogs had not trailed. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 14-0 halftime lead over the Gamecocks. This was the first time since the 2014 Missouri game that Georgia blanked an SEC opponent through the first two quarters. Two weeks ago, the Bulldogs had a strong start versus #11 Tennessee securing a 17-7 halftime lead. However, the Vols came back with 27 points in the second half (seven scored by their defense) to leave with a 34-31 win.

In the 28-27 road win over Missouri, the defense limited the Tigers to seven points in the second half as they gained just 128 yards on 35 plays. In the first half, Missouri tallied 20 points on 40 plays, gaining 343 yards.

Georgia's defense opened the season against a high-powered UNC offense. The Bulldogs held the #22 Tar Heels to 24 points and 315 total yards on offense. Most importantly when the Bulldogs fell behind 24-14 with 6:34 left in the third period, the Georgia defense blanked North Carolina the rest of the game as the Bulldogs rallied back for a 33-24 victory.

Georgia looks to improve its Red Zone Defense with only one stop in 19 trips, which is 14th in the SEC. Opponents have scored 14 touchdowns and four field goals. The lone stop came on an interception by senior **Quincy Mauger** when it trailed 27-21 in the fourth quarter at Missouri. He has had a pair of games with two interceptions, both against the Tigers.

#### **Smith A Senior STAR**

One of the leaders in the secondary is senior STAR **Maurice Smith.** Prior to the South Carolina game, head coach **Kirby Smart** said Smith was his unit's mature leader who sets an example for his younger teammates. Smith posted three tackles in the win at South Carolina, including a stop on 4th-and-2 in the fourth quarter with the Gamecocks trailing 21-7 and in Bulldog territory. He was one of the three game captains against #11 Tennessee and had his best game statistically. He tallied a career-high seven tackles, intercepted his first ball as a Bulldog (*he played for his first three years at Alabama*) and forced a fumble that he recovered. Smith is tied for fifth in stops with 26 this season.

Smith joined the team late in the summer after graduating and completing his undergraduate career at Alabama. Smith played in all 15 games for the 14-1 national champions in 2015 and finished with 15 stops. He played in 41 career games (starting two) and made 38 tackles, 1.5 sacks, five pass break-ups, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery for Alabama.

Sophomore DB **Deandre Baker** started for the first time versus #11 Tennessee and responded with three tackles. His top play of the game came when he drilled Tennessee's Jalen Hurd at the goal line and forced a fumble that **Aaron Davis** recovered for a touchback. Baker's hit came moments before Hurd was going to score on a 24-yard pass. Davis matched his career high with eight tackles against the Vols. Baker followed up his first start by tallying a career high seven tackles in the road win at South Carolina. He also recovered a fumble versus the Gamecocks.

Against #22 UNC, junior CB **Malkom Parrish** had a team-high seven tackles while Davis had five stops and Smith also registered five tackles plus two pass break-ups. Parrish grabbed his first interception of the year to set up Georgia's second score in the win over South Carolina. He now has three picks in his career.

All-SEC performer **Dominick Sanders** notched his 10th career interception in the win over Nicholls. He had an SEC-leading six picks in 2015 and finished last year with a UGA single season record of 205 INT return yards, which ranked fifth in SEC history.

#### Sophomore ILBs Leading The Way In Tackles

Sophomore ILBs **Natrez Patrick** and **Roquan Smith** rank 1-2 in tackles this season. Smith shot to second in the category (33) with his career-high and team-high 11 stops at South Carolina. He also added a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the 28-14 victory over the Gamecocks. After having a career-high 10 stops versus #11 Tennessee, Patrick leads the team with 36 stops, including four tackles for loss and one sack. Sophomore DL **Trenton Thompson** leads the interior linemen with 27 stops and a team-leading fiveTFLs and two sacks. True freshman **Julian Rochester** has started the last two games and responded with a combined five tackles

The defense has scored one touchdown on the year. Junior OLB **Lorenzo Carter** scooped up a fumble in the Nicholls game and ran 24 yards for a score during the Bulldogs' second victory of the year.

#### **Blankenship Continues Development At PK**

Redshirt freshman **Rodrigo Blankenship** has handled the PK duties over the last three games. Blankenship is 1-for-2 on the year, including a 27 yarder against the #11 Vols which was his first career field goal. He went a perfect 4-for-4 on PATs in the win at South Carolina. Redshirt sophomore **William Ham** is 3-for-7 on FGs this season. True freshman **Marshall Long** is taking care of the punting, averaging 39.5 yards on 33 punts. He had a career long 59 yarder versus the Gamecocks. However, the Bulldogs are 14th in the SEC in Net Punting at 36.1. This week's opponent, Vanderbilt, is 13th in the league in Net Punting at 37.6. The snapping responsibility has been shared by juniors **Glenn Welch** and **Trent Frix**. Frix is the younger brother of former snapper Ty Frix (2009-12) and the son of former snapper Mitch Frix (1981-82).

#### **Taking It To The House**

Junior **Isaiah McKenzie** has already made his mark in the SEC record book with his returns. Currently, his four punt returns for touchdowns rank fifth best in SEC history while his five total returns for scores (four PR, one KOR) is tied for third best in the league record books. This year, McKenzie has 11 returns for 106 yards for an SEC-best 9.6 average.

Senior **Reggie Davis** had a team-leading 17 kick returns for 394 yards (23.2 avg.) in 2015 to go with eight punt returns for 110 yards (one for a TD at Tennessee last year that covered 70 yards). This year, Davis is averaging 26.2 yards on nine kickoff returns, which ranks second in the SEC.

The Bulldogs had six first-time starters in the 2016 season opener on offense and defense. In game two against Nicholls, Georgia had two more new starters. On the trip to Oxford, Miss., the Bulldogs had another first-time starter. Georgia had three first-time starters versus #11 Tenneessee.

## Georgia 33, North Carolina 24

Sept. 3, 2016 • Georgia Dome - Atlanta, Ga.

**ATLANTA, Ga.** - Nick Chubb racked up an astounding 222 rushing yards in Georgia's come-from-behind victory over North Carolina (33-24) in front of a Georgia Dome capacity crowd of 75,405 and an ESPN national televised audience in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff game.

The 2016 season opener marked the debut of new head coach Kirby Smart, freshman quarterback Jacob Eason and the return of junior tailback Chubb since his gruesome knee injury that robbed him of the last seven games of the 2015 season.

Georgia held a 14-10 advantage at the half but UNC's T.J. Logan returned the second-half kickoff for a touchdown and then scored on a 21-yard run midway through the third quarter, giving the Tar Heels a 10-point lead. Defensively, Georgia stepped up as they only surrendered 49 yards to the Tar Heels for the rest of the game.

In the subsequent Georgia possession, Eason notched his first collegiate touchdown, a 17-yard strike to junior wideout Isaiah McKenzie. Then in the following UNC possession, UGA pinned the Tar Heels inside their own goal line and caused a safety to pull within one-point at 24-23 to conclude the third quarter.

With nearly 11 minutes left in the game, Eason orchestrated a nineplay, 71-yard drive highlighted by a 51-yard pass from Eason to McKenzie and a cruicial 16-yard rush by Brian Herrian to set up William Ham's go-ahead field goal. The 29-yard field goal by redshirt sophomore William Ham recaptured the lead at 26-24 for Georgia with 5:27 left in the game.

Chubb's 55-yard scamper cushioned the Bulldogs' lead to 33-24 and seemingly put the game out of reach with less than four minutes in regulation.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Somebody asked me if he (Nick Chubb) was on a pitch count. I guess not, huh? He did a great job. I think first, you should give a lot of credit to Ron Courson and his staff, okay, because they really pushed Nick. And then the second is Nick Chubb is a special person. He's got great humility, a great family and he works so hard. Not many of you guys know what this kid went through, when you're going out and doing extra Taekwondo at night, early mornings, there's a reason why he's in the shape he's in, and it's because of the way he works."



Nick Chubb made a heroic 2016 debut after suffering a gruesome knee injury that sidelined him for the final seven games of the 2015 campaign. He ran for a Chick-fil-A Kickoff game record 222 yards on 32 carries, including a 55-yard yard dash with 3:34 left in the fourth quarter that put UGA up by two scores.

- For the first time in school history, Georgia notched a season-opening win over a ranked team away from home. Coming in, Georgia was 8-9-1 against ranked teams to open a year, going 8-2 in Athens, 0-5-1 on the road and 0-2 in neutral site games. The Bulldogs posted a 33-24 win over No. 22 UNC in the debut of coach Kirby Smart. Georgia now is 93-27-3 in season openers including winning 17 of its past 20. Georgia now leads the UNC series 17-12-2.
- In Nick Chubb's first action since the Tennessee game last year (Oct. 10) when he suffered a season-ending knee injury, he set a Chick-fila-A Kickoff game record in yards (222) and carries (32) while he added two touchdowns. His 55-yard touchdown run with 3:34 left in the game strengthened Georgia's lead to 33-24 and it put him over the 200-yard mark. Chubb now has three career 200-yard rushing games, second only to Herschel Walker with nine in UGA history. The game also marked his 14th career game with at least 100 yards, good for fourth in school history.
- Freshman running back Brian Herrien made his collegiate debut and on his first carry, he scampered 23 yards for a touchdown. The score gave Georgia a 14-7 lead following the PAT and capped a 56-yard drive in 2:19. In the fourth quarter on a 2nd-and-22 play, Herrien rushed for 16 yards to the UNC 12-yard line which set William Ham up for a 29-yard field goal two plays later that gave UGA the 26-24 lead with 5:27 left to play.
- The Georgia defense limited the Tar Heels to 24 points and 315 total yards of offense. In 2015, UNC set school marks for points in a season (570), points per game (40.7) and Touchdowns (73). The Bulldogs' safety in the third quarter was the first safety since 2013 when UGA blocked a Louisiana-Monroe punt out of the end zone.

### Nicholls 24, No. 9 Georgia 26 Sept. 10, 2016 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

**ATHENS, Ga. -** After trailing 14-13 midway through the third quarter, No. 9 Georgia regained the lead and held off Nicholls to avoid an upset by a final score of 26-24 in a packed home crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium in front of a SEC network televised audience.

The 2016 home opener marked the home debut of head coach Kirby Smart and freshman quarterback Jacob Eason's first career start. Eason orchestrated a 67-yard scoring drive on the opening position that concluded with a six-yard touchdown run by junior tailback Nick Chubb.

The Colonels converted three Georgia turnovers into 17 points. Nicholls scored a touchdown in the final minute of the first half to cut the lead to 10-7 after a UGA fumble. Late in the fourth quarter, Georgia muffed a punt that led to a Colonels touchdown that brought the game within two points at 26-24 with 3:42 left to play. In the subsequent possession, Georgia was able to pick up two first downs to hold on to the victory.

The Georgia defense limited the Colonels to 236 total yards while notching two interceptions and a fumble. Georgia linebacker Lorenzo Carter returned the fumble for a touchdown after cornerback Aaron Davis knocked the ball loose from Nicholls' quarterback on a sack in the third quarter to put UGA up 26-14.

Offensively, McKenzie provided the spark for the Bulldogs as he collected 142 all-purpose yards stemming off a 66-yard touchdown reception from Eason and a 55-yard punt return that set up a 26-yard field goal in the third quarter. Eason finished with 204 yards passing and a touchdown, while Chubb totaled 80 yards on 20 carries.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It's important that we understand that our football team has to go get better. It's frustrating. A lot of guys didn't execute, didn't play well, and that's my responsibility. We've got to improve because there are good teams down the road. ... Other schools work on football, too. I'm disappointed we didn't go out and execute. We've got to perform better. We didn't perform the way we should have. It's in the books and we have to move on. They have to understand we need to practice really good to play really good. We need to practice this week with efficiency."



Lorenzo Carter's 24-yard fumble return for a touchdown gave Georgia a 26-24 lead late in the third quarter. The touchdown was his first career score while the fumble recovery was his second in a UGA uniform.

- The ninth-ranked Georgia Bulldogs defeated the Nicholls State Colonels 26-24 in the first-ever matchup between the two schools. The game marked the home debut of UGA head coach Kirby Smart. Georgia is now 2-0 in non-conference games this year.
- The Georgia defense limited the Colonels to 236 total yards on offense. Outside of an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, Nicholls' longest drive was 30 yards. Nicholls scored 17 of its 24 points off of three Georgia turnovers.
- Freshman quarterback Jacob Eason notched his first career win as a starter. In the first drive, Eason led the Bulldogs on a 67-yard scoring drive capped off by a Nick Chubb toiuchdown that gave UGA an early 7-0 lead. In the third quarter, Eason hit Isaiah McKenzie on a 66-yard touchdown to retake the lead at 20-14. The aerial strike was the longest UGA pass play since 2013. Eason is the sixth true freshman quarterback to start a game in school history.
- The Bulldogs forced three turnovers that resulted in six points. Juwan Briscoe and Dominick Sanders snagged interceptions in the first half that didn't lead to points. In the third quarter, Aaron Davis blindsided the Nicholls' quarterback forcing a fumble that Lorenzo Carter scooped up and returned 24 yards for a touchdown.
- Nick Chubb's touchdown marked his 24th career rushing score and the the 16th game that he has recorded a rushing touchdown in his 22 career games.

## No. 16 Georgia 28, Missouri 27

Sept. 17, 2016 • Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium-Columbia, Mo.

COLUMBIA, Mo. --- Jacob Eason found Isaiah McKenzie on a 4thand-10 for a 20-yard game-winning touchdown with 1:29 left to play that pushed the No. 16-ranked Georgia Bulldogs past the Missouri Tigers 28-27 in front of a crowd of 57,098 at Faurot Field in Memorial Stadium and a SEC Network televised audience.

The Bulldogs received the ball from the Tigers with 3:41 left on the clock trailing 27-21. True freshman quarterback Eason led Georgia 90 yards down the field on 10 plays, going 3-for-8 with 43 yards and the touchdown through the air. Junior wideout McKenzie caught two balls in the final drive for 26 yards and the score.

Eason set career-highs across the board as he went 29-for-55 with 308 yards and three touchdowns. McKenzie grabbed a career-best 10 receptions for 122 yards and three scores. Georgia Nick Chubb had 63 yards on the ground on 19 carries.

The Georgia defense caused five turnovers on the day. Safety Quincy Mauger matched his career-high of two interceptions that he set vs. Mizzou in 2014. Sophomore cornerback Juwuan Briscoe nabbed one interception and two fumble recoveries, both career-highs. Sophomore linebacker Natrez Patrick led the Bulldogs with nine total tackles.

The game was a tale of two halves as the first half featured a high-scoring aerial attack from both team and the second half consisted of a defensive struggle. The teams combined for 41 points and 595 total yards in the first half but the second half saw 14 points and 287 total yards.

After the game-winning touchdown, Aaron Davis stripped Mizzou's J'Mon Moore on the Tigers' first play, which was recovered by Briscoe. The Bulldogs were able to kneel the ball to expire the game clock and collect a win in their SEC season opener.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"It was a hard fought win," said Georgia head coach Kirby Smart." "Very emotional. It was a roller coaster ride. Those kids never stop believing, they never stop fighting. I feel like whenever we got control of them on offense. They slowed some things down and we were able to get the ball back. The kid really grew up tonight. The quarterback grew up a lot and became a better player."



Freshman quarterback Jacob Eason threw for 308 yards and three scores — none more important than the game-winning 4th-and-10 touchdown strike to Isaiah McKenzie with 1:29 left in the game.

- Kirby Smart became the first Georgia Head Coach to start 3-0 in their first year since Joel Hunt went 4-0 in 1938. The win marked the second fourth quarter come-from-behind victory in 2016. Georgia now leads the series against Missouri 5-1
- Junior wideout Isaiah McKenzie had a career-night as he matched his previous career-high of 122 yards, while setting career-bests in catches with 10 and touchdowns with three (2 receiving and 1 rushing). He accounted for 166 all-purpose yards.
- Freshman quarterback Jacob Eason showcased his arm, finishing 29-for-55 for 308 yards and three touchdowns, all career-highs. The 55 pass attempts were the most since Cory Phillips went 36-for-62 vs. Georgia Tech in 2000. In his second career start, he completed passes to nine different receivers.
- The Georgia defense notched five takeaways but was unable to transform them into points. Mizzou turned Georgia's one interception into seven points. The second pick came at the 8:09 mark in the fourth quarter in Georgia's own end zone as the Tigers were trying to make it a two-score game.

## No. 12 Georgia 14, No. 23 Ole Miss 45

Sept. 24, 2016 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium-Oxford, Miss.

**Oxford, Miss.** --- The Georgia Bulldogs were handed their first loss of the season against the No. 21 Ole Miss Rebels 45-14 on Saturday at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in front of an ESPN nationally televised audience and 65,843 attendees, second biggest in Ole Miss history.

The Rebels came out firing by putting up 31 points in the first half and the deficit proved to be too large for the Bulldogs to mount another second-half comeback. Ole Miss accumulated 510 total yards (330 through the air and 180 on the ground), while UGA managed 396 total yards with 230 rushing and 166 passing.

Bulldogs' freshman quarterback Jacob Eason went 16-for-36 for 137 yards with an interception and a fumble. Freshman tailback Brian Herrien led Georgia with 78 yards on 11 touches and two touchdowns, all career-bests. Junior tailbacks Nick Chubb and Sony Michel added 57 and 66 yards, respectively, on the ground. Michel notched a team-high 34 receiving yards on two catches.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly led Ole Miss with 282 yards passing on two touchdowns, and he had a team-high 53 yards rushing with one touchdown. Senior tight end Evan Engram grabbed team-high six receptions for 95 yards and a touchdown.

The Bulldogs got on the board in the third quarter as they orchestrated a 75-yard, 7-play drive capped with a touchdown. Herrien had 43 yards on the drive with a 10-yard scurry to make it a 45-7 game.

At the 7:38 mark in the fourth quarter, Georgia and Herrien reached the end zone again as the tailback finished the Bulldogs' longest drive of the game (79 yards in 12 plays) with a one-yard touchdown run. Eason amassed 45 yards on 5-for-6 passing, while he added 8 yards on the ground.

Defensively, junior safety Dominick Sanders led the team with seven tackles and added a sack, while fellow safety Aaron Davis recorded an interception.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"I believe in consistency and I believe in a 24-hour rule. Whether you win or lose. Good or bad. 24-hours. I want the kids to see the same me. 24-hours from now we have to move on. Unfortunately, in the SEC you get no breaks. You get no weeks off. You've got to come back and fight another day. That is the demeanor I have with the kids."

- Georgia is 3-for-4 on 4th downs this season. The Bulldogs executed their first fake punt since the 2015 Florida game, and the first successful one since the 2013 Clemson game when punter Collin Barber had a five-yard run for a first down. In the 2nd quarter, on 4th-and-8 from the UGA 40 yard line freshman punter Marshall Long completed his first career pass, a 29-yarder to Sony Michel. On 4th and 1 in the 2nd quarter, junior Nick Chubb scurried 16 yards to the Ole Miss 23, while defensive linemen Julian Rochester and John Atkins were in to block.
- Freshman tailback Brian Herrian set career-highs in carries (11), yards (78) and touchdowns (2). In the 3rd quarter, freshman Brian Herrien finished a seven play, 75-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown run, the second of his career. Herrien scored another TD from one-yard out with 7:38 left in the game.
- The Bulldogs scored 7 points off an interception while Ole Miss scored 7 points off two UGA turnovers. The first turnover was a 52-yard pick six by Ole Miss' Derrick Jones as the Rebels took a 10-0 lead. The second came on a fumble by Jacob Eason when he was sacked at the Bulldog 32. In the following possession, UGA's Aaron Davis intercepted a Jason Pellerin pass which led to an eventual 79-yard TD drive that made it 45-14. Opponents this season have scored 31 points off seven Bulldog miscues while Georgia has converted nine turnovers into only 13 points.
- Georgia's captains were junior John Atkins (NT), junior Malkom Parrish (DB) and junior Jeb Blazevich (TE).

# No. 11 Tennessee 34, No. 25 Georgia 31 Oct. 1, 2016 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

**ATHENS, Ga. --** A wild second half led to an even wilder ending, as a No. 20 Georgia (3-2, 1-2) lead with four seconds remaining disappeared with a Tennessee Hail Mary pass giving the No. 11 Volunteers (5-0, 2-0) a 34-31 win on Saturday.

Tennessee's Joshua Dobbs launched a 43-yard throw toward the end-zone with Jauan Jennings hauling it in for the game winner as time ran out. In the previous drive, Georgia used its own come-from-behind touchdown with Jacob Eason finding Riley Ridley on a 47-yard connection, giving the Bulldogs a 31-28 advantage with 10 seconds left in the contest.

Eason completed 17-of-28 passes for 211 yards, targeting Isaac Nauta with five of those throws for 83 yards. Sony Michel led the rushing attack with 91 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown while Brian Herrien added 74 yards on 15 carries.


Defensively, Natrez Patrick tallied team-high 10 tackles, including five solo stops. Aaron Davis and Maurice Smith followed with eight and seven tackles, respectively, as Smith also grabbed a late interception.

After holding the lead for most of the game, a late fumble by Georgia in its endzone allowed the Vols to recover and score for its first lead at 28-24 with less than three minutes left in the game. Starting at the Georgia 4-yard line, Eason was hit and lost the ball with Tennessee's Corey Vereen recovering for the touchdown.

The Bulldogs came out to a commanding 17-0 lead early but the Volunteers answered with a touchdown in the final minute of play in the first half and then scored on their openings possession of the second half to make it a 17-14 game.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"The kids fought hard and I'm proud of the way they played. We challenged them this week. We practiced physical and we played physical. Bottom line is we've got to do better; we've got to do better than them. ... We're a good football team, but we've got to improve. We challenged them to play their best game today and a lot of them did that. That's a response I was proud of. A lot of the kids played hard and physical. Now we've got to do it again next week."



Freshman Riley Ridley's 47-yard touchdown catch from Jacob Eason gave the Bulldogs the lead with 10 seconds remaining on the game clock. The touchdown was the first of Ridley's career.

- With No. 11 Tennessee's 34-31 comeback on the final play of the game, the Vols extend their lead in the series to 23-21-2. The last five games between the teams have been decided by a TD or less with one requiring overtime. This was the 14th time both teams came in ranked in the AP top 25, and Georgia is now 5-9 in these games.
- Georgia scored 10 points off three Vols turnovers while Tennessee scored 7 points off two Bulldog miscues. Coming into the game, the Bulldogs had scored just 13 points off nine turnovers this season.
- In the aerial attack, freshman TE Isaac Nauta had a career day with five grabs for 83 yards. He caught his first career touchdown reception on a career-long 50-yard strike from freshman QB Jacob Eason. Nauta came into the game with four catches for 32 yards.
- Freshman receiver Riley Ridley's first career catch was a 10-yard reception in the first quarter and then snatched a 47-yarder for his first career TD with 10 seconds left to give Georgia a lead.
- Nick Chubb's touchdown marked his 24th career rushing score and the 16th game that he has recorded a rushing touchdown in his 22 career games.
- Sophomore ILB Natrez Patrick finished with a career-high 10 tackles, including his second career sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. Maurice Smith, who forced and recovered a fumble, also registered a career-high seven tackles and had an interception. Sophomore DB Deandre Baker and freshman DL Julian Rochester started their first career games for the Bulldogs.

### Georgia 24, South Carolina 14

Oct. 9, 2016 • Williams-Brice Stadium - Columbia, S.C.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** - An authoritative rushing attack helped Georgia (4-2, 2-2) defeat South Carolina (2-4, 1-4) by a 28-14 final score Sunday on SEC network televished audience and in front of a crowd of 77,221 at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Bulldogs ran wild as they amassed 326 rushing yards, its largest output on the ground this season. Veteran backs Sony Michel (133 yards) and Nick Chubb (121 yards) both surpassed the 100-yard mark, while freshman Brian Herrien (82 yards) nearly hit triple digits as well.

On the defensive side, the Bulldogs limited South Carolina to 318 yards, with 164 coming on their two scoring drives. For the game, USC was held to 2-for-13 on third downs and turned the ball over three times.

Georgia started off fast, opening the game with a seven-play, 73-yard drive that ended with a Nick Chubb 15-yard touchdown. The Bulldogs tallied three runs of 15 or more yards on the opening drive.

Georgia cornerback Malkom Parrish interception a pass and the Bulldogs were able to cash-in with an eight-play, 28-yard drive that was capped off with a one-yard run from Chubb to claim a 14-0 lead that held through the end of the first half.

The Bulldogs took advantage of good field position in the fourth quarter, improved by runs of 14 and 18 yards by Herrien. Eason and Isaiah McKenzie then connected on a six-yard touchdown to put Georgia in control at 21-7 with 11:43 remaining in the contest.

The Gamecocks moved within one touchdown with 1:40 remaining, but Georgia promptly answered as Terry Godwin scooped the onside kick attempt and ran it back for a score to seal the victory.

#### Coach Kirby Smart said...

"We certainly made it more interesting than it needed to be. We challenged them to be physical, we tried to dominate the line of scrimmage, which I really thought we tried to do well. We have got to improve how we throw and catch the ball, which to be honest, especially early in the game, there were tough conditions out there. They struggled early with it, we struggled early. But we were physical, kids played hard, very resilient guys."



Georgia's offensive line paved the way for season-high 326 rushing yards and 17 first downs picked up on the ground. Junior tailbacks Nick Chubb (121 yards) and Sony Michel (133 yards) reached the triple digits, while freshman Brian Herrien collected 82 yards rushing.

- With today's 28-14 victory, the Bulldogs owns a 49-18-2 edge in the series history. The Oct. 9 matchup is the latest the teams have faced each other since 1980 when they played on Nov. 1. Georgia won that year in Athens 13-10.
- Today marked the first time the Bulldogs have ever played a regular season game on a Sunday. Before today, Sunday was the only day of the week that Georgia had never played a regular season game. Georgia has played three bowl games on a Sunday, the most recent in 2000, the O'ahu Bowl in Hawaii, when it beat Virginia 37-14 on Christmas Eve. Today's Georgia-USC game was moved to Sunday due to Hurricane Matthew.
- Sophomore LB Roquan Smith led the Bulldogs with a career-high 11 tackles including seven solo stops. The Bulldogs had a season-high five sacks including 1.5 by junior Davin Bellamy. Coming in today, the Bulldogs had just six sacks on the year. Georgia blanked USC 14-0 in the first half. The Gamecocks ran just 22 plays and had 108 yards of total offense (20-rushing, 88-passing). Before today, the last time Georgia shutout an SEC team in the first half came in 2014 at the other Columbia as Georgia beat Missouri 34-0. That day, it was 20-0 at the half. USC finished with 318 yards of offense on 62 plays.
- Georgia tallied 326 rushing yards and that was the most by the Bulldogs since 2014 against Troy when it had 367. Junior tailback Nick Chubb (16 carries, 124 yards, 2 TDs) returned to a starting role while junior Sony Michel led the squad today with 133 yards on 21 carries. Today was the first time since the 2014 Auburn game that two Bulldogs had more than 100 yards rushing. That day, Chubb (144) and Todd Gurley (138) did it in a 34-7 win in Athens. Chubb moved in to the top five of the Bulldog record book for Career Rushing Yards on the first play from scrimmage, an 18-yard scamper that moved him past Knowshon Moreno's total of 2,734 yards from 2007-08. For his career, Chubb has 2,840 yards.
