VANDERBILT VS. MID-AMERICAN FOES

The Commodores are 9-3 all-time versus current members of the Mid-American Conference (MAC).

Vanderbilt was captured its last four games against MAC affiliates dating back to a 33-30 loss to Miami (Ohio) in 2000. In its last game against a MAC team, the Commodores won at Miami 34-13 to open the 2008 season.

VANDERBILT VS. NON-SEC FOES

Vanderbilt enters the Eastern Michigan game 9-7 in its last 16 games against non-Southeastern Conference opponents. The Commodores are 0-2 this season in non-SEC play: dropping decisions to Northwestern (21-23) and Connecticut (21-40).

After Eastern Michigan, the Commodores will face one more non-SEC opponent (Wake Forest of the ACC in the season finale).

EMU AD GRAGG FORMER 'DORE

Dr. Derrick Gragg, entering his fifth year as Eastern Michigan Director of Athletics, is well known to longtime Commodore football fans. Gragg played for Vanderbilt under head coaches Watson Brown and Gerry DiNardo from 1988-91.

Gragg earned four football letters as a wide receiver for the Commodores. He ended his Vanderbilt career with 40 receptions for 646 yards and three touchdowns. He caught all three TDs in a single game – at Alabama (Sept. 29, 1990).

VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

Four weeks into the season, the list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 10 redshirt freshmen and 11 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

FOURTEEN NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Fourteen Commodore players – eight on defense, five on offense and one on special teams – enjoyed their first career starts through the team's first four games.

Four DBs and three offensive linemen were among the first time starters.

Colt Nichter (R-So., DT) earned first career start vs. UCONN.

Two Commodores – **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB) and **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety) – earned their first starts in the Ole Miss win.

Other defensive players besides Campbell and Ladler to earn initial starts this year are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., cornerback), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., defensive tackle) and **Trey Wilson** (So., cornerback).

The following offensive players have made their first career starts this year: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., left guard), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., left tackle), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., right tackle) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., wide receiver).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.

ELEVEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Eleven true freshmen have played this action, including center **James Kittredge**, who saw his first snaps Saturday at Connecticut.

Only 11 of 120 NCAA teams have played more true freshmen.

Two freshmen, WR **Jonathan Krause** and safety **Kenny Ladler**, started in the Commodore Sept. 18 win at Ole Miss.

Other true freshmen seeing action besides Kittredge, Krause and Ladler are **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Andre Simmons** (safety) and **Carey Spear** (kicker).

22 PLAYERS SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Twenty-two 'Dores have played their first snaps this season.

EARLY VU OPPONENTS: 16-4 OVERALL

Though Vanderbilt is just 1-3 overall, their four opponents are a combined 16-4.

Two of the opponents – Northwestern and LSU – are currently 5-0 and ranked 9th and 25, respectively, in the newest USA Today Coaches Poll. Since losing to Vanderbilt, Ole Miss has topped Fresno State and Kentucky. Connecticut was a preseason contender for the Big East title and listed in several Top 25 polls.

Vanderbilt's final eight opponents are a combined 18-20.

VU HAS LONE SEC EAST WIN FOR WEST

Vanderbilt's 28-14 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 18 represents the only win this season by an SEC East squad over their SEC West counterparts.

Through Week 5, teams from the SEC West are 7-1 against SEC East squads.

NORMAN MOVES UP RETURN CHARTS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** continues to move up Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman moved up one position to No. 9 all-time with a stellar performance at Connecticut. He returned four kickoffs for 162 yards against UCONN, including a long of 72 yards.

Norman is currently averaging 30.2 yards per return this year. He ranks third in the SEC – and 19th in the NCAA.

Norman's career average continues to rise also. He is now averaging 27.0 yards per kickoff, after setting a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

MORE PENALTY STRUGGLES

One stat line the Commodores need to reverse is excessive penalties. For the second straight year, Vanderbilt is struggling in an area where they traditionally lead the Southeastern Conference.

Through four games, Vanderbilt are averaging 7.0 penalties per game, tied for 10th in the SEC. They rank last in the conference in penalty yardage (62.5 ypg). Commodore opponents are being flagged for just 27.5 yards a game.

In the loss at UCONN, Vanderbilt had six penalties for 52 yards while Connecticut was flagged just three times for 15 yards.

CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

Robbie Caldwell, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, will be one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace Bobby Johnson at Vanderbilt on July 14th following Johnson's unexpected retirement.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

Vanderbilt is one of 23 NCAA FBS schools to feature a new head coach roaming the sidelines in 2010.

HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

Herb Hand, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and is the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

DUTIES CHANGE FOR SIX ASSISTANTS

Six assistant coaches have new responsibilities this season.

★ Longtime defensive coordinator **Bruce Fowler** will assist Caldwell as assistant head coach. He will also mentor linebackers.

★ **Jamie Bryant** becomes the sole defensive coordinator and continues as the secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** has added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ Running backs coach **Des Kitchings** has added running game coordinator duties.

★ **Mike Pelton**, hired last spring, will coach defensive ends.

★ **Ted Cain**, former offensive coordinator, will serve as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

PREP TEAMMATES SQUARE OFF

The last two starting QBs to guide Park Ridge (Ill.) Maine South H.S. – Vanderbilt's **Charlie Goro** (R-Fr.) and Eastern Michigan's **Tyler Benz** (Fr.) will face off Saturday.

Both Goro and Benz directed Maine South H.S. to Class 8A state titles as senior QBs.



COMMODORE NOTES

NOTES FROM CONNECTICUT GAME

★ Vanderbilt scored its three touchdowns against Connecticut in the span of 3:48 of the second quarter, going from a 14-point deficit to a 21-14 lead. It was the first 21-point quarter by the Commodores since Vanderbilt posted three scores in the fourth quarter at Florida on Nov. 5, 2005.

★ Vanderbilt lost the important turnover stat 3-2. The Huskies turned those Commodore three turnovers into 14 points. Entering the game, Vanderbilt ranks among the SEC leaders with a +5 turnover margin.

★ After taking a 21-14 lead, Vanderbilt allowed Connecticut to score 26 unanswered points.

★ **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) led all Commodore tacklers with 11 total tackles (7 solo, 4 individual). He was backed up by Sean Richardson (Jr., safety) with 10 total tackles (5 solo, 5 assisted). Marve and Richardson are tied for second in the SEC in total tackles, both averaging 9.8 stops.

★ **Larry Smith** (R-Jr., QB) compiled 221 yards of total offense, passing for 157 yards and rushing for 64 yards.

Smith, who was the Commodores' leading rusher, also produced the longest rush of his career (57 yards) in the first quarter. Smith also connected for two TD passes (8 yards to TE Brandon Barden and 48 yards to WR Udom Umoh) for the first time in his Vanderbilt career. He also had two interceptions for just the second time.

Barden's TD catch was the seventh of his career, the highest active total by a Commodore receiver.

★ **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) picked off his third pass of the season at the 7:16 mark in the second quarter, leading to a Vanderbilt offensive touchdown four plays later.

Hayward ranks as the SEC leader with six defended passes and is tied in the conference with three interceptions.

★ Freshman WR **Jonathan Krause** scored on a 44-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. It was his second career run, his first touchdown run and the longest run of his career.

★ **John Cole** (So., WR) had a 32-yard reception, the longest of his career.

★ Vanderbilt opponents has now scored first in 11 out of the last 12 games. The Commodores captured a win in the lone game when they posted the initial score (at Ole Miss, Sept. 18).

★ **Josh Jelesky** (R-So., DT) contributed a career-high seven tackles while seeing the most playing time of his career. Another DT playing in the starting lineup, **Colt Nichter** (R-So.), also posted a career high with five tackles. Nichter also enjoyed his first career start, replacing injured DT T.J. Greenstone.

★ **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) continues to impress, contributing six tackles, one for a loss of yardage, and scooping up a UCONN fumble forced by Casey Hayward.

★ Vanderbilt gave up a defensive touchdown (44-yard INT return by DB Blidi Wreh-Wilson) and a safety (poor offensive snap) for the first time this season.

★ The Commodores went scoreless in the first quarter for the fourth straight game this season.

TWO DEFENSIVE TACKLES MISS GAME

The Commodores played at Connecticut without the benefit of two veteran defensive tackles, **T.J. Greenstone** and **Adam Smotherman**.

Greenstone and Smotherman, both defensive co-captains, missed the game due to injury.

WINNING TREND: 100-YARD RUSHERS

Success in the Vanderbilt running game leads to team success.

Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt has won every game in which its rushing attack features a 100-yard rusher. **Warren Norman's** 111 rushing yards was a key factor in the Commodores' 28-14 victory at Ole Miss on Sept. 18.

Since the 2003 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-0 when a running back reaches 100 rushing yards.

TURNOVER MARGIN ADVANTAGE

Through four games, the Commodores rank fourth in the SEC in turnover margin. Vanderbilt has forced two more turnovers than they have committed. Only Alabama (+7), Florida (+4) and Tennessee (+4) have better results than the Commodores.

Turnovers have been key in the Commodores' last two games. At UCONN, Vanderbilt trailed in the stat 3-2, including giving up a 44-yard interception return for a score.

In the team's Sept. 18 win at Ole Miss, Vanderbilt forced three turnovers, resulting in 14 points, while committing no miscues.

UNANSWERED POINT PRODUCTION

The UCONN encounter was a game of runs by both teams.

After the Huskies jumped ahead 14-0, the Commodores responded with 21 straight points to take a 21-14 margin, only to have UCONN score 26 unanswered points for the final margin.

STATISTICAL MILESTONES

★ Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) continues to be effective in his first year as a starter. He also continues to be busy.

Though he ranks 12th in the SEC with a 38.9-yard punting average, Kent has been superb when considering net punting. His 37.7-yard net average ranks fifth in the SEC – and 22nd in the NCAA.

Only five of Kent's 32 punts have been returned – for a total of 18 return yards.

Kent has been busier than any other punter in the nation. He is averaging 8.0 punts per game, highest in the NCAA.

★ **Larry Smith** (R-Jr., QB) surpassed the 2,000-yard mark for career total offense during the UCONN performance.

Smith has 2,213 yards of total offense for his career: 1,833 passing yards and 377 rushing yards.

★ **Eddie Foster** (So., DB) and **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT) have surpassed their 2009 tackle totals through just four games. Foster has 19 total tackles, two more than a year ago. Lohr has 15 tackles, one more than in 2009.

IMPROVEMENT IN RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

The Commodores rank in the middle of the pack among SEC teams in both red zone efficiency categories, a stat frequently key to Vanderbilt success.

Vanderbilt rank sixth in the SEC in red zone offense, converting on five of six possessions inside the opponent's 20-yard line (2 TDs and 2 FGs).

The t defense has limited opponents to 80% red zone conversions (12-15). Superb red zone efficiency served as a key to Vanderbilt's 7-6 campaign in 2008.

SMOTHERMAN START STREAK ENDS

Adam Smotherman's consecutive start streak of 23 games ended against Northwestern when he did not dress due to an injury. It was the team's second longest active streak, trailing only LB **Chris Marve** (29).

Smotherman (R-Sr., DT) plans to return to the field this month after sustaining an ACL injury suffered during the first practice last spring.

TWO FIFTH-YEAR SENIORS IN POSTGRAD STUDIES

Two members of the football team, quarterback **Jared Funk** and receiver **Turner Wimberly**, are enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt's Peabody College.

Both Funk and Wimberly are working toward postgraduate degrees in Leadership and Public Policy.

A third Commodore player, linebacker **John Stokes**, has received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School, but will not start those classes before September 2011. Stokes is a two-time District IV Academic All-America recipient.

VANDERBILT'S TOUGH SLATE

College football insiders say the Commodores' 2010 schedule ranks among the nation's most difficult.

Ten of Vanderbilt's 12 opponents this season made postseason appearances during the 2009-10 season. Six of the 10 played in bowls on or after January 1.

Vanderbilt's 12 opponents won at a 58.4 percent clip in 2009, going a combined 90-66. Remove Eastern Michigan's winless campaign, and the remaining 11 teams went 90-54 one year ago.

Phil Steele's College Football Preview listed the Vanderbilt schedule No. 12 toughest among 120 NCAA FBS teams.

The Commodores will play four teams ranked in AP preseason Top 25 (Florida, 4th; Arkansas, 17th; LSU, 21st; and Georgia, 23rd).

The Commodores are also the only SEC school this year that will face at least three opponents from BCS-member conferences: Northwestern, Big Ten; UConn, Big East; and Wake Forest, ACC.

UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

For the first time since 2001, Vanderbilt jerseys sport player names.

The uniform change was introduced in the season opener versus Northwestern.

Jerseys during the Bobby Johnson tenure did not identify players.

The Vanderbilt offense was just 3 of 12 (25%) on third downs against UCONN. The percentage marks a slight improvement over the unit's season average (23%).

After enjoying plenty of success in a three-possession stage of the second quarter, the offense struggled for most of the second half.

Of eight drives after half-time, the offense was held without a first down in six possessions, enabling UCONN to hold a key 19:09-10:51 edge in time of possession.

Standouts **Chris Marve** and **Warren Norman** were playing up to their preseason hype.

named to the Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers.

Both are performing well this year: Marve among the SEC's leading tacklers while Norman ranks among league leaders as an all-purpose player.

Marve, one of four captains, has been named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award. He enters his third season as a starter trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

Marve, who posted 121 tackles in 2009, opened this season with a 12-tackle performance against Northwestern. He is tied for second in the SEC, averaging 9.8 tackles per game.

Norman rushed for 111 yards vs. Ole Miss Sept. 18 (second highest career total) and leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards, all-purpose yards and kickoff return average.

In 2009, Norman produced one of the most productive freshman campaigns in SEC history one year ago. He topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process, and matched another league mark with three kickoff returns for touchdowns. Norman also ranked seventh in the SEC with 783 rushing yards.

BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE) Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 65 receptions and 718 receiving yards.

REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

The son of Narjaketha Bennett and the late Charles Bennett, Rajaan is survived by a younger brother and sister.

Northwestern (23) at Vanderbilt (21)

NASHVILLE — Dan Persa threw for 222 yards and three touchdowns to three different receivers, and Northwestern beat Vanderbilt 23-21 Saturday night in the regular season game between the Big Ten and the Southeastern Conference.

This was Persa's first start with Mike Kafka now gone, and the junior was nearly perfect as he helped ruin the debut of Vanderbilt's new head coach Robbie Caldwell in the season opener for both teams.

Persa was 19 of 21 passing and he also led the Wildcats with 82 yards rushing. Vanderbilt had plenty of chances to make Caldwell the first Commodores' coach to win his debut since Woody Widenhofer in 1997.

Larry Smith threw for 240 yards and a touchdown with Warren Norman and Zac Stacy each running for touchdowns. But the Commodores missed an extra point, a 48-yard field goal and were stopped on two 2-point conversions -- the last with 2:25 left on a bad snap.

Northwestern faced third-and-6 from its own 33 when Persa was hit a yard short of the first down marker by Vandy safety Jay Fullam. But officials flagged him for a high hit and a personal foul, allowing Northwestern to run out the clock even though it looked on replay as if Fullam simply put his shoulder into Persa's shoulder for the stop.

The crowd, a couple thousand short of a sellout at 37,210, booed the officials off the field.

NASHVILLE — LSU coach Les Miles still sees his Tigers making mistakes that must be corrected. His defense can only be counted on to cover up those problems for so long.

Stevan Ridley scored a 65-yard touchdown and ran for 144 of his career-high 159 yards in the second half, and the Tigers came up with six sacks in defeating Vanderbilt 27-3 Saturday night.

It was the Tigers' seventh straight win in this series in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

The Tigers nearly blew a 30-10 lead a week ago against North Carolina before knocking down a couple of last-second passes in the end zone to preserve a 30-24 victory. Ridley had a couple of turnovers in that game, but he helped the Tigers seal this victory with 17 unanswered points in the fourth quarter.

Miles liked how the offense finished. He was even more impressed with Drake Nevis having 2½ sacks as his Tigers held Vanderbilt to 135 yards total offense.

"The defense was spectacular, really from the start and really pressed the Vanderbilt offense to get first downs. I like the way that the front is so disruptive," Miles said.

OXFORD — Warren Norman rushed for 111 yards, including an 80-yard touchdown, as Vanderbilt beat Mississippi 28-14 for coach Robbie Caldwell's first career victory on Saturday.

Vanderbilt (1-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) snapped a 10-game conference losing streak dating back to 2008. The Commodores have beaten the Rebels four of the past six seasons.

It was Norman's third career 100-yard rushing game, and his first against an SEC opponent. The Commodores did most of their damage on the ground, rushing for 227 yards.

Vanderbilt lived off big plays all afternoon. The Commodores scored their first three touchdowns on 35-yard touchdown run by Zac Stacy, a 21-yard interception return by Eddie Foster and the biggest of all -- Norman's 80-yard touchdown run that gave them the lead for good.

Norman's touchdown came at a critical juncture. Ole Miss (1-2, 1-1) had just tied the score at 14-14 when the 5-foot-10, 195-pound sophomore scored on Vanderbilt's first play from scrimmage, running untouched for the longest run of his career and the second-longest run in school history.
