
























COMMODORES ENTERING UNCHARTED BOWL ERA

significance for the Commodores. For the first time in program history, Vanderbilt is experiencing three consecutive bowl games, coming after appearances in the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl and 2012 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

The Commodores are 3-2-1 all-time in postseason bowls. The victories have come last year in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl (38-24 over N.C. State), in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl (16-14 over Boston College) and in 1955 at the Gator Bowl (25-13 over Auburn). Vanderbilt also tied Texas Tech 6-6 in the 1974 Peach Bowl. The losses have come in competitive, high-scoring affairs — 31-24 to Cincinnati in the 2011 Liberty Bowl and 36-28 to Air Force in the 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl.

The 1982 Hall of Fame encounter against Air Force also was played at Legion Field, site of the BBVA Compass Bowl.

James Franklin has enjoyed instant success as Vanderbilt's head coach, guiding the Commodores to bowl appearances in each of his three years on campus.

The BBVA Compass Bowl also is Vanderbilt's first January appearance.

VANDERBILT HAS WON NINE STRAIGHT NOVEMBER GAMES UNDER FRANKLIN

Vanderbilt has become a superb late-season team under **James Franklin**.

The Commodores notched their ninth consecutive win in the month of November by topping Wake Forest 23-21.

Vanderbilt's current nine-win streak in November is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished during the 1903-05 seasons.

The 'Dores under James Franklin are 10-2 in November games. In the decade before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

COMMODORES ARE 15-4 IN LAST 19 GAMES; OWN SEC'S 2ND BEST RECORD DURING SPAN

Since last October, the Commodores sport one of the Southeastern Conference's best records.

Vanderbilt owns a 15-4 overall record in its last 19 games dating back to a victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

The stretch includes a seven-game win streak to end the 2012 regular season, victory in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, and a four-game win streak to conclude this year.

The Commodores also own the SEC's second best record over that span. Defending BCS national champion Alabama (18-1) owns the only record better than Vanderbilt.

The Commodores' margin of victory in the 15 wins has been 18.1 points.

Eleven of Vanderbilt's victories have come against members of BCS-affiliated conferences: Auburn, Kentucky (twice), Ole Miss, Tennessee (twice), Georgia and Florida from the SEC and Wake Forest (twice) and N.C. State from the ACC.

Three of Vanderbilt's four losses have come to teams currently ranked in the Associated Press Top 25: No. 8 South Carolina, No. 9 Missouri and No. 22 Texas A&M.

Vanderbilt is also 16-5 in its last 21 games.

FRANKLIN'S COMMODORES ARE 11-1 IN REGULAR SEASON, NON-SEC PLAY

Vanderbilt notched its seventh straight regular season win against a non-Southeastern Conference team on Nov. 30 with a narrow victory over Atlantic Coast Conference member Wake Forest.

Besides Wake, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay, UMass and UAB, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 11-1 (.917) in regular season games against non-SEC teams, and 12-2 overall (.857) against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2012 and 2013 unblemished out-of-conference marks are the program's first since 1994.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt is 24-13 (.649) against regular season non-SEC teams.

VANDERBILT REGISTERS BACK-TO-BACK EIGHT-WIN REGULAR SEASONS

With its win over Wake Forest in the season finale on Nov. 30, Vanderbilt registered back-to-back eight-win regular seasons for the first time since the 1920s.

In the 2012 and 2013 seasons, the Commodores have finished with regular season records of 8-4. In both seasons, Vanderbilt ran the table on its four opponents in November.

Vanderbilt last achieved consecutive eight-win seasons under Hall of Fame coach Dan McGugin just before the Great Depression in 1927-28.

In its 123-year gridiron history, Vanderbilt has posted at least eight wins in 18 seasons.

Vanderbilt moved closer to inclusion in the Associated Press and Coaches/USA Today Top 25 polls after closing the regular season with a win over Wake Forest.

Vanderbilt notched 40 votes in the coaches' last final regular season ballot, and 25 votes in the AP poll. The 'Dores were No. 27 in the final coaches vote and No. 29 in the AP tally.

The Commodores ended 2012 ranked 20th by the coaches and 23rd



McGugin's potent 'Dore teams in the World War I era. The 2012 unit established a modern day scoring standard by averaging 30.0 points.

The chart shows a Commodore unit that compares with the 2012 offense that ranked among the team's best ever, and is improved from James Franklin's initial offense in 2011. The current offense is vastly improved over the 2010 unit, the last prior to Franklin's arrival.

Through 12 games, the current offense is averaging just 0.1 points less than the 2012 unit that featured a 2,500-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver.

ALL-SEC RECIPIENTS: MATTHEWS, HAL, JOHNSON AND LADLER

Four Vanderbilt seniors – WR **Jordan Matthews**, CB **Andre Hal**, OT **Wesley Johnson** and safety **Kenny Ladler** – have earned All-SEC postseason honors from coaches and sportswriters.

League coaches named Matthews and Ladler to their first team All-SEC squad, and Hal and Johnson to their second team All-SEC unit. A panel of Associated Press writers placed Matthews and Johnson on their first team all-conference squad, adding Ladler and Hal as second team selections.

It marked the second straight year that Matthews earned consensus first team All-SEC recognition. The record-breaking senior is Vanderbilt's first two-time consensus first team All-SEC receiver since **Earl Bennett** was recognized in 2005-07.

It also marked the second straight year that Hal was recognized. In 2012, the cornerback was named second team All-SEC by the Associated Press.

This is the first year that Johnson and Ladler have received All-SEC honors. In 2012, the Associated Press panel included Johnson among its honorable mention All-SEC candidate.

JELKS NAMED ALL-FRESHMAN

Andrew Jelks (R-Fr., OL) was named SEC All-Freshman by the head coaches.

Jelks took over the starting right tackle role in the fourth game. He finished with eight starts.

Jelks was also named a Third Team Freshman All-America OT by Athlons.

Kenny Ladler (Sr., safety) and Darreon Herring (So., LB) are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 60 solo tackles and 87 total stops. Herring is second with 80 total stops and third behind Ladler and **Javon Marshall** (Sr., safety) in solo stops.

DE Caleb Azubike has the most tackles for loss (9.5) while DE Kyle Woestmann has the team lead in QB sacks (5.5). DE Walker May is second in both categories.

Ladler also holds the team high with five interceptions, followed by Paris Head (R-Fr., CB) with three.

DEFENSE IMPRESSES IN VANDERBILT'S LAST FOUR CONFERENCE VICTORIES

The Vanderbilt defense has registered four impressive efforts in late-season wins over Georgia, Florida, Kentucky and Tennessee.

TENNESSEE – The unit held the Vols to its fewest points in the series since 1968. Tennessee managed just 53 passing yards and 257 total yards against the Commodore defense, which also picked off three UT passes.

KENTUCKY – One week earlier, the defense held Kentucky scoreless after an opening-drive touchdown. After that possession, Kentucky managed just 187 total yards on 56 plays. The unit also picked off a season-high four passes against the Wildcats.

FLORIDA – On Nov. 9, the defense limited Florida to 39 rushing yards and forced four critical turnovers. helping Vanderbilt to its first win in Gainesville since 1945.

GEORGIA – In mid-October, the unit held Georgia to season lows in virtually every offensive category, including rushing yards (107), first downs (16), total yards (221) and points scored (27). UGA QB **Aaron Murray**, the league's all-time leader in passing yardage, threw for only 114 yards, the third lowest total of his career. Trailing by 10 points at intermission, the 'Dore defense held Georgia to just five first downs and 80 total yards in the second half.

Georgia's 221 yards of total offense was the fewest allowed to an SEC team since the unit held Auburn to 212 total yards on Oct. 20, 2012.

COMMODORES HAVE NINE CAPTAINS

The Commodores feature nine team captains this year.

Head Coach James Franklin announced in August that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are Austyn Carta-Samuels (R-Sr., QB), Andrew East (R-Jr., snapper), Chase Garnham (Sr., LB), Andre Hal (Sr., CB),

Wesley Johnson (R-Sr., OT), Javon Marshall (R-Sr., safety), Jordan Matthews (Sr., WR), Walker May (R-Sr., DE) and Carey Spear (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since QB Jay Cutler was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they served as team captains.

CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss. Garnham has 19 tackles in five starts this year.

ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

All-SEC recipient has 40 total tackles, including 6.5 for losses, two INTs and SEC-high 14 passes defended.

WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL, named All-SEC by coaches and writers this year, has started more games (50) than any other player in Vanderbilt history.

JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 48 solo stops and 77 total tackles.

JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

Consensus All-SEC player will go down as one of the SEC's all-time great WRs. He set many SEC records, including 107 catches in 2013, and established a new team mark with 1,334 rec. yards. He is listed on Athlons and USA Today's All-America team.

WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

The Birmingham product and two-time captain has 40 total tackles, 4.0 QB sacks & 8.5 tackles for loss in 12 starts.

CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior is 13-of-17 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or longer. Spear has also been one of the SEC's top kickoff specialists this year.

NINETEEN COMMODORES HAVE EARNED INITIAL STARTS DURING 2013 SEASON

Colby Cooke (R-Fr., punter), Trent Pruitt (R-Jr., WR) and Jahmel McIntosh (R-So., safety) are the latest Commodores to earn their first career starts when Vanderbilt defeated Wake Forest Nov. 30.

Cooke averaged 53.5 yards on two punts while McIntosh contributed four tackles against Wake Forest.

Cooke, Pruitt and McIntosh join 16 other Commodores who have earned their first career starts this season.

- Dillon van der Wal (R-So., TE) became the latest Commodore to earn his initial start when Vanderbilt defeated Florida Nov. 9.
- Patton Robinette (R-Fr., QB), Paris Head (R-Fr., CB) and Torren McGaster (R-Fr., CB) started at Texas A&M. Robinette was 15-of-28 for 216 yards and a TD vs. the Aggies. Head and McGaster contributed three and two tackles, respectively.

Sims has impressed as a kick returner, averaging 23.1 yards, and has 10 total tackles at cornerback.


Cunningham has five starts at wide receiver, and has registered 15 catches for 123 vards.

MATTHEWS SETS NUMEROUS TEAM, SEC RECORDS; NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-AMERICA BY USA TODAY

Jordan Matthews (Sr., WR) has established himself as one of the finest receivers to ever wear the Black & Gold. As he pushes toward the final game of his Vanderbilt career, Matthews is making a strong case for inclusion among the greatest receivers in Southeastern Conference history.

After the regular season, *USA Today* and Athlons named Matthews as a First Team All-America. He is the first 'Dore to earn such First Team All-America honors since LB **Jamie Duncan** in 1997. He also earned second or third team All-America recognition from the Associated Press, SI.com and CBSSports.com.

A series of superb late-season performances have allowed Matthews to smash several important SEC career and single-season records for receivers, including career catches, career receiving yardage and receptions in a season.

In the regular season finale, Matthews totaled 125 yards on 11 receptions in Vanderbilt's 23-21 victory over Wake Forest. Matthews' final catch against the Demon Deacons – a 25-yarder in heavy traffic on 4th & 12 – will go down as one of the highlights of a remarkable career. The Commodores tallied a game-winning field goal three plays later with 39 seconds left.

Matthews shattered the SEC record for single-season receptions vs. Wake Forest. He ended the regular season with 107 receptions, 10 more than the previous record set by former

Commodore **Keith Edwards** in 1983. Matthews' SEC career record of 257 receptions is 21 more than the No. 2 all-time receiver, former Vanderbilt WR **Earl Bennett**.

Matthews leads the SEC in both receptions and receiving yardage. He ended the regular season with 1,334 receiving yards, a new team standard and the No. 5 single-season total in SEC history. He became the SEC's all-time leader in receiving yardage more than a month ago, and has nearly 500 more receiving yards than any other player in conference history. He also set the Vanderbilt team record Oct. 5 against Missouri with his 22nd career touchdown catch.

Matthews, a 2013 Biletnikoff Award semifinalist, also extended his SEC career record to games surpassing 100 receiving yards. He has a team-record eight games of 100+ receiving yards this year.

Matthews was sensational against SEC teams this year. He has 74 catches – a 9.2-reception avg. – for 904 yards in eight league encounters.

Matthews has opened and closed his senior year in remarkable fashion. In the opener, he put together a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole

Miss. In his last three games – against Kentucky, Tennessee and Wake Forest – Matthews has amassed 36 receptions and 399 receiving yards.

88.5 percent success leads the SEC and ranks 25th nationally. In 2012, Vanderbilt owned a 73% success rate.

Matthews' effort vs. Kentucky - 12 catches for 141 yards - earned the standout SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Remarkably, it marked Matthews' first recognition from the SEC.

CHASE GARNHAM (Sr., LB)

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - TENNESSEE, Nov. 23

In earning SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors, Garnham topped the Commodores' superb defensive effort against Tennessee. The linebacker contributed 10 total tackles – a season high – as Vanderbilt held Tennessee to its smallest point total since the 1960s.

PARIS HEAD (R-Fr., CB)

CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - TENNESSEE, Nov. 23

Forced into the lineup due to injuries, Head responded by picking off two Tennessee passes. One of Head's picks came on a Volunteer fake field goal deep in Vanderbilt territory.

CAREY SPEAR (Sr., PK)

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK - WAKE FOREST, Nov. 30

Spear shared SEC co-Specialist of the Week honors after kicking three field goals in a 23-21 victory over Wake Forest. Spear's last FG came from 38 yards out with 39 seconds left, and clinched the win for the Commodores. He also matched a single-game career high for field goals during the effort.

SIGNATURE WINS FOR THE COMMODORES: TENNESSEE, FLORIDA & GEORGIA

For the first time in Vanderbilt history, the Commodores defeated SEC East rivals Georgia, Florida and Tennessee in the same season in 2013.

The signature wins started during a furious, double-digit Commodore comeback at home against Georgia, Vanderbilt's first against the Bulldogs in Nashville since 1991. Two weeks later, the Commodores went on the road to claim their first victory in Gainesville since the World War II era. Two weeks after the Florida win, Vanderbilt went to Knoxville and won in dramatic fashion on a touchdown in the final minute.

Here's more on each of the signature wins:

GEORGIA, Oct. 19 31-27, in Nashville

- ★ The victory over No. 15 Georgia marked Vanderbilt's first against a ranked opponent since the Commodores defeated BCS No. 24 Boston College 16-14 in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.
- ★ The win was Vanderbilt's first in Nashville against Georgia since a 27-25 victory in 1991.
- ★ Sparked by redshirt QB Patton Robinette, the Commodores rallied from a 27-14 deficit after three quarters to outscore the Bulldogs 17-0 in the fourth quarter.

FLORIDA, Nov. 9 34-17, in Gainesville

- ★ It marked Vanderbilt's first victory on the Florida campus since a 7-0 shutout in 1945. That game, held just months after World War II ended, was Vanderbilt's first visit to Gainesville. Until the win, the Commodores were 0-19-1 in the Swamp since the 1945 win.
- ★ The victory also ended years of Commodore frustration in the series. The win was Vanderbilt's first over the Gators since 1988.
- ★ The win was sparked by a defense that limited Florida to 39 rushing yards and forced four Gator turnovers.

TENNESSEE, Nov. 23 14-10, in Knoxville

- ★ Following a 41-18 triumph in Nashville last year, the 14-10 win in Knoxville marked Vanderbilt's first back-to-back victories over the Vols since the 1925-26 seasons.
- ★ It was Vanderbilt's first victory in Neyland Stadium since Jay Cutler engineered a game-winning, fourth quarter drive in 2005.
- ★ It marked the 'Dores' fifth road win in SEC play in the last two years.

Kenny Ladler (Sr., safety) has been recognized for a remarkable senior season in the Commodore secondary.

In early December Ladler was named All-SEC by both the league's coaches and writers.

Ladler tops the SEC in forced fumbles, and ranks second in the league in both interceptions and solo tackles.



LASSING, HUDSON NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE DISTRICT III ALL-ACADEMIC SQUAD

Two of Vanderbilt's top scholar athletes, **Fitz Lassing** (Sr., FB) and **Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) earned Capital One/ CoSIDA Academic District III recognition this season.

Lassing, from Nashville, and Hudson, from Powell, Ohio, were considered for the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team.

Lassing and Hudson are the first Commodore football players to earn Academic All-District recognition since linebacker **John Stokes** and receiver **John Cole** were recognized in 2010.

Lassing returned to the Commodore starting lineup at Florida, providing several key lead blocks from his fullback position in the Vanderbilt victory. On the season, he has four pass receptions for 25 yards and two touchdowns.

Lassing is expected to earn an undergraduate degree in Economics in May. He holds a 3.9 GPA and is a multiple SEC Academic Honor Roll and Dean's List recipient.

Hudson has been superb as a first-year starting punter. He ranks among the nation's top 25 punters with a 42.9-yard average, and owns one of the top net averages in the SEC.

Hudson holds a 3.78 GPA as he works toward a Bachelor's degree in Neuroscience from the College of Arts and Science.

VANDERBILT COACHES: ONLY SEC STAFF FULLY INTACT FROM A YEAR AGO

The Vanderbilt coaching staff is the only one in the Southeastern Conference fully intact from 2012.

The Commodores are one of nine schools from the BCS-affiliated conference that return intact staffs. It also marks the first time since 2009 that the Vandy staff remained intact.

Jordan Rodgers threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as the Commodores capped their best season since 1915 by defeating North Carolina State 38-24 in Nashville's LP Field.

"We're not going anywhere," a smiling and teary Franklin said. The Commodores finished 9-4 for their best record since going 9-1 in 1915. It marks only the third time the smallest and only

private university in the SEC has won as many as nine games in a season.

Vandy closed the season with seven straight wins for its longest streak since an eight-game run in 1948. Senior RB Zac Stacy earned the bowl's MVP honors with 108 rushing yards and one touchdowns.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Vanderbilt won a bowl game for the first time in exactly 53 years, with Bryant Hahnfeldt kicking a 45-yard field goal with 3:26 left for a 16-14 win over #24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl held on New Year's Eve on Nashville's LP Field.

The Commodores hadn't played in a bowl since 1982 – the SEC's longest drought. The victory gave Vanderbilt (7-6) its first winning season since 1982. This is just the fourth time in the past 50 years that Vanderbilt has won seven games in a season.

The Eagles got the ball twice after Hahnfeldt's third field goal. They had to punt the first time, then

Vanderbilt DB Myron Lewis picked off a pass with 1:36 left.

Vanderbilt scored its lone TD when freshman safety Sean Richardson fell on a Commodore punt that bounced off the knee of BC's Paul Anderson with 10:35 left in the third quarter.

Hahnfeldt, a Nashville product playing his final game as a Commodore, matched a single-game career high with the three field goals. The Commodores also forced two interceptions while allowing none.



BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Without question, the Hall of Fame Bowl was one of college football's most exciting 1982 postseason games.

The game matched one of the nation's most potent aerial attacks featuring Vanderbilt All-SEC quarterback Whit Taylor and one of America's most devastating rushing attacks in the Falcons' option attack.

Offensively, the game lived up to the hype as 33 Hall of Fame records were broken and another eight were tied in Legion Field. Unfortunately for the Commodores, Air Force walked away the winner 36-28 after a remarkable fourth quarter comeback.

For three quarters, Whit Taylor was unstoppable. Connecting with a variety of receivers and running

backs, Taylor's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a four-yarder to Norman Jordan, gave the 'Dores a 28-17 margin entering the fourth quarter. Down by double digits, Air Force scored rushing TDs on three straight possessions to take the win.

Taylor was named the Most Valuable Player, after completing a team-record 38 passes of 51 attempts for 452 yards, which remains as the second highest single-game passing yardage total in Vanderbilt history. Jordan's performance arguably was more remarkable. Though rushing for just four yards, Jordan hauled in 20 receptions for 173 yards and three TDs, breaking five Hall of Fame Bowl records.



ATLANTA, Ga. – The 1974 Peach Bowl was a game with no champion but two winners, the Commodores and Texas Tech Red Raiders.

Despite the effective rushing of Red Raider tailback Larry Isaac and fullback Cliff Hoskins, the Commodore defense held Texas Tech without points in the first half and entered halftime with a 3-0 lead after Mark Adams kicked a 31-yard field goal with 10 minutes remaining.

Neither team was able to muster much offense in the third quarter, though Texas Tech did tie the score at 3-3 after a drive stalled at the Vanderbilt 16-yard line.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Commodores' freshman lineman Dennis Harrison stopped a deep Texas

Tech threat by blocking a Red Raider field goal attempt. The Tech drive started following one of two VU turnovers during the game.

After the blocked field goal, the Commodores responded with a possession that ended with Adams' second field goal of the day, a 26-yarder that resulted in a 6-3 Vanderbilt margin. However, Texas Tech tied the game at the 2:00 mark on a 35-yard field goal by Brian Hall. On its final drive, Vanderbilt could not move into scoring range.

The 'Dore offense struggled much of the day, with QB David Lee hitting just five of 14 attempts. RB Jamie O'Rourke had 76 rushing yards.

The limited offensive production from both teams resulted in numerous defensive and scoring records being set in the game.





JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Still hurting from a dislocated right elbow suffered in the Tennessee game, quarterback Don Orr scored two touchdowns and set up another as the Commodores defeated No. 8-ranked Auburn in the 11th Gator Bowl 25-13.

The Vandy defense provided a huge lift for the 'Dores, recovering five fumbles in the win.

Vanderbilt's first score was set up when Orr recovered an Auburn fumble. Eight plays later, Joe Stephenson ran seven yards for the VU TD.

Auburn answered on a 38-yard TD pass from Howell Tubbs to Rob James in the second quarter, but the rest of the game belonged to the Black and Gold. On Vanderbilt's following possession, Orr

carried the ball 44 yards to the Tigers' 28. He then passed to Joe Scales, who advanced to the Auburn 4-yard line. On the next play, Orr carried the ball over the line after a fake to RB Phil King to give Vanderbilt a 13-7 lead at the half.

At the opening of the third quarter, Vanderbilt guard Sonny Tatum recovered an Auburn fumble, and the Commodores marched quickly into scoring position as Orr crossed the goal line for his second touchdown of the day to make the score 19-7. Both teams scored once more in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt's score came on a one-yard run off right tackle by Charley Horton.

Vanderbilt coach Art Guepe cleared his bench in the final minutes, using 38 of the 39 men dressed for the game. Capitalizing on Auburn's five fumbles and using an ailing quarterback, Vanderbilt captured its first bowl appearance.





HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

In three seasons, Head Coach **James Franklin** has guided the Commodore football program to unprecedented heights, while rewriting pages of Vanderbilt's record book each season.

An exceptional motivator and tireless worker, Franklin exudes an unmatched passion for his program in everything he does. In short time, he has completely changed the team's internal culture, as well as its regional and national reputation, through his strong leadership, infectious personality and on-field results.

A relentless salesman and cheerleader for everything that represents the Star V, Franklin has backed up his words by guiding the Commodores to three straight bowl games and racking up more wins over a three-year span than any Vanderbilt coach since College Football Hall of Famer Dan McGugin. He holds an overall record of 23-15 and is one win shy of tying McGugin's total through his first three years (1904-06). In the last 19 games, Franklin is 15-4, a record that is only surpassed in the SEC by Alabama.

In all three seasons under Franklin, the Commodores have accomplished highs not achieved since decades earlier, if ever. With each year the accomplishments have only exceeded those from the previous season. In 2011, he inherited a team that had finished 2-10 in two consecutive seasons and directed it to an appearance in the Liberty Bowl. In 2012, Franklin led the Commodores to nine wins - their most since 1915 -- which included a victory in the Music City Bowl. This year, Vanderbilt defeated Florida, Georgia and Tennessee in the same season for the first time ever and again won eight games in the regular season for the second straight year -- a first since the 1920s. A win in the bowl game will give Vanderbilt two straight years of nine wins for the first time in school

history. His on-the-field accomplishments have been accompanied by three straight years of signing the highest-rated recruiting class in school history and the continuous mentoring of student-athletes who have earned numerous individual and collective academic honors.

Players and fans alike have gravitated toward Franklin through his energy and love for the program. He has developed a fun, energetic and close-knit family atmosphere that current, former and future players desire.

Always conscious of the platform he has and the surroundings in which he lives, Franklin never passes up an opportunity to assist others through random acts of kindness. Whether it is pausing a press conference to hug a grateful bystander, helping Vanderbilt freshmen move into dorms, inviting a cancer patient to attend practices, visiting patients at the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital, allowing an inspiring 11-year-old boy to lead the team

FRANKLIN COACHING ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2013

THIRD CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCE

Prior to Franklin's arrival in Nashville, the Commodores played in just four bowls in 120 years. Amazingly, the program has made bowl appearances in each of Franklin's three years in Nashville.

MOST WINS BY THIRD-YEAR COACH AT VANDERBILT IN MORE THAN A CENTURY

Only one coach in team history has posted more victories in his first three years than Franklin's 23-win total. That coach, Dan McGugin, accomplished the feat from 1904-06.

His Vanderbilt teams are 15-4 in their last 19 games, the second best record among SEC teams over that span.

EXPERIENCING NOVEMBER SUCCESS

Franklin's Commodores have enjoyed consecutive undefeated records during the month of November, and have won nine straight November games dating back to 2011.

In the 15 years prior to Franklin's arrival on campus, Vanderbilt was 5-46 in November games.

CONSECUTIVE EIGHT-WIN REGULAR SEASONS

For the first time since 1927-28, Vanderbilt has experienced back-to-back 8-4 regular seasons in 2012-13. A win in the BBVA Compass Bowl will give Vanderbilt its first back-to-back 9-win seasons in program history.

SIGNATURE WINS AGAINST SEC EAST RIVALS

In 2013 Vanderbilt registered signature victories over SEC East rivals Georgia, Florida and Tennessee. It marked the first time in team history for the Commodores to defeat all three teams in the same season.

MOST SEC WINS SINCE 1935

Vanderbilt was 9-7 in SEC play in 2012-13. The two-year win total in conference action ties a school record that dates back to 1934-35.

onto the field for homecoming or passing out ice cream during a campus event, Franklin is the first one in line looking to spread good will.

Franklin's generosity and overall success as a coach has sparked the interest of football fans and media members across the country as people look to learn more about the mind behind the program's meteoric rise from the depths of the SEC. Franklin has welcomed the intrigue by providing unprecedented access to what takes place behind the scenes. From pregame and postgame locker room speeches, to team meetings and trips inside the War Room on National Signing Day, Franklin has made a conscious effort to provide the public with an inside look at his program.

His efforts to share in the success of Vanderbilt's program have paid dividends with feature stories and videos landing on prominent websites such as SI.com, ESPN.com, Yahoo.com and in publications such as Sports Illustrated, the New York Times and the Washington Post. The access Franklin provides has also enabled Vanderbilt's staff to capture a number of viral videos that have been viewed by hundreds of thousands of people and featured on programs such as ESPN's SportsCenter.

Franklin's impact on campus can also be seen just a few hundred feet from the football offices where a new indoor facility opened in November. The facility is available for all Vanderbilt teams, students and staff members and includes a 120-yard field, which is encircled by a 300-meter track.

The multipurpose facility is the latest in a line of facility enhancements that have been made since Franklin arrived. Before the 2012 season, a new video board and hillside seating area in the south end zone were added

to Vanderbilt Stadium. Additionally, new stadium lights enhanced the gameday experience and an artificial surface improved playing conditions on Dudley Field.

Hired as the first African-American head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Dec. 17, 2010, Franklin's off-the-field accomplishments have helped fuel excitement in and around the program, but the results on the field have been even more impressive.

Just when skeptics doubted whether he could match the success from his first two seasons, he trumped both years with what he has done in 2013. Despite losing a number of key contributors, including record-setting running back Zac Stacy, the Commodores again won eight regular season games. Along the way, Vanderbilt ended prolonged losing streaks to Georgia and Florida, and earned back-to-back wins against Tennessee for the first time since 1925 and 1926. The win against the 15th-ranked Bulldogs marked Franklin's first victory against a ranked opponent. By defeating Florida, the Commodores ended a 22-game losing streak and won in Gainesville for the first time since 1945. Vanderbilt's other SEC win came against Kentucky - a school Franklin is 3-0 against.

Vanderbilt's final two regular-season wins came in the final minute of each game. Against Tennessee, Vanderbilt drove 92 yards to defeat the Vols when quarterback Patton Robinette faked a jump pass and ran it in from eight yards out for the score with 16 seconds remaining. The play was just the latest of Franklin's arsenal of gadget plays the Commodores have dialed up under his watch. Vanderbilt followed its game-winning drive at

Tennessee with another one against Wake Forest, just one week later. This time, quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels connected with wide receiver Jordan Matthews, who made a remarkable 25-yard catch on fourth-and-11 to put the Commodores in field goal range for Carey Spear, who drilled a 38-yarder with 39 seconds to go.

The two wins gave Vanderbilt four straight to end the regular season. It was the second straight year Vanderbilt had closed the season on a long winning streak after taking seven straight to close 2012. The late-season success comes as a drastic change from years of late-season futility that preceded Franklin. In the previous 15 years before Franklin arrived (1996-2010), Vanderbilt posted a 5-46 mark in games played in November. Since his arrival, Vanderbilt is 10-2 during the month and has won nine straight games dating back to the final game of the 2011 regular season. It is





the program's longest win streak in November since 1903-1905.

Under Franklin, the Commodores have also been extremely successful against non-conference foes. Vanderbilt finished 2013 with a 4-0 record in non-conference play, marking the second 4-0 non-conference slate in three seasons by Franklin. Overall, the Commodores are 11-1 in the regular season against non-SEC foes under Franklin.

One of the many high points during the 2013 season was the continued mentoring of All-America senior wide receiver Jordan Matthews, who set virtually every SEC and Vanderbilt receiving record during the year. Matthews set SEC career records in receptions and yards, and a single-season league mark in receptions. Matthews surpassed former Commodore Earl Bennett's receptions record and former Georgia wide receiver Terrence Edwards' yardage record, while becoming the first Vanderbilt wide receiver to top 1,000 receiving yards twice during a career.

Franklin's 2013 team again has excelled in all three phases of the game – offense, defense and special teams. The offense is close to mirroring its record-setting pace of 2012. The success on offense has been enhanced by Vanderbilt's superb play in the red zone. The team leads the SEC in red-zone success, having scored on 88 percent of possessions inside the opponents' 20-yard line. Most importantly, Vanderbilt has scored touchdowns on 67% of its trips inside the red zone.

Defensively, the Commodores finished the regular season ranked in the top 25 in total defense for the third season in a row. The opportunistic defense forced 20 takeaways in the final six games. On special teams, Vanderbilt's punt and placekicking specialists continue to perform at a high level and the unit's kickoff return defense ranked second in the nation allowing just 15.85 yards per return.

The 2013 campaign has come on the heels of Vanderbilt finishing 9-4 overall, matching the school record for wins last achieved in 1915. It ended the season with the longest winning streak in the Southeastern Conference, having won seven straight. It was Vanderbilt's longest win streak since an eight-game streak in 1948.

The remarkable 2012 campaign also included Vanderbilt tying another school record with five victories in SEC play. One of those conference wins, against Tennessee, marked Vanderbilt's most decisive victory in the series since 1954.

The team also won on the road in 2012. Three of Vanderbilt's five SEC wins came at Missouri, Kentucky and Ole Miss. A convincing win at Wake Forest gave Vanderbilt four road victories, the most by a Commodore squad since 1948.

Vanderbilt's victory at Missouri was Franklin's first road triumph in the SEC. The team's 40-0 shutout at Kentucky was its second shutout of the season, marking the first time Vanderbilt had two shutouts in the same year since 1968. The win at Ole Miss was its sixth win of the season and came after facing a 23-6 deficit in the third quarter.

The Commodores culminated the season with a 38-24 win over N.C. State in the 2012 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. After the victory, Franklin was named one of five finalists for National Coach of the Year honors from the Bryant Awards.

Vanderbilt also ended the season ranked No. 20 in the USA Today-Coaches Top 25 poll and No. 23 in the Associated Press ballot. It marked the program's first inclusion in the final Top 25 poll since 1958.

Franklin also helped mentor three players to school records in 2012. Running back Zac Stacy became Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher and was the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. Matthews set Vanderbilt's single-season receiving yardage record with 1,323 yards and accumulated 94 catches, the second highest receptions total in Vanderbilt and SEC history. Kicker Carey Spear set a new school record by making 20 of 24 field goals.

In three seasons at the helm, Franklin has won 60.5% of his games, a winning percentage not achieved since Red Sanders (1940-42, 1946-48). He has also led the Commodores to 11 conference wins, including six by 23 points or more. From 1955-2010, Vanderbilt had six total wins against SEC opponents by 23-plus points.



Prior to accepting the Vanderbilt position, Franklin spent five seasons coordinating highly productive offensive units at the University of Maryland and Kansas State University. In his second stint at Maryland from 2008-10, Franklin served as offensive coordinator, and later added the title of assistant head coach. In 2010, he helped the Terrapins to an impressive 9-4 turnaround.

Franklin went to Maryland after spending the 2006-07 seasons as offensive coordinator at Kansas State. He helped the Wildcats earn their first winning season in four years and a berth in the inaugural Texas Bowl. In 2006, Franklin focused on mentoring talented true freshman quarterback Josh Freeman. In 2007, Franklin's offense produced a 3,000-yard passer (Freeman), 1,500-yard receiver (All-America wide receiver Jordy Nelson), and 1,000-yard rusher for the first time in school history.

Franklin spent the 2005 season coaching wide receivers for the Green Bay Packers. During that season, wide receiver Donald Driver set new career-high marks with 86 receptions for 1,221 yards.

Prior to working with the Green Bay Packers, Franklin served five years coaching wide receivers at Maryland. He also has coached at Kutztown (Pa.) University, James Madison University, Washington State, Idaho State and at his alma mater, East Stroudsburg (Pa.) University.

Franklin developed a passion for the game as a four-year letter-winning quarterback at East Stroudsburg. He was a two-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference selection. As a senior, he garnered MVP honors and was a Harlon Hill Trophy nominee for Division II Player of the Year after setting seven school records.

Franklin earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from East Stroudsburg in 1995 and a master's in educational leadership from Washington State in 1999.

Franklin and his family reside in Nashville. He and his wife, Fumi, are the parents of two daughters, Shola, 7, and Addy, 6.

Off. Coordinator•Running Backs 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

The Vanderbilt offense continues to improve under Donovan - now in his third season on West End.

The Commodores averaged 29.2 points per game during the regular season while racking up 366.7 yards per game.

With senior Austyn Carta-Samuels at quarterback the Commodores improved in the passing game from a

year ago averaging 233.7 yards per game while completing 66.4% of the

team's passes. The passing game has already posted the most passing yards by a Vanderbilt team since 2005 and has the opportunity to be the most since 1983 when the Commodores passed for a school record 3,299 yards.

MORE ON DONOVAN

Donovan's offense improved yet again in 2013 with a noticeable improvement in the red zone. The Commodores have scored on 46 of the team's 52 trips into the red zone (88%) up from 76% last season. Of those 46 scores this season, 35 of them have been TDs - 10 more than all of last season.

with the running backs is not to be overlooked. The New Jersey native used three running backs during the season with Jerron Seymour leading the way. Seymour enters the bowl game one touchdown shy of matching Zac Stacy's single-season school record of 14 rushing scores. Donovan has also successfully employed the running talents of quarterback Patton Robinette, who enters the game with six rushing TDs.

Joining Seymour in the backfield have been senior Wesley Tate and sophomore Brian Kimbrow. The trio have combined to run for 1,246 yards and score 19 TDs.

The offense has also improved on third down and is one of the nation's leaders on fourth down conversions going 21-for-27 during the season.



SHOOP

Def. Coordinator•Safeties 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

Shoop's defense improved as the season progressed with the Commodore's "Black Death" closing the season in a big way allowing only 13.5 points per game during Vanderbilt's season-ending, four-game winning streak.

The defense enters the bowl season having forced at least one

turnover in six straight games. During the six-game streak, VU has forced 20 turnovers with a season-high five takeaways at Texas A&M. It should come as no surprise the Commodores are 5-1 in the six games the team

has forced a turnover and 8-2 for the season in games forcing at least one turnover. Vanderbilt's 27 takeaways are the most in the Southeastern

Conference along with Missouri.

The defense saved some of their best efforts for the team's last three games. Over the last three games, the Commodores allowed opponents to gain only 255 yards per game and average only 109 yards per game passing.

MORE ON SHOOP

During the Commodores' four-game winning streak to close the season, Shoop's defense got off the field on third down allowing opponents to convert only 20-of-56 (35.7%) third down opportunities. Steady progress during the season has pushed the unit back among the nation's Top 25 in total defense.

The defense was one of the best in the SEC against the pass, ranking fourth in pass defense effeciency and picking off 16 passes - secondmost in the league.

Shoop also mentored All-SEC recipient Kenny Ladler and Javon Marshall. Ladler is on pace to lead the Commodores in tackles for the second consecutive year.



CHARLES BANKINS

Special Teams Coordinator•TEs 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

Bankins' special teams unit has been a huge contributor to the Commodores success in his three seasons, including 2013.

Vanderbilt's kickoff team has produced at a high level all season, entering the bowl season as the second-best unit in the country allowing only 15.9 yards per return.

Freshman Darrius Sims emerged as the go-to-guy for the 'Dores on kickoff returns with an average of 23.1 yards per return, including a season-best 71-yard return at Tennessee. The freshman from Memphis, Tenn. posted two games with over 100 yards of kick returns this season.

Carey Spear again led the kicking unit making 13-of-17 field goals and going 2-for-2 in field goals of 50-plus yards with a career-long of 54 yards at South Carolina. The senior captain booted three field goals to match a career-best in the season-ending victory against Wake Forest, including

the game-winner from 38 yards.


Bankins coached first year punter Taylor Hudson to a steady first campaign as the Commodore punter. Hudson averaged 42.9 yards over his 48 punts, landing 11 inside the 20-yard line with a long of 75 yards.

MORE ON BANKINS

Bankins has led one of the most productive threeyear stretches in Vanderbilt special teams history. Spear has set the single-season scoring record for kickers twice, 'Dore punters have averaged over 42 yards per punt three straight years and VU has scored at least one TD on special teams each year.

Vanderbilt's tight ends continued to improve under Bankins' guidance as Kris Kentera and Steven Scheu each set career-highs in receiving yards and each caught touchdown passes.

Barlow continued to make an impact on the Vanderbilt staff in his second season on campus.

Gattis picked up where he left off last season - leading the Commodores' wide receivers to unknown heights.

In the last three years, Gattis' pupils have included a pair of All-Americans, the Mid-American Conference all-time leading receiver and the SEC's career leading receiver.

With Gattis' guidance Jordan Matthews became one of the greatest wide receivers in Southeastern Conference and Vanderbilt history. Matthews has already taken over the top spot in the SEC and Vanderbilt record books for career receptions, career receiving yards, 100-yard receiving games and single-season receptions. His 22 receiving touchdowns are the most in VU history and his 1,334 yards receiving this

season are the most ever by a player in the Black & Gold. Matthews is also the only player in league history to ever record two seasons of at least 90 catches and the only player to catch over 100 passes.

While Matthews may get the headlines, fellow senior Jonathan

In his brief career at Vanderbilt and Western Michigan, Gattis has now coached those school's greatest WRs in Vanderbilt's Jordan Matthews and Western Michigan's Jordan White. Matthews was named All-America this year after setting an array of SEC career & season season records. Like Matthews, White set virtually every WMU receiving record under Gattis.

Krause has enjoyed a career year in his final season on West End. Krause posted his first two career 100-yard games in consecutive weeks against UMass and UAB while also catching his first touchdown pass in the win at UMass. The combination of Krause and Matthews has produced 148 catches for 2,037 yards and is set to become the greatest receiving duo in school history.

Freshman Jordan Cunningham also developed under Gattis starting five games and catching 15 passes.



HERB HAND

Run Game Coordinator-Off. Line 4th year on Vanderbilt staff

This season Hand was able to keep a cohesive unit on the field for the majority of the season with only seven different linemen starting games, led by All-SEC senior Wesley Johnson, junior Joe Townsend and redshirt sophomore Spencer Pulley who started every game for the

Commodores.

Johnson established a new Vanderbilt school record starting 50 straight games heading into the bowl game. The versatile and talented Johnson earned his fourth SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honor for his work in the victory against Georgia. His four weekly honors are the most in team history.

Under Hand's tutelage, redshirt freshman Andrew Jelks worked his way into the starting lineup with nine starts in his first action for the Black & Gold. Jelks started the season opener against Ole Miss and later started eight straight games at right tackle.

Hand's coaching of senior Wesley Johnson has not gone unnoticed this year. A preseason candidate for both the Lombardi Award and Outland Trophy, Johnson earned All-SEC honors from coaches and writers after the regular season. Townsend and Bernstein continued to develop into mainstays on the line. Redshirt Junior Chase White proved Coach Hand's philosophy of training linemen in multiple positions starting games at left guard and right tackle.

As a unit, the O-line paved the way for 31 touchdowns on the ground, the third-most in the SEC and has helped Jerron Seymour to 13 scores just one shy of the school single-season school record.

Rahne also molded Robinette into a winning QB with the redshirt freshman getting the start in Vanderbilt's historic win at Florida.

Vanderbilt's defensive line continues to feed off the energy and enthusiasm of Sean Spencer.

under Spencer's guidance with the D-line accounting for 42.5 tackles for loss this season.



In three years at Vanderbilt, Galt has developed a reputation of molding the Commodores into athletes that are physically and mentally strong.



OLE MISS EDGES VANDERBILT IN WILD SEASON OPENER

NASHVILLE (AP) – Mississippi coach Hugh Freeze may have a highlyrated crop of freshmen to coach. Senior Jeff Scott made sure his new teammates left their first college game as winners.

Jeff Scott ran 75 yards for a touchdown with 1:07 left, and Mississippi rallied twice Thursday night to beat Vanderbilt 39-35 in a wild season opener for both teams.

GAME 1 Aug. 29, 2013 Nashville Vanderbilt went up 35-32 on a 34-yard TD pass from Austyn Carta-Samuels to Steven Scheu with 1:30 left. But Scott beat the Commodores for a TD and the fourth lead change.

Vanderbilt had a final chance to extend the

Southeastern Conference's longest winning streak, but Cody Prewitt intercepted a pass off Jordan Matthews' hands with 26 seconds left. That allowed the Rebels to snap a three-game skid to Vanderbilt, the last a painful 27-26 loss in Oxford last year.

Earlier in the final drive, Matthews and Carta-Samuels hooked up for a remarkable 4th down completion and first down.

PLAY OF THE GAME

With just over a minute remaining in the game Ole Miss' Jeff Scott ran 75 yards for the winning touchdown immediately following what looked to be the winning score from Vanderbilt's Steven Scheu on a pass from Austyn Carta-Samuels.

KEY STATISTIC

Austyn Carta-Samuels' 300 yards passing made him the first Vanderbilt QB to throw for 300 yards in a game since 2006 when Chris Nickson threw for 446 yards against Kentucky.


Still, it was a satisfied Spurrier heading into the Gamecocks' first bye week after his team ran up 579 yards.



UMass drove as far as the Commodores' 32-yard line in the third guarter, but lost seven yards on a pair of rushes, then allowed a sack.



Carta-Samuels' second touchdown pass went to Jordan Matthews, who tied a Vanderbilt record with his 21st career touchdown reception.



the first six Tiger possessions, which resulted in three touchdowns and three field goals. Missouri out-gained the Commodores 285-97 in the first half in taking a 30-7 lead.

Franklin finished 19-for-28 for 278 yards passing and added another 63 yards on the ground.



also got their first victory over Georgia in Nashville since 1991, snapping a six-game skid to the Bulldogs.



Manziel showed no signs that the right shoulder he injured last week was bothering him. He threw three TDs in the first quarter to help A&M (6-2, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) College Station, Texas build a 28-point lead. He tacked on another score before sitting down with 6 minutes left in

the third quarter and the Aggies leading 42-17.

Sumlin said Manziel practiced for the first time this week on Friday and was a little sore on Saturday morning, raising more questions about his availability.

Jordan Matthews had eight receptions for 92 yards to become the SEC's all-time leader in career yards receiving with 3,172. Kenny Ladler had an interception and forced two fumbles for the Commodores.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Vanderbilt scored 17 straight points to end the first half and get back in the game but Patton Robinette's pass on the third play of the second half was picked off and ran back for a score by Howard Matthews to swing the momentum back to the Aggies.

Tyler Murphy's four turnovers led to three touchdowns, helping Vanderbilt embarrass Florida 34-17 for the program's first win in Gainesville since 1945.

The Commodores snapped a 22-game losing streak in the lopsided

Franklin also notched another signature win, giving Vanderbilt victories over Southeastern Conference powerhouses Georgia and Florida

"The difference in the game was turnovers," Franklin said. "Our defense was able to get turnovers."

The Commodores (5-4, 2-4) scored after each of Murphy's three interceptions, building a 24-3 lead after getting the ball inside the 22-yard line three times. Vanderbilt finished with 12 first downs and 187 yards. Florida had 26 first downs and 353 yards.

On offense, redshirt freshman Patton Robinette guided an efficient unit that dod not have a turnover.

PLAY OF THE GAME

After a Florida touchdown cut the VU lead to 24-10 in the third quarter, the Commodores march 24 yards on 16 plays over the final 7:22 of the quarter capped by a Jerron Seymour 5-yard run to put the game away.

field goals in the fourth quarter to give them their ninth straight win in


