VANDERBILT SOCCER

COACH DEREK GREENE

A dynamic recruiter, excellent tactician and passionate leader, Derek Greene officially was named the head coach of the Vanderbilt women's soccer program after the 2011 season, which he spent as the interim head coach for five months.



A 18-year veteran of collegiate women's soccer, Greene's coaching career has been highlighted by success at a number of schools in the southeast. As an assistant and associated head coach at Ole Miss, Greene helped lead the Rebels to their first three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a second-round appearance in 2003. Greene helped guide Ole Miss to seven consecutive SEC Tournament berths — including an SEC Western Division title and second-place overall finish in 2005 — and recruited four Freshman All-America selections to Oxford.

Greene got his start in coaching nearly 20 years ago with the Knoxville Stars Soccer Club. He developed a team that went from third to second to first in the Tennessee youth soccer ranks over a period of three years, and guided that program to a Region III semifinal appearance. Five years of club experience led Greene to a position with the University of Tennessee's new varsity women's soccer program in 1996.

After serving on staff at his alma mater for a year, Greene was named the head coach at Division II Carson-Newman College. In 2000, he led the Eagles to their first South Atlantic Conference semifinal appearance with a victory over nationally ranked Wingate.

Greene made his way back to the SEC in 2002 and immediately made his mark on the recruiting trail. Among the recruits he helped bring to Ole Miss was 2005 Freshman of the Year Jennifer Hance, a four-time All-SEC honoree who went on to play professionally. Team success once again followed Greene. The Rebels would advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2003 and 2005 while posting the fourth-highest conference winning percentage from 2002 to 2008. Ole Miss also boasted a 15-game unbeaten streak in conference play spanning the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

After helping Belmont to its best finish in the A-Sun in 2009, Greene was brought to Vanderbilt as coach Ronnie Woodard's top assistant.

Just weeks before the 2011 season, Woodard retired and Greene was elevated to interim head coach. Under Greene's direction the Commodores won eight games, including victories over SEC foes LSU and Arkansas.

Shortly after the season ended, athletic director David Williams named Greene head coach — just the fifth coach in program history.

In 2013, Greene guided a Commodores bunch that scored 35 goals — the most in a season since 2005. They also averaged 2.06 goals a game for their highest average in 13 seasons.

Greene and wife Gail reside in Nashville with their two sons, Max and Miller.

DORES WEEKLY REPORT

The Commodores (7-9-2, 2-6-2 SEC) wrapped up their home schedule with a tie against No. 21 South Carolina and a loss to Ole Miss.

On Friday, Vanderbilt tied the Gamecocks 1-1 in double overtime after rallying from a first-half deficit. South Carolina scored in the 29th minute, but, needing a point to stay in the SEC Tournament hunt, the Commodores pulled even in the 78th minute. Senior defender Cherrille Jarrett headed in her second goal of the season on a pass from Taylor Richardson. The equalizer held up, as Vanderbilt withstood 22 shots from South Carolina and Christiana Ogunsami made eight saves.

Two days later, on Sunday, Ole Miss ended Vanderbilt's chances of making the SEC Tournament. The Commodores allowed two second-half goals after Simone Charley scored her team-high eighth goal in the 47th minute. The Rebels tied the game in the 54th minute on a shot from the right flank and they went ahead on a free kick that bounced past Ogunsami. Before the game, Vanderbilt honored its seven seniors – Jarrett, Richardson, Gena Inbusch, Ashley Oswald, Taylor Elliott, Brittney Thomas and Ashley Vega – and all seven started.

SCOUTING FLORIDA

The Commodores wrap up the 2014 season at No. 8 Florida at 6 p.m. on Thursday on SEC Network.

The Gators hold a 22-2-1 advantage in the series and have won eight straight. The Commodores' last win against Florida was on Sept. 14, 1997 in Gainesville, Fla. The teams didn't meet in 2013 and Florida won the last game in the series 4-0 on Oct. 21, 2012.

Florida (13-4, 8-2) has won two straight after dropping two on the road. The Gators, the defending conference champs, currently sit in second place in the league but are eyeing the No. 1 spot for next week's SEC Tournament. Their 40 goals are second-most in the SEC and Savannah Jordan leads the league with 14 goals.

WINS UP

With a win against Florida, Vanderbilt can double its win total from last year and match its most wins in a season since 2011.

The Commodores' seven wins are already the most in three years. They needed just eight games to win five this fall, eclipsing last year's total of four. VU also has two SEC wins - the most in two years. Both came in back-to-back road wins — also a conference first since 2010. One more win will give Vanderbilt its most SEC wins since 2010.

SIMONE SAYS

Simone Charley has showed no signs of a sophomore slump.

The forward scored five goals and had five assists in 2013 en route to earning SEC All-Freshman honors. This fall, she has picked up the pace, especially in the last two weeks.

She has scored five goals in the past five games: one against Texas A&M, the lone goal against Mississippi State, two in a 2-0 victory over Tennessee — the first multi-goal game of her career — and a goal against Ole Miss. As a result, she was named the SEC's Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 20 and was honored as the women's soccer player of the week by the Tennessee Sportswriters Association. Of VU's six goals in SEC play, Charley has scored five.

Charley leads the team with eight goals and 19 points and is tied for first with three assists.

The two-sport athlete from Hoover, Ala., also broke the Vanderbilt record five times in the triple jump last spring. She finished ninth at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships to earn second team All-American honors. At the USATF Junior Championship in June, she broke the school record again with a leap of 43-2.5 to finish third.



OGUNSAMI TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR SAVES

Vanderbilt freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami tied the school record with 15 saves against No. 10 Texas A&M on Oct. 10. It was the most saves by a Vanderbilt keeper since Christy Barringer made 15 stops on Oct. 17, 1992.

The Cherry Hill, N.J., native has quickly risen to the top of the SEC charts. The 5-foot-11 Ogunsami leads the league in saves (106) and saves per game (5.89) and is third in save percentage (.809). She has started all 18 games, played all but one half and posted five shutouts.

STOUT FIRST-HALF D'

Through the first 12 games, Vanderbilt was the only SEC team that hadn't allowed a first-half goal.

Missouri ended that streak with a goal in the first 24 seconds of the game. No. 10 Texas A&M, which leads the league with 37 goals, tacked on three in the first half against VU on Oct. 10.

Vanderbilt has allowed just five goals against 125 first-half shots this season.

SEVEN SENIORS HONORED

Vanderbilt's seven seniors were honored on Senior Night on Sunday before their last home game against Ole Miss.

Forwards Taylor Elliott, Gena Inbusch and Ashley Oswald along with midfielders Brittney Thomas and Ashley Vega and defenders Cherrelle Jarrett and Taylor Richardson will be recognized before the game with their families. Elliott and Vega made their first career starts. Oswald made her first start of the year and played three minutes before being subbed out to a nice round of applause by the Commodore faithful. Oswald hadn't played since scoring a goal and dishing out two assists on Sept. 14 against Chattanooga. A day after the game, doctors found a blood clot on her lung that ended her season.

Together, the seven seniors have played in 329 games and made 184 starts the past four years.

EXPERIENCED GROUP

The Commodores bring a wealth of experience for a team full of freshmen and sophomores, which count for 16 of the squad's 30 players. Twenty-one letterwinners return from 2013, including nine starters. The trio of forward/defender Kelsey Tillman, defender Cherrelle Jarrett and midfielder Erin Myers (a team captain) started all 19 games.

SEC All-Freshman forward Simone Charley started 16 of 17 games before suffering a MCL sprain. Forward/midfielder Sasha Gray started 18 of 19 games. Midfielders Jamie Kator and Andie Lakin each made 16 starts. Defender Taylor Richardson made 14 starts. As a freshman, Olivia Liebman started 13 games in goal after Alexa Levick suffered an ACL injury. In 2013, Vanderbilt scored 37 goals for its highest single-season scoring output since 2005. The Commodores also averaged 2.06 goals a game — their highest average in 13 years.

GRANADOS WINS GOLD

Redshirt sophomore Lina Granados did not play for the Commodores in 2013 in order to pursue a dream of representing her country in international play. Granados, a 5-foot-6 forward, helped the Colombian U-20 team win the gold medal in the 2013 Bolivarian Games last November. Granados, who first started playing with the team when

she was 15, and Colombia defeated Venezuela in penalty kicks of the tournament in Peru.

In January, Granados and the U-20 team narrowly missed qualifying for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup. Colombia finished third in the South American qualifier in Uruguay, falling short by one point as the top two teams qualify. Granados also spent part of this summer on the training roster of the full national team. Granados was born in Bogota, Colombia before her family moved to Costa Rica and then Ashburn, Va., where she has lived since she was five.

CIARROCCA, OSWALD DONE FOR SEASON

Vanderbilt forwards Colby Ciarrocca and Ashley Oswald both suffered season-ending injuries in the last month.

Ciarrocca's breakout freshman season came to a halt after a season-ending injury on Oct. 5. Ciarrocca broke her collarbone after landing hard on her right shoulder after a collision with a Missouri defender. Ciarrocca will undergo surgery later in the month. She is expected to be out for four to five months. Ciarrocca picked up five goals in the team's first eight games. She made four starts and was named the SEC Freshman of the Week and the Tennessee Sportswriters Association's Player of the Week on Sept. 2.

The Montgomery, N.J., native was honored after she scored her first two career goals, including the game-winning goal, in a 3-2 overtime win against Cincinnati on Aug. 29. Two days later, at Memphis, she scored twice more in a 2-1 win. She scored her fifth goal of the season against Chattanooga on Sept. 14.

Senior forward/midfielder Ashley Oswald is out for the rest of the season after doctors discovered a blood clot on her lung on Sept. 15.

Oswald experienced discomfort hours after scoring her first goal of the season and dishing out a personal-best two assists in a 6-0 victory over Chattanooga on Sept. 14. Oswald is undergoing treatment and remains with the team. The native of Pembroke Pines, Fla., played in 58 games with 16 starts and had four goals, six assists and 14 points.

She was cleared to play on Senior Night and made her first start of the season. She played three minutes before exiting to a nice applause.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Jamie Kator and Ashley Oswald met at the same spot, both determined to be the player to deliver a go-ahead goal for Vanderbilt.

But on a hot and muggy Friday night, it was Kator's time to be the star. And the junior came through. In the 67th minute, Kator scored on a penalty kick to lift the Commodores to a 1-0 victory at the Vanderbilt Soccer/Lacrosse Complex in the season opener for both teams.

"When I stepped up Ashley Oswald was there too and we kind of had a silent exchange like, 'Who is going to get this one?'" Kator said. "But it came down to me. I saw the keeper moving and I knew it was just so easy. So I hit it straight, hit it hard and it went in. It was just really exciting."

Kator scored the first goal for Vanderbilt in 2014 after forward Simone Charley drew a foul in the box. Charley, who scored the lone goal in the Commodores' exhibition victory against UAB last week, fell to the ground after she was tangled with Mercer's Rachel Buffalo. The two were fighting for a loose ball and Buffalo was whistled for a foul just inside the box.

That set up Kator, who scored two goals last year. The striker stepped up to the penalty kick spot just 12 yards from the goal. She saw Mercer goalkeeper Christina Mursuli lean to her left and fired a laser down the middle of the goal and to the right of Mursuli.

As they did in their exhibition victory over UAB, the Commodores (1-0) dominated possession of the game.

With eight shots on goal, Vanderbilt had several chances to score early but the Mercer goalie duo of Maggie Cropp and Mursuli made seven saves. In fact, Vanderbilt outshot Mercer 25-4, including an impressive 14-1 advantage in the second half.

After the game, head coach Derek Greene reminded his team that they had a similar shooting effort in the 2013 season opener. But this time the result was different.

"Opening game last year we outshot UAB 13-1 in the second half and lost that game," Greene said. "So we did what we needed to do. We grinded it out, held onto the lead late. I'm proud of our kids. They deserved it 100 percent."

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – In the season opener, the Vanderbilt women's soccer team fired off a bevy of shots.

On Sunday, opportunities were far fewer.

Less than 48 hours after opening the 2014 season with a win, the Commodores mustered just three shots in a 3-0 loss to Rutgers in the first road game of the season. The Scarlet Knights scored all three goals in the second half and outshot Vanderbilt 19-3.

After recording 25 shots in a 1-0 victory over Mercer on Friday, Vanderbilt faced a quick turnaround. The team boarded a plane early Saturday afternoon and flew nearly 900 miles to play Rutgers, an NCAA Tournament team a year ago.

The Commodores (1-1) and the Scarlet Knights (2-0) played an evenly match first half. Neither team scored over the first 45 minutes. Rutgers outshot Vanderbilt 6-2 in the opening half but freshman Christiana Ogunsami, playing in her native state of New Jersey, made three saves.

Forward Simone Charley had the team's best chance at scoring in the 14th minute. She kept playing through a play that looked like an easy pickup for Rutgers goalie Casey Murphy and knocked the ball loose. But her header was cleared away by a Rutgers defender at the goal line.

After halftime, Rutgers proved to be the aggressor, outshooting Vanderbilt 13-1. Stefanie Scholz broke up a scoreless tie in the 51st minute on a goal to the right of a diving Ogunsami. It was the first goal Ogunsami had allowed in her first 141 minutes of collegiate action.

Nearly 15 minutes later, Rutgers added insurance with the first of two goals by Amy Pietrangelo. After Rachel Cole's header hit the post, Pietrangelo chipped in the rebound. In the 89th minute, with the Commodores stretching the field in hopes of a desperation goal, Pietrangelo added the final goal of the game on a breakaway attempt that slipped into the bottom right corner.

Ogunsami made a total of six saves, including knocking away breakaway attempt in the opening minutes of the game.

Along with Ogunsami (Cherry Hill, N.J.), junior midfielder Andie Lakin (Wayne, N.J.) and freshman forward Colby Ciarrocca (Montgomery, N.J.) returned to their home state.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – With no timeouts, college soccer coaches have to rely on their players to stick together and rally each other when faced with adverse situations.

On Friday night, Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene witnessed his team grow up a little.

Trailing by a goal late in the second half, the Commodores were determined to fight back against a scrappy, physical Cincinnati team. Behind the first two career goals of freshman Colby Ciarrocca, including the game-winner in overtime, Vanderbilt rallied for a 3-2 win over the Bearcats at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. In rallying past Cincinnati (2-1), Vanderbilt avoided a second straight loss and appeared to learn from its setback at Rutgers on Sunday when three second-half goals spelled doom.

"I really think they thought, 'We're not going to go through this again. We're still going to get this and we're going to fight for this,'" Greene said. "I think it is just a belief in each other and trust in each other... We have some really good players right now. We're still a little bit young but the determination on their faces when we went down 2-1, you could see it."

Coming off the bench, Ciarrocca tied the game on a header in the 81st minute, thanks to a brilliant cross by her roommate and fellow freshman Cristina De Zeeuw. Standing in the box, Ciarrocca out-jumped a Cincinnati defender and headed a shot just inside the post.

She won the game 12 minutes later. After Erin Myers forced a turnover in the midfield, the junior captain sent a pass up the field to Simone Charley. The sophomore, who scored the first goal of the game, laid the ball off to her left for Ciarrocca. The forward then put on a move to separate from one defender and fired a missile past Cincinnati goalkeeper Natalie Smith. The Commodores celebrated their first win in overtime since a 3-2 double overtime victory at Arkansas on Oct. 5, 2012.

But victory was snatched away from the Commodores.

Rice scored in the 90th minute to force overtime and then scored the game-winner in the opening minute of overtime to hand Vanderbilt a 2-1 loss on Friday night.

The Commodores suffered a 1-0 loss at North Texas on Sunday for their second straight loss. A goal in the 69th minute for the undefeated Mean Green was the difference but Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said his team’s start to the game proved more costly.

“This is a tough loss,” Greene said. “We have to do a better job coming out with more passion in the first half. We moved the ball well but there was no desire to win in the first half.”

Coming off a tough 2-1 overtime loss at Rice on Friday, Vanderbilt (3-3) mustered just three shots in the opening half against North Texas. The Commodores managed 10 shots in the second half. But it wasn’t enough as they had just four shots on goal. Sasha Gray led the team with five shots. Simone Charley had three shots, including two on goal and one that hit the post. Jamie Kator and freshman Colby Ciarrocca, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week, each took two shots.

North Texas (5-0) stayed undefeated on a goal midway through the second half. Molly Grisham scored on a shot outside the penalty box that soared into the top right corner and well beyond the reach of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami for the game-winner. Ogunsami made six saves, just one shy of tying a career-high.

“The second half we imposed our will on the game and dominated every phase other than the scoreboard,” Greene said. “There were some really bright spots and quality chances in the second half, but we played down to their level in the first half and that ultimately cost us the game. That’s unacceptable and we have to learn from it.”

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Gena Inbusch showed off her range with her first goal of the season – the game-winner in a 1-0 victory over crosstown rival Lipscomb on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. It was her eighth career goal.

The Commodores fired off 15 shots, including eight on goal. Sophomore Simone Charley led the way with six shots, including three on goal. Lipscomb (4-3-1) had eight shots, but just two came after halftime as Vanderbilt controlled possession. The loss snapped a program-best three-game losing streak for the Lady Bisons.

“We had a little chip on our shoulder being from the same city,” Oswald said. “Throughout the full 90 both teams gritted it out. Our coaches said in the first half we were a bit more clean and crisp. We had to do what he had to do to get points on the scoreboard. They were a definitely a good team and it was tough but we gritted it out until the final minute and it was a great win.”

Freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, who entered the game with a SEC-high 30 saves, made three saves to post her second career shutout. Through seven games, Vanderbilt hasn't allowed a first-half goal.

The win snapped a two-game winning streak and gave Vanderbilt some much-needed confidence after a pair of one-goal losses on the road last weekend to Rice and North Texas.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – The Vanderbilt soccer team capped off non-conference play with a scoring outburst the program hasn't seen in seven years.

With Southeastern Conference play set to begin next weekend, the Commodores boosted their confidence with a 6-0 win over Chattanooga on Sunday afternoon at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex. Six players scored for Vanderbilt, which last scored six goals in a game on Sept. 9, 2007 against Tennessee Tech.

The Commodores used 28 players and fired off an astonishing 47 shots while Chattanooga (1-6) had just one. Through eight games, Vanderbilt (5-3) already has more wins than they had all of last season.

“I told the team before the game I'm not sure what to expect from Chattanooga. We didn't have a ton of information on them. But we knew what to expect from us,” coach Derek Greene said. “It took about 10 minutes to get flowing in that game but once we did, we never looked back. I think the fact we could score some quality goals and do some things in the attacking third we haven't done. Could have had more but we stuck six in and that is really good. ATHENS, Ga. – On the road, against a ranked team in the Southeastern Conference opener, the Vanderbilt soccer team pounced first and had chances to increase its lead.

But the Commodores couldn't manufacture the same energy after halftime, allowing three goals in a 3-1 loss to No. 24 Georgia on Sunday at UGA Soccer Stadium in the Southeastern Conference opener.

An early first-half goal by Simone Charley was the only score for the Commodores, who outshot Georgia 11-8 at halftime. But the Bulldogs were the aggressor in the second half, outshooting Vanderbilt 14-5 in the second half.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After holding strong against a flurry of Auburn shots in the early going, the Vanderbilt soccer team battled back to stay undefeated at home on Friday night.

Neither team scored but the Commodores picked up their first point of the young SEC season with a 0-0 double overtime tie against the visiting Tigers in the conference home opener.

"We were lucky not to be down 1-0, I told the team, in the first 15 minutes," Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said. "Honestly, I've seen a lot of video on Auburn and I think that's the best game they've played all year... I haven't seen them be that mobile in the attacking half of the field so credit to them. But really proud of our team's response. It was a really good response by us. I felt like after the first 15 (minutes) we were unlucky not to win the game. I think we created a ton of chances. But, again, credit to Auburn. It was a really good game."

In front of a lively, student-heavy crowd of 876 - a season-high - at the VU Soccer Complex, Vanderbilt (5-4-1, 0-1-1 SEC) came alive after a sluggish first half. Thirteen of the Commodores' 15 shots came after halftime, including 11 in the second half. Jamie Kator led the way with four shots, including three on goal. Kator had several good looks but Auburn goalkeeper Alyse Scott snuffed out every chance with a season-high 10 saves.

Vanderbilt's goalkeeper was up to the challenge, too. At one point in the first half, Auburn (6-3-1, 0-1-1) outshot Vanderbilt 7-0. But VU freshman goalie Christiana Ogunsumi didn't let any of Auburn's 21 shots sneak by her. Ogunsumi set a career-high with nine saves and posted her third shutout of the season - and fourth for the team.

She made a couple big saves late in regulation, diving to her left to snatch a couple shots. She also snuffed out a possible finish on an Auburn corner kick late in the game by just using all of her 5-foot-11 frame to pluck the ball out of the air.

"She just goes up and snags a ball out of the air that you don't see very often in the women's game," Greene said. "Her game management was good. We gave her some balls under pressure a couple times and she dealt with it very well. So I'm really proud of her and she is developing so well. (Assistant coach) Sebastian (Vecchio) is doing a great job with her. She comes to work every day with the other goalkeepers with Sebastian and they're just bringing an effort and they're all making each other better."

It was the first tie for both teams, each recording a point in the SEC standings.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – From start to finish on Sunday night, Vanderbilt soccer coach Derek Greene believed his team was the better squad in all phases on Sunday.

Unfortunately a play that lasted just seconds sunk the Commodores in a 1-0 loss to Alabama at the VU Soccer Complex. It was Vanderbilt's first loss at home this year after starting with four wins and a tie.

Merel van Dongen's corner kick was deflected and went right to Jordan Meier, who booted in a goal in the 61st minute. Vanderbilt outshot Alabama 25-19, with nine players taking shots. The Commodores (5-5-1, 0-2-1 SEC) also manufactured eight corner kicks. But Vanderbilt was held scoreless for the second straight game and is still searching for its first SEC win of the season.

"I'm really proud of the team," Greene said. "My thoughts are it is the game of soccer and it really stinks for our kids right now. We should have won that game. We had no business losing it. Sometimes it happens like that. I'm just proud of the effort. They brought it for 90 minutes tonight. We were clearly the better team. Dominated every phase of the game – every phase. Unfortunately, the scoreboard was the main one that matters. And they stuck a set piece in. We told the team set pieces were going to be important. They're dangerous on those and they live for them and certainly it cost us tonight."

Sophomore Simone Charley led the Commodores with seven shots against Alabama (7-3-1, 2-1). Midfielder Lydia Simmons added five shots, with a team-high three on goal and freshman Colby Ciarrocca fired off four shots. The Commodores haven't scored in more than 283 minutes. On Friday, they tied with Auburn in double overtime and their last goal came in the seventh minute against Georgia a week ago.

In goal, Christiana Ogunsam made eight saves, one shy of a career-high. The freshman goalkeeper and Vanderbilt's stout back line defense hadn't allowed a goal since the 86th minute of a loss to Georgia one week ago for a span of more than 174 minutes. The Commodores extended their SEC best streak to 11 games this season without allowing a first-half goal.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. – After an evenly played first half, Vanderbilt soccer coach Derek Greene believes his team played a second half worthy of coming away victorious.

Unfortunately the breaks didn't go the Commodores' way.

For the third straight game, the Vanderbilt soccer team was held scoreless in a 1-0 loss at Arkansas on Friday night.

The Commodores failed to score in losing back-to-back games and falling below .500 for the first time this season. The Commodores (5-6-1, 0-3-1 SEC) are looking for their first SEC victory of the season along with their first goal since the seventh minute against Georgia on Sept. 21.

"Anybody that has spent time around soccer will tell you soccer can be a cruel sport sometimes and we are feeling that now," he said. "The luck just isn't going our way, but I am very proud of our effort and play. We out-worked and out-hustled an Arkansas team that takes a lot of pride in having a blue collar effort. We won most of the physical battles and played some tremendous soccer. I am very proud of our entire team for the work they put in and the belief they have."

After Vanderbilt once again didn't allow a goal in the first half – the only team in the SEC to stake that claim through 12 games — Arkansas scored the lone goal in the 50th minute. Hailey Pescatore scored her first goal of the season after Arkansas (6-2-4, 2-0-2) took advantage of a rebound when a shot bounced off the crossbar.

The Commodores nearly tied the game in the 60th minute but Simone Charley's shot hit the crossbar and Gena Inbusch's rebound attempt went wide left. Vanderbilt took nine shots, including four on goal.

Vanderbilt will try to bounce back on Sunday when it stays on the road and plays at Missouri at 1 p.m. in a game broadcast on SEC Network +.

"We have a lot of SEC games left," Greene said, "and we will take some grit and fight with us to Missouri on Sunday and hope to create our own luck through even harder work than we put in tonight."

STARKVILLE, Miss. - With October halfway over, the Vanderbilt soccer team knows time is running out in order to achieve its goal and reach the SEC Tournament.

On Friday night, the Commodores catapulted themselves into the hunt with a huge win - their first in SEC play this year.

Simone Charley headed in a corner kick by Lydia Simmons to propel VU to a 1-0 road victory over Mississippi State on Friday night. The win snapped a four-game losing streak and was Vanderbilt's first victory since defeating Chattanooga on Sept. 14 six games ago. It was also their first SEC win since defeating Mississippi State last October.

"This was a huge win," Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said. "Obviously, there are several of us that know it is crunch time to get into the SEC Tournament. We knew that coming into this game against Mississippi State. I was very proud of the way we moved the ball in our possession. I'd like for us to play with a little more urgency a little earlier on, just understanding the situation we are in right now. But we have played pretty well throughout the SEC season and not have had any results to show for it. Tonight, I'm just really happy for these kids. They deserve this."

The Commodores (6-8-1, 1-5-1 SEC) dominated the tempo with 19 shots. Charley and Simmons each had six shots, with Charley putting five shots on goal. Charley scored her fifth goal of the season (tied for the most on the team) in the 78th minute. The sophomore forward ran and leaped into a cross on a corner kick from Simmons and headed the ball into the top of the net.

Vanderbilt notched its fifth shutout of the season against the Bulldogs (3-11, 0-7). Freshman goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami, fresh off tying a school-record with 15 saves against No. 10 Texas A&M last week, posted her fourth shutout. Ogunsami finished with seven saves. Greene also lauded the efforts of midfielders Erin Myers and Andie Lakin and the entire back line of Taylor Richardson, Claire Anderson, Cherelle Jarrett and Kelsey Tillman for thwarting the attempts of Mississippi State. The Bulldogs had only nine shots.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Simone Charley's scoring surge continued and the defense and goalkeeper Christiana Ogunsami stood tall once again as the Vanderbilt soccer team knocked off rival Tennessee for the first time in five years.

Charley scored twice and the defense posted its second straight shutout in a 2-0 victory over the Volunteers on Sunday night. With a victory over Mississippi State on Friday, the Commodores (7-8-1, 2-5-1 SEC) swept the weekend and won consecutive SEC games for the first time since 2011. They also collected back-to-back SEC road victories for the first time since 2010.

The Commodores have won two straight and moved into a tie for 11th place with Tennessee (7-8-1, 2-5-1) in the SEC standings with seven points with three regular-season games left. The top 10 teams in the league reach the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Ala., in November. Vanderbilt last played in the SEC Tournament in 2010.

Vanderbilt also defeated in-state foe Tennessee for the first time since 2009 and notched its first victory in Knoxville since the 2008 season. It marked the first win over the in-state rival for Vanderbilt's fourth-year head coach Derek Greene, a Knoxville native who graduated from and was an assistant coach at Tennessee and had a large contingency of family and friends in the stands.

"First of all it is great to get a win against the University of Tennessee, which is a big in-state rival for us of course," Greene said. "We didn't talk much about that at all (before the game) but I think the kids were motivated to play Tennessee just because who they are. I couldn't be happier and more proud of this group that continue to come to work every day and every game. I felt like they deserved to be in a good position going into the last two weeks of the season. I'm really, really proud of the effort they've put in."

It was the first multi-goal game of Charley's career. The sophomore has scored four times in the last three games and is responsible for five of the team's six goals in SEC play this season.

The Vanderbilt defense and Ogunsami collected the team's sixth shutout of the season. It was the fifth of the season for Ogunsami. The freshman made four saves, including a couple diving stops to her left in the second half. Tennessee had 18 shots but only four were on goal.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – The Vanderbilt soccer team's hopes of making the SEC Tournament were dashed on Sunday night.

The Commodores surrendered two goals in the second half in a 2-1 loss to Ole Miss at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex on Senior Night.

The loss eliminated Vanderbilt (7-9-2, 2-6-2 SEC) from SEC Tournament contention. With just one game left – on Thursday at No. 8 Florida – the Commodores have eight points. They were chasing Ole Miss (8-5-5, 5-3-3), which now has 13 points and is alone in 10th place. The top 10 teams make the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Ala.

“Frustrating loss for us, obviously,” Vanderbilt coach Derek Greene said. “We wanted to get these seniors to Orange Beach. I thought we played well enough to win. For probably 70 minutes of the game we were the better team. I thought we were dangerous all night. We really couldn't be stopped. We kind of stopped ourselves unfortunately. I thought they played hard... Our team kept fighting and kept believing. Unfortunately, the result didn't go our way.”

Simone Charley put VU ahead 1-0 with a goal in the 47th minute. The sophomore received the ball outside of the box and dribbled all the way in past several defenders before uncorking her team-high eighth goal over Ole Miss goalkeeper Kelly McCormick.

But the Rebels quickly tied the game, scoring in the 54th minute. Bethany Bunker sailed a shot in from the right side, out of reach of Vanderbilt goalkeeper Christiana Ogunnsami.

The game stayed tied for nearly 30 minutes before Ole Miss scored the game-winner. On a free kick after a Vanderbilt yellow card, Jessica Hiskey snuck a shot around a wall of Commodore defenders and off the hand of Ogunnsami. The Commodores had 13 shots, including eight before halftime. Charley led the team with five, including two on goal. But Charley left the game with 25 minutes remaining due to a knee injury. She returned briefly late in the game before subbing out.

With their parents, siblings and friends and family on hand, Vanderbilt's seven seniors – Cherrelle Jarrett, Taylor Richardson, Gena Inbusch, Ashley Oswald, Taylor Elliott, Ashley Vega and Brittney Thomas – were honored before they took the field for their last home game.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After a sluggish first half, Vanderbilt soccer coach Derek Greene urged his team to “flip the switch” after halftime.

The Commodores responded to secure a huge point with just two games remaining.

Senior Cherrelle Jarrett headed in a goal on a pass from fellow senior Taylor Richardson in the 78th minute as Vanderbilt rallied to tie No. 21 South Carolina 1-1 after two overtimes on Friday night at the VU Soccer/Lacrosse Complex.

“Give them a lot of credit, they were very good in the first half; this is a really good South Carolina team,” Greene said. “We used that exact quote at halftime - flip the switch. And they all nodded like they could flip the switch. And our team flipped it. We knew we had to press to get a result here and try to at least get a tie. Our kids did. Very proud of their response in the second half. They earned a tie and maybe could have gotten more.”

The Commodores, trying to make the SEC Tournament for the first time in four years, picked up one point with the tie. They now have eight points and are alone in 11th place, two behind Ole Miss, which tied Missouri on Friday night. The top 10 teams in the league make the tournament, which is played from Nov. 3-9 in Orange Beach, Ala.

Vanderbilt (7-8-2, 2-5-2 SEC) hosts Ole Miss at 5 p.m. on Sunday in a pivotal game that could ultimately decide the 10th and final spot in the tournament. The team's seven seniors -- Jarrett, Richardson, Taylor Elliott, Gena Inbusch, Ashley Oswald, Brittney Thomas and Ashley Vega -- will be honored before their last home game for Senior Night.

Jarrett and Richardson connected for a clutch goal late in the second half. The equalizer came at the end of a free kick by redshirt freshman Lydia Simmons. South Carolina (11-4-2, 4-3-2) attempted to clear out her cross into the box.

But Richardson tracked down the ball about 30 yards out and lobbed a kick to the right side of the box. Keeping herself onside, Jarrett leapt up and headed the ball over goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo and into the back of the net. It was the second goal of the season for the two-year captain and fifth of her career.
