VANDERBILT IN SEASON OPENERS

Vanderbilt will open its 124th football season on August 29 against Ole Miss, looking to improve on a 78-41-4 all-time mark in openers.

The contest marks the second straight year Vanderbilt will open with an SEC foe. In 2012, the Commodores fell to No. 9 17-13 in Nashville.

- Some other notes on Vanderbilt in season-openers:
- ★ Vanderbilt is opening at home for the fifth straight season. It also marks the Commodores' second straight Thursday night opener.
- ★ Vanderbilt has won four of its last six season openers.
- ★ The 'Dores are 3-14 when facing an SEC team in the first game of the season.
- ★ The last win in a season-opener versus an SEC team came in 1988, (24-20 over Mississippi State in Nashville).

night. That year, the Commodores opened with a win at Miami (Ohio).

The Ole Miss game will mark Vanderbilt's eighth Thursday night appearance, dating back to a 1996 home stint against nationally ranked Notre Dame. A victory over the Rebels would even the Commodores' all-time record on Thursdays at 4-4.

FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 15-11 overall. His .577 winning percentage is the best by a Commodore mentor since eventual College Football Hall of Famer Red Sanders had a .578 winning percentage from 1940-48.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years was Hall of Famer Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

VANDY ACTIVE WIN STREAK: T-4TH IN NCAA

Vanderbilt enters the 2013 riding the SEC's longest win streak and among the nation's

The Commodores' sevengame streak, dating back to a Oct. 15 loss to No. 4 Florida, is tied for NCAA's fourth longest behind Ohio State (12), Arkansas State (8) and Stanford (8).

The streak ranks among the Top Ten in program history. It ranks T-10th along with similar streaks in 1920-21, 1915 and 1806-07

The longest win streak in Vanderbilt history came before World War I. From late in the 1903 campaign to early in the 1905 season, the Commodores captured 13 straight games. That stretch includes the first 11 games Hall of Famer Dan McGugin coached at Vanderbilt.

A win against Ole Miss will match the program's longest streak the 1948 'Dores won their final eight regular season games.

VANDY STAFF: FULLY INTACT FROM 2012

Vanderbilt is the only SEC team that will have its entire coaching staff intact from last year.

It also marks the first time since 2009 that the Commodore staff remained intact.

Vanderbilt is one of nine schools from the NCAA's FBS subdivision that will return intact staffs. The others are Baylor, Louisville, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Notre Dame and Ohio State.

MORE ON THE OLE MISS SERIES

The Commodores have captured the last three games played against Ole Miss – and six of the last eight games played between the teams.

The Commodores' current three-game streak against Ole Miss is the longest since the 1949-52 seasons. The last four-game Vanderbilt winning streak in the series dates back to a 1925-1938

Vanderbilt has also captured three of the four games between the schools played in Nashville.

This year will mark the 88th game between the two schools, who have played annually since the 1970 season. The only team that Vanderbilt has faced more often than Ole Miss is Tennessee (107).

Despite the 87 previous games, this will be only the fourth season that Vanderbilt has opened the year against Ole Miss. The Commodores are 2-1 in season openers vs. the Rebels: winning in 1900 (6-0) and 1929 (9-7) and falling in 2003 (21-24).

MORE KEY RECENT MOMENTS IN SERIES

2011 A decisive 30-7 home victory for the 'Dores in mid-September gave James Franklin his first SEC victory as Vanderbilt head coach.

2010 Warren Norman scored on a 80-yard carry to seal a road victory for the Commodores. Vanderbilt jumped out to a 14-0 early lead after **Zac Stacy's** 35-yard TD rush and a 21-yard INT return by **Eddie Foster**.

2008 The Commodore defense forces six turnovers, helping Vanderbilt edge the Rebels 23-17 in Oxford. Safety **Ryan Hamilton** earns national player of the week honors after tying a school record with three INTs.

2007 Vanderbilt used 119 rushing yards and three TDs by **Cassen Jackson-Garrison** to record a 31-17 victory on campus.

2002 Freshman RB/KR **Kwane Doster** posted one of the most productive games in team and SEC history, compiling 344 all-purpose yards, including 101 yards rushing and a league-record 243 yards in kickoff returns.

LAST TIME VS. OLE MISS

'DORES RALLY FROM 17-POINT DEFICIT TO DOWN REBELS IN OXFORD

OXFORD, Miss. – It was a clutch moment that has so often flummoxed Vanderbilt's football program for the better part of its history.

But in yet another piece of mounting evidence that the Commodores are for real, Jordan Rodgers calmly surveyed the field and found Chris Boyd wide open for a 26-yard touchdown pass with 52 seconds remaining to give Vanderbilt a 27-26 victory over Mississippi.

It ended a thrilling comeback for the Commodores (6-4, 3-3 SEC), who trailed 23-6 early in the third quarter but rallied for their fourth straight win.

Now the postseason is in Vanderbilt's future - again. The 'Dores are poised to go to their second straight bowl game for the first time in school history.

Second-year coach James Franklin has engineered the quick turnaround, turning

Vanderbilt into an SEC threat nearly overnight.

"I'm looking forward to the day when I don't have to say first ever, because we want this to be the culture at Vanderbilt. A culture of winning," Franklin said. "Our coaches and players believe it."

RETURNING TO WORK AFTER BACK-TO-BACK BOWL APPEARANCES

Vanderbilt returns to action this Thursday against Ole Miss off one of the most impressive seasons in Commodore gridiron history.

The list of program achievements witnessed in 2012 is long, but perhaps none top the fact that

Vanderbilt fans have now witnessed their Commodores making bowl appearances in back-to-back seasons.

The postseason accomplishment tells college football fans across the nation how far Head Coach **James Franklin** has brought the Vanderbilt program. The Commodores are headed toward a bright future that bears no resemblance to much of the previous six decades on campus. The team sports the longest active win streak among SEC teams. The 2012 Vanderbilt offense ranked as the program's most explosive since World War I. For a second straight year, the Commodore defense ranked among the nation's Top 25 in key statistical categories in 2012.

FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC ACHIEVEMENT ON CAMPUS

TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before — in 1915 and 1904.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

FOUR 'DORES PLAYING NEW POSITIONS

Four players will appear at new positions this season.

On offense, Josh Grady (R-So.) has moved to WR to ΩB and Derek King (R-So.) will move to RB from DB.

On defense, **Adam Butler** (R-Fr.) is competing for a starting job at DT after practicing on the OL last year. **Torey Agee** (R-Fr.) also moved to DT from DE.

'DORES SELECT NINE TEAM CAPTAINS

The Commodores will feature nine team captains this season. Head Coach James Franklin announced today that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the upcoming campaign, which starts next Thursday, Aug. 29, against Southeastern Conference Western Division rival Ole Miss.

The 2013 captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since QB **Jay Cutler** (2003-05) to Johnson, May and Marshall are earning captain status for the second consecutive year.

CARTA-SAMUELS The Wyoming transfer has earned team's starting QB role, replacing two-year starter Jordan Rodgers.

EAST A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers.

GARNHAM Ranked among SEC LB leaders with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior.

HAL The Jim Thorpe Award contender ranks as the SEC's returning leader with 16 passes defended, including pair of INTs.

JOHNSON The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC is team's active leader with 38 consecutive career starts.

MARSHALL The senior ranks among the active co-leaders with 60 solo tackles and was third on the team with 84 total tackles.

MATTHEWS One of the nation's top receivers, the First Team All-SEC senior is a Biletnikoff Trophy and Maxwell Award candidate.

MAY A 13-game starter last year, May posting single-season highs with 25 solo tackles and 10.5 tackles for loss as a junior.

SPEAR The senior is coming off best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, including converting team-record 20 field goals.

SEVEN OFFENSIVE STARTERS ARE BACK; UNIT MUST REPLACE RODGERS & STACY

Several important playmakers will return in 2013 as Vanderbilt coaches look to build on the most impressive two-year offensive run in modern team history.

While the squad returns key receivers and much of an improved offensive line, the offensive staff hopes that a host of talented performers can step forward to replace production lost by graduation of All-SEC running back **Zac Stacy** and two-year starting QB **Jordan Rodgers**. Stacy became the most decorated back in team history, setting new Commo-

dore career standards with 3,145 rushing yards and 30 rushing TDs; Rodgers put together one of the best seasons ever by a Vanderbilt senior quarterback, passing for more than 2,500 yards and 15 TDs.

Topping the list of returnees are Biletnikoff Award candidate **Jordan Matthews** at wide receiver and All-SEC offensive line prospect **Wesley Johnson**.

TOP OFFENSIVE RETURNEES

They are backed by two-year wide receiver starter **Jonathan Krause**, and returning line starters **Joe Townsend**, **Jake Bernstein** and **Andrew Bridges**.

Redshirt senior **Austyn Carta-Samuels** has earned the starting job as Rodgers' replacement. The strong-armed Carta-Samuels, who started in Vanderbilt's victory over Presbyterian last year, beat out three other candidates: versatile sophomore **Josh Grady**, redshirt freshman **Patton Robinette** and true freshman **Johnny McCrary**.

The Commodores will enter the season with a trio of backs — **Wesley Tate** (R-Sr.), **Jerron Seymour** (R-So.) and **Brian Kimbrow** (So.) — battled for Stacy's former role. Tate rushed for 376 yards and was most effective in short-yardage situations where he produced eight touchdowns. Kimbrow was an explosive threat as a freshman, averaging 6.3 yards on 66 carries. Seymour did not play in 2012, but was the team's No. 2 rusher in 2011.

SPEAR COMING OFF ALL-SEC YEAR

after establishing a new Vanderbilt single-season record with 20 field goals.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, is a preseason candidate for the Lou
Groza Award, and a First Team All-SEC honoree from coaches and writers.

Spear also ranked among the SEC's most accurate kickers. Spear finished the year third in the SEC with a 83.3 percent success rate. He was 20-of-24 on the season. He also made 11 of his 12 field goal attempts and was a perfect 15-of-15 inside 43 yards. Spear's misses are from 44, 44, 46 and 51 yards.

Spear also set a new Vanderbilt single-season scoring mark for points by a kicker. The two-year co-captain finished the year with 87 points, 14 more than the former record set by Ricky Anderson in 1982.

Spear also was recently selected as a captain for the third straight season. The only other recent Commodore to serve three years as a captain was quarterback **Jay Cutler** (2003-05).

SEVEN STARTERS BACK ON DEFENSE; PRODUCTIVE STANDOUTS RETURN

The three top tacklers from a year ago, an All-SEC cornerback and a productive line co-captain top the list of defensive players back for the Commodores in 2013.

The list of standouts back includes six extremely productive seniors Karl Butler (LB), Kenny Ladler (safety), Chase Garnham (LB), Andre Hal (CB), Javon Marshall (safety), Walker May (DE) and Jared Morse (DT).

The biggest personnel losses for a defensive staff guided by coordinator **Bob Shoop** are **Rob Lohr** (DT), **Johnell Thomas** (DE), **Archibald Barnes** (LB) and **Trey Wilson** (CB).

The defensive staff has 22 letterwinners, including the six returning starters, back to combat the graduation losses.

Six of the team's top seven tacklers from 2012 – Ladler,

Garnham, Marshall, May, Hal and Butler – are returning this season. Among the other top key contributors expected at spring drills at **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) and **Caleb Azubike** (So., DE) the team's No. 2 and No. 3 sack specialists from a year ago.

MOST OF TEAM'S TOP SPECIALISTS ARE BACK

The Vanderbilt corps of specialists includes a record-setting senior placekicker and one of the top punt returners in recent team history.

Carey Spear, an All-SEC selection in 2012 after booting a team-record 20 field goals, is expected to handle the team's placekicking and kickoff responsibilities. Spear gives the Commodores a strong-legged, accurate kicker who brings tremendous leadership abilities to the special team units. Senior Jonathan Krause became one of the SEC's top return specialists in 2012, averaging 11.2 yards on 25 punt returns. Krause, who took two punts for touchdowns last year, has the second best average of all SEC returners from the 2012 season.

The competition between **Colby Cooke** (R-Fr.) and **Taylor Hudson** (Jr.) for the vacant punting role have been superb through preseason camp.

Vanderbilt also returns junior **Andrew East**, a two-year starting snapper on all conversion and punt units.

The team's top kick returners, **Brian Kimbrow** (So.) and **Andre Hal** (Sr.) also are back. Both averaged more than 22 yards per return last year.

THE WILKINS: BROTHER VS. BROTHER

This Thursday promises to be an interesting one for **Billy** and **Angie Wilkins** of suburban Memphis.

The Wilkins could have sons on opposing sidelines when the Commodores and Rebels meet in Nashville. Their oldest son, **Trey Wilkins**, is a redshirt junior receiver for the Commodores who could see his first action in a Vanderbilt uniform against Ole Miss. Their youngest son, **Jordan Wilkins**, was recruited by Vanderbilt but picked Ole Miss, and is currently a freshman running back prospects for the Rebels.

- Johnson has never been called for a single holding penalty.
- Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 6.5 sacks on 1,021 career pass attempts, or one sack every 157 pass plays.
 - Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012.
- Johnson has produced 152 knockdown blocks, 37 intimidation blocks and 106 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.
- Johnson has been on the field for every Vanderbilt touchdown and PAT for the last three seasons.
- Johnson has played 2,364 career snaps: 1,578 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 67 at tight end. He has played 98.3 percent of the team's snaps over the last three years.

Vince Taylor (R-Jr., Hattiesburg) is expected to earn his first career start at defensive tackle against the Rebels. Taylor, one of the strongest Commodores, is coming off arguably the most impressive preseason performance of any Vanderbilt interior lineman. Jahmel McIntosh (R-So., Cleveland) is a top safety reserve in the Commodore secondary.

A First Team All-State player at Hattiesburg's Oak Grove HS, Taylor helped the Warriors to back-to-back deep runs in the Mississippi 5A state playoffs. One of Taylor's classmates at Oak Grove was Steve McNair Jr., son of the Titans' late standout. On occasion, his team enjoyed summer workouts with local resident and NFL QB great Brett Favre, who served as Oak Grove's offensive coordinator in 2012.

McIntosh prepped at Cleveland HS, the same school that produced Ole Miss' **Terrell Grant** (R-Sr., WR).

FOUR 'DORES EARN COACHES RECOGNITION

For the first time in recent years, three Commodore standouts have earned preseason First-Team All-SEC recognition from the league's 14 head coaches. A fourth Vanderbilt player received second team honors.

The coaches' ballot, the last preseason unit named prior to the season opener, includes **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) as first team recipients. A fourth Commodore, **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) also was named as a Second-Team All-SEC member by the coaches.

It marks the most Commodores to be recognized in the coaches' preseason ballot since 2009 when five Vanderbilt players — Patrick Benoist (LB), Chris Marve (LB), Myron Lewis (CB), Brett Upson (punter) and Ryan Hamilton (safety) — were named. None of the 2009 performers were first team recipients.

2014 SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED; EIGHT HOME GAMES SLATED

Home games with Ole Miss, South Carolina, Florida and Tennessee will highlight Vanderbilt's 2014 football schedule, SEC officials announced Aug. 21.

The 2014 Vanderbilt schedule features eight home games, including the first four contests of the season. The 'Dores will conclude the regular season against Tennessee, reviving season-ending rivalry that existed for 67 years until being interrupted in 2007.

The 2014 season opens against Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28 and is followed by Ole Miss, which will be visiting for the second straight year, on Sept. 6. UMass and South Carolina follow to cap the monthlong home stand.

VANDERBILT POINT PRODUCTION INCREASES, 2012 SCORING MOST SINCE WORLD WAR I

The Commodores are coming off their most productive season in terms of points since the post-World War I era.

The Commodores totalled 390 points in 2012, the highest single-season total since Dan McGugin's 1915 Vanderbilt squad averaged 51.4 points during a 9-1 campaign.

The 2012 squad became just the third Vanderbilt team since the late 1940s to surpass 300 total points.

The 2012 squad also averaged 30.0 points, the program's highest single-season average since the 1916 Commodores averaged 36.4 points during a 7-1-1 season.

Vanderbilt also posted greater point production as the 2012 season endured. The Commodores averaged 41.7 points in the final six games and tallied at least 40 points against four opponents from BCS-affiliated leagues: Kentucky and Tennessee from the Southeastern Conference, and Wake Forest and North Carolina State from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Vanderbilt outscored its 13 foes in 2012 by a 147-point margin (390-243). The 147-point differential is the second largest in modern Commodore gridiron history. Since World War II, the only point differential larger than 2012 came during the 1955 campaign when Vanderbilt outscored its opponents by 154 points for the season (240-86).

RIVALS.COM: VANDY 2013 SIGNEES AMONG NATION'S TOP 20 CLASSES

On Feb. 1, Head Coach **James Franklin** and his coaching staff delivered on a promise to Vanderbilt fans by signing what recruiting experts regard as the best class of national prospects in team history.

Franklin praised the 24-player class that ranks among the finest recruiting achievements of any coaching staff in the nation. According to Rivals.com, the class ranks 19th nationally, making it the highest ranked collection of signees in Commodore history.

The 2013 class includes 11 players on offense, 12 on defense and one kicking specialist. It features three prep All-Americans and 16 players that earned rare four-star evaluations from national recruiting services. Fifteen members of the class made appearances in prestigious postseason all-star games. Five different signees played huge roles on state championship squads. Twenty members of the class were senior captains.

The recruiting effort attacked depth concerns. The signing class includes five wide receivers, five defensive backs, four defensive linemen, and three linebackers.

If Johnson starts every game of his final season, he could become the all-time team leader in career starts. **Chris Marve**, a linebacker from 2007-11, and **Brian Stamper**, an offensive lineman from 2003-07, share the team mark with 48 starts.

Kenny Ladler, a senior safety, and two senior receivers, Jordan Matthews and Jonathan Krause, are

the closest to Johnson's starts total. Ladler enters the 2013 campaign with 27 starts, Matthews with 25 and Krause with 23.

the nation's elite for a second straight year under coordinator **Bob Shoop**. It ranked among the NCAA Top 25 in numerous key categories: 15th in the nation in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 18.7 ppg; 19th in total defense, holding foes to an average of 333.9 yards; and 14th in pass defense, limiting opponents to just 175.8 yards.

The unit also ranked even higher nationally in other stat categories.

The Commodores ranked sixth with a 102.4 defensive pass efficiency rating and 12th with 97 tackles for loss.

CORING DEFENSE

Shoop's squad also performed extremely well in third down situations. The team ranked No. 25 in the NCAA in third down efficiency (34 percent) and 21st in first downs allowed (18.2 pg.). On the season, opponents have been limited to a quick 3-and-out possession on 31% of their drives.

produced more points, more total yards and more first downs on offense, and allowed fewer points on defense than their 2011 counterparts.

In 2012, Vanderbilt averaged 30.0 points, 3.3 more than in 2011. The 2012 team also averaged 40.6 more yards of offense: 38.8 passing and 1.8 rushing. The improved production allowed the 2012 Commodores to register 1.7 more first downs per game.

The 2012 offense also averaged 5.6 yards per play, a 0.3-yard improvement over 2011.

On defense, the 2012 Commodores registered two shutouts for the first time in nearly 50 years and allowed 18.2 points per game, 3.4 points fewer than in 2011.

The Commodores improved in pass offense and pass defense in 2012. The offense's 138.9 pass efficiency rating last year was far superior to the 110.8 efficiency rating. Vanderbilt's pass efficiency on defense was 102.7 in 2012, eight points better than the previous year.

The 2012 squad also produced more sacks and allowed less sacks by opposing defenses. The 2012 team edition also was flagged for 5.3 fewer yards in penalties.

KRAUSE AMONG SEC'S BEST RETURNERS

Jonathan Krause (Sr., WR/PR) ranks among the SEC's top punt returners His 2012 average of 11.2 yards ranks second behind Missouri's Marcus Murphy (13.9 ypr) among active SEC return specialists.

Krause's punt return average is the third highest by a Commodore in the last three decades, trailing only D.J. Moore (14.4 yd. avg., 2008) and Jeff Brothers (12.3 yd. avg., 1992).

In 2012, Krause also became the first Commodore to return two punts for touchdowns since 1968.
