## VANDY: LOOKING TO CREATE WIN STREAK

Vanderbilt will look to start a winning streak Saturday vs. Connecticut after breaking a seven-game losing skid against Elon.

The Commodores have gone more than two seasons since putting together consecutive victories. The team's most recent back-to-back wins against against Ole Miss and Auburn in the 2008 season.

### VANDERBILT VS. RECENT NON-SEC OPPONENTS

After defeating Elon 45-14 in the opener, Vanderbilt is 9-6 in its last 15 games against non-Southeastern Conference opponents. In 2010, the Commodores were 1-3 vs. non-SEC foes: defeating Eastern Michigan while falling to Northwestern, Connecticut and Wake Forest.

In the last decade, the Commodores are 20-18 in games against outof-league teams.

## FOUR FIRST-TIME STARTERS IN OPENER

Four Commodores enjoyed their first career starts against Elon.

Mylon Brown (R-So., OG) was the only first-time starter on the
Commodore offense. Brown saw only limited duty in 2010, but played
every offensive snap through the first three quarters Saturday.

The defense had three first-time starters: **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB), **Chase Garnham** (So., LB) and **Javon Marshall** (So., safety). Garnham's six tackles tied for second on the team.

## THREE TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Three true freshmen playing offense were among the 65 Commodores that saw action Saturday against Elon.

**Jerron Seymour** (RB) rushed for 15 yards and had two passes for 22 yards. Two first-year linemen, **Spencer Pulley** (OG) and **Joe Townsend** (C), also enjoyed snaps late in the contest.

## FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS IN ELON GAME

Twelve underclassmen saw their initial action in a Commodore uniform in the victory over Elon.

First-time offensive players were Chris Boyd (R-Fr., WR), Andrew Bridges (R-Fr., OT), Trent Pruitt (R-Fr., WR), Spencer Pulley (Fr., OG), Jordan Rodgers (R-Jr., QB), Jerron Seymour (Fr., RB) and Joe Townsend (Fr., C). First-time defensive players were Robby Barbieri (R-Fr., LB), Kyle Woestmann (R-Fr., DE), Reggie Ford (So., DB) and Thomas Ryan (R-Fr., DE).

One specialist, **Andrew East** (R-Fr., snapper), also enjoyed the first snaps of his career.

## **KEY STAT: POSITIVE TURNOVER MARGIN**

Vanderbilt started the 2011 season exactly the way it wanted in one turnover margin, a stat that has been a dependable indicator of team success for the Commodores.

In the opening victory over Elon, the Commodores forced three turnovers – a fumble and two interceptions – while committing none.

The forced turnovers directly led to 21 Vanderbilt points, including a 21-yard interception return for a score by **Trey Wilson** (Jr., DB). It was the team's first defensive touchdown in 10 games dating back to an interception return by **Eddie Foster** (Jr., DB) vs. Ole Miss.

After Week 1, the Commodores rank among the SEC and NCAA leaders with a turnover margin of +3. They are tied for the conference lead and rank ninth in the NCAA.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the need to force turnovers while protecting the ball on offense. In 2010, his Maryland Terrapins' squad rode a positive turnover margin (+15) to a 9-4 record and Military Bowl victory. On the flip side, Vanderbilt finished the 2010 season with a negative turnover margin (-4) and disappointing 2-10 record.

In 2008, the Commodores' 7-6 season and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl victory were aided by a positive turnover margin (+9).

On Saturday, the Commodores were one of 28 teams nationally that did

## HONORING COACH MACINTYRE AT HALFTIME

At halftime Saturday, former Vanderbilt Head Coach Coach George MacIntyre will be honored for his incredible contribution to the legacy of Commodore football and also to assist in raising awareness within the Commodore community for finding a cure to multiple sclerosis.

Coach MacIntyre, a longtime resident of Nashville, was known throughout his coaching career as a powerful motivator and infectious personality. Those qualities have never been more apparent than in his current battle with multiple sclerosis.

"Coach Mac," as he's been known throughout much of his career, served as head coach of the Commodores from 1979-1985 and led Vanderbilt to some of the university's biggest victories. In 1982, MacIntyre's team upset 14th-ranked Florida 31-29 and went on to finish the season 8-3 with an appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. That year, he received the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, the *Sporting News* College Football Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year. The eight wins posted in 1982 were the most wins posted by a Commodore team since 1955 and a mark that has not been matched since.

After leaving Vanderbilt, MacIntyre went on to a successful business career before returning to the coaching ranks as an assistant coach at Liberty University when in 1997 he was forced to retire after being diagnosed with primary progressive multiple sclerosis. In the subsequent years, Coach Mac has continued to serve as an inspiration to his former players and fellow coaches.

A group of those former players came together earlier this year with the hopes of honoring MacIntyre for his contributions to Vanderbilt and the local community. In conjunction with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and the athletic department, this group of former players and colleagues has worked to raise awareness and money in Coach Mac's honor in the fight against MS.

The infectious personality and strong will continue to resonate today from Coach Mac, who still serves as a motivator and inspiration for former players, coaches and friends that visit him at his home in Nashville.

## MATCHUP OF 2010 MARYLAND COORDINATORS

Vanderbilt first-year head coach **James Franklin** and new Commodore offensive coordinator **John Donovan** were top offensive assistants at Maryland one year ago. The defensive coordinator for that Terp squad, **Don Brown**, holds the same post at UConn this season under Coach Paul Pasqualoni.

A third Vanderbilt staffer, special teams coordinator-tight ends coach Charles Bankins, also served with Franklin, Donovan and Brown under Head Coach Ralph Friedgen at Maryland.

### Two Commodores Face Prep Teammates

Two Commodores will face prep teammates this Saturday when Connecticut visits Nashville.

**Kenny Ladler** (So., safety) was a teammate at Stephenson H.S. near Atlanta with UConn freshman DB David **Stevenson**.


## PAIR OF SEC-BIG EAST ENCOUNTERS THIS WEEK

## Vanderbilt (21) at Connecticut (40) Rentschler Field, East Hartford (40,000) • Oct. 2, 2010 • Big East TV



EAST HARTFORD, Conn. — Jordan Todman ran for 190 yards and two touchdowns to lead Connecticut to a 40-21 win over Vanderbilt, just the second win for the Big East over a BCS conference team this season.

Todman, who carried the ball 37 times, has now rushed for over 100 yards in seven of his last eight games. He missed last week's game against Buffalo with an injured left arm.

The Huskies (3-2) outscored the Commodores 19-0 in the second half, after holding a 21-21 halftime lead. Cornerback Blidi Wreh-Wilson put the game away when he stepped in front of receiver Akeem Dunham, returning the interception 44 yards for a touchdown midway through the fourth quarter to put the Huskies up 38-21.

Larry Smith threw for 157 yards and two touchdowns and

ran for 64 yards to lead Vanderbilt. Warren Norman had 162 yards on kick returns.

## SUPERLATIVES FROM VICTORY OVER ELON

- The 45-point total was the highest single-game total by Vanderbilt since a 52-6 victory over Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.
- Four players scored the first touchdowns in a Vanderbilt uniform during the victory over Elon. Fitz Lassing (So., FB) scored on a 15-yard pass from Larry Smith; Trey Wilson (Jr., DB) tallied on a 21-yard INT return; Chris Boyd (R-Fr., WR) scored on an 11-yard pass reception; and Wesley Tate (R-So., WR) on a 23-yard end sweep.
- Chase Garnham (So., LB) and Tristan Strong (R-Jr., LB) posted career highs in tackles during their first career defensive starts.

Garnham tied **Casey Hayward** for second on the team behind **Chris Marve** with six tackles. Strong added three stops.

 Chris Boyd (R-Fr., WR) enjoyed quite a performance in his first collegiate action. The wideout made the most of two receptions, scoring TDs on both.

Boyd's first career catch — a 11-yarder from **Larry Smith** (R-Sr.) — gave Vanderbilt a 17-point cushion early in the fourth quarter. His final catch — 30 yards from **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr.) provided the Commodores' final tally.

Boyd became the first Commodore to catch two touchdowns in a game since converted DB D.J. Moore hauled in a pair of TD receptions against Kentucky in 2008 to seal Vanderbilt's sixth victory of the regular season and an eventual Music City Bowl bid.

Boyd's second touchdown also came on Rodgers' first pass as a Commodore. He finished 3 of 4 for 52 yards and 1 TDs.

After allowing Elon more than 200 yards of total offense before intermission, the Commodore defense clamped down in the second half.

Vanderbilt limited the Phoenix to just 104 total yards and six first downs in the second half.

• Tim Fugger (R-Sr., DE) picked up right where he left off, forcing an Elon fumble on a quarterback sack in the first quarter. The Commodore offense scored its first touchdown eight plays later.

Fugger ranked among the SEC leaders last year with four forced fumbles. He now has six for his career, just one behind team leader **Chris Marve**.

• The Commodores played an efficient game, forcing three turnovers while committing none.

In 2009-10, Vanderbilt enjoyed just three games without a turnover. Those games ended in a Commodore win over Ole Miss, and two narrow losses to South Carolina.

• Jordan Matthews didn't stretch his streak of games with a touchdown catch to five, but the sophomore WR did top the 'Dores in receptions (3) and receiving yards (58).

Matthews has topped the Commodores in both catches and receiving yards during his last three games.

- **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) returned his first career interception for a touchdown. Starting in the secondary following a strong preseason camp, Wilson took the pick 21 yards for a score. It was Vanderbilt's first defensive touchdown since **Eddie Foster** went the same distance with an interception against Ole Miss on Sept. 18, 2010.
- Converted to WR from RB in preseason camp, **Wesley Tate** (R-So.) still produced the longest rush of his career, a 23-yarder end sweep in the fourth quarter.
- Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB) matched a career high by throwing touchdowns to Fitz Lassing (So., FB) and Chris Boyd (R-Fr., WR).
- Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) had his first career rush a 23-yard gain on a sweep that featured running back **Zac Stacy** at quarterback.
- Richard Kent (R-Jr.) finished with a net punting average of 39.8 yards.
- Carey Spear (So.) converted on a 33-yard field goal, the first FG attempt of his Commodore career.

## VANDERBILT GETS 78TH WIN IN SEASON OPENERS

Vanderbilt, in its 122nd year of football, captured its 78th seasonopening victory Saturday vs. Elon. The Commodores are 78-40-4 all-time in openers, and has won four of the five openers.

Besides defeating Elon, other recent Vanderbilt wins in season openers include Western Carolina in 2009, Miami (Ohio) in 2008 and Richmond in 2007

- ★ The Commodores have won five of seven openers since 2005 after enduring a seven-game losing streak from 1998-2004.
- ★ Vanderbilt is 10-15 in its last 25 openers.
- ★ Vanderbilt is 5-5 in its last 10 openers against non-Southeastern Conference members.

## 2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEARS GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: Kyle Fischer, Casey Hayward, Chris Marve, Larry Smith and Carey Spear.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) will serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams.

Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

**FISCHER:** A 26-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role last spring. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

**HAYWARD:** The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (9) and enters the season with a team-leading 25 consecutive starts.

**MARVE**: A three-year starter and candidate for numerous postseason defensive awards, Marve is the SEC's active leader with 312 career

tackles. He also has a team-high 37 starts.

SMITH: The fifth-year senior has shown determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith threw for 2 TDs and ran

The 'Dores will also name three additional captains prior to each game.

## Franklin: One of 24 New FBS Head Coaches

**James Franklin** is one of 13 NCAA FBS coaches across the nation who will be directing their first game as a head coach this season.

Vanderbilt is one of 24 programs entering the year with a new head coach. One of the other 23 programs is Connecticut, where longtime Syracuse Head Coach **Paul Pasqualoni** guided the Huskies in their 2011 opener.

Franklin, regarded as one of the nation's top offensive minds following successful coordinator tenures at Maryland and Kansas State, was named as Vanderbilt's 27th head coach last December.

Franklin is also one of two new head coaches in the Southeastern Conference, joining Will Muschamp of Florida. This is also Muschamp's first year as a collegiate head coach.

Vanderbilt's starting lineup against Elon featured 14 position players that started much of the 2010 season. Several others expected to play important minutes Saturday have multiple starts in past years.

The list of likely Commodore starters includes eight offensive players and six defensive contributors back from similar roles last year.

Returning offensive starters who have earned their way into Franklin's starting lineup are Larry Smith (QB), Udom Umoh (WR), Kyle Fischer (QL), Wesley Johnson (QL), Ryan Seymour (QL), Jabo Burrow (QL) and Brandon Barden (TE).

On defense, seven starters from a year ago should be in the starting unit vs. Elon. They are **Tim Fugger** (DE), **Rob Lohr** (DT), **Colt Nichter** (DT), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Casey Hayward** (CB) and **Sean Richardson** (safety).

Four other starters – **Zac Stacy** (RB), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Austin Monahan** (TE) and **Johnell Thomas** (DE) – also started games last year.

A number of other position players that played key roles for the Commodores against Elon also have multiple career starts, including John Cole (WR), Jonathan Krause (WR), Eddie Foster (CB), T.J. Greenstone (DT), Andre Hal (CB) and Kenny Ladler (safety).

### OL: Familiar Faces, New Positions

The 2011 Vanderbilt offensive line featured a bunch of familiar jersey numbers lining up at unfamiliar positions vs. Elon.

Three starters from a year ago — **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.), **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr.) and **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) — lined up at new positions against Elon.

Johnson, an SEC All-Freshman pick last year at left tackle, will move inside to center. Seymour, an All-SEC candidate, shifts from right tackle to left tackle. Fischer, the team's most experienced lineman, moves from right guard to right tackle.

## Coach James Franklin

### FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- As a college quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the Harlon Hill Trophy, given to the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with and spent extended time with several other top quarterbacks, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Farve as a coach with the 2005 Green Bay Packers.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

### **KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN**

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

#### • DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement

For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since ince 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.

#### JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff

Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.

#### • JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator

For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.

### • CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator

Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

## Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

#### FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

#### FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

#### FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

#### FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

#### NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

#### FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

#### FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

#### THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

#### **OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH** ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture — changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

#### POSTS VICTORY IN OPENER ★ Sept. 3, 2011

Franklin guides Commodores to victory in his first game on the sideline, leading the team to a 45-14 win over Elon in Nashville.

### Franklin's Career At a Glance

#### 2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

### SEEKING PAIR OF BOWL APPEARANCES

Eight Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – Tim Fugger (DE), T.J. Greenstone (DT), Casey Hayward (DB), Josh Jelesky (OL), Chris Marve (LB), Sean Richardson (safety), Larry Smith (QB) and Udom Umoh (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured D.J. Moore. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

## RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR 'DORE COACHES

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history, became the 13th to win his first game guiding the Commodores.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to an impressive 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3.

The last coach before Franklin to register a win in his first game was Woody Widenhofer, who guided the 'Dores to a 29-14 victory over North Texas in the 1997 opener. Franklin and Widenhofer are two of just four first-year Vanderbilt coaches to accomplish the feat since World War II, joining Fred Pancoast (1975) and Steve Sloan (1973).

Pancoast is also the only Vanderbilt first-year coach since WWII to achieve a winning record in his initial year.

## SMITH CLOSE TO JOINING TOP TEN PASSING LIST

Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB) needs less than 110 passing yards to enter the Vanderbilt top ten in career yardage.

The two-year starter is currently ranked No. 9 all-time in pass attempts (535) and No. 10 all-time in completions (255).

Coming off a confidence-building preseason camp where he was elected as an offensive co-captain, Smith could reach the team's all-time Top 5 in several categories with an outstanding season.

Last Saturday, Smith passed for a pair of scores and ran for a third in Vanderbilt's victory over Elon.

## MARVE, HAYWARD TOP SQUAD IN STARTS

Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) has started more games than any other position player on the 2011 Commodore roster. The All-SEC candidate and two-time defensive co-captain made his 37th career start when Vanderbilt defeated Elon last Saturday.

Brandon Barden (R-Sr., TE) ranks second on the team with 31 starts. followed by Kyle Fischer (R-Sr., OL) with 26 starts. Four other veterans - John Cole (R-Jr., WR), Casey Hayward (Sr., CB), Sean Richardson (Sr., safety) and **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR) – have at least 20 career starts. One specialist, Ryan Fowler (R-Jr., PK) also has at least 20 starts.

Hayward leads the team with 25 consecutive starts entering this season. He is followed by Barden (19), Richardson (19) and Fischer (18). Four other 'Dores – Wesley Johnson (R-So., OL), Richard Kent (R-Jr., punter) and Rob **Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) – have started 13 consecutive games.

## HAYWARD: NINE CAREER INTERCEPTIONS

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) is nearing the Vanderbilt all-time Top Ten for career interceptions.

Hayward, a first-team All-Southeastern Conference preseason recipient, needs just one interception to reach the Top Ten. He is three INTs shy of tying former All-SEC standout Corey Chavous for fifth all-time.

Hayward had a pick vs. Elon. In 2010, he ranked second in the SEC in 2010 with six INTs.

## VANDY VS. FCS FOES

The Commodores are 15-1 all-time against FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) opponents since the NCAA created the I-AA classification in 1978 and redefined it in the early 2000s. Vanderbilt topped FCS member Elon 45-14 in the 2011 opener.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt has defeated all nine FCS opponents on its schedule: Elong in 2011, Western Carolina in 2009 (45-0), Richmond in 2007 (41-17). Tennessee State in 2006 (38-9). Richmond in 2005 (37-13) Eastern Kentucky in 2004 (19-7), Chattanooga in 2003 (51-6), Furman in 2002 (49-18) and Richmond in 2001 (28-22).

## RESULTS VS. SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOES

Vanderbilt is 26-4 all-time versus current teams from the Southern Conference after its 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3. The 'Dores are also 10-0 against SoCon teams since losing to The Citadel in 1979. In 2010, Vanderbilt also topped Western Carolina 45-0.

Vanderbilt also has historical ties to the SoCon. The Commodores were members of a league seven decades ago when it became an SEC charter member in 1933.

## LINEBACKER CHRIS MARVE MOVES OT 12th IN TACKLES

Chris Marve, a two-time All-Southeastern Conference linebacker for the Commodores, is nearing the team's all-time Top Ten for career tackles.

Marve posted a team-high 12 tackles, including six unassisted stops, in the Commodores' season opener vs. Elon.

It marked Marve's 16th career game with at least 10 total tackles, tops on the team.

During the performance, Marve jumped past Jonathan Goff into 12th place all-time on the Commodore charts with 318 total tackles. The middle linebacker needs 31 tackles to match 1970s standout Randy Sittason for 11th all-time, and 34 stops to reach the the Top Ten.

Marve will need to continue his first-game performance to challenge the team's top three career tacklers: Andrew Coleman (458), Joe Staley (443) and Chris Gaines (440).

The Memphis product has been named to the preseason watch list for several prestigious honors, including the Nagurski Trophy, the Bednarik Award, Lombardi and Butkus Award. He also is a candidate for the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

A two-time defensive captain who has worked in Vanderbilt's Admissions Office and interned with a Nashville law firm, Marve is coming off a sub-par season. Marve garnered 80 stops last year while nursing an injury. Marve posted more than 100 tackles as a freshman and sophomore.

The team's second leading tackler is Sean Richardson (Sr., safety) with 198 stops. Richardson can reach the Top 25 career list with 31 more tackles.

Athletics Hall of Fame Recipients

The 2011 Hall of Fame recipients were honored at a banquet Sept. 2, and recognized at halftime of the opener vs. Elon.

#### Lamar Alexander 🖈 Track

Before he launched a decorated political career during which he has represented the state of Tennessee with distinction on the national and international stage, U.S. Senator Lamar Alexander was a Vanderbilt student-athlete. Discovered and recruited by track coach Herc Alley as a student in 1960, Alexander joined the track team as a sophomore and junior, running the one-mile relay, 440-yard dash and 440-yard relay. He carried his affinity for physical exercise into his political life when he walked 1,000 miles across the state of Tennessee wearing a red and black checkered shirt during his campaign for governor in 1978.

- ★ Ran leg of school-record 42.7 440-yard relay in a race against Tennessee in 1961.
- \* Graduated with bachelor of arts degree.
- ★ Only Tennessean ever to be popularly elected both governor and U.S. senator.

#### John Ingram ★ Lifetime Achievement

For over 15 years, John Ingram has followed in the generous tradition of the entire Ingram family by donating his time and resources as chairman of the Shape the Future campaign for Vanderbilt Athletics, affirming his role in the direction of the entire athletics department. A former graduate student at Vanderbilt and the son of former University Board of Trust Chairs Bronson and Martha Ingram, John Ingram has helped drive numerous athletic projects. Ingram has played a vital role in the facility upgrades that have helped Vanderbilt become more competitive in the athletics-rich SEC.

- ★ Graduated from Princeton with B.A. in 1984.
- ★ Received M.B.A. from Owen Graduate School of Management in 1986
- ★ Chairman of Ingram Industries Inc. Board of Directors since April 2008.

#### Scotti Madison ★ Baseball

Scotti Madison arrived on campus in 1977 with a scholarship to play football and baseball, but it was his dominance on the diamond that ultimately propelled him to be regarded among Vanderbilt's all-time greats. The first baseball player in school history to be selected as a first team All-American, Madison graduated with numerous school records, including career and single season home runs, single season batting average and single season walks. He is also the only Vanderbilt player ever to be named to the All-SEC first team for two different positions, being honored as an outfielder in 1978 and as a catcher in 1979 and 1980. Madison went on to spend 10 years playing pro baseball, including stints with three MLB teams.

#### Tyler Griffin ★ Women's Soccer

Goalkeeper Tyler Griffin backstopped Vanderbilt to its most successful stretch of the decade, including consecutive NCAA tourney berths in 2005 and 2006. Earned starting job just four games into her first season on campus after a transfer from North Carolina. In just three years, Griffin played her way into the school record books in several goalkeeping statistical categories and garnered All-American recognition from multiple national organizations. Her dominant run during the 2005 campaign, highlighted by an 11-game winning streak during which she allowed just one goal, helped the 'Dores set the most important record for any team with 16 victories that year.

- ★ 2005 SEC Defensive Player of the Year (First Vanderbilt winner of defensive honor).
- ★ Vanderbilt's Female Athlete of the Year in 2005.

#### Peter Lamb ★ Men's Tennis

Peter Lamb's exceptional ability on the tennis court landed him considerable public attention during his four-year Vanderbilt career. A native of South Africa, Lamb distinguished himself upon his admittance to Vanderbilt when he became the first tennis player ever to be offered a full athletic scholarship to the school. As a sophomore Lamb became the first nonwhite player ever to represent South Africa in international Davis Cup play. He competed against the United States in the 1978 North and Central America Zone Final, a match held in Vanderbilt's Memorial Gymnasium.

- ★ Played 1975 Junior Wimbledon for South Africa.
- ★ First tennis player to be offered a full athletic scholarshin to Vanderhilt
- ★ Three-time All-SEC honors, 1978-1980.

#### Will Perdue ★ Men's Basketball

Will Perdue's senior season in 1988 helped lift the basketball team to several milestones, including the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in 15 years and first Sweet 16 appearance in school history. The 7-foot center went on to have the longest NBA career of any former Commodore and played alongside some of the game's all-time greats in Michael Jordan and David Robinson at the professional level. He has remained around the game since the conclusion of his playing career and can be seen and heard providing commentary and analysis for ESPN's basketball coverage

- ★ 1988 SEC Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year.
- ★ Ended career with .606 FG percentage, a team record.
- ★ Selected in 1st round of 1988 NBA Draft by Chicago.
- ★ Won four NBA titles three with Chicago, one with San Antonio.

#### Carl Hinkle \* Football

Playing on both sides of the line from 1935 to 1937. Carl Hinkle Vanderbilt with his toughness, endurance and penchant for the big play. Hinkle helped extend the culture of success left by legendary head football coach Dan McGugin after his departure from coaching following the 1934 season. As team captain in 1937, Hinkle played every minute of seven of his team's nine games in his senior season, leading the Commodores in tackles and finishing among the team leaders in interceptions. Hinkle is one of only five Commodore players enshriped in the National College Football Hall of Fame.

- ★ Named All-American by Associated Press, Grantland Rice and Liberty Magazine in 1937.
- ★ Finished seventh in 1937 Heisman Trophy voting.
- ★ Inducted into National College Football Hall of Fame in 1959.

### David Latimer \* Cross Country

Cross country runner David Latimer concluded an eventful undergraduate career at Vanderbilt with a flourish in 1997 when he became the school's first recipient of a Rhodes Scholarship in 14 years. Latimer, a double major in physics and mathematics, lettered in cross country in his junior and senior seasons and represented the team in the season-ending SEC Championships and District IX Championships. Those athletic accomplishments supplemented his already impressive academic resume – his undergraduate work in theoretical cardiac electrophysiology was published in multiple conference journals - to help Latimer earn the chance to study at Oxford following his graduation from Vanderbilt. Latimer is now a physics professor at Reed College in Oregon.

### Sheri Sam \* Women's Basketball

Sheri Sam's four-year career began and ended with postseason success - she was a freshman when the Commodores reached the Final Four in 1993 and a senior on the 1996 team that reached the Elite Eight. She led the team in points, rebounds and steals in her final two seasons, and her points per game and field goal percentage numbers remain among the 10 highest career totals in program history to this day. After averaging 20.4 points per game as a senior in 1996, Sam became the third player in school history to be named a Kodak All-American and remains one of only four Vanderbilt players to be honored. She has gone on to enjoy a well-traveled pro career, having played multiple seasons both in the WNBA and abroad.


