Balcomb enters the 2006-07 season looking for her fifth straight trip to the NCAA Tournament with the Commodores. In 13-plus seasons as a head coach, Balcomb has compiled 273 career wins in 417 games for a .655 winning percentage. Eight Balcomb teams have advanced to postseason play, including an NCAA Elite 8 trip with Xavier and a pair of journeys to the Sweet 16 with the Commodores.

Now in her fifth season in Nashville, Balcomb has compiled a 110-40 record at Vanderbilt, including a SEC Tournament Championship in only her second season. She has coached 12 players who have received All-Conference accolades and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft.

NEXT TIME OUT

Vanderbilt travels to Fayetteville this weekend for the return trip of the season series. The Commodores won the initial meeting between the two schools, 98-61.

Last year in Fayetteville, however, the LadyBucks tied the game with a half-court shot to end regulation before a free throw in overtime sent the Commodores back to Nashville with a loss. Vanderbilt leads the all-time series, 14-5, and has won seven of the last eight meetings.

VETERAN LEADERSHIP KEY TO SUCCESS

Vanderbilt three seniors have logged 329 career games coming into this weekend, including 277 games started. That experience, which includes three trips to the NCAA Tournament and the 2004 SEC Tournament Championship, has played a key role in VU's success this season.

SENIORS EXEMPLIFY CLASS

Point guard Dee Davis and forward Carla Thomas were recently named two of the top 30 candidates for the 2007 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to the senior basketball player who excels both on and off the court.

The nation's premier tribute to college seniors, the Lowe's Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award was launched during the 2001-02 season to honor the attributes of college basketball seniors who remain committed to their university and pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring.

This year's list of 30 candidates includes representatives from 27 schools and 13 conferences. On the women's side, the Southeastern Conference placed seven athletes on the list -- led by Vanderbilt's duo. The North Carolina and Duke women's programs also have double candidates.

LIEBERMAN, NAISMITH, WOODEN WATCHING DAVIS

Everybody's watching as Dee Davis writes her name in Vanderbilt's record book. The Cincinnati native has been named a preseason candidate for a number of prestigious awards. The Naismith and Wooden Awards, which both honor a national player of the year, and the Nancy Lieberman Award, given to the nation's top point guard, all include Davis on their short lists.

ESPN.COM LAUDS DAVIS

Senior point guard Dee Davis was named one of the five best point guards in the country, in a poll of national experts released on ESPN.com.

Davis is joined on the list by Lindsay Harding of Duke, Lyndsey Medders of Iowa State and Renee Montgomery of Connecticut, all ranked just behind North Carolina's Ivory Latta.

Davis led the Southeastern Conference with 6.8 assists per game as a junior during the 2005-06 season. She earned preseason All-SEC honors from league coaches and media.

The voting panel featured ESPN analysts Nancy Lieberman and Beth Mowins, as well as Mechelle Voepel, Graham Hays and Melanie Jackson of ESPN.com.

DAVIS, THOMAS: PRESEASON ALL-SEC (COACHES)

Seniors Dee Davis and Carla Thomas were named preseason All-Southeastern Conference selections by a vote of league coaches.

Davis, who led the SEC in assists a season ago, was a first-team choice. Her 6.8 assists per game last year ranked third in the nation and earned her a spot on the Nancy Lieberman Award watch list.

Thomas led the Commodores in scoring last season at 12.4 points per game, surpassing 1,000 points for her career early in the conference season. After earning second-team All-SEC from the media at the conclusion of last season, the coaches made Thomas a second-team preseason pick this year.

Vanderbilt joins Georgia and LSU with two honorees on the Coaches' All-SEC team, while Tennessee led the league with three selections. Georgia's Tasha Humphrey, LSU's Sylvia Fowles and Tennessee's Candace Parker were all unanimous first-team choices.

DORES 4TH, DAVIS & THOMAS HONORED BY MEDIA

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth overall in the Southeastern Conference, according to media voting at the league's Media Days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

Melanie Balcomb's fifth squad at Vanderbilt (85) was predicted to finish behind Tennessee (19), Georgia (48) and LSU (51). Tennessee was picked to finish first in the league by all 19 media voting in the women's poll.

Commodore senior guard Dee Davis and senior forward Carla Thomas both were chosen All-SEC Second Team honorees by the attending media.

Tennessee's Candace Parker was selected as the SEC's Player of the Year.

WHO DOESN'T LIKE FREE?

The Commodores make a living at the free throw line, shooting an SEC-best .737 from the charity stripe.

Senior forward Carla Thomas ranks second all-time at Vanderbilt in free throw percentage. She had made 19 straight free throws before missing in the South Carolina game. Earlier this season, Thomas also had separate streaks of 14 and 15 made free throws.

impressive streaks. Sophomore Christina Wirth hit 13 straight free throws after missing the first of three against TAMUCC.

Senior guard Caroline Williams made 13 consecutive free throws from the Colorado game through the TAMUCC contest and is leading the team with a .938 free throw percentage.

Senior guard Dee Davis closed the 2005-06 season by making 27 straight free throws after missing her second of six attempts in a home game against Georgia. Davis opened the season by making her first four attempts at Colorado for a total streak of 31 straight makes.

VU's 20/20 VISION

Vanderbilt earned its 20th overall 20-win season and fourth straight under Melanie Balcomb last year when the Commodores defeated Alabama, 84-62, in the opening round of the 2006 SEC Tournament. The Commodores have won at least 20 games in 13 of the last 14 seasons, and seven in a row. A complete list is below:

DAVIS NEARS ASSISTS MARK

Senior Dee Davis stands only three assists away from passing former Commodore and current Alabama Director of Operations Ashley McElhiney for first all-time at Vanderbilt. McElhiney dished out 673 assists in 132 career games. Davis is on pace to surpass her mark in only 113 career games.

McElhiney is also currently tied for eighth place all-time in the SEC with Tennessee's Holly Warlick.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Senior Carla Thomas earned Most Valuable Player honors following the 2006 VU Holiday Classic. Thomas poured in 32 points in a pair of Commodores victories to lead Vanderbilt to its second home tournament championship of the season. Senior Dee Davis and sophomore Christina Wirth also earned All-Tournament accolades for their performances.

Senior Caroline Williams was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament after leading the Commodores past Florida Atlantic and No. 16 California. Williams was VU's leading scorer during both games. Thomas also earned All-Tournament honors for her performance, which included an impressive first half that helped Vanderbilt take an early lead over California in Saturday's championship game.

Last season, Thomas earned MVP honors at the 2005 Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. Thomas averaged 21 points and eight rebounds in two VU victories. Williams and Liz Sherwood also were featured on that All-Tournament team.

Sherwood earned a similar honor at the 2005 WBCA/BTI Classic after a pair of impressive performances against Arizona State and Clemson. She led the Commodores with 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.

THOMAS' TIMELINE

• Thomas became the 26th Commodore to score 1,000 points on Jan. 12, 2006 with a layup less than a minute into a game against Mississippi State. She was only the 11th VU player to reach 1,000 points prior to her senior season.

• Thomas entered VU's all-time Top 20 on Feb. 12, 2006, at Tennessee, scoring her 1,105th career point on a lay-up with 6:31 remaining in the first half. She passed Mara Cunningham, who scored 1,104 points during her Vanderbilt career (1993-96).

• Thomas passed Jillian Danker for 19th on the all-time scoring list on Feb. 23, 2006, against Kentucky, converting a jumper in the lane (off an assist from point guard Dee Davis) for her 10th point of the game (1,136th of her career) with 10:08 remaining in the second half.

• Thomas finished the 2005-06 season with 1,223 points, good for 19th all-time at Vanderbilt.

• Thomas made quick work of moving up the scoring list this season, opening the year with 26 points at Colorado on Nov. 12, 2006, to jump from 19th to 17th on the all-time list.

• After scoring nine points in the first half, Thomas poured in Vanderbilt's first eight points of the second half and then passed Carolyn Peck for 18th all-time with a lay-up at the 10:36 mark (assisted by Davis as part of a three-point play).

• Later in that game, Thomas capped another three-point play at the 5:52 mark of the second half to pass Misty Lamb for 17th all-time.

• Thomas moved into 16th all-time on Nov. 20, 2006, with 16 points against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. At the 14:21 mark of the first

half, Thomas converted a lay-up (off an assist from guard Jennifer Risper) to give her 1,296 career points.

• After scoring 32 points (one shy of her career high) at UAB and 19 points in 18 minutes against Clemson, Thomas stood only five points behind 15th place.

• With a team-high 14 points against Duke, Thomas jumped Ashley Earley and Deborah Denton on the same night to move into 14th place. At the 1:39 mark of the first half, Thomas scored her sixth point of the game on a jumper in the paint to slide past early. She tied and then overtook Denton with two made free throws at the 2:28 mark of the second.

• Thomas scored 18 points at South Florida to jump two spots in the rankings. She moved past Julie Powell into 13th place with her fourth point of the game on a jumper off an assist from Merideth Marsh. She later passed the 1,400-point threshold and Donna Harris (for 12th place) with her 10th point of the game on a layup at the 6:08 mark of the first half, assisted by Jennifer Risper.

• Thomas posted her second double-double of the season in VU's rout of No. 20 Arkansas, scoring 12 points to pull within 18 of former teammate Jenni Benningfield.

• She tied Benningfield with a pair of free throws in VU's loss at Ole Miss (her 16th & 17th consecutive makes at the charity stripe).

• Thomas scored 26 at South Carolina to pass Benningfield and Karen Booker (1,522), ending the contest with 1,527 points -- only 10 away from ninth place.

• She scored 10 points in a win over Florida to reach ninth place in a tie with former Commodore and WNBA star Sheri Sam (1,537 points).

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Tennessee coach Pat Summitt didn't have to wait long to get her 900th career victory.

Tennessee (18-0, 4-0 SEC) had never gone through a first half without leading at least once until this game, and the Lady Vols trailed by 14 late in the half.

Vanderbilt (13-5, 2-2) looked ready to end that skid and get its first victory against the Lady Vols since Feb. 2, 2002. As well as the Commodores shot, they couldn't stop Tennessee from turning their turnovers into 25 points.

Caroline Williams led Vanderbilt with 21 points, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range. Dee Davis added 20 points.

The Lady Vols, who trailed 33-19 in the first half, didn't take their first lead until 45:44 with 14:53 left on a pair of fast-break layups by Hornbuckle coming off a Parker block, then an Anosike steal.

Vanderbilt last led 50-49 on a 3-pointer by Cherish Stringfield. Then Tennessee scored 19 of the next 21 points in taking its biggest lead at 68-52 with 5:47 to go on a pair of Anosike free throws.

The Commodores came into the game as the nation's fourth-best shooting team, and they shot 54 percent in the first half. They finished 10-of-22 from 3-point range.

They hit four three's in a 14-0 spurt capped by Davis' three-pointer from the top of the key for a 33-19 lead with 5:13 left in the first half.

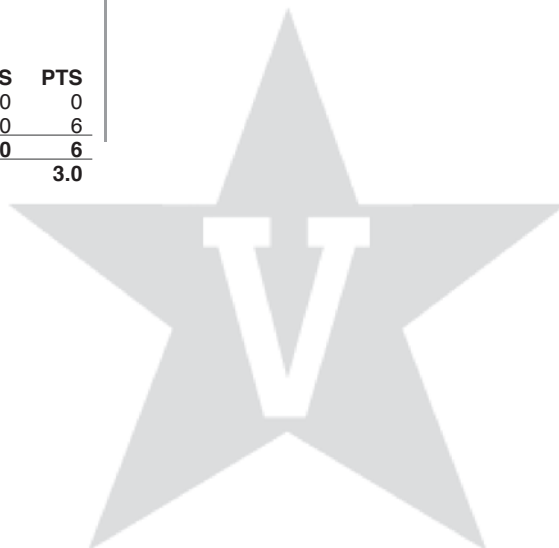
Series Notes vs. Tennessee

Tonight's game marks the 53rd meeting between Vanderbilt and Tennessee in a series that began on Nov. 21, 1979 in Nashville. The Lady Volunteers claim a victory from the 1975-76 season in their overall records, but the game was contested two years before Vanderbilt adopted women's basketball as a varsity sport prior to the 1977-78 season.

Four of Vanderbilt's six wins in the series have come at Memorial Gymnasium, including the Commodores' most recent victory in the series in 2002. That victory followed up VU's second win over Tennessee in SEC Tournament action, as the Dores claimed victory over the then-No. 1 ranked Lady Vols in the 2001 SEC semifinals.

Tennessee has claimed the last 11 meetings in the series, including four straight wins in Nashville. Last year, UT Head Coach Pat Summitt earned her 900th career victory by defeating the Commodores in Nashville.

Since 1993-94, the Commodores and Lady Vols have played a home-and-home series every year.

Four prep standouts inked a National Letter of Intent during the early period to attend Vanderbilt and play women's basketball for Coach Balcomb.

Chanel Chisholm (Long Island, N.Y.), Jence Rhoads (Slippery Rock, Pa.), Rebecca Silinski (Birmingham, Ala.) and Hannah Tuomi (Brighton, Colo.) all plan to enroll at Vanderbilt and begin their collegiate eligibility in the Fall of 2007.

"We are extremely excited about next year's incoming class," Balcomb said. "Our staff has worked very hard evaluating talent and establishing relationships, and we couldn't be happier with the four student-athletes who have chosen to come to Vanderbilt. This is an extremely talented class that is bound to make an immediate impact on our team."

Chisholm recently moved into Scout.com's National Hot 100. Playing at North Babylon High School, she was named to the 2006 All-Island Team after averaging 21 points, eight rebounds, five assists and two steals during her junior season. Chisholm led the Lady Bulldogs to an 18-4 record and League IV championship. Off the court, Chisholm also competed as a sprinter for her school's track team.

Rhoads, a point guard at Slippery Rock High School, was ranked No. 25 in the nation by

Scout.com. As a junior for the Rockets, she earned all-state honors and was the co-recipient of the Swin Cash District 10 Player of the Year award from the Western Pennsylvania Youth Basketball Club. Rhoads led her club squad, Tri-State Rock Solid, to the finals of the adidas Tournament of Champions and was invited to the Top Ten All-American Camp.

A 6-3 forward from nearby Birmingham, Ala., Silinski was an honorable-mention all-state selection by the Alabama Sports Writers Association last season. Senior Caroline Williams added 21 points, while sophomore Christina Wirth had 14.

The Lady Toppers were led by 10 points from Cammie Campbell. VU's Thomas scored the half's last four points, and eight of Vanderbilt's final 10, to bring VU within 43-37 at the break.

Western made 6-of-9 three-point attempts in the first half, but were limited to one three-pointer on three tries in the second period. Vanderbilt, on the other hand, made 17-of-24 field goal attempts in the second half to outscore Western Kentucky by 14.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The 15th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team won its home opener Saturday against Dartmouth, 79-49, in Memorial Gymnasium.

Senior Carla Thomas led all scorers with 21 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the field. All 12 of Vanderbilt players saw action during the game, with everyone scoring except for senior guard Caroline Williams. Williams came into Saturday's game averaging 21 points in VU's first two contests.

"The reason we got off to a slow start was because Caroline [Williams] and Carla [Thomas] were targeted as offensive threats," VU Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "I've known [Dartmouth Head Coach] Chris Wielgus for a long time and she's a very good coach. She had her team prepared and wanted to shut down our two offensive producers. That's why Caroline didn't score this evening."

Vanderbilt's defense forced 25 turnovers, while the offense shot better than 50% and committed only nine giveaways. The last time Vanderbilt had less than 10 turnovers was Jan. 15, 2006, at South Carolina (8).

Senior point guard Dee Davis had eight assists and no turnovers in the game to go along with two steals.

Freshman Merideth Marsh and sophomore Jennifer Risper and Christina Wirth scored eight points each. Dartmouth was led by 11 points each from Koren Schram and Cookeville, Tenn., native Ashley Taylor.

For Vanderbilt, it was the 21st consecutive victory in a home opener, dating back to a Nov. 28, 1986, victory over Mississippi Valley.

After a slow start in the first half, Vanderbilt connected on 59% of its second-half field goals. Florida Atlantic was held to 26% shooting in the period, and connected on only 32% of its field goal attempts for the game.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 14th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team played smothering defensive basketball en route to a 67-55 win over No. 16 California in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament Saturday at Memorial Gymnasium.

Vanderbilt's defense held California scoreless for nearly 11 minutes at one stretch, opening a 19-point lead at the beginning of the second half before California scored at the 14:57 mark. The Golden Bears had been stuck at 20 points since the 5:50 mark of the first half.

Senior guard Caroline Williams, who had 18 on Saturday, was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player after scoring 35 points in two games. Senior Carla Thomas also found her way onto the All-Tournament Team after a 16-point, seven-rebound performance.

Ashley Walker led the Golden Bears with 19 points, while Rama N'Diaye posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

The Commodores led by 11 at the half, and would continue to grow that lead during a 17-0 run, capped by a fast-break lay-up by Williams assisted by senior Dee Davis. Williams would also go 4-for-4 from behind the arc in the second half.

In the process, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb earned her 100th career victory at Vanderbilt. Balcomb has won 73% of her 137 games since moving to Nashville prior to the 2002-03 season.

Thomas scored 32 points -- one shy of her career high -- and added 11 rebounds, posting her first double-double of the season and the 10th of her career.

Senior point guard Dee Davis, the Southeastern Conference leader in assists, dished out a career-high 12 helpers as Vanderbilt (7-0) outscored UAB, 51-28, in the second half.

Winless UAB (0-6) hung tough with the visiting Commodores into the second half. The game was last tied at the 15:35 mark of the second half before a jumper by senior Caroline Williams gave Vanderbilt the lead for good.

Thomas led all scorers with 16 points in the first half, shooting 6-of-8 from the floor. Thomas' only two misses of the first half came on the first two three-point attempts of her VU career; entering Thursday's game, Thomas had attempted 970 shots as a Commodore.

Aside from Thomas, the Commodores made only six of 17 first-half field goal attempts. UAB turned scored 15 points in the first half off of 12 VU turnovers, helping the Blazers take a 35-34 lead into the half.

Freshman Lauren Lueders scored six points in her first career start, hitting 2-of-4 three-point attempts. Sophomore Jennifer Risper missed her first game of the season. Risper is expected to miss about a week with a knee injury.

DURHAM, N.C. -- The 11th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team suffered its first defeat of the season at the hands of the fourth-ranked Duke Blue Devils, 69-48, Thursday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Senior Carla Thomas led the Commodores with 14 points, while senior Dee Davis had a season-high 12. Alison Bales, Duke's 6-7 senior center, led four Blue Devils' in double-figures with 16 points.

The Commodore defense forced Duke into a season-high 23 turnovers, holding the Blue Devils under 70 points for the first time this year.

Davis led the Commodores with eight points in the first half, matching her season-high from the UAB game. Duke took a seven-point lead into the break after outrebounding Vanderbilt, 21-12, in the opening stanza. Of Duke's 29 first-half points, 11 came after offensive rebounds.

An intentional foul was whistled on Vanderbilt as Duke made a break-away lay-up. The foul was judged to be after the shot, giving Duke two free throws. The Commodore bench was assessed a technical foul after the first free throw was missed, giving Duke two additional free throws. The Blue Devils would make three charity tosses and sink a three-pointer on the ensuing possession to stretch the lead to 17 points at 57-40.

Ten of Duke's final 12 points came at the free throw line, expanding the lead to 23 points before Davis made a lay-up at the buzzer.

TAMPA, Fla. -- The 12th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team defeated South Florida, 76-68, at the St. Pete Times Forum Sunday.

Junior Liz Sherwood and sophomore Christina Wirth each posted double-double performances for Vanderbilt (9-1) -- the second time this season that a pair of Commodores have achieved the feat in the same contest.

Sherwood led all Commodores with 19 points and pulled down a career-high-tying 13 boards. Wirth scored 12 and had a personal-best 11 rebounds.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 12th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team had little trouble advancing to the championship of its Holiday Classic, defeating neighboring Lipscomb, 109-40, Wednesday at Memorial Gymnasium.

Vanderbilt's win set up a championship matchup with Indiana State -- 79-68 winners over Longwood earlier in the day. Longwood and Lipscomb will begin Thursday's action at 1 p.m. CT, with Vanderbilt and Indiana State to follow 30 minutes after the consolation game concludes (approximately 3:15 p.m.).

The Commodore win was the third-largest margin of victory in Vanderbilt history and the most points scored by the Commodores (10-1) since they put up 116 against Hampton in 1998.

All 12 players on Vanderbilt's roster scored at least five points in the game, with only four players reaching double-figures -- led by freshman Amber Norton's game-high 14 points.

Norton was one of four true freshmen to register career highs -- with Jessica Mooney (12 points on 6-of-6 shooting), Ashlee Bridge (9) and Merideth Marsh (9) also putting up personal bests.

Sophomore Jennifer Risper scored a career-high 11, and senior Carla Thomas added 10. Lipscomb (3-10) was led by nine points from Katie Woods.

The Commodores scored 41 points off of 29 Lipscomb turnovers. All 12 of Mooney's points came in transition, as she led VU with six steals.

Vanderbilt connected on 25-of-31 shots from the field in the second half (80.6%) to expand a 33-point halftime lead.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Carla Thomas scored 22 points to lead No. 12 Vanderbilt to an 89-75 victory over Indiana State on Thursday in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Holiday Tournament.

The Commodores (11-1) pulled away in the second half with a 19-8 run, stretching a 58-53 lead to 77-61 with 5:27 remaining.

Indiana State (7-4) kept it close in the first half by making 13 of its first 18 shots from the field and six of its first 10 3-pointers. The Sycamores shot 55.6 percent before halftime.

Vanderbilt clamped down on defense in the second half, holding Indiana State to 34.4 percent shooting. The Commodores shot 54.8 percent in the second half.

Thomas was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Christina Wirth added a career-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Rachel Maenpaa led Indiana State with 23 points and six rebounds.

Longwood defeated Lipscomb 55-53 in the consolation game.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Sophomore Christina Wirth scored a career-high 24 points and senior Carla Thomas had a double-double to lead No. 11/10 Vanderbilt to a convincing 98-61 win over No. 20/23 Arkansas in the Southeastern Conference women's basketball opener for both schools, Thursday night at Memorial Gymnasium.

Wirth's 24 points came in only 11 shots, as the Mesa, Ariz., native misfired only once on the evening and hit all four of her three-point attempts. Her 10-of-11 performance from the field marks the best shooting night for an SEC player this season.

Wirth led five Commodores in double-figures. Senior Caroline Williams scored 15 points on 3-of-3 shooting from behind-the-arc. Senior Dee Davis added 13 points and seven assists, while Thomas posted 12 points and 14 rebounds. Sophomore Jennifer Risper scored 10 points, one off her career high.

Vanderbilt's defense held Arkansas to a season-low 30% from the field, while the Commodores were unstoppable offensively. The Commodores made 62% of their field goals and 69% of their three-point attempts.

Donica Cosby scored a team-high 15 points for the Lady Razorbacks coming off the bench. She was the only LadyBack in double-digits.

The 37-point victory marked Vanderbilt's largest margin in conference play since defeating Mississippi State, 87-48, on Jan. 12, 2005.

OXFORD, Miss. -- The No. 11/10 Vanderbilt women's basketball team were upset Sunday, 76-66, by the Rebels on the road at Ole Miss' Tad Smith Coliseum.

The Commodores (14-2, 1-1 SEC), who had tied their second best start in school history at 14-1, were outrebounded, 47-27, by the Rebels and dropped their Southeastern Conference road opener for the second straight season.

Senior Caroline Williams led the Commodores with 19 points. Senior Carla Thomas scored 18 points, tying her with former teammate Jenni Benningfield for 11th all-time in Vanderbilt history for scoring.

Sophomore Christina Wirth contributed 12 points, while senior Dee Davis nine assists.

Ole Miss' Armintie Price led all scorers with 21 points. Price posted a double-double, with 11 rebounds. Five Rebels had three or more offensive rebounds in the game.

All five Ole Miss starters scored in double-figures, including 14 points from Alliesha Easley on 7-of-11 shooting.

Freshman Lauren Lueders scored the first six points for the Commodores on a pair of three-pointers, but was pulled from the game after picking up her second foul at the 15:34 mark.

Ole Miss led by as many as 14 points in the first half as the Rebels held the Commodores to 30% shooting from the field. The Commodores were outrebounded, 23-14, in the opening 20 minutes, while giving up 16 second-chance points to Ole Miss.

Vanderbilt opened the half on an 8-1 run to decrease the deficit to five points at 35-30. But the Rebels would expand the lead back to 12 with the help of six points from Jada Mincy.

The final points of the game gave the No. 14 Commodores (15-2, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) their only lead of the night.

The Gamecocks (10-7, 1-2) led 64-55 with 4 minutes to go, but turned the ball over six times and made just 2-of-6 free throws in their final 11 possessions. The only shot from the field during that stretch was Lakesa Tolliver's miss with 2 seconds to go.

The Commodores scored on five of their final seven possessions, making four of six free throws in the final 40 seconds.

South Carolina dominated much of the game, outrebounding Vanderbilt by 14 and holding the SEC's second-best shooting team to just 44.1 percent (26-of-59) from the field. However, the Gamecocks turned over the ball 27 times, compared to 18 for the Commodores.

Stacy Booker scored 14 points and Tolliver had nine points and nine rebounds for South Carolina.

South Carolina led by seven at half and by 13 with just over 8 minutes to go as Vanderbilt kept making turnovers and missed eight straight free throws. But the Commodores press started to rattle the Gamecocks, who scored just two points in the final four minutes.

Thomas' 26 points lifts her to 10th on Vanderbilt's all-time scoring list with 1,527 points.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Christina Wirth scored 20 points to lead No. 14 Vanderbilt to an 82-69 comeback victory over Florida on Sunday.

Georgia, coming off a 52-41 home loss to No. 4 Tennessee, regrouped offensively with four players scoring in double figures.

Tasha Humphrey scored 18 points, and Janese Hardrick added 17 points and eight rebounds for Georgia (15-4, 3-2 Southeastern Conference). Christy Marshall was 7 for 8 from the free-throw line in the last 3 minutes and added 13 points.

Christina Wirth led Vanderbilt (16-3, 3-2) with 16 points. Merideth Marsh, Caroline Williams and Carla Thomas each added 12 points, but couldn't keep the Commodores from falling to 2-2 against ranked teams.

Thomas, fourth in the SEC averaging 17.4 points per game, was 4-for-11 from the field. Marsh and Wirth fouled out late in the game.

Vanderbilt, led by Williams' nine points on three 3-pointers, led 30-29 at halftime. Georgia shot only 31.3 percent from the field, but stayed close on Humphrey's season-high three 3-pointers.

With the 6-foot-3 Humphrey moving her scoring inside, Georgia took the lead early in the second half.

Megan Darrah rebounded a missed free throw by Marshall. Darrah's three-point play, followed by a steal and basket by Hardrick, gave Georgia a 48-39 advantage.

Vanderbilt pulled within 50-46 before Georgia pulled away with its 10-0 run for a 60-46 lead with 6:42 left to play.

Janie Mitchell scored 14 points for Georgia Tech (11-8) in her first game since spraining her left knee on Jan. 4. Chioma Nnamaka added 13 points and Stephanie Higgs 11.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with an 18-5 run to take a 42-35 lead after trailing 30-26 at halftime.

Vanderbilt's troubles increased when point guard Dee Davis left with four fouls at the 11:58 mark.

Tech led by nine points at 46-37 before the Commodores took control. A 3-pointer and three-point play by Williams sparked the big run. Williams added another 3 in the run, which ended with two free throws by Higgs with 2:39 left.

Vanderbilt played its second game in four days in the state of Georgia, following an 83-71 loss to Georgia on Thursday.
