Opening Tip

• Lafayette wraps up its three-game road swing in its first-ever meeting with Vanderbilt on Wednesday evening. Lafayette has not played since Dec. 11 at Sacred Heart, a nine day layoff, while the Commodores are playing their third game in five nights.

• Lafayette has lost four of its last five games after starting the season 2-1. Three of those games (at Delaware, vs. Long Island and at Sacred Heart) were decided by a total of 10 points.

• Vanderbilt is Lafayette's fourth opponent of the season that qualified for the 2011 NCAA Tournament. Long Island was a 15-seed, Princeton earned a 13-seed, Penn State was slotted 10th in its region and the Commodores were the No. 5 seed in the Southwest region as an at-large bid.

• Tonight's game is the seventh road contest of the season for Lafayette. The Leopards are 2-4 away from Easton, Pa.

• Senior guard **Jim Mower** has scored in double figures in nine of 10 games and has led the team in scoring in six. Mower has three 20-plus point games in 2011-12 and 13 for his career.

• Senior forward **Nick Petkovich** made the move from wing to small forward for the 2011-12 season. The 6-5 Petkovich is usually undersized on the defensive end, but is managing 4.7 rebounds per game (second on the team). Offensively, he is playing in the post for the first time in his career (high school included), but has averaged 9.0 points per game. Against LIU, he hit a career-high six three-pointers.

• **Jim Mower** is second in the Patriot League in three-pointers per game (2.7 per game). Mower has 27 three's in 2011-12 and hit 10 three's against Fairleigh Dickinson, the highest single-game output in the nation this season.

• Senior guard **Rob Delaney** is handling the point guard spot full-time while Tony Johnson nurses a back injury. Delaney is averaging 9.4 points, 2.9 rebounds and leads the team with 4.0 assists per game.

• Lafayette is 0-7 all-time against current Southeastern Conference members.

MEDIA LUNCHEONS

The Athletic Communications Office will host four media luncheons: **Dec. 6, Jan. 5, Feb. 2, and Feb. 28** at noon.

The luncheons will be held on campus in Pfenning Alumni Center and working media members are encouraged to attend.

WILLENANDABLE: Senior forward **Ryan Willen's** production has jumped significantly in the 2011-12 season, one that has been free of the back injury that slowed him last season. Willen, who averaged 10.4 points and 3.7 rebounds per game in 2010-11, is averaging 15.0 points and 5.1 rebounds per game in 2011-12. He has four games with 20 or more points (11 for his career) and has done much of his scoring at the line. At the stripe, Willen leads the team with 6.4 attempts and 4.9 points per game. With the graduation of Jared Mintz, Willen is the top post scorer, only playing forward instead of splitting time between wing and small forward like in previous seasons.

DELANEY ON POINT: Senior guard **Rob Delaney** has taken on a new role, handling the point guard spot full-time while Tony Johnson nurses a back injury. Delaney is averaging 9.3 points, 2.7 rebounds and leads the team with 4.0 assists per game. His line against LIU was indicative of his play this season: 10 points, six rebounds, eight assists, two blocks and a steal in 27 minutes.

EIGHTS ABOUND: Lafayette had a season-high eight blocks against Long Island. **Dan Trist** sent away three shots and **Jim Mower** and **Rob Delaney** had two apiece. It was the first time since Feb. 21, 2010 vs. Lehigh that Lafayette had eight or more. The Leopards also managed a season-high eight steals and Delaney dished out eight assists vs. LIU.

MORE THREE'S: In seven straight games, Lafayette has made more three-pointers than its opponent. The Leopards derive 41 percent of their offense from behind the arc. Lafayette has made 10 or more three's in six games, including a season-high 15 vs. Fairleigh Dickinson.

FRESH FACES: The freshman class has made an impact in 2011-12. Guard **Seth Hinrichs** has started seven games and is averaging 8.9 points in 20 minutes per game. **Joey Ptasinski** has started three outings including the LIU game when he had eight points and five boards in 25 minutes. Ptasinski is averaging 5.9 points in 22 minutes per game. **Dan Trist** (5.1 ppg, 3.0 rpg) came off the bench in the first two games and played a team-high 35 minutes with 12 points at La Salle. He has started four games. Forward **Alan Flannigan** has played in six games at 7.3 minutes per stint. He is averaging 1.8 rebounds a game.

The freshmen are averaging 19.9 points and 9.5 rebounds, while playing 34.4 percent of the team's minutes per game.

HONORED AGAIN: **Seth Hinrichs** earned his third Patriot League Rookie of the Week award after averaging 12.7 points and 4.0 rebounds over a three-game span, including Lafayette's win at Penn State. Against PSU, Hinrichs put up 14 points, had five rips and made two steals. He followed that performance up with a career-high 17 points at Sacred Heart.

WEEKLY SWEEP: Senior guard **Jim Mower** and freshman guard **Seth Hinrichs** swept Patriot League weekly honors on Nov. 29.

Mower made a school-record 10 three-pointers in a win over FDU (Nov. 22), shooting 10-of-13 from beyond the arc and finishing with a career-high 37 points. At Delaware (11/26), Mower had 19 points, including 7-of-8 at the line, and a season-high seven rebounds. It was the second weekly honor of Mower's career.

Hinrichs became the first Lafayette player to garner Rookie of the Week accolades in two straight weeks since Bilal Abdullah '08 accomplished the feat in 2004-05. Hinrichs was in the starting lineup for both games and averaged 10 ppg, including a career-high 13 points at Delaware. The last time two Lafayette players swept the weekly awards was Dec. 26, 2007, when Andrew Brown '09 and Deirunas Visockas '11 were named Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively.

LION TAMERS: Lafayette shut down the Big 10's leading scorer, Tim Frazier, (holding him to three points on 0-for-11 shooting) and churned out a 61-57 win at Penn State on Dec. 7. It was the first victory by a Patriot League team over Penn State since the league's inception in 1990.

TURNOVER TALE: Lafayette committed a season-low 10 turnovers at Penn State, tying the previous best mark first set at Delaware on Nov. 26.

SHATTERED GLASS: In the team's two biggest losses of the season (in terms of points), Lafayette was beaten soundly on the boards. At La Salle, Lafayette was outrebounded by 17 and at Princeton was handled by 11 boards. At Penn State, the Leopards were roughed up 47-26 around the rim while surrendering 20 offense rebounds. On average, Lafayette is being outrebounded by 6.6 boards per game this year.

1,000-POINT CLUB: Entering the FDU game, senior guard **Jim Mower** needed 19 points to reach 1,000 for his career. He surpassed that goal with a 37-point effort. Mower became the 38th player in Lafayette history to score 1,000. Mower has 1,096 career points and stands at 29th on Lafayette's all-time scoring list.

In 2010-11, senior forward **Ryan Willen** scored his 1,000th career point after netting eight points in the Patriot League Tournament Championship game at Bucknell. Willen stands at 1,157, currently in 25th place. He needs five points to move into 24th spot occupied by Chet Brightful '84.

SCOUTING VANDERBILT

The Commodores enter the first ever meeting against Lafayette with a 7-4 record, and are playing their third game in five nights. After starting the season 5-1, Vandy has lost three of its last five games, including overtime contests to Xavier and Louisville.

All five starters return from last season's NCAA Tournament squad, which earned a No. 7 preseason ranking this year.

Junior guard **John Jenkins** is the Commodores' leading scorer, averaging 20.0 points per game and leads the team with 35 three-pointers. Senior **Brad Tinsley** (10.5 ppg, 3.0 rpg) leads Vandy with 33 assists and joins Jenkins in the backcourt starting lineup.

Jeffery Taylor, a senior from Norrkoping, Sweden, scores 18.1 points and grabs 5.9 boards per game from his forward position while **Lance Goulbourne** contributes 7.5 rps per contest. Goulbourne, another senior, has started 10 games and nets 10.0 points on average. The man in the middle, **Festus Ezeli**, is averaging 9.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game, has played in only two games this season after serving a five-game NCAA suspension and battling a knee injury.

As a team, the Commodores are shooting 45.6 percent from the floor for the season and average 75.6 points per game. They have had trouble taking care of the ball, committing nearly 15 turnovers per game.

Vanderbilt is coached by **Kevin Stallings** (Purdue '82) in his 18th season. He holds a 243-152 mark in his 13th year at the school.

A HELPING HAND: Senior **Rob Delaney** dished out a career-high nine assists at Penn State, a single-game high for all Lafayette players. Lafayette recorded assists on 15 of 18 buckets and Delaney has 21 assists in the last three games.

DOUBLING UP: Senior forward **Ryan Willen** notched the fifth double-double of his career and the Leopards' first of the season with 20 points and 10 rebounds against Wagner (11/19). Willen was a perfect 11-for-11 from the stripe, his best career effort.

Senior forward **Nick Petkovich** turned in the best all-around performance of his career against Fairleigh Dickinson (11/22), managing his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. He also blocked a career-high four shots.

ON THE SIDELINE: The all-time winningest coach in Lafayette history and longest-tenured coach in the Patriot League, **Fran O'Hanlon** (Villanova, '70) is in his 17th season as the Leopards' head coach. A **three-time Patriot League Coach of the Year**, O'Hanlon has twice led Lafayette's program to the NCAA Tournament and lays claim to three Patriot League regular-season titles.

With a 75-71 double-overtime victory over Lehigh on Feb. 18, 2007, O'Hanlon became the winningest coach in Lafayette history and now holds an all-time record of **230-248** on College Hill. O'Hanlon's overall record does not necessarily tell an accurate story of the job he has done at Lafayette. The Philadelphia native inherited a 2-25 team when he took over in 1995-96 and won seven, 11, 19, 22 and 24 games over the next five seasons.

From 1997-00, Lafayette was 65-24 overall and 31-5 in the conference with two NCAA Tournament appearances. In 1996, the Patriot League, which was originally founded based on the principle of need-based financial aid only, began allowing athletic scholarships. However, it was not until 2006 that Lafayette chose to do so. By no coincidence, during that span, Lafayette posted a 79-91 mark and was 38-44 in the league.

NATIONAL LEADER: According to the latest NCAA report of Division I institutions, Lafayette College ranks 10th in the nation in student-athlete graduation success rate (GSR). The Leopards posted an impressive 97 percent GSR, ranking well above the national GSR for Division I student-athletes of 82 percent. Lafayette was ranked third in 2010-11.

DELANEY'S CAREER DAY: Senior guard **Rob Delaney** scored a career-high 17 points in 32 minutes at Delaware (11/26). The bulk of Delaney's points came on drives to the hoop while he also added a three-pointer.

RECORD BREAKING: **Jim Mower's** 10 three-pointers erased the previous school record of nine set by Andrew Brown '09 on Dec. 21, 2007 at Mount St. Mary's and again vs. Army on Jan. 30, 2008.

A GAME EFFORT: Senior guard **Jim Mower** played 40 minutes against Wagner, the first time since Dec. 23, 1996 (Sam Gilbert vs. Maryland) that a player had played 40 minutes in a regulation game. He followed that with 39 minutes vs. Fairleigh Dickinson. Mower is averaging 35 minutes per game.

HELP FROM HINRICHS: Freshman guard **Seth Hinrichs** contributed 12 points on three three-pointers vs. Wagner (11/19) in a week that saw him named Patriot League Rookie of the Week.

MOWER ON THE MOVE: Senior guard **Jim Mower** is third for career three-point field goals with 207, surpassing Justin DeBerry '04. Mower needs 64 more to move into second and 78 to become the all-time leader.

HALL OF FAMER: Stefan Ciosici '00, the 1998 Patriot League Player of the Year was one of four former student-athletes inducted into the Maroon Club Hall of Fame's Class of 2011 on Nov. 18. He led Lafayette to two Patriot League regular-season titles, two Patriot League Tournament championships and back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1999 and 2000. The 6-11 center, who was also the 1996 Patriot League Rookie of the Year and MVP of the conference tournament in 2000, ranks fifth in Lafayette history with 1,496 career points and is the second-most prolific rebounder in Patriot League history with 831 boards. He is also among Lafayette's all-time leaders in blocked shots, free throws and field-goal percentage.

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS: Lafayette ranked 15th in the nation last season in free-throw percentage, knocking down a 76.1 percent clip (482-of-633). **Jim Mower** led the team at 87 percent (60-69). **This season**, Lafayette is shooting 75 percent from the stripe (155-for-208). Lafayette made 30-of-37 free throw attempts against St. Francis (N.Y.) when **Ryan Willen** hit 10-of-12. It was the first time since Feb. 18, 2007 vs. Lehigh that a Lafayette squad made 30-plus free throws. Willen followed with an 11-for-11 night vs. Wagner when Lafayette shot 18-of-22.

FRESH START: After earning the starting nod in the season opener at La Salle, **Seth Hinrichs** became the first freshman to start a season-opener for Lafayette in more than a decade. The last time a freshman had made an appearance in the starting five was the 1997-98 opener at St. John's on Nov. 15. Head coach Fran O'Hanlon put point guard Tim Bieg in the lineup against the Red Storm.

Necessitated by the losses of **Tony Johnson** and **Levi Giese**, Fran O'Hanlon started two freshmen vs. St. Francis (N.Y.), Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, Delaware and Princeton.

MEET THE CAPTAINS: Senior **Rob Delaney** and junior **Tony Johnson**, a preseason All-League selection, are holding the leadership reins for the 2011-12 season. Delaney started in 15 games last year and accounted for more than six points per game while Johnson led the team in assists with 117.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT: Senior forward **Ryan Willen** was named to the Capital One Academic All-District II Men's Basketball Team after last season. Willen averaged 10.4 points and 3.7 rebounds per game. Academically, he posted a 3.85 GPA in the spring as a Neuroscience major.

FOR STARTERS: Lafayette used 10 different starting lineups in 2010-11. In the first five games of 2011-12, **Fran O'Hanlon** used four different starting combinations and has used five for the season.

START WITHOUT ME: Lafayette is without the services of point guard **Tony Johnson** because of a back injury. In the last seven games of 2010-11, Johnson began to assert himself offensively and averaged 12.5 points and 4.8 assists per game. Junior forward **Levi Giese**, who started at power forward/center for the season opener, suffered a severe sprain of his right ankle and, like Johnson, is out indefinitely. Giese was battling a similar injury during the preseason.

The Leopards will also lead the Patriot League with at least six nationally-televised games, as MASN (available through both DIRECTV and DISH Network) will air Lafayette's entire slate of home league broadcasts on a tape-delay basis for the fourth straight season.

Ten of the 13 regular-season telecasts will be produced by the Lafayette Sports Network (LSN), which annually produces the most expansive and highest quality television packages in the Patriot League. Each of those broadcasts will air live regionally to more than 10 million viewers on RCN-4, RCN-8 and WBPH-60.

Through the Lafayette Sports Network's partnership with ESPN, select games will air on ESPN Full Court, ESPN's pay per view service, and ESPN3.com, ESPN's broadband service.

CBS College Sports will pick up two of the Leopards' Patriot League contests with the possible addition of two flex games at the end of the conference regular season. In addition both semifinals of the Patriot League Tournament and the championship game will be televised on CBS College Sports.

MASN continues as one of LSN's national distribution partners, airing at least six LSN telecasts nationally to more than 65 million households via both DIRECTV and DISH Network.

As an element of Lafayette's multi-media agreement with CBS Interactive, all LSN telecasts are streamed live on the internet and available worldwide through GoLeopards.com. Lafayette was the first of the CBS College Sports partners to make live video streaming available to fans worldwide when the 2000 Lafayette-Lehigh football game aired live on GoLeopards.com.

Emmy-nominated local sports broadcaster Gary Laubach will handle all of the Leopards' play-by-play duties for the 15th straight season. Former Lafayette men's basketball coach John Leone will provide color analysis for the 15th season. In his 10th year as a member of the announcing crew is RCN's Dan Mowdy, who will report on the Leopards from the sideline.

SUB!!!!: Fran O’Hanlon likes to run players in and out at stoppages of play. The Leopards have traditionally gone 10 deep into their bench, often substituting offense-defense as early as the first half.

THE PASSING GAME: Lafayette led the Patriot League with 14.9 assists per game in 2010-11. The Leopards dished off an assist on 63 percent of their baskets. This season Lafayette is averaging 12.3 per game and had a season-high 20 assists vs. Fairleigh Dickinson (11/22).

ALL-AROUND CONTRIBUTOR: When you think point guard, you think “pass first” and that is certainly the case with junior **Tony Johnson**. Johnson led the team with 3.8 assists per game in 2010-11. Rebounding has also been a strength, as he hauled in 4.2 per game (second on the team). In the scoring column, Johnson contributed 8.5 ppg.

THEY WENT AS THEY SHOT: In 2010-11, Lafayette was 12-3 when shooting a better percentage from the floor than its opponent and 1-16 when the reverse was true. This season, Lafayette is 3-0 when shooting a better field goal percentage than its opponent.

NATIONALLY RANKED FOES: The last time Lafayette beat a nationally ranked opponent was Dec. 2, 1978, a 77-70 victory over Rutgers. The last conference game that pitted Lafayette against a ranked opponent was Feb. 15, 2006, a 69-49 loss to Bucknell. Lafayette’s last game against a ranked opponent was Nov. 20, 2010 an 86-41 loss vs. No. 6/7 Villanova.

BASKETBALL IQ: Seven Lafayette basketball student-athletes were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll. Senior forward **Ryan Willen**, who played in every game last season and was third on the team in scoring with 10.4 points per game, led the Leopards with a 3.85 semester grade-point average. A Neuroscience major, Willen was also named a member of the inaugural Academic All-Patriot League Team and the Capital One Academic All-District II Team in February.

All-Patriot League First Team selection Jared Mintz ’11 and fellow graduates Deirunas Visockas ’11 and Ben Wheeler ’11 were named to the squad. Mintz led Lafayette with 15.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game last season while posting a 3.33 GPA in his final semester. He earned a degree in Biology. Visockas and Wheeler graduated with degrees in Economics and Business, sporting GPAs of 3.75 and 3.33, respectively in the spring. Government & Law majors **Rob Delaney** and Andy Moore also earned nods along with sophomore **Les Smith**, an Economics major.

CLASS ACTS: During the spring semester, nine men’s basketball players achieved a 3.0 or better grade-point average. **Ryan Willen** led the way with a 3.85 in Neuroscience.

THE PRESEASON POLL: Lafayette was picked to finish fourth in the Patriot League Preseason Poll of coaches and sports information directors. Lafayette was selected behind reigning Patriot League champion Bucknell, which returns four starters, Lehigh and Holy Cross. Bucknell was a unanimous choice as the top team, garnering 98 points in the poll while Lehigh (82), Holy Cross (73) and Lafayette (55) followed. American (47), Colgate (44), Navy (34) and Army (15) rounded out the poll.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - The Lafayette men's basketball team opened its season with a 79-53 loss to La Salle on Friday evening at Gola Arena. La Salle led wire-to-wire and opened the game with a 13-2 run over the first 3:10 of the game. The Leopards could not get over the hump, as Wagner scored eight of the next 10, capped off by a steal and a breakaway dunk by Josh Thompson, to put the Seahawks up 65-58 with 5:01 left. Two Willen freebies made it a five-point game with 3:23 to play. Wagner made its final nine free throw attempts in the last minute and a half, which sealed the victory. Six of the nine free throws came from Latif Rivers, who scored a team-high 19 points for Wagner.

EASTON, Pa. - A dominating second-half performance led by **Jim Mower's** career-high 37 points propelled Lafayette to an 85-74 comeback victory over Fairleigh Dickinson. The Leopards erased a seven-point halftime deficit, outscoring FDU 50-32 over the final 20 minutes. Mower scored 28 of his 37 points in the second half, setting the school record with 10 three-pointers and scoring his 1,000th career point. Back to back buckets from **Ryan Willen** gave Lafayette its largest lead of the opening half, and the Leopards led 21-17 with 8:43 on the clock. Trailing by four, the Knights used a 13-0 spurt to take a 30-21 lead with 3:57 to play. **Seth Hinrichs** hit a layup to stop the bleeding following the stoppage and FDU took a 42-35 lead into the break. Lafayette scored on its first three possessions of the second stanza, with two trifectas from Mower and a Hinrichs driving lay-in, cutting the deficit to 44-43. Seven straight points from FDU, including another Melquan Bolding triple, put the Knights up 51-43 with 16:13 to play. Mower answered with two more three-pointers, the second of which made him the 38th player in Lafayette history to score more than 1,000 points in a career. Sparked by Mower's consecutive left wing threes, Lafayette went on a 30-6 run over an 8:59 span, ending on Mower's ninth three-pointer with 7:14 to play. Mower scored 17 of Lafayette's 30 points during that stretch and that basket put Lafayette ahead 73-57 and gave the Leopards a 16-point advantage, its largest of the contest Fairleigh Dickinson cut the Leopards' lead to 10, but Mower drained another try to set the record previously held by Andrew Brown '09. Mower finished 12-for-16 from the field and 10-for-13 from beyond the arc in 39 minutes. **Nick Petkovich** scored 13 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in the game, his first career-double. He also set a career-high with four rejections. Also scoring in double figures was Willen, who added 17 points and five assists. **Rob Delaney** scored nine points and dished out six assists.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Lafayette used a controlled effort to churn out a 61-57 win over Penn State. The Leopards held the Big 10's leading scorer, Tim Frazier, to three points and 0-of-12 from the field. **Jim Mower**, **Seth Hinrichs** and **Nick Petkovich** scored in double figures while **Rob Delaney** distributed a career-high nine assists. Mower did the bulk of his work at the line, converting 8-of-9, including two free throws in the final seconds to seal the victory, the first for a Patriot League opponent against Penn State since the league's formation in 1990-91.
