ARMY BACK IN ACTION AFTER BYE WEEK

Black Knights searching for first road victory

- The Black Knights come off their first bye week of the 2011 season with their second straight road game. Army is still looking for its first victory of the season away from West Point after having dropped three straight on opponents' home fields. Saturday's game against Vanderbilt will mark the first road trip to a school not from the Mid-American Conference (Northern Illinois, Ball State, Miami (Ohio)).
- The Commodores are Army's second opponent this season that plays in a BCS automatic-qualifying conference. The Black Knights upended Big Ten foe Northwestern on Sept. 17, marking the third straight year they have beaten an AQ opponent. Army has never defeated two teams from BCS leagues in the same season.
- Army has run for at least 300 yards in each of the first six games. It is the program's longest run since the 1996 team reached that plateau in eight straight outings to start the season.
- The Black Knights enter Saturday's tilt against the Commodores as the nation's No. 1 ranked rushing offense with a 361.33 yards-per-game average. Army will face a stiff test in Nashville. The Commodores are ranked 27th in the country against the run, giving up only 109.67 yards per game.
- Sophomore RB **Raymond Maples** has led the Army ground game over the last four games, averaging 118.0 yards per game, including three straight 100-yard games. A 100-yard effort by Maples against the Commodores would tie the Academy record. Junior FB **Jared Hassin** was the last Army player to do it, reaching 100 rushing yards in four straight games last season.
- While Maples has been on a tear lately, junior QB **Trent Steelman** is still the team's leading rusher at 89.3 yards per game. His 11 rushing touchdowns far and away lead the Black Knights and are the most by any quarterback in the nation this season. He ranks tied for fifth overall nationally in that category.
- The Army passing game has begun to find its stride. After completing only three passes in his previous three games, Steelman has completed all 11 of his throws in the last two outings for 194 yards and two touchdowns. He has both run and passed for a touchdown in each of the last two games.
- Defensively, senior LB **Steven Erzinger** leads the team and is 12th nationally with 10.67 tackles per game. Erzinger also leads the Black Knights with 7.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.
- Turnovers have been a key indicator for the Black Knights this season. In its two wins, Army +0.5 in the turnover margin (4 takeaways, 3 turnovers). In the four losses, The Black Knights have turned it over nine times while forcing only three opponent miscues.

SCOUTING THE COMMODORES

- Vanderbilt head coach James Franklin is in his first season on the Commodores' sideline and his first season as a head coach. Franklin spent the previous three seasons as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Maryland. In February 2009, he was designated as Ralph Friedgen's successor, but left the Terrapins for Nashville in December 2010. Franklin also served as offensive coordinator at Kansas State (2006-07). Prior to his stint in Manhattan, he was on the staffs at Maryland (2000-04), Idaho State (1999), Washington State (1998), James Madison (1997) and his alma mater, East Stroudsburg (1996) and Kutztown (1995).
- The Commodores have lost three straight games, all versus SEC opponents. Vanderbilt lost its last game, 33-28, versus Georgia. The Bulldogs raced out to a 23-7 lead, but the Commodores closed to within five points at 26-21. The two teams exchanged touchdowns in the fourth quarter to set the final margin. Zac Stacy ran for 97 yards and a score, while Andre Hal added a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.
- Offensively, Vanderbilt is averaging 261.83 yards and 21.67 points per game. The Commodores run for 129.33 yards and throw for another 132.5 yards per contest. Stacy is the team's leading rusher at 63.5 yards per game, while Jerron Seymour has a team-best three rushing touchdowns. Larry Smith and Jordan Rogers have split the quarterbacking duties. Smith has completed 57.3 percent of his throws (59-103) for 481 yards and three scores and five interceptions, while Rodgers is 24-for-51 (47.1 percent) for 236 yards and a touchdown. Jonathan Krause is the Commodores' top receiver with 20 catches for 108 yards. Chris Boyd has accounted for three of Vandy's five receiving scores and is averaging a team-best 16.0 yards per catch.
- Vanderbilt has been a ball-hawking defense so far in 2011. The Commodores lead the nation with 15 interceptions and are tied for 10th nationally with 17 total takeaways.
- The Commodores are 26th in the nation in total defense, allowing only 329.83 yards per game, and rank 37th in the country in scoring defense at just 21.67 points per game. Chris Marve paces the team with 46 tackles. Tim Fugger leads the team with 8.0 tackles for loss and is tied with Rob Lohr for tops on the team's quarterback sacks list with 3.0. Casey Hayward has five of the team's 15 picks.

THE ARMY-VANDERBILT SERIES

- The Black Knights and Commodores have split the first four meetings in the all-time series. Army evened the series at 4-4 with a 16-13 overtime win at Michie Stadium on Oct. 10, 2009.
- Saturday's game is Army's fourth trip to Nashville and first since 1990. The Black Knights have won two of their previous three visits to Vanderbilt.

ARMY VERSUS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- Vanderbilt is the only team from the SEC on the Black Knights' docket this season. SEC opponents are rare for the Black Knights. Prior to the Commodores' trip to West Point in 2009, Army's last Southeastern Conference foe was Auburn in the 1996 Independence Bowl. Saturday is just the third time since 1991 the Black Knights have played a regular-season game against the SEC. All three have been versus Vanderbilt.
- Since the league formed in 1932, Army owns a 7-14-2 record against SEC squads. That includes a 1-0-1 record against Tulane while it was a member (1932-66) and a 1-1 record versus Georgia Tech when the Yellow Jackets competed in the SEC (1932-64). Army's other wins in that span include four versus Vanderbilt and one versus Tennessee (1986).
- Army's all-time record against teams currently comprising the SEC is 13-14-1 (Alabama 0-1, Auburn 2-1, Florida 2-1, LSU 1-0, Mississippi State 0-1, South Carolina, 2-1, Tennessee 2-5-1 and Vanderbilt 4-4).

THE LAST MEETING — ARMY 16, VANDERBILT 13 (OT)

WEST POINT, N.Y. — Alex Carlton kicked a 42-yard field goal in overtime, after Andrew Rodriguez forced a fumble on Vanderbilt's first possession, as Army beat the Commodores, 16-13, Saturday in front of a season-best crowd of 34,357 fans at Michie Stadium.

Army won the toss in overtime and elected to play defense. The Commodores were driving when Rodriguez knocked the ball out Warren Norman's hands at the one-yard line and out of the end zone, forcing a touchback. The Black Knights ran the ball three times before calling on Carlton. The sophomore's kick hit off the left upright but went through.

On the first overtime possession, the Commodores gained 13 yards on first down, no gain on second and appeared to be driving for a touchdown when Rodriguez swooped in and forced the fumble. On Army's possession, Malcolm Brown rushed for no gain and Trent Steelman carried twice, setting up Carlton's heroics.

Rodriguez made a game-high 13 tackles and helped lead a defensive effort that kept Vanderbilt's offensive out of the end zone. Steelman completed seven passes for 47 yards and was the leading rusher with 97 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries. Following a scoreless first quarter, Army went on top early in the second period. Steelman gained 15 yards on the possession before Carlton kicked a career-long 51-yard field goal.

Vanderbilt tied the game to start the second half when Ryan Fowler booted a 19-yard field goal with 11:12 left in the quarter. Army went back on top with a time-consuming touchdown drive. Steelman capped the drive with a two-yard touchdown run. He called his own number, was initially stopped at the line of scrimmage, but continued moving and punched into the end zone as his helmet came off. Vanderbilt quickly quieted the large crowd when Warren Norman returned the ensuing kickoff for a 76-yard touchdown and the second tie of the ball game (10-10).

Donovan Travis set up Carlton's second field goal with an interception. The kick put Army ahead 13-10 with 7:33 to go. Vanderbilt had a 1st-and-goal from the three-yard line, but thanks to the Army defense and penalties, the Commodores were forced to kick a 41-yard field goal with 52 seconds left to play, setting up the overtime.

ARMY IN OVERTIME

- After playing just one overtime game between 1996 and 2005, Army has had seven games go to an extra session in its last 66 outings.
- Army lost its last overtime game, a 23-20 setback versus Rutgers on Oct. 16, 2010. Army is now 6-2 all-time in overtime. Army is 5-0 at Michie Stadium in overtime.
- Army has played at least one overtime game in each of the previous five seasons.
- Army has allowed just 16 points in its eight overtime games. Rutgers' game-winning score was the first time the opponent reached the end zone after regulation since Louisville scored a touchdown in the first overtime in 1999. It stopped a streak of seven straight overtime periods without allowing a touchdown.

SATURDAY'S UNIFORM PATCH

The Black Knights will be wearing the unit patch of the **101st Airborne Division** when they take on Vanderbilt. The 101st Airborne Division was activated on Aug. 15, 1942 at Camp Claiborne, La., and is currently headquartered at Fort Campbell, Ky. The 101st is the only Air Assault Division in the world. Following its initial training, the Division was sent to the European Theater of Operations and continued its training in England. On June 6, 1944, the 101st parachuted into the Contentin Peninsula, becoming the first Allied Soldiers to step foot into occupied France. In March 2008, the 101st was deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. As Combined Joint Task Force 101 (CJTF-101), the Division Headquarters was supported by many attached Coalition units and was responsible for an area of operation the size of Pennsylvania designated as Regional Command-East.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Army is 0-3 on the road this season, dropping games at Northern Illinois, Ball State and Miami (Ohio) by a combined 132-75 margin. The Black Knights have allowed 1,557 yards of offense in those three games (519.0/game).
- The Black Knights are 2-1 at home, outscoring their opponents 86-43. Army has allowed just 800 total yards in those three games (266.7/game).
- Army's road woes are a new problem this season. In 2010, the Black Knights won all five games on their opponents' home fields.
- Despite the loss at Miami, Army still boasts a 7-6 record in games played on opponents' home fields since 2009. The loss in the season opener at Northern Illinois snapped a six-game road winning streak, the program's longest since the 1966 and 1967 seasons.
- The Black Knights were 4-15 on opponents' home fields from 2005-08. Since the start of the 2009 season, Army is 7-7 at Michie Stadium and 0-4 in neutral site games.

NO (TURNOVER) MARGIN FOR ERROR

- In 2010, Army ranked third in the country at +1.23 per game. The Black Knights will have some work to do in order to replicate that number. Even with their +2 showing against Tulane, the Black Knights are -0.83 per game through the first six contests, which ranks tied for 103rd.
- Army has lost only two games under Rich Ellerson when on the plus side of the turnover battle and just once when holding at least a two-takeaway advantage. The Black Knights are 11-2 when winning the turnover margin under Ellerson.
- In Army's last 14 wins the Black Knights are averaging 3.0 takeaways and hold a +2.0 turnover margin average (42-14 overall). Conversely, in its last 17 losses, Army is averaging just 1.1 takeaway per game and is on the wrong end of a -0.71 turnover margin average (19-31 overall).
- Since the start of 2006, the Black Knights have posted a 15-4 record when winning the turnover battle. On the flip side, Army is 8-39 when the margin is negative or even.
- Army is 2-11 in its last 13 games without forcing an opponent turnover. Army's four takeaways against Tulane snapped a three-game streak without recording a turnover, the longest streak under Ellerson.

FOURTH QUARTER SCORING

- Army suffered a rare fourth-quarter deficit in the loss at Miami. In the first five games, Army outscored its opponents, 61-13 in the fourth quarter, but the RedHawks scored both the game-tying and game-winning touchdowns in the final stanza, while the Black Knights were kept out of the end zone for the first time. The Black Knights are on the short end of a 148-100 margin through the first three quarters.
- Entering the Miami, game Army allowed only one fourth quarter touchdown (vs. Northwestern).
- Army's scoring pattern is nearly the exact opposite of 2010. Last season, Army held a 283-200 scoring edge through the first three quarters and were outscored 116-63 in the fourth period and overtime.

BROTHERLY LOVE

- The Black Knights have three sets of brothers on its current roster — sophomores **Jordan and Julian Crockett**, juniors **A.J. and Jarett Mackey**, and sophomore **Corey** and junior **Zach Watts**. In the opener at Northern Illinois, four of the brothers started in Army's defensive front seven. A.J. Mackey was at one defensive tackle spot, Jarett Mackey was a defensive end, Zach Watts was the "whip" linebacker and Corey Watts was the other defensive end.
- The Crockett and Watts' brothers are both sets of twins. Corey Watts attended Lafayette in 2008 and the U.S. Military Academy Prep School in 2009 before enrolling at West Point last season. Zach Watts entered West Point in 2009 after a season at Fork Union Military Academy. A.J. Mackey is 11 months older than Jarett. Both graduated from high school in 2008 and enrolled at West Point in 2009 after a season at the prep school.
- In addition, there are two players on the roster whose older siblings have played at West Point. Sophomore LB **Justin Trimble** is the third brother to play for the Black Knights. His oldest brother, Jeremy, graduated in 2008 as Army's all-time leader in receptions and receiving yards. Older brother, Jordan, graduated this past spring, earning Academic All-America accolades last season. Freshman DL **Mike Ugenyi** is the younger brother of Victor Ugenyi, a 2010 graduate who started three years on the defensive line.

ARMY OFFENSIVE NOTES

SCOREBOARD WATCHING

- Army has posted at least 20 points in all six of its games so far in 2011 after failing to reach that mark in its last three outings of last season. The Black Knights have scored at least 20 points in 16 of their last 19 games. Army is 8-78 since the start of 1996 in games where they score less than 20 points.
- The Black Knights posted a season-high 45 points in the win over Tulane. It was their seventh straight win when scoring at least 40 points in a game.
- Army's 26.8 points per game average through six games is 0.2 points higher than last season's scoring average which was the Black Knights' best offensive output since the 1996 team scored 31.8 points per game. The Black Knights' 346 total points last season ranked third in Academy history.

STAYING GROUNDED

- For the first time in the Rich Ellerson Era, the Black Knights have posted six straight 300-yard rushing games. It is the program's longest streak since the 1996 team reached the 300-yard mark in the first eight games.
- The Black Knights' 403 yards against San Diego State marked their highest total since going for 461 yards versus Rice on Nov. 8, 2008. Army posted its 53rd game all-time with at least 400 yards on the ground at Ball State with 402 yards.
- The Black Knights have ranked among the nation's top 20 rushing attacks in each of the past three seasons. Army enters Saturday's game ranked first in the country with 361.3 yards per game.

- Army's 77 rushing attempts against San Diego State marked the team's highest since rushing 77 times against Lafayette on Sept. 13, 1997. It tied for the 19th most in Academy history. The 77 attempts are the second most by any team in the nation this season. Army's 75 rushes versus Northwestern rank third. All six of Army's rushing attempt totals this season rank among the top 23 games in the nation.

- After not having three players reach the 75-yard mark in the same game since 2008, the Black Knights have accomplished that feat twice this season – the opener at Northern Illinois and against Ball State. In the loss to the Cardinals, Army had a pair of 100-yard rushers in **Raymond Maples** (125) and **Jared Hassin** (111). Quarterback **Trent Steelman** added 81 yards.
- For the season, Army has three players averaging at least 50.0 yards per game. Steelman leads the team at 89.3 yards per contest followed by Maples (89.0) and junior SB **Malcolm Brown** (54.2). Hassin is fourth on the team at just under 50.0 yards per game (47.8).
- Army has not had four players average at least 50.0 rushing yards per game in the same season since 1996 when Joe Hewitt (83.9), Bobby Williams (55.5), Demetrius Perry (52.6) and Ronnie McAda (51.0) accomplished the feat.

PICK YOUR POISON

- Through the first five weeks of the 2011 season, Army is one of only five teams to boast two players that average at least 80.0 rushing yards per game. Junior QB **Trent Steelman** is 47th in the nation with 89.33 yards per contest and sophomore SB **Raymond Maples** is 48th in the country with 89.00 yards per game.

300/100 VISION

- Army ran for 303 yards and passed for another 106 yards in its season-opening loss at Northern Illinois. It marked the first time the Black Knights posted a 300-100 game since Nov. 14, 1998 against Tulane. The Black Knights rushed for 357 yards and threw for another 178 yards in a 49-35 loss to the Green Wave.
- The Black Knights needed just another five games to accomplish the feat again, running for 326 yards and throwing for 124 at Miami (Ohio).

POSSESSION IS NINE-TENTHS

- Army was on the short end of the time of possession numbers for the first time in its loss to Ball State. The Black Knights had the ball for just 28:48 against the Cardinals, snapping a two-game run with at least 40 minutes of possession time. It was the first time Army had at least 40 minutes of possess in two consecutive games since the 1996 season.
- Army leads the country, averaging 35 minutes, 53 seconds of possession time per game.
- The Black Knights have at least 35 minutes of possession in 10 games since the start of 2009, posting a 6-4 record in those games.
- Army has been particularly adept at controlling the ball in the fourth quarter. The Black Knights had possession for a season-high 12 minutes, 34 seconds in the final stanza in the win against Tulane. Army has held the ball for at least 10 minutes in the fourth quarter four times this season. In both of Army's wins, the Black Knights have had the ball for at least 12 minutes in the fourth quarter.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Army seniors **Steven Erzinger**, **Max Jenkins** and **Andrew Rodriguez** were chosen by their teammates to represent the Black Knights as captains in 2011.
- Erzinger was selected as a "legacy" captain for the 2011 season by last year's seniors during Army-Navy preparation. Erzinger was chosen by that group as the best representative to carry on their voice and legacy.
- This season marks a departure from Head coach Rich Ellerson's normal process of rotating game captains and selecting permanent captains at midseason. This year's squad felt strongly enough about Erzinger, Jenkins and Rodriguez to forego that process.

CHAIN GANG

- The Black Knights have converted 46.25 percent of their third-down opportunities through the first four games. Army is 34th in the nation in that category.
- Army moved the chains on 46 percent of its third-down plays (89-193) in 2010. The Black Knights were 24th in the nation in third-down efficiency, up from 119th in the nation in 2009 (28.9 percent).
- Last year marked the first time since 1996 that the Black Knights converted third downs at a rate of 40.0 percent or better.

MAPLES REACHES 100-YARD MARK ... AGAIN



- Sophomore SB **Raymond Maples** has reached the 100-yard mark in each of the last three games, running for 125 yards and two touchdowns at Ball State, 141 yards and a score in the win over Tulane, and 111 yards and a touchdown at Miami (Ohio).
- In the last four games, Maples is Army's leading rusher with 472 yards (118.0/game). He is averaging 7.0 yards per carry and is second on the team with four rushing scores in that span.
- For the season, Maples is second on the team with 534 yards and ranks second with four rushing touchdowns and a 6.5 yards-per-carry average. He has already surpassed his season total from last year in carries, yards and rushing touchdowns.

BIG PLAY BROWN



- Junior SB **Malcolm Brown** is Army's third-leading rusher with 325 yards despite ranking fourth on the team with 42 carries. His 7.7 yards per rush is 1.2 yards better than any of the other seven Army players with at least 20 carries.

- Brown is responsible for one of Army's two longest running plays and longest passing play of the season. He had a 40-yard run against Northwestern and a 45-yard touchdown catch against Miami (Ohio). For the season, Brown has five of the Black Knights' 19 rushing plays that have covered at least 20 yards.
- For his career, Brown is averaging 7.1 yards per play from scrimmage. He averages 6.0 yards per rush and 22.9 yards per reception.

- A local product from nearby Monroe, N.Y., McFarlin led the Black Knights with four receptions, including his first career touchdown. McFarlin's four catches matched Army's single-game high from last season. He was second on the team with 35 receiving yards.

- McFarlin was on the receiving end of Army's only completion in the win over Northwestern. He had his streak of three straight games with at least one reception stopped at Ball State when the Black Knights did not complete a pass.

ARMY DEFENSIVE NOTES

THE MAGIC NUMBER

- Army won its 14th straight game when holding an opponent to 14 points or less in its 45-6 win over Tulane. The last time the Black Knights allowed 14-or-fewer points and lost was Sept. 2, 2006 in a 14-6 loss at Arkansas State. Since 2000, Army is 17-2 when holding opponents to no more than 14 points.
- After the loss to Miami (Ohio), the Black Knights are 20-111 since 1996 when allowing opponents to score 18-or-more points. In that same span, Army is 31-7 when the opponent tallies 17 or less.
- The Black Knights' 48-21 loss at Ball State was their 35th straight defeat when allowing at least 40 points. The last time Army won a game when its foe scored more than 40 was a 59-52 double-overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 7, 1999.
- Northern Illinois' 49 points in the season opener marked the most by an Army opponent since a 49-39 loss to Tulsa on Nov. 17, 2007.

PASS HAPPY

- The Army defense surrendered a season-high 383 passing yards at Ball State. It was the most passing yards by an opponent since Rice threw for 384 yards on Nov. 8, 2008.
- Army has allowed 300-or-more passing yards 16 times since the start of the 2004 season, posting a 4-12 record in those 16 games. The last Army win was the 2010 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl when SMU threw for 302 yards in the Black Knights' victory.
- The Black Knights allowed a season-low 74 passing yards in the win over Tulane. It was Army's best showing against the pass since Eastern Michigan threw for 31 yards on Sept. 4, 2010. Army is 3-1 in its last four games when holding opponents to less than 100 yards through the air.

GET OFF THE FIELD

- Army's home/road splits have been particularly noticeable on third down. In the Black Knights' three road games, both losses, opponents have converted third downs at an 72.2 percent rate (26-36). In its three home games, opponents are converting at only a 26.7 percent rate (8-30).
- Much like the offense, distance dictates third-down success. In the last 31 games, the Black Knights have allowed their opponents to convert only 28.5 percent of their third downs when the line to make is at least seven yards away (57-200). Conversely, when Army's opponent has three-or-fewer yards to go, they are converting at a 70.7 percent clip.

SACK LUNCH

- The Black Knights took down Tulane quarterback Ryan Griffin five times in their 45-6 win over the Green Wave. It was Army's highest sack total since an Academy-record eight quarterback takedowns against Rutgers last season.
- It was the fourth time in the Rich Ellerson Era that Army recorded at least five sacks in a game.
- All four players that recorded sacks against the Green Wave reached the quarterback for the first time in their careers — junior LB **Kyler Martin**, sophomore DL **Clayton Keller**, freshman DL **Jacob Drozd** and freshman DL **Colin Linkul**. Linkul recorded two sacks against the Green Wave and is tied for the team lead with senior LB **Steven Erzinger**.

ERZINGER AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS



- Senior LB **Steven Erzinger** posted his second double-digit tackle game of the season at Ball State with a game-high 17 stops. He made a career-high 21 tackles in the season opener at Northern Illinois. Erzinger had six solo stops and a career-high 15 assists.
- Erzinger's 21-tackle performance ranks as the fourth-best total in the nation to date.
- Erzinger's 21 tackles marked the most by an Army player since Caleb Campbell had 21 stops against Air Force in 2005.
- Erzinger leads the team with 64 tackles. The next closest player is sophomore FS Tyler Dickson with 35 stops. Erzinger's 10.67 stops per game ranks 12th in the nation. He also leads the team with 7.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.

WELCOME BACK

- A pair of Army defenders returned from injury in the season opener at Northern Illinois. Senior LB **Andrew Rodriguez** played in his first game since the 2009 season finale, and junior LB **Nate Combs** was back on the field for the first time since last year's season opener at Eastern Michigan.
- Rodriguez was Army's leading tackler in 2009, but missed all of last season with a back injury. His status for 2011 was uncertain entering preseason camp, but he was medically cleared. Rodriguez has 28 tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss, two pass breakups and two fumble recoveries in his six games back.
- Combs won the starting job at "whip" linebacker last season, stepping in for Rodriguez, but went down with a season-ending knee injury in the first quarter at Eastern Michigan. Combs has 14 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack in his six games back on the field.

ARMY SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

CARLTON AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS



- Senior PK **Alex Carlton** made his first field goal of the season in the Black Knights' win over Tulane. Carlton was true from 23 yards out to snap a streak of three straight misses to start the season. Carlton entered the season with a string of 11 consecutive made field goals. Carlton ranks third all-time at Army in career field goals (34).
- Carlton drilled all four of his extra point attempts against Miami. The senior ranks fifth on Army's all-time top 10 in extra points made. He made 53 in a row before having his first attempt in last season's bowl game blocked. Carlton is 18-for-20 on extra point tries through the first six games. (See sidebar for Carlton's complete entries in the Army record book.)

DUO SPLITS PUNTING DUTIES

- Senior P **Kolin Walk** and junior P **Chris Boldt** have split the punting duties through six games this season. Walk made his debut as Army's punter at Northern Illinois and also handled the punting against San Diego State.
- In his two games, Walk has punted four times for an average of 41.0 yards per kick. He owns Army's longest punt of the season at 54 yards and put three of his four kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line.
- Boldt took over for the Northwestern game and has been Army's punter in the last four games. He has kicked 11 times for an average of 41.1 yards and a long of 64 yards. He has had two kicks downed inside the 20-yard line.

WILLIAMS EARNS SPOT ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- Sophomore SB **Scott Williams** has won the job as Army's primary kick returner. In the last five games, Williams has 14 returns for 299 yards (21.4). He owns Army's longest kickoff return of the season with a 29-yarder against San Diego State.
- The Villa Park, Calif., native has also played on offense in each of the last five games. His first career rush was a 17-yard gain to the Northwestern 30-yard line on the Black Knights' game-winning drive.

KICKOFF COVERAGE UNIT EXCELLING

- Army's kickoff coverage unit ranks ninth in the nation through six weeks of the 2011 season. The Black Knights are allowing just 17.45 yards per return.
- The Black Knights ranked 32nd in the country in that category last season, giving up an average of 20.4 yards per return. Last year's squad also forced five turnovers in 13 games.
- Junior PK **Eric Osteen** has handled the kickoff duties in all six games. Osteen is averaging 63.3 yards per kickoff, including seven touchbacks. On average, opponents are starting at their own 23-yard line following Army kickoffs.

LOSS LEADER



• Senior DE **Josh McNary** registered 2.5 sacks at Rutgers to extend his Academy record to 48.5 career tackles for loss. The old mark of 42.0 had stood since 1979. He leads the team with 12.0 tackles for loss in 2010.

• The tackles for loss mark is another in a long line of record-book entries for McNary. The Houston native is Army's all-time leader with 27.5 career sacks and holds the Academy's single-season record with 12.5 in 2009 and the single-game mark with 4.0 versus Temple last season.

• McNary has a chance to break his own single-season mark. Through 12 games, he has 9.5 quarterback takedowns, which already ranks second on the Army season list. He is tied for 16th in the nation with 0.79 sacks per game.

• In 32 games since moving from linebacker to defensive end, McNary has seven multi-sack games, including four this season (3.0 vs. Hawaii; 2.0 vs. North Texas; 2.0 vs. Tulane; 2.5 vs. Rutgers).

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

• McNary was named one of five finalists for the inaugural Burlsworth Trophy. The honor is given to the collegiate player who began their career as a walk-on and has shown outstanding performance on the field. McNary was not recruited to play football at West Point and began his career as a walk-on at the U.S. Military Academy Prep School.

• The award is named in honor of Brandon Burlsworth, a former University of Arkansas walk-on and All-America offensive lineman. Without one Division I scholarship offer, Burlsworth walked on to the Razorback team in 1994. He became a three-year starter and was named an All-American in 1998. Burlsworth was selected with the 63rd overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 1999 NFL draft, but was tragically killed in a car accident 11 days later.

BACK IN BLACK



• The opener at Eastern Michigan marked the first time senior LB **Stephen Anderson** stepped on the field since suffering a knee injury at Air Force on Nov. 7, 2009. He missed the final three games of the season and all of spring practice while recovering from his injury.

• Anderson, a team captain for the second straight season, made a team-leading 10 tackles in the Black Knights' win at Eastern Michigan. He also made one stop behind the line of scrimmage and forced a fumble in his first game back.

• Anderson recorded his first career interception in the win at Duke.

• The senior captain leads the Black Knights with 94 total tackles. Anderson has 284 career stops, tied for the 15th-best total in Army history.

• Anderson's 10.5 tackles for loss is second on the team. His career total of 32.5 ranks sixth on the Army all-time ledger.

ERZINGER RACKS UP SEASON HIGH TACKLES TOTAL



• Junior LB **Steven Erzinger** made a career-best 14 tackles in the game at Rutgers. His team-leading 3.5 tackles for loss were also a career high and his first stops behind the line of scrimmage this season.

• Erzinger had 1.5 of Army's eight sacks versus the Scarlet Knights. His career total entering the game was one.

• Erzinger's total tackles and his tackles for loss were the most by an Army player in a game this season.

• For the season, Erzinger is Army's second-leading tackler with 71 stops. He is tied for second on the team with five pass breakups.

TRAVIS ADDS TO INTERCEPTION TOTAL



• Senior FS **Donovan Travis** recorded his team-leading fifth interception of the season in the game against Notre Dame.

• It was Travis' 11th career interception, giving him sole possession of second place on the Army career ledger. 1946 Heisman Trophy winner Glenn Davis holds the Academy record with 14 picks. Travis is only the fourth player to record double-digit interceptions in their career, joining Mike McElrath (10, 1989-92) and Doug Pavak (10, 1983-85).

BROTHERLY LOVE

• The Army defense has two sets of brothers that have seen action this season.

• Sophomore LB **Jarett Mackey** is sixth on the team with 39 total tackles and has registered 3.5 sacks in his first season as a starter. His brother, **A.J. Mackey**, is a defensive lineman who has made nine stops in six games. Both brothers were in the starting lineup against Air Force.

• Senior DB **Jordan Trimble** is seventh on the team in tackles with 34 stops in 10 games. He also has one interception and two pass breakups. His younger brother, **Justin Trimble**, is a freshman reserve linebacker who has five tackles in nine games. The oldest Trimble brother, Jeremy, graduated from West Point in 2008 as Army's all-time leader in receptions (176), receiving yards (2,330) and receiving touchdowns (15).

- Army teams have captured three national championships, seven Lambert Trophy crowns and six Commander in Chief's Trophy titles.
- Eleven National Collegiate Athletic Association football records still reside at West Point, including three individual marks and nine team standards. Legendary halfback Glenn Davis had a hand in three of the individual records and participated on Army squads that hold six of the team marks.
- West Point's football alumni include two Rhodes Scholars, two Olmsted Scholarship winners and two Marshall Scholarship recipients. In addition, 13 former players are National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes, the most recent being 2000 USMA graduate Shaun Castillo.
- Army Football players have garnered 71 first-team All-America honors.
- Twenty-seven West Pointers have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.
